OPENING TIP

► No. 12/14 K-State (19-7, 7-6 Big 12) returns home to Bramlage Coliseum on Saturday for the start of back-to-back Top 25 matchups, as the Wildcats play host to No. 19/18 Iowa State (17-8, 8-5 Big 12) for a 1 p.m., CT tip on ESPN. The Cyclones won their first meeting, 80-76, at home on Jan. 24 in a highly competitive game in which both teams shot better than 50 percent. They have split the last 8 meetings at Bramlage Coliseum, including 74-73 victory last season.

KEY STORYLINES

► K-State has lost 4 of its last 5 games, including consecutive road losses to Texas Tech and Oklahoma. The Sooners broke open a tight contest with a 12-0 run early in the second half, as they finished with 43 points in the half on 61.1 percent shooting. They tied an opponent-high with 11 makes from 3-point range, including 3 during the pivotal 12-0 run, to upend what had been the Big 12's best 3-point field goal percentage defense at 28.6 percent. Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin's** second double-double.

► K-State is still off to one of its better starts, as the 19-7 record ties 2 others for the seventh-best record in the past 50 seasons, trailing only the 1972-73 (22-4), 2009-10 (22-4), 2012-13 (21-5), 1976-77 (20-6), 1981-82 (20-6) and 2018-19 (20-6) teams. Among the 13 wins in the last 19 outings is a 9-game streak from Dec. 3, 2022 to Jan. 10, 2023, which was the longest by the Wildcats since a 10-game winning streak in 2013-14, and a 4-0 start in Big 12 play.

► K-State's 19-7 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the second-best by a first-year coach in school history, just behind the 15-2 record by **Zora G. Clevenger** (1916-17). Tang's 19-7 start also ranks among the very best by all first-year coaches in Division I, tying Missouri's **Dennis Gates** (19-7) and Xavier's **Sean Miller** (19-7) for the best mark. His next victory will make him just the fourth K-State head coach (**Lon Kruger** [1986-87], **Bob Huggins** [2006-07] and **Frank Martin** [2007-08]) to win 20 or more games in his first season.

► Seniors **Keyontae Johnson** (17.5 ppg.) and **Markquis Nowell** (16.8 ppg.) have been one of the most prolific tandems in the country, as they combine to average 34.3 points per game on 45 percent (287-of-638) shooting, including 36.5 percent (89-of-244) from 3-point range, and 80.6 percent (228-of-283) from the free throw line. They are the fourth-most prolific scoring duo among the power conferences, including the second-best in the Big 12. They were each named to the Oscar Robertson Trophy, John R. Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy Watch Lists, while each were selected to their respective position award (Bob Cousy and Julius Irving) Top 10 lists.

► Nowell joined elite company in the win over TCU on Feb. 7, as his 7 assists allowed him to pass **Steve Henson** (186; 1987-88) to become the school's single-season leader. His current total of 197 assists ranks third nationally, while he is third in assists per game (7.6 apg.). He is one of 4 active Division I player with at least 1,500 points, 500 assists and 200 steals. In addition, he has accumulated 253 career steals, which are first among active Division I players.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: 19/18 IOWA STATE (17-8)

► No. 19/18 Iowa State (16-8, 8-5 Big 12) snapped a 2-game losing streak with a 70-59 win over No. 22/24 TCU on Wednesday night at home. The Cyclones were led by senior **Aljaz Kunc**, who paced all scorers with 22 points on 7-of-10 shooting, including 5 3-pointers.



► Iowa State is averaging 70.1 points on 45.9 percent shooting, including 34.8 percent from 3-point range, with 33.5 rebounds, 14.8 assists, 9.3 steals and 3.0 blocks per game, while allowing a Big 12-best 61.6 points on 41.7 percent shooting, including 32.2 percent from 3-point range. The Cyclones are connecting on 66.8 percent from the free throw line.

► Iowa State is among the best defensive teams in the country, ranking in the top-10 in 4 categories, including 10th in turnover margin (+4.5) and turnovers forced/game (17.5), 12th in steals/game (9.3) and 14th in scoring defense (61.6). They lead the Big 12 in all 4 categories, while they are third in field goal percentage defense (41.7).

► Three players (**Jaren Holmes**, **Gabe Kalschauer** and **Caleb Grill**) are averaging in double figures, while two others averaging nearly 9 points per game. Holmes and Kalschauer are averaging 13.6 and 12.4 points per game, while Grill is averaging 10 points per outing. The trio have combined for 134 of the Cyclones' 169 made 3-pointers. Freshman **Tamin Lipsey** leads the team in assists (4.7 apg.), while **Aljaz Kunc** is tops in rebounding (5.1 rpg.).

► Iowa State is led by second-year head coach **T.J. Otzelberger**, who has a 39-21 record. He guided the Cyclones to 22 wins and a Sweet 16 appearance in 2021-22. Overall, he is 138-84 in his seventh season as a head coach.

SERIES HISTORY

► K-State holds a 144-92 advantage in the all-time series with Iowa State, including an 83-29 record at home and 23-11 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The teams have split the last 10 meetings with Iowa State winning twice in the last 4 at Bramlage Coliseum, including a 74-73 win last season.

LAST MEETING IN MANHATTAN:

IOWA STATE 74, K-STATE 73 [Feb. 26, 2022]

► K-State nearly rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit, closing to within 72-70 and possession with 16 seconds to play, but Iowa State was able to hold on in the final seconds to pick up a 74-73 victory in the last meeting between the schools at Bramlage Coliseum on Feb. 26, 2022.

► Down 70-58 with 2:14 to play, K-State nearly made a remarkable rally behind their defensive pressure and clutch free throw shooting by **Markquis Nowell**, who converted on 10 consecutive attempts to close to within 72-70 with 49 seconds. However, ISU was able to force a turnover with 4 seconds.

► Sophomore **Nijel Pack** led three Wildcats in double digits with 32 points.

LAST TIME OUT:

OKLAHOMA 79, 12/14 K-STATE 65

► Oklahoma hit on an opponent season-tying 11 3-pointers, including 3 during a key 12-0 run early in the second half, as the Sooners earned a 79-65 win over No. 12/14 K-State on Tuesday before a crowd of 5,167 at the Lloyd Noble Center.

► Oklahoma saw five players connected on at least one 3-pointer, including 3 each by senior **Grant Sherfield** and freshman **Milos Uzan**, as the Sooners tied an opponent season-high with 11 made triples while making 47.8 percent of their shots from beyond the arc. The Wildcats entered with the Big 12's best and nation's 12th-best 3-point field goal percentage defense at 28.6 percent.

► Sherfield led all scorers with 22 points to go with a game-tying 6 assists and 8 rebounds to help the Sooners snap a 4-game losing streak.

► Oklahoma carried the momentum of a 3-pointer by Sherfield that knotted the score at 36-all right before halftime into the second half, using the 12-0 run to build a double-digit lead with just over 16 minutes to play. Sherfield, senior **Tanner Groves** and Uzan all hit treys during the run.

► Down 60-45 midway through the second half, the Wildcats got some positive momentum with an 8-1 run that cut the deficit to 61-53 with over 7 minutes to play. However, the Sooners ended any hopes of a further comeback with a 9-1 run, which was capped by a 3-pointer from sophomore **Bijan Cortes** - the team's 11th trey - that extended the lead to 70-54 with 4:50 remaining.

► Overall, the Sooners scored their 79 points on 51 percent (25-of-49) shooting, including 43 points after halftime on 61.1 percent (11-of-18) shooting.

► K-State saw four players score in double figures led by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who collected his second double-double with 17 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** each scored 14 points, while fellow senior **Abayomi Iyiola** added 11 points.

► Sherfield was joined in double figures by Groves, who had 16 points on 5-of-7 field goals, including 2-of-3 from long range, as well as Uzah and senior **Jalen Hill**, who scored 13 and 12 points, respectively.

► Oklahoma has now won 3 straight in the series with K-State.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

► K-State has now lost 4 of their last 5 games, while they lost their fifth straight Big 12 road game after opening 2-0.

► The 11 made 3-pointers by Oklahoma tied the opponent, as Texas (Jan. 3) and Kansas (Jan. 31) also hit on 11 treys in its matchups with K-State.

► Oklahoma held a 32-31 edge on the glass, while K-State grabbed 11 offensive rebounds... The Wildcats are now 2-4 when losing the rebounding battle.

► K-State got 20 points from its bench, which was the fourth game in a row with 20 or more bench points.

► Tomlin collected his second double-double with 17 points on 8-of-15 field goals with a season-tying 10 rebounds... Both double doubles have come in Big 12 play... He has 15 double-digit scoring games, including 6 in Big 12 play.

► With his 14 points, Nowell has now scored in double figures in 89 career games, including 42 at K-State and 23 this season... He added a game-tying 6 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals in 37 minutes.

► Johnson also scored 14 points and now has in double figures in a team-high 25 of 26 games this season... He also had 4 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals.

► Iyiola scored in double figures for the fourth time with 11 points.

■ TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

'CATS WINS CAYMAN ISLANDS CLASSIC

► K-State won its 17th in-season tournament title, as the Wildcats knocked off Rhode Island (77-57), Nevada (96-87 in overtime) and LSU (61-59) to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic on Nov. 21-23. It was the team's first tournament title since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The 3 wins gave K-State its first 6-0 start since the 2018-19 season.



► Senior **Markquis Nowell** was selected the Cayman Islands Classic MVP and to the all-tournament team, while fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson** was named to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the 3-game tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game. For his efforts, Nowell was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28.

► After breezing past Rhode Island, 77-57, in the first round, K-State had to fight through tight contests with Nevada in the semifinals and LSU in the finals to earn the title. After surrendering a 9-point lead to the Wolf Pack with 4:08 to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds remaining in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force overtime with 3.5 seconds. The Wildcats were able to carry the momentum in the extra period, as they hit on 5 of 6 from the field and 6 of 10 free throw line to win 96-87.

► The Wildcats then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to the Tigers in the title game, using their defense to allow 18 points after halftime on 36.8 percent shooting while forcing 14 turnovers en route to a 61-59 victory. Nowell led all scorers with 18 points.



NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

► With the 64-50 win over Florida in the final SEC/Big 12 Challenge on Jan. 28, K-State completed its non-conference schedule with a 12-1 mark, including a perfect 8-0 in home games (Nebraska was played at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City is considered a home game).

► The 12-1 record is the best non-conference record since the Wildcats won a program-best 13 non-conference games in 2009-10. The teams also won 12 non-conference games in both 2008-09 (12-3) and 2010-11 (12-3). K-State had won just 19 non-conference games, including 16 at home, in the 3 seasons (2019-20 to 2021-22) before this season.

► K-State has posted a 171-53 (.762) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07. During that span, the Wildcats have a 129-14 (.901) mark at home venues (includes games at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City in non-conference play, including a 119-12 (.908) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

TANG DEBUTS AS HEAD COACH

- First-year coach **Jerome Tang** enjoyed a successful debut, as the Wildcats earned a 93-59 win against UTRGV on Nov. 7 to help Tang earn his first victory as the 24th head coach and the first full-time black head coach in school history. He is the sixth minority men's head coach in K-State Athletics history, including the third in men's basketball following interim head coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85) and former full-time head coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12).
- K-State's 19-6 start under **Jerome Tang** is the second-best by a first-year coach in school history, just behind **Zora G. Clevenger**, who went 15-2 in 1916-17. The start ties for the best by any current first-year coach in Division I with Missouri's **Dennis Gates** (19-7) and Xavier's **Sean Miller** (19-7).

- This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he served as athletics director and head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships.

- In addition, Tang twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record. He helped Baylor to wins over Texas (86-79 in OT) and at Texas Tech (82-48) during the 2012-13 season, while he guided the squad to wins over Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52) to open the 2020-21 season.

A TEAM OF WINNERS

- Head coach **Jerome Tang** has remarked on a number of occasions that he recruited a team 'full of winners' as exemplified by the number of championships that the collective group has won in their careers.

- There are a combined 8 state championships among the 15 players on the roster, including 2 each won by seniors **Desi Sills** and **Abayomi Iyiola** and true freshmen **Taj Manning**. In addition, sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and true freshman **Dorian Finister** also won state titles during their senior seasons.

- In addition to the high school success, a number of players have been a part of winning college programs, including Sills and Iyiola being members of Arkansas' Elite Eight team in 2021 and senior **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida) and junior **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech) being a part of 2 NCAA Tournaments.

- This championship mentality stretches to the staff, as associate head coach **Urlic Maligi** has been part of 5 NCAA Tournament and 5 conference title teams in his career. Assistant coach **Jareem Dowling** has been involved with teams that have won 4 conference titles and earned 4 postseason trips, while assistant coach **Rodney Perry** is coming off a 2021-22 year in which he led Link Academy to a national runner-up finish at the GEICO National Tournament before helping MOKAN Elite to its third Nike Peach Jam title.

SPECIAL PERFORMANCE

- K-State enjoyed a special night on offense in its 116-103 win over No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, as the Wildcats not only broke the school record for points but also tied the Big 12 record in handing the Longhorns their first loss in the brand-new Moody Center before a sold-out crowd of 10,763 fans.

- The 116 points eclipsed the previous school-record mark of 115, which first came vs. Delaware State on Dec. 7, 1991, then again vs. Fresno State in the NIT on March 24, 1994. It was also the most-ever in a road game, surpassing the 108 at Iowa State on Jan. 29, 1975, while it was most in a conference game, topping the 114 scored vs. Nebraska at home on Jan. 10, 1987, and the most in a Big 12 game, surpassing the 111 vs. Missouri at home on Jan. 3, 1998.

- According to *ESPN Stats & Info*, K-State's 116 points in the win at No. 6/6 Texas marked the most by an unranked team in a win over a top-10 opponent since Missouri scored 119 against Iowa State in 1988.

- All 5 starters scored in double figures, including a career-best 36 points from senior **Markquis Nowell** and a career-tying 28 by senior **Keyontae Johnson**. The 64 combined points tied for the fourth-most by a duo in school history and most since 2008, while it marked just the 16th time (including the second time this season) that tandem has each had at least 25 points in a game. Nowell's 36 points are the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Barry Brown, Jr.**, scored 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

- As a team, the Wildcats connected on 61 percent (36-of-59) from the field, including 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from 3-point range, and set a school-record by hitting on 93.9 percent (31-of-33) from the free throw line. It marked the first time the team has shot better than 60 percent against a Big 12 opponent since 2018, while the 13 treys tied for the sixth-most made in a conference game.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

- K-State's overtime 96-87 win over Nevada in the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.

- The Wildcats have a 1,714-1,220 (.586) all-time record as a program, which includes 31 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships.

1,000-WIN CLUB

- K-State is one of 11 Division I schools whose men's and women's basketball teams have both won more than 1,000 games. Joining K-State is this unique club is Baylor, Georgia, Maryland, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Stanford, Tennessee, Texas, UConn and Western Kentucky.

POTENT OFFENSIVE ATTACK

- K-State is averaging 75.9 points this season on 45.1 percent (682-of-1511) shooting, including 34.2 percent (181-of-530) from 3-point range, while hitting on 74.7 percent (429-of-574) from the free throw line. The Wildcats are second in the Big 12 in assists (16.8 app.), while they are third in free throw percentage and fifth in scoring offense and assist/turnover ratio (1.17).

- The current scoring average (75.9 ppg.) is on pace to be the ninth-best in school history and the highest since the 2007-08 team averaged 78.0 points per game. The 45.1 field goal percentage is on pace to finish in the top-10 in the shot clock era (1985-86) and the highest since 2017-18 (46.3 percent).

- K-State has scored 80 or more points 9 times, including 5 games of 90 or more points highlighted by the school-record 116-point effort in the win at No. 6/6 Texas (1/3/23), which was the first 100-point game since 2011. It is the most games of 80 or more points since posting 11 in 2017-18 and most games of 90 or more points since also totaling 5 in 2009-10.

- The 93 points vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) were the fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons and the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah to open the 2014-15 season. The Wildcats also topped the 90-point barrier in a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada (11/22/22) at the Cayman Islands Classic, while the squad fell 2 points short of their first 100-point game since 2010-11, totaling 98 vs. UIW (12/11/22) behind a school-record first 7 double-digit scorers.

- Twice this season the Wildcats have had 2 players (**Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson**) score 25 or more points in the same game, which hadn't happened since 2010. Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) combined for 57 points in the overtime win over Nevada (11/22/22) before they went for 64 in the win at No. 6/6 Texas (1/3/23), which ties for the fourth-most by a duo in school history and the most since **Michael Beasley** and **Bill Walker** at Baylor in 2008.

- K-State has connected on better than 50 percent of its field goals in 7 games, including back-to-back vs. Rhode Island (11/21/22) and Nevada (11/22/22) and ACU (12/6/22) and UIW (12/11/22). The team hit on a season-best 60 percent (36-of-60) vs. Texas (1/3/23), which included a season-high 13 3-pointers, and a school-record performance from the free throw line of 93.9 percent (31-of-33).

DISHING THE ROCK

- K-State ranks among the best in the country in sharing the basketball, as the Wildcats rank 13th nationally and second in the Big 12 with 16.8 assists per game. Among the 437 assists are 7 players with double-digit totals, including senior **Markquis Nowell**, who ranks third nationally in assists/game (7.6) and total assists (197). Nowell, who has double-digit assists in 6 games, became the school's single-season assist leader with his 7 dimes in the win over TCU.

► The Wildcats also rank in the top-10 with a 64.1 assist percentage according to *KenPom*, which calculates assists (437) to made field goals (682). Only Lafayette (69.4), Virginia (66.9), Arizona (66.7), Xavier (66.7), Tennessee (66.0) and Air Force (64.3) have a better percentage nationally.

► Although Nowell gets all the attention for his playmaking ability, the rest of the team has shared the ball, as the Wildcats have had 3 or more players dish out at least 2 assists in 20 of 26 games. The team had 7 players with 2 or more assists vs. UTRGV (11/7/22), while 6 vs. Nebraska (12/17/22) and Baylor (1/3/23) and 5 vs. UIW (12/11/22), Texas (1/3/23), TCU (twice) and Texas Tech (1/21/23).

TEAM FULL OF SCORERS

► K-State is one of just 15 schools to have at least four 1,000-point scorers on its roster, as Wildcats **Tykei Greene** (1,191 points), **Keyontae Johnson** (1,243 points), **Markquis Nowell** (1,745 points) and **Desi Sills** (1,331 points) have all reached the milestone in their Division I careers. Only Johnson, who did it against Radford (12/21/22), and Nowell have reached the mark while at K-State.

► K-State has now six 1,000-point scorers if you count senior walk-on **Nate Awbrey**, who scored 1,032 points in his 4-year career at Manhattan Christian College, and junior **Nae'Gwan Tomlin**, who scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at Monroe (2019-20) and Chipola Colleges (2020-22).

► Missouri has 6 1,000-point scorers followed by Notre Dame, Penn State, San Diego and UAB with 5, while Alabama, Iowa State, K-State, Miami, UNC, Ohio State, Southern Utah, Texas, Xavier and Youngstown State have 4 such scorers.

BENCH PRODUCTION

► K-State is getting solid production from its bench through the first 26 games, as the Wildcats are averaging 18.5 points per game. The team has scored 20 or more bench points in each of the last 4 games, including 29 vs. TCU.

► Senior **Desi Sills** has been particularly impactful from the bench, scoring in double figures 11 times, including a season-high 24 points in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas. He is fourth on the team in scoring in Big 12 play, averaging 8.6 points on 46.1 percent shooting. Junior **Ismael Massoud** has also proved to be a spark of the bench, posting 4 double-digit scoring games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

► K-State's defense has forced 398 turnovers through the first 26 games, which includes 205 steals, while averaging 16.6 points per game off those miscues.

► The 15.3 turnovers forced per game ranks 36th nationally, while it places fourth in the Big 12 behind Iowa State, TCU and Texas. K-State ranks sixth in steals (7.8) and seventh in turnover margin (+1.1), while senior **Markquis Nowell** leads the Big 12 and places 12th nationally in steals (2.35 spg.).

► K-State has scored 20 or more points off turnovers 6 times with a season-high 31 points off 26 UTRGV (11/7/22) turnovers in the opener. The Wildcats scored 20+ points off miscues in back-to-back games vs. Kansas City (11/17/22; 26 points) and Rhode Island (11/21/22; 21 points) as well as ACU (12/6/22; 23 points), UIW (12/11/22; 28 points) and West Virginia (12/31/22; 22 points).

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 414-145 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 414 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State has registered a 214-65 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including a 92-53 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 214 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 92 league victories at home are among the tops in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 28 of its 35 seasons in the arena.

► K-State has a 275-87 (.754) record at home, including a 161-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of just over 12 home wins (12.5) per season in that span.

► K-State has defeated 44 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 41 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,000 for the 2022-23 season.

PLAYER NOTES

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

► Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Nov. 7 in the opener with UTRGV after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points, 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.

► Johnson was named the *March Madness* National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 14, as he averaged 14.5 points on 47.6 percent (10-of-21) shooting, including 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3-point range, to go with 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the Wildcats' first 2 wins.

► Johnson helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic and was named to the All-Tournament team, as he averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent (15-of-28) shooting, including 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range, to go with a team-best 6.0 rebounds in 32.3 minutes per game.

► Johnson earned Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors for the second time on Dec. 19 after his impressive effort vs. Nebraska, as he posted game-highs in points (23) and rebounds (11) to go with his career-tying 4 steals.

► Johnson was selected for the Newcomer award for the third time on Jan. 9 after posting consecutive 20-point games in wins at No. 6/6 Texas and No. 19/17 Baylor while adding a game-high 9 rebounds in each contest. He continued his impressive play with the game-winning dunk to cap a 24-point effort in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas before logging his third double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds vs. Texas Tech to earn Newcomer honors for fourth time on Jan. 23.

► Johnson has scored in double figures in a team-best 25 games, leading the Wildcats and ranking second in the Big 12 in scoring (17.5 ppg.). He is second in the league in field goal percentage (51.4), while he is in the top-15 in 6 other categories. He is one of two Big 12 players (Kansas' **Jalen Wilson**) rank in the league's top-5 in scoring and rebounding in overall and conference-only games.

NOWELL RUNNING THE SHOW

► On a team with 13 new players and a new staff, fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** once again has demonstrated he is still the guy running the show for the Wildcats, as he leads in both assists (7.6 apg.) and steals (2.35 spg.) while averaging the second-most points (16.8 ppg.). He was named to the Oscar Robertson Trophy, John R. Wooden and Naismith Trophy Award Midseason Watch Lists and Bob Cousy Point Guard Award Top 10 List.

► Nowell ranks third nationally in assists/game (7.6 apg.) and total assists (197), while he is in the top-30 in four other categories, including ninth in steals (61), 12th in steals/game (2.35), 13th in free throws (129) and 27th in minutes/game (36.1). He is one of 3 Division I players with at least 1,500 points, 500 assists and 200 steals, while he recently eclipsed 1,700 points in his career. He also ranks first among all active Division I players in steals (253).

► Nowell was recognized for his MVP performance in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he was selected as the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28 after averaging 18.7 points and 9.0 assists per game.

► In wins vs. Rhode Island and Nevada, Nowell became the first Wildcat to record double-digit assists in consecutive games, while he became the second player in school history and the first since 1989 to post a 25-point/10-assist game with his 29-point, 11-assist effort in the overtime win over the Wolf Pack.

► Nowell enjoyed a special performance in the historic win at No. 6/6 Texas, scoring a career-best 36 points on 9-of-15 shooting, including 6-of-10 from 3-point range, to go with a perfect 12-of-12 effort from the free throw line. It was the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Barry Brown, Jr.**, scored 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

► Nowell capped his impressive week with the school's first 30-point, 10-assist game in the win at No. 19/17 Baylor, scoring 32 points while dishing a career-best 14 assists. He became the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 with consecutive 30-point games, while his 14 assists tied the record for most in a conference game in school history. In addition to his second Big 12 Player of the Week on Jan. 9, he was named the *NCAA March Madness*, ESPN, Naismith Trophy and Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week.

► Nowell, who nearly posted the school's first triple-double in the win over Florida on Jan. 28 with 13 points, a career-tying 9 rebounds and a game-high 8 assists, became the school's single-season assists leader (187) in the win over TCU, as he eclipsed the record of **Steve Henson** (186) set in 1987-88.

AN INSTANT IMPACT

► Junior transfer **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** has given K-State another scoring threat in the post, as the junior college All-American ranks third on the team in scoring (10.4 ppg.) while connecting 45.8 percent (103-of-225) from the field to go with 5.9 rebounds, 1.2 steals and 0.9 blocks in 28.1 minutes per game. He ranks in the Big 12's top-15 in rebounding (11th) and blocks (10th).

► Tomlin was selected as the Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Week on Dec. 26 after his near double-double in the win over Radford on Dec. 21. He led four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 26 points, as he hit on 11-of-18 field goals, which included 4 dunks, a 3-pointer and 3 free throws, to go with 9 rebounds.

► Tomlin scored in double figures in 7 consecutive games from Dec. 3 to Jan. 3, in which, he averaged 14.9 points on 55.4 percent (41-of-74) shooting to go with 6.3 rebounds per game. The streak began with 14 points vs. Wichita State and was highlighted by a career-best 26 points vs. Radford.

► Tomlin has grabbed 10 rebounds 3 times this season, while posting his first career double-double (15 points/10 rebounds) in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas. He added a second double-double with 17 points and a season-tying 10 boards at Oklahoma. He has scored in double figures in 6 games in Big 12 play.

STARTER OFF THE BENCH

► Senior **Desi Sills** has provided a spark for the Wildcats off the bench, as he is averaging 8.5 points on 44.5 percent (77-of-173) shooting with 3.4 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 28.6 minutes per game. He has scored in double figures 11 times, including a season-high 24 points in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas.

► Sills scored in double figures in 2 of the first 3 games, including 10 in his first game as a Wildcat vs. UTRGV. He scored 16 points vs. LSU in the championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic, hitting on 6-of-9 field goals, before his 17-point effort at Butler, which all came in the second half. He has scored in double figures in 3 of the last 4 games, including 14 in the win over TCU.

► Although Sills went scoreless in the win over Wichita State, he had the play of the game with his block of **Shammah Scott's** breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.

► Ames was named First Team Class 4A All-State by the AP, while was selected to the *Chicago Sun-Times* All-Area and First Team All-City teams.

► Jones was named the 2022 TAPPS Class 6A Player of the Year, a First Team All-State and All-District selection and MVP of District 6A-2.

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022. He agreed to a 6-year contract through the 2027-28 season.

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at K-State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

Tang has K-State off to a 19-7 record in 2022-23, which is one of the best starts in the last 50 seasons. In addition, he helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic with wins over Rhode Island, Nevada and LSU, which was the first in-season tournament title since 2017. Coupled with 2 wins as interim coach at Baylor in 2013, he tied Kansas' **Roy Williams** (1988-89) and Missouri's **Frank Haith** (2011-12) for the best 20-game start (18-2) in Big 12 history.

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections **Johnathan Motley** (2017) and **Jared Butler** (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in **Davion Mitchell** (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang assisted in the construction of nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (**Perry Jones III**), 2011 (**Quincy Miller** and **Deuce Bello**), 2012 (**Isaiah Austin**, **Prince and Rico Gathers**), 2013 (**Ishmail Wainwright**, **Al Freeman** and **Johnathan Motley**) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (**Kendall Brown**, **Langston Love** and **Jeremy Sochan**).

Tang will be the first full-time Black head men's basketball coach and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach **Dave Baker** (1978-83), interim basketball coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85), football coach **Ron Prince** (2006-08), basketball coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach **Jordan Smith** (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, **Jared Butler**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Pierre Jackson**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Perry Jones III**, **Quincy Miller**, **Davion Mitchell**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Royce O'Neale**, **Taurean Prince**, **MaCio Teague**, **Ekpe Udoh** and **Ish Wainwright**.

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record from 2019-22 was the second-best, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts, Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer **James Akinjo**. Senior **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman **Jeremy Sochan** was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. Teammate **Kendall Brown** followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection. **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague** were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a 5-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of 4 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (**Paul & Bano Tang**) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, **Careylyn (Rey)** have a son, **Seven**, and a daughter, **Aylyn**. He also has adopted sons (**Lamar** and **Richard Hurd**).

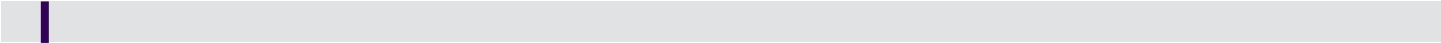

▶ K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Nov. 7 before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.

▶ Fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.

▶ Another fifth year **Abayomi "Baybe" Iyiola** posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.

▶ The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.

▶ K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.

▶ The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.

▶ For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.

▶ With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Senior **Markquis Nowell's** 4-point play with just over 5 minutes helped ignite an 8-0 run that lifted K-State to a 63-54 win over California on Nov. 11 before 3,607 fans at Haas Pavilion.

▶ Nowell hit a 3-pointer from the corner right in front of the Wildcat bench before being knocked to the ground. He calmly hit the free throw that gave K-State a 51-46 lead with 5:07 to play. Nowell, who finished with 13 points to go along with a game-high 7 assists and 3 steals, followed his 4-point with a layup then had the steal and assist on the dunk by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** that capped the 8-0 run and gave K-State a 55-46 lead with 4:02 to play.

▶ The Golden Bears closed to within 55-50 after a 3-pointer from **Devin Askew** and a free throw by **Joel Brown**, but the Wildcats responded with 6 in a row, including a pair of free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter** to go along with a layup by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and a dunk by senior **Tykei Greene**, that pushed the lead back to double figures with just over a minute to play.

▶ Nowell's clutch shot came with the momentum clearly on the side of the Golden Bears, who had used separate runs of 13-0 and 11-0 run to erase a 20-point deficit and cut the lead to 47-46 with 5:37 to play.

▶ In addition to Nowell's spectacular night, Johnson had a near double-double with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-13 field goals to go with a game-high 9 rebounds and 2 steals in a team-high 33 minutes. He was joined in double figures by Tomlin, who added 11 points to go with 2 rebounds and 2 blocks.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on 36.8 percent (21-of-57), including 26.3 percent (5-of-19) from 3-point range, and hit on a season-high 88.9 percent (16-of-18) from the free throw line. They made just 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from the field in the second half, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from beyond the arc.

▶ K-State's lull in the second half overshadowed a sensational start, in which, the Wildcats built as much as 17-point lead in the first half behind swarming defense (15 forced turnovers) and efficient offense. The lead grew to 20 points (42-22) in the early moments of the second half.

▶ Cal, which is coached by former K-State assistant **Mark Fox**, was led by a game-high 17 points by the Texas transfer **Devin Askew**.

▶ K-State again used a huge first-half performance to carry itself to victory, as the Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 77-57 win over Rhode Island on Nov. 21 before 1,256 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The Wildcats scored 44 points in the first half on a blistering 58.1 percent (18-of-31) shooting to build as much as a 21-point lead. On the defensive end, they held the Rams (1-3) to 31.3 percent (10-of-32) shooting, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from 3-point range.

▶ Although the second half was plagued by sloppy play with a combined 23 turnovers, including 13 by K-State, the lead never dipped below 15 points, and grew to many as 24 in the waning minutes.

▶ Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led a balanced attack with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, while senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **David N'Guessan** added 14 and 12 points, respectively. Johnson has now scored in double figures in all 4 games as a Wildcat, while N'Guessan and Tomlin each recorded new season-highs. Tomlin also added 5 blocked shots, which were the most by a Wildcat since **Jordan Henriquez-Roberts** in 2013.

▶ K-State had 20 assists on 28 field goals, including a stellar performance from senior **Markquis Nowell**, who was responsible for 12 of those assists to go along with 9 points and 5 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 12 assists tied for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and were the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma State on Feb. 25, 1989. The total was one assist shy of Nowell's career-high of 13 that he accomplished twice while playing at Little Rock.

▶ Nowell now has totaled 9 career games of at least 10 assists, including 4 at K-State. The 12 assists gave him 499 in his career, as he closes on the distinction of being one of just two active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1,300 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on a season-high 52.8 percent (28-of-53), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from 3-point range, and hit on 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw line. More than half (38) of the team's 77 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats again took advantage of their opponent's turnovers, turning 16 Ram miscues into 21 points.

▶ Seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 57 points, including 14 of the team's 16 points in overtime, to help lift K-State to the Championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22 before 1,200 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ After the Wildcats surrendered a 9-point lead with less than 4 minutes to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds left in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force the overtime period with 3.5 seconds remaining. The momentum carried the team in the extra period, as they dominated the game by connecting on 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the field and making 6 of their 10 free throws.

▶ Junior **David N'Guessan** gave K-State the lead for good in overtime with a driving layup with 3:48 to play, which was followed by a jumper and free throw by Johnson for an 87-82 lead. After the Wolf Pack closed to within a possession on 2 free throws by **Kenan Blackshear**, Nowell caught fire offensively, hitting on a 3-point play and a jumper to push the lead to 92-84 with 1:24 remaining.

▶ The 57 combined points by Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) were the most by Wildcat teammates since **Dean Wade** (34) and **Kamau Stokes** (23) also combined for 57 points in win at Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017. It marked just the 15th time in school history that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.

▶ Nowell finished with 29 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 free throws and 11 assists in 41 minutes to become just the fifth Wildcat with a 20-point/10-assist game in school history and just the second with a 25-point/10-assist game following **Steve Henson** in 1989.

▶ Johnson set a career-high with 28 points on 8-of-13 field goals and 10-of-11 free throws to earn his ninth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.

▶ K-State connected on a season-high 55 percent (33-of-60), including 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range, and hit on 78.6 percent (22-of-28) from the free throw line. Nearly half (44) of the team's 96 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats out-rebounded the Wolf Pack, 36-22, including 13 offensive boards that they converted into a season-high 16 second-chance points.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** jumper with 4.7 seconds helped lift K-State to a 61-59 win over LSU to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic Championship on Nov. 23 before 2,400 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The in-season tournament title was the 17th in school history and the first since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam.

▶ Johnson (16 points) and fellow seniors **Markquis Nowell** (18) and **Desi Silks** (16) combined for 50 of the 61 points, including 22 of their 28 second-half points, in which, the team rallied from an 11-point deficit with 17:27 to play.

▶ Nowell was selected as the Cayman Islands Classic Tournament MVP, while Johnson was selected to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game.

▶ K-State (6-0) had to survive some nervous moments to earn the victory, as both teams called their full allotment of timeouts (2 each) before the last 4.7 seconds played out. LSU (5-1) was able to dribble up the court and seemingly tied the game at 61-all at the buzzer. However, the officials reviewed the play and waved the shot off after they discovered that the clock didn't start on time and the shot came after the game clock had expired.

▶ It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who looked like the more rested team after playing in the early sessions in the first 2 days of the tournament and breezing past their first 2 opponents by 16 and 15 points, respectively.

▶ LSU scored 41 points in the first half on 47.1 percent (16-of-34), including 50 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range, with 3 turnovers, to build as much as a 12-point lead right before halftime. Things changed in the second half, as the Tigers managed just 18 points on 36.8 percent (7-of-19) shooting, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from long range, to go with 14 turnovers.

▶ Nowell scored his game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists in 33 minutes. Johnson, who played just 13 minutes in the second half due to foul trouble, scored his 16 points on 4-of-7 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Silks, who provided a spark off the bench, scored his season-high 16 points off 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, to go with game-high 5 assists in 33 minutes.

- The Bulldogs connected on an opponent-high 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) in the second half, while all 5 starters scored in double figures led by **Manny Bates**' 22 points.
- Despite the impressive offensive performance, the Wildcats still had chances to rally from a double-digit deficit twice in the second half. After falling behind by 14 just after halftime, senior **Markquis Nowell**'s first 3-pointer keyed a 13-4 run that closed the deficit to 48-43 with just over 14 minutes to play. However, the Bulldogs responded with a 17-2 run that pushed the lead to 20 points.
- Down 65-45 with 8:29 remaining, senior **Desi Sills** helped spark one more attempt at a comeback for K-State, as the reserve scored 13 of his 17 second-half points in a 15-3 run that cut the deficit to 68-60 with just over 4 minutes to play. However, once again, Butler had a response, rattling off 6 in a row to push the lead back to double figures en route to the 12-point victory.
- The loss spoiled an impressive night by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who collected his first double-double as a Wildcat, pouring in a team-high 20 points on 9-of-9 shooting to go with a season-high 12 rebounds. It was his 14th career double-double, including his sixth with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds. He became the ninth player in school history to go 9-of-9 or better from the field.
- Sills came off the bench to provide a big lift in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points after halftime on 8-of-12 shooting. Nowell dished out a game-high 8 assists to go with his 13 points.
- For the game, K-State connected on 46 percent (29-of-63), including just 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Wildcats had a season-high 48 points in the paint but posted season-lows in a number of categories, including just 3 free throw attempts while making 2. The team came in averaging 17.3 free throws made per game, which ranked among the top-25 nationally.

- Senior **Markquis Nowell** shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state Wichita State on Dec. 3 before a season-best crowd of 8,957 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- K-State rebounded from its first loss of the season at Butler on Nov. 30 to earn its fourth straight win over its in-state rival in the first meeting between the schools at Bramlage Coliseum since 2003.
- Although he had an off-shooting night, Nowell had a stellar all-around night for the Wildcats, adding a game-high 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals to his 11 points. He was joined in double figures by fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who led all scorers with 17 points, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who kept the team in the game early with 12 of his 14 points coming in the first half.
- It marked the second year in a row Nowell proved to be difference in a win against Wichita State. Last season, he scored 5 of his team-high 16 points in a late 7-0 run, including a dagger of a 3-pointer with 1:35 to play, that helped the Wildcats to a 65-59 win over the Shockers at INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita.
- Nowell's heroics helped spark a late rally by K-State, which trailed for more than 30 minutes and appeared to be heading for a loss until senior **Desi Sills** made perhaps the biggest play of the night with his block of **Shammah Scott**'s breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.
- Nowell tied the game with a free throw with 1:32 left then forced a steal of senior **Craig Porter, Jr.**, to set up his winning 3-pointer with 54 seconds. After his triple gave the Wildcats a 53-50 lead, he forced another bad pass on the next possession before knocking down 2 free throws for the final margin of victory.
- K-State had a season-low offense night across the board, scoring a season-low 55 points on 35.8 percent (19-of-53) shooting, including 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Big 12's best free throw shooting team also had an off night from the line, hitting on a season-low 61.9 percent (13-of-21).
- It was a tale of two halves for Wichita State, which led by as many as 7 points in the first half on 54.5 percent (12-of-22) shooting before scoring just 18 points in the second half on a mere 25.9 percent (7-of-27) shooting. For the game, the Shockers had just 5 assists on its 19 made field goals with 16 turnovers.

- ▶ K-State opened the second half with 23 consecutive points to blow open an already lopsided game, as the Wildcats capped an impressive offensive effort with a 98-50 win over UIW on Dec. 11 before 7,042 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ K-State collected its third 90-point scoring effort, narrowly missing the school's first 100-point game since 2010 in the last few minutes before opting to dribble out the ball in the closing seconds against an undermanned UIW. The Wildcats hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) from the field, including 68.8 percent (22-of-32) after halftime, and saw 7 players in double figures.
- ▶ The 9-1 start is best start by the Wildcats since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 mark, while head coach **Jerome Tang** is off to the best 10-game start by a first-year coach in school history.
- ▶ The 48-point margin of victory was the 10th-largest in school history.
- ▶ K-State busted open a close contest with a 20-1 run midway through the first half before landing the knockout punch with a 23-0 start to the second half. Six Wildcats contributed in the first-half run, including 5 points each from senior **Markquis Nowell** and freshman **Dorian Finister**. The second-half run was much the same with seven players registering points, including 3-pointers from senior **Keyontae Johnson** and juniors **Ish Massoud** and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**.
- ▶ Johnson led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with 5 assists, 4 rebounds and 3 steals in a season-low 24 minutes of action. The Wildcats' leading scorer (17.3 ppg.) has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Tomlin had a near double-double with 15 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in 23 minutes, while junior reserve **Desi Sills** added 14 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 steals.
- ▶ Sophomore **Cam Carter**, Finister and Nowell each added 10 points, as Nowell nearly notched another double-double with a game-high 8 assists to go with 5 rebounds. Finister saw his most action of the season in 22 minutes, recording his first career double-digit scoring game to go with 7 rebounds and 4 assists.
- ▶ UIW, which has 9 true or redshirt freshmen among its 16-man roster, hit on 38 percent (19-of-50) from the field, including 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range, and made 5 of 8 attempts from the free throw line. Freshman **Trey Miller** led with 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range.

- ▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson** collected his second double-double of the season to pace four Wildcats in double figures, as K-State led from nearly start to finish in earning a 71-56 win over former conference foe Nebraska in the 11th Wildcat Classic on Dec. 17 before 13,184 fans at the T-Mobile Center.
- ▶ The win helped K-State (10-1) continue its best start to a season since 2016-17, as the Wildcats snapped a 4-game skid in the T-Mobile Center while handing Nebraska (6-6) its seventh straight defeat in the series.
- ▶ Johnson led all scorers with a game-high 23 points on 9-of-13 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range, to go with a game-best 11 rebounds, 2 assists and a career-tying 4 steals in 34 minutes. It was his 15th career double-double, including his seventh with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds, while it was his 11th career 20-point contest.
- ▶ Johnson was joined in double figures by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including 2-of-5 from long range, along with senior **Markquis Nowell** and sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with 13 and 10 points, respectively. Nowell added a game-high 7 assists.
- ▶ K-State playing in its first Wildcat Classic since a 66-63 loss to Saint Louis in 2019, used a strong finish to the first half to build a double-digit lead at the break. The Wildcats continued to extend that lead in the first 11 minutes of the second half, building as much as a 19-point lead at 59-40 before Nebraska head coach **Fred Hoiberg** called a timeout with just over 9 minutes to play.
- ▶ The timeout seemed to ignite the Cornhuskers, as they rattled off 10 straight points to cut the deficit to 59-50 with under 4 minutes to play before a corner 3-pointer by freshman Jamarques Lawrence got them to within 62-55 with 1:19 remaining. However, they could get no closer as the Wildcats scored 7 straight points and 9 of the last 10 points — all from the free throw line — to close it out.

- ▶ After connecting on 48.4 percent (15-of-31), including 40 percent (6-of-15) from 3-point range, in the first half, K-State had to survive a poor second-half shooting performance, where he hit on just 31 percent (9-of-29) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-of-13) from beyond the arc. For game, the Wildcats connected on 40 percent (24-of-60) from the field, including 35.7 percent (10-of-28) from 3-point range, while making 13 of 19 free throws.

- ▶ K-State (11-1) headed into its 10-game holiday break with a 5-game winning streak, as the Wildcats continued their best start to a season since 2016-17. The 11 non-conference wins are the most since 2017-18 and tied six other teams for the third-most in a single season since 2006-07.
- ▶ Tomlin, who has now scored in double figures in 5 consecutive games, earned his first 20-point game as a Wildcat by connecting on 11-of-18 field goals, which included 4 dunks, to go with a 3-pointer and all 3 free throws attempted. He also tied a season-high with 9 rebounds to go with 2 blocks, 1 assist and 1 steal.
- ▶ Tomlin was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who shook off a poor shooting night to post 16 points on 6-of-15 shooting, as well as seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Desi Sills**, who each added 10 points. The team has now had at least four double-digit scorers in each of the last four games.
- ▶ On the strength of Tomlin's play, K-State took control of the game with a 9-0 run late in the first half then held a double-digit lead for much of the second half before a scrappy Radford (6-7) created some anxious moments for the home team. The Highlanders used a 13-2 run to cut the deficit to 71-65 with less than a minute to play. However, the Wildcats were able to hold off any further rally with a big steal from Sills on a tie-up and a pair of free throws from Johnson.
- ▶ In addition to his scoring, Nowell also dished out a game-high 11 assists to record his 11th career double-double, including his seventh at K-State, and his third of the season. His 7 career double-doubles as a Wildcat extended his school record. He reached 100 assists in 12 games, which is the fastest in school history.
- ▶ Johnson also reached a milestone, as the first of his two free throws with 20 seconds remaining gave him 1,000 points for his career. He has now scored in double figures in all 12 games this season.

- ▶ K-State connected on 49.2 percent (29-of-59) from the field, including 57.1 percent (24-of-42) from inside the 3-point arc, and hit on 66.7 percent (10-of-15) from the line. The team also tallied 46 points in the paint, which marked the third time in 4 games that they have posted 40 or more points in the paint.

▶ Senior **Markquis Nowell** scored 21 of his game-high 23 points in the second half and overtime to help K-State rally from a double-digit halftime deficit to hand No. 24/24 West Virginia an 82-76 loss in both teams' Big 12 opener on New Year's Eve before 8,199 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Nowell finished the night 3 steals shy of a triple-double, dishing out a game-high 10 assists to go with a career-tying 7 steals in 43 minutes of action. It was just the sixth 20-point/10-assist game in school history, including the second such game by Nowell after his 29-point, 11-assist effort vs. Nevada on Nov. 22.

▶ Nowell was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who scored 18 points on 6-of-13 field goals and 6-of-9 free throws, as well as fellow senior **Abayomi Iyiola** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who added 14 and 11 points, respectively. Iyiola went 6-of-7 from the field to go with a pair of clutch free throws, along with a team-high 8 rebounds.

▶ The victory was anything but easy, as the Mountaineers (10-3, 0-1 Big 12) jumped out to a 17-3 lead behind their stellar defense, which held the Wildcats without a field goal for nearly 6 minutes until a layup by Johnson with 14:04 to play before halftime. WVU led by 11 at the half, holding K-State to just 21 points on 29 percent (9-of-31) shooting, including misses on all 8 3-point attempts.

▶ Nowell sparked the Wildcats to open the second half, scoring the team's first 5 points, as they slowly started to chip away at the double-digit deficit. He tied it at 42-all on a free throw with just over 13 minutes to play before Johnson's layup 13 seconds later gave them their first lead of the contest. Six different Wildcats scored in the 23-10 run out of halftime, including 11 from Nowell.

▶ Just as the Wildcats had done to start the second half, the Mountaineers made their own comeback, using a 10-4 run to take a 63-62 lead on a layup by senior **Tre Mitchell** with 1:03 to play. A Johnson jumper and 2 free throws from Iyiola helped K-State take a 66-63 lead with 13 seconds before a wild sequence capped by a 3-pointer from **Kedrian Johnson** sent the game into overtime.

▶ The Wildcats grabbed the momentum to start overtime, scoring 11 of the first 15 points to take a 77-70 lead with 1:24 to play. Although the Mountaineers got a 3-pointer from Mitchell on the next possession, Nowell answered with his own 3-point play with 53 seconds for an 80-73 advantage and they were able to salt the game away with 2 more Nowell free throws for the final margin.

▶ All 5 starters scored in double figures, including a career-best 36 points from senior **Markquis Nowell**, as K-State broke the school record for points in a 116-103 victory at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3 to hand the Longhorns their first loss in the brand-new Moody Center before a sold-out crowd of 10,763 fans.

▶ The point total not only broke the school record, but it also tied the Big 12 record for points scored in a league game, as Baylor scored 116 in a win at Texas A&M on Jan. 23, 2008. It also set the Big 12 record for most combined points.

▶ The 116 points eclipsed the previous mark of 115, which first came against Delaware State on Dec. 7, 1991, then again vs. Fresno State in the NIT on March 24, 1994. It was also the most-ever in a road game, surpassing the 108 at Iowa State on Jan. 29, 1975, while it was most in a conference game, topping the 114 scored against Nebraska at home on Jan. 10, 1987, and the most in a Big 12 game, surpassing the 111 vs. Missouri at home on Jan. 3, 1998.

▶ According to *ESPN Stats & Info*, K-State's 116 points marked the most by an unranked team in a win over a top-10 opponent since Missouri scored 119 against Iowa State in 1988 and most-ever in a road game.

▶ Nowell led a tremendous all-around effort by the Wildcats, who connected on 61 percent (36-of-59) from the field, including 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from 3-point range, and set a school-record by hitting on 93.9 percent (31-of-33) of their attempts from the free throw line. It marked the first time the team has shot better than 60 percent against a Big 12 opponent since 2018, while the 13 treys tied for the sixth-most made in a conference game.

▶ Nowell nearly became the first player in school history with a 30-point, 10-assist game, as he dished out a game-high 9 assists to go with 3 steals in 38 minutes. His 36 points came on 9-of-14 field goals, including 6-of-9 from 3-point range, and a perfect 12-of-12 effort from the free throw line. It was the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Barry Brown, Jr.**, scored 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

▶ Nowell was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who tied his career-high with 28 points to go with a near double-double himself with a game-high 9 rebounds and 5 assists, along with a career-best 17 points from sophomore **Cam Carter**, as well as 11 and 10 points, respectively from junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** and senior **Abayomi Iyiola**.

▶ On a night when **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 56 points, it was reserve **Ish Massoud** who proved to be the difference, as his 3-pointer with 32 seconds in overtime lifted K-State to a thrilling 97-95 win over No. 19/17 Baylor on Jan. 7 before 9,211 fans at Ferrell Center.

▶ Baylor's **Adam Flagler** turned the ball over with 5.3 seconds left and Nowell was fouled immediately, making the first free throw before missing the second – snapping a streak of 29 straight makes – to allow the Bears' one more chance to either win it or force a second overtime, but junior **Caleb Lohner's** 3-pointer was off the mark, setting off a wild celebration on the Wildcat bench.

▶ K-State, which is off to its best start to a season in more than 60 years (1958-59), collected its school-record third consecutive Top 25 victory, including its second in a row over a Top 20 on the road. Although the Wildcats have won as many as 4 straight games over Top 25 opponents, including as recently as the 2018-19 season, no team had ever done it in 3 straight games.

▶ A game after combining for 64 points in the win over No. 6/6 Texas in Austin, the tandem of Nowell (32 points) and Johnson (24 points) collectively scored their 56 points on 19-of-35 field goals, including 6-of-11 from 3-point range.

▶ Nowell starred yet again, posting the first 30-point/10-assist game in school history, dishing out a career-best 14 assists to go with his 32 points. Johnson, who has now scored in double figures in all 15 games, had a near double-double with 24 points and a game-high 9 boards in a career-best 43 minutes. Massoud joined the tandem in double figures with a season-high 13 points on 3-of-4 field goals (all from 3) and a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the line.

▶ After scoring a career-best 36 points against the Longhorns, Nowell became the first Wildcat with consecutive 30-point games since **Michael Beasley** did it in 4 consecutive games from Feb. 23-March 4, 2008. Nowell's 14 dimes tied the school record for assists in a conference game, while they tied for the second-most in school history and were the most by any Wildcat in the last 40 years.

▶ Nowell's 30-point/10-assist game is just the second in Division I in the last 10 seasons, joining Oklahoma's **Trae Young** who did it against TCU in 2017.

▶ The Wildcats posted a 50/40/80 line as a team, connecting on 53.1 percent (34-of-64) from the field, including 44 percent (11-of-25) from 3-point range, while hitting on 85.7 percent (18-of-21) from the free throw line.

► Senior **Markquis Nowell** continued his impressive play with a team-high 20 points and game-high 7 assists, as No. 11/13 K-State won its first game as a ranked team in nearly 4 seasons with a gritty 65-57 win over Oklahoma State on Jan. 10 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State, which continued its best start to a season in more than 60 years, extended its winning streak to 9 games, which is the longest since a 10-game streak from Nov. 24, 2013, to Jan. 7, 2014. The team is also 4-0 to start Big 12 play for the first time since 2012-13.

► As expected, the Wildcats took the best shot of a long and athletic Oklahoma State team, which leads the Big 12 in scoring defense (61.5) and ranks third nationally in field goal percentage defense (36.4).

► The Cowboys rode that elite defense to much as a 5-point lead in the first half, including 32-30 at halftime. However, the Wildcats scored 5 of the first 7 points out of halftime to take the lead for good on a trey by junior **Ish Massoud** at 35-34 and force a timeout by coach **Mike Boynton, Jr.**, at the 17:17 mark.

► K-State twice built a 10-point lead, including 51-41, with just over 10 minutes remaining to cap a 9-0 run and 56-46 after a layup by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** with just over 7 minutes left. However, OSU make a furious comeback with 9 straight points to cut the deficit to 56-55 with 3:10 to play.

► The Wildcats were able to make key plays down the stretch to end the game on a 9-2 run, which included a highlight alley-oop dunk by senior **Keyontae Johnson** from Nowell with 38 seconds left. This 9-2 ending included a pair of free throws from senior **Abayomi Iyiola** and Nowell, the dunk by Johnson and 3 free throws from reserve senior **Desi Sills**.

► Nowell was joined in double figures by Johnson, who kept his double-digit scoring streak alive at 16 games with 12 points on 5-of-11 shooting to go with 6 rebounds and 2 assists, and Sills, who added 11 points on 3-of-8 field goals and 5-of-6 free throws to go with 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals.

► After scoring 213 points in back-to-back wins over No. 6/6 Texas and 19/17 Baylor, K-State proved it can win in a variety of ways, including on defense. The Wildcats connected on a season-low 35.6 percent (21-of-59) from the field, including 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from 3-point range, but took advantage of 16 turnovers by the Cowboys to score 19 points.

► No. 11/13 K-State saw its 9-game winning streak end on Jan. 14, as No. 17/17 TCU used its stellar defensive pressure to harass the Wildcats into 20 turnovers, which the Horned Frogs converted into 26 points, en route to an 82-68 win before 5,884 fans at Schollmaier Arena.

► TCU, which took control with a 10-0 run midway through the first half, led by 14 points at the half and by as many as 25 in the second half before K-State was able to cut the deficit to 12 on two occasions late. However, the Wildcats could go no closer, as they lost for the first time in nearly 7 weeks.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** led three players in double figures with a near double-double of 18 points and 9 rebounds in 38 minutes, while senior **Markquis Nowell** finished with 16 points but with his second-fewest assists (4) on the season to go with 2 rebounds and 2 steals in nearly 38 minutes. Senior **Tykei Greene** provided a spark in the second half with a season-high 11 points on 5-of-7 shooting. Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** grabbed a season-best 10 boards and dished out a season-high 5 assists to go with his 8 points.

► Four Horned Frogs scored in double figures led by senior **Emanuel Miller's** game-high 23 points, while sophomore **Eddie Lampkin** was a force in the paint with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting. Presaison Big 12 Player of the Year **Mike Miles, Jr.**, notched a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 11 assists.

► A motivated TCU team, which lost on a last-second shot to No. 25/25 Iowa State at home on Jan. 7 before losing an 18-point lead at No. 10/10 Texas on Wednesday, showed why they are the nation's top-ranked transition team (21.4 points per game), using its 15 steals to post a 32-13 advantage in fast-break points. The 32 fast-break points are the most allowed to an opponent since the stat has been kept starting in 2000-01.

► The Horned Frogs were efficient on the offensive end, connecting on 46.5 percent (33-of-71) from the field, while recording an opponent season-high 54 points in the paint. They had 22 assists, including a game-high 11 from Miles, with just 10 turnovers. They also were called for just 8 personal fouls.

► The Wildcats finished at 43.1 percent (28-of-65) from the field, including 28.6 percent (6-of-21) from 3-point range, while making 6 of its their 7 free throws.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** lob dunk from fellow senior **Markquis Nowell** with 25 seconds left in overtime proved to be the game-winner, as No. 13/15 K-State outlasted No. 2/2 Kansas, 83-82, in the Dillons Sunflower Showdown on Jan. 17 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State snapped a 7-game losing streak to its longtime rival in the 298th meeting and in the first top-15 matchup since 2013, while ending Kansas' 10-game overall winning streak. The Wildcats are off to their best overall start since 2009-10, while they are 5-1 in Big 12 play for the first time since 2007-08.

► The win was the eighth over the No. 2 team in the country, including the first since defeating No. 2 Baylor, 56-54, in Waco, Texas on Feb. 4, 2017, while it was the highest ranked win since knocking off No. 1 Oklahoma on Feb. 6, 2016. Overall, it was the 26th Top 5 win in school history.

► Kansas had one last chance with 11 seconds left, but junior **Ish Massoud** was able to force junior **Dajuan Harris, Jr.**, into a turnover on the baseline with only a few seconds left to preserve the victory.

► K-State is 9-0 in games decided by single digits (9 points or less), including 4-0 in overtime games.

▶ No. 13/15 Kansas State used a 14-2 run late in the second half to break a 50-all tie and pull away from Texas Tech, 68-58, on Jan. 21 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Senior **Markquis Nowell** led all scorers with a game-high 23 points to go with a season-high 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals, as K-State continued its strong start to the season. The Wildcats are off to their best start in more than 60 years, while they moved to 6-1 in Big 12 play for the first time since 2007-08.

▶ With the score knotted at 50-all, K-State took control of the game with its late 14-2 run. Senior **Abayomi Iyiola** started a run of 10 straight points with a free throw after the third media timeout with 7:27 to play, which was followed by a 3-pointer from senior **Keyontae Johnson**, layups by senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael Massoud** and a pair of free throws from Johnson that gave the Wildcats a 60-50 lead with just under 3 to play.

▶ Although Texas Tech broke the 10-0 run with a bucket from senior **Fardaws Aimaq** with under 2 minutes remaining, the Red Raiders could get no closer than the rest of the way, as Nowell sealed it with 6 consecutive free throws.

▶ Nowell was joined in double figures by Johnson, who pulled down his third double-double of the season with 15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, and Massoud, who added 12 points on 5-of-6 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range. Iyiola added 7 points, 5 rebounds and 2 assists.

▶ The Red Raiders (10-9, 0-7 Big 12), who entered the game 30th nationally in field goal percentage at 48.1 percent shooting, were held to a season-low 32.4 percent (23-of-71) shooting from the field, including 24.1 percent (7-of-29) from 3-point range, while they made just 5 of 12 free throw attempts.

▶ Texas Tech led 33-28 at the half on the strength of a 14-2 run, which was highlighted by a 3-pointer by Isaacs at the buzzer. The Raiders extended their lead to 45-37 with just over 13 minutes to play on a 10-2 run, but the Wildcats were able to answer with an 11-0 run to regain the lead at 48-45 near the midway point of the half before the game was tied up at 50 with 8:46 to play.

▶ After shooting just 34.6 percent from the field in the first half, K-State hit on 52.4 percent (11-of-21) after halftime. For the game, the Wildcats shot 42.6 percent (20-of-47) from the field, including 32 percent (8-of-25) from 3-point range, while making 74.1 percent (20-of-27) from the free throw line.

▶ In a game befitting the first top-15 matchup in the 246-game history between the schools, No. 12/13 Iowa State made the right plays at the right moments to hold off a late rally by No. 5/5 Kansas State for 80-76 win on Jan. 24 before a sold-out crowd of 14,267 fans at Hilton Coliseum.

▶ Down 59-49 with 8:12 to play, K-State made a late charge behind the play of senior **Markquis Nowell**, who scored 5 points in a 10-1 run that closed the deficit to 60-59 at the 5:43 mark. However, senior **Caleb Grill** made his only shot — a 3-pointer — on the next possession after a big offensive rebound from freshman **Tamin Lipsey** that gave ISU a 63-59 lead and more breathing room.

▶ Five times down the stretch, the Wildcats closed to within one possession but each time the Cyclones seemed to answer any big shot with one of their own to remain perfect (11-0) at home. Nowell, who continued his stellar play with a game-tying 23 points and a game-high 9 assists, missed a layup with 14 seconds left that would've pulled K-State to within 76-75. Lipsey grabbed the defensive rebound and Grill sink a pair of free throws for a 78-73 lead.

▶ Nowell gave the Wildcats' one last chance at 78-76 with 3 seconds left after he made all 3 free throws after being fouled on a 3-pointer, but senior **Jaren Holmes** was able to knock down both free throws for the final margin.

▶ Nowell continued his stellar play with another near double-double, scoring a game-tying 23 points to go with a game-high 9 assists in 38 minutes. He has now scored 20 or more points 7 times this season, including on 6 occasions in Big 12 play. He was one of four Wildcats in double figures, as senior **Keyontae Johnson** grabbed his fourth double-double, including his second straight, with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while sophomore **Cam Carter** and junior **Ismael Massoud** finished with 15 and 13 points, respectively.

▶ Both teams shot better than 50 percent from the field in the game, including an opponent-high 57.1 percent (28-of-49) by Iowa State, which finished with advantages in points off turnovers (25-13), points in the paint (34-28) and second-chance points (17-7). K-State was able to hit on 52.1 percent (25-of-48) of its field goals, including a season-best 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from 3-point range. The 76 points were the most allowed this season by the Cyclones.

▶ The loss spoiled the Wildcats' debut as a Top 5 team, which is the highest in more than a decade since also ranking No. 5 on Dec. 6, 2010.

▶ No. 5/5 K-State turned up the defensive pressure, holding Florida to a season-low 50 points on 31 percent shooting, as the Wildcats snapped a 4-game losing streak in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge with a 64-50 win over the Gators on Jan. 28 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ K-State (18-3) continued its best start to a season in nearly 50 years, as the Wildcats earned their first win in the Challenge series since a 56-51 win over Georgia at home on Jan. 27, 2018. The team also finished its non-conference season at 12-1, which is the best mark since going 13-1 in 2009-10.

▶ After allowing 80 points on 57 percent shooting in the loss to No. 12/12 Iowa State on Tuesday, K-State set the tone for the game in the first half, playing its best defensive half of the season, as the Wildcats allowed just 16 points to the Gators (12-9) on just 20.7 percent (6-of-29) shooting.

▶ K-State, which never trailed in the contest, took advantage of its top-notch defensive effort to build as much as a 21-point advantage in the first half, as the Wildcats ended the half with an 11-0 run. Although Florida opened the second half with a 10-0 run that cut the deficit to 37-26, the lead never dipped below double figures, as K-State put the game away with an 11-1 run that pushed its lead to a game-high 23 points with 5 minutes remaining.

▶ The 50 points tied for an opponent-low, also done in wins over Wichita State and UIW, while it was the lowest field goal percentage by opponent this season.

▶ It was a special night for senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who recorded his third consecutive double-double, against his former team. He played his first 3 years for the Gators before a medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020, sidelined him for much of his junior (2020-21) and all of his senior season (2021-22).

▶ Johnson finished with a game-tying 13 points and game-best 11 rebounds for his 18th career double-double and his fifth of the season. He was among 3 Wildcats in double figures, along with senior **Markquis Nowell** (13 points) and junior **NaeQwan Tomlin** (11 points). In all, five players had at least 9 points.

▶ Nowell flirted with the school's first triple-double, as he collected 13 points, a career-tying 9 rebounds and a game-high 8 assists in 33 minutes. Tomlin added 11 points and 6 rebounds. Sophomore **Cam Carter** had all-around solid night with 9 points, 5 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals in nearly 30 minutes.

► No. 7/6 K-State could not overcome a poor shooting night, as the Wildcats shot a season-low 33.9 percent from the field in falling 90-78 to No. 8/8 Kansas in the 299th edition of the Dillons Sunflower Showdown on Jan. 31 before a sold-out crowd of 16,300 at Allen Fieldhouse.

► In just the 10th meeting as Top 10 opponents, including the first time since 2010, the Jayhawks took control of the game with a 13-3 run over a pivotal stretch late in the first half to take a 49-37 lead into the half. The Wildcats got to within striking distance at 54-48 with just under 16 to play and within single digits at 83-74 with 2:28 left but could get no closer in falling for the 17th consecutive time at Allen Fieldhouse.

► The tandem of seniors **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell** were impressive despite the loss, combining for 45 points, while Johnson collected his team-leading sixth double-double, including his fourth in a row, with 22 points and 12 rebounds. Nowell earned his team-best eighth 20-point game of the season with a team-best 23 points.

► Juniors **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** and **David N'Guessan** also registered double figures with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Tomlin had a near double-double for the second consecutive game against the Jayhawks, grabbing 8 rebounds. N'Guessan performed well in his first Big 12 start, scoring his 10 points to go with 6 rebounds in more than 30 minutes. He had missed the first 6 Big 12 games due to injury and only played 4 minutes off the bench vs. Texas Tech.

► Kansas (18-4, 6-3 Big 12) got a stellar effort from All-American candidate **Jalen Wilson**, who had a near double-double with 20 points and 8 rebounds. However, it was two players — junior **Dejuan Harris, Jr.**, and senior **Kevin McCullar, Jr.** — who had poor games in the previous loss to K-State on Jan. 17 who helped the Jayhawks even the season series. The duo combined for 34 points, including a career-tying 18 from Harris on 7-of-12 shooting while McCullar added a double-double with 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds.

► Neither team shot the ball well, as Kansas hit on 40.3 percent (27-of-67) from the field, including 40.7 percent (11-of-27) from 3-point range, compared to the 33.9 percent (20-of-59) from K-State, including 33.3 percent (7-of-21) from long range. However, each team took advantage of the 47 personal fouls in the game, combining 56 points, as the Wildcats shot 86.1 percent (31-of-36) from the free throw line, while the Jayhawks made 71.4 percent (25-of-35) from the stripe.

► No. 10/9 Texas rallied from a 14-point deficit with an impressive second-half effort, as the Longhorns handed No. 7/6 K-State its first home loss with a 69-66 win on Feb. 4 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State had one last chance to send the game to overtime with 5 seconds left, but junior **Ishmael Massoud's** 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer, as Texas (19-4, 8-2) extended its lead in the Big 12 standings.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** led three Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 16 points on 6-of-10 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range, in 24 minutes. Senior **Desi Sills** chipped in 11 points, 5 rebounds and 3 assists, while senior **Markquis Nowell** added 10 points, 6 rebounds and 3 assists.

► Down by 14 points in the first half and 11 at halftime after shooting just 30.4 percent (7-of-23) from the field, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from 3-point range, the Longhorns came out on fire to start the second half, using a 14-4 run to close the deficit to 40-39 just after the first media timeout

► K-State stayed ahead for the next few minutes before a layup by **Christian Bishop** and a 3-pointer from **Sir Jabari Parker** gave Texas the lead for the first time at 51-48 with just over 10 minutes left. Twice, they built the lead to 6 points before K-State rallied to tie the game at 64-64 on a 12-6 spurt that included production from four players, including 4 points from Sills.

► The teams traded the lead over the next few minutes, including a floater by Nowell for a 66-65 lead with just over a minute to play before a driving layup by Bishop and two free throws by Parker provided the final margin.

► After shooting 30.4 percent in the first half, Texas responded by connecting on 57.1 percent (16-of-28) in the second half, including 42.9 percent (3-of-7) from 3-point range. The Longhorns finished at 45.1 percent (23-of-51) from the field, including 25 percent (4-of-16) from long range. They were stellar from the free throw line, knocking down 79.2 percent (19-of-24).

► For the game, K-State hit on 44 percent (22-of-50) from the field, including 31.6 percent (6-of-19) from 3-point range, and made 80 percent (16-of-20) from the line. The Wildcats connected on 46.2 percent (12-of-26) in first half.

► The game included 36 combined turnovers with each team scoring 19 points off those miscues, while the teams had 40 combined personal fouls.

► Five Wildcats scored in double figures, including a game-high 18 points from senior **Markquis Nowell**, as No. 12/11 K-State snapped a 2-game losing streak with a near wire-to-wire 82-61 victory over No. 19/17 TCU on Feb. 7 before a crowd of 8,667 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Nowell also dished out a game-high 7 assists, giving him 187 for the season, which broke the single-season school record of 186 set by **Steve Henson** in 1987-88. In addition, his 18 points helped him eclipse 1,700 in his college career.

► The Wildcats had five or more players score in double figures for the fourth time this season and the second time in Big 12 play and the first since Texas on Jan. 3. Nowell was joined in double figures by seniors **Keyontae Johnson** and **Desi Sills**, who each scored 14 points, while senior reserve **Tykei Greene** nearly registered a double-double with season-highs in both points (13) and rebounds (9) to go with 10 points from junior **David N'Guessan**.

► Leading 36-30 at the half, K-State took control with an impressive second-half performance, as the Wildcats scored 46 points after halftime on 61.5 percent (16-of-26) shooting with 26 coming in the paint. Despite the offensive output, the game was still in the balance with under 5 minutes to play after TCU cut the deficit to 65-59 after a 6-0 run to force a timeout by head coach **Jerome Tang**.

► The timeout seemed to ignite K-State, as 2 free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter** started a streak of 15 consecutive points, as the Wildcats ended the game on a 17-2 run to snap a 3-game losing streak to the Horned Frogs at home and a 3-game skid in Big 12 play. Five players contributed to the run, including 5 points from Johnson, 4 from Greene and Nowell and 2 from Carter and Sills.

► The Wildcats frustrated the Horned Frogs into 19 turnovers, including 13 in the first half, converting those into 15 points, while holding the nation's top-ranked fast-break team (20.7 ppg.) to just 10. After giving 20 second-chance points on 14 offensive rebounds in the first meeting on Jan. 14, they allowed just 3 second-chance points on 6 offensive rebounds in the rematch.

► For the game, K-State hit on 45.9 percent (28-of-61) from the field, including 36.8 percent (7-of-19) from 3-point range, while hitting on

▶ No. 12/11 K-State had numerous chances to take the lead in the final minutes but could not quite make the right play at the right time in falling 71-63 at Texas Tech on Feb. 11 before a crowd of 12,973 at United Supermarkets Arena.

▶ The Wildcats had opportunities to win the game down the stretch despite a season-high 23 turnovers which the Red Raiders converted into 28 points. It is the most points allowed to an opponent via turnovers since Texas Tech scored 30 in a win at Bramlage Coliseum on Jan. 17, 2020.

▶ Seven times in the last 12 minutes K-State was within one possession and each time Texas Tech had an answer. The Red Raiders responded with 3-point plays after the Wildcats closed to within 2 points at 43-41 and 46-44 midway through the second half.

▶ K-State closed to 50-49 on 2 free throws by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and a 3-pointer from reserve **Desi Sills** with under 9 minutes to play then again at 52-51 on 2 more free throws by senior **Markquis Nowell** with 8:19 remaining. However, each time Texas Tech made a clutch shot, including a dunk by junior **D'Maurian Williams** after the Sills' 3-pointer and a layup by senior **De'Vion Harmon**, who led all scorers with 20 points, after Nowell's free throws.

▶ Two more free throws by Nowell gave the Wildcats' one last opportunity at 62-61 with 1:45 to play, but the Red Raiders were able to answer with a layup from sophomore **Jaylon Tyson** that ignited a 9-2 run to end the game that included a jumper from Harmon and 4 free throws from senior **Kevin Obanor**.

▶ Nowell led three players in double figures with 18 points, while Sills and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** added 12 and 10 points, respectively. Johnson did not reach double figures for the first time this season, scoring 9 points on 3-of-11 field goals but he did grab a game-high 8 rebounds to go with 3 assists.

▶ For the game, K-State hit on just 35.2 percent (19-of-54) of its field goals, including 23.1 percent (6-of-26) from long range, while hitting on 67.9 percent (19-of-28) from the free throw line. Although the Wildcats were able to turn the Red Raiders over 18 times, they scored just 14 points off those miscues.

▶ Texas Tech got a spirited effort from Harmon — the transfer from Oklahoma and Oregon — who led all scorers with 20 points. Three others scored in double figures, including 13 from freshman **Lamar Washington** off the bench.

▶ Oklahoma hit on an opponent season-tying 11 3-pointers, including 3 during a key 12-0 run early in the second half, as the Sooners earned a 79-65 win over No. 12/14 K-State on Tuesday before a crowd 5,167 at the Lloyd Noble Center.

▶ Oklahoma saw five players connected on at least one 3-pointer, including 3 each by senior **Grant Sherfield** and freshman **Milos Uzan**, as the Sooners tied an opponent season-high with 11 made triples while making 47.8 percent of their shots from beyond the arc. The Wildcats entered with the Big 12's best and nation's 12th-best 3-point field goal percentage defense at 28.6 percent.

▶ Sherfield led all scorers with 22 points to go with a game-tying 6 assists and 8 rebounds to help the Sooners snap a 4-game losing streak.

▶ Oklahoma carried the momentum of a 3-pointer by Sherfield that knotted the score at 36-all right before halftime into the second half, using the 12-0 run to build a double-digit lead with just over 16 minutes to play. Sherfield, senior **Tanner Groves** and Uzan all hit treys during the run.

▶ Down 60-45 midway through the second half, the Wildcats got some positive momentum with an 8-1 run that cut the deficit to 61-53 with over 7 minutes to play. However, the Sooners ended any hopes of a further comeback with a 9-1 run, which was capped by a 3-pointer from sophomore **Bijan Cortes** — the team's 11th trey — that extended the lead to 70-54 with 4:50 remaining.

▶ Overall, the Sooners scored their 79 points on 51 percent (25-of-49) shooting, including 43 points after halftime on 61.1 percent (11-of-18) shooting.

▶ K-State saw four players score in double figures led by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who collected his second double-double with 17 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** each scored 14 points, while fellow senior **Abayomi Iyiola** added 11 points.

▶ Sherfield was joined in double figures by Groves, who had 16 points on 5-of-7 field goals, including 2-of-3 from long range, as well as Uzah and senior **Jalen Hill**, who scored 13 and 12 points, respectively.

▶ Oklahoma has now won 3 straight in the series with K-State, along with the last 3 at the Lloyd Noble Center.

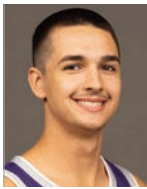
