OPENING TIP

► No. 15/13 K-State (25-9, 11-7 Big 12) will make its 18th trip to the Sweet 16 and the first since 2018 when the 3-seed Wildcats meet 7-seed Michigan State (21-12, 11-8 Big Ten) in the first game of the East Regional Semifinals at 5:30 p.m., CT on Thursday night at the World's Most Famous Arena - Madison Square Garden - in New York City. The game will air on TBS with **Brian Anderson** (play-by-play), **Jim Jackson** (analyst) and **Allie LaForce** (reporter) on the call. The winner will advance to play either No. 4 seed Tennessee (25-10, 11-7 SEC) or No. 9 seed Florida Atlantic (33-3, 18-2 C-USA) on Saturday in the East Regional Final for a trip to the Final Four.

KEY STORYLINES

► K-State earned its way to the Sweet 16 with impressive wins over 14-seed Montana State (77-65) on March 17 and 6-seed Kentucky (75-69) on March 19 at the East Regional First/Second Rounds at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. The Wildcats hit on 58.2 percent (32-of-55) from the field, including 65.4 percent (17-of-26) in the second half, to knock off the Bobcats. They used a late second-half 8-0 run, keyed by 3-pointers from junior **Ismael Massoud** and senior **Keyontae Johnson**, to defeat the Wildcats for the second consecutive meeting.

► National Coach of the Year finalist **Jerome Tang** is the first K-State head coach to guide his team to the Sweet 16 in his first season, while posting just the eighth 25-win season in school history and the first since 2017-18. His 25 wins tie for the second-most by a first-time Division I coach this season, trailing just Duke's **Jon Scheyer** (27-9).

► Seniors **Markquis Nowell** (44 points) and **Keyontae Johnson** (31 points) combined for 75 of the Wildcats' 152 points in the wins over Montana State and Kentucky. It was right on average for the duo, who are averaging 34.6 points per game to rank fourth among power conferences. They have been named to several All-America Teams, including Third Team by The Associated Press, while both are finalists for the Bob Cousy and Julius Erving Awards.

► Nowell has had a spectacular start to the NCAA Tournament, combining for 44 points and 23 rebounds in the wins over Montana State (10 points, 14 assists) and Kentucky (27 points, 9 assists). He is one of 2 players since 1990, along with Murray State's **Ja Morant**, to combine for 40 points and 20 assists before the Sweet 16. He collected his eighth double-double this season vs. Montana State, while tying for the ninth-most assists in an NCAA Tournament. His 27 points vs. Kentucky were the most by a Wildcat in the NCAA Tournament since 2012. He ranks among the top-20 nationally in 7 categories, including second in assists/game (7.8 apg.) and third in total assists (266), while he ranks first in the Big 12 in an astounding 8 categories.

► Johnson is the comeback story of the year in sports after arriving at K-State in August having not played basketball in nearly 2 seasons since his medical emergency while playing at Florida on Dec. 12, 2020. He has led the Wildcats in both scoring (17.5 ppg.) and rebounding (7.0 rpg.) while scoring in double figures in 33 of 34 games with 9 20-point games and 6 double-doubles. He paced the team in both scoring (18) and rebounding (8) vs. Montana State.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: MICHIGAN STATE (21-12)

► Michigan State (21-12, 11-8 Big Ten) enters the matchup on Thursday with victories in 7 of the last 10 games, including wins over 10-seed USC (72-62) and 2-seed Marquette (69-60) to open NCAA Tournament play. This stretch has come after winning just 2 in a 7-game span in the middle of Big Ten play.



► Michigan State is making its 36th trip to the NCAA Tournament, including its 25th consecutive appearance. The Spartans are making their 21st Sweet 16 appearance, including their 15th under Hall of Fame coach **Tom Izzo**.

► Michigan State is averaging 70.2 points on 45.1 percent shooting, including 38.7 percent from 3-point range, with 35.6 rebounds, 14.5 assists, 4.8 steals and 2.9 blocks per game, while allowing 67 points on 41.9 percent shooting, including 31.9 percent from 3-point range. The Spartans are connecting on 75.7 percent from the free throw line.

► Michigan State is among the best 3-point shooting teams in the country, ranking eighth in 3-point field goal percentage (38.7). The Spartans are also first in the Big Ten in free throw percentage, while they are second in defensive rebounds (26.7) and third in rebounding margin (+2.9).

► Three players are averaging in double figures led by All-Big Ten Second Team selection **Tyson Walker**, who paces the Spartans at 14.8 points per game on 46.2 percent shooting, including 40.7 percent from 3-point range. Graduate **Joey Hauser** is just behind Walker at 14.3 points per game on 48.5 percent shooting, including 46.2 percent from 3-point range, to go with a team-best 7.1 rebounds. Junior **A.J. Hoggard** also averages double figures at 12.5 points game, while dishing out 5.9 assists per outing.

► Michigan State is led by Izzo, who has a 687-278 (.712) record in his 28th season on the sideline. He has taken the Spartans to eight Final Fours (1999, 2000, 2001, 2005, 2009, 2010, 2015, 2019) and the 2000 national title.

SERIES HISTORY

► Michigan State leads the all-time series, 5-2, in this, the first meeting since the Spartans swept a home-and-home series in head coach **Tom Izzo's** first 2 seasons in 1995-96 and 1996-97. MSU won 67-54 in Manhattan on Dec. 16, 1995 then 75-43 on Dec. 21, 1996 at home. Overall, MSU has won 3 in a row, which includes a 72-68 win at the Great Alaska Shootout in 1989.

► The series dates all the way back to a home-and-home series in 1952 and 1954, which was swept by the Spartans.

► K-State has not defeated Michigan State since a 66-56 win in East Lansing on Dec. 1, 1962. The other Wildcat win came at Allen Fieldhouse, 104-82, in the Sunflower Doubleheader on Dec. 17, 1960.

► This will be the first meeting in the NCAA Tournament.

K-STATE ADVANCES TO SWEET 16
THE CATS TO FACE (7) MICHIGAN STATE

► No. 15/13 K-State (25-9) will be making its 18th appearance in the Sweet 16 and the first since 2018 when the 3-seed Wildcats face 7-seed Michigan State (21-12, 11-8 Big Ten) at 5:30 p.m., CT on Thursday in the East Regional Semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

► K-State rated as the No. 11 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, including the third among the four No. 3 seeds (behind Baylor and Gonzaga). The No. 3 seed is the second highest by a Wildcat team since seeding began in 1979 and the highest since the 2010 team was selected as a No. 2 seed.

► K-State is making its 39th postseason appearance, which includes 32 in the NCAA Tournament and 7 in the Postseason NIT. The program has now advanced to the postseason 12 times in the last 17 seasons (10 trips to NCAA Tournament and two to the NIT). The 32 overall bids rank 22nd nationally, including fourth among Big 12 schools (Kansas [51], Texas [37] and Oklahoma [33]).

► The program has posted a 39-35 record in NCAA Tournament play, including 13-5 in the regional semifinals. The school is making its fifth appearance (1975, 1989, 1996, 2012) in the East Regional and is 5-4 all-time in the region. This will be the second meeting in the East Regional Semifinals and the first since beating Boston College, 74-65, on March 20, 1975 at the Providence Civic Center.

► In K-State's NCAA Tournament history, the Wildcats have advanced to the Sweet 16 a total of 18 times. The program has also reached the Elite Eight 12 times, made 4 Final Four appearances and played in one National Championship.

► Tang is the 10th head coach to lead K-State to the NCAA Tournament dating back to 1948. Tang was part of 10 NCAA Tournament appearances during his stint as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, which included 5 trips to the Sweet 16 (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), 3 in the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and a Final Four and national championship in 2021.

► Prior to last week's games, **Jerrell Colbert**, **Abayomi Iyiola**, **Keyontae Johnson**, **David N'Guessan** and **Desi Sills** had been a part of teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in their careers. Johnson (Florida), N'Guessan (Virginia Tech) and Sills (Arkansas) had all played in NCAA Tournament games, including Johnson in 2019, N'Guessan and Sills in 2021 and N'Guessan in 2022. Sills was part of an Arkansas team that advanced to the Elite Eight in 2021.

Below is a timeline on building K-State back from a 14-17 season in 2021-22 to its current 25-9 record and No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Only 2 players (**Markquis Nowell** and **Ismail Massoud**) stayed upon **Jerome Tang** hiring, while a high school signee (**Taj Manning**) decided to keep his commitment.

■ TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

'CATS WINS CAYMAN ISLANDS CLASSIC

► K-State won its 17th in-season tournament title, as the Wildcats knocked off Rhode Island (77-57), Nevada (96-87 in overtime) and LSU (61-59) to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic on Nov. 21-23. It was the team's first tournament title since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The 3 wins gave K-State its first 6-0 start since the 2018-19 season.



► Senior **Markquis Nowell** was selected the Cayman Islands Classic MVP and to the all-tournament team, while fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson** was named to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the 3-game tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game. For his efforts, Nowell was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28.

► After breezing past Rhode Island, 77-57, in the first round, K-State had to fight through tight contests with Nevada in the semifinals and LSU in the finals to earn the title. After surrendering a 9-point lead to the Wolf Pack with 4:08 to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds remaining in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force overtime with 3.5 seconds. The Wildcats were able to carry the momentum in the extra period, as they hit on 5 of 6 from the field and 6 of 10 free throw line to win 96-87.

► The Wildcats then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to the Tigers in the title game, using their defense to allow 18 points after halftime on 36.8 percent shooting while forcing 14 turnovers en route to a 61-59 victory. Nowell led all scorers with 18 points.



NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

► With the 64-50 win over Florida in the final SEC/Big 12 Challenge on Jan. 28, K-State completed its non-conference schedule with a 12-1 mark, including a perfect 8-0 in home games (Nebraska was played at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City is considered a home game).

► The 12-1 record is the best non-conference record since the Wildcats won a program-best 13 non-conference games in 2009-10. The teams also won 12 non-conference games in both 2008-09 (12-3) and 2010-11 (12-3). K-State had won just 19 non-conference games, including 16 at home, in the 3 seasons (2019-20 to 2021-22) before this season.

► K-State has posted a 171-53 (.762) record in non-conference play since 2006-07. During that span, the Wildcats have a 129-14 (.901) mark at home venues (includes games at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City in non-conference play, including a 119-12 (.908) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

TANG EARNS BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR

► First-year coach **Jerome Tang** was selected as the Big 12 Coach of the Year both by the league coaches and the AP after guiding K-State to a 23-8 record and a tie for third place with an 11-7 mark in the nation's toughest conference despite being picked last in the preseason poll. He becomes the seventh coach in school history to earn league Coach of the Year honors, including the third in the Big 12 era (joining **Frank Martin** and **Bruce Weber**) and the first since 2013.

► K-State's 25-9 start under **Jerome Tang** is the second-best by a first-year coach in school history behind **Zora G. Clevenger**, who went 15-2 in 1916-17. It ranks among the best by any first-year head coach in Division I, trailing just Duke's **Jon Scheyer** (27-9). He joins Xavier's **Sean Miller** as the only first-year Division I head coaches to advance his team to the Sweet 16 in 2023.

► Tang has been named a finalist for a number of national coaching honors, including the Ben Jobe Award (top Division I minority coach), Joe B. Hall Award (top first-year coach) and Jim Phelan Award as well as the Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year Award.

► This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he led Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships from 1993-2003. He also twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record.

A TEAM OF WINNERS

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** has remarked on a number of occasions that he recruited a team 'full of winners' as exemplified by the number of championships that the collective group has won in their careers.

► There are a combined 8 state championships among the 15 players on the roster, including 2 each won by seniors **Desi Sills** and **Abayomi Iyiola** and true freshmen **Taj Manning**. In addition, sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and true freshman **Dorian Finister** also won state titles during their senior seasons.

► In addition to the high school success, a number of players have been a part of winning college programs, including Sills and Iyiola being members of Arkansas' Elite Eight team in 2021 and senior **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida) and junior **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech) being a part of 2 NCAA Tournaments.

► This championship mentality stretches to the staff, as associate head coach **Urfic Maligi** has been part of 5 NCAA Tournament and 5 conference title teams. Assistant coach **Jareem Dowling** has been involved with teams that have won 4 conference titles and earned 4 postseason trips, while assistant **Rodney Perry** led Link Academy to a national runner-up finish at the 2022 GEICO National Tournament before helping MOKAN Elite to its third Nike Peach Jam title.

SPECIAL PERFORMANCE

► K-State enjoyed a special night on offense in its 116-103 win over No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, as the Wildcats not only broke the school record for points but also tied the Big 12 record in handling the Longhorns their first loss (and only one in 2022-23) in the brand-new Moody Center.

► The 116 points eclipsed the previous school-record mark of 115, which first came vs. Delaware State on Dec. 7, 1991, then again vs. Fresno State in the NIT on March 24, 1994. It was also the most-ever in a road game, surpassing the 108 at Iowa State on Jan. 29, 1975, while it was most in a conference game, topping the 114 scored vs. Nebraska at home on Jan. 10, 1987, and the most in a Big 12 game, surpassing the 111 vs. Missouri at home on Jan. 3, 1998.

► According to *ESPN Stats & Info*, K-State's 116 points in the win at No. 6/6 Texas marked the most by an unranked team in a win over a top-10 opponent since Missouri scored 119 against Iowa State in 1988.

► All 5 starters scored in double figures, including a career-best 36 points from senior **Markquis Nowell** and a career-tying 28 by senior **Keyontae Johnson**. The 64 combined points tied for the fourth-most by a duo in school history and most since 2008, while it marked just the 16th time (including the second time this season) that tandem has each had at least 25 points in a game. Nowell's 36 points are the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Barry Brown, Jr.**, scored 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

► As a team, the Wildcats connected on 61 percent (36-of-59) from the field, including 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from 3-point range, and set a school-record by hitting on 93.9 percent (31-of-33) from the free throw line. It marked the first time the team has shot better than 60 percent against a Big 12 opponent since 2018, while the 13 treys tied for the sixth-most made in a conference game.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State's overtime 96-87 win over Nevada in the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.

► The Wildcats have a 1,720-1,222 (.584) all-time record as a program, which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships.

FOOTBALL/BASKETBALL SUCCESS

► The K-State men's basketball and football teams are having historically great seasons, as the 2022-23 season marks the seventh time in Big 12 history (and first since 2015-16) a school has won a football conference championship and gone to the Sweet 16 in the same athletics season.

POTENT OFFENSIVE ATTACK

► K-State is averaging 75.5 points this season on 45.8 percent (896-of-1957) shooting, including 33.6 percent (237-of-706) from 3-point range, while hitting on 75.2 percent (539-of-717) from the line. The Wildcats lead the Big 12 in assists (16.8 apg.), while are second in free throw percentage, fourth in scoring offense and assist/turnover ratio (1.19) and fifth in scoring margin (+6.62).

► The season point total (2,568) is the fourth-best in school history and the most since scoring 2,630 points in 2017-18, while the Wildcats put up the most points in a conference season with 1,384 in Big 12 play. The scoring average (75.5 ppg.) is just outside the top-10 the single season top-10 and the highest since the 2009-10 team averaged 79.7 points per game. The 76.9 points average in Big 12 play is the sixth-best in a conference season and best since 2007-08.

► The Wildcats broke the single-season assist record (571) with their win over Kentucky on Sunday, breaking their tie with the 2012-13 team. The current 45.8 field goal percentage ties for the ninth-best in the shot clock era (1985-86) and the highest since 2017-18 (46.3 percent).

► K-State has scored 80 or more points 11 times, including 5 games of 90 or more points highlighted by the school-record 116-point effort in the win at No. 6/6 Texas (1/3/23), which was the first 100-point game since 2011. It is the most games of 80 or more points since posting a school-record 22 in 2009-10 and most games of 90 or more points since also totaling 5 in 2009-10.

► Twice this season the Wildcats have had 2 players (**Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson**) score 25 or more points in the same game, which hadn't happened since 2010. Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) combined for 57 points in the overtime win over Nevada (11/22/22) before they went for 64 in the win at No. 6/6 Texas (1/3/23), which ties for the fourth-most by a duo in school history and the most since **Michael Beasley** and **Bill Walker** at Baylor in 2008.

► K-State has connected on better than 50 percent of its field goals in 9 games, including back-to-back vs. Rhode Island (11/21/22) and Nevada (11/22/22) and ACU (12/6/22) and UIW (12/11/22). The team hit on a season-best 60 percent (36-of-60) vs. Texas (1/3/23), which included a season-high 13 3-pointers, and a school-record performance from the free throw line of 93.9 percent (31-of-33).

DISHING THE ROCK

► K-State ranks among the best in sharing the basketball, as the Wildcats rank ninth nationally and first in the Big 12 with 16.8 assists per game. Among the school-record 571 assists are 8 players with double-digit totals, including senior **Markquis Nowell**, who ranks second nationally in assists/game (7.8) and third in total assists (266). Nowell, who has double-digit assists in 9 games, became the school's single-season assist leader with his 7 dimes in the win over TCU.

► The Wildcats also rank in the top-10 with a 63.7 assist percentage according to *KenPom*, which calculates assists (571) to made field goals (896). Only Lafayette (68.8), Tennessee (66.4), Virginia (65.4), Air Force (64.9), Arizona (64.7) and Xavier (64.1) have a better percentage nationally.

► Although Nowell gets all the attention for his playmaking ability, the rest of the team has shared the ball, as the Wildcats have had 3 or more players dish out at least 2 assists in 27 of 34 games. The team had 7 players with 2 or more assists vs. UTRGV (11/7/22), while 6 vs. Nebraska (12/17/22) and Baylor (1/3/23) and 5 vs. UIW (12/11/22), Texas (1/3/23), TCU (twice) and Texas Tech (1/21/23).

TEAM FULL OF SCORERS

► K-State is one of just 15 schools to have at least four 1,000-point scorers on its roster, as Wildcats **Tykei Greene** (1,198 points), **Keyontae Johnson** (1,385 points), **Markquis Nowell** (1,891 points) and **Desi Sills** (1,399 points) have all reached the milestone in their Division I careers. Only Johnson, who did it against Radford (12/21/22), and Nowell have reached the mark while at K-State.

► K-State has now six 1,000-point scorers if you count senior walk-on **Nate Awbrey**, who scored 1,032 points in his 4-year career at Manhattan Christian College, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at Monroe (2019-20) and Chipola Colleges (2020-22).

► Missouri had 6 1,000-point scorers followed by Notre Dame, Penn State, San Diego, UAB and Youngstown State with 5, while K-State joins 13 other schools (including Big 12 foes Iowa State and Texas) with 4 such scorers.

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 417-145 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 417 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State finished the 2022-23 campaign with a 15-1 record at Bramlage Coliseum, which included an 8-1 mark vs. Big 12 foes. The 15 wins tie for the second-most in the arena's history and are the most since also winning 15 in 2013-14, while the 15-1 record is the best since going 16-1 in 2012-13.

► K-State has registered a 217-65 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including a 95-53 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 217 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 95 league victories at home are among the tops in the Big 12.

► K-State has defeated 46 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 43 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,000 for the 2022-23 season.

BENCH PRODUCTION

► K-State is getting solid production from its bench this season, as the Wildcats are averaging 16.9 points per game. The team has scored 20 or more bench points 10 times this season, including a season-best 41 vs. UTRGV.

► Before starts in 7 of the last 8 games, senior **Desi Sills** had made a huge impact from the bench, scoring in double figures 11 times, including a season-high 24 points in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas. Junior **Ismael Massoud** has also proved to be a spark of the bench, posting 4 double-digit scoring games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

► K-State's defense has forced 506 turnovers this season, which includes 266 steals, while averaging 16.3 points per game off those miscues. The Wildcats' 14.9 turnovers forced per game ranks 37th nationally, including fourth in the Big 12. They are fifth in the league in steals/game (7.8 spg.), which includes steals leader **Markquis Nowell** (2.41 spg.).

► K-State has scored 20 or more points off turnovers 8 times with a season-high 31 points off 26 UTRGV (11/7/22) turnovers in the opener. The Wildcats scored 20+ points off miscues in back-to-back games vs. Kansas City (11/17/22; 26 points) and Rhode Island (11/21/22; 21 points) and Oklahoma (3/1/23; 20 points) and West Virginia (3/4/23; 20 points).

► K-State is 19-2 this season when the Wildcats have less or equal turnovers than their opponents, while they are 6-7 when they have more turnovers.

PLAYER NOTES

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

► Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Nov. 7 in the opener with UTRGV after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points, 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.

► Johnson was named the *March Madness* National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 14, as he averaged 14.5 points on 47.6 percent (10-of-21) shooting, including 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3-point range, to go with 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the Wildcats' first 2 wins.

► Johnson helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic and was named to the All-Tournament team, as he averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with a team-best 6.0 rebounds in 32.3 minutes per game.

► Johnson was selected for the Newcomer award 3 more times since the start of Big 12 play, including Jan. 9 after posting consecutive 20-point games in wins at No. 6/6 Texas and No. 19/17 Baylor, Jan. 23 after his 24-point effort in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas and double-double vs. Texas Tech and Feb. 27 after averaging 21 points in wins vs. No. 9/10 Baylor and at Oklahoma State. The 5 total awards are the most since **Michael Beasley** won it 8 times in 2007-08.

► Johnson has scored in double figures in a team-best 33 games, leading the Wildcats and ranking third in the Big 12 in scoring (17.5 ppg.). He is the league leader in field goal percentage (51.4), while he ranks in the top-15 in 5 other categories. He is one of two Big 12 players (Kansas' **Jalen Wilson**) rank in the league's top-5 in scoring and rebounding in overall and conference-only games.

► Johnson was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year by both the league coaches and the AP as well as a First Team All-Big 12. He has been chosen as a finalist for the Naismith and John R. Wooden Awards as well as the Julius Erving Award, which goes to the top small forward, and twice named an All-American.

NOWELL RUNNING THE SHOW

► On a team with 13 new players and a new staff, fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** has been the guy running the show for the Wildcats, as he leads in both assists (7.8 apg.) and steals (2.4 spg.) while averaging the second-most points (17.1 ppg.). An All-Big 12 First Team and All-Defensive Team selection, he was named a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award and a Third Team All-American by the AP, NABC, *The Sporting News* and USBWA.

► Nowell ranks second nationally in assists/game (7.8 apg.) and third in total assists (266), while he is in the top-20 in five others, including fifth in steals (82), 10th in steals/game (2.41), 13th in free throws (172), 17th in free throw percentage (88.7) and 18th in minutes/game (36.4). He is one of 3 Division I players with at least 1,500 points, 500 assists and 200 steals. He also ranks first among all active Division I players in steals (274).

► Nowell was recognized for his MVP performance in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he was selected as the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28 after averaging 18.7 points and 9.0 assists per game.

► In wins vs. Rhode Island and Nevada, Nowell became the first Wildcat to record double-digit assists in consecutive games, while he became the second player in school history and the first since 1989 to post a 25-point/10-assist game with his 29-point, 11-assist effort in the overtime win over the Wolf Pack.

► Nowell enjoyed a special performance in the historic win at No. 6/6 Texas, scoring a career-best 36 points on 9-of-15 shooting, including 6-of-10 from 3-point range, to go with a perfect 12-of-12 effort from the free throw line. It was the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since 2018.

► Nowell capped his impressive week with the school's first 30-point, 10-assist game in the win at No. 19/17 Baylor, scoring 32 points while dishing a career-best 14 assists. He became the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 with consecutive 30-point games, while his 14 assists tied the record for most in a conference game in school history. In addition to his second Big 12 Player of the Week on Jan. 9, he was named the *NCAA March Madness*, ESPN, Naismith Trophy and Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week.

► The school's single-season assists leader (266) with his 7 assists in the win over TCU, Nowell combined for 44 points and 23 assists in his first two NCAA Tournament games. He is one of two players since 1990, along with Murray State's **Ja Morant**, to combine for 40 points and 20 assists before the Sweet 16. He collected his 16th career double-double, including his eighth this season, with 17 points and a career-tying 14 assists vs. Montana State.

INSTANT IMPACT

► Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** has given K-State another scoring threat in the post, as the junior college All-American ranks third on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg.) while connecting 50 percent (137-of-274) from the field to go with 5.8 rebounds, 1.2 steals and 0.9 blocks in 26.8 minutes per game. He averaged 12.5 points on 70.5 percent shooting in the first two NCAA Tournament games.

► Tomlin was selected as the Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Week on Dec. 26 after his near double-double in the win over Radford on Dec. 21. He led four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 26 points, as he hit on 11-of-18 field goals, which included 4 dunks, a 3-pointer and 3 free throws, to go with 9 rebounds.

► Tomlin scored in double figures in 7 consecutive games from Dec. 3 to Jan. 3, in which, he averaged 14.9 points on 55.4 percent (41-of-74) shooting to go with 6.3 rebounds per game. The streak began with 14 points vs. Wichita State and was highlighted by a career-best 26 points vs. Radford.

► Tomlin has grabbed 10 rebounds 3 times this season, while posting his first career double-double (15 points/10 rebounds) in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas. He added a second double-double with 17 points and a season-tying 10 boards at Oklahoma. He has scored in double figures in 19 games.

STARTER OFF THE BENCH

► Before missing the West Virginia game, senior **Desi Sills** had earned the start in each of the games during the 4-game win streak, where he averaged 8.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.8 assists in 33 minutes per game. Before that 4-game span, he had been a spark off the bench for the Wildcats, averaging 8.5 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 29 minutes per game.

► Sills has scored in double figures 15 times, including a season-high 24 points in the win over No. 2/2 Kansas. He came up with 16 big points in the win over LSU in the Cayman Islands Classic Championship game, while he scored all 17 of his points at Butler in the second half. He has scored in double figures in 7 of the last 11 games, including a near triple-double vs. Oklahoma in his final home game with 15 points, 9 rebounds and 8 assists.

► Ames finished his career at Kenwood Academy in Chicago by leading the Broncos to a 28-7 record and a trip to the Super-Sectionals. He averaged a team-best 20.4 points on 51.3 percent shooting, including 33 percent from 3-point range with 4.4 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game.

► Ames was named First Team All-State by the AP for the second straight season, while he was selected First Team All-State by the *Chicago Sun-Times*.

► Jones played his senior season at prep powerhouse Wasatch Academy in Utah after leading John Paul II High School in Plano, Texas to a 31-7 record and a second TAPPS Class 6A State Championship in 2021-22. He averaged 19.7 points, 4.1 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.6 steals per game as a junior.

► Jones was named the 2022 TAPPS Class 6A Player of the Year, a First Team All-State and All-District selection and MVP of District 6A-2.

► Rich was named First Team Class 3A All-State by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and to the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* All-Metro First Team.

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022. He agreed to a 6-year contract through the 2027-28 season.

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at K-State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

A finalist for several National Coach of the Year awards, Tang has helped K-State to a 25-9 record in 2022-23 and a berth in the Sweet 16. It is just the eighth 25-win season in school history and the first since 2017-18, while he is the first Wildcat head coach to advance to the Sweet 16 in his first season. He was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year after inheriting just two players and being picked last in the preseason Big 12 coaches poll.

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections **Johnathan Motley** (2017) and **Jared Butler** (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in **Davion Mitchell** (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang assisted in the construction of nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (**Perry Jones III**), 2011 (**Quincy Miller** and **Deuce Bello**), 2012 (**Isaiah Austin**, **Prince and Rico Gathers**), 2013 (**Ishmail Wainwright**, **Al Freeman** and **Johnathan Motley**) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (**Kendall Brown**, **Langston Love** and **Jeremy Sochan**).

Tang will be the first full-time Black head men's basketball coach and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach **Dave Baker** (1978-83), interim basketball coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85), football coach **Ron Prince** (2006-08), basketball coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach **Jordan Smith** (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, **Jared Butler**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Pierre Jackson**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Perry Jones III**, **Quincy Miller**, **Davion Mitchell**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Royce O'Neale**, **Taurean Prince**, **MaCio Teague**, **Ekpe Udoh** and **Ish Wainwright**.

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record from 2019-22 was the second-best, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts, Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer **James Akinjo**. Senior **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman **Jeremy Sochan** was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. Teammate **Kendall Brown** followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection. **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague** were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a 5-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of 4 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (**Paul & Bano Tang**) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, **Careylyn (Rey)** have a son, **Seven**, and a daughter, **Aylyn**. He also has adopted sons (**Lamar** and **Richard Hurd**).

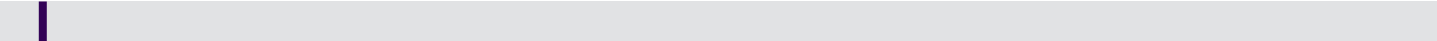

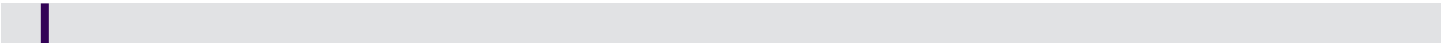

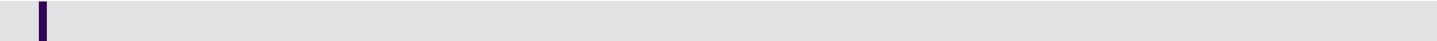

▶ K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Nov. 7 before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.

▶ Fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.

▶ Another fifth year **Abayomi "Baybe" Iyiola** posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.

▶ The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.

▶ K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.

▶ The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.

▶ For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.

▶ With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Senior **Markquis Nowell's** 4-point play with just over 5 minutes helped ignite an 8-0 run that lifted K-State to a 63-54 win over California on Nov. 11 before 3,607 fans at Haas Pavilion.

▶ Nowell hit a 3-pointer from the corner right in front of the Wildcat bench before being knocked to the ground. He calmly hit the free throw that gave K-State a 51-46 lead with 5:07 to play. Nowell, who finished with 13 points to go along with a game-high 7 assists and 3 steals, followed his 4-point with a layup then had the steal and assist on the dunk by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** that capped the 8-0 run and gave K-State a 55-46 lead with 4:02 to play.

▶ The Golden Bears closed to within 55-50 after a 3-pointer from **Devin Askew** and a free throw by **Joel Brown**, but the Wildcats responded with 6 in a row, including a pair of free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter** to go along with a layup by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and a dunk by senior **Tykei Greene**, that pushed the lead back to double figures with just over a minute to play.

▶ Nowell's clutch shot came with the momentum clearly on the side of the Golden Bears, who had used separate runs of 13-0 and 11-0 run to erase a 20-point deficit and cut the lead to 47-46 with 5:37 to play.

▶ In addition to Nowell's spectacular night, Johnson had a near double-double with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-13 field goals to go with a game-high 9 rebounds and 2 steals in a team-high 33 minutes. He was joined in double figures by Tomlin, who added 11 points to go with 2 rebounds and 2 blocks.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on 36.8 percent (21-of-57), including 26.3 percent (5-of-19) from 3-point range, and hit on a season-high 88.9 percent (16-of-18) from the free throw line. They made just 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from the field in the second half, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from beyond the arc.

▶ K-State's lull in the second half overshadowed a sensational start, in which, the Wildcats built as much as 17-point lead in the first half behind swarming defense (15 forced turnovers) and efficient offense. The lead grew to 20 points (42-22) in the early moments of the second half.

▶ Cal, which is coached by former K-State assistant **Mark Fox**, was led by a game-high 17 points by the Texas transfer **Devin Askew**.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson** continued his impressive play to start the year, as he led three Wildcats in double figures with 19 points in helping K-State to a 69-53 win over Kansas City on Nov. 17 before 7,376 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ The win gave K-State its first 3-0 start to a season since 2019-20.

▶ Johnson, who scored in double figures for the third consecutive game, had a stellar all-around night, adding a team-tying 7 rebounds, a career-tying 6 assists and 2 steals to his 19-point effort in 35 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with a career-high 16 points on 5-of-10 field goals, including 4 treys, and senior **Desi Sills**, who added 11 points.

▶ The Wildcats once again used their defense to generate offense, forcing the Roos (1-4) into 22 turnovers and converting those into 26 points. The team has forced 20 or more turnovers in each of the first 3 games, totaling 76 points off those miscues, an average of 25.3 points per game.

▶ K-State took control of the game in the first half on eight straight points from Johnson, which was capped by the game's first 3-pointer with 15:21 to play. From there, Carter took control of the the game, hitting his first 3-pointer with 11:23 to play. He followed 3 more treys, as his fourth of the first half gave the Wildcats a 34-20 advantage with 2:24 remaining. Johnson and Carter combined for 25 of the team's 41 first-half points.

▶ For the second straight game, K-State built a 20-point advantage in the early moments of the second half only to see its opponent chip away at the deficit. Behind the play of senior **Shemarri Allen**, who finished with a game-high 21 points, Kansas City closed to within 57-47 with just under 7 minutes to play.

▶ However, it was another veteran who stepped up for the Wildcats when they most needed it. Just like senior **Markquis Nowell** who came through in the clutch with his 4-point play in the win at Cal on Nov. 11, it was the veteran Sills who did it against Kansas City, as he scored the next 6 points and finished with 10 of the team's last 12 points to push the lead back

▶ K-State again used a huge first-half performance to carry itself to victory, as the Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 77-57 win over Rhode Island on Nov. 21 before 1,256 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The Wildcats scored 44 points in the first half on a blistering 58.1 percent (18-of-31) shooting to build as much as a 21-point lead. On the defensive end, they held the Rams (1-3) to 31.3 percent (10-of-32) shooting, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from 3-point range.

▶ Although the second half was plagued by sloppy play with a combined 23 turnovers, including 13 by K-State, the lead never dipped below 15 points, and grew to many as 24 in the waning minutes.

▶ Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led a balanced attack with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, while senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **David N'Guessan** added 14 and 12 points, respectively. Johnson has now scored in double figures in all 4 games as a Wildcat, while N'Guessan and Tomlin each recorded new season-highs. Tomlin also added 5 blocked shots, which were the most by a Wildcat since **Jordan Henriquez-Roberts** in 2013.

▶ K-State had 20 assists on 28 field goals, including a stellar performance from senior **Markquis Nowell**, who was responsible for 12 of those assists to go along with 9 points and 5 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 12 assists tied for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and were the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma State on Feb. 25, 1989. The total was one assist shy of Nowell's career-high of 13 that he accomplished twice while playing at Little Rock.

▶ Nowell now has totaled 9 career games of at least 10 assists, including 4 at K-State. The 12 assists gave him 499 in his career, as he closes on the distinction of being one of just two active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1,300 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on a season-high 52.8 percent (28-of-53), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from 3-point range, and hit on 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw line. More than half (38) of the team's 77 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats again took advantage of their opponent's turnovers, turning 16 Ram miscues into 21 points.

▶ Seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 57 points, including 14 of the team's 16 points in overtime, to help lift K-State to the Championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22 before 1,200 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ After the Wildcats surrendered a 9-point lead with less than 4 minutes to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds left in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force the overtime period with 3.5 seconds remaining. The momentum carried the team in the extra period, as they dominated the game by connecting on 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the field and making 6 of their 10 free throws.

▶ Junior **David N'Guessan** gave K-State the lead for good in overtime with a driving layup with 3:48 to play, which was followed by a jumper and free throw by Johnson for an 87-82 lead. After the Wolf Pack closed to within a possession on 2 free throws by **Kenan Blackshear**, Nowell caught fire offensively, hitting on a 3-point play and a jumper to push the lead to 92-84 with 1:24 remaining.

▶ The 57 combined points by Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) were the most by Wildcat teammates since **Dean Wade** (34) and **Kamau Stokes** (23) also combined for 57 points in win at Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017. It marked just the 15th time in school history that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.

▶ Nowell finished with 29 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 free throws and 11 assists in 41 minutes to become just the fifth Wildcat with a 20-point/10-assist game in school history and just the second with a 25-point/10-assist game following **Steve Henson** in 1989.

▶ Johnson set a career-high with 28 points on 8-of-13 field goals and 10-of-11 free throws to earn his ninth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.

▶ K-State connected on a season-high 55 percent (33-of-60), including 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range, and hit on 78.6 percent (22-of-28) from the free throw line. Nearly half (44) of the team's 96 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats out-rebounded the Wolf Pack, 36-22, including 13 offensive boards that they converted into a season-high 16 second-chance points.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** jumper with 4.7 seconds helped lift K-State to a 61-59 win over LSU to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic Championship on Nov. 23 before 2,400 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The in-season tournament title was the 17th in school history and the first since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam.

▶ Johnson (16 points) and fellow seniors **Markquis Nowell** (18) and **Desi Silks** (16) combined for 50 of the 61 points, including 22 of their 28 second-half points, in which, the team rallied from an 11-point deficit with 17:27 to play.

▶ Nowell was selected as the Cayman Islands Classic Tournament MVP, while Johnson was selected to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game.

▶ K-State (6-0) had to survive some nervous moments to earn the victory, as both teams called their full allotment of timeouts (2 each) before the last 4.7 seconds played out. LSU (5-1) was able to dribble up the court and seemingly tied the game at 61-all at the buzzer. However, the officials reviewed the play and waved the shot off after they discovered that the clock didn't start on time and the shot came after the game clock had expired.

▶ It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who looked like the more rested team after playing in the early sessions in the first 2 days of the tournament and breezing past their first 2 opponents by 16 and 15 points, respectively.

▶ LSU scored 41 points in the first half on 47.1 percent (16-of-34), including 50 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range, with 3 turnovers, to build as much as a 12-point lead right before halftime. Things changed in the second half, as the Tigers managed just 18 points on 36.8 percent (7-of-19) shooting, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from long range, to go with 14 turnovers.

▶ Nowell scored his game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists in 33 minutes. Johnson, who played just 13 minutes in the second half due to foul trouble, scored his 16 points on 4-of-7 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Silks, who provided a spark off the bench, scored his season-high 16 points off 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, to go with game-high 5 assists in 33 minutes.

- K-State could not quite dig itself out of a first-half deficit, as a hot-shooting Butler hit on nearly 55 percent from the field in a 76-64 win on Nov. 30 in the fourth annual BIG EAST/Big 12 Battle at historic Hinkle Fieldhouse.
- Butler (5-3), which came into the game averaging 90 points per game on 60.1 percent shooting in 3 home games this season, stayed hot from the field in handing K-State (6-1) its first loss under first-year head coach **Jerome Tang**.
- The Bulldogs connected on an opponent-high 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) in the second half, while all 5 starters scored in double figures led by **Manny Bates**' 22 points.
- Despite the impressive offensive performance, the Wildcats still had chances to rally from a double-digit deficit twice in the second half. After falling behind by 14 just after halftime, senior **Markquis Nowell**'s first 3-pointer keyed a 13-4 run that closed the deficit to 48-43 with just over 14 minutes to play. However, the Bulldogs responded with a 17-2 run that pushed the lead to 20 points.
- Down 65-45 with 8:29 remaining, senior **Desi Sills** helped spark one more attempt at a comeback for K-State, as the reserve scored 13 of his 17 second-half points in a 15-3 run that cut the deficit to 68-60 with just over 4 minutes to play. However, once again, Butler had a response, rattling off 6 in a row to push the lead back to double figures en route to the 12-point victory.
- The loss spoiled an impressive night by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who collected his first double-double as a Wildcat, pouring in a team-high 20 points on 9-of-9 shooting to go with a season-high 12 rebounds. It was his 14th career double-double, including his sixth with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds. He became the ninth player in school history to go 9-of-9 or better from the field.
- Sills came off the bench to provide a big lift in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points after halftime on 8-of-12 shooting. Nowell dished out a game-high 8 assists to go with his 13 points.
- For the game, K-State connected on 46 percent (29-of-63), including just 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Wildcats had a season-high 48 points in the paint but posted season-lows in a number of categories, including just 3 free throw attempts while making 2. The team came in averaging 17.3 free throws made per game, which ranked among the top-25 nationally.

- Senior **Markquis Nowell** shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state Wichita State on Dec. 3 before a season-best crowd of 8,957 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- K-State rebounded from its first loss of the season at Butler on Nov. 30 to earn its fourth straight win over its in-state rival in the first meeting between the schools at Bramlage Coliseum since 2003.
- Although he had an off-shooting night, Nowell had a stellar all-around night for the Wildcats, adding a game-high 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals to his 11 points. He was joined in double figures by fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who led all scorers with 17 points, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who kept the team in the game early with 12 of his 14 points coming in the first half.
- It marked the second year in a row Nowell proved to be difference in a win against Wichita State. Last season, he scored 5 of his team-high 16 points in a late 7-0 run, including a dagger of a 3-pointer with 1:35 to play, that helped the Wildcats to a 65-59 win over the Shockers at INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita.
- Nowell's heroics helped spark a late rally by K-State, which trailed for more than 30 minutes and appeared to be heading for a loss until senior **Desi Sills** made perhaps the biggest play of the night with his block of **Shammah Scott**'s breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.
- Nowell tied the game with a free throw with 1:32 left then forced a steal of senior **Craig Porter, Jr.**, to set up his winning 3-pointer with 54 seconds. After his triple gave the Wildcats a 53-50 lead, he forced another bad pass on the next possession before knocking down 2 free throws for the final margin of victory.
- K-State had a season-low offense night across the board, scoring a season-low 55 points on 35.8 percent (19-of-53) shooting, including 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Big 12's best free throw shooting team also had an off night from the line, hitting on a season-low 61.9 percent (13-of-21).
- It was a tale of two halves for Wichita State, which led by as many as 7 points in the first half on 54.5 percent (12-of-22) shooting before scoring just 18 points in the second half on a mere 25.9 percent (7-of-27) shooting. For the game, the Shockers had just 5 assists on its 19 made field goals with 16 turnovers.

► K-State opened the second half with 23 consecutive points to blow open an already lopsided game, as the Wildcats capped an impressive offensive effort with a 98-50 win over UIW on Dec. 11 before 7,042 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State collected its third 90-point scoring effort, narrowly missing the school's first 100-point game since 2010 in the last few minutes before opting to dribble out the ball in the closing seconds against an undermanned UIW. The Wildcats hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) from the field, including 68.8 percent (22-of-32) after halftime, and saw 7 players in double figures.

► The 9-1 start is best start by the Wildcats since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 mark, while head coach **Jerome Tang** is off to the best 10-game start by a first-year coach in school history.

► The 48-point margin of victory was the 10th-largest in school history.

► K-State busted open a close contest with a 20-1 run midway through the first half before landing the knockout punch with a 23-0 start to the second half. Six Wildcats contributed in the first-half run, including 5 points each from senior **Markquis Nowell** and freshman **Dorian Finister**. The second-half run was much the same with seven players registering points, including 3-pointers from senior **Keyontae Johnson** and juniors **Ish Massoud** and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**.

► Johnson led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with 5 assists, 4 rebounds and 3 steals in a season-low 24 minutes of action. The Wildcats' leading scorer (17.3 ppg.) has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Tomlin had a near double-double with 15 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in 23 minutes, while junior reserve **Desi Sills** added 14 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 steals.

► Sophomore **Cam Carter**, Finister and Nowell each added 10 points, as Nowell nearly notched another double-double with a game-high 8 assists to go with 5 rebounds. Finister saw his most action of the season in 22 minutes, recording his first career double-digit scoring game to go with 7 rebounds and 4 assists.

► UIW, which has 9 true or redshirt freshmen among its 16-man roster, hit on 38 percent (19-of-50) from the field, including 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range, and made 5 of 8 attempts from the free throw line. Freshman **Trey Miller** led with 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** collected his second double-double of the season to pace four Wildcats in double figures, as K-State led from nearly start to finish in earning a 71-56 win over former conference foe Nebraska in the 11th Wildcat Classic on Dec. 17 before 13,184 fans at the T-Mobile Center.

► The win helped K-State (10-1) continue its best start to a season since 2016-17, as the Wildcats snapped a 4-game skid in the T-Mobile Center while handing Nebraska (6-6) its seventh straight defeat in the series.

► Johnson led all scorers with a game-high 23 points on 9-of-13 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range, to go with a game-best 11 rebounds, 2 assists and a career-tying 4 steals in 34 minutes. It was his 15th career double-double, including his seventh with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds, while it was his 11th career 20-point contest.

► Johnson was joined in double figures by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including 2-of-5 from long range, along with senior **Markquis Nowell** and sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with 13 and 10 points, respectively. Nowell added a game-high 7 assists.

► K-State playing in its first Wildcat Classic since a 66-63 loss to Saint Louis in 2019, used a strong finish to the first half to build a double-digit lead at the break. The Wildcats continued to extend that lead in the first 11 minutes of the second half, building as much as a 19-point lead at 59-40 before Nebraska head coach **Fred Hoiberg** called a timeout with just over 9 minutes to play.

► The timeout seemed to ignite the Cornhuskers, as they rattled off 10 straight points to cut the deficit to 59-50 with under 4 minutes to play before a corner 3-pointer by freshman Jamarques Lawrence got them to within 62-55 with 1:19 remaining. However, they could get no closer as the Wildcats scored 7 straight points and 9 of the last 10 points — all from the free throw line — to close it out.

► After connecting on 48.4 percent (15-of-31), including 40 percent (6-of-15) from 3-point range, in the first half, K-State had to survive a poor second-half shooting performance, where he hit on just 31 percent (9-of-29) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-of-13) from beyond the arc. For game, the Wildcats connected on 40 percent (24-of-60) from the field, including 35.7 percent (10-of-28) from 3-point range, while making 13 of 19 free throws.

- Senior **Markquis Nowell** scored 21 of his game-high 23 points in the second half and overtime to help K-State rally from a double-digit halftime deficit to hand No. 24/24 West Virginia an 82-76 loss in both teams' Big 12 opener on New Year's Eve before 8,199 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- Nowell finished the night 3 steals shy of a triple-double, dishing out a game-high 10 assists to go with a career-tying 7 steals in 43 minutes of action. It was just the sixth 20-point/10-assist game in school history, including the second such game by Nowell after his 29-point, 11-assist effort vs. Nevada on Nov. 22.
- Nowell was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who scored 18 points on 6-of-13 field goals and 6-of-9 free throws, as well as fellow senior **Abayomi Iyiola** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who added 14 and 11 points, respectively. Iyiola went 6-of-7 from the field to go with a pair of clutch free throws, along with a team-high 8 rebounds.
- The victory was anything but easy, as the Mountaineers (10-3, 0-1 Big 12) jumped out a 17-3 lead behind their stellar defense, which held the Wildcats without a field goal for nearly 6 minutes until a layup by Johnson with 14:04 to play before halftime. WVU led by 11 at the half, holding K-State to just 21 points on 29 percent (9-of-31) shooting, including misses on all 8 3-point attempts.
- Nowell sparked the Wildcats to open the second half, scoring the team's first 5 points, as they slowly started to chip away at the double-digit deficit. He tied it at 42-all on a free throw with just over 13 minutes to play before Johnson's layup 13 seconds later gave them their first lead of the contest. Six different Wildcats scored in the 23-10 run out of halftime, including 11 from Nowell.
- Just as the Wildcats had done to start the second half, the Mountaineers made their own comeback, using a 10-4 run to take a 63-62 lead on a layup by senior **Tre Mitchell** with 1:03 to play. A Johnson jumper and 2 free throws from Iyiola helped K-State take a 66-63 lead with 13 seconds before a wild sequence capped by a 3-pointer from **Kedrian Johnson** sent the game into overtime.
- The Wildcats grabbed the momentum to start overtime, scoring 11 of the first 15 points to take a 77-70 lead with 1:24 to play. Although the Mountaineers got a 3-pointer from Mitchell on the next possession, Nowell answered with his own 3-point play with 53 seconds for an 80-73 advantage and they were able to salt the game away with 2 more Nowell free throws for the final margin.

- All 5 starters scored in double figures, including a career-best 36 points from senior **Markquis Nowell**, as K-State broke the school record for points in a 116-103 victory at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3 to hand the Longhorns their first loss in the brand-new Moody Center before a sold-out crowd of 10,763 fans.
- The point total not only broke the school record, but it also tied the Big 12 record for points scored in a league game, as Baylor scored 116 in a win at Texas A&M on Jan. 23, 2008. It also set the Big 12 record for most combined points.
- The 116 points eclipsed the previous mark of 115, which first came against Delaware State on Dec. 7, 1991, then again vs. Fresno State in the NIT on March 24, 1994. It was also the most-ever in a road game, surpassing the 108 at Iowa State on Jan. 29, 1975, while it was most in a conference game, topping the 114 scored against Nebraska at home on Jan. 10, 1987, and the most in a Big 12 game, surpassing the 111 vs. Missouri at home on Jan. 3, 1998.
- According to *ESPN Stats & Info*, K-State's 116 points marked the most by an unranked team in a win over a top-10 opponent since Missouri scored 119 against Iowa State in 1988 and most-ever in a road game.
- Nowell led a tremendous all-around effort by the Wildcats, who connected on 61 percent (36-of-59) from the field, including 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from 3-point range, and set a school-record by hitting on 93.9 percent (31-of-33) of their attempts from the free throw line. It marked the first time the team has shot better than 60 percent against a Big 12 opponent since 2018, while the 13 treys tied for the sixth-most made in a conference game.
- Nowell nearly became the first player in school history with a 30-point, 10-assist game, as he dished out a game-high 9 assists to go with 3 steals in 38 minutes. His 36 points came on 9-of-14 field goals, including 6-of-9 from 3-point range, and a perfect 12-of-12 effort from the free throw line. It was the seventh-most points by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Barry Brown, Jr.**, scored 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.
- Nowell was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who tied his career-high with 28 points to go with a near double-double himself with a game-high 9 rebounds and 5 assists, along with a career-best 17 points from sophomore **Cam Carter**, as well as 11 and 10 points, respectively from junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** and senior **Abayomi Iyiola**.

- On a night when **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 56 points, it was reserve **Ish Massoud** who proved to be the difference, as his 3-pointer with 32 seconds in overtime lifted K-State to a thrilling 97-95 win over No. 19/17 Baylor on Jan. 7 before 9,211 fans at Ferrell Center.
- Baylor's **Adam Flagler** turned the ball over with 5.3 seconds left and Nowell was fouled immediately, making the first free throw before missing the second – snapping a streak of 29 straight makes – to allow the Bears' one more chance to either win it or force a second overtime, but junior **Caleb Lohner**'s 3-pointer was off the mark, setting off a wild celebration on the Wildcat bench.
- K-State, which is off to its best start to a season in more than 60 years (1958-59), collected its school-record third consecutive Top 25 victory, including its second in a row over a Top 20 on the road. Although the Wildcats have won as many as 4 straight games over Top 25 opponents, including as recently as the 2018-19 season, no team had ever done it in 3 straight games.
- A game after combining for 64 points in the win over No. 6/6 Texas in Austin, the tandem of Nowell (32 points) and Johnson (24 points) collectively scored their 56 points on 19-of-35 field goals, including 6-of-11 from 3-point range.
- Nowell starred yet again, posting the first 30-point/10-assist game in school history, dishing out a career-best 14 assists to go with his 32 points. Johnson, who has now scored in double figures in all 15 games, had a near double-double with 24 points and a game-high 9 boards in a career-best 43 minutes. Massoud joined the tandem in double figures with a season-high 13 points on 3-of-4 field goals (all from 3) and a perfect 4-of-4 effort from the line.
- After scoring a career-best 36 points against the Longhorns, Nowell became the first Wildcat with consecutive 30-point games since **Michael Beasley** did it in 4 consecutive games from Feb. 23-March 4, 2008. Nowell's 14 dimes tied the school record for assists in a conference game, while they tied for the second-most in school history and were the most by any Wildcat in the last 40 years.
- Nowell's 30-point/10-assist game is just the second in Division I in the last 10 seasons, joining Oklahoma's **Trae Young** who did it against TCU in 2017.
- The Wildcats posted a 50/40/80 line as a team, connecting on 53.1 percent (34-of-64) from the field, including 44 percent (11-of-25) from 3-point range, while hitting on 85.7 percent (18-of-21) from the free throw line.

► Senior **Markquis Nowell** continued his impressive play with a team-high 20 points and game-high 7 assists, as No. 11/13 K-State won its first game as a ranked team in nearly 4 seasons with a gritty 65-57 win over Oklahoma State on Jan. 10 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State, which continued its best start to a season in more than 60 years, extended its winning streak to 9 games, which is the longest since a 10-game streak from Nov. 24, 2013, to Jan. 7, 2014. The team is also 4-0 to start Big 12 play for the first time since 2012-13.

► As expected, the Wildcats took the best shot of a long and athletic Oklahoma State team, which leads the Big 12 in scoring defense (61.5) and ranks third nationally in field goal percentage defense (36.4).

► The Cowboys rode that elite defense to much as a 5-point lead in the first half, including 32-30 at halftime. However, the Wildcats scored 5 of the first 7 points out of halftime to take the lead for good on a trey by junior **Ish Massoud** at 35-34 and force a timeout by coach **Mike Boynton, Jr.**, at the 17:17 mark.

► K-State twice built a 10-point lead, including 51-41, with just over 10 minutes remaining to cap a 9-0 run and 56-46 after a layup by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** with just over 7 minutes left. However, OSU make a furious comeback with 9 straight points to cut the deficit to 56-55 with 3:10 to play.

► The Wildcats were able to make key plays down the stretch to end the game on a 9-2 run, which included a highlight alley-oop dunk by senior **Keyontae Johnson** from Nowell with 38 seconds left. This 9-2 ending included a pair of free throws from senior **Abayomi Iyiola** and Nowell, the dunk by Johnson and 3 free throws from reserve senior **Desi Sills**.

► Nowell was joined in double figures by Johnson, who kept his double-digit scoring streak alive at 16 games with 12 points on 5-of-11 shooting to go with 6 rebounds and 2 assists, and Sills, who added 11 points on 3-of-8 field goals and 5-of-6 free throws to go with 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals.

► After scoring 213 points in back-to-back wins over No. 6/6 Texas and 19/17 Baylor, K-State proved it can win in a variety of ways, including on defense. The Wildcats connected on a season-low 35.6 percent (21-of-59) from the field, including 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from 3-point range, but took advantage of 16 turnovers by the Cowboys to score 19 points.

► No. 11/13 K-State saw its 9-game winning streak end on Jan. 14, as No. 17/17 TCU used its stellar defensive pressure to harass the Wildcats into 20 turnovers, which the Horned Frogs converted into 26 points, en route to an 82-68 win before 5,884 fans at Schollmaier Arena.

► TCU, which took control with a 10-0 run midway through the first half, led by 14 points at the half and by as many as 25 in the second half before K-State was able to cut the deficit to 12 on two occasions late. However, the Wildcats could go no closer, as they lost for the first time in nearly 7 weeks.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** led three players in double figures with a near double-double of 18 points and 9 rebounds in 38 minutes, while senior **Markquis Nowell** finished with 16 points but with his second-fewest assists (4) on the season to go with 2 rebounds and 2 steals in nearly 38 minutes. Senior **Tykei Greene** provided a spark in the second half with a season-high 11 points on 5-of-7 shooting. Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** grabbed a season-best 10 boards and dished out a season-high 5 assists to go with his 8 points.

► Four Horned Frogs scored in double figures led by senior **Emanuel Miller's** game-high 23 points, while sophomore **Eddie Lampkin** was a force in the paint with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting. Presaison Big 12 Player of the Year **Mike Miles, Jr.**, notched a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 11 assists.

► A motivated TCU team, which lost on a last-second shot to No. 25/25 Iowa State at home on Jan. 7 before losing an 18-point lead at No. 10/10 Texas on Wednesday, showed why they are the nation's top-ranked transition team (21.4 points per game), using its 15 steals to post a 32-13 advantage in fast-break points. The 32 fast-break points are the most allowed to an opponent since the stat has been kept starting in 2000-01.

► The Horned Frogs were efficient on the offensive end, connecting on 46.5 percent (33-of-71) from the field, while recording an opponent season-high 54 points in the paint. They had 22 assists, including a game-high 11 from Miles, with just 10 turnovers. They also were called for just 8 personal fouls.

► The Wildcats finished at 43.1 percent (28-of-65) from the field, including 28.6 percent (6-of-21) from 3-point range, while making 6 of its their 7 free throws.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** lob dunk from fellow senior **Markquis Nowell** with 25 seconds left in overtime proved to be the game-winner, as No. 13/15 K-State outlasted No. 2/2 Kansas, 83-82, in the Dillons Sunflower Showdown on Jan. 17 before a sold-out crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State snapped a 7-game losing streak to its longtime rival in the 298th meeting and in the first top-15 matchup since 2013, while ending Kansas' 10-game overall winning streak. The Wildcats are off to their best overall start since 2009-10, while they are 5-1 in Big 12 play for the first time since 2007-08.

► The win was the eighth over the No. 2 team in the country, including the first since defeating No. 2 Baylor, 56-54, in Waco, Texas on Feb. 4, 2017, while it was the highest ranked win since knocking off No. 1 Oklahoma on Feb. 6, 2016. Overall, it was the 26th Top 5 win in school history.

► Kansas had one last chance with 11 seconds left, but junior **Ish Massoud** was able to force junior **Dajuan Harris, Jr.**, into a turnover on the baseline with only a few seconds left to preserve the victory.

► K-State is 9-0 in games decided by single digits (9 points or less), including 4-0 in overtime games. It marks the

▶ No. 14/16 K-State rallied from a halftime deficit for the second consecutive game with a dominant second-half performance as the Wildcats tied the school-record for AP Top 25 wins with seven in a 75-65 win over No. 9/10 Baylor on Feb. 21 before a sellout crowd of 11,000 at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Down 34-31 at the break, K-State scored 44 points in the second half on 57.7 percent (15-of-26) shooting with 22 coming in the paint. For the game, the Wildcats connected on 48.3 percent (28-of-58) from the field, including 64.9 percent (24-of-37) inside the 3-point arc. The team had a season-low 7 turnovers, while dishing out 20 assists on 28 made field goals with senior **Markquis Nowell** collecting a game-high 10 assists without a single turnover.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson** led three Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 25 points on 11-of-17 field goals. Joining Johnson in double figures was Nowell with 14 points to go with his game-high 10 assists and sophomore **Cam Carter**, who added 10 points to go with career-tying 8 rebounds.

▶ The Wildcats led by 10 points with just over 7 minutes to play in the first half before the Bears got hot from 3-point range to take a 34-26 lead with 1:32 left before halftime. Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** was able to go on a 5-0 run to cut the deficit to 34-31 to give the squad some momentum heading into halftime.

▶ A 3-pointer by Johnson tied the game at 34-all on the first possession of the second half, as K-State snatched the lead for good on back-to-back jump shots by their senior with 15:29 to play. The consecutive baskets by Johnson started a 12-3 run by the Wildcats that extended the lead to 49-43 and forced Baylor head coach **Scott Drew** to call a timeout with 12:19 remaining.

▶ K-State kept the pressure on out of the timeout, scoring 3 consecutive baskets all from different players to push the lead to 55-44 and force another Baylor timeout with just over 8 to play. The lead grew to as many as 14 points after 2 Nowell free throws at the 4:23 mark, as he finished off the Wildcats' scoring from the line with 6 consecutive makes as part of a perfect 10-of-10 performance.

▶ As impressive as the offense was in the second half, the defense was equally as impressive, as the Wildcats held the Big 12's second-best scoring offense (78.5 ppg.) and the best in Big 12 play (77.4 ppg.) to 65 points on 40 percent shooting, including 39.3 percent from 3-point range. The Bears scored just 31 points after halftime on 37 percent shooting, including 33.3 percent from long range.

▶ Consecutive 3-point field goals by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **Ish Massoud** late in the second half gave No. 14/16 K-State the lift it needed in a tight contest, as the Wildcats swept the season series from Oklahoma State with a 73-68 win on Feb. 25 before 11,124 at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

▶ K-State extended its winning streak to 3 games, while snapping a 5-game road losing streak in Big 12 play. It was the first road win since a 97-95 overtime win at Baylor on Jan. 7. The victory also gave the Wildcats' double-digit wins in league play for the 10th time in the Big 12 era and the first time since 2018-19.

▶ Trailing 60-59 with 6:23 remaining, K-State took the lead for good on a 3-pointer by Johnson which was followed 50 seconds later by another triple from Massoud that gave the Wildcats a 65-60 lead. After the Cowboys closed to within 65-63 with 2:44 remaining, the Wildcats got key plays down the stretch from their backcourt, including 4 free throws from senior **Markquis Nowell**, a layup from senior **Desi Sills** and 2 free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter**.

▶ Nowell led three Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 22 points on 5-of-12 field goals, including 3-of-8 from 3-point range, and 9-of-10 free throws, while adding a game-high 8 assists and 4 steals and a team-high 5 rebounds in nearly 39 minutes. Johnson scored 17 points on 7-of-13 shooting, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, while Sills posted 10 points in his third straight start.

▶ For the third straight game, K-State had to rally from a halftime deficit, as Oklahoma State used an 11-0 run to take as much as a 6-point lead in the first half. Sills was able to pull the Wildcats to within 35-33 at the break on a pair of free throws and a layup and steal right before the buzzer.

▶ K-State used a 7-0 run in the first 5 minutes of the second half to take a 40-39 lead, but OSU responded with its own 7-0 run to take its largest lead at 53-45 with just over 12 minutes to play. A key moment came minutes later after the Wildcats closed the gap to 53-49, as head coach **Jerome Tang** was whistled for a technical with 10:49 remaining, allowing the Cowboys to take a 55-49 lead.

▶ The technical seemed to spark K-State, as the Wildcats rattled off 6 straight points capped by a 3-pointer from Carter to tie the game at 55 with 9:17 left. The teams traded the lead over the next few possessions before the pivotal stretch of 3-pointers from Johnson and Massoud.

▶ K-State outscored OSU, 24-13, in the final 10:49 after the Tang technical.

▶ A 9-0 run to end the first half fueled an explosive second-half effort by No. 11/11 K-State, as the Wildcats ended their home schedule with an 85-69 win over Oklahoma on March 1 before a sold-out crowd at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ K-State ran its winning streak to 4 games, while ending its home season with 4 straight wins to finish with a near perfect 15-1 record at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ It was an impressive offensive effort for the Wildcats after a shaky start, in which, they started just 4-of-20 (20 percent) from the field while missing 10 of their first 11 field goals. However, the team was able to get their offense going towards the end of the first half, breaking a 25-all tie with 3:28 to play with 9 consecutive points to end the half to take a 34-25 lead into the break.

▶ Riding the momentum, K-State opened the second half by scoring 14 of the first 18 points to expand its lead to 48-31 and force a timeout by Oklahoma head coach **Porter Moser** with near 16 minutes to play. A few minutes later, a 3-pointer by sophomore **Cam Carter** and a dunk by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** gave the Wildcats their largest lead at 53-33. The Sooners were able to cut into the lead on a number of occasions, including 75-65 with just over 2 minutes left, however, the home team was able to remain ahead and finish off the game.

▶ All told, the Wildcats scored 72 points in the final 31 minutes on 70 percent (28-of-40) shooting after opening the game with just 13 points on 20 percent (4-of-20) shooting in the first 8 minutes of the game. The team scored 51 points in the second half on 70.4 percent (19-of-27) shooting, including 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range. It marked the first time K-State has hit on 70 percent or better in a half since 2019 and the first time in Big 12 play since 2018.

▶ It was an all-around team effort, as four Wildcats scored in double figures led by 19 points from Tomlin, while six players had at least 6 points and nine players scored in total. The team is now 12-1 this season when six or more players score at least 6 points. Tomlin scored 14 of his 19 points in the second half on 6-of-6 shooting while finishing a near perfect 8-of-9 from the field.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-4 from beyond the arc, to go with 5 rebounds, 3 steals and 2 assists in 35 minutes. Senior **Desi Sills** flirted with a triple-double in his final home game with 15 points, a game-high 9 rebounds and 8 assists. Senior **Markquis Nowell** collected his seventh double-double with 11 points and a game-high 10 assists.

▶ West Virginia used a big second-half performance to end No. 11/11 K-State's 4-game winning streak on March 4, as the Mountaineers earned an 89-81 win over the Wildcats before a sold-out crowd of 14,000 on Senior Day.

▶ It was a tale of two halves, as K-State connected on just 38.9 percent (14-of-36) from the field in the second half after hitting on 51.6 percent (16-of-31) in the first half. In contrast, West Virginia (18-13, 7-11 Big 12) hit on 57.7 percent (15-of-26) with 50 points in the second half after shooting 45.5 percent (15-of-33) in the opening half. The Mountaineers finished at 50.8 percent (30-of-59) from the field compared to the Wildcats' 44.8 percent (30-of-67).

▶ K-State led 8-0 to start and built as much as 10-point advantage in the first half before WVU used a 15-3 run to take its first lead at 33-31 with 4:28 before halftime. The Mountaineers scored the final 4 points of the half to take a 39-37 lead into the break then used that momentum to construct as much as a 15-point lead in the second half.

▶ It was a fast-paced game, as the teams combined for 43 points off 36 turnovers, including 24 steals, and a combined 50 fast-break points. WVU got the better of K-State in all 3 categories, including a 23-20 edge in points off turnovers, 14-10 on steals and a 30-20 advantage in fast-break points.

▶ Three Wildcats scored in double figures led by 24 points each from seniors **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell**. It marked the fifth time this season that both All-America candidates topped the 20-point barrier in the same game, including the fourth time in Big 12 play. They combined to go 17-of-41 from the field, including 10-of-21 from 3-point range.

▶ Nowell once again flirted with a triple-double, finishing with game-highs in both assists (8) and steals (6). Sophomore **Cam Carter** also had double figures with 13 points to go with a season-high 5 assists.

▶ Johnson scored 16 of his 24 points in the first half to pace all scorers, while Nowell scored all 24 of his points in the second half, as he knocked down 6 3-pointers. The 24 points tied for the ninth-most by a Wildcat in a second half and were the most since **Barry Brown Jr.**, had 26 points vs. OSU in 2018.

▶ K-State played without senior **Desi Sills**, who did not travel with the team due to a family funeral. A candidate for the Big 12's Sixth Man Award, Sills had started each of the last 4 games during the winning streak.

▶ A strong second-half performance carried No. 22/23 TCU to an 80-67 win over No. 12/12 Kansas State in the final quarterfinal game of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship on March 9 before a crowd of 17,476 at the T-Mobile Center.

▶ The win helped TCU advance to the semifinals, while snapping a 4-game losing streak to K-State at the Big 12 Championship.

▶ The Horned Frogs took control of the game late in the first half with a 9-2 run before responding emphatically with a 19-7 run after the Wildcats closed to within a possession on two occasions early in the second half to build a double-digit advantage. The lead grew to as many as 16 points on several occasions down the stretch, including 80-64 with 3:33 remaining.

▶ TCU knocked down a season-high 11 3-point field goals (tying an opponent season-high), including a combined 8 triples from seniors **Mike Miles Jr** and **Chuck O'Bannon Jr.**, who both scored game-high 22 points. The Horned Frogs entered the game ranking 338th in Division I in 3-point field goals made/game (5.2), while they ranked 343rd in 3-point field goal percentage (29.6). They finished the game hitting on 44 percent (11-of-25) from beyond the arc.

▶ In addition to the success beyond the arc, TCU made the most of K-State's turnovers, scoring 20 points off 20 Wildcat turnovers, while posting an opponent season-high 25 second-chance points on 14 offensive rebounds. The Wildcats are now 1-4 this season when turning the ball over 20 or more times.

▶ Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including 14 points each from seniors **Keyontae Johnson** and **Desi Sills**. Fellow senior **Markquis Nowell** added 11 points and 5 assists, while junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** had a near double-double with 10 points and a game-high 9 rebounds to go with 3 steals.

▶ For the game, K-State hit on 43.6 percent (24-of-55) from the field, including 23.3 percent (7-of-30) from 3-point range, while making 80 percent (12-of-15) from the free throw line.

▶ The Wildcats fell to 37-44 all-time at the conference tournament, including 17-26 in the Big 12 era. They have now lost 3 straight in the event.

▶ Hot shooting carried 3-seed Kansas State to its first NCAA Tournament win under head coach **Jerome Tang** and its first overall since 2018, as the Wildcats connected on 58.2 percent from the field en route to earning a 77-65 victory over 14-seed Montana State in the first round of the East Regional on March 17 before 17,150 fans at the Greensboro Coliseum.

▶ It was an impressive all-around offensive performance for the Wildcats, who posted the fifth-highest field goal percentage (58.2/32-of-55) in an NCAA Tournament game in school history and the highest since the 2017 First Four. The team hit on 51.7 percent (15-of-29) in the first half before connecting on 65.4 percent (17-of-26) after halftime. They also tied the school record for assists (21) in an NCAA Tournament game.

▶ Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by 18 points from senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who went 8-of-15 from the field with a team-high 8 rebounds and 3 assists in nearly 39 minutes. It marked the seventh time that he has led the team in scoring and rebounding, while he has posted double digits in 32 of 33 games.

▶ Fellow senior **Markquis Nowell** dished out a career-tying 14 assists to go with 17 points on 7-of-12 field goals, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, while adding 6 rebounds and 3 steals in 37 minutes. The 14 assists not only broke the school record for most by a Wildcat in a NCAA Tournament, surpassing the 12 by **Steve Henson** against Purdue on March 25, 1998, they also tied for the ninth-most by any player in an NCAA Tournament game. It was Nowell's 16th career double-double, including his 11th at K-State and eighth this season.

▶ The senior duo was joined in double figures by juniors **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** and **David N'Guessan**, who finished with 13 and 10 points, respectively. Sophomore Cam Carter scored 8 points on his birthday and senior **Desi Sills** added 7 points, as the Wildcats moved to 13-1 this season when six or more players have 6 or more points.

▶ K-State used an 11-4 run late in the first half to break open a tight contest and build a 9-point lead with 52 seconds before halftime. After the Bobcats (25-10) closed to within

► Clutch 3-pointers by junior **Ismael Massoud** and senior **Keyontae Johnson** in the last 2:21 helped lift No. 15/13 Kansas State to a trip to New York City for the Sweet 16 with a 75-69 win over Kentucky on March 19 in the second round of the East Regional before 16,517 fans at the Greensboro Coliseum.

► It will be the 18th trip to the Sweet 16 for the Wildcats, including the first since 2018. The win was the 25th of the season, as they became the eighth team in school history and the first since 2018-19 to collect a 25-win season.

► Down 62-61 with 2:43 to play, Massoud gave the Wildcats the lead for good with a deep 3-pointer from the right wing with 2:21 to play that was followed by another deep triple from Johnson on an offensive rebound from junior **David N'Guessan** at the 1:23 mark. Senior **Markquis Nowell** continued the 8-0 spurt with a pair of free throws that extended the lead to 69-62 with 37 seconds.

► Kentucky (22-12) was able to get a basket from senior **Oscar Tschiebwe**, who posted a double-double of 25 points and 18 rebounds, to close the gap to 69-64 with 23 seconds, but Nowell and fellow senior **Desi Sills** clinched the game at the free throw line with a combined 6 consecutive makes.

► Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by a special performance from the Harlem native Nowell, who finished with a game-high 27 points, 9 assists and 3 steals in playing all but 16 seconds. It was the most points by a Wildcat in an NCAA Tournament game since **Rodney McGruder** scored 30 points in 2012.

► After his 17-point, 14-assist performance in the win over 14-seed Montana State on Friday night, Nowell combined for 44 points and 23 assists in his first two NCAA Tournament. He is one of two players since 1990, along with Murray State's **Ja Morant**, to combine for 40 points and 20 assists before the Sweet 16.

► Johnson finished with 13 points to go with 4 rebounds and 3 assists. He has now scored in double figures in all but one game. Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who led the way in the first half with 8 points, and Sills each added 12 points.

► After a shaking start offensively, in which, the Wildcats made just 5 of their first 16 field goal attempts, including going 0-fer on 7 3-point attempts, the team settled down to hit on 48.1 percent (26-of-54) from the field, including 63.6 percent (21-of-33) from inside the 3-point line with 40 points in the paint. They were nearly flawless from the free throw line, converting on 18 of 22 attempts, including a 10-of-11 effort from Nowell.

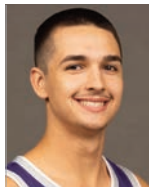
