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CREDENTIALS

Media outlets interested in covering Kansas State football on either a season or individual-game basis are requested to submit all applications for credentials through the K-State Athletics Communications football credential application website at www.k-statesports.com/media. K-State is unable to process written requests for football credentials. Please be sure and review the department's credential policies on page 226 of the 2025 K-State Football Media Guide.

Due to inconsistent mail delivery service on tight deadlines, media passes generally will not be mailed. If this is the case, passes may be picked up at a location to be determined by the K-State Athletics Communications Office. Individuals picking up credentials will be required to furnish positive identification.

Admission to the press level is for working media only. Only those media with official K-State credentials will be admitted. Friends, spouses, children under the age of 16 and non-workers are not welcome in the press area.

Only two field access credentials will be allowed per media outlet for each game.

RECENT RECAP

- Kansas State is coming off a dominating 42-17 win at Kansas, its 17th straight win over the Jayhawks.
- **Avery Johnson** was 11-of-17 for 231 yards and accounted for four touchdowns, while **Jayce Brown** caught four passes for 160 yards, including a 78-yard score.
- Defensively, the Wildcats forced four total turnovers and pressured quarterback Jalon Daniels most of the day. The Jayhawks averaged just 3.2 yards per snap in the contest.
- Prior to that, the Wildcats earned a 41-28 victory over TCU, a game that featured defensive touchdowns by safety **Wesley Fair** (15-yard fumble return) and linebacker **Des Purnell** (25-yard interception return).
- Purnell's pick-6 came on the very next play after he had a sack and was part of a two-interception game with four total passes defended en route to Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- Johnson threw three touchdown passes against the Horned Frogs, including two to tight end **Garrett Oakley**, which gave him 11 in his career to set the school record by a tight end.

A LOOK BACK IN HISTORY

- K-State and Texas Tech will meet for the 25th time on Saturday as the Wildcats hold a 15-9 advantage in the series.
- These two teams also hold a special place in the Big 12 record book as they met in Manhattan on August 31, 1996, in the inaugural Big 12 Conference football game, a 21-14 Wildcat win.

AGAINST A RANKED FOE

- Kansas State will play a ranked team for the second time this season in No. 13 Texas Tech. The Wildcats opened the season with a narrow 24-21 loss to No. 22 Iowa State.
- This is the first time K-State will face a ranked Red Raider team since a 49-26 win over No. 25 Texas Tech in Lubbock in 2013.
- The Wildcats are looking to defeat a ranked opponent for the first time since September 2024 when they topped No. 20 Arizona, 31-7, before a 42-20 win over No. 20 Oklahoma State two weeks later.
- The last time K-State defeated a top-15 team was in the 2022 Big 12 Championship, a 31-28 overtime victory over No. 3 TCU.

FIVE ONE-SCORE GAMES

- Of Kansas State's last 21 games dating back to Week 2 of the 2024 season, 11 have been decided by just one score.
- Last year, the Wildcats went 4-2 in one-possession games. All four of the victories were fourth-quarter comebacks, which ranked second in the nation to Illinois' five.
- This season, K-State has played five one-possession games but has only come out on the winning side one time. In four of those games, the Wildcats had the ball with a chance to either tie or take the lead late in the fourth quarter.
- The five one-score games this year are tied for the second most among Power 4 teams (Ole Miss – 6; Arizona State, Iowa State and Virginia – 5).

TOWARD THE TOP IN CONSISTENCY

- K-State is one of only 10 Power 4 schools that have won at least nine games in each of the last three seasons, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, LSU, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oregon, Penn State and Tennessee.
- Among those teams, only Kansas State, Alabama, Clemson, Georgia and Oregon have accomplished that feat in addition to winning a conference championship during that time frame.

- The Wildcats are tied for second among current Big 12 teams and 18th among Power 4 teams with 32 total wins since the beginning of 2022.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- K-State has a total of 235 victories since 1996, which ranks 22nd nationally.
- Among active Big 12 teams, the Wildcats rank fourth behind BYU (247), TCU (244) and Utah (239).

A WINNING TRADITION

- Kansas State has totaled 147 Big 12 victories since the conference's formation in 1996, which stands as the most among active Big 12 programs.
- The Cats are also rank first among active Big 12 members in winning percentage since non-divisional play began in 2011. They sit at 59.5% (78-53), just ahead of Oklahoma State (58.8%; 77-54).
- During that stretch, the Wildcats are 44-21 (67.7%) at home in Big 12 play and 34-32 (51.5%) on the road/neutral.

A TRACK RECORD OF WINNING

- A proven winner with a championship history, **Chris Klieman** holds a 124-45 career record, as his 73.4% career winning percentage ranks fourth among current FBS coaches that have completed at least 10 seasons. He is also one of just 15 current Power 4 full-time head coaches with at least 100 career victories.
- Klieman, who is 52-32 since arriving at K-State, has led the Cats to five victories over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25, the most of any active Big 12 program since 2019.

FEW PENALTIES

- K-State enters this week's game against Texas Tech ranked third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.25) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (33.0).
- Since 2022, the Wildcats have averaged 42.23 penalty yards per game (48 games) to rank sixth among Power 4 teams, while their 4.87 penalties per game to rank ninth.

CATS TOPS IN NON-OFFENSIVE TDs

• K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 25-plus seasons as it has 139 since 1999, 11 more than the next closest team (Alabama – 128) and 20 more than the next Big 12 program (Utah – 119).

• K-State recorded four non-offensive scores during the 2024 season – its most since also recording four in 2020 – and has equaled that mark in 2025.

• The first non-offensive score of the year was **Bryce Noernberg's** 99-yard kickoff return against Army.

• Against TCU, **Wesley Fair** had a 15-yard fumble return touchdown in the second quarter before **Des Purnell** recorded a 25-yard interception return. It was the first time since the 2023 Baylor game that the Wildcats had two defensive touchdowns in one contest.

• Then, last week at Kansas, **Ralph Ortiz** scooped up an errant snap on a punt and returned it 20 yards for a score.

OFFENSIVE NOTES TOTAL OFFENSE

• K-State has totaled at least 375 yards of offense in 36 of the last 48 games dating back to the beginning of the 2022 season.

• The 36 games with at least 375 yards are tied for ninth in the Power 4 and rank second among Big 12 schools (TCU – 39).

• Georgia and USC lead the way with 41, followed by Ole Miss, Oregon and TCU with 39, Washington and Tennessee with 38, and Texas with 37.

• During that stretch, K-State holds a 28-8 record when totaling at least 375 yards, while the Wildcats are 4-8 when going under that mark. Two of their wins when going under 375 yards of offense have come in the last two games.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

• Kansas State enters the week ranked 16th nationally and third in the Big 12 by converting on 92.0% (23-of-25) of its red zone opportunities.

• That included a streak of 22-straight red-zone scores, which was the second-longest active streak in the Big 12 until taking a knee at Kansas to run out the clock.

• Since **Chris Klieman's** first season at K-State in 2019, the Wildcats have been the best in the Big 12 in terms of converting red-zone opportunities into points.

• The Wildcats rank first in the Big 12 with a 90.1% (292-of-324) success rate in the red zone since 2019, just ahead of Texas Tech (87.9%) and Oklahoma State (87.2%).

• K-State also ranks first in the league in touchdown success rate at 67.0% (217-of-324), ahead of Utah (66.0%) and Kansas (66.0%).

LIMITED SACKS PER GAME

• K-State has been one of the nation's best in terms of limiting sacks since head coach **Chris Klieman's** first season of 2019.

• The Wildcats rank fifth among Power 4 teams and second in the Big 12 by allowing only 1.43 sacks per game over the last six-plus seasons, a span of 84 games.

• K-State is seventh in the nation by allowing 0.75 sacks per game this season.

T.O.P. TURNAROUND

• Over its first four games of 2025, Kansas State averaged 24:28 in time of possession, ranking 131st out of 134 teams entering its Week 5 game against UCF.

• Over the last four games, K-State is averaging 33:24 in time of possession. The Wildcats now rank 91st nationally in that department – a 40-spot jump in the rankings – with a season average of 28:56 – a 4:28 rise in their average.

VERY EFFICIENT

• **Avery Johnson** tallied a career-best pass efficiency rating of 217.7 at Kansas. It was the 10th-best mark by a K-State quarterback 1996 (minimum 15 attempts), the best since Jesse Ertz had a 319.8 rating against Central Arkansas in 2017 and the best in a Big 12 game since Jake Waters had a 218.1 mark against Kansas in 2014.

• Johnson's mark was the second-best mark by a Big 12 quarterback in a league game this season.

MULTIPLE SCORING STRIKES

• **Avery Johnson** threw two touchdown passes against Kansas, his fourth-straight game with multiple touchdown passes and 17th in his 22 career starts under center. His performance at Kansas came on the heels of a three-touchdown game against TCU, the second time this season and sixth in his career he had three passing touchdowns in a game.

• Johnson is now in second place in school history with 45 career passing touchdowns, just three shy of the record held by Will Howard (2020-23).

• His 15 passing touchdowns this season are tied for fourth in school history by a junior – five shy of the record – and three shy of entering the school's top-10 list among all passers.

• On the flip side, the Wichita, Kansas, product has done a tremendous job of taking care of the football. He has a 0.8% interception rate this season to rank 13th in the nation and second among Big 12 signal callers.

4,000/1,000

• **Avery Johnson** became the fifth quarterback in program history to pass for 4,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in a career as he went over the 1,000-yard rushing mark against UCF.

• He was the second-fastest player in school history to hit that mark as he did so in his 26th career game, just four games shy of Michael Bishop (1997-98). The others to accomplish the feat were Eli Roberson (2000-03), Collin Klein (2009-12) and Skylar Thompson (2017-21).



AVERY ON THE RUN

- **Avery Johnson** ranks fifth in school history among quarterbacks with 1,156 career rushing yards, while his 5.00-yard career average on 231 carries ranks ninth in school history among all players and second among quarterbacks (Jesse Ertz, 2014-17 – 5.46).
- When taking away sack yardage, Johnson has rushed for 1,320 yards on 211 true rushing attempts, good for a 6.26-yard clip.

BROWN DELIVERS

- Wide receiver **Jayce Brown** leads the Wildcats this season with 36 receptions for 577 yards and four touchdowns.
- He had his best game as a Wildcat at Kansas, catching four passes for 160 yards, including a 78-yard touchdown. It was the most receiving yards by a Wildcat since Byron Pringle had 166 yards at Oklahoma State in 2017. His 40.0-yard average was the fourth-highest average nationally in a game this season (minimum four catches) and the third-highest average by a Big 12 player since 2018.
- A native of Fort Walton Beach, Florida, Brown has a career receiving average of 16.70 yards to rank ninth in school history and fourth in the nation among active players.

HARD RUNNING BY JACKSON

- Running back **Joe Jackson** tallied the first 100-yard rushing game of his career against TCU, going for 110 yards on a career-high 27 attempts. It shattered his previous bests of 61 yards on 13 carries the week prior at Baylor.
- It was the most rushing attempts by a Wildcat since DJ Giddens had 28 rushes against NC State in the 2023 Pop-Tarts Bowl, while it was the most against a Big 12 opponent since Giddens had 31 totes in the 2023 regular-season finale against Iowa State.
- Most of Jackson's damage against the Horned Frogs came in the second half when he tallied 88 yards on 21 carries.
- He backed that up with another solid outing at Kansas, rushing for 69 yards on 20 carries, including 35 yards on 13 attempts in the second half to help run out the clock.

CAREER RECORD FOR OAKLEY

- Tight end **Garrett Oakley** had two receiving touchdowns against TCU to bring his career total to 11, which is the most in school history by a tight end.
- The previous record of 10 was shared by current Washington Commander Ben Sinnott (2021-23) and Henry Childs (1971-73).
- Each of Oakley's four receiving touchdowns this season have come since September 27, tied for the most in the nation among tight ends since that date. He enters the week tied for seventh nationally in receiving touchdowns by tight ends this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES OPENING DRIVE DEFENSE

- Kansas State has allowed points only twice on opponents' first drive of the game or second half, which was a field goal to open the game at Baylor and a short-field touchdown by Kansas following a fumble on a kick return.
- Of the 16 total drives to start a half, the K-State defense has forced 12 punts – including seven 3-and-outs – a missed field goal and a turnover on downs.
- Five of the 2-and-outs have on opponents' initial drive of the second half. K-State's opponents have only managed four first downs and 57 total yards on the eight opening drives of the second half.

LIMITED POINTS PER GAME

- Since the 2021 season (61 games), the Cats are allowing 22.3 points per game, which ranks fourth among current Big 12 teams and 20th among Power 4 teams (minimum 40 games).
- Additionally, the Cats have allowed 155 offensive touchdowns (2.5 per game) over that time to rank 21st among Power 4 schools.
- The Wildcats have finished each of the previous three seasons allowing less than 24.0 points per game, their longest streak since going 13-straight years from 1991 through 2003.
- Since head coach **Chris Klieman's** first year of 2019, the Wildcats have held 46 of their 58 Big 12 opponents under their season average at the time it faces the Wildcats (excluding 2025 season opener against Iowa State).

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

- After beginning the 2025 season with a minus-1 turnover margin in the first three games (4 giveaways, 3 takeaways) to rank 86th in the nation and 12th in the Big 12, K-State has turned the tide on turnovers.
- Over the last five games, K-State is plus-10 in turnover margin, thanks to seven interceptions and seven fumble recoveries by the defense while only losing two fumbles and throwing two picks.
- K-State has made a 78-spot improvement in the national rankings from Week 3 to now as the Wildcats are eighth nationally and tied for first in the Big 12 in turnover margin.
- Additionally, K-State enters the week ranked third nationally and first in the Big 12 with 17 turnovers gained.

CREATING TURNOVERS

- Since the beginning of 2022, K-State has forced 79 turnovers, which is the most among active Big 12 teams and tied for eighth among Power 4 teams.
- Of the 79 turnovers, 47 have been via interception to rank second among all active Big 12 programs and tie for 16th among Power 4 teams.

JUMPING ON THE BALL

- K-State has had a propensity of falling on fumbles this season as it ranks first nationally and is the best in the Big 12 with nine recoveries.
- The nine fumble recoveries this season are the most through the first eight games of a season since the 2012 team had 10 recoveries in the first eight games. Last year, the Wildcats only had five fumble recoveries over 13 games.
- K-State's nine recoveries this season have come from nine different players in **Austin Romaine** (Iowa State), **Chiddi Obiazor** (Iowa State), **Tobi Osunsanmi** (North Dakota), long snapper **Mason Olguin** (Arizona), **Justice Clemons** (UCF), **Asa Newsome** (Baylor), **Wesley Fair** (TCU), **Ralph Ortiz** (Kansas) and **Malcolm Alcorn-Crowder** (Kansas).

ROMAINE LEADING THE WAY

- After leading the Wildcats in tackles last season en route to All-Big 12 Second Team honors, linebacker **Austin Romaine** is at it again in 2025.
- A product of Hillsboro, Missouri, Romaine has a team-leading 55 tackles, ranking 13th in the Big 12 with 6.9 tackles per game.
- Romaine has at least four tackles in every game this season, including 10 apiece against North Dakota and Army.
- Last season, Romaine led the Wildcats and ranked ninth in the conference with 96 tackles (7.38 per game). He was the first Wildcat with at least 90 tackles in a season since Jayd Kirby had 99 in 2017.

WILDCATS IN THE NFL

With NFL season in full swing, Kansas State currently has 19 players on NFL rosters. Of the 19, there are 11 on offense and eight on defense.



The longest-tenured former Wildcats are **Tyler Lockett** and **Cornelius Lucas**, who are in their 11th seasons, but both are playing for new teams. Lucas is in Cleveland after spending the last five seasons with the Washington Commanders, while Lockett – who began the season with Tennessee – is now with Las Vegas after spending his first 10 seasons with Seattle.

Four players from last year's roster are now on NFL teams, including third-round pick **Jacob Parrish** (Tampa Bay) and fifth-round selections **DJ Giddens** (Indianapolis) and **Marques Sigle** (San Francisco).

Defense was the theme in the game against Texas Tech. After beating the Red Raiders to open the Big 12 season in 1996, K-State faced a tough challenge in going to Lubbock. Both teams played well enough to win defensively, but K-State proved it was just a little stronger.

Texas Tech held the Wildcats to only 69 yards passing, allowing Michael Bishop to compete six passes in 21 attempts and forcing him to throw three interceptions. K-State was held in check rushing as well with 129 yards on the group and backup quarterback Jonathan Beasley led the team with 59.

K-State's only bring spot for the day was its defense which, once again, posted some great numbers. Texas Tech had just 117 yards in total offense, gaining 53 yards rushing and 64 yards passing. Texas Tech quarterback Zebbie Lethridge was sacked three times for 24 yards. The Cats allowed just six first downs the entire game and allowed only two third-down conversions.

The game was close throughout until Beasley, who saw most of his playing time for the season in this game, ran a 33-yard quarterback keeper in for a touchdown, putting the game out of reach.

PURNELL THE PLAYMAKER

• Senior linebacker **Des Purnell** put together an outstanding game against TCU as he was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week after carding five tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, a sack, two interceptions — including one he returned 25 yards for a touchdown — and two pass breakups.

• His sack and pick-6 came on consecutive plays, the first K-State player since at least 1989 to have both on consecutive plays and the only player in the nation to accomplish the feat this season.

• He is the only Big 12 player with a pick-6 and a sack in the same game this season and one of seven in the country.

• His four total passes defended are tied for fourth in the country for a single game this season and are tied for the most among linebackers. He was the first Wildcat with four passes defended in a game since safety Russ Yeast against West Virginia in 2021 and the first K-State linebacker to do so since at least 2003.

• His pick-6 against TCU was the third time in his career he found paydirt as he returned a fumble for a touchdown against Baylor in 2023 and returned a blocked punt for a score against South Dakota in 2022. He is one of only two players in school history to have a pick-6, fumble return touchdown and a punt return score in a career (Courtney Herndon, 2006-09).

• A native of Topeka, Kansas, Purnell ranks fifth nationally among active players with two defensive touchdowns, and he is the only active Big 12 player with a fumble return score and a pick-6 in Big 12 games in his career. He also ranks fifth nationally among active players with three career non-offensive touchdowns.

BREAKING UP THE PASS

• Sophomore cornerback **Zashon Rich** has eight pass breakups in eight games this season to tie second in the Big 12 and eighth in the country.

• His eight pass breakups are the most since Jacob Parrish and Marques Siple each had nine in 2023. Both of those players were drafted last year as Parrish was selected in the third round by Tampa Bay and Siple was taken in the fifth round by San Francisco.

• A native of Minneapolis, Minnesota, Rich added to his repertoire against UCF when he had a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss, including his first-career sack.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

• The Wildcats continue to lead the nation in total kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns since 2005 with 63, which is 23 more than the next closest team in Alabama (40) and 29 more than the next closest Big 12 programs, Oklahoma State and TCU (34).

• Of the 63 total returns, a nation-leading 32 are on kickoff returns, and the next closest team is Houston with 21.

HIGH AVERAGE ON RETURNS

• Kansas State enters the week ranked 13th nationally and tops in the Big 12 with a 26.86-yard average on kickoff returns, a mark that ranks fifth in school history.

• The Wildcats are looking to rank in the top-15 nationally in kickoff return average for the first time since 2021 (9th — 27.22). In head coach **Chris Klieman's** first year of 2019, K-State led the nation with a 29.50-yard average, which was the top mark in school history.

• The high average is boasted by a 99-yard touchdown by **Bryce Noernberg** against Army, the 12th kickoff return of at least 99 yards in school history.

EIGHT STRAIGHT

• With **Garrett Harstad's** blocked punt at Arizona, K-State has now blocked a punt in eight-straight seasons, which is the longest streak in the nation.

• San Diego State is next on the list with seven-straight years, while Iowa State, Michigan, Oregon State, Rutgers, South Carolina, Toledo and UNLV are tied for third with five-consecutive years.

RODRIGUEZ CONNECTS

• Due to injuries at kicker late in the summer, the Wildcats scrambled to find a replacement, and they landed community-college transfer **Luis Rodriguez** from College of the Canyons.

• After arriving in Manhattan just as preseason practices commenced, all Rodriguez has done over his first eight games is connect on 10-of-11 field goal and all 30 extra-point attempts. His lone miss this season was a blocked 56-yard attempt as time expired at Baylor.

• Rodriguez ranks 15th nationally and fourth in the Big 12 by connecting on 90.9% of his field goal attempts. He also has the ninth-longest streak in school history of extra-point connections to start a season.

HIGH AVERAGE BY McCLANNAN

• Sophomore punter **Simon McClannan** ranks sixth in the Big 12 with a 41.7-yard average on 32 punts. His average is boosted by eight punts that have traveled at least 50 yards, which is tied for fifth in the Big 12. Last year, McClannan only had six punts of 50 or more yards over 13 games.

• A native of Omaha, Nebraska, McClannan recorded a career-best 50.8-yard average on five punts at Arizona and came back with a 51.0-yard average on four punts against UCF. Following the game against the Knights, he was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week.

• It was the first time in the Big 12 era that Kansas State had a punter average at least 50.0 yards on at least four punts in consecutive games.

• McClannan enters his 24th-career game with a 42.08-yard average on 79 career punts, which ranks eighth in school history.

DEFENSE ON KICK RETURNS

• K-State has not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since the 2013 season, going the last 159 games and 457 returns without allowing its opponent to find paydirt.

• The streak is the longest among the active Big 12 teams, 261 returns better than the next closest team (Arizona State — 196).

• Since K-State allowed its last kickoff-return touchdown, the Wildcats have scored 15 of their own.

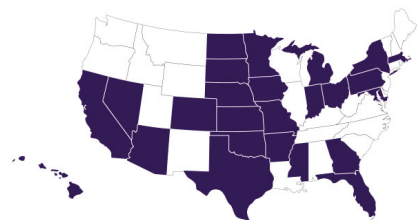

PRIOR RELATIONSHIPS

- Several K-State coaches had prior working relationships before their time in Manhattan. Defensive coordinator **Joe Klenderman** was a part of **Chris Klieman**'s original staff at North Dakota State and came to Manhattan with Klieman in 2019. When Klieman was the defensive coordinator at NDSU in 2012 and 2013, **Steve Stanard** was the linebacker coach.
- Additionally, Klieman and running backs coach **Brian Anderson** were at Western Illinois together from 1994 to 1996.
- Other connections include: assistant head coach/cornerbacks coach **Van Malone** and defensive ends coach **Buddy Wyatt** working together at Texas A&M in 2008 and 2009 as well as SMU from 2015 to 2017; Offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/associate head coach **Matt Wells** and tight ends coach **Luke Wells** working together at both Utah State (2013-18) and Texas Tech (2019-21).
- Also, Matt Wells and Athletics Director **Gene Taylor** were at Navy together from 1997 to 2001.

ROSTER NOTES OWNING THE STATE

- K-State casts a wide net in addition to owning its state when it comes to roster composition as a total of 25 states are represented on the 2025 roster, and none more than the state of Kansas as 33 players hail from the Sunflower State.
- The next highest totals come from Texas (14), Missouri (8), Florida (8), Colorado (6), Nebraska (6) and Georgia (5).



LOTS OF LETTERWINNERS

- For the sixth-straight season, Kansas State brings back 44 or more letterwinners as the 2025 squad sees 45 returning letterwinners come back for another year.
- Of the 45 returning letterwinners, 18 are on offense, 25 are on defense and there are two specialists.
- The 45 returning letterwinners are tied for the sixth most by a K-State squad since 2003.

SUPER SENIORS

- K-State has eight players who are using an extra year of eligibility and are seniors again in 2025 as the NCAA froze eligibility clocks during the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic in addition to the community-college ruling for this season.
- Those using a second senior season are cornerback **Justice Clemons**, transfer safety **Gunner Maldonado**, transfer wide receiver **Caleb Medford**, linebacker **Beau Palmer**, offensive lineman **Taylor Poitier**, defensive tackle **Uso Seumalo**, defensive end **Cody Stufflebean** and tight end **Will Swanson**.
- Poitier is actually in his seventh season of college football in 2025 due to the pandemic followed by season-ending injuries in both 2021 and 2022.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

- Kansas State welcomes 14 Division I or II transfers with eight on offense and six on defense. The 14 transfers are the most for K-State under head coach **Chris Klieman**, topping the previous mark of 11 last season.
- Nine of the transfers have multiple years of eligibility remaining, while nine of the 14 came from Power 5 schools.
- The incoming transfers for 2025 include: wide receiver **Jerand Bradley** (Texas Tech/Boston College), offensive lineman **Terrence Enos Jr.** (Pittsburgh), offensive lineman **George Fitzpatrick** (Ohio State), cornerback **Amarion Fortenberry** (South Alabama), safety **Gunner Maldonado** (Northwestern/Arizona), running back **Antonio Martin Jr.** (Georgia Tech/Southeastern Louisiana), wide receiver **Caleb Medford** (TCU/New Mexico), safety **Qua Moss** (West Georgia), offensive lineman **JB Nelson** (Penn State), linebacker **Ralph Ortiz** (West Florida), linebacker **Gabe Powers** (Ohio State), cornerback **Jayden Rowe** (Oklahoma), offensive lineman **Amos Talalele** (USC) and wide receiver **Jaron Tibbs** (Purdue).

THESE CATS ARE SMART

- Not only has Kansas State put in hard work on the field, but also in the classroom as the Wildcats have been one of the Big 12's best over the better part of a decade.
- Since 2014, K-State has accumulated a Big 12-leading 347 Academic All-Big 12 selections, which is 34 more than the next closest program (Iowa State).
- The Wildcats have produced at least 24 Academic All-Big 12 performers every year since 2014, including a school record 45 selections in 2023.

SERIES NOTES

- K-State leads the all-time series, 15-9, which includes a current eight-game winning streak – the longest by either team in the series – and a 12-1 mark over the last 13 meetings.
- The Wildcats also hold a 15-6 advantage since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. One of those games was the first-ever Big 12 game, as the Cats topped Tech, 21-14, on August 31, 1996.
- Two years ago in Lubbock – the last time the two teams met – then-true freshman Avery Johnson rushed for five touchdowns, tying the school's single-game record in a 38-21 victory.
- In 2022 in Manhattan, K-State rushed for 343 yards, including 171 yards by running back Deuce Vaughn and 170 yards by quarterback Adrian Martinez. The game was tied, 13-13, midway through the third quarter, but the Wildcats outscored the Red Raiders, 24-15, the rest of the way.

Game Notes

• This was the 24th all-time meeting between K-State and Texas Tech with the Wildcats now holding a 15-9 advantage in the series, including a 15-6 edge as Big 12 members... K-State extended its winning streak to eight games, the longest streak by either team in the series, while the Wildcats have won 12 of the last 13 in the series... K-State won on the road for the first time this season, while they have now rebounded from a loss with a victory twice this year (defeated UCF after losing at Missouri).

• The K-State defense, which had two interceptions on the season coming into the game, came up with three interceptions against Texas Tech... It was the Wildcats' first game with at least three interceptions since they had four against Missouri in 2022... Of the three picks, safety Kobe Savage had two, the first multi-interception game by a Wildcat since Kevin McGee had two at Iowa State in 2018.

• Quarterback Avery Johnson rushed for 91 yards and five touchdowns in addition to throwing for 77 yards on 8-of-9... His five rushing touchdowns tied a school record, joining Collin Klein (2011 vs. Texas A&M) and Jonathan Beasley (2000 vs. North Texas)... It was the most rushing touchdowns by a true freshman in a game in school history... He is the only player in the nation this year with five rushing scores... The last player in the nation with five rushing touchdowns in a game was Pitt's Israel Abanikanda, who had six against Virginia Tech on October 8, 2022.

JOHNSON'S 5 TDS HELPS K-STATE RUN PAST TECH

LUBBOCK, Texas – On a night in which everyone wore black, purple and white was the color of the night, as Kansas State knocked out Texas Tech, 38-21, behind a record-tying performance by true freshman quarterback Avery Johnson, who rushed for five touchdowns in his first appearance in a Big 12 Conference game at Jones AT&T Stadium.

Johnson rushed 12 times for 91 yards and his rushing touchdowns tied the all-time record by Collin Klein in 2011 and Jonathan Beasley in 2000.

Johnson, who also completed 8-of-9 passes for 77 yards, entered the game for the first time late in the first quarter and rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. He raced five yards into the end zone in the second quarter, then scored three straight touchdowns on runs of 30, 11 and three yards in the second half, as the Wildcats went from a 21-17 deficit to a 17-point lead.

On and on it went. It was mesmerizing to watch.

K-State, 4-2 overall and 2-1 in the Big 12, appeared as potent as it has been all season behind a rushing attack that gained 273 yards on 46 carries against a Red Raiders' defense that allowed 123.0 yards on the ground per game.

Johnson and the Wildcats could've run for even more, but Johnson slid down after a 14-yard gain as the team ran off the final minute of their most lopsided win over the Red Raiders since 2014. They raced through Texas Tech, 3-4 and 2-2, to win their eighth straight in the series, while Johnson joined elite company.

Although the defending Big 12 Champions came back from defeat to score victories last season, they had something to prove after a loss at Oklahoma State and were badly in need of a road win before back-to-back home games against TCU and Houston.

Mission accomplished.

Texas Tech outgained K-State 480-436 and the battle was tight in the beginning. Although K-State had a 17-14 lead at halftime, Texas Tech brushed that aside in a hurry behind true freshman Jake Strong, who took the Red Raiders 99 yards in 10 plays for a 21-17 lead with 9:31 left in the third quarter.

But Johnson and the Wildcats rose to the top.

Johnson, who split possessions with starting senior Will Howard in the first half, took control in the third quarter. He led his team 75 yards in nine plays capped by his 30-yard touchdown run on third-and-10 behind blocks from left guard Cooper Beebe, center Hayden Gillum and right guard Hadley Panzer. It was Johnson's third touchdown of the game, and he hadn't looked any better or comfortable.

He only appeared to gain confidence as the game wore on.

Treshaun Ward led K-State with 15 carries for 118 yards and formed a potent one-two punch with Johnson.

VJ Payne intercepted Strong when he stepped in front of an overthrown pass intended for Myles Price. Payne returned the ball to the 11 to set up Johnson, who strolled untouched into the end zone for his fourth touchdown and a 31-21 lead.

K-State regained the ball again when Strong threw a pass directly to Kobe Savage in the middle of the field at the K-State 28.

Strong tried to overcome his lumps, though, and fired pass after pass before Savage caught another interception off an overthrown pass, this time in the end zone for a touchdown.

• A culture of selflessness, discipline, toughness and commitment is the cornerstone of a Chris Klieman-led K-State program, and that is what has led the Wildcats to sustained success and the distinction of being the winningest active program in the Big 12 Conference. In six seasons, Klieman has led the Wildcats to a 52-32 record as he has the second most wins in school history.

• Under Klieman's leadership, K-State has won eight or more games in five of the six seasons, the lone exception being the COVID-19 campaign of 2020. No other coach in school history has more wins or eight-plus win seasons in their first six years. Klieman has led the Cats to five victories over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 – the most of any active Big 12 program since 2019 – while they have eight wins over top-20 teams since 2019 – which is tied for the second most among current Big 12 teams. Additionally, the Wildcats' overall record the last two years (18-8), three years (28-12) and four years (36-17) all lead the Big 12.

• Sustained success is demonstrated by K-State being one of only five Power 4 teams to win at least nine games each of the last three seasons with at least one conference championship in that timeframe, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia and Oregon. The Wildcats' three-straight seasons of at least nine wins are the most since an eight-year streak from 1993 through 2000.

• The latest of the stretch of nine-win campaigns came in 2024 as the Wildcats earned a pair of early-season victories over teams ranked No. 20. Those two top-20 wins propelled K-State to a 7-1 start, its best record over the first eight games of a season since 2014. Although the Wildcats finished the regular season with one win in their final four games, they ended on a high note with a thrilling 44-41 victory over Rutgers in the Rate Bowl. That game saw K-State trail by as many as 17 points in the middle of the third quarter and by 13 points early in the fourth before it put together the largest bowl comeback win in school history.

• The Rate Bowl victory capped a school-record tying four comeback victories by Klieman's squad when trailing in the fourth quarter, matching the mark by the 2011 Wildcats. In addition to the bowl win, K-State also overcame a seven-point deficit in week two at Tulane for a 34-27 win; a four-point deficit by scoring on a 50-yard touchdown pass with 2:14 left at Colorado for a 31-28 win; and a one-point deficit with a 51-yard field goal with 1:42 left for a 29-27 win over Kansas, the latter being the Wildcats' 16-straight Dillons Sunflower Showdown victory.

• It only took year four of the Klieman era for a milestone to be reached at K-State as the Wildcats captured the 2022 Big 12 Championship – the fourth league title in school history and first since 2012 – and the Wildcats finished the season with a 10-4 record, the 11th double-digit victory campaign in school history. K-State finished No. 9 in the final College Football Playoff Top 25, the Wildcats' second-highest ranking ever in the CFP era and the highest for the final poll. K-State also ranked No. 14 in the final Associated Press Top 25 and Coaches' Poll, the highest final ranking since 2012.

• The Wildcats' championship campaign was spearheaded by a school-record three victories over teams that were ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25, culminating with a 31-28 overtime victory over No. 3 TCU in the Big 12 Championship. In fact, since Klieman took over the reins of the K-State program in 2019, the Wildcats have five wins over teams ranked in the top 10 of the AP Top 25 poll, the most victories by any Big 12 program over that span.

• Under Klieman, 10 Wildcats have been selected in the NFL Draft, including four in 2023 and three in 2024. In fact, Anudike-Uzomah was selected in the first round (No. 31) and Julius Brents was picked in the second round (No. 44) of the 2023 NFL Draft, marking the first time in school history two Wildcats were taken within the first 44 picks of an NFL Draft.

• Prior to arriving at K-State, Klieman capped his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018. He tied Jim Tressel (Youngstown State) for the most FCS National Championships as a head coach, while he was a part of seven national championships at NDSU, which was the most in FCS history at the time of his departure. Klieman guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record, just the fifth team in FCS history to go undefeated and untied on the way to a national championship.

• Klieman was a three-time All-Gateway Conference defensive back at Northern Iowa and four-year letterwinner from 1986 to 1990. He graduated from UNI in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health education and a master's degree in physical education in 1992.

• Klieman and his wife, Rhonda, are parents of two sons, Devin and Colby, and one daughter, Haley.

Game Notes

• This was the 109th all-time meeting between K-State and Iowa State, each coming in consecutive seasons as this is the eighth-longest active uninterrupted series in FBS history... It was the second time this century that there was a ranked matchup on opening day (2009 – No. 14 Boise State vs. No. 16 Oregon) and the first time two Big 12 teams met in Week 0/1 since Nebraska faced Oklahoma State in 2003.

• Kansas State and Iowa State played to yet another one-score game... It was the 14th one-score game between the two teams dating back to 2008, the most in any series in the country... Each of the last four games in the series have been decided by one score.

• Junior **Avery Johnson** posted a pass efficiency rating of 168.4, which was the second-highest of his career (min. 10 attempts)... His career best is 186.0 last year at West Virginia... His 273 passing yards were the second most of his career, just behind the 298 yards he put up last year at West Virginia... He has now thrown for multiple touchdowns in four-straight games dating back to last season... K-State is now 6-1 all-time when Johnson passes and rushes for a touchdown.

• Junior defensive end **Tobi Osunsanmi** finished the game with a career-high 2.0 sacks... His previous best was 1.5 sacks in last year's season opener against UT Martin... It was the most sacks by a Wildcat since Brendan Mott had 2.5 last year at Colorado... As a team, K-State had 4.0 tackles, its most since carding four in last year's Cincinnati game.

K-STATE FALLS TO IOWA STATE IN DUBLIN

DUBLIN, Ireland – They call the Aer Lingus College Football Classic “Much More Than a Game,” and this fifth edition of the classic lived up to that billing, as the 2025 college football season got underway under the lights of Aviva Stadium. In a game that featured two ranked teams and longtime arch-rivals, No. 17 Kansas State and No. 22 Iowa State slugged it out in old-school style in the rain before the Cyclones finally outlasted the Wildcats, 24-21, to get a quick jump on the 2025 season.

The game that was announced 486 days ago and pitted the Wildcats against the Cyclones for the 109th time in the eighth-longest active uninterrupted series in FBS history carried a Big 12 feel with purple filling one side of the stadium and red filling the other.

Both teams reportedly sold 11,000 tickets, but the crowd was much larger, as the teams played before a sellout crowd of 47,221. The K-State marching band, which endured significant travel challenges to make it more than 4,000 miles for kickoff, was in midseason form at an overseas venue that served as a home game for the Wildcats and brimmed with purple furnishing, thousands of purple Powercat flags, and highlight upon highlight upon the videoboard.

In the end, though, Iowa State, 1-0 overall and 1-0 in the Big 12, made more plays to capture its third straight victory over K-State, 0-1 and 0-1 in the Big 12, in a series that dates to 1917.

From beginning to end, this game was excruciatingly close — on brand with previous clashes between these two programs. The teams have played 14 one-score games since 2008, the most in any series in the country. Each of the last four games in the series have been decided by one score. It wasn't until the final possession by Iowa State that this back-and-forth game reached its conclusion.

Johnson rocketed a deep ball to new wide receiver Jerand Bradley for a 65-yard catch-and-run down the Iowa State sideline, as Bradley outran three defenders for his first K-State touchdown. K-State trailed, 24-21, with 6:23 left in the fourth quarter, and still had a chance.

But Iowa State dug in and drained the clock behind a punishing second-half rushing game that gashed the Wildcats. K-State needed a stop. K-State needed the football. But K-State couldn't get the stop it needed for its offense to gain possession. After an Iowa State timeout on fourth-and-3 at the K-State 16-yard line, Iowa State quarterback Rocco Becht completed a pass to running back Carson Hansen and let him take care of the rest, as he rumbled and twisted on a 15-yard catch-and-run to the 1-yard line just before the 2-minute timeout.

From there, the Cyclones downed the ball three times inside the 3-yard line until the game clock expired.

After the teams slugged through the rain in the first half, the conditions proved more favorable over the final two quarters. Johnson completed 21-of-30 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns, and Becht went 14-of-28 for 183 yards and two touchdowns. Both quarterbacks, who can run, were limited by field conditions. Becht had 12 carries for 18 yards and one touchdown, and Johnson had eight carries for 21 yards and one score.

A promising sign for K-State? It's passing game. Jayce Brown had four catches for 78 yards and one touchdown, Bradley had three catches for 75 yards and one touchdown, tight end Garrett Oakley had five catches for 65 yards, and Jaron Tibbs had four catches for 35 yards.

LATE TD LIFTS K-STATE PAST NORTH DAKOTA

MANHATTAN, Kan. — No. 17 Kansas State found a way.

Avery Johnson engineered an 81-yard drive and threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to running back Joe Jackson with 42 seconds remaining, and the Wildcats held off first-time starting quarterback Jerry Kaminski and North Dakota for a 38-35 nail-biting victory Saturday at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State led 31-21 late in the third quarter before North Dakota scored two touchdowns, including a 20-yard run by Sawyer Seidl that gave the Fighting Hawks a 35-31 edge with 4:19 left in the fourth quarter, leaving the sellout crowd of 51,927 in stunned silence while North Dakota first-year head coach Eric Schmidt applauded his players' effort from the sideline.

But Johnson and the Wildcats avoided disaster in their first-ever meeting against North Dakota and prevented the FCS member from pulling off perhaps its biggest win in history.

The back-and-forth slugfest ended with K-State staging its fifth come-from-behind victory since the beginning of the 2024 season when trailing in the fourth quarter. This one marked the Wildcats' first game-winning touchdown with under 1:00 left in regulation since Skylar Thompson connected with Isaiah Zuber on the final play in a home game against Iowa State in 2017.

Johnson had career highs across the board as a passer, completing 28-of-43 passes for 318 yards and three touchdowns, while he rushed for 43 yards, including a crucial 25-yard run on the game-winning drive.

In the second game of his second season as a full-time starter, Johnson showed something to Kliesen in the game-winning drive.

After K-State's final touchdown, North Dakota took over with 37 seconds to go, and the crowd rose to peak level, and a K-State defense that had its hands full with the Fighting Hawks all game forced Kaminski to throw four straight incompletions, including a deep ball that glanced off the hands of Caden Dennis down the sideline with 5 seconds left, as the Wildcats survived a rollercoaster night.

K-State outgained North Dakota, 461 to 354, in total offense and held the Fighting Hawks to just 5-of-14 on third downs and 1-of-2 on fourth downs. K-State improved to 27-7 when totaling at least 375 offensive yards since 2022.

K-State wide receiver Jayce Brown had a career-high 12 catches for 109 yards and a touchdown, marking the most receptions by a K-State player since Tyler Lockett had 13 in the final game of his career, the 2014 Alamo Bowl. Jerand Bradley had five catches for 46 yards and Jaron Tibbs had three catches for 55 yards and a touchdown.

However, the third quarter saw sophomore running back DeVon Rice rise to the occasion with a pair of touchdowns of nine and 13 yards. Seeing significant action in place of the injured Dylan Edwards, Rice had seven carries for 40 yards and two touchdowns, and Joe Jackson had 11 carries for 55 yards.

Meanwhile, Jackson's lone catch in the game made everybody happy. Jackson caught the game-winning pass from Johnson along the edge to the right side inside the 10-yard line, turned up field and stepped into the end zone, then dropped the ball and flexed in excitement.

K-State got it done in the clutch. K-State found a way.

Kansas State is now 102-21 in regular-season non-conference games since 1990, which includes an 85-10 mark at home... The Wildcats are 25-19-1 all-time against current members of the American.

• Junior **Avery Johnson** made his 17th-career start at quarterback, going 15-of-25 through the air for 172 yards and a touchdown... He now has 318 career completions to rank 10th in school history as he passed Eli Roberson (307 - 2000-03)... He now has 36 career touchdown passes to tie Michael Bishop (1997-98) for sixth place in school history.

• Junior wide receiver **Jayce Brown** recorded three receptions for 29 yards... He now has a catch in each of the last 24 games dating back to the 2023 Texas Tech contest... It is the longest streak by a Wildcat since Phillip Brooks had a 25-game streak over the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

• Redshirt freshman **Bryce Noernberg** returned a third-quarter kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown... It was the K-State's first kickoff-return touchdown since Malik Knowles took one 93 yards for a touchdown against Oklahoma in 2021... It was the longest by a Wildcat since Knowles went 99 yards earlier in the 2021 season at Oklahoma State.

ARMY GRINDS OUT 24-21 VICTORY OVER K-STATE

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Kansas State hoped its lengthy preparation for Army paid dividends. All that quarterback Avery Johnson and the Wildcats offense could do, though, was watch almost the entire second half from the sideline as the Black Knights ran, ran, and ran some more — and scored. It all ended with a forgettable 24-21 loss in front of a sellout crowd at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State took a 13-7 lead into halftime following a balanced first two quarters between the teams. K-State led in total offense, 198 to 140, and in time of possession — 16:15 to 13:45. Then Army started its march. And it simply wouldn't be stopped.

Incredibly, K-State possessed the football for fewer than four minutes in the second half. The Wildcats ran four offensive plays from scrimmage before their final fourth-quarter drive. In actual time, the K-State offense didn't see the field for almost an hour.

Army quarterback Cale Hellums and slotback Noah Short guided drive after drive. They put together drives of 14, 13 and 14 plays that consumed more than seven minutes apiece and produced two touchdowns and a field goal in the second half.

K-State saw its halftime lead dissolve as Army efficiently ran the ball down the field with three- and four-yard gains. And the clock continued to dwindle.

K-State surrendered its lead for good the final time that the noticeably worn-down defense was on the field. Facing second-and-4 at the K-State 14-yard line, Hellums got good blocking from the right side of the line, skated through a hole up the middle with only an arm touching along the way, and celebrated with his teammates in the end zone to take the 24-21 lead, capping a monster 14-play, 56-yard drive and giving the Wildcats just 2:52 left to pull off a comeback.

Johnson completed 15-of-25 passes for 172 yards and one touchdown and one interception. His first pick of the season arrived when a ball deflected off running back Joe Jackson and into the hands of Collin Matteson near midfield with 1:35 left.

The Black Knights ran three plays to run out the final 95 seconds and secure their third win all-time against the Wildcats.

Army outgained K-State, 332 to 247, as the Black Knights put up 237 rushing yards, went 10-for-22 on third downs, and 6-for-7 on fourth downs. Army held the ball twice as long as K-State — 40:44 to 19:16. K-State recorded its lowest time of possession in a game since holding the ball for 18:34 at Louisville in 2008.

Total plays? Army ran 82, K-State ran 43. It marked the fewest plays by K-State in a game since it ran 41 plays against Navy in the 2019 Liberty Bowl.

It marked the third-straight close game to start the season for K-State, which suffered a 24-21 loss to Iowa State in Ireland and needed a game-winning touchdown to escape North Dakota, 38-35.

Game Notes

• This was the ninth all-time meeting between Kansas State and Arizona with UofA now holding a 6-2-1 advantage in the series... K-State has dropped its last three Friday road games, losing at Stanford in 2016 and at Texas in 2021.

• Sophomore **Garrett Harstad** blocked a punt in the third quarter, which eventually led to a K-State touchdown... It was K-State's first blocked punt since Ty Bowman had one in last year's season opener against UT Martin... The Wildcats have now blocked a punt in each of the last eight years, which currently stands at the longest streak in the nation... San Diego State entered the 2025 season tied with K-State by blocking a punt in each of the last seven years.

• **Jayce Brown** recorded six receptions for 68 yards, extending his catch streak to 25 games... He recorded a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second half, the Wildcats' longest rush since Deuce Vaughn went 88 yards for a score in the 2022 Sugar Bowl... It was the longest rush by a K-State wide receiver since Malik Knowles went 75 yards for a score on the first play of the 2022 season against South Dakota.

• **Simon McClannan** averaged 50.8 yards on his five punts on Friday evening, a new career high... His previous best was a 46.5-yard average on four punts last year against Rutgers in the Rate Bowl... It was the first time a K-State punter averaged more than 50 yards per punt on at least four punts since Ty Zentner had a 54.3-yard average against Missouri in 2022.

K-STATE FALLS TO ARIZONA, 23-17

TUCSON, Ariz. – Kansas State never found its groove, Arizona put together a powerful running attack, and K-State suffered a 23-17 loss in its first true road game of the season.

Playing at Arizona Stadium, the site of K-State's first-ever bowl victory in the 1993 Copper Bowl, K-State incurred a rash of troubles in the final game before its first bye week.

K-State experienced difficulties from the start, while Arizona moved the ball. Arizona outgained K-State 412 to 193 and went 8-of-18 on third down behind a solid performance from quarterback Noah Fifita, who completed 16-of-33 passes for 178 yards and rushed 15 times for 48 yards and two touchdowns. Ismail Mahdi had 22 carries for 189 yards on the ground.

Avery Johnson completed 13-of-29 passes for 88 yards and had seven carries for minus-16 yards and one touchdown.

K-State's leading rusher was wide receiver Jayce Brown, whose 75-yard touchdown run out of the Wildcat formation down the right side on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter gave K-State hope and drew the Wildcats to within 17-10. Brown had one carry for 75 yards and also led K-State with six catches for 68 yards.

Even after its troubles, K-State had a chance to win the game. K-State had fourth-and-7 from its 43-yard line, but Johnson saw his pass across the middle to Brown fall incomplete with 1:00 to go, effectively ending the game and extending the Wildcats' woes.

Arizona led 17-3 at halftime while outgaining K-State 257 to 44 in the first two quarters. K-State's lone score in the first half was a career-long 51-yard field goal by Luis Rodriguez with 7:42 left in the first quarter, which marked the first score by either team.

But Fifita scored touchdowns on runs of 15 and 2 yards, and Michael Salgado-Medina hit a 31-yard field goal, as Arizona had its way in the first two quarters. About the only thing that didn't go right for Arizona came when Salgado-Medina missed a 62-yard field goal to end the first half.

Faced with a halftime deficit, Brown and K-State seemingly sprang to life in the third quarter. On the first play from scrimmage, Brown took the football out of the Wildcat formation and dashed 75 yards down the right side for a touchdown to draw K-State to 17-10 just 13 seconds into the second half.

After K-State held Arizona to a three-and-out for the first time in the game, the K-State special teams came alive. Punter Salgado-Medina dropped a snap, and K-State's Garrett Harstad blocked a punt as K-State took over at the Arizona 13-yard line. It was the eighth-straight season the Wildcats have blocked a punt, the longest streak in the nation.

Johnson threaded the ball down the middle to Brown to the 1, and two plays later Johnson punched the ball into the end zone for a 17-17 tie.

Then Qua Moss leaped in front of Keyan Burnett to intercept a halfback pass from Javin Whatley, and K-State had a chance to take the lead. It marked the first K-State defensive interception this season and the first interception by the Arizona offense this season.

However, K-State went three-and-out and Arizona started its possession at the K-State 46 and drove for a Salgado-Medina 31-yard field goal and a 20-17 lead with 2:40 left in the third quarter.

On Arizona's next drive, Fifita methodically took Arizona down the field on a 7:30 drive before Damian Ilalio and Travis Bates sacked him and forced another Salgado-Medina 41-yard field goal. That gave Arizona a 23-17 lead with 4:25 to go.

K-State was unable to answer. Facing fourth-and-3 at the K-State 32-yard line, with 2:31 left, Johnson saw his pass fly off Brown's hands on a slant route, giving the ball back to Arizona.

Game Notes

• This was the third all-time meeting between Kansas State and UCF with the Wildcats now holding a 3-0 lead... It was the first time the Wildcats had a morning kickoff to almost exactly one year as they defeated Oklahoma State, 42-20, at home on September 27, 2024... The Wildcats have won each of their last four Big 12 home openers, defeating Texas Tech in 2022, UCF in 2023 and Oklahoma State last year prior to this victory.

• Junior quarterback **Avery Johnson** threw for 168 yards and two touchdowns on 18-of-25 attempts... With his two touchdown passes, Johnson now has 38 in his career as he moved into fifth place in school history, passing Eli Roberson (2000-03)... He now has 5,248 yards of total offense in his career, entering the school's top-10 list... His 72.0% completion mark was a new career high, bettering the 70.0% clip in the season opener against Iowa State (min. 10 attempts).

• Johnson rushed for a season-high 75 yards on Saturday... He now has 1,038 career rushing yards as he became the seventh quarterback in school history to reach the 1,000-yard mark.

• Running back **Dylan Edwards** rushed for a season-high 166 yards and a touchdown... It was the second-most yards of his career, behind a 196-yard output last year against Rutgers in the Rate Bowl... He had a 75-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, which was a career-long rush... His previous career long was a 65-yard touchdown in last year's Rate Bowl... It was the second-straight game the Wildcats had a 75-yard touchdown run as Jayce Brown had one at Arizona... It was the first time K-State had runs of at least 75 yards in consecutive games in school history.

JOHNSON, EDWARDS LEAD BALANCED ATTACK IN WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Avery Johnson passed for 168 yards and two touchdowns, and he added 75 rushing yards on 12 carries, and standout running back Dylan Edwards had 166 rushing yards and one score, as Kansas State put together its best performance of the season in a much-needed 34-20 win over UCF.

K-State took a 17-7 lead into the half and led 31-10 late in the third quarter after Edwards took a handoff and raced down the right sideline 75 yards for a touchdown, prompting a massive celebration among the crowd of 53,013 and coaches and players on the sideline for a K-State team that came off a bye week looking to rebound after a few tough losses.

Johnson, coupled with Edwards, his childhood best friend and pee-wee football teammate from the Wichita area, stole the show.

UCF suffered its first loss in the second tenure of head coach Scott Frost, who had won 16 straight with the Knights, and who led a squad into Manhattan after an emotional week following the sudden death of offensive line coach Shawn Clark.

K-State outgained UCF 434 to 402. The Wildcats had season highs both with 434 total yards and 266 rushing yards and were a perfect 4-for-4 inside the red zone. The K-State defense held the Knights' offense to 3-for-13 on third downs, and it held a squad that led the FBS in fourth-down conversions without a single fourth-down conversion in the contest.

Tayven Jackson completed 12-of-24 passes for 115 yards and one interception, and Jacurri Brown completed 1-of-2 passes with one touchdown and one interception. Running back Myles Montgomery had 10 carries for 119 yards.

But K-State held UCF to 20 points after the Knights entered averaging 39.7 points per game. The Wildcats had some standout performances on defense, including two interceptions, eight tackles for loss and three sacks.

Johnson completed 18-of-25 passes for 168 yards and two touchdowns, and his 12 rushes for 75 yards were just what the doctor ordered in keeping the Knights defense honest. He was poised, calm, and picked his spots well in the running game.

Wide receiver Jaron Tibbs had eight catches for 72 yards, Garrett Oakley had two catches for 36 yards, and Sterling Lockett and Cure both had their first-career catches in a K-State uniform.

And then there was Edwards. And he was downright dangerous.

Game Notes

• This was the 22nd all-time meeting between Kansas State and Baylor with the Bears evening the series at 11-11... Baylor took a 7-5 advantage in the series in games played in Waco... K-State is now 11-19 in its Big 12 road opener since the league's inception in 1996.

• The Wildcats went 75 yards on their first drive, the first opening-drive touchdown of the season and first since last year's Cincinnati game on November 23... In its first drive of the second half, K-State went 97 yards for a touchdown... It tied for the 12th-longest drive in school history and was the longest since a 97-yard drive at Baylor in 2022.

• Avery Johnson threw for 344 yards and two touchdowns on 29-of-45 aim, while he rushed for 72 yards and another one score... His 29 completions were tied for the seventh most in a game in school history, while his 344 passing yards were the most by a Wildcat since Jake Waters had 400 yards at West Virginia in 2014... He now has 1,110 career rushing yards to rank fifth in school history among quarterbacks... He now has 40 career passing touchdowns to tie for fourth in school history.

• Garrett Oakley tallied seven receptions for 54 yards and a touchdown... His seven receptions were a new career high, bettering the four he had two games ago at Arizona and in last year's regular-season finale at Iowa State... It was the most receptions in a game by a tight end since Ben Sinnott had 10 catches in the 2023 regular-season finale against Iowa State... Oakley now has 54 career receptions to rank fifth in school history by a tight end, passing Kent Dean (1984-87), who had 50.

LATE FIELD GOAL LIFTS BAYLOR PAST K-STATE

WACO, Texas – Kansas State saw Baylor's Caden Jenkins block a 56-yard field goal attempt by Luis Rodriguez with 5 seconds remaining, and the Wildcats suffered another narrow loss with a 35-34 defeat at McLane Stadium.

Avery Johnson completed 29-of-45 passes for 344 yards and two touchdowns and one interception, and he added 10 carries for 72 yards and one score, but his standout performance was overshadowed by a valiant comeback from Baylor, which stormed back from a 31-17 deficit to take the lead on a Connor Hawkins 53-yard field goal with 31 seconds left, ultimately giving the Wildcats their fourth one-score loss in a frustrating season.

Baylor's comeback was keyed by one of the rare mistakes of the game by Johnson, whose pass up the middle to wide receiver Jaron Tibbs was intercepted by Jacob Redding, and his 66-yard return gave the Bears a 32-31 lead with 4:28 left in the fourth quarter.

On the ensuing drive, the Wildcats were unable to get the ball into the end zone inside the 10 and used a Rodriguez 22-yard field goal to take a 34-32 lead with 1:48 left.

The Bears weren't finished. Sawyer Robertson, who entered the game leading the FBS in passer rating, passing yards and touchdown passes, completed 25-of-39 passes for 345 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, and he drove the Bears for Hawkins' decisive 53-yard field goal, which proved to be enough to keep the Wildcats winless on the road.

Although Baylor entered with the 11th-ranked offense in the FBS, the Wildcats outgained the Bears 501-443 in total offensive yards, forced three turnovers, and held the Bears to just 3-of-9 on third downs and 0-1 on fourth downs. K-State also led in time of possession 37:47 to 22:13. Johnson's 344 passing yards were the most by a K-State quarterback since Jake Waters had 400 at West Virginia in 2014.

The game featured standout performances by pass catchers from both teams. K-State wide receiver Jayce Brown had four catches for 106 yards and one touchdown, and Tibbs had six catches for 80 yards. Tight end Garrett Oakley had a career-high seven catches for 54 yards and one touchdown. Baylor tight end Michael Trigg had eight catches for 155 yards.

K-State and Baylor were tied 17-17 at halftime. The Wildcats began their first drive of the second half at its own 3-yard line in what turned out to be arguably the best drive so far in the 2025 season as the Wildcats converted on two third-and-shorts and one fourth-and-short to keep alive a possession that included a Brown 30-yard catch-and-run before Brown caught a 12-yard touchdown back-hip pass on a slant at the goal line for a 24-17 lead. It was the Wildcats' longest drive of the season — 14 plays, 97 yards and it consumed 6:41.

K-State then forced a three-and-out keyed by a 10-yard sack by defensive end Cody Stufflebean. Following a punt, the Wildcats regained possession at the Baylor 44-yard line. Johnson found tight end Will Anciaux, who out-wrestled Baylor's Tevin Williams III for the ball, and that gave the Wildcats the ball at the 5. Dylan Edwards scored on the next play to make it 30-17 with 1:15 left in the third quarter.

Robertson and the Bears tried to answer as the game steered into the fourth quarter. But facing fourth-and-8 from the K-State 15-yard line, Robertson overthrew wide receiver Kole Wilson on fade in double coverage.

But moments later, Robertson came back and hit Trigg with a pair of long passes. First, he completed a 42-yard pass to Trigg to take the Bears to the K-State 40. Then Robertson fired a 29-yard completion that Trigg caught with one hand to the K-State 11. Finally, running back Bryson Washington caught a swing pass at the 10 and broke tackles to get the ball inside the right pylon for a score. Robertson ran into the end zone for a 2-point conversion to cut K-State's lead to 31-25 with 8:50 to go.

K-State had its eyes set on putting the game away with a touchdown. Johnson converted a third-and-11 at the K-State 29 when he found running back Joe Jackson on a 17-yard catch-and-run. Facing third-and-9 at the K-State 48, Johnson hit Tibbs for 11 yards. But the next play, disaster struck. Johnson's pass up the middle to Tibbs was intercepted by Redding, whose pick six gave the Bears a 32-31 lead with 4:28 left.

The K-State offense was ready come back. Johnson fired a right-side stop-and-go deep ball over the defense to Brown, who raced down the field, but was ruled down at the Baylor 28 when his helmet was taken off. Brown was credited with a 48-yard catch.

Caldra Williford, who took off Brown's helmet, was charged with a face-mask penalty, which gave K-State the ball at the Baylor 14. Three Jackson runs got the ball to the 4. But facing third-and-goal at the 4, Johnson's pass fell incomplete, leading to Rodriguez's 22-yard field goal for a 34-32 lead with 1:48 to go.

Then Baylor answered with Hawkins' 53-yarder.

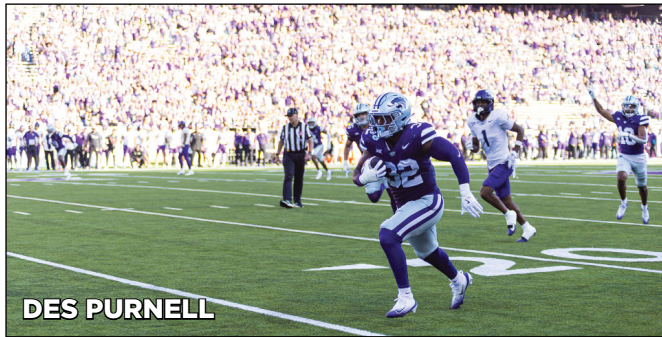

Game Notes

• This was the 19th all-time meeting between Kansas State and TCU with the Wildcats now holding an 11-8 advantage in the series, including a 7-3 mark in games played in Manhattan... K-State has won each of the last three matchups dating back to the 2022 Big 12 Championship, the longest streak by the Wildcats in the series.

• K-State had two defensive scores in the contest as **Wesley Fair** had a 15-yard fumble return touchdown and **Deshaun Purnell** had a 25-yard interception return touchdown... It was the first time the Wildcats had a fumble-return touchdown and a pick-6 in the same game since the 2023 Baylor contest... In that game, Purnell had a 15-yard fumble-return touchdown and Keenan Garber had a 45-yard interception-return touchdown.

• **Deshaun Purnell** recorded a 25-yard interception-return touchdown, which came just one play after he had an 8-yard sack... It was his second-career interception and the first he returned for a touchdown... It was K-State's first pick-6 since Marques Sigle returned a pick 43 yards for a score last year at West Virginia.

• **Deshaun Purnell** had two interceptions in the contest as he had one in the fourth quarter along with his pick-6 in the third quarter... It was the first time a Wildcat had two interceptions in one game since Jacob Parrish had two at Texas in 2023... It was the first time a Wildcat linebacker had two interceptions in a game since Elijah Lee had two against TCU in 2015.

• **Garrett Oakley** had two touchdowns, giving him 11 for his career, which is a new school record by a tight end... The previous record of 10 was shared by Ben Sinnott and Henry Childs.

DEFENSE PACES K-STATE IN 41-28 WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Avery Johnson threw three touchdowns, including two to tight end Garrett Oakley to reach a milestone, and an opportunistic Kansas State defense accounted for two touchdowns as well, as the Wildcats blew past TCU 41-28 at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Playing without leading rusher Dylan Edwards and sack leader Tobi Osunsonmi, K-State showed it had more than enough talented bodies to get past TCU, which historically has had a tough time against the Wildcats. K-State has now won six of its last seven meetings and hasn't lost to the Horned Frogs in Manhattan since 2017. K-State beat TCU, 41-3, the last time the teams met on October 21, 2023.

This win was plenty big. After a chain of past heartbreaks for a team still busting with potential, the Wildcats cut it loose, scored their most points all season, and recorded a pair of defensive touchdowns in a single game for the first time in two years — a Wesley Fair 15-yard fumble recovery for a 14-7 lead, and a Deshaun Purnell 25-yard interception return to make it 21-7 — en route to handing the Horned Frogs their most unpleasant defeat of the season.

Johnson completed 16-of-26 passes for 198 yards and three touchdowns, and grinded out 29 yards on the ground on 13 rushing attempts. He appeared sensational at times with a 32-yard touchdown pass to Oakley in the second quarter, a 17-yard touchdown pass to Oakley in third quarter, and a 12-yard touchdown pass to 6-foot-6 wide receiver Jerand Bradley in the back of the end zone in the fourth quarter. Oakley's 11 career touchdown catches are the most by a tight end in K-State history.

Meanwhile, there are some who maybe didn't believe what they were seeing — as Fair, and then Purnell darted into the end zone for defensive scores. Purnell had two interceptions, the first time a K-State linebacker had two in a game since Elijah Lee against TCU in 2015.

The awareness of Fair gave the Wildcats a 14-7 lead with 2:02 left in the second quarter — and the Wildcats led the game the rest of the way. TCU's talented quarterback Josh Hoover threw a pass down the line to wide receiver Ed Small — which was ruled by officials as a lateral — and the ball bounced off Small's hands in the right flat. Fair picked up the ball near the TCU sideline and raced 15 yards into the end zone.

Purnell put together arguably the best back-to-back plays by a K-State defender this season as K-State built a 21-7 lead. On first down, Purnell swept in and sacked Hoover at the TCU 15. Then Purnell dropped back into coverage, read the eyes of Hoover, and stepped in front of the pass, caught the ball, and it was clear sailing for a pick-six and a 14-point lead with 10:28 left in the third quarter.

It was K-State's first pick-six since Marques Sigle returned an interception 43 yards for a score at West Virginia last season.

It was the first time K-State had two defensive touchdowns in a game since against Baylor in 2023. K-State now has 138 non-offensive touchdowns since 1999, which leads the FBS during that span.

Game Notes

• This was the 123rd all-time meeting between K-State and Kansas, the ninth most-played rivalry in FBS history... It was also the 115th consecutive meeting between the two schools, the third-longest uninterrupted series in the FBS... The Wildcats have now won each of the last 17 meetings and 30 of the last 35 dating back to 1991... Kansas State defeated KU in Lawrence for the ninth-consecutive time dating back to 2010.

• K-State picked up its 17th-consecutive victory over Kansas to improve the longest streak in the series by either team... Among active uninterrupted winning streaks (must have played and won every year), the Wildcats' 17-game streak over KU is the most in the FBS.

• Kansas State forced four turnovers on Saturday on fumble recoveries by **Ralph Ortiz** and **Malcolm Alcorn-Crowder**, as well as interceptions by **Daniel Cobbs** and **Gunner Maldonado**... It is the fourth-straight game the Wildcats forced multiple turnovers after beginning the year with just three in their first three games.

• **Jayce Brown** tallied four receptions for a career-high 160 yards and a touchdown... It was the fifth 100-yard game in his career, one shy of entering the school's top-10 list... His 160 receiving yards was the most by a Wildcat in a game since Byron Pringle had 166 yards at Oklahoma State in 2017... His touchdown reception came on a 78-yarder toward the end of the third quarter, K-State's longest pass play since an 80-yarder by Deuce Vaughn against Kansas in 2022, while it was the longest touchdown reception since an 81-yard by Phillip Brooks at Iowa State in 2022.

WILDCATS DOMINATE KU IN SUNFLOWER SHOWDOWN

LAWRENCE, Kan. — Seventeen and counting! Kansas State entered the Sunflower Showdown as the underdog for the first time since this remarkable winning streak began in 2009, but the Wildcats emphatically showed that it was the same 'ol, same 'ol in a series that they have dominated for nearly two decades, racing past Kansas, 42-17, for a 17th straight win over their rival — and keeping the coveted Governor's Cup Trophy in Manhattan for another year.

On a dreary and cold Saturday in Lawrence, it was K-State — not Kansas — that repeatedly lit up the scoreboard, quickly conjuring memories of many previous victories at Memorial Stadium. As time ticked down, some folks headed toward the stadium exits, but the K-State marching band blared on, and K-State players and coaches paraded toward the visiting locker room serenaded by rain-soaked K-State fans, who remained, and who were warmed by the vision of the numerals upon the scoreboard and by the smiles upon the faces of players who labored for this win.

K-State answered its skeptics. Kansas fell to 4-4 and 2-3.

K-State with 17-straight wins over Kansas now owns the longest winning streak in an uninterrupted series in the FBS. Georgia owns a 16-game winning streak over Kentucky.

After starting the season with a 1-3 record, K-State has gone 3-1 with the lone loss a one-point defeat at Baylor on October 4. K-State thumped TCU 41-28 in its previous game on October 11.

With K-State and Kansas both coming off bye weeks, many believed this Sunflower Showdown had the makings of a nailbiter. After all, K-State entered as one of only three Power 4 teams to already have five games decided by one possession. Also, the last two K-State/Kansas battles were notably close. Two years ago, K-State beat Kansas 31-27 in Lawrence, and last season K-State beat Kansas 29-27 in Manhattan. Didn't happen this time in front of 41,525 at Memorial Stadium. K-State, which said it was ascending into a really good team, exploded.

K-State led 21-14 at halftime and finished things off by outscoring Kansas 21-3 in the final two quarters. K-State outgained Kansas 371-247 in total yards, outgained the Jayhawks in passing yards 231-137, and outgained them in rushing yards 140-110. K-State averaged 7.0 yards per play; Kansas 3.2. The Wildcats also collected four sacks on Jalon Daniels, who went 17-of-35 for 129 yards and one interception. The leader in passing efficiency in the FBS entering the game, Daniels never seemed comfortable against the Wildcats' defense, which sent four and five rushers at a time while defensive backs took care of the back end.

K-State forced four takeaways — two fumble recoveries by Ralph Ortiz and Malcolm Alcorn-Crowder, and two interceptions by Daniel Cobbs and Gunner Maldonado. K-State now has 17 takeaways this season and entered the game ranked 12th nationally in that department.

In a game that featured impressive performances, perhaps K-State sophomore wide receiver Jayce Brown shined the brightest. He had four catches for 160 yards and one touchdown for the most receiving yards by a K-State player since Byron Pringle at Oklahoma State in 2017, and Brown's 78-yard catch-and-run touchdown was the longest pass play since Will Howard's 80-yard pass to Deuce Vaughn against Kansas in 2022. The touchdown couldn't have come at a better time.

K-State grinded down the field. Johnson converted a fourth-and-1 play to get the ball to the Kansas 33. Three plays later, Johnson rolled to his right and threw across his body and found Brown in front of Mason Ellis near the goal line. DeVon Rice pounded it into the end zone for a 28-14 lead with 7:23 left in the third quarter.

BILL SNYDER FAMILY STADIUM

58TH YEAR – 1968-2025



Renamed in honor of Hall of Fame coach Bill Snyder by a proclamation of the Kansas Board of Regents on Nov. 16, 2005, Bill Snyder Family Stadium is hosting its 58th season of Wildcat football this fall.

Originally named KSU Stadium, the facility was built at a cost of \$1.6 million and financed from student fees, athletics gate receipts and contributions. The stadium opened its doors Sept. 21, 1968, with a 21-0 shutout of Colorado State. The original seating capacity was set at 35,000, and an expansion in the summer of 1970 added 4,000 permanent bleachers on the east side and 3,000 temporary bleachers on the west side.

Following the 1998 season, the addition of a deck and sky suites on the east side of the stadium increased capacity to more than 50,000. On Nov. 11, 2000, 53,811 fans witnessed Kansas State's 29-28 win over Nebraska. It remains the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Kansas.

Bill Snyder Family Stadium's more recent changes include a \$75 million project to construct the West Stadium Center in 2013 and the new Vanier Football Complex, with full completion in time for the 2016 season.

Most recently completed is the Shamrock Zone in the south end zone, named on behalf of the Bill Ryan and Martin Ryan families who own and operate Shamrock Trading Corporation. The Shamrock Zone was completed in time for the 2021 season. The project has transformed the south concourse and includes permanent concessions and restrooms for the first time in the history of Bill Snyder Family Stadium, along with two new videoboards in the southwest and southeast corners of the stadium, the latter of which fans began enjoying in 2020.
