## OPENING TIP

■ K-State (11-18, 2-14 Big 12) wraps up its home schedule tonight, as the Wildcats host West Virginia (17-12, 8-8 Big 12) at Bramlage Coliseum.

■ The matchup with the Mountaineers will be the second of 3 consecutive repeat opponents to end the regular season, as K-State travels to No. 14/15 Kansas (21-8, 11-5 Big 12) on Saturday afternoon.

■ The Wildcats lost both first meetings with WVU and Kansas, including a 59-54 setback to the Mountaineers on Jan. 27. K-State led 49-45 with 3:38 to play before senior **Treysen Eaglestaff** scored 8 of his 12 points in the last 3 minutes to lift WVU to the come-from-behind win. The Wildcats had 2 chances to tie the game in the last 22 seconds, but junior **P.J. Haggerty** had his layup blocked out of bounds with 14.5 seconds left before missing a 3-pointer with 10 seconds.

■ WVU holds a 17-13 edge in the all-time series, including 16-12 in the Big 12 era. However, K-State has won 5 of the last 8 meetings with 4 straight wins at home in the series.

## LAST TIME OUT

■ A 9-0 run gave TCU the lift it needed in a back-and-forth contest with K-State, as the Horned Frogs won their fifth in a row over the Wildcats with a 77-68 victory on Saturday at Bramlage Coliseum.

■ The Wildcats pulled to within 67-65 on a 3-point play by sophomore **David Castillo** with 4:44 to play before the decisive 9-0 run that put the Horned Frogs up 11 (76-65) with just over 2 minutes left.

■ TCU was led by junior **Xavier Edmonds**, who once again proved to be a nightmare for K-State with a 15-point, 13-rebound double-double that came with 3 assists, 3 steals and 2 blocks. After scoring 6 of the game's final 7 points in a come-from-behind win in Fort Worth on Feb. 7, Edmonds was responsible for 6 of the 9 points in the decisive run that put the game away.

## NOTES ON K-STATE

■ The Wildcats have shown the ability to score points this season, as they have recorded 80 or more points in 15 games, which includes a school-record 8 games of 90 or more points and 2 games of 100 or more points.

■ The team is averaging 79.5 points on 45.9 percent shooting, including 36 percent from 3-point range. They are still on pace to post the highest field goal percentage since connecting on 48.4 percent in 1988-89. They rank among the top 30 in several categories, including 24th in assists (17.3) and 25th in fastbreak points (14.9)

■ The 2305 points are the third-most points through 29 games, just behind the 2315 in 2009-10 and the 2306 in 2007-08. The 79.5 points per game scoring average is the third-highest in school history and highest since 2009-10.

■ The Wildcats have set the school single-season record for 3-point field goals with 275, connecting on 36 percent. The 275 makes are 6 more than the previous record of 261 set during the 2021-22 season.

■ The No. 3 scorer nationally at 23.3 points per game, Haggerty ranks first in field goals made (255) and is second in points (677) and field goals attempted (516). Johnson leads the Big 12 with 63 steals, while he is second in average (2.2 spg.)

## NOTES ON WEST VIRGINIA

■ Led by first-year head coach **Ross Hodge**, West Virginia enters the last week of the regular season with a 17-12 record, including an 8-8 mark in Big 12 play. The Mountaineers snapped a 3-game skid with a 79-71 win over No. 19/23 BYU on Saturday.

■ West Virginia is averaging 69.9 points on 44.4 percent shooting, including 33.3 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 64.7 points on 41.6 percent shooting, including 35.6 percent from 3-point range. The Mountaineers are out-rebounding their foes, 34.8 to 32.8, and turn the ball over just 11.1 times per game. They are shooting 67.5 percent from the free throw line.

■ Under Hodge, the Mountaineers have developed into one of the top defensive teams in the Big 12, ranking second (ninth nationally) in scoring defense (64.7 ppg.) and fifth in field goal percentage defense (41.6).

■ Three players are averaging in double figures led by senior **Honor Huff's** 15.7 points per game on 36.4 percent shooting with 99 made 3-pointers. Senior **Brenen Lorient** (11.5 ppg.) and graduate **Chance Moore** (10.0 ppg.) also average in double figures, while senior **Treysen Eaglestaff** is averaging 9.9 points per game with 51 made 3-pointers.
