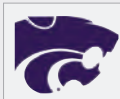

Preseason All-American **P.J. Haggerty** became the first Division I player since **Ja Morant** in 2018-19 to average 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals to go with 6.5 free throw per game while at Memphis in 2024-25.

Junior transfer **Abdi Bashir Jr.** led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while at Monmouth in 2024-25 while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332).

K-State's 5 Division I transfers - **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, **P.J. Haggerty**, **Marcus Johnson**, **Nate Johnson** and **Khamari McGriff** - have combined to score 5,415 points in 411 career games with 229 starts.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: CALIFORNIA

► Led by third-year head coach **Mark Madsen**, California is off to a 3-0 start for the first time since 2019-20 after home wins over Cal State Bakersfield (87-60), Wright State (77-67) and Cal State Fullerton (93-65). The Golden Bears return 5 players, including 2 starters (**DJ Campbell**, **Rytis Petraitis**), from a squad that went 14-19 overall, including 6-14 in their first season in the ACC, in 2024-25.



► California is averaging 85.7 points on 45.6 percent shooting, including 28.4 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 64 points on 37.6 percent shooting, including 25.0 percent from 3-point range. The Bears out-rebound their opponents, 41.7 to 35.3, and turn the ball over just 10.7 times per game. They are shooting 81.4 percent from the free throw line.

► The Golden Bears are a balanced team with all 5 starters averaging in double figures led by former Wildcat **Dai Dai Ames**, who is averaging a team-best 21.7 points per game on 57.1 percent shooting, including 60 percent from 3-point range. Delaware transfer **John Camden** is averaging 16.7 points on 47.1 percent shooting with 4.7 rebounds, while Michigan transfer **Justin Pippen** is averaging a team-best 5.7 assists to go with 14.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. Syracuse transfer **Chris Bell** (10.7 ppg.) and Vanderbilt transfer **Lee Dort** (10.0 ppg.) are also averaging double figures, while Dort has a team-best 8.0 rebounds per game.

► The Bears were picked 16th in the 18-team preseason ACC poll by the league coaches. Duke is the preseason favorite to win the league.

► Madsen, who won NBA championships in 2001 and 2002 while playing for Lakers in a 9-year playing career, is in his seventh season as a head coach, including his third at Cal. He won his 100th game as a head coach in the 93-65 win over Cal State Fullerton on Monday. He went 70-51 in 4 seasons at Utah Valley (2019-23) before becoming head coach at Cal in 2023.

SERIES HISTORY

► K-State leads the all-time series, 7-1, including 1-0 in games played in Manhattan and consecutive wins. This will be the first meeting since a 63-54 win by the Wildcats at Haas Pavilion on Nov. 11, 2022. The lone previous meeting in Manhattan was an 82-75 Wildcat win on Dec. 9, 2007.

► K-State is 28-26 against teams from the ACC, including a 10-1 mark in games played at home. This is the first meeting at home with a current member of the ACC since a 69-61 win over Virginia Tech on Dec. 4, 2011.

LAST MEETING:

K-STATE 63, CAL 54 (Nov. 11, 2022)

► **Markquis Nowell's** 4-point play with just over 5 minutes to play helped ignite an 8-0 run that lifted K-State to a 63-54 win over California at Haas Pavilion in the last meeting between the schools on Nov. 11, 2022.

► Nowell hit a 3-pointer from the corner right in front of the Wildcat bench before being knocked to the ground. He calmly hit the free throw to give K-State a 51-46 lead with 5:07 to play.

► Nowell's clutch shot came with the momentum clearly on the side of the Golden Bears, who had used separate runs of 13-0 and 11-0 run to erase a 20-point deficit and cut the lead to 47-46 with 5:37 to play.

LAST TIME OUT

K-STATE 98, BELLARMINE 71

► Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including the first career points/assists double-double for junior **P.J. Haggerty**, as K-State moved to 2-0 on the season with a 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Saturday night at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The offense continued its fast pace, as K-State (2-0) posted 90 or more points in the first 2 games for the first time in nearly 34 years while totaling the most points in that span since scoring 193 to open the 1991-92 season.

► The Wildcats posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era at 62.3 percent (33-of-53), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 62.5 percent against Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.

► Haggerty led the way with his third career double-double and first points/assists double-double, as he finished with a game-high 23 points on 5-of-9 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a career-best 11 assists. It marked his first double-double since posting a pair of tradition points/rebounds double-doubles while playing at Tulsa in 2023-24.

► Two Wildcats — senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** — each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals. Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

► **Abdi Bashir Jr.** also had double figures with 16 points with 5 3-pointers.

► K-State broke open a back-and-forth affair with an 18-4 run near the midway point of the first half en route to taking a 46-30 lead into the halftime break. The lead grew to 19 points in early moments of the second half before a timeout by Bellarmine head coach **Doug Davenport** keyed a surge by the Knights, who closed to within 62-52 with 13:04 to play.

► Bellarmine kept the pressure on K-State over the next 6 minutes, staying within 11 points, including 73-62 on back-to-back layups, before a 10-5 run by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 83-67 at the final media timeout. The squad then ended the game on a 15-4 run to put it away.

POSTGAME NOTES

► K-State moves to 2-0 on the season for the fourth time in 5 seasons.

► K-State is now 190-62 in non-conference games since 2006, including 148-18 in home non-conference games and 132-14 in non-conference games at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State made 14 3-pointers for the second consecutive game, tying seven others for the seventh-most in a game in school history... Five different players had at least one triple, including 5 each from Bashir and Castillo.

► K-State had 24 assists on 33 made field goals (72.7 assist rate).

► K-State used a starting lineup of junior **P.J. Haggerty**, senior **Nate Johnson**, junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, junior **Elias Rapieque** and senior **Khamari McGriff**... This is the first time using this lineup and the first career start for Rapieque.

■ BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

'CATS PICKED 9TH IN BIG 12 POLL; HAGGERTY NAMED ALL-BIG 12

► K-State was picked ninth in the 16-team Big 12 preseason poll, while junior transfer **P.J. Haggerty** was named to the 10-member Preseason All-Big 12 team by the league coaches on Oct. 16.

► Haggerty's selection marks the second straight year that a Wildcat has been named to the preseason all-conference team (**Coleman Hawkins**, 2024) by the league coaches. He is one of 9 players in school history to be chosen for preseason all-conference honors dating to **Manny Dies** in 1998-99. Others include **Jacob Pullen** and **Curtis Kelly** in 2010-11, **Rodney McGruder** in 2012-13 and **Marcus Foster** in 2014-15 and **Barry Brown Jr.** and **Dean Wade** in 2018-19.

► Haggerty is one of 3 newcomers on the Preseason All-Big 12 team, along with freshmen **AJ Dybantsa** (BYU) and **Darryn Peterson** (Kansas). The trio of newcomers are joined by 7 returners in BYU's **Richie Saunders**, Houston's **Emanuel Sharp**, **Joseph Tugler** and **Milos Uzan**, Iowa State's **Tamin Lipsey** and Texas Tech's **Christian Anderson** and **JT Toppin**. Dybantsa, Uzan, Peterson and Toppin were all unanimous.

► K-State received 117 points to place ninth in the poll, just 3 points behind eighth-place Cincinnati and 27 points ahead of 10th-place TCU.

► Regular-season and tournament champion Houston was picked first with 224 points and 14 first-place votes followed by second-place BYU (204 points, 1 first-place vote) and third-place Texas Tech (200 points).

► Haggerty has already received a number of preseason accolades, including All-America honors from CBS Sports, Jay Bilas, The Field of 68, Jon Rothstein and @CBBAnalytics. He was also named to the watch list for the Jerry West Award, which is given annually the nation's top shooting guard, as well as the NABC Division I Player of the Year and Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year awards.

HOW THE ‘CATS WERE BUILT

‘CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, INCLUDING 5 DIVISION I TRANSFERS

► K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 5 Division I transfers, 4 players from the international ranks and 1 true freshman. The class has been rated nationally as high as No. 4 by *247Sports* and No. 20 by *On3*.

► Among the 10 newcomers are 5 Division I transfers, including **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (Monmouth), **P.J. Haggerty** (Memphis), **Marcus Johnson** (Bowling Green), **Nate Johnson** (Akron) and **Khamari McGriff** (UNC Wilmington). Haggerty, N. Johnson and McGriff were on teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.

► The 4 international additions include the school’s first-ever players from Italy (**Dorin Buca**), Serbia (**Andrej Kostic**) and Germany (**Elias Rapieque**). The fourth international player - **Stephen Osei** - from Toronto played at the junior college level at Casper College in Wyoming.

► Haggerty is coming off a career year at Memphis, in which, he became the first Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while earning consensus Second Team All-American honors. The AAC Player of the Year ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759).

► Johnson became the first Akron player to be named both the MAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year in the same season and the first since Ball State’s **Bonzi Wells** in 1998.

► Bashir was one of the top scorers in the NCAA in 2024-25, leading the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game while leading the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.85) and second in total 3-pointers (127).

► McGriff was one of the top sixth men in the CAA at UNC Wilmington, where he was part of 99 wins and 3 conference championships.

► A member of the German U18 and U20 National Teams, Rapieque played in 53 games with ALBA Berlin in 2024-25 between the EuroLeague (27 games) and the German Basketball Bundesliga (26 games).

► Kostic was a member of the Serbia U18 and U19 National Teams, winning the gold medal at the 2023 European U18 Championship and the silver medal at the 2024 European U18 Championship.

► The lone freshman - **Exavier Wilson** - was a 3-time all-state selection and scored more than 1,700 career points in his prep career.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- K-State has posted a 190-62 (.752) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 148-18 (.890) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 132-14 (.903) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
- K-State’s 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. Last season, the team went 7-6 in non-conference play, including 4-1 in Bramlage Coliseum.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

- K-State enters the 2025-26 season as one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,758-1,255 (.583) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,758 wins are the 43rd-most in Division I history (one shy of Virginia in 42nd), including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

TANG ADJUSTS COACHING STAFF

- Head coach **Jerome Tang** adjusted his coaching staff during the offseason, adding veteran head coach **Matthew Driscoll** as associate head coach as well as acclaimed player development coach **Bill Peterson** as an assistant coach and **Chase Driscoll** as director of video and analytics.
- The winningest coach in both North Florida and Atlantic Sun Conference history during a 16-year stint (2009-25) with the Ospreys, Driscoll joined the staff on May 23. He won 248 games at North Florida, including 144 in ASUN play, while guiding the school to 3 regular-season championships and the league’s tournament championship and a NCAA Tournament bid in 2015.
- Driscoll’s relationship with Tang dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for 6 seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach **Scott Drew’s** staff.
- Peterson has served in various capacities in the NBA, including the Golden Warriors, Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks. He has mentored over 20 NBA players, including Hall of Famers **Dirk Nowitzki**, **Steve Nash** and **Karl Malone**. He also has a combined 10 years of head coaching experience at the NAIA, Division II and G-League levels in his 47-year coaching career.
- Peterson coached alongside Tang while at Baylor from 2017-22, where they helped guide the Bears to the 2021 NCAA Championship.
- **Chase Driscoll** joined the staff on May 13 after serving as an assistant coach and director of operations for his father, Matthew, at North Florida.

BAYLOR NORTH

- With the additions of associate head coach **Matthew Driscoll** and assistant coach **Bill Peterson**, **Jerome Tang** tapped into his coaching history, as all three were on staff at Baylor. Tang and Driscoll were part of **Scott Drew’s** first staff from 2003-09, while Tang and Peterson helped the Bears to the 2021 NCAA title while together on staff from 2017-22.
- Driscoll and Peterson aren’t the only K-State staffers with Baylor ties, as director of player development **Austin Carpenter** was a graduate assistant for Tang with the Bears from 2020-22, while current graduate assistants **Henry Dugat** and **Mark Vital Jr.** are among the best players in Baylor history.
- Dugat is one of five players known as “The Foundation” that was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021. He was part of Drew’s first two recruiting classes that led to Bears’ historic turnaround. He still ranks in the top 20 all-time in program history with 1,229 career points.
- Vital was a 3-time All-Big 12 selection and a member of Baylor’s 2021 National Championship team, playing in 126 games with 105 starts.

WILDCATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 138-299 (.316) record, including 28-85 (.248) vs. the top-5, 56-150 (.272) vs. the top-10 and 80-211 (.275) vs. top-15.

K-State has 45 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 13 seasons, including 17 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 34 Top 25 wins at home.



PLAYER NOTES

HAGGERTY AMONG THE BEST

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** is the among the best players to transfer to K-State, as he is coming off a career-best year in 2024-25, in which, he became the first Memphis Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while becoming the first Division I player to average at least 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game to go with 6.5 free throws per game since **Ja Morant** in 2018-19. He is the only Division I player to average at 21 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in each of the last 2 seasons.

► Haggerty ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759) in 2024-25, while his 759 points were an AAC single-season record and the most since **Dajuan Wagner** (762) set the school season record in 2001-02.

► Haggerty was a consensus Second Team All-American in his lone season at Memphis, while was just the second Tiger to be named the AAC Player of the Year as well as Most Outstanding Player at the AAC Tournament. He was also a finalist for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award, the Wooden Award and the Riley Wallace Award as the most impactful transfer.

► Haggerty, who has also made stops at TCU (2022-23) and Tulsa (2023-24), has scored more than 1,400 points (1,433) in his college career, connecting on 48.4 percent from the field and 79.1 percent from the free throw line. He has scored in double figures in 64 of 72 career games with 25 games of 25 or more points, including two 30-point games and one 40-point game. He scored a career-high 42 points vs. Wichita State on March 14.

HAGGERTY ALSO GREAT AT LINE

► In addition to his scoring prowess, **P.J. Haggerty** is also great at getting to the free throw line, as he ranked in the top-3 nationally in both free throws made and attempted in the past 2 seasons, including second in attempts (309) and third in makes (237) in 2023-24 while playing at Tulsa and second in both makes (224) and attempts (274) in 2024-25 while at Memphis.

► Haggerty has made 461 free throws on 583 attempts in the past 2 seasons, averaging nearly 7 makes on nearly 9 attempts in his last 66 games played.

► Last season, Haggerty connected on 81.8 percent from the free throw line with an AAC-best 224 makes on 274 attempts. He went perfect from the line in 6 games, including 14-of-14 vs. Tulane on March 15 in the AAC Tournament. He made 27 straight free throws at one point during the season.

► Haggerty drew 7.9 fouls per 40 minutes as a sophomore at Tulsa in 2023-24, finishing behind only National Player of the Year **Zach Edey** with 309 free throw attempts, while his 237 free throws were the third-most in the country.

BASHIR GOOD FROM 3

► Junior guard **Abdi Bashir Jr.** is among the best returning 3-point shooting in the country, as he led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332) in 2024-25. He broke both the Monmouth and CAA (Coastal Athletic Association) single-season record for 3-pointers (327).

► Bashir connected on a career-high 10 3-pointers in his 38-point performance against Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2024. The 10 treys tied for the second-most in Monmouth history. He made at least 5 3-pointers in 12 games, while he had 8 triples in back-to-back games vs. Northeastern (2/24/25) and Elon (2/27/25).

► Bashir has made 182 3-point field goals in his 67-game college career on 38.6 percent shooting, which is nearly 3 made 3-pointers per game.

► As a sophomore, Bashir led Monmouth and the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game, while he was 16th in scoring and 25th in total points (663) in the NCAA. He posted five 30-point games, which tied for the most in program history, while he scored 20 or more points in 13 other contests. He scored a career-high 38 points at Rutgers on Nov. 15, 2024, which were the most points scored against the Scarlet Knight since 1977.

► Bashir also had notable performances against Michigan State (20 points), Wichita State (15 points), Stephen F. Austin (30 points), Seton Hall (28 points), Lehigh (22 points), Princeton (26 points) and Auburn (15 points) in 2024-25.

BASHIR ALSO A TWIN

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and his brother **Abdul** are among 9 sets of twins playing Division I basketball in 2025-26, including one of 3 sets of identical twins (Illinois’ **Tomislav** and **Zvonimir Ivisic** and Texas State’s **Dimp** and **Ky Pernel**). They also one of 3 sets playing at different schools, joining **Ethan** (Air Force) and **Eli** (Le Moyne) **Greenberg** and **Tajuan** (Seton Hall) and **Takai** (Oregon) **Simpkins**.

► Buca, Kostic and Rapieque are the first-ever players from their respective countries, while the trio joins Ikegwuruka among 7 players from Europe.

► Junior **Nate Johnson** nearly made history in his first game in a Wildcat uniform, as he narrowly missed the school’s first triple-double in the 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4, as he finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists.

► Johnson’s 6 made 3-pointers are the most by a Wildcat in a season opener, while his 9 assists tie **Aaron Swartzendruber** vs. Kansas City in 1996 and **Larry Reid** vs. UTSA in 2000 for the most in an opener.

► Junior All-American candidate **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and Johnson (22 points) became the first duo to go over 20 points in a season opener in nearly 18 years since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points, respectively, against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

► Haggerty’s 27 points, which came on 10-of-20 field goals and 6-of-7 free throws, are ninth-most by a Wildcat in an opener and the most since the aforementioned Beasley, who had 32 points in his first career game.

► Haggerty and Johnson became the first Wildcat duo to post 20-point games in any game since **Arthur Kaluma** (23) and **Cam Carter** (21) did it against No. 6/6 Iowa State on March 9, 2024.

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was the other Wildcat to score in double figure, scoring all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

► The 93 points equaled the most by a **Jerome Tang**-team in a season opener (93 vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) and were the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014.

► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. The 14 made 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game and are the most-ever in a season opener.

► The Wildcats scored 60 of their 93 points in the second half, connecting on 59.5 percent from the field and 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range. The 60-point second-half marked the 11th time that a Wildcat team has 60 or more points in a half and tied for the ninth-most points in any half.

38th season [1988-present]

Now in its 38th season of hosting Wildcat men's basketball, the **Fred Bramlage Coliseum** has carved its own niche in K-State's colorful history of basketball homes. In keeping with the tradition established by Nichols Gymnasium (1910-50) and Ahearn Field House (1950-88), the arena has given the team a deafening, winning environment since its opening in 1988.

Dubbed the "Octagon of Doom," K-State has posted a 443-153 (.743) all-time mark in its current home, including an emotional 81-77 win over Purdue (led by alumnus **Gene Keady**) in the facility's debut on Nov. 26, 1988. The 443 victories are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the previous mark of 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88).

K-State has earned double-digit victories in 29 of its 37 seasons at Bramlage Coliseum, including a streak of 18 consecutive seasons from 2001-19. Three times Wildcat teams have set the single-season mark with 16 wins in the arena, which came in the 2008-09, 2010-11 and 2012-13 seasons. The 2010-11 team set the high mark for highest winning percentage (.611; .941) in a single season, which was then matched by the 2012-13 squad. The team recorded a 15-1 mark at home in 2022-23, which tied for the fewest losses in arena history.

K-State's home court advantage has been even better since 2001-02, as the Wildcats have a compiled a 304-96 (.759) record at Bramlage Coliseum, which includes a 174-19 (.901) mark in non-conference play. Among those 304 victories are 130 in Big 12 play, including 42 against ranked conference foes. In the last 24 seasons, the school has posted double-digit wins 21 times with an average of just over 12 home wins (12.7) per season.

Wins over Top 25 teams have also been a regular occurrence at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening with 54 ranked opponents falling to K-State, including 23 Top 10 opponents. Four No. 1 teams have been defeated during the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016. The Wildcats have beaten at least one Top 25 opponent at Bramlage Coliseum every season since 2009-10.

The three Top 10 wins (No. 9 Baylor, No. 4 Kansas and No. 6 Iowa State) at Bramlage Coliseum in 2024 were a first in the arena's history. It surpassed the mark of two Top 10 wins set four times (1989-90, 2007-08, 2013-14, 2022-23).

In addition to wins, Bramlage Coliseum has also played host to some of the biggest crowds in the history of K-State basketball. The Wildcats have averaged better than 12,000 fans in 10 seasons since the doors to the arena opened in 1988-89, including a program-best 12,978 fans during that inaugural season.

Nine of the school's Top 10 attendance averages have come since 2006-07.

K-State has ranked among the NCAA's Top 40 nationally in attendance 13 times in the last 19 seasons, including a program-best 24th in 2012-13 (12,528) and 25th in both 2007-08 (12,529) and 2011-12 (12,783). In addition, the program has been rated 26th in 2006-07 (12,301), 2010-11 (12,652) and 2014-15 (12,549), 29th in 2013-14 (12,125) and 2016-17, 31st in 2009-10 (11,884), 32nd (11,903) in 2015-16 and 35th in 2018-19 (10,640).

K-State was one of 22 schools nationally and one of four Big 12 schools (Arizona, Iowa State and Texas Tech) to have both its men's and women's programs finish in the Top 40 nationally in average attendance in 2023-24, as the Wildcats finished 19th in women's basketball attendance with an average of 5,531 fans. The Wildcat women hosted NCAA First/Second Round action for the first time since 2017, selling out the arena for their Second Round matchup with Colorado.

Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,010 for the 2025-26 season. The Wildcats sold out eight games and ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57% as well as 39th in average (9,596) and total attendance (163,135) in 2022-23.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is set to start his fourth season as the 25th head men's basketball coach at K-State in 2025-26.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 3 seasons, he has led the Wildcats to a 61-42 (.592) record, including 28 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (**Lon Kruger**, **Frank Martin** and **Bruce Weber**) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 63 wins at K-State are 16 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 7 Top 10 opponents. The 16 career Top 25 wins tie **Tex Winter** (1954-68) for the fourth-most in school history, while the 7 against Top 10 competition are also fourth all-time. Thirteen of the 16 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 41-9 (.820) overall, including 21-7 (.750) in Big 12 play and 13-4 (.765) against ranked foes. The 13 career home Top 25 wins are the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 40-9 record at home with 13 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 Iowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history.

During a roller coaster 2024-25 season that included a 6-game losing streak followed by a 6-game winning streak in Big 12 play, K-State could not overcome a disappointing non-conference season, as the Wildcats finished with a 16-17 overall record, including a tie for ninth place with TCU in the new-look 16-team Big 12 with a 9-11 mark. Among the 16 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (3 NCAA Tournament, 1 NIT and 6 College Basketball Crown), including ranked wins over No. 3/3 Iowa State, No. 3/13 Arizona, No. 16/17 Cincinnati, No. 16/17 Kansas and No. 23/23 West Virginia.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell** as well as a third starter in **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the 2023-24 season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at Iowa. The team posted a 19-15 record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason, including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 Iowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Jayhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference – the Big 12 – with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner **Markquis Nowell** and forward **Keyontae Johnson**, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Tang arrived at K-State on March 21, 2022 after a 19-year stint at Baylor (2003-22), where as an original member of **Scott Drew's** staff played an instrumental role in building the Bears' program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship. He helped Baylor win 397 games, including 168 in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs).

- K-State erupted for 60 points in the second half to shake off a one-point halftime deficit, as the Wildcats opened the 2025-26 season with a 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4 before 7,765 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- Three Wildcats scored in double figures, including a pair of 20-point efforts from junior **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and senior **Nate Johnson**, who narrowly missed the school's first recorded triple-double, with 22 points and game-highs of 9 rebounds and 9 assists. Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** scored all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3.
- It marked the first time in nearly 18 years that a pair of Wildcats each went over 20 points in an opener and the first since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.
- Down 34-33 at the half, the Wildcats (1-0) came out of the locker room a different team, scoring 22 of the first 31 points to take a 12-point lead and force a timeout by UNGC head coach **Mike Jones** at the 13:25 mark. Unfortunately for the Spartans, the timeout only slowed the Wildcats' momentum as they rattled off 15 straight points — all on 3-pointers from Bashir and Johnson — to go ahead 70-45 with under 10 minutes to play. The lead grew to as many 32 points (89-57) after Haggerty's last points of the night with 3:12 left.
- K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. Eleven of the Wildcats' 14 makes from beyond the arc came after halftime. The 14 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game, while the 11 in the second half tie for the second-most in any half.
- The 60-point second half marked just the 11th time that the Wildcats have scored 60 or more points in any half, as it ties for the ninth-most points in any half and are the most since a 63-point second half against UAPB on Dec. 1, 2024.
- K-State is now 95-27 all-time in season openers, including an 83-10 mark at home and a 31-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
- UNGC (0-1) led by as many as 10 points in the first half before K-State closed to within one at the break. The Spartans were led by graduate **Justin Neely**, who had 15 points to go with a team-high 9 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in 32 minutes. Freshman **Lilian Marville** added 14 points in his college debut, while junior **Domas Kauzonas** chipped in 10 points.

- Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including the first career points/assists double-double for junior **P.J. Haggerty**, as K-State moved to 2-0 with a 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8 before 8,040 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- The offense continued its fast pace, as K-State (2-0) posted 90 or more points in the first 2 games for the first time in nearly 34 years while totaling the most points in that span since scoring 193 to open the 1991-92 season.
- The Wildcats posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era at 62.3 percent (33-of-53), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 62.5 percent against Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.
- Haggerty led the way with his third career double-double and first points/assists double-double, as he finished with a game-high 23 points on 5-of-9 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a career-best 11 assists. It marked his first double-double since posting a pair of tradition points/rebounds double-doubles while playing at Tulsa in 2023-24.
- Two Wildcats — senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** — each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals. Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.
- K-State broke open a back-and-forth affair with an 18-4 run near the midway point of the first half en route to taking a 46-30 lead into the halftime break. The lead grew to 19 points in early moments of the second half before a timeout by Bellarmine head coach **Doug Davenport** keyed a surge by the Knights, who closed to within 62-52 with 13:04 to play.
- Bellarmine kept the pressure on K-State over the next 6 minutes, staying within 11 points, including 73-62 on back-to-back layups, before a 10-5 run by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 83-67 at the final media timeout. The squad then ended the game on a 15-4 run to put it away.
- Bellarmine (0-2) saw four players score in double figures, including 19 points from sophomore **Michael Wilson, Jr.**, and 18 from senior **Jack Karasinski**. The Knights shot 45.9 percent (28-of-61) from the field, but just 20 percent (4-of-20) from beyond the arc.
