- Give the Wildcats a 194-62 non-conference mark since 2006.

K-STATE'S PROJECTED ROTATION

OPENING TIP

- ► K-State (5-0) will play in the championship game of the Hall of Fame Classic for third time in its history on Friday night, as the Wildcats will take on former conference rival Nebraska (5-0) in the nightcap of a doubleheader at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. It will air on Peacock, NBC Sports NOW as well as on the NBC Sports Network linear channel on YouTubeTV.
- ▶ K-State will be making its third appearance (2010, 2015, 2025) in the championship game of the Hall of Fame Classic, in this, the fourth overall appearance (2010, 2015, 2021, 2025) in the event. The Wildcats are 0-2 all-time in the title game, having lost to top-ranked Duke in 2010 and No. 9 North Carolina in 2015. Overall, the team is 3-4 all-time in the Hall of Fame Classic.
- ▶ K-State and Nebraska will meet for the 223rd on Friday night with the Wildcats leading 128-94 in a series that dates to 1905. This will be the 24th time the schools have met in Kansas City with K-State holding a 20-3 advantage. The Wildcats defeated the Huskers, 71-56, in the only previous matchup at the T-Mobile Center on Dec. 17, 2022. However, Nebraska enacted a measure of revenge in the last meeting, posting a 62-46 win at Bramlage Coliseum on Dec. 17, 2023.
- ▶ Led by seventh-year head coach **Fred Hoiberg**, Nebraska is also a perfect 5-0 to start the season after home wins over West Georgia (86-53), FIU (96-66) and UMES (69-50) and neutral site wins over Oklahoma (105-99) and New Mexico (84-72). Four players are averaging in double figures in junior Pryce Sandfort (15.6 ppg.) and senior Rienk Mast (15.4 ppg.).

LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored a season-high 37 points to lift K-State to the Hall of Fame Classic Championship game with 98-77 win over Mississippi State on Thursday night. The 37 points were the most scored by a Wildcat in 49 career games at the T-Mobile Center, surpassing the 29 scored by Makol Mawien against Kansas in the Big 12 Championship on March 9, 2018.
- ▶ The 37 points are the most by a Wildcat since Barry Brown Jr. scored 38 against Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018, while he is the first player with back-to-back 30-point games since **Markquis** Nowell in 2023. Haggerty now has six career games of 30 or more points.
- ▶ Haggerty joins **Michael Beasley** as the only players in school history to record 5 consecutive games of 20 or more points to open a season. His 141 points through the first 5 games are only topped by Beasley's 150 points in 2007-08 for the most by a player to open a season.
- ▶ Along with game-high 8 assists and 7 rebounds, Haggerty is the first Wildcat to record a stat line of 30 or more points. 5 or more rebounds and 5 or more assists since Brown tallied 34 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in a win at Baylor on Jan. 22, 2018.
- ► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior Nate Johnson (14 points) and junior Abdi Bashir Jr. (12 points), as K-State's 98 points broke the school record for points scored at the T-Mobile Center, topping the 87 scored in the school's first-ever game in the arena in 2007.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

K-State is averaging 43.2 points in the paint through 5 games, which includes a school record-tying 56 vs. Cal.

K-State is connecting on 53.8 percent (172-of-320) from the field through 5 games, including 58.6 percent from 2.

K-State's 472 points are the most through the first 5 games of a season, eclipsing the 466 scored in 1991-92.

K-State now has 1,761 all-time wins, as the school entered 2025-26 ranking 43rd all-time among Division I schools.

Preseason All-American P.J. Haggerty became the first Division I player since Ja Morant in 2018-19 to average 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals to go with 6.5 free throw per game while at Memphis in 2024-25.



Junior transfer **Abdi Bashir Jr.** led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while at Monmouth in 2024-25 while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332).



K-State's 5 Division I transfers -Abdi Bashir Jr., P.J. Haggerty, Marcus Johnson, Nate Johnson and Khamari McGrifff - have combined to score 5,616 points in 423 career games with 242 starts.

▶ Led by seventh-year head coach **Fred Hoiberg**, Nebraska is off to a 5-0 start to the season with home wins over West Georgia (86-53), FIU (96-66) and UMES (69-50) and neutral site wins over Oklahoma (105-99) in Sioux Falls, S.D., and last night's 84-72 win over New Mexico. The Comhuskers return 5



players, including starters **Berke Buyuktuncel** and **Rienk Mast**, from a squad that won 21 games, including the inaugural College Basketball Crown.

- ▶ Nebraska is averaging 88 points on 49.4 percent shooting, including 38.1 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 68.0 points on 38.3 percent shooting, including 29.3 percent from 3-point range. Four Huskers are averaging in double figures, including a pair of 15.0 points per game scorers in lowa transfer **Pryce Sandfort** (15.6 ppg.) and Mast (15.4 ppg.). Braden Frager (11.8 ppg.) and Jamarques Lawrence (11.2 ppg.) also average double figures. Mast is averaging a team-high 7.0 rebounds. Junior **Sam Hoiberg** has a team-best 20 assists and 10 steals.
- ► Hoiberg is in his 12th season as a head coach, which includes a successful 5-year stint at his alma mater lowa State, where he led the Cyclones to 115 wins and 4 trips to the NCAA Tournament. He has a 204-164 record in his coaching career, including a 89-108 mark at Nebraska with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tournament and the College Basketball Crown championship.

SERIES HISTORY

- ► K-State and Nebraska have one of the longest running rivalries, having played in 222 games since 1905. It is the fourth-most played series in school history. The Wildcats lead the all-time series, 128-94, including 19-3 in games played on neutral sites.
- ► K-State is 185-170 all-time vs. current Big Ten members, including a 31-20 mark at neutral sites.

HISTORY AT T-MOBILE CENTER

- $\blacktriangleright \text{ K-State is familiar with the T-Mobile Center, having played in 49 games since the arena's opening in 2007, posting a 25-24 all-time record.}$
- ▶ Most of these games have come in the annual Big 12 Championship (28; 2008, 2010-current), while the Wildcats have played 13 times in the Wildcat Classic (2007-12, 2014, 2016, 2018-19, 2022-24), along with 6 in the Hall of Fame Classic and once in the NCAA Tournament (2013).
- ► After Thursday's win over Mississippi State, K-State now has 6 wins over SEC teams at T-Mobile, including Alabama in 2011, Florida in 2012, Texas A&M in 2014, Missouri in 2015 and Vanderbilt in 2018. The Wildcats defeated Nebraska in the 2022 Wildcat Classic.

LAST TIME OUT K-STATE 98, MISSISSIPPI STATE 77

- ▶ Junior P.J. Haggerty scored a season-high 37 points to go with a game-high 8 assists and 7 rebounds to lift K-State to the Hall of Fame Classic Championship game with 98-77 win over Mississippi State on Thursday at the T-Mobile Center.
- ▶ Haggerty paced three Wildcats with his season-high 37 points, which came on 13-of-21 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-8 free throws. The 37 points are the most scored by a K-State player in 49 games played at the T-Mobile Center, eclipsing the 29 scored by **Makol Mawien** against Kansas in the Big 12 Championship on March 9, 2018.
- ► The 37 points are the most by a Wildcat since **Barry Brown Jr.** scored 38 against Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018, while he is the first player with back-to-back 30-point games since **Markquis Nowell** posted 36 points vs. Texas and 32 points vs. Baylor on Jan. 3 and 7, 2023.
- ▶ In addition, Haggerty is the first Wildcat to record a stat line of 30 or more points, 5 or more rebounds and 5 or more assists since Brown tallied 34 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in a win at Baylor on Jan. 22, 2018.
- ► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior **Nate Johnson** and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, who posted 14 and 12 points, respectively. The Wildcats also got 9 points from sophomore **David Castillo**, 8 points from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 7 points from freshman **Andrej Kostic**.
- ► K-State connected on 50 percent or better from the field for the fourth time in 5 games, making 50.7 percent (37-of-73) from the field, including 46.7 percent (14-of-30) from 3-point range, and were nearly perfect from the line, making 10 of 11 attempts. The Wildcats dished out 22 assists and had just 8 turnovers.
- ► The 98 points broke the school record for points scored at T-Mobile Center, topping the 87 scored in the school's first-ever game in the building against Florida A&M on Dec. 17, 2007. The 472 points are the most points scored through the first 5 games of a season.
- ► K-State took the lead for good on a rare 4-point play by Kostic with 9:11 left in the first half then slowly pulled away behind the play of Haggerty, who had 15 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in the first half. Haggerty's old-fashioned 3-point play extended the lead to 40-32 with 2:07 remaining before consecutive baskets by Castillo and Johnson made it 44-36 at the break.
- ▶ The lead grew to double digits early in the second half after a 3-pointer by Johnson, but the Bulldogs closed within 69-62 after 4 consecutive free throws with 9:24 to play. However, four more points from Haggerty and a layup by McGriff extended it back to double figures at the third media timeout. From there, the advantage grew to more than 20 points, including its largest at 91-68 after a 3-pointer by Bashir with 3:13 to play.
- ► Mississippi State (2-2) was led by **Josh Hubbard's** 23 points, who went 7-of-15 from the field and 8-of-9 from the line. Senior **Jayden Epps** had 18 points off the bench on 6-of-11 shooting, including 4-of-7 from beyond the arc, while former Wichita State player **Quincy Ballad** had 10 points.

■ OFFENSE OFF TO FAST START

MOST POINTS THROUGH 5 GAMES

- ► After posting their fourth 90-point performance through the first 5 games, the Wildcats continued their fast offensive start. The squad is averaging 94.4 points on 53.8 percent (172-of-320) shooting, including 45.9 percent (25-of-122) from 3-point range, while hitting on 75 percent (72-of-96) from the free throw line.
- ► The 472 points are the most points through the first 5 games of a season, surpassing the 466 scored by the 1991-92 squad. The 99 points vs. Cal marked the third consecutive 90-point performance to open the season, which was a first since that Dana Altman-led squad 34 years ago.

HAGGERTY JOINS ELITE COMPANY

▶ After his season-high 37-point performance vs. Mississippi State, junior PJ. Haggerty became just the second Wildcat to open a season with five consecutive games of 20 or more points, joining Michael Beasley in 2007-08. His 141 points are only topped by Beasley's 150 points for the most points by a player to open a season.

HAGGERTY HAS RARE 30-10 GAME

▶ Junior **P.J. Haggerty** had 31 points and a career-tying 10 rebounds vs. Tulsa to become the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 to post a rare 30-point, 10-rebound double-double. He scored 27 of his 31 points in the second half, which are the fifth-most in any half.

MOST POINTS AT BRAMLAGE

- ► K-State's 99-96 win over Cal on Nov. 13 made history, as the 195 combined points were the most-ever in Bramlage Coliseum, surpassing the 194 scored between K-State (106) and Marshall (88) on Dec. 2, 1995.
- ► K-State posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era for the second straight game, as the Wildcats hit on 64.4 percent (38-of-59) from the field. It was the highest field goal percentage since shooting 66.0 percent vs. Wake Forest on March 14, 2017.

TRIO OF 'CATS POST 20-POINT GAMES

- ► K-State had three players record 20-point games in the win over Cal, as junior PJ. Haggerty led the way with 23 points to go with 21 from senior Khamari McGriff and 20 from senior Nate Johnson.
- ► The trio is the first to each have 20-point games since **Dean Wade** (34 points), **Kamau Stokes** (23 points) and **Barry Brown Jr.** (21 points) did it against lowa State on Dec. 29, 2017.

MCGRIFF, CASTILLO GO PERFECT

- ► Two Wildcats senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals in the 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8. They are the first set of teammates to accomplish the feat in the same game.
- ► Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals. Castillo is just the eighth Wildcat to go 5-of-5 from beyond the arc, joining his high school coach **Clent Stewart** who was in attendance.

■ HOW THE 'CATS WERE BUILT

'CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, INCLUDING 5 DIVISION I TRANSFERS

- ► K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 5 Division I transfers, 4 players from the international ranks and 1 true freshman. The class has been rated nationally as high as No. 4 by 2475ports and No. 20 by 0n3.
- ▶ Among the 10 newcomers are 5 Division I transfers, including Abdi Bashir Jr. (Monmouth), P.J. Haggerty (Memphis), Marcus Johnson (Bowling Green), Nate Johnson (Akron) and Khamari McGriff (UNC Wilmington). Haggerty, N. Johnson and McGriff were on teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.
- ► The 4 international additions include the school's first-ever players from Italy (**Dorin Buca**), Serbia (**Andrej Kostic**) and Germany (**Elias Rapieque**). The fourth international player **Stephen Osei** from Toronto played at the junior college level at Casper College in Wyoming.
- ► Haggerty is coming off a career year at Memphis, in which, he became the first Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while earning consensus Second Team All-American honors. The AAC Player of the Year ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759).
- ▶ Johnson became the first Akron player to be named both the MAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year in the same season and the first since Ball State's Bonzi Wells in 1998.
- ▶ Bashir was one of the top scorers in the NCAA in 2024-25, leading the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game while leading the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.85) and second in total 3-pointers (127).
- ► McGriff was one of the top sixth men in the CAA at UNC Wilmington, where he was part of 99 wins and 3 conference championships.
- ► A member of the German U18 and U20 National Teams, Rapieque played in 53 games with ALBA Berlin in 2024-25 between the EuroLeague (27 games) and the German Basketball Bundesliga (26 games).
- ► Kostic was a member of the Serbia U18 and U19 National Teams, winning the gold medal at the 2023 European U18 Championship and the silver medal at the 2024 European U18 Championship.
- ► The lone freshman **Exavier Wilson** was a 3-time all-state selection and scored more than 1,700 career points in his prep career.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- ► K-State has posted a 192-62 (.752) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 150-18 (.890) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 134-14 (.903) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. Last season, the team went 7-6 in nonconference play, including 4-1 in Bramlage Coliseum.

1750 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State is one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,761-1,255 (.583) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,761 wins are the 43rd-most in Division I history (one shy of Virginia in 42nd), including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

TANG ADJUSTS COACHING STAFF

- ► Head coach Jerome Tang adjusted his coaching staff during the offseason, adding veteran head coach Matthew Driscoll as associate head coach as well as acclaimed player development coach Bill Peterson as an assistant coach and Chase Driscoll as director of video and analytics.
- ► The winningest coach in both North Florida and Atlantic Sun Conference history during a 16-year stint (2009-25) with the Ospreys, Driscoll Joined the staff on May 23. He won 248 games at North Florida, including 144 in ASUN play, while guiding the school to 3 regular-season championships and the league's tournament that the high pand a NCAA Tournament bid in 2015.
- ▶ Driscoll's relationship with Tang dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for 6 seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff.
- ▶ Peterson has served in various capacities in the NBA, including the Golden Warriors, Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks. He has mentored over 20 NBA players, including Hall of Famers Dirk Nowitzki, Steve Nash and Karl Malone. He also has a combined 10 years of head coaching experience at the NAIA, Division II and G-League levels in his 47-year coaching career.
- ▶ Peterson coached alongside Tang while at Baylor from 2017-22, where they helped guide the Bears to the 2021 NCAA Championship.
- ▶ Chase Driscoll joined the staff on May 13 after serving as an assistant coach and director of operations for his father. Matthew. at North Florida.

BAYLOR NORTH

- ▶ With the additions of associate head coach **Matthew Driscoll** and assistant coach **Bill Peterson**, **Jerome Tang** tapped into his coaching history, as all three were on staff at Baylor. Tang and Driscoll were part of **Scott Drew's** first staff from 2003-09, while Tang and Peterson helped the Bears to the 2021 NCAA title while together on staff from 2017-22.
- ▶ Driscoll and Peterson aren't the only K-State staffers with Baylor ties, as director of player development **Austin Carpenter** was a graduate assistant for Tang with the Bears from 2020-22, while current graduate assistants **Henry Dugat** and **Mark Vital Jr.** are among the best players in Baylor history.
- ▶ Dugat is one of five players known as "The Foundation" that was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021. He was part of Drew's first two recruiting classes that led to Bears' historic turnaround. He still ranks in the top 20 all-time in program history with 1,229 career points.
- ▶ Vital was a 3-time All-Big 12 selection and a member of Baylor's 2021 National Championship team, playing in 126 games with 105 starts.

WILDCATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 138-299 (.316) record, including 28-85 (.248) vs. the top-5, 56-150 (.272) vs. the top-10 and 80-211 (.275) vs. top-15.

K-State has 45 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 13 seasons, including 17 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 34 Top 25 wins at home.

PLAYER NOTES

HAGGERTY AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ Junior P.J. Haggerty is the among the best players to transfer to K-State, as he is coming off a career-best year in 2024-25, in which, he became the first Memphis Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while becoming first Division I player to average at least 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game to go with 6.5 free throws per game since Ja Morant in 2018-19. He is the only Division I player to average at 21 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in each of the last 2 seasons.
- ▶ Haggerty ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759) in 2024-25, while his 759 points were an AAC single-season record and the most since **Dajuan Wagner** (762) set the school season record in 2001-02.
- ▶ Haggerty was a consensus Second Team All-American in his lone season at Memphis, while was just the second Tiger to be named the AAC Player of the Year as well as Most Outstanding Player at the AAC Tournament. He was also a finalist for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year award, the Wooden Award and the Riley Wallace Award as the most impactful transfer.
- ▶ Haggerty, who has also made stops at TCU (2022-23) and Tulsa (2023-24), has scored more than 1,500 points (1,574) in his college career, connecting on 49.1 percent from the field and 79.5 percent from the free throw line. He has scored in double figures in 69 of 77 career games with 28 games of 25 or more points, including five 30-point games and one 40-point game. He scored a career-high 42 points vs. Wichita State on March 14.

HAGGERTY ALSO GREAT AT LINE

- ▶ In addition to his scoring prowess, **P.J. Haggerty** is also great at getting to the free throw line, as he ranked in the top-3 nationally in both free throws made and attempted in the past 2 seasons, including second in attempts (309) and third in makes (237) in 2023-24 while playing at TuIsa and second in both makes (224) and attempts (274) in 2024-25 while at Memphis.
- ► Haggerty has made 511 free throws on 643 attempts in the past 4 seasons, averaging nearly 7 makes on nearly 9 attempts in his last 77 games played.
- ▶ Last season, Haggerty connected on 81.8 percent from the free throw line with an AAC-best 224 makes on 274 attempts. He went perfect from the line in 6 games, including 14-of-14 vs. Tulane on March 15 in the AAC Tournament. He made 27 straight free throws at one point during the season.
- ► Haggerty drew 7.9 fouls per 40 minutes as a sophomore at Tulsa in 2023-24, finishing behind only National Player of the Year **Zach Edey** with 309 free throw attempts, while his 237 free throws were the third-most in the country.

BASHIR GOOD FROM 3

- ▶ Junior guard **Abdi Bashir Jr.** is among the best returning 3-point shooting in the country, as he led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332) in 2024-25). He broke both the Monmouth and CAA (Coastal Athletic Association) single-season record for 3-pointers (327).
- ▶ Bashir connected on a career-high 10 3-pointers in his 38-point performance against Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2024. The 10 treys tied for the second-most in Monmouth history. He made at least 5 3-pointers in 12 games, while he had 8 triples in back-to-back games vs. Northeastern (2/24/25) and Elon (2/27/25).
- ▶ Bashir has made 1953-point field goals in his 71-game college career on 39.3 percent shooting, which is nearly 3 made 3-pointers per game. He leads the team with 17 makes so far this season on 51.5 percent shooting.
- ▶ As a sophomore, Bashir led Monmouth and the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game, while he was 16th in scoring and 25th in total points (663) in the NCAA. He posted five 30-point games, which tied for the most in program history, while he scored 20 or more points in 13 other contests. His 38 points at Rutgers were the most points scored against the Scarlet Knight since 1977.
- ▶ Bashir also had notable performances against Michigan State (20 points), Wichita State (15 points), Stephen F. Austin (30 points), Seton Hall (28 points), Lehigh (22 points), Princeton (26 points) and Auburn (15 points) in 2024-25.

BASHIR ALSO A TWIN

▶ Junior Abdi Bashir Jr. and his brother Abdul are among 9 sets of twins playing Division I basketball in 2025-26, including one of 3 sets of identical twins (Illinois' Tomislav and Zvonimir Ivisic and Texas State's Dimp and Ky Pernell). They also one of 3 sets playing at different schools, joining Ethan (Air Force) and Eli (Le Moyne) Greenberg and Tajuan (Seton Hall) and Takai (Oregon) Simpkins.


INTERNATIONAL FLAIR

- ▶ Junior **Nate Johnson** nearly made history in his first game in a Wildcat uniform, as he narrowly missed the school's first triple-double in the 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4, as he finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists.
- ▶ Johnson's 6 made 3-pointers are the most by a Wildcat in a season opener, while his 9 assists tie **Aaron Swartzendruber** vs. Kansas City in 1996 and **Larry Reid** vs. UTSA in 2000 for the most in an opener.
- ▶ Junior All-American candidate **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and Johnson (22 points) became the first duo to go over 20 points in a season opener in nearly 18 years since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points, respectively, against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

- ► Haggerty's 27 points, which came on 10-of-20 field goals and 6-of-7 free throws, are ninth-most by a Wildcat in an opener and the most since the aforementioned Beasley, who had 32 points in his first career game.
- ► Haggerty and Johnson became the first Wildcat duo to post 20-point games in any game since **Arthur Kaluma** (23) and **Cam Carter** (21) did it against No. 6/6 lowa State on March 9, 2024.
- ▶ Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was the other Wildcat to score in double figure, scoring all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.
- ► The 93 points equaled the most by a **Jerome Tang**-team in a season opener (93 vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) and were the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14. 2014.
- ► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. The 14 made 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game and are the most-ever in a season opener.
- ► The Wildcats scored 60 of their 93 points in the second half, connecting on 59.5 percent from the field and 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range. The 60-point second-half marked the 11th time that a Wildcat team has 60 or more points in a half and tied for the ninth-most points in any half.

BRAMLAGE COLISEUM

38th season [1988-present]

Now in its 38th season of hosting Wildcat men's basketball, the **Fred Bramlage Coliseum** has carved its own niche in K-State's colorful history of basketball homes. In keeping with the tradition established by Nichols Gymnasium (1910-50) and Ahearn Field House (1950-88), the arena has given the team a deafening, winning environment since its opening in 1988.

Dubbed the "Octogon of Doom," K-State has posted a 445-153 (.743) all-time mark in its current home, including an emotional 81-77 win over Purdue (led by alumnus Gene Keady) in the facility's debut on Nov. 26, 1988. The 445 victories are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the previous mark of 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88).

K-State has earned double-digit victories in 29 of its 37 seasons at Bramlage Coliseum, including a streak of 18 consecutive seasons from 2001-19. Three times Wildcat teams have set the singleseason mark with 16 wins in the arena, which came in the 2008-09, 2010-11 and 2012-13 seasons The 2010-11 team set the high mark for highest winning percentage (16-1; .941) in a single season, which was then matched by the 2012-13 squad. The team recorded a 15-1 mark at home in 2022-23, which tied for the fewest losses in arena history.

K-State's home court advantage has been even better since the 2001-02 season, as the Wildcats have compiled a 306-96 (.759) record at Bramlage Coliseum, which includes a 176-19 (.901) mark in non-conference play. Among those 306 victories are 130 in Big 12 play, including 42 against ranked conference foes. In the last 24 seasons, the school has posted double-digit wins 21 times with an average of just over 12 home wins (12.7) per season.

Wins over Top 25 teams have also been a regular occurrence at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening with 54 ranked opponents falling to K-State, including 23 Top 10 opponents. Four No. 1 teams have been defeated during the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016. The Wildcats have beaten at least one Top 25 opponent at Bramlage Coliseum every season since 2009-10.

The three Top 10 wins (No. 9 Baylor, No. 4 Kansas and No. 6 Iowa State) at Bramlage Coliseum in 2024 were a first in the arena's history. It surpassed the mark of two Top 10 wins set four times (1989-90, 2007-08, 2013-14, 2022-23).

In addition to wins, Bramlage Coliseum has also played host to some of the biggest crowds in the history of K-State basketball. The Wildcats have averaged better than 12,000 fans in 10 seasons since the doors to the arena opened in 1988-89, including a program-best 12,978 fans during that

Nine of the school's Top 10 attendance averages have come since 2006-07.

K-State has ranked among the NCAA's Top 40 nationally in attendance 13 times in the last 19 seasons, including a program-best 24th in 2012-13 (12,528) and 25th in both 2007-08 (12,529) and 2011-12 (12,783). In addition, the program has been rated 26th in 2006-07 (12,301), 2010-11 (12,652) and 2014-15 (12,549), 29th in 2013-14 (12,125) and 2016-17, 31st in 2009-10 (11,884), 32nd (11,903) in 2015-16 and 35th in 2018-19 (10,640).

K-State was one of 22 schools nationally and one of four Big 12 schools (Arizona, Iowa State and Texas Tech) to have both its men's and women's programs finish in the Top 40 nationally in average attendance in 2023-24, as the Wildcats finished 19th in women's basketball attendance with an average of 5,531 fans. The Wildcat women hosted NCAA First/Second Round action for the first time since 2017, selling out the arena for their Second Round matchup with Colorado.

Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,010 for the 2025-26 season. The Wildcats sold out eight games and ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57% as well as 39th in average (9,596) and total attendance (163,135) in 2022-23.

K-State is 43-9 at Bramlage Coliseum under Jerome Tang, including 21-7 in Big 12 play. Tang is 13-4 at home vs. AP Top 25 opponents, including 4-2 in 2024-25.

K-State has defeated 54 ranked teams in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 51 ranked Big 12 foes.

K-State has tallied a 306-96 record at home since 2001-02, including 130 wins in Big 12 play. The 306 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools.

K-State has posted a 445-153 all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening in 1988-89. The 445 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats.

Charter Oak State '07 Fourth Season at K-State [66-42]



33rd Season Overall | 23rd Season in College

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is set to start his fourth season as the 25th head men's basketball coach at K-State in 2025-26.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 3 seasons, he has led the Wildcats to a 61-42 (.592) record, including 28 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (Lon Kruger, Frank Martin and **Bruce Weber**) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 66 wins at K-State are 16 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 7 Top 10 opponents. The 16 career Top 25 wins tie Tex Winter (1954-68) for the fourth-most in school history, while the 7 against Top 10 competition are also fourth all-time. Thirteen of the 16 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 43-9 (.820) overall, including 21-7 (.750) in Big 12 play and 13-4 (.765) against ranked foes. The 13 career home Top 25 wins are the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14: 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10: 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 40-9 record at home with 13 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archrival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 lowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history.

During a roller coaster 2024-25 season that included a 6-game losing streak followed by a 6-game winning streak in Big 12 play, K-State could not overcome a disappointing non-conference season, as the Wildcats finished with a 16-17 overall record, including a tie for ninth place with TCU in the new-look 16-team Big 12 with a 9-11 mark. Among the 16 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (3 NCAA Tournament, 1 NIT and 6 College Basketball Crown), including ranked wins over No. 3/3 lowa State, No. 13/13 Arizona, No. 16/17 Cincinnati, No. 16/17 Kansas and No. 23/23 West Virginia.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in Keyontae Johnson and Markquis Nowell as well as a third starter in Nae'Qwan Tomlin right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the 2023-24 season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at lowa. The team posted a 19-15 record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason, including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 lowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Jayhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference — the Big 12 — with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 $\,$ Bob Cousy Award winner Markquis Nowell and forward Kevontae Johnson. who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by The Sporting News, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Tang arrived at K-State on March 21, 2022 after a 19-year stint at Baylor (2003-22), where as an original member of Scott Drew's staff played an instrumental role in building the Bears' program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship. He helped Baylor win 397 games, including 168 in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs).
