Preseason All-American **P.J. Haggerty** currently ranks 7th among active Division I in total points with 1,774 points in just 87 games. He leads all of Division I in career scoring average at 20.4 points per game.

K-State's 5 Division I transfers - **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, **P.J. Haggerty**, **Marcus Johnson**, **Nate Johnson** and **Khamari McGriff** - have combined to score 6,141 points in 468 career games with 253 starts.

TEAM NOTES

■ OPPONENT SPOTLIGHT: ARIZONA STATE

► Led by 11-year head coach **Bobby Hurley**, Arizona State (9-6, 0-2 Big 12) enters Saturday's game on a 4-game losing streak after dropping a 104-76 decision at No. 9/9 BYU on Wednesday night. The Sun Devils opened Big 12 play with a 95-89 loss to Colorado. Before their recent slump, the squad had opened the year with 9 wins in 11 games, including a runner-up finish at the Maui Invitational.

► Arizona State is averaging 80.3 points on 45.6 percent shooting, including 34.1 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 78.5 points on 45.1 percent shooting, including 34.1 percent from 3-point range. The Sun Devils are being out-rebounded, 35.3 to 33.3, and turn the ball over just 11.5 times per game. They are shooting 75 percent from the free throw line.



► ASU ranks 34th nationally in fastbreak points at 16.3 points per game, while the Sun Devils rank in the top-40 in both free throws made (18.8) and attempted (25.1).

► The Sun Devils have 7 players averaging at least 6 or more points per game, including 3 double-digit scorers (senior **Maurice Odum**, senior **Anthony Johnson** and freshman **Massamba Diop**). Odum is averaging 16.1 points on 38 percent shooting with a team-best 37 made 3-pointers, 99 assists and 22 steals. Johnson is averaging 14.7 points on 47.7 percent shooting, while Diop is averaging 14.2 points on a team-best 64.5 percent shooting to go with 5.3 rebounds and a team-best 26 blocks.

► The Duke legend is in his 13th season as a head coach, which includes a 2-year stop at Buffalo (2013-15) before moving to ASU in 2015. He has a 177-157 record in his time in Tempe, including 3 NCAA Tournament appearances.

SERIES HISTORY

► This will be 13th meeting between K-State and Arizona State with the series tied at 6 wins each. This will be the fourth meeting since the start of Big 12 play with the Wildcats winning 2 of those 3 matchups, including a 71-70 come-from-behind win in Tempe on Feb. 4, 2025.

LAST MEETING IN TEMPE

K-STATE 71, ARIZONA STATE 70 (Feb. 4, 2025)

► Senior **David N'Guessan** paced four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 22 points, as K-State overcame a 16-point first-half deficit to run its winning streak to 4 games with a 71-70 win over Arizona State in the last meeting at Desert Financial Arena on Feb. 4, 2025.

► N'Guessan made perhaps his best play with K-State clinging to a 71-70 lead late in the game, as he fouled Sun Devil freshman **Jayden Quaintance** as he was attempting to dunk the game-winning basket with 4.1 seconds left, forcing him to connect on 2 free throws to win the game. However, he missed on both attempts and junior **Dug McDaniel** corralled the rebound and threw it down the court to senior **Max Jones** to run out the clock.

■ UP NEXT: UCF

► K-State returns home on Wednesday night, as the Wildcats welcome No. 25 UCF (12-2, 1-1 Big 12) to Bramlage Coliseum at 7 p.m., CT on Peacock. The Knights won the lone matchup in 2025 by a score of 80-76 at home. However, the Wildcats are 2-0 all-time in the series at home, including a 77-52 victory on Jan. 6, 2024.

OFFENSE OFF TO FAST START
MOST POINTS THROUGH 15 GAMES

- After scoring 80 or more points in 9 of the first 15 games, including 7 games of 90 or more points and 2 games of 100 or more points, the Wildcats have continued their fast offensive start.
- The 1299 points are the most points through the first 15 games, surpassing the 1238 scored in 2009-10. The 106 points vs. South Dakota (12/20/25) marked the 43rd 100-point game, including the fifth under head coach **Jerome Tang**.

'CATS SCORE 100+ POINTS TWICE

- K-State has twice scored 100 or more points, including a season-high 108 vs. Mississippi Valley State (12/8/25) and 106 vs. South Dakota (12/20/25). The 2 100-point outings tie 4 other teams (1966-67, 1979-80, 1993-94 and 1997-98) for the most in a single season, while also matching the most at home.

MOST POINTS AT BRAMLAGE COLISEUM

- K-State's 99-96 win over Cal (11/13/25) made history, as the 195 combined points were the most-ever in Bramlage Coliseum, surpassing the 194 scored between K-State (106) and Marshall (88) on Dec. 2, 1995. It was the highest field goal percentage (64.4) of the **Jerome Tang** era, while it was the highest field goal percentage since 66.0 percent vs. Wake Forest on March 14, 2017.

MOST POINTS AT T-MOBILE CENTER

- The 98 points scored against Mississippi State (11/20/25) are the most by the Wildcats in 50 games at the T-Mobile Center topping the 87 scored in the first-ever game in the building against Florida A&M on Dec. 17, 2007.

HAGGERTY IN ELITE COMPANY

- After his 27-point effort vs. Nebraska (11/21/25), junior **P.J. Haggerty** became the first Wildcat to open a season with 6 straight games of 20 or more points, eclipsing a record shared with **Michael Beasley** in 2007-08. He is the first Wildcat to score in double figures in the first 15 games since **Jacob Pullen** in 2009-10, while his 341 points are the second-most by a player through the first 15 games and the most since Beasley's 372 points.

HAGGERTY SCORES 37 VS. MSU

- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** had back-to-back 30-point games against Tulsa (11/17/25) and Mississippi State (11/20/25), including a season-high 37 points vs. the Bulldogs. The 37 points are the most scored under **Jerome Tang** and the most since **Barry Brown Jr.** had 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

HAGGERTY HAS RARE 30-10 GAME

- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** had 31 points and a career-tying 10 rebounds vs. Tulsa (11/17/25) to become the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 to post a rare 30-point, 10-rebound double-double. He scored 27 of his 31 points in the second half, which are the fifth-most in any half.

TRIO OF 'CATS POST 20-POINT GAMES

- K-State had 3 players record 20-point games in the win over Cal (11/13/25), as junior **P.J. Haggerty** led the way with 23 points to go with 21 from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 20 from senior **Nate Johnson**. The trio is the first to each have 20-point games since **Dean Wade** (34 points), **Kamau Stokes** (23 points) and **Barry Brown Jr.** (21 points) did it against Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017.

MCGRIFF, CASTILLO GO PERFECT

- Senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to make all attempts from the field (minimum of 5 attempts) vs. Bellarmine (11/8/25). Castillo scored 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

LAST TIME OUT
1/2 ARIZONA 101, K-STATE 76

- Arizona looked every bit the nation's top-ranked team on Wednesday night, as the Wildcats shot nearly 50 percent from the field while posting a 55-32 advantage on the glass en route to a 101-76 win over Kansas State before 14,357 fans at the McKale Center.
- One of six remaining unbeaten teams, Arizona hit on 49.3 percent (34-of-69) of its field goals, including 58.5 percent (31-of-53) from inside the arc with 56 points in the paint, while knocking down 30 of 39 free throw attempts (78.9 percent). In addition to a 56-36 advantage in the paint, Arizona had 26 fast-break points (compared to 13 for K-State) while turning 15 offensive rebounds into 19 second-chance points.
- It marked just the 18th time that K-State has surrendered 100 or more points in school history, including just the second time under head coach **Jerome Tang** in 118 games in his tenure.
- Equally impressive was Arizona's defensive play, holding K-State to a season-low 33.8 percent (26-of-77) from the field, including 22.2 percent (8-of-36) from 3-point range. Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was held without a 3-point make (0-of-5) for the first time after entering the day ranking in the top-10 in 3-pointers/game (3.71) and 3-pointers (52).
- Arizona has won its 15 games by an average of more than 23 points.
- Freshman **Brayden Burries** (28 points) and junior **Motiejus Krivas** (25 points) paced the home team Wildcats with a combined 53 points on 19-of-26 shooting. Krivas had a double-double with a game-high 12 rebounds, while Burries narrowly missed a double-double with 9 rebounds to go with 4 assists and 4 steals. Freshman **Koa Peat** also had a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while senior **Tobe Awaka** added 8 points and 11 rebounds off the bench.
- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** led K-State with 19 points and 7 assists in 32 minutes, while senior **Nate Johnson** and junior **Dorin Buca** chipped in 15 and 12 points, respectively. Haggerty now has double figures in all 15 games this season while the leading the team in scoring 12 times.

■ HOW THE 'CATS WERE BUILT

'CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, INCLUDING 5 DIVISION I TRANSFERS

► K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 5 Division I transfers, 4 players from the international ranks and 1 true freshman. The class has been rated nationally as high as No. 4 by 247Sports and No. 20 by On3.

► Among the 10 newcomers are 5 Division I transfers, including **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (Monmouth), **P.J. Haggerty** (Memphis), **Marcus Johnson** (Bowling Green), **Nate Johnson** (Akron) and **Khamari McGriff** (UNC Wilmington). Haggerty, N. Johnson and McGriff were on teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.

► The 4 international additions include the school's first-ever players from Italy (**Dorin Buca**), Serbia (**Andrej Kostic**) and Germany (**Elias Rapieque**). The fourth international player - **Stephen Osei** - from Toronto played at the junior college level at Casper College in Wyoming.

► Haggerty is coming off a career year at Memphis, in which, he became the first Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while earning consensus Second Team All-American honors. The AAC Player of the Year ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759).

► Johnson became the first Akron player to be named both the MAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year in the same season and the first since Ball State's **Bonzi Wells** in 1998.

► Bashir was one of the top scorers in the NCAA in 2024-25, leading the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game while leading the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.85) and second in total 3-pointers (127).

► McGriff was one of the top sixth men in the CAA at UNC Wilmington, where he was part of 99 wins and 3 conference championships.

► A member of the German U18 and U20 National Teams, Rapieque played in 53 games with ALBA Berlin in 2024-25 between the EuroLeague (27 games) and the German Basketball Bundesliga (26 games).

► Kostic was a member of the Serbia U18 and U19 National Teams, winning the gold medal at the 2023 European U18 Championship and the silver medal at the 2024 European U18 Championship.

► The lone freshman - **Exavier Wilson** - was a 3-time all-state selection and scored more than 1,700 career points in his prep career.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

► K-State has posted a 197-66 (.748) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 153-20 (.884) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 137-16 (.895) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. The 94-85 win over ULM on Dec. 28 gave the Wildcats their third-best non-conference record (9-4) in the past 7 seasons.

1750 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State is one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,765-1,261 (.581) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,765 wins are the 43rd-most in Division I history (one shy of Virginia in 42nd), including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

TANG ADJUSTS COACHING STAFF

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** adjusted his coaching staff during the offseason, adding veteran head coach **Matthew Driscoll** as associate head coach as well as acclaimed player development coach **Bill Peterson** as an assistant coach and **Chase Driscoll** as director of video and analytics.

► The winningest coach in both North Florida and Atlantic Sun Conference history during a 16-year stint (2009-25) with the Ospreys, Driscoll joined the staff on May 23. He won 248 games at North Florida, including 144 in ASUN play, while guiding the school to 3 regular-season championships and the league's tournament championship and a NCAA Tournament bid in 2015.

► Driscoll's relationship with Tang dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for 6 seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach **Scott Drew**'s staff.

► Peterson has served in various capacities in the NBA, including the Golden Warriors, Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks. He has mentored over 20 NBA players, including Hall of Famers **Dirk Nowitzki**, **Steve Nash** and **Karl Malone**. He also has a combined 10 years of head coaching experience at the NAIA, Division II and G-League levels in his 47-year coaching career.

► Peterson coached alongside Tang while at Baylor from 2017-22, where they helped guide the Bears to the 2021 NCAA Championship.

► **Chase Driscoll** joined the staff on May 13 after serving as an assistant coach and director of operations for his father, Matthew, at North Florida.

Baylor North

► With the additions of associate head coach **Matthew Driscoll** and assistant coach **Bill Peterson**, **Jerome Tang** tapped into his coaching history, as all three were on staff at Baylor. Tang and Driscoll were part of **Scott Drew**'s first staff from 2003-09, while Tang and Peterson helped the Bears to the 2021 NCAA title while together on staff from 2017-22.

► Driscoll and Peterson aren't the only K-State staffers with Baylor ties, as director of player development **Austin Carpenter** was a graduate assistant for Tang with the Bears from 2020-22, while current graduate assistants **Henry Dugat** and **Mark Vital Jr.** are among the best players in Baylor history.

► Dugat is one of five players known as "The Foundation" that was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021. He was part of Drew's first two recruiting classes that led to Bears' historic turnaround. He still ranks in the top 20 all-time in program history with 1,229 career points.

► Vital was a 3-time All-Big 12 selection and a member of Baylor's 2021 National Championship team, playing in 126 games with 105 starts.

WILDCATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 138-300 (.316) record, including 28-85 (.248) vs. the top-5, 56-151 (.272) vs. the top-10 and 80-212 (.275) vs. top-15.

K-State has 45 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 13 seasons, including 17 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 34 Top 25 wins at home.

PLAYER NOTES

HAGGERTY AMONG THE BEST

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** is among the best players to transfer to K-State, as he is coming off a career-best year in 2024-25, in which, he became the first Memphis Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while becoming the first Division I player to average at least 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game to go with 6.5 free throws per game since **Ja Morant** in 2018-19. He is the only Division I player to average at 21 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in each of the last 2 seasons.

► Haggerty ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759) in 2024-25, while his 759 points were an AAC single-season record and the most since **Dajuan Wagner** (762) set the school season record in 2001-02.

► Haggerty was a consensus Second Team All-American in his lone season at Memphis, while was just the second Tiger to be named the AAC Player of the Year as well as Most Outstanding Player at the AAC Tournament. He was also a finalist for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the Wooden Award and the Riley Wallace Award as the most impactful transfer.

► Haggerty, who has also made stops at TCU (2022-23) and Tulsa (2023-24), has scored more than 1,700 points (1,774) in his college career, connecting on 48.8 percent from the field and 78.5 percent from the free throw line. He has scored in double figures in 79 of 87 career games with 30 games of 25 or more points, including five 30-point games and one 40-point game. He scored a career-high 42 points vs. Wichita State on March 14 while at Memphis.

► Haggerty is the first Wildcat to score in double figures in the first 15 games of the season since **Jacob Pullen** in 2009-10, while his 341 points are second only to **Michael Beasley**'s 372 in 2007-08. Of his 15 double-digit scoring games, he has 10 games of 20 or more points, including back-to-back 30-point efforts. He is ranks seventh nationally in scoring (22.7 ppg.) and eighth in total points.

CASTILLO'S IMPROVEMENT

► Junior **David Castillo** has scored in double figures in 9 of the first 15 games, including 6 of the last 8, as he continues to display the improvement that he has made in his second season. He ranks second on the team in scoring (12.9 ppg.) while connecting on 46.3 percent (69-of-149) from the field, including 35.4 percent (29-of-82) from 3-point range, and 81.3 percent (26-of-32) from the free throw line. He is second in 3-pointers (29) and fourth in assists (33).

► Castillo has more than doubled his point total (77 to 193) from his freshman year, while also posting 9 double-digit scoring games, including 5 in a row from Dec. 1-20. He scored a career-high 22 points vs. Bowling Green (12/1/25).

BASHIR GOOD FROM 3

► Junior guard **Abdi Bashir Jr.** is among the best returning 3-point shooting in the country, as he led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while he was second in total 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332) in 2024-25. He currently ranks 13th in 3-point field goals/game (3.47), 14th in total (52) and 18th in 3-point percentage (45.2).

► Bashir connected on a career-high 10 3-pointers in his 38-point performance against Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2024. The 10 treys tied for the second-most in Monmouth history. He made at least 5 3-pointers in 13 games, while he had 8 triples in back-to-back games vs. Northeastern (2/24/25) and Elon (2/27/25).

► Bashir has made 230 3-point field goals in his 81-game college career on 39.8 percent shooting, which is nearly 4 made 3-pointers per game. He leads the team with 52 makes so far this season on 45.2 percent shooting. His 7 made 3-pointers vs. Nebraska (11/21/25) tied for the sixth-most ever in a game while he has at least 2 3-pointers in 13 of 15 games with 4 or more in 7 games.

► Bashir eclipsed 1,000 career points with his second of 6 made 3-pointers in his hometown of Omaha in the win at Creighton (12/13/25). He has scored in double figures in 11 of 15 games, including a high 26 points vs. Nebraska.

BASHIR ALSO A TWIN

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and his brother **Abdul** are among 11 sets of twins playing at Division I in 2025-26, including one of 5 sets of identical twins (Milos (Cal) and **Veljko Ilic** (Sam Houston), Illinois' **Tomislav** and **Zvonimir Ivicic** and Texas State's **Dimp** and **Ky Pernell** and **Cooper** (Wake Forest) and **Carson** (Queens) **Schwieger**. They also one of 5 sets playing at separate schools, joining **Ethan** (Air Force) and **Eli** (Le Moyne) **Greenberg**, **Ilics**, **Tajuan** (Seton Hall) and **Takai** (Oregon) **Simpkins** and **Schwiegers**.

► Junior **Nate Johnson** nearly made history in his first game in a Wildcat uniform, as he narrowly missed the school's first triple-double in the 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4, as he finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists.

► Johnson's 6 made 3-pointers are the most by a Wildcat in a season opener, while his 9 assists tie **Aaron Swartzendruber** vs. Kansas City in 1996 and **Larry Reid** vs. UTSA in 2000 for the most in an opener.

► Junior All-American candidate **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and Johnson (22 points) became the first duo to go over 20 points in a season opener in nearly 18 years since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points, respectively, against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

► Haggerty's 27 points, which came on 10-of-20 field goals and 6-of-7 free throws, are ninth-most by a Wildcat in an opener and the most since the aforementioned Beasley, who had 32 points in his first career game.

► Haggerty and Johnson became the first Wildcat duo to post 20-point games in any game since **Arthur Kaluma** (23) and **Cam Carter** (21) did it against No. 6/6 Iowa State on March 9, 2024.

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was the other Wildcat to score in double figure, scoring all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

► The 93 points equaled the most by a **Jerome Tang**-team in a season opener (93 vs. UTRGV (11/7/22)) and were the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014.

► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. The 14 made 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game and are the most-ever in a season opener.

► The Wildcats scored 60 of their 93 points in the second half, connecting on 59.5 percent from the field and 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range. The 60-point second-half marked the 11th time that a Wildcat team has 60 or more points in a half and tied for the ninth-most points in any half.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladd Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is set to start his fourth season as the 25th head men's basketball coach at K-State in 2025-26.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 3 seasons, he has led the Wildcats to a 61-42 (.592) record, including 28 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (**Lon Kruger, Frank Martin and Bruce Weber**) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 70 wins at K-State are 16 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 7 Top 10 opponents. The 16 career Top 25 wins tie **Tex Winter** (1954-68) for the fourth-most in school history, while the 7 against Top 10 competition are also fourth all-time. Thirteen of the 16 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 46-12 (.793) overall, including 21-8 (.724) in Big 12 play and 13-5 (.722) against ranked foes. The 13 career home Top 25 wins are the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 46-12 record at home with 13 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archrival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 Iowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history.

During a roller coaster 2024-25 season that included a 6-game losing streak followed by a 6-game winning streak in Big 12 play, K-State could not overcome a disappointing non-conference season, as the Wildcats finished with a 16-17 overall record, including a tie for ninth place with TCU in the new-look 16-team Big 12 with a 9-11 mark. Among the 16 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (3 NCAA Tournament, 1 NIT and 6 College Basketball Crown), including ranked wins over No. 3/3 Iowa State, No. 13/13 Arizona, No. 16/17 Cincinnati, No. 16/17 Kansas and No. 23/23 West Virginia.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell** as well as a third starter in **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the 2023-24 season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at Iowa. The team posted a 19-15 record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason, including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 Iowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Jayhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference – the Big 12 – with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner **Markquis Nowell** and forward **Keyontae Johnson**, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Tang arrived at K-State on March 21, 2022 after a 19-year stint at Baylor (2003-22), where as an original member of **Scott Drew's** staff played an instrumental role in building the Bears' program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship. He helped Baylor win 397 games, including 168 in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs).

► K-State erupted for 60 points in the second half to shake off a one-point halftime deficit, as the Wildcats opened the 2025-26 season with a 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4 before 7,765 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Three Wildcats scored in double figures, including a pair of 20-point efforts from junior **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and senior **Nate Johnson**, who narrowly missed the school's first recorded triple-double, with 22 points and game-highs of 9 rebounds and 9 assists. Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** scored all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3.

► It marked the first time in nearly 18 years that a pair of Wildcats each went over 20 points in an opener and the first since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

► Down 34-33 at the half, the Wildcats (1-0) came out of the locker room a different team, scoring 22 of the first 31 points to take a 12-point lead and force a timeout by UNCG head coach **Mike Jones** at the 13:25 mark. Unfortunately for the Spartans, the timeout only slowed the Wildcats' momentum as they rattled off 15 straight points – all on 3-pointers from Bashir and Johnson – to go ahead 70-45 with under 10 minutes to play. The lead grew to as many 32 points (89-57) after Haggerty's last points of the night with 3:12 left.

► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. Eleven of the Wildcats' 14 makes from beyond the arc came after halftime. The 14 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game, while the 11 in the second half tie for the second-most in any half.

► The 60-point second half marked just the 11th time that the Wildcats have scored 60 or more points in any half, as it ties for the ninth-most points in any half and are the most since a 63-point second half against UAPB on Dec. 1, 2024.

► K-State is now 95-27 all-time in season openers, including an 83-10 mark at home and a 31-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► UNCG (0-1) led by as many as 10 points in the first half before K-State closed to within one at the break. The Spartans were led by graduate **Justin Neely**, who had 15 points to go with a team-high 9 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in 32 minutes. Freshman **Lilian Marville** added 14 points in his college debut, while junior **Domas Kauzonas** chipped in 10 points.

► Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including the first career points/assists double-double for junior **P.J. Haggerty**, as K-State moved to 2-0 with a 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8 before 8,040 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The offense continued its fast pace, as K-State (2-0) posted 90 or more points in the first 2 games for the first time in nearly 34 years while totaling the most points in that span since scoring 193 to open the 1991-92 season.

► The Wildcats posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era at 62.3 percent (33-of-53), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 62.5 percent against Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.

► Haggerty led the way with his third career double-double and first points/assists double-double, as he finished with a game-high 23 points on 5-of-9 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a career-best 11 assists. It marked his first double-double since posting a pair of tradition points/rebounds double-doubles while playing at Tulsa in 2023-24.

► Two Wildcats – senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** – each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals. Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

► K-State broke open a back-and-forth affair with an 18-4 run near the midway point of the first half en route to taking a 46-30 lead into the halftime break. The lead grew to 19 points in early moments of the second half before a timeout by Bellarmine head coach **Doug Davenport** keyed a surge by the Knights, who closed to within 62-52 with 13:04 to play.

► Bellarmine kept the pressure on K-State over the next 6 minutes, staying within 11 points, including 73-62 on back-to-back layups, before a 10-5 run by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 83-67 at the final media timeout. The squad then ended the game on a 15-4 run to put it away.

► K-State rallied from a 5-point deficit with 49 seconds to play with a 6-0 run to end the game, as the Wildcats moved to 4-0 with a nail-biting 84-83 win over a defiant Tulsa squad on Nov. 17 before 7,123 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Down 83-78 after a pair of free throws from junior **Myles Rigsby** with 49 seconds remaining, K-State was able to pull out the improbable victory behind the heroics of junior **P.J. Haggerty** and sophomore **David Castillo**, who combined for the final 6 points.

► Haggerty connected on 2 free throws before a successful coach's challenge reversed an out of bounds play leading to a jumper by Haggerty that closed it to 83-82 with 31 seconds. Senior **Khamari McGriff** stole the ball on the next possession, leading to the game-winning layup by Castillo with 18 seconds.

► Tulsa (3-1) had two chances in the final seconds to escape with victory, but senior **Miles Barnstable** missed a 3-pointer with 7 seconds, then after a second coach's challenge reversed another out of bounds call this time in favor of the Golden Hurricane, graduate **David Green** missed a jumper and senior **C.J. Jones** was able to corral the rebound as the clock expired.

► Haggerty finished the night with 31 points on 10-of-17 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a game-high 10 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals in 32 minutes. He is the first Wildcat with a 30-point, 10-rebound performance since **Michael Beasley** registered 33 points and 14 rebounds against Colorado on March 4, 2008. He scored 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half, which is the fifth-most by any Wildcat in a half and the most since 2009.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by McGriff, who narrowly missed his own double-double with 13 points and 9 rebounds, while Castillo and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** added 12 and 10 points, respectively.

► K-State entered averaging 96.7 points on 58.7 percent shooting, including 54.4 percent from 3-point range, but scored its 84 points in a different way with lows in field goal percentage (44.1) and 3-point field goal percentage (20.8).

► The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) inside the 3-point arc with 46 points in the paint to go with 26 fast-break points and a 17-15 edge in second-chance points while out-rebounding the nationally-ranked Hurricane, 40-38. They also converted on their opportunities from the free throw line, hitting on a season-best 90.5 percent (19-of-21).

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored a season-high 37 points to go with a game-high 8 assists and 7 rebounds to lift K-State to the Hall of Fame Classic Championship game with 98-77 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 20 at the T-Mobile Center.

► Haggerty paced three Wildcats with his season-high 37 points, which came on 13-of-21 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-8 free throws. The 37 points are the most scored by a K-State player in 49 games played at the T-Mobile Center, eclipsing the 29 scored by **Makol Mawien** against Kansas in the Big 12 Championship on March 9, 2018.

► The 37 points are the most by a Wildcat since **Barry Brown Jr.** scored 38 against Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018, while he is the first player with back-to-back 30-point games since **Markquis Nowell** posted 36 points vs. Texas and 32 points vs. Baylor on Jan. 3 and 7, 2023.

► In addition, Haggerty is the first Wildcat to record a stat line of 30 or more points, 5 or more rebounds and 5 or more assists since Brown tallied 34 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in a win at Baylor on Jan. 22, 2018.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior **Nate Johnson** and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, who posted 14 and 12 points, respectively. The Wildcats also got 9 points from sophomore **David Castillo**, 8 points from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 7 points from freshman **Andrej Kostic**.

► K-State took the lead for good on a rare 4-point play by Kostic with 9:11 left in the first half then slowly pulled away behind the play of Haggerty, who had 15 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in the first half. Haggerty's old-fashioned 3-point play extended the lead to 40-32 with 2:07 remaining before consecutive baskets by Castillo and Johnson made it 44-36 at the break.

► The lead grew to double digits early in the second half after a 3-pointer by Johnson, but the Bulldogs closed within 69-62 after 4 consecutive free throws with 9:24 to play. However, four more points from Haggerty and a layup by McGriff extended it back to double figures at the third media timeout. From there, the advantage grew to more than 20 points, including its largest at 91-68 after a 3-pointer by Bashir with 3:13 to play.

► The 98 points broke the school record for points scored at T-Mobile Center, topping the 87 scored in the school's first-ever game in the building against Florida A&M on Dec. 17, 2007.

► K-State ended its 4-game skid with a thorough domination of Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 8, breaking 100 points for the fourth time under head coach **Jerome Tang** while connecting on 57.6 percent shooting in a 108-49 victory before 6,682 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State (6-4) eclipsed 100 points in a game for the 42nd time, while the 108 points tied for the eighth-most in school history and were the most since the Wildcats scored a school-record 120 points in a win over UAPB more than a year ago. The 59-point margin of victory tied for the fourth-largest and was the largest since a 61-point win over Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 13, 2012.

► In shooting 57.6 percent (38-of-66) from the field, the Wildcats made 63.3 percent (19-of-30) of their 2-point field goals, including a 34-10 advantage in the paint, while collecting the third-most 3-point field goals (19) in school history on 52.8 percent shooting. They also outscored the Delta Devils in points off turnovers (17-4), second-chance points (17-7) and fast-break points (27-11).

► The 19 made 3-pointers are only surpassed by the school-record 23 against Fresno State in 1994 and the 21 vs. UAPB in 2024. Six different players had at least one 3-pointer, including 5 each from juniors **P.J. Haggerty** and **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, and sophomore **David Castillo**.

► All 11 players who saw action had at least one made field goal while four Wildcats scored in double figures led by a game-high 28 points from the nation's leading scorer – Haggerty – who has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Castillo had 19 points off the bench on 6-of-11 field goals, while Bashir and senior **Nate Johnson** added 15 and 14 points, respectively.

► The Wildcats also shared the ball well with the third-most assists (30) in a game on their 38 made field goals, as four players tallied 5 or more assists, including a game-high 6 by Johnson.

► K-State took control less than 2 minutes into the game with 6 straight points before stretching its lead to 20 points (32-12) near the midway point of the first half. The lead was 18 points before a 10-0 run made it 50-18 with less than 2 minutes before halftime. The second half was much of the same as the deficit never fell below 32 points and grew to as many as 61 (108-47) with 1:25 to play.

► Sophomore **David Castillo** scored six of his game-high 19 points in the last two minutes to help K-State hold off a furious Creighton rally in an 83-76 win on Dec. 13 before 16,657 fans at CHI Health Center Omaha.

► K-State (7-4) earned its first win in a non-conference road game since a 75-60 victory at LSU on Dec. 9, 2023, snapping a 4-game skid. The Wildcats posted just their third all-time win in 10 visits to Omaha (1969, 1987 and 2025) while running their winning streak over the Bluejays to 4 games.

► Buoyed by a near record-setting 51-point first-half, K-State led by as many as 20 points in the early moments of the second half before Creighton (5-5) slowly chipped away at the deficit, closing to within 73-70 with 2:41 to play. However, Castillo saved his best for clutch time, scoring six of the Wildcats' last 10 points while adding an assist. It marked the fourth straight game in double figures for the sophomore, including the second in a row off the bench with 19 points.

► After Bluejay senior **Josh Dix** missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game with 2:10 remaining, Castillo grabbed the rebound and converted on a driving layup. Following another 3-point miss, Castillo once again drove the lane, feeding senior **Khamari McGriff** on a lob dunk to put the Wildcats ahead 77-70 with 1:21 left. Castillo then knocked down a pair of free throws for a 79-73 lead before finishing things off with a breakaway dunk with 18 seconds.

► Castillo was one of four Wildcats to score in double figures, collecting his 19 points on 7-of-11 field goals, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range, while making all 3 free throws. Omaha native junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** put on a show for the hometown crowd with 18 points on 6 made 3-pointers, including 15 points in the first half when he eclipsed 1,000 career points. Senior **Khamari McGriff** and junior **P.J. Haggerty** added 12 and 10 points, respectively, while senior **Nate Johnson** had game-highs in both assists (6) and steals (4) go with 8 points.

► K-State led by as many as 18 points in the first half, including 51-33 at the break, as the Wildcats connected on 59.4 percent (19-of-32) from the field, including 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range.

► The Wildcats, which shot a season-low 27.8 percent (10-of-36) in the second half, finished at 42.6 percent (29-of-68) for the game, including 42.9 percent (12-of-28) from 3-point range. The team also made 13 of 15 attempts (86.7 percent) from the free throw line and turned the ball over just 7 times.

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** paced five Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 24 points, as K-State recorded its second 100-point game of the season in a 106-76 win over South Dakota on Dec. 20 before 7,287 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The Wildcats (8-4), which scored a season-high 108 points in the win over Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 8, notched their second 100-point performance in the last 3 games while tying the school single-season record with the 1966-67, 1979-80, 1993-94 and 1997-98 teams. It also matched the 1993-94 and 1997-98 teams for the most 100-point games at home in a single season.

► K-State shot better than 60 percent from the field for the third time, as the Wildcats connected on 62.1 percent (41-of-66), including 50 percent (12-of-24) from 3-point range, and 75 percent (12-of-16) from the free throw line. The team hit on better than 56 percent in each half, including a season-high 57 first-half points on a season-high 67.6 percent (23-of-3

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored 23 of his team-high 24 points in the second half, as K-State wrapped up non-conference play with a 94-85 win over a pesky ULM squad on Dec. 28 before 8,163 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The victory extended the team's winning streak to 4 games, as they finished non-conference play with a 9-4 record, which is the third-best mark in the last 7 seasons and the best since the 2023-24 squad opened at 10-3. K-State is now 197-66 in non-conference play since 2006-07, including 137-16 at home.

► Haggerty, who collected his ninth game of 20 or more points this season, bounced back from his worst first half of the season to score his 23 second-half points on 7-of-10 field goals and 9-of-9 free throws. None of his 23 second-half points proved more critical than a pair of 3-point plays after the Warhawks (3-11) had whittled the lead from a game-high 20 points (69-49) with 13:18 to play to just 4 points (75-71) with just over 6 minutes remaining.

► With momentum shifting to ULM after a 6-0 run cut the deficit to 75-71 at the 6:04 mark, Haggerty converted on the first of his 3-point plays out of a K-State timeout. He then added a second one following a Warhawks' 3-pointer that gave the Wildcats an 83-74 lead with 4:51 remaining.

► After yet another rally closed the deficit to 87-83 with just over 3 minutes to play, Haggerty came through with a big defensive rebound before assisting on a fast-break layup by sophomore **David Castillo** that pushed the lead to 92-83 with 2:24 left. He then scored the game's final points on a layup with 1:10 remaining that put the Wildcats ahead 94-85.

► Haggerty finished the day 7-of-16 from the field and 10-of-11 from the free throw line to go with a team-best 8 rebounds and 3 assists in 29 minutes. He has now scored in double figures in all 13 games while leading in scoring 10 times.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior **Nate Johnson** (14 points) and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (11 points). Two other Wildcats had 9 points (junior **Elias Rapique** and Castillo), while senior **Khamari McGriff** and junior **Taj Manning** added 8 points each. Manning also had a career-high 7 rebounds.

► Despite shooting a lackluster 28.6 percent (10-of-35) from 3-point range, K-State still managed to score 90 or more points for the seventh time in 13 games. The Wildcats converted on 65.7 percent (23-of-35) of their shots inside the 3-point line, including a 44-32 advantage in the paint.
