

K-State's 5 international players are the most on any Wildcat team in school history, which includes junior **Dorin Buca** (Perugia, Italy), **Mobi Ikegwuruka** (Galway, Ireland) and **Elias Rapieque** (Berlin, Germany), sophomore **Stephen Osei** (Toronto, Ontario) and freshman **Andrej Kostic** (Belgrade, Serbia).

Buca, Kostic and Rapieque are the first-ever players from their respective countries.

Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, who led the NCAA in 3-point field goals while at Monmouth in 2024-25, ranked in the top-20 in 3-point field goals/game (3.72), 3-pointers (67) and 3-point FG percentage (44.4) before his injury.

Preseason All-American **P.J. Haggerty** currently ranks 5th among active Division I in total points with 1,969 points in just 95 games. He leads all of Division I in career scoring average at 20.7 points per game.

K-State's 5 Division I transfers - **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, **P.J. Haggerty**, **Marcus Johnson**, **Nate Johnson** and **Khamari McGriff** - have combined to score 6,527 points in 495 career games with 276 starts.

TEAM NOTES**■ OPPONENT SPOTLIGHT: CINCINNATI**

► Led by fifth-year coach **Wes Miller**, Cincinnati enters Wednesday's game with a 12-12 overall record, including a 4-7 mark in Big 12 play, after snapping a 2-game losing streak with a 92-72 win over UCF on Sunday afternoon. The Bearcats opened league play with 3 straight losses before winning 4 of their last 8 games.



► Cincinnati is averaging 71.6 points on 42.4 percent shooting, including 31.2 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 67.3 points on 41.3 percent shooting, including 32.1 percent from 3-point range. The Bearcats are out-rebounding their foes, 37.4 to 34.8, and turn the ball over 12.4 times per game. They are shooting 66.5 percent from the free throw line.

► Cincinnati ranks among the best at scoring defense, holding opponents to 67.3 points per game, which ranks 29th nationally and fourth in the Big 12.

► Four players are averaging in double figures led by senior **Baba Miller**, who is averaging a double-double with 13.6 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 10.5 rebounds. Junior **Jizzle James** and sophomore **Moustapha Thiam** both average 11 points per game, while graduate **Day Day Thomas** is averaging 10.9 points to go with a team-high 88 assists. Thiam is shooting a team-best 53.8 percent along with 35 blocked shots.

► Miller has won 279 games in his career, including 185 at UNC Greensboro (2011-21) and 94 since taking over at Cincinnati in 2021-22. He has led teams to 6-20-win seasons in the last 9 years with 2 NCAA Tournaments and 4 trips to the NIT. He is 1-2 all-time vs. K-State, including 0-1 on the road.

SERIES HISTORY

► Cincinnati leads the all-time series, 8-3, which dates back to the 1958 NCAA Tournament. The teams have met 4 times in the Big Dance (1958, 1959, 1961 and 2017).

► This will be the fourth meeting in the Big 12 era with K-State winning the last 2 meetings, including 70-67 at home on Dec. 30, 2024.

LAST MEETING**K-STATE 54, CINCINNATI 49 (March 5, 2025)**

► Senior **David N'Guegan** collected his team-leading sixth double-double of the season with a game-high 18 points and 10 rebounds in helping K-State to a 54-49 win over Cincinnati on March 5, 2025 at Fifth Third Arena in the last meeting between the schools. N'Guegan scored 14 of his 18 points in the second half on 6-of-6 shooting.

► K-State used a stifling defensive effort to snap a 3-game road losing streak while sweeping the regular season series from Cincinnati, including its first-ever road win in four tries. The 49 points were the fewest allowed by a **Jerome Tang** team and the fewest allowed by the Wildcats in a conference game since Oklahoma State scored 46 points on Feb. 23, 2019.

■ UP NEXT: AT 3/3 HOUSTON

► K-State makes another visit to the Lone Star State on Saturday, as the Wildcats travel to No. 3/3 Houston (21-2, 9-1 Big 12). The game will tip at 3 p.m., CT on Peacock and NBC Sports Network. The series is tied at 5 wins each, but the Cougars have won the 2 matchups in the Big 12 era by a margin of 161-109, including 87-57 last year.

**OFFENSE OFF TO FAST START**
MOST POINTS THROUGH 23 GAMES

- After scoring 80 or more points for the 14th time in 23 games, which includes 7 games of 90 or more points and 2 games of 100 or more points, the Wildcats have continued their fast offensive start.
- The 1879 points are the most points through the first 23 games, surpassing the 1862 scored in 2009-10. The 106 points vs. South Dakota (12/20/25) marked the 43rd 100-point game, including the fifth under head coach **Jerome Tang**.

'CATS SCORE 100+ POINTS TWICE

- K-State has twice scored 100 or more points, including a season-high 108 vs. Mississippi Valley State (12/8/25) and 106 vs. South Dakota (12/20/25). The 2 100-point outings tie 4 other teams (1966-67, 1979-80, 1993-94 and 1997-98) for the most in a single season, while also matching the most at home.

MOST POINTS AT BRAMLAGE COLISEUM

- K-State's 99-96 win over Cal (11/13/25) made history, as the 195 combined points were the most-ever in Bramlage Coliseum, surpassing the 194 scored between K-State (106) and Marshall (88) on Dec. 2, 1995. It was the highest field goal percentage (64.4) of the **Jerome Tang** era, while it was the highest field goal percentage since 66.0 percent vs. Wake Forest on March 14, 2017.

MOST POINTS AT T-MOBILE CENTER

- The 98 points scored against Mississippi State (11/20/25) are the most by the Wildcats in 50 games at the T-Mobile Center topping the 87 scored in the first-ever game in the building against Florida A&M on Dec. 17, 2007.

HAGGERTY IN ELITE COMPANY

- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** recorded his fourth 30-point game of the season in the loss at TCU (2/7/26), which is the most in a single season since **Michael Beasley** had a school-record 13 in 2007-08. His 17 games of 20 or more points tie **Jacob Pullen** (2010-11) for sixth on the single season list. He is the first Wildcat to score in double digits in the first 23 games since Pullen in 2009-10, while his 536 points are the second-most through the first 23 games since Beasley's 577 points in 2007-08. He is the 36th Wildcat to eclipse 500 points in a single season.

HAGGERTY SCORES 37 VS. MSU

- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** had back-to-back 30-point games against Tulsa (11/17/25) and Mississippi State (11/20/25), including a season-high 37 points vs. the Bulldogs. The 37 points are the most scored under **Jerome Tang** and the most since **Barry Brown Jr.** had 38 points vs. Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018.

HAGGERTY HAS RARE 30-10 GAME

- Junior **P.J. Haggerty** had 31 points and a career-tying 10 rebounds vs. Tulsa (11/17/25) to become the first Wildcat since **Michael Beasley** in 2008 to post a rare 30-point, 10-rebound double-double.

TRIO OF 'CATS POST 20-POINT GAMES

- K-State had 3 players record 20-point games in the win over Cal (11/13/25), as junior **P.J. Haggerty** led the way with 23 points to go with 21 from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 20 from senior **Nate Johnson**. The trio is the first to each have 20-point games since **Dean Wade** (34 points), **Kamau Stokes** (23 points) and **Barry Brown Jr.** (21 points) did it against Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017.

MCGRIFF, CASTILLO GO PERFECT

- Senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to make all attempts from the field (minimum of 5 attempts) vs. Bellarmine (11/8/25). Castillo scored 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

LAST TIME OUT
TCU 84, K-STATE 82

► Junior **Xavier Edmonds** scored 6 of the last 7 points, including the game-winning free throws with 6.7 seconds left, as TCU rallied from an 18-point first-half deficit to hand K-State an 84-82 loss on Saturday.

► K-State (10-13, 1-9 Big 12) led 82-77 after a dunk by senior **Khamari McGriff** with 1:29 to play, but the Wildcats didn't score again as they turned the ball over on each of their last 3 possessions while the Horned Frogs (14-9, 4-6 Big 12) ended the game on a 7-0 run.

► Edmonds paced TCU with 26 points on 9-of-10 field goals and 7-of-13 free throws and a game-high 10 rebounds in just over 30 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **David Punch** (14 points) and senior **Jayden Pierre** (10 points).

► It marked the second consecutive matchup between the teams in Fort Worth that ended with TCU on a game-winning run as the Horned Frogs scored the last 6 points in a 63-62 win on Jan. 4, 2025. They have now won 6 of the last 8 meetings in the series, including 4 in a row.

► The loss particularly stung as the short-handed Wildcats led for more than 39 minutes and 30 seconds in the game, including 42-24 with 5:31 to play in the first half and by double figures 3 times in the second half, including 78-68 with 5:26 remaining. The 18-point lead represents the third-largest blown in school history and the largest since 2001.

► K-State now has 5 losses by 5 points or less, including 4 in Big 12 play.

► The Wildcats shot better than 50 percent from the field for the ninth time this season, as they connected on 52.4 percent (33-of-63) from the field, including 11 made 3-pointers, while getting a game-high 30-point effort from junior **P.J. Haggerty** and a season-high 15 points from senior reserve **Marcus Johnson**, who made 5-of-6 3-point attempts.

► Senior **Nate Johnson** added his second career double-double and first this season with 13 points and a career-high 11 assists to go with a career-best 6 steals in 37 minutes. Sophomore **David Castillo** gave the Wildcats a fourth double-digit scorer with 11 points.

■ HOW THE 'CATS WERE BUILT

'CATS WELCOME 10 NEWCOMERS, INCLUDING 5 DIVISION I TRANSFERS

► K-State brought in one of the top transfer classes with 10 newcomers, including 5 Division I transfers, 4 players from the international ranks and 1 true freshman. The class has been rated nationally as high as No. 4 by 247Sports and No. 20 by On3.

► Among the 10 newcomers are 5 Division I transfers, including **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (Monmouth), **P.J. Haggerty** (Memphis), **Marcus Johnson** (Bowling Green), **Nate Johnson** (Akron) and **Khamari McGriff** (UNC Wilmington). Haggerty, N. Johnson and McGriff were on teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2024-25.

► The 4 international additions include the school's first-ever players from Italy (**Dorin Buca**), Serbia (**Andrej Kostic**) and Germany (**Elias Rapieque**). The fourth international player - **Stephen Osei** - from Toronto played at the junior college level at Casper College in Wyoming.

► Haggerty is coming off a career year at Memphis, in which, he became the first Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while earning consensus Second Team All-American honors. The AAC Player of the Year ranked third nationally in both scoring (21.7 ppg.) and total points (759).

► Johnson became the first Akron player to be named both the MAC Player and Defensive Player of the Year in the same season and the first since Ball State's **Bonzi Wells** in 1998.

► Bashir was one of the top scorers in the NCAA in 2024-25, leading the CAA in scoring at 20.1 points per game while leading the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.85) and second in total 3-pointers (127).

► McGriff was one of the top sixth men in the CAA at UNC Wilmington, where he was part of 99 wins and 3 conference championships.

► A member of the German U18 and U20 National Teams, Rapieque played in 53 games with ALBA Berlin in 2024-25 between the EuroLeague (27 games) and the German Basketball Bundesliga (26 games).

► Kostic was a member of the Serbia U18 and U19 National Teams, winning the gold medal at the 2023 European U18 Championship and the silver medal at the 2024 European U18 Championship.

► The lone freshman - **Exavier Wilson** - was a 3-time all-state selection and scored more than 1,700 career points in his prep career.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

► K-State has posted a 197-66 (.748) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 153-20 (.884) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 137-16 (.895) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. The 94-85 win over ULM on Dec. 28 gave the Wildcats their third-best non-conference record (9-4) in the past 7 seasons.

1750 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State is one of the winningest programs in Division I history, as the Wildcats have posted a 1,766-1,268 (.581) all-time record which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,766 wins are the 43rd-most in Division I history (one shy of Virginia in 42nd), including the seventh-most among current Big 12 schools.

TANG ADJUSTS COACHING STAFF

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** adjusted his coaching staff during the offseason, adding veteran head coach **Matthew Driscoll** as associate head coach as well as acclaimed player development coach **Bill Peterson** as an assistant coach and **Chase Driscoll** as director of video and analytics.

► The winningest coach in both North Florida and Atlantic Sun Conference history during a 16-year stint (2009-25) with the Ospreys, Driscoll joined the staff on May 23. He won 248 games at North Florida, including 144 in ASUN play, while guiding the school to 3 regular-season championships and the league's tournament championship and a NCAA Tournament bid in 2015.

► Driscoll's relationship with Tang dates back more than 20 years, as the two coached alongside each other for 6 seasons (2003-09) at Baylor as original members of head coach **Scott Drew**'s staff.

► Peterson has served in various capacities in the NBA, including the Golden Warriors, Dallas Mavericks and Milwaukee Bucks. He has mentored over 20 NBA players, including Hall of Famers **Dirk Nowitzki**, **Steve Nash** and **Karl Malone**. He also has a combined 10 years of head coaching experience at the NAIA, Division II and G-League levels in his 47-year coaching career.

► Peterson coached alongside Tang while at Baylor from 2017-22, where they helped guide the Bears to the 2021 NCAA Championship.

► **Chase Driscoll** joined the staff on May 13 after serving as an assistant coach and director of operations for his father, Matthew, at North Florida.

Baylor North

► With the additions of associate head coach **Matthew Driscoll** and assistant coach **Bill Peterson**, **Jerome Tang** tapped into his coaching history, as all three were on staff at Baylor. Tang and Driscoll were part of **Scott Drew**'s first staff from 2003-09, while Tang and Peterson helped the Bears to the 2021 NCAA title while together on staff from 2017-22.

► Driscoll and Peterson aren't the only K-State staffers with Baylor ties, as director of player development **Austin Carpenter** was a graduate assistant for Tang with the Bears from 2020-22, while current graduate assistants **Henry Dugat** and **Mark Vital Jr.** are among the best players in Baylor history.

► Dugat is one of five players known as "The Foundation" that was inducted into the Baylor Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021. He was part of Drew's first two recruiting classes that led to Bears' historic turnaround. He still ranks in the top 20 all-time in program history with 1,229 career points.

► Vital was a 3-time All-Big 12 selection and a member of Baylor's 2021 National Championship team, playing in 126 games with 105 starts.

WILDCATS VS. RANKED TEAMS

K-State has played over 400 games vs. ranked teams in their history, posting a 138-303 (.316) record, including 28-86 (.248) vs. the top-5, 56-153 (.272) vs. the top-10 and 80-214 (.275) vs. top-15.

K-State has 45 wins vs. ranked foes in the last 13 seasons, including 17 vs. the top 10 (one over No. 1), and 34 Top 25 wins at home.

PLAYER NOTES

HAGGERTY AMONG THE BEST

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** is among the best players to transfer to K-State, as he is coming off a career-best year in 2024-25, in which, he became the first Memphis Tiger since 2008 to be named an AP All-American while becoming the first Division I player to average at least 21.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game to go with 6.5 free throws per game since **Ja Morant** in 2018-19. He is the only Division I player to average at 21 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.0 steals per game in each of the last 3 seasons.

► Haggerty was a consensus Second Team All-American in his lone season at Memphis, while was just the second Tiger to be named the AAC Player of the Year as well as Most Outstanding Player at the AAC Tournament. He was also a finalist for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the Wooden Award and the Riley Wallace Award as the most impactful transfer.

► Haggerty, who has also made stops at TCU (2022-23) and Tulsa (2023-24), is nearing 2,000 career points (1,969) after posting a game-high 30 at TCU (2/7/26), connecting on 48.5 percent from the field and 77.4 percent from the line. He has scored in double figures in 87 of 95 career games with 33 games of 25 or more points, including eight 30-point games and one 40-point game.

► Haggerty is the first Wildcat to score in double figures in the first 23 games since **Jacob Pullen** in 2009-10, while his 536 points are second to **Michael Beasley**'s 577 in 2007-08. Of his 23 double-digit scoring games, he has 17 games of 20 or more points, including 4 30-point efforts. He ranks second in total points, field goals made (196) and attempted (403) and scoring (23.3 ppg.).

► Haggerty's 34 points vs. Utah (1/20/26) were the 10th-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Markquis Nowell** went for 36 at Texas on Jan. 3, 2023. His 15 made field goals were the most by a player since **Michael Beasley** in 2008, as he went 15-of-29 from the field to go with a game-high 8 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals in more than 39 minutes. He scored 28 of his 34 points in the second half, which tied for the third-most points in a half in school history, including the most since **Denis Clemente**'s 32 points at Texas in 2009.

BASHIR OUT 4-6 WEEKS

► K-State received some unfortunate news on Jan. 19 when junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** underwent foot surgery to repair a stress fracture. He is expected to miss 4-6 weeks. He is the Wildcats' second-leading scorer at 13.2 points per game, while he ranks among the top-20 in most 3-point categories nationally.

BASHIR GOOD FROM 3

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** is among the best 3-point shooters in the nation, as he ranked fifth in 3-point field goals/game (3.72), fifth in total 3-pointers (67) and 14th in 3-point percentage (44.4) before going down with an injury on Jan. 19. Last year, he led the NCAA in 3-point field goals/game (3.85) while he was second in 3-point field goals (127) and 3-point field goals attempted (332).

► Bashir has made 245 3-point field goals in his 84-game college career on 39.9 percent shooting, which is nearly 4 made 3-pointers per game. He leads the team with 67 makes so far this season on 44.4 percent shooting. His 7 made 3-pointers vs. Nebraska (11/21/25) tied for the sixth-most ever in a game while he has at least 2 3-pointers in 16 of 18 games with 4 or more in 10 games.

► Bashir eclipsed 1,000 career points with his second of 6 made 3-pointers in his hometown of Omaha in the win at Creighton (12/13/25). He has scored in double figures in 14 of 18 games, including a high of 26 points vs. Nebraska.

CASILLO'S IMPROVEMENT

► Junior **David Castillo** has made one of the biggest jumps in production this season, as he ranks third on the team in scoring (11.7 ppg.) while connecting on 44.2 percent (96-of-217) from the field, including 39.8 percent (47-of-118) from 3-point range, and 81.1 percent (30-of-37) from the free throw line. He is second in 3-pointers (47) and third in assists (45).

► Castillo has more than tripled his point total (77 to 269) from his freshman year, while also posting 13 double-digit scoring games, including 5 in a row from Dec. 1-20. He scored a career-high 22 points vs. Bowling Green (12/1/25). He collected his first career 20-point game in the win over Utah (1/20/26), as he knocked down a career-high 6 made 3-pointers on 9 attempts.

MANNING IS THE MAN

► Junior **Taj Manning**'s patience is finally paying off, as the longest tenured Wildcat is finally making an impact on the court. With injuries in the frontcourt, he has averaged 20.4 minutes in the last 16 games with starts in 8 of the last 10 games, including in each of the last 7 games. In that span, he is averaging 4.6 points on 46.6 percent (27-of-58) shooting with 5.5 rebounds per game.

► Manning has made a particular impact on the rebounding end, where 87 of his 93 rebounds this season have come in the last 16 games with a career-high 9 at West Virginia (1/27/26) and 7 in 3 other contests. He posted double figures for the first time vs. UCF (1/14/26) with a career-high 10 points.

JOHNSON IS MR. EVERYTHING

► Senior **Nate Johnson** has impacted the Wildcats in a number of areas, as the transfer ranks first in assists (102), steals (48) and free throw percentage (85.4), second in 3-pointers (47) and rebounding (4.7 rpg.) and fourth in scoring (11.3 ppg.). He is the only Big 12 player averaging a stat line of at least 11.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game.

► Johnson has posted 14 double-digit scoring games this season, including a pair of 20-point games vs. UNC Greensboro (11/4/25) and California (11/13/25). He has recorded 3 games of 8 or more rebounds, 8 games of 5 or more assists and 7 games of 3 or more steals. He posted career-highs for both assists (11) and steals (6) at TCU (2/7/26) to go with 13 points, 2 rebounds and 2 blocks.

► Junior **Nate Johnson** nearly made history in his first game in a Wildcat uniform, as he narrowly missed the school's first triple-double in the 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4, as he finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 field goals, including 6-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists.

► Johnson's 6 made 3-pointers are the most by a Wildcat in a season opener, while his 9 assists tie **Aaron Swartzendruber** vs. Kansas City in 1996 and **Larry Reid** vs. UTSA in 2000 for the most in an opener.

► Junior All-American candidate **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and Johnson (22 points) became the first duo to go over 20 points in a season opener in nearly 18 years since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points, respectively, against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

► Haggerty's 27 points, which came on 10-of-20 field goals and 6-of-7 free throws, are ninth-most by a Wildcat in an opener and the most since the aforementioned Beasley, who had 32 points in his first career game.

► Haggerty and Johnson became the first Wildcat duo to post 20-point games in any game since **Arthur Kaluma** (23) and **Cam Carter** (21) did it against No. 6/6 Iowa State on March 9, 2024.

► Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** was the other Wildcat to score in double figure, scoring all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

► The 93 points equaled the most by a **Jerome Tang**-team in a season opener (93 vs. UTRGV (11/7/22)) and were the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014.

► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. The 14 made 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game and are the most-ever in a season opener.

► The Wildcats scored 60 of their 93 points in the second half, connecting on 59.5 percent from the field and 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range. The 60-point second-half marked the 11th time that a Wildcat team has 60 or more points in a half and tied for the ninth-most points in any half.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladd Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is set to start his fourth season as the 25th head men's basketball coach at K-State in 2025-26.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang has re-energized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons before his arrival in 2022-23. In his first 3 seasons, he has led the Wildcats to a 61-42 (.592) record, including 28 wins in Big 12 play, with consecutive postseason appearances (2023 NCAA Tournament, 2024 NIT) highlighted by the run to the Elite Eight. He is one of just 4 head coaches (**Lon Kruger, Frank Martin and Bruce Weber**) to help the Wildcats to the postseason in their first 2 seasons.

Among his 71 wins at K-State are 16 against teams ranked in the Top 25, including 7 Top 10 opponents. The 16 career Top 25 wins tie **Tex Winter** (1954-68) for the fourth-most in school history, while the 7 against Top 10 competition are also fourth all-time. Thirteen of the 16 ranked wins have come in the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum, where Tang is 47-15 (.793) overall, including 22-11 (.724) in Big 12 play and 13-7 (.722) against ranked foes. The 13 career home Top 25 wins are the second-most by a head coach in school history.

In addition to the wins over ranked teams, Tang's teams have also proved to be clutch in his short tenure, posting a 13-1 mark in overtime games, including an NCAA single-season record 7 such wins in 2023-24. The 12-game winning streak in overtime games was the second-longest such streak in Division I history since 1950 and the second-longest streak behind Florida State (14; 2018-present) and right ahead of Winthrop (10; 2017-present). Including his time as interim head coach at Baylor, Tang is now 13-1 in overtime games.

Tang has helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats have played before nine sellouts while posting a 47-15 record at home with 13 wins over Top 25 foes, including a pair of top-5 wins over archrival Kansas, two over top-10 Baylor and No. 6/6 Iowa State. The 15 home wins in 2022-23 were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history.

During a roller coaster 2024-25 season that included a 6-game losing streak followed by a 6-game winning streak in Big 12 play, K-State could not overcome a disappointing non-conference season, as the Wildcats finished with a 16-17 overall record, including a tie for ninth place with TCU in the new-look 16-team Big 12 with a 9-11 mark. Among the 16 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason (3 NCAA Tournament, 1 NIT and 6 College Basketball Crown), including ranked wins over No. 3/3 Iowa State, No. 13/13 Arizona, No. 16/17 Cincinnati, No. 16/17 Kansas and No. 23/23 West Virginia.

Despite losing a pair of All-Americans in **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell** as well as a third starter in **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** right before the season, Tang kept the Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament conversation until the very end of the 2023-24 season before receiving a bid to the NIT, where they lost in the first round at Iowa. The team posted a 19-15 record, which included a tie for ninth with Oklahoma in the new 14-team Big 12 with an 8-10 mark. Among the 19 wins were 10 over teams that advanced to the postseason, including No. 9/9 Baylor, No. 4/4 Kansas, No. 25/21 BYU and No. 6/6 Iowa State.

The victories over the Bears and Jayhawks came in overtime, as the Wildcats set a new Division I single-season record with 7 overtime wins, breaking the mark of 6 set by Wake Forest (1983-84), Chattanooga (1988-89) and Lafayette (2007-08). The 7 overtime wins also broke the school record of 5, set in 1992-93 and 2022-23, while it is the most overtime games in school history (5 total set in 1992-93 and 2022-23). The 6 overtime home wins are also a Division I record.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference – the Big 12 – with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner **Markquis Nowell** and forward **Keyontae Johnson**, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Tang arrived at K-State on March 21, 2022 after a 19-year stint at Baylor (2003-22), where as an original member of **Scott Drew's** staff played an instrumental role in building the Bears' program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship. He helped Baylor win 397 games, including 168 in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs).

► K-State erupted for 60 points in the second half to shake off a one-point halftime deficit, as the Wildcats opened the 2025-26 season with a 93-64 win over UNC Greensboro on Nov. 4 before 7,765 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Three Wildcats scored in double figures, including a pair of 20-point efforts from junior **P.J. Haggerty** (27 points) and senior **Nate Johnson**, who narrowly missed the school's first recorded triple-double, with 22 points and game-highs of 9 rebounds and 9 assists. Junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** scored all 16 of his points in the second half, hitting on 6-of-7 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3.

► It marked the first time in nearly 18 years that a pair of Wildcats each went over 20 points in an opener and the first since **Michael Beasley** and **Blake Young** went for 32 and 22 points against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007.

► Down 34-33 at the half, the Wildcats (1-0) came out of the locker room a different team, scoring 22 of the first 31 points to take a 12-point lead and force a timeout by UNCG head coach **Mike Jones** at the 13:25 mark. Unfortunately for the Spartans, the timeout only slowed the Wildcats' momentum as they rattled off 15 straight points – all on 3-pointers from Bashir and Johnson – to go ahead 70-45 with under 10 minutes to play. The lead grew to as many 32 points (89-57) after Haggerty's last points of the night with 3:12 left.

► K-State shot just over 50 percent (34-of-67) from the field, including 59.5 percent (22-of-37) in the second half, while hitting on 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from 3-point range. Eleven of the Wildcats' 14 makes from beyond the arc came after halftime. The 14 3-pointers tie for the seventh-most in any game, while the 11 in the second half tie for the second-most in any half.

► The 60-point second half marked just the 11th time that the Wildcats have scored 60 or more points in any half, as it ties for the ninth-most points in any half and are the most since a 63-point second half against UAPB on Dec. 1, 2024.

► K-State is now 95-27 all-time in season openers, including an 83-10 mark at home and a 31-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► UNCG (0-1) led by as many as 10 points in the first half before K-State closed to within one at the break. The Spartans were led by graduate **Justin Neely**, who had 15 points to go with a team-high 9 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in 32 minutes. Freshman **Lilian Marville** added 14 points in his college debut, while junior **Domas Kauzonas** chipped in 10 points.

► Four Wildcats scored in double figures, including the first career points/assists double-double for junior **P.J. Haggerty**, as K-State moved to 2-0 with a 98-71 win over Bellarmine on Nov. 8 before 8,040 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The offense continued its fast pace, as K-State (2-0) posted 90 or more points in the first 2 games for the first time in nearly 34 years while totaling the most points in that span since scoring 193 to open the 1991-92 season.

► The Wildcats posted the highest field goal percentage of the **Jerome Tang** era at 62.3 percent (33-of-53), including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from 3-point range. It was the highest field goal percentage since hitting on 62.5 percent against Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.

► Haggerty led the way with his third career double-double and first points/assists double-double, as he finished with a game-high 23 points on 5-of-9 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a career-best 11 assists. It marked his first double-double since posting a pair of tradition points/rebounds double-doubles while playing at Tulsa in 2023-24.

► Two Wildcats – senior **Khamari McGriff** and sophomore **David Castillo** – each went perfect from the field, becoming the 24th and 25th players in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals. Castillo scored a career-high 19 points on 7-of-7 shooting, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range, while McGriff totaled 16 points on 8-of-8 field goals.

► K-State broke open a back-and-forth affair with an 18-4 run near the midway point of the first half en route to taking a 46-30 lead into the halftime break. The lead grew to 19 points in early moments of the second half before a timeout by Bellarmine head coach **Doug Davenport** keyed a surge by the Knights, who closed to within 62-52 with 13:04 to play.

► Bellarmine kept the pressure on K-State over the next 6 minutes, staying within 11 points, including 73-62 on back-to-back layups, before a 10-5 run by the Wildcats pushed the lead to 83-67 at the final media timeout. The squad then ended the game on a 15-4 run to put it away.

► Bellarmine (0-2) saw four players score in double figures, including 19 points from sophomore **Michael Wilson, Jr.**, and 18 from senior **Jack Karasinski**. The Knights shot 45.9 percent (28-of-61) from the field, but just 20 percent (4-of-20) from beyond the arc.

► K-State rallied from a 5-point deficit with 49 seconds to play with a 6-0 run to end the game, as the Wildcats moved to 4-0 with a nail-biting 84-83 win over a defiant Tulsa squad on Nov. 17 before 7,123 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Down 83-78 after a pair of free throws from junior **Myles Rigsby** with 49 seconds remaining, K-State was able to pull out the improbable victory behind the heroics of junior **P.J. Haggerty** and sophomore **David Castillo**, who combined for the final 6 points.

► Haggerty connected on 2 free throws before a successful coach's challenge reversed an out of bounds play leading to a jumper by Haggerty that closed it to 83-82 with 31 seconds. Senior **Khamari McGriff** stole the ball on the next possession, leading to the game-winning layup by Castillo with 18 seconds.

► Tulsa (3-1) had two chances in the final seconds to escape with victory, but senior **Miles Barnstable** missed a 3-pointer with 7 seconds, then after a second coach's challenge reversed another out of bounds call this time in favor of the Golden Hurricane, graduate **David Green** missed a jumper and senior **C.J. Jones** was able to corral the rebound as the clock expired.

► Haggerty finished the night with 31 points on 10-of-17 field goals and 11-of-12 free throws to go with a game-high 10 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals in 32 minutes. He is the first Wildcat with a 30-point, 10-rebound performance since **Michael Beasley** registered 33 points and 14 rebounds against Colorado on March 4, 2008. He scored 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half, which is the fifth-most by any Wildcat in a half and the most since 2009.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by McGriff, who narrowly missed his own double-double with 13 points and 9 rebounds, while Castillo and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** added 12 and 10 points, respectively.

► K-State entered averaging 96.7 points on 58.7 percent shooting, including 54.4 percent from 3-point range, but scored its 84 points in a different way with lows in field goal percentage (44.1) and 3-point field goal percentage (20.8).

► The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (25-of-44) inside the 3-point arc with 46 points in the paint to go with 26 fast-break points and a 17-15 edge in second-chance points while out-rebounding the nationally-ranked Hurricane, 40-38. They also converted on their opportunities from the free throw line, hitting on a season-best 90.5 percent (19-of-21).

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored a season-high 37 points to go with a game-high 8 assists and 7 rebounds to lift K-State to the Hall of Fame Classic Championship game with 98-77 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 20 at the T-Mobile Center.

► Haggerty paced three Wildcats with his season-high 37 points, which came on 13-of-21 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-8 free throws. The 37 points are the most scored by a K-State player in 49 games played at the T-Mobile Center, eclipsing the 29 scored by **Makol Mawien** against Kansas in the Big 12 Championship on March 9, 2018.

► The 37 points are the most by a Wildcat since **Barry Brown Jr.** scored 38 against Oklahoma State on Jan. 10, 2018, while he is the first player with back-to-back 30-point games since **Markquis Nowell** posted 36 points vs. Texas and 32 points vs. Baylor on Jan. 3 and 7, 2023.

► In addition, Haggerty is the first Wildcat to record a stat line of 30 or more points, 5 or more rebounds and 5 or more assists since Brown tallied 34 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in a win at Baylor on Jan. 22, 2018.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior **Nate Johnson** and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, who posted 14 and 12 points, respectively. The Wildcats also got 9 points from sophomore **David Castillo**, 8 points from senior **Khamari McGriff** and 7 points from freshman **Andrej Kostic**.

► K-State took the lead for good on a rare 4-point play by Kostic with 9:11 left in the first half then slowly pulled away behind the play of Haggerty, who had 15 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists in the first half. Haggerty's old-fashioned 3-point play extended the lead to 40-32 with 2:07 remaining before consecutive baskets by Castillo and Johnson made it 44-36 at the break.

► The lead grew to double digits early in the second half after a 3-pointer by Johnson, but the Bulldogs closed within 69-62 after 4 consecutive free throws with 9:24 to play. However, four more points from Haggerty and a layup by McGriff extended it back to double figures at the third media timeout. From there, the advantage grew to more than 20 points, including its largest at 91-68 after a 3-pointer by Bashir with 3:13 to play.

► The 98 points broke the school record for points scored at T-Mobile Center, topping the 87 scored in the school's first-ever game in the building against Florida A&M on Dec. 17, 2007.

► K-State was forced into a season-high 19 turnovers leading to 27 Indiana points, as the No. 25/24 Hoosiers remained unbeaten with an 86-69 win over the Wildcats on Nov. 25 before 12,342 fans at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

► The Wildcats (5-2), whose offense entered the game averaging more than 90 points per game, were held to a season-low in both points and field goal percentage (42.1), while the nation's leading scorer – junior **P.J. Haggerty** – finished with a season-low 16 points on 7-of-17 shooting and 6 turnovers. The reigning National Player of the Week saw his school-record streak of games scoring 20 or more points to open the season come to an end at 6 games.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by seniors **C.J. Jones** and **Nate Johnson** who finished the night with 15 and 13 points, respectively. Junior **Elias Rapieque** posted a season-high 9 points to go with 5 rebounds.

► K-State struggled from the opening tip, as Indiana jumped out to a 20-4 lead while holding the Wildcats to a 1-of-11 start from the field and 7 turnovers. A 10-0 run sparked by the play of Johnson, Jones and Rapieque enabled the Wildcats to climb back to within a possession on three different occasions. However, a pair of free throws by the Hoosiers before the final media timeout ignited a 13-3 run to end the half that pushed the lead back out to 12 points.

► Indiana's momentum continued out of the halftime break, as the Hoosiers scored 10 of the first 12 points to go ahead 49-29 and forced a timeout by **Jerome Tang** less than 4 minutes into the second half. Haggerty helped start a 13-4 run that pulled the Wildcats to within 67-57 with 8:51 remaining.

► However, a 3-point play by Conerway on the next possession ended any hopes of a further comeback, as the Hoosiers rattled off 10 of the next 12 points to push back ahead 77-59 with 5:39 to play. The home team extended the lead to as many as 23 points before the Wildcats closed the game with 3-pointers from sophomore **David Castillo** and Jones for the final margin.

► In addition to the 27 points scored off turnovers, Indiana also took advantage of a season-high 25 personal fouls by K-State, converting on 22 of 29 attempts from the free throw line. The Hoosiers shot 47.4 percent (27-of-57) from the field, including 57.7 percent (15-of-26) in the second half.

► The win continued the Hoosiers' mastery of the Wildcats as they have now won 10 straight in the series, including all 5 matchups at famed Assembly Hall.

► Senior **Sam Towns** led all scorers with 27 points, including 17 in a big first-half performance by Bowling Green, as the Falcons earned an 82-66 wire-to-wire win over K-State Dec. 1 before 6,917 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Led by Towns, Bowling Green (6-2) set the tone for the game in the first half, scoring 49 points on 50 percent (19-of-38) shooting, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from 3-point range, in building a 14-point lead at the half. Towns was nearly perfect from the field in the opening half, connecting on 7-of-8 field goal attempts, including all 3 from beyond the arc.

► Despite cooling off from the field in the second half, the Falcons answered every attempt by the Wildcats to cut into the deficit, keeping the lead in double figures for much of the time, including by 18 points with 36 seconds to play. Towns was joined in double figures by seniors **Javontae Campbell** and **Javon Ruffin**, who each scored 17 points.

► K-State (5-3) dropped its third straight game after opening the season 5-0, as the Wildcats were held to season-lows in points (66), field goal percentage (39.3) and free throw percentage (54.5) while hitting on just 26.1 percent (6-of-23) from 3-point range.

► Sophomore **David Castillo**, in his first start of the season, produced a career-high 22 points on 8-of-15 field goals, including 3-of-9 from 3-point range, while junior **P.J. Haggerty** added 17 points on 6-of-19 shooting, including 1-of-4 from beyond the arc, and 4-of-9 from the line.

► The Wildcats turned the ball over a season-low 6 times and surrendered just 3 steals against the Falcons, who lead the NCAA in turnovers forced per game (20.4) and steals per game (13.4).

► The loss snapped a 6-game non-conference winning streak at Bramlage Coliseum, as the Wildcats lost for just the third time in a non-conference home game under head coach **Jerome Tang**.

► Seton Hall showed why it is one of the top defensive teams in the country by forcing Kansas State into season-lows into multiple offensive categories en route to a 78-67 win on Dec. 6 before 9,195 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The Pirates (9-1), who rank in the top-15 in scoring defense, blocks, turnover margin and steals, continued their impressive start to the season by converting 16 Wildcat turnover into 22 points while also holding the potent K-State offense to 67 points on season-lows for field goal percentage (37.1), 3-point field goal percentage (20.0) and free throw percentage (42.9).

► In a game where the Pirates held a slight edge in field goal percentage (38.9 to 37.1) it was the 22-7 advantage in points off turnovers and 20 missed free throws by the Wildcats (5-4) that proved to be too much to overcome despite a season-best crowd of 9,196 fans who were on hand to see the introduction of new head football coach **Collin Klein** at halftime.

► Seton Hall led by as many as 8 points in the early going before 7-foot-2 junior center **Dorin Buca** helped ignite a 10-2 run by K-State that tied it at 22-all, forcing a timeout by coach **Shaheen Holloway** with under 8 minutes to play in the half. The teams went back and forth before a driving layup by senior **Elijah Fisher** sparked an 8-0 run that carried the Pirates to a 35-29 halftime lead.

► The momentum carried into the early moments of the second half, as a dunk by freshman **Najai Hines** started a 9-2 run that extended the lead to 44-31, forcing a timeout by K-State head coach **Jerome Tang** with 17:21 to play. The Wildcats used another 10-2 run to close the deficit to 62-54 with less than 6 minutes to play, but the Pirates responded with 9 straight points to put the game away at 71-54 with just over 4 minutes remaining.

► Graduate transfer **A.J. Staton-McCray** and Fisher paced four Seton Hall players in double figures with a game-high 16 points each, while Hines and junior **Adam Clark** added 11 and 10 points, respectively.

► All five K-State starters scored in double figures for the first time this season led by a team-high 12 points from senior **Khamari McGriff**. Juniors **Abdi Bashir** Jr. and **P.J. Haggerty** and senior **Nate Johnson** all added 11 points while sophomore **David Castillo** had 10 points in his second straight start.

► Buca finished with his best all-around game of the season with 5 points, 7 rebounds, 2 assists and 3 blocked shots in just 17 minutes of action.

► K-State ended its 4-game skid with a thorough domination of Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 8, breaking 100 points for the fourth time under head coach **Jerome Tang** while connecting on 57.6 percent shooting in a 108-49 victory before 6,682 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State (6-4) eclipsed 100 points in a game for the 42nd time, while the 108 points tied for the eighth-most in school history and were the most since the Wildcats scored a school-record 120 points in a win over UAPB more than a year ago. The 59-point margin of victory tied for the fourth-largest and was the largest since a 61-point win over Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 13, 2012.

► In shooting 57.6 percent (38-of-66) from the field, the Wildcats made 63.3 percent (19-of-30) of their 2-point field goals, including a 34-10 advantage in the paint, while collecting the third-most 3-point field goals (19) in school history on 52.8 percent shooting. They also outscored the Delta Devils in points off turnovers (17-4), second-chance points (17-7) and fast-break points (27-11).

► The 19 made 3-pointers are only surpassed by the school-record 23 against Fresno State in 1994 and the 21 vs. UAPB in 2024. Six different players had at least one 3-pointer, including 5 each from juniors **P.J. Haggerty** and **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, and sophomore **David Castillo**.

► All 11 players who saw action had at least one made field goal while four Wildcats scored in double figures led by a game-high 28 points from the nation's leading scorer – Haggerty – who has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Castillo had 19 points off the bench on 6-of-11 field goals, while Bashir and senior **Nate Johnson** added 15 and 14 points, respectively.

► The Wildcats also shared the ball well with the third-most assists (30) in a game on their 38 made field goals, as four players tallied 5 or more assists, including a game-high 6 by Johnson.

► K-State took control less than 2 minutes into the game with 6 straight points before stretching its lead to 20 points (32-12) near the midway point of the first half. The lead was 18 points before a 10-0 run made it 50-18 with less than 2 minutes before halftime. The second half was much of the same as the deficit never fell below 32 points and grew to as many as 61 (108-47) with 1:25 to play.

► MVSU (1-9) shot just 25.8 percent (16-of-62), including 22.2 percent (4-of-18) from 3-point range. Junior **Michael James** led the way with 23 points.

► Sophomore **David Castillo** scored six of his game-high 19 points in the last two minutes to help K-State hold off a furious Creighton rally in an 83-76 win on Dec. 13 before 16,657 fans at CHI Health Center Omaha.

► K-State (7-4) earned its first win in a non-conference road game since a 75-60 victory at LSU on Dec. 9, 2023, snapping a 4-game skid. The Wildcats posted just their third all-time win in 10 visits to Omaha (1969, 1987 and 2025) while running their winning streak over the Bluejays to 4 games.

► Buoyed by a near record-setting 51-point first-half, K-State led by as many as 20 points in the early moments of the second half before Creighton (5-5) slowly chipped away at the deficit, closing to within 73-70 with 2:41 to play. However, Castillo saved his best for clutch time, scoring six of the Wildcats' last 10 points while adding an assist. It marked the fourth straight game in double figures for the sophomore, including the second in a row off the bench with 19 points.

► After Bluejay senior **Josh Dix** missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game with 2:10 remaining, Castillo grabbed the rebound and converted on a driving layup. Following another 3-point miss, Castillo once again drove the lane, feeding senior **Khamari McGriff** on a lob dunk to put the Wildcats ahead 77-70 with 1:21 left. Castillo then knocked down a pair of free throws for a 79-73 lead before finishing things off with a breakaway dunk with 18 seconds.

► Castillo was one of four Wildcats to score in double figures, collecting his 19 points on 7-of-11 field goals, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range, while making all 3 free throws. Omaha native junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** put on a show for the hometown crowd with 18 points on 6 made 3-pointers, including 15 points in the first half when he eclipsed 1,000 career points. Senior **Khamari McGriff** and junior **P.J. Haggerty** added 12 and 10 points, respectively, while senior **Nate Johnson** had game-highs in both assists (6) and steals (4) go with 8 points.

► K-State led by as many as 18 points in the first half, including 51-33 at the break, as the Wildcats connected on 59.4 percent (19-of-32) from the field, including 64.7 percent (11-of-17) from 3-point range.

► The Wildcats, which shot a season-low 27.8 percent (10-of-36) in the second half, finished at 42.6 percent (29-of-68) for the game, including 42.9 percent (12-of-28) from 3-point range. The team also made 13 of 15 attempts (86.7 percent) from the free throw line and turned the ball over just 7 times.

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored 23 of his team-high 24 points in the second half, as K-State wrapped up non-conference play with a 94-85 win over a pesky ULM squad on Dec. 28 before 8,163 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The victory extended the team's winning streak to 4 games, as they finished non-conference play with a 9-4 record, which is the third-best mark in the last 7 seasons and the best since the 2023-24 squad opened at 10-3. K-State is now 197-66 in non-conference play since 2006-07, including 137-16 at home.

► Haggerty, who collected his ninth game of 20 or more points this season, bounced back from his worst first half of the season to score his 23 second-half points on 7-of-10 field goals and 9-of-9 free throws. None of his 23 second-half points proved more critical than a pair of 3-point plays after the Warhawks (3-11) had whittled the lead from a game-high 20 points (69-49) with 13:18 to play to just 4 points (75-71) with just over 6 minutes remaining.

► With momentum shifting to ULM after a 6-0 run cut the deficit to 75-71 at the 6:04 mark, Haggerty converted on the first of his 3-point plays out of a K-State timeout. He then added a second one following a Warhawks' 3-pointer that gave the Wildcats an 83-74 lead with 4:51 remaining.

► After yet another rally closed the deficit to 87-83 with just over 3 minutes to play, Haggerty came through with a big defensive rebound before assisting on a fast-break layup by sophomore **David Castillo** that pushed the lead to 92-83 with 2:24 left. He then scored the game's final points on a layup with 1:10 remaining that put the Wildcats ahead 94-85.

► Haggerty finished the day 7-of-16 from the field and 10-of-11 from the free throw line to go with a team-best 8 rebounds and 3 assists in 29 minutes. He has now scored in double figures in all 13 games while leading in scoring 10 times.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by senior **Nate Johnson** (14 points) and junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** (11 points). Two other Wildcats had 9 points (junior **Elias Rapique** and Castillo), while senior **Khamari McGriff** and junior **Taj Manning** added 8 points each. Manning also had a career-high 7 rebounds.

► Despite shooting a lackluster 28.6 percent (10-of-35) from 3-point range, K-State still managed to score 90 or more points for the seventh time in 13 games. The Wildcats converted on 65.7 percent (23-of-35) of their shots inside the 3-point line, including a 44-32 advantage in the paint.

► K-State made a furious rally to close a 9-point deficit to one with 5 seconds left, but senior **Moe Odum** calmly sank 2 free throws on the ensuing possession to help Arizona State hold on for an 87-84 win at Desert Financial Arena.

► K-State had one last chance with 4.3 seconds left, but junior **P.J. Haggerty's** desperation 3-point attempt fell short as the buzzer sounded. The guard led all scorers with 25 points, as he registered his 11th game of 20 or more points. He was joined in double figures by **Abdi Bashir Jr.**, who added 22 points.

► The near comeback came on the heels of a key 10-0 run midway through the second half that provided Arizona State (10-6, 1-2 Big 12) the difference in a back-and-forth game that included 9 lead changes and 9 ties. The Sun Devils, who played just 7 players due to injury, saw all 5 starters score in double figures, including 21 by Odum and 7-foot-1 freshman **Massamba Diop**. Sophomore **Santiago Trouet** had a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

► The pivotal 10-0 run came after K-State took a 64-58 lead with 10:32 to play on a sixth 3-pointer from Bashir. The front court trio of Trouet, Diop and graduate **Allen Muueba** combined for all 10 points to help ASU go ahead 68-64 with 7:13 remaining. From there, the Sun Devils continued their momentum, scoring 8 of the next 11 points to take their largest lead at 76-67 and force a timeout by head coach **Jerome Tang** with 4:21 to play.

► The Wildcats didn't go away quietly though, as a 3-pointer from Haggerty sparked a 17-9 run that closed the gap to 85-84 with 5 seconds. Haggerty was responsible for 9 of the 17 points, including a circus 3-pointer that made it 85-84, while Bashir and senior **Khamari McGriff** each had 4 points. The Sun Devils assisted the rally by making just 5-of-10 free throw attempts during this stretch.

► A key stat in the game came in the paint, where ASU outscored K-State, 50-28, that came alongside a 48-34 rebounding advantage that included a combined 34 boards from the quartet of Trouet (10), Diop (9), Muueba (8) and sophomore guard **Noah Meeusen** (7). The Sun Devils converted 18 offensive rebounds into a 24-20 narrow edge in second-chance points. In addition, ASU scored 24 points at the free throw line, taking advantage of 27 fouls on K-State.

► The Wildcats were able to stay competitive in the game with 13 made 3-pointers, including 6 from Bashir and 3 from Haggerty. It marked the ninth time this season that the team has registered double-digit 3-point field goals.

► K-State battled back from a 16-point deficit to close to within one possession numerous times in the second half, but UCF had an answer to every rally en route to posting an 82-73 win on Jan. 14 at Bramlage Coliseum.

► After trailing as many as 16 points in the first half, including 12 at the half, K-State showed some desperation out of break, closing to 57-56 at the 11:18 mark after a layup from junior **P.J. Haggerty**, who scored 18 of his game-high 23 points in the second half.

► UCF (14-2, 3-1 Big 12) responded with consecutive 3-pointers from graduate **Themus Fulks** and junior **Jordan Burks** to push back ahead 63-56 near the midway point. After consecutive layups from junior **Taj Manning** got K-State to within 63-60, senior **Riley Kugel** connected on a 3-point play to once again put some distance between the teams with 8:50 remaining.

► Haggerty split a pair of free throws to close the deficit to 68-65, but a tip-in from junior **Chris Johnson** and a layup from Kugel put the Knights up 72-65, forcing a timeout from **Jerome Tang** with 5:14 to play. Another 3-point play from Haggerty gave the Wildcats one last opportunity at 72-68, but Johnson came through with a big 3-pointer to again answer the rally. From there, they got no closer than 5 points, as the Knights salted it away at the free throw line.

► UCF connected on 52.5 percent (32-of-61) of its field goals, including better than 50 percent in each half, while hitting on 46.7 percent (7-of-15) from beyond the arc. Four players scored in double figures, including 19 from Kugel, 18 from senior **Jamichael Stillwell** and a points/assist double-double from Fulks with 13 points and a game-high 12 assists.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by 15 points from senior **Khamari McGriff**, 12 points from junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and a new career-high 10 points from junior **Taj Manning**. Senior **Nate Johnson** tied a career-high with 10 assists to go with 7 points, 6 rebounds and 3 steals.

► K-State rebounded to shoot 54.5 percent (18-of-33) from the field in the second half after making just 34.4 percent (11-of-32) in the first half. For the game, the Wildcats hit on 44.6 percent (29-of-65), including just 20 percent (6-of-30) from 3-point range.

► The win was the first in 3 tries for UCF at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Sophomore **Vytorius Miller** connected on all 3 free throws after being fouled with 2.8 seconds left, as Oklahoma State came from behind to post an 84-83 win in a back-and-forth affair on Jan. 17 at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

► In a game that included 13 lead changes and 11 ties, K-State (9-9, 0-5 Big 12) took an 83-81 lead with 49 seconds remaining on junior **P.J. Haggerty's** jumper. On the ensuing possession, junior guard **Kanye Clary** twice missed from 3-point range with Oklahoma State (14-4, 2-3 Big 12) each time getting the offensive rebound, including on a jump ball with 4 seconds left.

► Miller received the inbounds pass in the corner and was fouled by junior **Abdi Bashir Jr.** as he attempted to swap down at the ball, resulting in 3 free throws. After Miller's 3 free throws gave the Cowboys an 84-83 lead, the Wildcats still had an opportunity to win. The inbounds pass was caught by **Taj Manning** at midcourt, where he called K-State's last timeout with 2.1 seconds. However, Haggerty's 3-point attempt fell short as the buzzer sounded.

► Haggerty paced four Wildcats in double figures with 21 points on 8-of-17 shooting, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with 8 rebounds, 3 assists and a steal while playing all 40 minutes. He has now scored 20 or more points 13 times with double figures in all 18 games. He is the first Wildcat to open with 18 consecutive games in double figures since **Jacob Pullen** in 2009-10.

► OSU led 48-43 after ending the first half on a 7-2 run then continued that momentum with 8 of the first 11 points out of halftime to take a double-digit lead at 56-46 and force a timeout at the 17:15 mark. From there, K-State scored 15 of the next 20 points to register the first of 7 ties in the second half at 61-61.

► The Wildcats went ahead 67-64 near the midway point before the teams battled through ties of 67-all, 69-all and 71-all. After a McGriff dunk gave the visitor a 73-72 lead, the home team responded with 5 straight points to go back ahead 77-73 with 5:12 remaining. However, the Wildcats didn't go away, as 3-pointers from senior **C.J. Jones** and Haggerty plus a dunk by Johnson made it 81-79 at the final media timeout with 92 seconds left. The Cowboys tied it at 81-all on a Clary jumper with 1:15 to play before the final sequence.

► OSU shot just 41.2 percent (28-of-68) from the field with 5 less field goals and 7 fewer 3-point field goals but made up for it by scoring 26 points off 16 K-State turnovers while converting on 20-of-24 attempts (83.3 percent) from the free throw line. The Cowboys had just 7 turnovers.

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored 28 of his game-high 34 points in the second half in helping a short-handed Kansas State to an 81-78 win over Utah before 8,061 fans at Bramlage Coliseum to end a 5-game losing streak to open Big 12 play.

► The 28 points tied for the third-most points in a half, including the most since **Denis Clemente** went for 32 points in the second half at Texas on Jan. 31, 2009.

► K-State (10-9, 1-5 Big 12) had just 10 available players due to injuries, as the Wildcats had to play without regulars **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and **Khamari McGriff**, who had started the previous 18 games. This forced head coach **Jerome Tang** to insert juniors **Dorin Buca** and **David Castillo** into the lineup, alongside Haggerty, senior **Nate Johnson** and junior **Taj Manning**, who made his third straight start in place of the injured **Elias Rapieque**.

► Despite this adversity, the Wildcats found a way to pick up their first Big 12 win as Haggerty came through with a big jumper shot with a score tied at 77-77 before Johnson iced the game with a pair of free throws with 6.7 seconds left. The Utes (9-10, 1-5 Big 12) had one last chance, but junior **Terrence Brown**'s 3-point attempt fell short with 2 seconds remaining.

► Haggerty's 34 points were the 10th-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game and the most since **Markquis Nowell** went for 36 at Texas on Jan. 3, 2023. He hit on 15-of-29 field goals, including 1-of-4 from 3-point range, and 3-of-6 free throws to go with a game-high 8 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals in 39 minutes.

► Haggerty was joined in double figures by Castillo, who posted his second career 20-point games and first in Big 12 play with 20 points, and Johnson, who added 17 points on 5-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with a game-high 6 assists and 5 rebounds. Castillo hit a career-high 6 3-pointers, which tied for the 10th-most by a Wildcat in a Big 12 game.

► The Utes were led by Brown, who nearly equaled Haggerty with a team-high 33 points on 14-of-24 shooting, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range. Brown was joined in double figures by junior **Seydou Traore** and graduate **Don McHenry**, who had 15 points each.

► Both teams shot nearly 50 percent with K-State hitting on exactly 50 percent (31-of-62) for the second consecutive game, including 52.2 percent (12-of-23) from 3-point range. Utah shot 49.2 percent (32-of-65), including 34.8 percent (8-of-23) from long range.

► No. 19/19 Kansas broke open a tight contest with a decisive 8-0 run to snap a 3-game losing streak at Bramlage Coliseum and earn an 86-62 win in the 304th Dillons Sunflower Showdown on Jan. 24.

► Kansas (15-5, 5-2 Big 12) saw 5 players post double-digits led by sophomore **Flory Bidunga**'s 21-point, 10-rebound double-double while senior **Melvin Council Jr.** added his own double-double with 17 points and 12 assists.

► K-State (10-10, 1-6 Big 12) played its second consecutive game with just 10 available players due to injuries, as starters **Abdi Bashir Jr.** and **Khamari McGriff** each missed their second straight game. A third regular starter – **Elias Rapieque** – missed his fourth game in a row.

► The potent Wildcat offense, which entered averaging 85.3 points on 47.3 percent shooting, was held to its lowest output of the season with just 62 points on 34.4 percent (21-of-61) shooting with season-lows for both field goals made (21) and points in the paint (18).

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** scored a game-high 23 points, doing most of his damage at the free throw line, where he was 10-of-12, to go with 5 rebounds and 4 assists in nearly 39 minutes. He has now scored in double figures in all 20 games this season with 15 20-point scoring efforts.

► Freshman **Andrej Kostic** posted his first double-digit scoring game with 12 points, going 4-of-7 from 3-point range.

► The Wildcats trailed just 59-55 after a 3-pointer by Haggerty just before the third media timeout with 7:26 to play. However, a Bidunga free throw sparked a run of eight straight points that pushed the lead to 67-55, prompting a timeout by head coach **Jerome Tang** with 5:37 to play.

► A Haggerty free throw broke the run out of the timeout, but the Jayhawks continued their push with 7 of the next 9 points to go ahead 74-58 at the final media timeout with 3:41 to play. From there, the lead ballooned to as many as 24 points in the eventual 86-62 loss.

► The first half was a back-and-forth affair with Kansas leading by as many as 7 points before K-State closed to with 37-35 at the halftime break. The Wildcats had a chance to take the lead just before halftime but senior **C.J. Jones'** 3-pointer just rimmed out at the buzzer.

► No. 8/9 Iowa State showed why it's one of the top teams in the nation on Feb. 1, as the Cyclones shot 55 percent from the field with five players in double figures en route to a 95-61 win over K-State at Bramlage Coliseum.

► Iowa State (20-2, 7-2 Big 12) continued its best start in school history, as the Cyclones earned their fourth straight win, which includes three wins of 30 or more points, since consecutive road losses at Kansas and Cincinnati.

► Senior **Joshua Jefferson** paced the Cyclones with 19 points on 7-of-13 shooting to go with 8 rebounds and 5 assists, while fellow senior **Tamin Lipsey** chipped in 16 points on 6-of-9 field goals to go with a game-high 9 assists and 4 steals. The nation's best 3-point shooter – junior **Milan Momcilovic** – knocked down 5 triples to go with 18 points. Freshman **Killyan Toure** and redshirt senior **Nate Heise** added 13 and 11 points, respectively.

► Junior **P.J. Haggerty** led a shorthanded K-State team with a game-high 23 points, including 17 in the second half. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **David Castillo** with 11 points. Senior **Nate Johnson** had team-highs for assists (5) and steals (3) to go with his 8 points.

► The Wildcats played without 3 starters for the fourth straight game.

► Iowa State used a 22-4 run midway through the first half to take early control at 24-8. The Cyclones followed with another 13-0 run to go ahead by 24 points (37-13) at the 6:29 mark before they scored 12 of the next 14 points to take a 49-17 lead with 2:20 before halftime.

► Down 29 points at the break, the Wildcats got to within 54-31 at the 16:30 mark of the second half before the Cyclones answered back with an 11-2 spurt to go back ahead by 32 points (65-33). The lead ballooned from there, extending to as many as 39 points (90-51) with 3:32 remaining.

► Iowa State was impressive on both ends of the court, connecting on 55 percent (33-of-60) from the field with assists on 28 of their 33 made field goals. The Cyclones made 14 3-pointers on 51.9 percent shooting, while making 75 percent (15-of-20) of their free throw attempts.

► Defensively, they held the Wildcats to just 40.3 percent (25-of-62) shooting, including 30.4 percent (7-of-23) from 3-point range, while scoring 21 points off 14 turnovers.

► Junior **Xavier Edmonds** scored 6 of the game's last 7 points, including the game-winning free throws with 6.7 seconds left, as TCU rallied from an 18-point first-half deficit to hand K-State an 84-82 loss on Jan. 7 at Schollmaier Arena.

► K-State led 82-77 after a dunk by senior **Khamari McGriff** with 1:29 to play, but the Wildcats didn't score again as they turned the ball over on each of their last 3 possessions while the Horned Frogs ended the game on a 7-0 run.

► Edmonds paced TCU with 26 points on 9-of-10 field goals and a game-high 10 rebounds in 30 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **David Punch** (14 points) and senior **Jayden Pierre** (10 points).

► It marked the second consecutive matchup between the teams in Fort Worth that ended with TCU on a game-winning run as the Horned Frogs scored the last 6 points in a 63-62 win on Jan. 4, 2025. They have now won 6 of the last 8 meetings in the series, including 4 in a row.

► The loss particularly stung as the short-handed Wildcats led for more than 39 minutes and 30 seconds in the game, including 42-24 with 5:31 to play in the first half and by double figures 3 times in the second half, including 78-68 with 5:26 remaining. The 18-point lead represents the third-largest blown in school history and the largest since a loss to Western Carolina on Dec. 19, 2001.

► K-State now has 5 losses by 5 points or less, including 4 in Big 12 play.

► The Wildcats shot better than 50 percent from the field for the ninth time this season, as they connected on 52.4 percent (33-of-63) from the field, including 11 made 3-pointers, while getting a game-high 30-point performance from junior **P.J. Haggerty** and a season-high 15 points from senior reserve **Marcus Johnson**, who made 5-of-6 attempts from 3-point range.

► Haggerty, who has now scored in double figures in all 23 games, recorded his 17th game of 20 or more points and his fourth 30-point game of the season. The 43-point game this season ties for the fifth-most in a single season and the most since **Michael Beasley** had 13 in 2007-08.

► Senior **Nate Johnson** added his second career double-double and first this season with 13 points and a career-high 11 assists to go with a career-best 6 steals in 37 minutes. Sophomore **David Castillo** gave the Wildcats a fourth double-digit scorer with 11 points.
