ABOUT TODAY'S MATCH

The Kennesaw State women's soccer team is looking to start a season with three straight wins for the first time in its Division I history on Friday when they take on the Richmond Spiders at 5:30 p.m. in their first of two matches at the First Tennessee Lady Vol Classic.

This weekend's tournament will also mark the first time the Owls will be playing in back-to-back matches away from home this season with Richmond on Friday and No. 14 Maryland on Sunday. This will be the first time the Black and Gold will play Richmond or Maryland in their program's history.

Kennesaw State comes into this contest with a record of 2-0 with its main formula for success thus far being a balanced offensive attack. The Owls have had seven players score at least one goal in the first two games with Preseason All-Atlantic Sun member Kristin Marietta leading the way with two goals and one assist.

The Spiders were picked to finish in fifth place in the Atlantic 10 Conference Preseason Poll. They finished last season with an overall record of 8-10-2 under long-time head coach Peter Albright, who entered his 15th year at the helm of the program this fall. Richmond has ten starters returning from last year's squad, including its leading scorer from 2009 in sophomore forward Shondel Archer.



OWLS LATELY

Early Season Accolades: Alyssa Mahan and Staci Pugh both received conference accolades on Monday, as they earned the first women's soccer season's Atlantic Sun Conference Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week awards. Mahan finished the week with two goals and one assist, while Pugh made 10 saves with a 2.00 goals against average.

Owls Open up New Stadium In Style: Kennesaw State women's soccer made their regular season debut at their new home, KSU Soccer Stadium, with an impressive, 6-0 victory over Alabama A&M. The win saw five Owls score goals, while goalkeepers Staci Pugh and Melissa Hutto split time in the net to preserve the shutout.

OWLS ADD REBECCA NOLIN TO STAFF

KENNESAW, Ga. – Kennesaw State Owls women's soccer coach Rob King has announced the addition of former Owl and current Atlanta Beat player Rebecca Nolin to the coaching staff. Nolin, formerly Rebecca Hall, played for the Owls from 2003-2006.

"I am extremely excited to add Rebecca to our staff. She is an important part of our history, as she was a captain for our squad during her playing days and was a big part of our 2003 Division II National Championship run," said King, the only coach in the program's history. "With local club soccer experience, her main focus will be our in-state recruiting and team conditioning. Becks is a proven winner at every level she has played at and in the classroom, as well. She's a super role model for any student athlete who wants to reach their athletic and academic potential and is a fantastic addition to our soccer program."

Over her four seasons with the Black and Gold, Nolin scored a total of 16 goals, including four game winners, and had 11 assists. She excelled at both the Division I and II levels, as she received NCAA Division II All-Southeast Region and First Team All-Peach Belt honors in 2003 during her freshman campaign and All-Atlantic Sun Conference First Team Honors during her senior year in 2006.

Nolin spent 2007-2009 with the Atlanta Silverbacks of the United Soccer League before joining the Beat for their inaugural season. She made history on May 29 when she scored the first goal in the club's history.

"This is an extremely exciting opportunity for me, to be on Coach King's staff after having played for him, and to do it with the same program that I played for," said Nolin. "It's also unique that I'll be able to coach at the same stadium that I'm currently playing in. I can't wait to get started and help this team continue to reach new heights."



WHO WOULD'VE GUESSED? The Kennesaw State women's soccer team finished last season with a 2.00 goals per game average which ranked 33rd in the nation. KSU made the switch to Division-I in 2005, and in every season since then the Owls have been ranked in the top-35 in the nation for scoring offense.



HEAD COACH ROB KING

9TH YEAR

RECORD AT KENNESAW STATE: 120-26-10 (39-8-3 A-SUN)

The Owls' Rob King is heading into his ninth year and eighth season of play as the only head coach in program history and his list of accomplishments never ceases to impress the soccer community.

Leading his club to an eighth consecutive season of double digit wins, the Owls posted an 11-7-0 season record and a 7-3 conference mark to earn their third regular season Atlantic Sun Conference title in five years of league membership. They would then take down Jacksonville and Belmont, both in thrilling fashion, while serving as hosts of the A-Sun Tournament, to win their second tournament title and allow them to make their second trip to the NCAA Division I Women's College Cup.

King continued the habit of having his team's success carry-over into his player's trophy cases in 2009, as his team took home a total of 12 conference regular season and tournament honors, including Bridget Gaughan, who was named the A-Sun's Defensive Player of the Year and to the All A-Sun First Team, and Goalkeeper Staci Pugh, who was named the A-Sun Tournament's Most Valuable Player.

Immediately upon his arrival in Kennesaw in 2001 following a successful six-year stint at the University of Montevallo (Ala.), King built the Owls' program from scratch and immediately instilled a culture of winning and the expectation of doing so year-in and year out. After spending the 2001-2002 academic year recruiting and filling out his coaching staff, his troops took to the field for the first in the fall of 2002, putting together an undefeated season in the program's first year of existence en-route to snagging the Peach Belt Conference regular season title and the NCAA Division II Southeast Region title.

Already one of the feared teams in the south after just one season, King took the final step towards national prominence just one year later, guiding his club to a 25-1-0 record and a stunning run through the NCAA Division II College Cup, including a 2-0 victory in the championship game against Division II titan Franklin Pierce, who had won five of the last nine national titles.

With all of his success, King readily greeted the Owls move to Division I by volunteering his program's move to the highest level of collegiate competition. Never shying away from a challenge, he quickly tested himself against top-notch Division I opponents, scheduling meetings with Atlantic Coast Conference power Duke and NCAA perennial powerhouse, North Carolina. A pair of near-upsets ensued, earning King the respect and admiration of many of his peers in the upper echelon of collegiate soccer.

Following back-to-back regular season conference titles in 2006 and 2007, King once again delivered a first to the Kennesaw State community when he led the Owls on their championship run in the 2007 A-Sun Tournament, earning the athletic department's first-ever bid to an NCAA Division I championship, where they went on to face national power Florida State.

King's team accomplishments have been staggering, but so have been his player's. Entering 2010, his club has garnered a total of 59 All-Atlantic Sun Conference awards in just five years as a conference member, including two conference Player of the Year winners (Annie Phillips- 2007, Laura Tucker-2006), four Defensive Player of the Year Winners (Bridget Gaughn-2009, Rebecca Hall-2006, Katrina Hirsch and Jessica Marek-2005) and two A-Sun Tournament MVPs (Staci Pugh-2009, Caitlin Dingle-2007). The Owls' short time in the Peach Belt Conference was no different, as their two years of play in the Division II conference yielded 11 All-Conference awards, including Jenae Gzehoviak's Player of the Year triumph in 2003.

Overall, King has recorded a 120-26-10 record with the Owls over eight seasons, good for a winning percentage of .801. The record includes an extremely impressive 39-8-3 mark in A-Sun play, by far the best record in conference play since 2005.

As a coach, King has won a plethora of honors. He was named both NCAA Division II National Coach-of-the-Year and Regional Coach-of-the-Year in 2003 after leading the Owls on their national championship run. In 2002, he was honored as the Peach Belt and Regional Coach-of-the-Year in his squad's first year of play.

King began his American soccer career as a three-year letter-winner for the University of Alabama-Huntsville Chargers. After receiving a bachelor's degree in psychology from UAH, he joined their staff as an assistant coach, a capacity in which he served from 1990-1992.

In May of 1992, Martin Methodist College in Pulaski, Tennessee offered King his first head-coaching job. His inaugural team went 14-2-1 and won the National Junior College Athletic Association Region VII championship. The following year, King's team went 17-1-0 and won the National Small College Athletic Association title.

In 1995, he was asked to take over the men's and women's soccer program at the University of Montevallo. In the six seasons at the helm of the women's team, King led the Falcons to post season play during four of those seasons and finished with a conference winning percentage of .500 or better during all five seasons of Gulf South Conference play. In 1998, he was named the GSC Coach-of-the-Year after leading his squad to a 10-5-2 record and an appearance in the GSC championship game. His stint as the men's coach included a 15-10-2 conference record, a co-Coach of the Year honor and a GSC Tournament title in 1999.

In addition to his work at the collegiate level, King has established himself as a fixture in the Cobb County soccer scene, conducting youth clinics and helping to coach youth teams in the local community.

Coach King and his wife, Valerie, have two children, Chloe and Rory. The Kings currently reside in Dallas, Ga.

OWLS CONTINUE TO BE THE CLASS OF THE A-SUN:

Ever since Kennesaw State joined the Atlantic Sun Conference in 2005 it has been one of the most consistent and dominant programs in the league. The Owls have accumulated 39 conference wins in that time span, which is an average of just below eight league victories per season. The 39 wins are the most conference victories by any team since 2005, with in-state rival Mercer coming in second with 29 A-Sun wins. Kennesaw State has also flexed its muscles outside the conference, as well, recording 65 total victories in its past five seasons, the most in the conference, with Stetson and Belmont coming in second in that category with 47 wins apiece.

MARIETTA RECEIVES SEVERAL PRESEASON HONORS:

Junior forward Kristin Marietta was recognized by both the Atlantic Sun Conference and respected soccer website topdrawersoccer.com in their preseason coverage. She was named to the Preseason All A-Sun team after a vote by the coaches in the 11-team league. The Douglasville, Ga., native was also picked as the 13th-ranked player in the A-Sun by topdrawersoccer.com.

Marietta had a solid 2009 season for the Owls, earning A-Sun Second Team All-Conference honors after putting together her best season with the Owls. She finished the season in a tie for third on the team with 11 points on the strength of four goals and three assists. She recorded her first two-goal match of her career as well last season in a 7-0 win against Lipscomb on Oct. 9. Kennesaw State is no stranger to having players named to the Preseason All-Conference Team, as Marietta is the 10th member of the Owls to receive the honor in the last four years.

OWLS OPEN UP HISTORIC NEW STADIUM:

When the Owls played their first exhibition match of the 2010 season on Aug. 14, they officially were able to call the brand-new, 8,300 seat KSU Soccer Stadium, home. The \$16.5 million facility, which sits on the Kennesaw State campus, also serves as the home of the Atlanta Beat of Women's Professional Soccer. Complete with state-of-the-art locker-rooms, offices, training facilities and luxury suites, KSU Soccer Stadium is the largest women's-only soccer facility in the NCAA. The stadium also features a stage area behind the North goal, making it a perfect venue for concerts and other live events. Also constructed next to the stadium is a brand-new practice field for the Owls. 2010 will mark the first season in the program's history that their home games will be played away from KSU Soccer Complex, where they sported a 71-7-2 record over eight seasons.

OWLS TIDBITS

- The Kennesaw State women's soccer team is currently ranked 53rd in the nation in the latest poll on TopDrawerSoccer.com, moving up seven spots from last week's rankings.
- The Owls kept the ball on the attacking half of the field during Tuesday night's, 1-0, exhibition win over the George College and State University Bobcats. Rob King's squad consistently put their opposition on the defensive, as demonstrated by their 10-3 advantage in corner kicks during the match.
- The Owls would do very well to carry-over their favorable shot disparity from the exhibition season into regular season play. In their two exhibition matches, the Black and Gold took 31 shots while allowing just 11.
- The Black and Gold showed that they weren't afraid to share last season, as they led the A-Sun in assists for the fifth year in a row, finishing with 45 helpers in just 18 matches. Brittany Vining was third in the conference in assists last season as she was on the helping end of seven Owls goals.
