SCOUTING POINT

- Point is currently 5-1 on the season, including a 2-0 mark in The Sun Conference. The Skyhawks compete in the NAIA.
- Head coach Mike McCarty is in his 1st season at Point after spending the previous six years at West Alabama where he coached the running backs, tight ends, linebackers and special teams.
- The Skyhawks are averaging 438.5 yards a game (188.2 rushing; 250.6 passing)
- Senior QB Charles Fortis leads the offense, completing 90 of 145 passes for 1,187 yards and 15 touchdowns while playing in all five games. He was named The Sun Conference's Offensive Player of the Week after connecting on 18 of 27 passes for 273 and three touchdowns and rushing for 13 yards and a score in a 48-21 victory over Warner last week.
- The Skyhawks are averaging 42.2 points a contest and have scored 36 or more points in four of their five games.
- Points defense is surrendering 33.6 points a game and 445.2 yards a game, including 252.0 yards on the ground.

DAYTON REVIEW

- After jumping out to a 13-0 advantage and a 27-20 halftime lead, the Owls were held scoreless in the second half and fell 31-27.
- DB Marcus Thurman thwarted Dayton's opening drive with first career interception in the end zone
- RB Chaston Bennett ran 80 yards for a TD on Owls' first offensive play from scrimmage
- Bennett rushed for a season-high 155 yards
- QB Trey White carried ball 25 times for 128 yards rushing
- White and Bennett became first KSU tandem to rush for 100 yards in same game
- LB Kyron Minter had his first career interception
- S Taylor Henkle tallied season-high 10 tackles

DEBUT PROGRAMS IN 2015: Kennesaw State is one of four institutions who have debuted football in 2015. Along with the Owls, East Tennessee State (FCS), Finlandia University (Division III), located in Hancock, Mich. and Lyon College (NAIA) in Batesville, Ark. started football programs this fall.

The Owls are off to a 3-1 start. East Tennessee State is currently 0-5, while Finlandia is 1-4 and Lyon College is 0-5.

Team Notes

- The 56 points scored by the Owls in their opener at East Tennessee State are the most scored by a debuting Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) program dating back to 2008, and the 40-point margin of victory is the second largest during that time.
- Kennesaw State is the sixth different program to win its first game as a member of the Big South Conference
- KSU is the only FCS program since 2008 to score 50-plus points in each of its first two games
- Kennesaw State is one of just three FCS programs since 2008 to begin its history 3-0, joining Mercer (4-0; 2013) and Old Dominion (3-0; 2009)
- The Owls are the first time in Big South Conference history to begin a season 3-0 in their first year in the conference

National Team Rankings

- The Kennesaw State offense ranks first in the FCS in yards per pass completions (24.88) and is fourth in rushing offense, averaging 324 yards a game. The Owls are also one of two teams (Harvard) in the country to now allow a sack.
- \bullet KSU is tied for 10th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 39.8 points a game
- The Kennesaw State defense ranks No. 3 in passing yards allowed (130.5) and No. 5 in total defense (273.5).

National Individual Rankings

- Wide receiver Justin Sumpter is first in the nation in yards per reception (34.0)
- Defensive back Derrick Farrow ranks third in the country with three forced fumbles

Miscellaneous Notes

- Quick Strike Offense: The Owls have scored on the first drive in each of their first four games, scoring three touchdowns and making a field goal.
- For the second time in three weeks, KSU scored on its first offensive play as Chsaton Bennett ran 80 yards for a touchdown on the Owls' opening play from scrimmage at Dayton (Sept. 26). QB Trey White and WR Justin Sumpter hooked up on 55-yard scoring play versus Edward Waters.
- Kennesaw State has scored a defensive or special teams touchdown in three of its first four games and has forced at least one turnover in all four games.
- The Owls have rushed for more than 300 yards in three of four games and have totaled at least 230 yards in all four games
- KSU's defense has twice recorded two interceptions in a game (at ETSU and at Dayton) and has at least one pick in all four games. The defense has also twice recorded four sacks in a game (Shorter, at Dayton) and has one sack in all four games.
- Six different players (Trey White, Jae Bowen, Chaston Bennett, Trey Chivers, Darnell Holland and Jake McKenzie) have scored rushing touchdowns.
- The Owls have three rushing scores of 46 or more yards
- Wide receiver Justin Sumpter has pass receptions of 69, 55 and 46 yards.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: Kennesaw State has wasted little time introducing itself to its opponents. The Owls have outscored their opponent 61-10 in the first quarter through their first four games. KSU scored a season-high 35 points in the first 15 minutes versus Edward Waters. Meanwhile, Kennesaw State has allowed just one first-quarter touchdown (at Dayton) and twice held an opponent (Edward Waters, Shorter) scoreless in the first quarter.

WINNING RETURNS: Through its first four games, Kennesaw State has four touchdown returns by its defense and special teams. When redshirt freshman linebacker Dez Billingslea returned a fumble 65 yards for a touchdown on the final play of the game against Shorter (Sept. 19), it was the third of the season for the Owls and tied a Big South Conference single-season record.

JUST FOR KICKS: Freshman placekicker Justin Thompson tied a Big South Conference single-game record with four (42, 26, 40, 28) made field goals versus Shorter on Saturday (Sept. 12), including the game-winner with under two minutes remaining. His 12 points gave him 30 for the season that tie him for fifth nationally.

BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE HONORS: Kennesaw State junior defensive back Derrick Farrow became the first Owl to earn a Big South Conference honor when was named the conference's Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 14 following an impressive performance versus Edward Waters on Sept. 12. Farrow was a disruptive and dominating force during the Owls' 58-7 victory as he recorded a team-high five tackles and three forced fumbles, including one that led directly to a touchdown and one that prevented a score.

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS: The Owl's 56-16 win over East Tennessee State on Sept. 3 marked a night of firsts in the history of the Kennesaw State football program. Here is a list of a few of the firsts:

- First Offensive Play: Trey White 4-yard rush
- First Touchdown: Trey White 6-yard run (1st quarter)
- First Passing Touchdown: White 69 yards to Justin Sumpter (3rd quarter)
- First Defensive Tackle: Taylor Henkle (1st quarter)
- First Defensive Touchdown: Nick Perrotta 19-yard INT return (2nd quarter)

OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- Kennesaw State's 417 yards of offense versus Shorter marked the third straight game of totaling more than 375 yards of offense.
- The Owls were held without a touchdown in the first half for the first

time this season versus Shorter. Justin Thompson made two field goals to account for all six KSU points.

INDIVIDUAL OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- RBs Jae Bowen (2-41) and Chaston Bennett (1-14) had their first career receptions versus Shorter (Sept. 19).
- Justin Thompson's 42-yard field on the opening drive versus Shorter (Sept. 19) marked the third straight game the Owls have scored on their first possession of the game. Thompson also tied a single-game Big South Conference record with four made field goals (42,26,40,28).
- Justin Sumpter's 114 yards receiving on four catches in the first half versus Shorter (Sept. 19) represented the first 100-yard receiving day for a KSU receiver. He finished the game with 5 catches for 121 yards.
- Micah Reed rushed 26 times for 100 yards versus Shorter (Sept. 19) to become the first KSU player to gain 100 yards rushing.
- Quarterback Trey White established season-highs for pass completions (9), attempts (16) and yards (186) versus Shorter (Sept. 19).

INAUGURAL GAME OFFENSIVE NOTES:

- Kennesaw State had five touchdown drives of 50 or more yards, including four of 65 yards or more
- The 56 points are the most scored by a debuting FCS program dating back to 2008, and the 40-point win is the second largest during that same time period. KSU is one of just two teams to open against another FCS program among 10 institutions that have started a program. Charlotte, which debuted as an FCS program and has since moved to the FBS level, defeated Campbell, 52-7, in 2013.
- The 56 points by the Owls tied for the fifth most scored in FCS play during the opening weekend and led Big South Conference teams
- The 512 total yards gained led Big South Conference teams and KSU's 416 yards rushing were the third-highest total nationally

DEFENSIVE NOTES:

- Kennesaw State allowed a season-low 27 rushing yards against Shorter
- The KSU defense has limited three of its first four opponents to less than 140 yards passing, including a season-low 41 yards versus Edward Waters (Sept. 12) that ties for the eighth-fewest allowed in the FCS this year.
- Two of Kennesaw State's four opponents have failed to rush for 100 yards. The Owls limited East Tennessee State (98) and Shorter (27) to under 100 yards. Opponents are averaging just 3.5 yards a rush against the Owls.
- Kennesaw State became the first team in Big South Conference history to return two fumbles for touchdowns in the same game when Izzy Sam (11 yards) and McKenzie Billingslea (18 yards) each achieved the feat against Edward Waters (Sept. 12).

INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE NOTES:

- Junior defensive back Derrick Farrow's three forced fumbles versus Edward Waters on Sept. 12 is an FCS single-game high in 2015. He ranks third in the country in total forced fumbles.
- Senior DL Mason Harris ranks 10th in the country with two forced fumbles. He also leads the Owls with 6.5 tackles for loss totaling 38 yards.
- S Taylor Henkle leads Kennesaw State with 20 tackles and 2 pass breakups
- Taylor Henke recorded his first career interception Saturday versus Shorter.

INAUGURAL DEFENSIVE GAME NOTES:

- Redshirt junior defensive lineman Nick Perrotta had a game-changing 19-yard interception return for a TD late in the second quarter that gave the Owls a 21-13 lead. He finished with four tackles, including two for loss.
- Kennesaw State limited ETSU to 98 rushing yards (2.6 yards per carry)
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Mason Harris tied for the team lead with seven tackles, including three for loss and a sack for 10 yards. He also had two quarterback hurries and a forced fumble.
- Redshirt freshman Taylor Henkle tied for the team lead with seven tackles, including one for loss, and had a pass breakup. He also recorded the first defensive tackle in program history.
- Redshirt defensive back Dante' Blackmon had four tackles and returned an interception 23 yards.

SMASHING DEBUT: Kennesaw State is the sixth different program to win its first game as members of the Big South Conference, joining Gardner-Webb and Elon in 2002, Coastal Carolina in 2003, Stony Brook





in 2008 and Monmouth in 2014. Meanwhile, the Owls' 56 points at East Tennessee State was the most scored by a Big South member in a season opener against an FCS opponent, and the fourth-most points scored overall in an opening game of a season since the league's formation in 2002.

OWLS FLY INTO BIG SOUTH RECORD BOOK: One game into its history, Kennesaw State immediately wrote itself into the Big South Conference record book:

• The Owls' 416 yards and six touchdowns rushing in their debut game against East Tennessee marked just the 10th time in league history that a football member gained at least 415 yards on the ground with six rushing TDs. The last to do it was Presbyterian on Sept. 6, 2014 against Bluefield (523/7). KSU's performance was just the fifth such effort against an FCS opponent.

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: As a startup program, Kennesaw State will feature a young team that is dominated by freshmen and redshirt freshmen. Of the 105 players listed on the Owls roster, 73 are either true freshmen (20) or redshirt freshmen (53). The roster also includes 11 sophomores, 16 juniors and five seniors.

THE SENIORS: The five seniors on the Kennesaw State roster include Chaz Cheeks (DL, Gainesville, Ga. / Georgia Tech), Brett Gillespie (OL, Kennesaw, Ga. / North Greenville), Ryan Godhigh (RB, Acworth, Ga. / Harrison HS), Mason Harris (DL, Fort Oglethorpe, Ga. / South Carolina) and Prentice Stone (Marietta, Ga. / Eastern Kentucky).

TRYOUT TO THE TWO-DEEP: A handful of players who took part in tryouts over the last year and a half, have made significant impressions on the coaching staff and earned their way onto the two-deep. Redshirt senior offensive lineman Brett Gillespie, redshirt junior defensive lineman Nick Perrotta, redshirt sophomore linebacker Izzy Sam and redshirt senior Ryan Godhigh were part of the initial tryout on March 22, 2014. Additionally, redshirt senior PJ Stone (wide receiver) and redshirt freshman defensive back Shawn Reynolds have gone from tryout hopefuls to earning spots on the Owls two-deep.

LEADING THE WAY: Redshirt freshman quarterback Chandler Burks (Douglasville, Ga. / South Paulding HS) became the first recruit to verbally commit to Kennesaw State when he let head coach Brian Bohannon know of his intentions to attend KSU in the summer of 2013. He also was the first signee after inking his name to a National Letter-of-Intent on Feb. 5, 2014. Burks was one of 29 players who were part of the initial signing class.

A GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE: Kennesaw State will face a challenging schedule during its inaugural season. Six of the Owls' 10 opponents posted winning records in 2014, including five of six Big South Conference teams. Non-conference foe Dayton (8-3), along with Big South rivals Liberty (9-5), Monmouth (6-5), Charleston Southern (8-4), Coastal Carolina (12-2) and Presbyterian (6-5) all were on the plus side of the win-loss ledger a year ago.

SCOUTING THE BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE: The Big South Conference is considered one of the country's top NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) conferences According to HERO Sports, the Big South Conference is ranked second among the 13 conferences, behind only the Missouri Valley Conference, home to four-time defending national champion North Dakota State. STATS FCS has listed the Big South as the fourth-best conference, trailing the Missouri Valley, Colonial Athletic Association and Big Sky Conference. The Big South Conference has had two teams advance to the FCS playoffs in each of the last three seasons.

KENNESAW STATE-ALABAMA STATE AGREE TO 4-YEAR SERIES:

Kennesaw State and Alabama State jointly announced on Monday (Aug. 31) an agreement on a four-year series that will begin in 2017 and run through 2020. The two teams will meet for the first time on Sept. 16, 2017 at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before switching venues to The New ASU Stadium on Sept. 15, 2018. The remaining two games will be played Sept. 14, 2019 in Kennesaw before wrapping up the current agreement on Sept. 19, 2020 in Montgomery, Ala.

Bohannon was formally introduced as head coach at a press conference inside the locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before a standing-room only audience that included media, family, friends, KSU Athletics administration and coaches, members of the University community and invited guests on March 26, 2013.

"Let me just first say how humbled and honored I am to be here today," Bohannon said in his opening remarks. "This is something you look forward to in our profession and I'm honored to be a part of an institution that is as special as this one is. I'm truly excited and it's surreal for me to hear 'first head football coach at Kennesaw State."

"I also want to give special thanks to University President Dr. Dan Papp, Vaughn Williams, the search committee and the people I met with during my interview," Bohannon added.

"My family is important to me and that's the culture I want to bring to KSU. People are excited to be here and to be in this department and that's what I want to continue," Bohannon said. "It was a surreal moment for me last night looking back on what's gotten me to this podium today. I started out on the field at age eight with my mom dropping me off. I've watched my dad coach and that's what I've learned from. It's had a huge affect on me and my path here today.

"My family, the coaches I've worked with, they've all been influential and I can't thank them enough and I'll never be able to," Bohannon added. "This is the plan laid out for me and I've followed it and that's why I'm here today."

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul

HEAD COACH BRIAN BOHANNON

Prian Bohannon made history on March 24, 2013 when he was named the first football coach in the history of Kennesaw State University.

Bohannon joined the Owls' family after spending the previous five seasons as quarterbacks/B-backs coach at Georgia Tech where he engineered one of the country's most prolific spread option offenses.

Bohannon was formally introduced as head coach at a press conference inside the locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before a standing-room only audience that included media, family, friends, KSU Athletics administration and coaches, members of the University community and invited guests on March 26, 2013.

"Let me just first say how humbled and honored I am to be here today," Bohannon said in his opening remarks. "This is something you look forward to in our profession and I'm honored to be a part of an institution that is as special as this one is. I'm truly excited and it's surreal for me to hear 'first head football coach at Kennesaw State."

"I also want to give special thanks to University President Dr. Dan Papp, Vaughn Williams, the search committee and the people I met with during my interview," Bohannon added.

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson.

During Bohannon's time at Georgia Tech in 2008, the Yellow Jackets finished in the top four nationally in rushing offense every season, including in 2010 when they led the nation in rushing for the first time in school history.

No team in college football rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech as the Yellow Jackets accumulated more than 20,000 yards on the ground during his last five seasons on The Flats.

In 2012, Georgia Tech broke school records for total offense and rushing yards. The Yellow Jackets also averaged a school-record 40.0 points per game in conference play.

Two B-backs – David Sims and Zach Laskey – combined to rush for more than



1,300 yards. Two quarterbacks - Tevin Washington and Vad Lee - combined to run for more than 1,200 yards. Washington broke the school record for rushing touchdowns in a season (20).

Under Bohannon's direction, former Georgia Tech quarterbacks Washington and Joshua Nesbitt emerged as two of the most prolific signal callers in Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) history. Nesbitt and Washington combined to rush for more than 5,000 yards and rank first and third, respectively, in ACC history for career rushing yards by a quarterback.

Under Bohannon, four players rushed for more than 1,000 yards in a season -- B-back Jonathan Dwyer in 2008, Dwyer and Nesbitt in 2009, and B-back Anthony Allen in 2010.

Dwyer was a first-team All-ACC selection (2008, 2009). Nesbitt was the first team All-ACC quarterback in 2009, and Allen was first-team all-conference in 2010. Dwyer and Allen advanced to the NFL.

Before arriving at Georgia Tech, Bohannon spent six years as wide receivers coach at

Navy. He was part of a staff that returned the Midshipmen to the national spotlight. Navy won 35 games over four years, earning a school-record four consecutive bowl berths and a school-best four straight Commander-In-Chief's Trophies.

Navy's offense put up remarkable numbers in 2007. The Midshipmen ranked first nationally in rushing (348.8 ypg), 10th in scoring (39.3 ppg.), and 22nd in total offense (444.1 ypg.) and ninth in sacks allowed (1.08 pg). Navy's rushing attack averaged a nation's best 318.7 yards per contest in 2005 as the Midshipmen went to a bowl game for a third straight year, won a second consecutive bowl game and captured the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for a third-straight year.

The Midshipmen led the nation in rushing (323.2 yards per contest) and set school records for rushing yards per game, total rushing yards (4,202), rushing yards per attempt (5.5), rushing touchdowns (44), total offense (5,506), total offense per game (423.5) and yards per play (6.0) in 2003.

Bohannon coached the wide receivers (1997-99) and defensive backs (2000-01) at Georgia Southern.

During Bohannon's five seasons in Statesboro, Georgia Southern advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, finishing as national runner-up in 1998 and claiming back-to-back national championships (1999 and 2000).

A four-year letter winner and standout as a wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996. He is married to the former Melanie Cobb and the couple has has three children, sons Blake Patrick and Braden Thomas, and daughter Brooke Anna. The family resides in Woodstock, Ga.

Listed below are media policies and information to assist you in your coverage of the Owls. Please let us know how we may serve you throughout the upcoming season. Note: All policies are subject to change. Please consult the weekly game notes for any changes in media policies.

INTERVIEWS

Media are requested to provide at least 24 hours notice to help ensure player/coach availability and to confirm practice times. Players will return phone calls when requested. Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided at any time. Media are encouraged to conduct interviews after practice due to better player availability. Practices are open to the media during the pre-practice session and through the first three periods Monday through Wednesdays. The remainder of the practice is closed to all media. Post-practice interviews will be conducted outside the Kennesaw State locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Kennesaw State home games are issued for working media only. Because of severe space limitations, seating will be based on a priority system. Individual game credentials must be requested two (2) weeks prior to the date of the game.

All members of the media must request credentials online at $\underline{\text{www.}}$ $\underline{\text{KSUOwls.com/FBCredentials}}$.

Please keep in mind that credentials authorize an accredited organization for news coverage of the game. ANY unauthorized use of credentials subjects the bearer to ejection from the stadium and the accredited organization to revocation of all its credentials for future KSU athletic events.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking will be located in the Pink Lot (465 Big Shanty Rd. Marietta, GA 30066). All media reqesting season parking should make their request in writing. Parking passes along with season credentials will be mailed out in advance. All media must have a parking pass prior to game day to park in the Pink Lot.

FIFTH THIRD BANK STADIUM

Fifth Third Bank Stadium is located at 3200 George Busbee Pkwy NW, Kennesaw, GA 30144. The media entrance is located on the west side of the stadium near Gate B and the box office. The media entrance will open three hours prior to kickoff. The press box is located on the on the promenade level and the working press booth is located on Press Box S. The TV booth is also located on Press Box S. The home radio booth is located in Press Box K and the visiting radio booth is in Press Box U.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

The press box at Fifth Third Bank Stadium has limited seating and is available to media on a priority basis. High spead internet is available to transmit stories.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKROOM

A photographer's workroom is located just off the field in the interview room that is situated underneath the stage on the northwest side. Internet access is available and all photographer's are required to have a wristband for field access. Wristbands will be issued at Media Will Call. Photographers already with credentials in hand are required to check in at the will call window to pick up a wristband.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The Kennesaw State locker room is located below the East stands near the North end zone. The interview room is located under the stage at the northwest end zone. The visitor's locker room is located below the East stands near the South end zone.

Owls head coach Brian Bohannon and requested players will be available in the post game interview approximately 10 minutes after the team enters the locker room. Kennesaw State's locker room is closed. The SID of the visiting school will establish admittance policies to the visiting locker room.

STATISTICS

Statistics will be provided throughout the game. Full stat packets, including scoring summary, play-by-play, and team and individual statistics, will be available following the game and distributed at the postgame press conference.


