OPENING KICKOFF: History will be made in Johnson, City, Tenn. when the Kennesaw State football team visits East Tennessee State for its inaugural game on Thursday (Sept. 3). Kickoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

The contest will mark a rare occasion where both teams are start-up programs. Kennesaw State will be playing its first football game in school history while East Tennessee State is re-instituting the sport after suspending football following the 2003 season.

BOHANNON MAKES HEAD

COACHING DEBUT: Brian Bohannon will make his head coaching debut on Thursday after being hired as head coach on March 22, 2013. Bohannon spent the previous five seasons as quarterbacks/B-backs coach at Georgia Tech.

BOHANNON ON FIRST GAME: "Obviously there has been a lot of exciting times here at this University but this is the one we have been shooting for. It's amazing the last two and a half years for me how fast this has gone by. I remember on our TV screens in our weight room and offices it said

400 days before we play and I walked out of my office and it said six today. That is kind of a surreal moment for us as a program and everything that has gone on. It's really what we have been working towards, is this first game. I can't tell you how excited our kids are, they're tired of practicing, they're tired of hitting each other, and they're ready to go play somebody else...The same with our staff."

OWLS TO PLAY AT FCS LEVEL: Kennesaw State will play at the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. KSU joined the Big South Conference as an associate member on Sept. 4, 2013.

A LOOK AHEAD: The Owls will make their home debut on Saturday, Sept. 12 when they host Edward Waters at Fifth Third Bank Stadium. The game is sold out and fans unable to attend will have an opportunity to watch the historic first game on TV as Atlanta's CW69 will air the game live.

NEW IN 2015: Kennesaw State and East Tennessee State are two of four institutions who will debut football in 2015. Finlandia University, located in

Hancock, Mich. will compete at the NCAA Division III level, while Lyon College in Batesville, Ark., returned to the gridiron last Saturday following a 64-year hiatus, and will play at the NAIA level.

HOW IT WAS BUILT: A documentary on how the Kennesaw State football program was built will air on WUPA-TV Atlanta's CW69 on Saturday (Sept. 5) at 4 p.m. The one-hour show takes an in-depth behind-the-scene look into the building of the program.

A LOOK AT EAST TENNESSEE STATE: The Buccaneers are coached by Carl Torbush, who was named head coach on June 21, 2013. Torbush has previous head coaching experience at Louisiana Tech (1987) and North Carolina (1997-2000), and has an overall record of 20-26 (.435) in five seasons. Redshirt freshman Austin Herink, a transfer from Middle Tennessee State, is listed on the Buccaneers' two-deep as the starting quarterback.

EAST TENNESSEE STATE CONNECTIONS: Kennesaw State offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Grant Chesnut has family ties to East Tennessee State. His father, Greg, was an All-Ohio Valley Conference selection for the Buccaneers during his four-year (1967-70) career at ETSU. During his junior season, Chesnut was part of a Buccaneers team that went 10-0-1 and defeated a Terry Bradshaw-led Louisiana Tech team, 34-14, in the Grantland Rice Bowl in Baton, Rouge, La.

LEGENDARY INPUT: Both Kennesaw State and East Tennessee State have had legendary input during their building process. College Football Hall of Fame Coach Vince Dooley, the former head coach and athletics director at the University of Georgia was named chair of a 33-member Exploratory Committee in 2009 that looked into the feasibility of Kennesaw State adding a football program. He has continued to remain involved with KSU, serving as a valuable resource.

Meanwhile former University of Tennessee head coach and College Football Hall of Fame inductee Phillip Fulmer has served as a special assistant to the athletic director at East Tennessee State.

THE VIEW FROM THE SIDELINE: Head coach Brian Bohannon, who spent most of his career as an assistant coach in the press box on game day, will move down from the coaches' booth to the sideline in 2015. Bohannon last coached a game from the sideline during his final season at Georgia Southern in 2001.

IN THE BOOTH: Offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Grant Chesnut, quarterbacks coach Cody Worley, defensive line coach Kevin Downing and defensive backs coach Chris Bland will be positioned in the booth.

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: As a startup program, Kennesaw State will feature a young team that is dominated by freshmen and redshirt freshmen. Of the 105 players listed on the Owls roster, 73 are either true freshmen (20) or redshirt freshmen (53). The roster also includes 11 sophomores, 16 juniors and five seniors.

THE SENIORS: The five seniors on the Kennesaw State roster include Chaz Cheeks (DL, Gainesville, Ga. / Georgia Tech), Brett Gillespie (OL, Kennesaw, Ga. / North Greenville), Ryan Godhigh (RB, Acworth, Ga. / Harrison HS), Mason Harris (DL, Fort Oglethorpe, Ga. / South Carolina) and Prentice Stone (Marietta, Ga. / Eastern Kentucky).

TWO-DEEP BREAKDOWN: Head coach Brian Bohannon released the Kennesaw State two-deep on Friday (Aug. 28) and 27 players are either freshmen or redshirt freshmen. On offense, there are 15 freshmen or redshirt freshmen listed, including seven as starters. Defensively, 12 players fall into the above categories, with six being starters.

Gameday Central

The Kennesaw State Department of Athletics has launched a Football Game Day Central page at KSUOwls.com. The web page is one-stop shopping for Owls fans and the media, and includes relevant information for the upcoming game. The web page includes quick links to both Kennesaw State and its weekly opponent's roster, schedule, coaching staff, record book, game notes. It also is a quick reference point for all web-based multimedia game materials, including links to audio and video streams, and live stats.

Media Center

The Kennesaw State athletics communications department has produced a Media Center page at KSUOwls.com. The Media Center includes links to the KSU football information guide, statistics, FCS and opponent information, including game notes, broadcast information, flip cards, postgame quote and video highlights.

TRYOUT TO THE TWO-DEEP: A handful of players who took part in tryouts over the last year and a half, have made significant impressions on the coaching staff and earned their way onto the two-deep. Redshirt junior defensive lineman Nick Perrotta, redshirt sophomore linebacker Izzy Sam and redshirt senior Ryan Godhigh were part of the initial tryout on March 22, 2014. Additionally, redshirt senior PJ Stone (wide receiver) and redshirt freshman defensive back Shawn Reynolds have gone from tryout hopefuls to earning spots on the Owls two-deep.

THE QUARTERBACK POSITION: Redshirt junior quarterback Trey White is listed as the starting quarterback and backed up by redshirt freshman Jake McKenzie. White, a transfer from The Citadel, prepped at St. Pius X Catholic High School in Atlanta. When White finally takes the field at ETSU, it will mark his first game action since 2011 when he was a high school senior. McKenzie is a former all-state player from Monroe Academy in Monroeville, Ala.

LEADING THE WAY: Redshirt freshman quarterback Chandler Burks (Douglasville, Ga. / South Paulding HS) was the first recruit to verbally commit to Kennesaw State when he let head coach Brian Bohannon know of his intentions to attend KSU in the summer of 2013. He also was the first signee after inking his name to a National Letter-of-Intent on Feb. 5, 2014. Burks was one of 29 players who were part of the initial signing class.

RECRUITING GEORGIA: When head coach Brian Bohannon assumed the challenge of building a program, he said he was committed to recruiting the state of Georgia. He and his staff have stayed true to that plan as 92 of the 105 players on the roster are from Georgia. There are three players each from Alabama and Florida, two from Texas, and one each from California, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, South Carolina and Tennessee.

A GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE: Kennesaw State will face a challenging schedule during its inaugural season. Six of the Owls' 10 opponents posted winning records in 2014, including five of six Big South Conference teams. Non-conference foe Dayton (8-3), along with Big South rivals Liberty (9-5), Monmouth (6-5), Charleston Southern (8-4), Coastal Carolina (12-2) and Presbyterian (6-5) all were on the plus side of the win-loss ledger a year ago.

SCOUTING THE BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE: The Big South Conference has earned a reputation as one of the top NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) conferences in the country. According to HERO Sports, the Big South Conference is ranked second among the 13 conferences, behind only the Missouri Valley Conference, home to four-time defending national champion North Dakota State. STATS FCS has listed the Big South as the fourth-best conference, trailing the Missouri Valley, Colonial Athletic Association and Big Sky Conference. The Big South Conference has had two teams advance to the FCS playoffs in each of the last three seasons.

FLYING HIGH: The inaugural 2015 season can be labeled the "Year of the Bird". In addition to the Kennesaw State Owls, five opponents on KSU's schedule have a type of bird as part of their mascot. Those teams include Shorter (Hawks), Point (Skyhawks), Monmouth (Hawks), Coastal Carolina (Chanticleers) and Liberty. Although Liberty's, nickname is the Flames, it also has "Sparky the Eagle", who was introduced on campus in 2006.

KENNESAW STATE-ALABAMA STATE AGREE TO 4-YEAR SERIES:

Kennesaw State and Alabama State jointly announced on Monday (Aug. 31) an agreement on a four-year series that will begin in 2017 and run through 2020. The two teams will meet for the first time on Sept. 16, 2017 at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before switching venues to The New ASU Stadium on Sept. 15, 2018. The remaining two games will be played Sept. 14, 2019 in Kennesaw before wrapping up the current agreement on Sept. 19, 2020 in Montgomery, Ala.

BRIAN BOHANNON Head Coach • 1st Season Georgia • 1993

Brian Bohannon made history on March 24, 2013 when he was named the first football coach in the history of Kennesaw State University.

Bohannon joined the Owls' family after spending the previous five seasons as quarterbacks/B-backs coach at Georgia Tech where he engineered one of the country's most prolific spread option offenses.

"This is an extremely exciting moment in Kennesaw State University history," Kennesaw State Director of Athletics Vaughn Williams said. "Coach Bohannon embodies every value, characteristic and skill set that we look for when choosing head coaches to lead our student-athletes. Brian has distinguished himself as a servant leader who will build a program the right way. I can't wait to kick off that football in 2015."

Bohannon was formally introduced as head coach at a press conference inside the locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before a standing-room only audience that included media, family, friends, KSU Athletics administration and coaches, members of the University community and invited guests on March 26, 2013.

"Let me just first say how humbled and honored I am to be here today," Bohannon said in his opening remarks. "This is something you look forward to in our profession and I'm honored to be a part of an institution that is as special as this one is. I'm truly excited and it's surreal for me to hear 'first head football coach at Kennesaw State.'"

"I also want to give special thanks to University President Dr. Dan Papp, Vaughn Williams, the search committee and the people I met with during my interview," Bohannon added.

"My family is important to me and that's the culture I want to bring to KSU. People are excited to be here and to be in this department and that's what I want to continue," Bohannon said. "It was a surreal moment for me last night looking back on what's gotten me to this podium today. I started out on the field at age eight with my mom dropping me off. I've watched my dad coach and that's what I've learned from. It's had a huge affect on me and my path here today."

"My family, the coaches I've worked with, they've all been influential and I can't thank them enough and I'll never be able to," Bohannon added. "This is the plan laid out for me and I've followed it and that's why I'm here today."

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul

HEAD COACH BRIAN BOHANNON

Brian Bohannon made history on March 24, 2013 when he was named the first football coach in the history of Kennesaw State University.

Bohannon joined the Owls' family after spending the previous five seasons as quarterbacks/B-backs coach at Georgia Tech where he engineered one of the country's most prolific spread option offenses.

Bohannon was formally introduced as head coach at a press conference inside the locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before a standing-room only audience that included media, family, friends, KSU Athletics administration and coaches, members of the University community and invited guests on March 26, 2013.

"Let me just first say how humbled and honored I am to be here today," Bohannon said in his opening remarks. "This is something you look forward to in our profession and I'm honored to be a part of an institution that is as special as this one is. I'm truly excited and it's surreal for me to hear 'first head football coach at Kennesaw State.'"

"I also want to give special thanks to University President Dr. Dan Papp, Vaughn Williams, the search committee and the people I met with during my interview," Bohannon added.

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson.

During Bohannon's time at Georgia Tech in 2008, the Yellow Jackets finished in the top four nationally in rushing offense every season, including in 2010 when they led the nation in rushing for the first time in school history.

No team in college football rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech as the Yellow Jackets accumulated more than 20,000 yards on the ground during his last five seasons on The Flats.

In 2012, Georgia Tech broke school records for total offense and rushing yards. The Yellow Jackets also averaged a school-record 40.0 points per game in conference play.

Two B-backs - David Sims and Zach Laskey - combined to rush for more than



1,300 yards. Two quarterbacks - Tevin Washington and Vad Lee - combined to run for more than 1,200 yards. Washington broke the school record for rushing touchdowns in a season (20).

Under Bohannon's direction, former Georgia Tech quarterbacks Washington and Joshua Nesbitt emerged as two of the most prolific signal callers in Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) history. Nesbitt and Washington combined to rush for more than 5,000 yards and rank first and third, respectively, in ACC history for career rushing yards by a quarterback.

Under Bohannon, four players rushed for more than 1,000 yards in a season -- B-back Jonathan Dwyer in 2008, Dwyer and Nesbitt in 2009, and B-back Anthony Allen in 2010.

Dwyer was a first-team All-ACC selection (2008, 2009). Nesbitt was the first team All-ACC quarterback in 2009, and Allen was first-team all-conference in 2010. Dwyer and Allen advanced to the NFL.

Before arriving at Georgia Tech, Bohannon spent six years as wide receivers coach at

Navy. He was part of a staff that returned the Midshipmen to the national spotlight. Navy won 35 games over four years, earning a school-record four consecutive bowl berths and a school-best four straight Commander-In-Chief's Trophies.

Navy's offense put up remarkable numbers in 2007. The Midshipmen ranked first nationally in rushing (348.8 ypg), 10th in scoring (39.3 ppg.), and 22nd in total offense (444.1 ypg.) and ninth in sacks allowed (1.08 pg). Navy's rushing attack averaged a nation's best 318.7 yards per contest in 2005 as the Midshipmen went to a bowl game for a third straight year, won a second consecutive bowl game and captured the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for a third-straight year.

The Midshipmen led the nation in rushing (323.2 yards per contest) and set school records for rushing yards per game, total rushing yards (4,202), rushing yards per attempt (5.5), rushing touchdowns (44), total offense (5,506), total offense per game (423.5) and yards per play (6.0) in 2003.

Bohannon coached the wide receivers (1997-99) and defensive backs (2000-01) at Georgia Southern.

During Bohannon's five seasons in Statesboro, Georgia Southern advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, finishing as national runner-up in 1998 and claiming back-to-back national championships (1999 and 2000).

A four-year letter winner and standout as a wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996. He is married to the former Melanie Cobb and the couple has three children, sons Blake Patrick and Braden Thomas, and daughter Brooke Anna. The family resides in Woodstock, Ga.

Listed below are media policies and information to assist you in your coverage of the Owls. Please let us know how we may serve you throughout the upcoming season. **Note: All policies are subject to change. Please consult the weekly game notes for any changes in media policies.**

INTERVIEWS

Media are requested to provide at least 24 hours notice to help ensure player/coach availability and to confirm practice times. Players will return phone calls when requested. Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided at any time. Media are encouraged to conduct interviews after practice due to better player availability. Practices are open to the media during the pre-practice session and through the first three periods Monday through Wednesdays. The remainder of the practice is closed to all media. Post-practice interviews will be conducted outside the Kennesaw State locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Kennesaw State home games are issued for working media only. Because of severe space limitations, seating will be based on a priority system. Individual game credentials must be requested two (2) weeks prior to the date of the game.

All members of the media must request credentials online at www.KSUOwls.com/FBCredentials.

Please keep in mind that credentials authorize an accredited organization for news coverage of the game. ANY unauthorized use of credentials subjects the bearer to ejection from the stadium and the accredited organization to revocation of all its credentials for future KSU athletic events.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking will be located in the Pink Lot (465 Big Shanty Rd. Marietta, GA 30066). All media requesting season parking should make their request in writing. Parking passes along with season credentials will be mailed out in advance. All media must have a parking pass prior to game day to park in the Pink Lot.

FIFTH THIRD BANK STADIUM

Fifth Third Bank Stadium is located at 3200 George Busbee Pkwy NW, Kennesaw, GA 30144. The media entrance is located on the west side of the stadium near Gate B and the box office. The media entrance will open three hours prior to kickoff. The press box is located on the on the promenade level and the working press booth is located on Press Box S. The TV booth is also located on Press Box S. The home radio booth is located in Press Box K and the visiting radio booth is in Press Box U.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

The press box at Fifth Third Bank Stadium has limited seating and is available to media on a priority basis. High speed internet is available to transmit stories.

PHOTOGRAPHY WORKROOM

A photographer's workroom is located just off the field in the interview room that is situated underneath the stage on the north-west side. Internet access is available and all photographer's are required to have a wristband for field access. Wristbands will be issued at Media Will Call. Photographers already with credentials in hand are required to check in at the will call window to pick up a wristband.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The Kennesaw State locker room is located below the East stands near the North end zone. The interview room is located under the stage at the northwest end zone. The visitor's locker room is located below the East stands near the South end zone.

Owls head coach Brian Bohannon and requested players will be available in the post game interview approximately 10 minutes after the team enters the locker room. Kennesaw State's locker room is closed. The SID of the visiting school will establish admittance policies to the visiting locker room.

STATISTICS

Statistics will be provided throughout the game. Full stat packets, including scoring summary, play-by-play, and team and individual statistics, will be available following the game and distributed at the postgame press conference.
