## About Today's Game

- Today's game is the first-ever meeting between Shorter, which is in its 11th year as a program and third as an NCAA Division II team that plays in the Gulf South Conference, and Kennesaw State, playing its inaugural season as an NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team in the Big South Conference.
- The Hawks come into the game having opened the season with a 38-12 win in an exhibition game two week ago against the University of Faith (Fla.) but dropped a 20-7 decision last week in Jefferson City, Tenn., to non-conference foe Carson-Newman.
- Kennesaw State has gotten its first-ever campaign off to a promising start, handing East Tennessee State a 56-16 loss on Sept. 3 in Johnson City, Tenn., then rolled to a 58-7 victory last week over NAIA foe Edward Waters in the Owls inaugural home opener at Fifth Third Bank Stadium in Kennesaw.
- Shorter's game against the Owls marks the first of two-straight showdowns against NCAA Division I FCS teams, the first time that has ever happened in the history of the program. Next week on Saturday, Sept. 19, the Hawks head to Cape Girardeau, Mo., to take on Ohio Valley Conference member Southeast Missouri State.
- The Hawks have lost their last eight games, the most in the program's history. The last time Shorter tasted a win came on Oct. 2, 2014 when the Hawks defeated GSC foe Mississippi College 27-14.
- This is the second of four-straight road games for the Hawks, just the second time Shorter has played four consecutive away contest, the first time coming in 2006.
- A coach and a player who teamed up as Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets will be on opposing sidelines today. Prior to taking over as the KSU head coach, Brian Bohannon was the Quarterbacks/B-Backs coach at Tech where one of his players was David Sims, who is now a first-year coach at Shorter working with the quarterbacks and B-backs.

**LAST WEEK'S GAME****Carson-Newman 20  
Shorter 7**

JEFFERSON CITY, Tenn. – Despite a career-high output by junior fullback B.J. McCoy, the Shorter Hawks found themselves a victim of poor field position and turnovers when they were handed a 20-7 non-conference defeat by the Carson-Newman Eagles on Saturday afternoon.

The setback was Shorter's first of the regular season heading into back-to-back road trips against Division I FCS teams over the next two weeks, the first coming next Saturday when the Hawks head to Kennesaw to take on the Kennesaw State Owls.

The win improves Carson-Newman, picked to finish second in the South Atlantic Conference, to 2-0.

McCoy ended the game leading all ball carriers gaining 139 yards on 18 carries, his longest run coming in the first quarter when he exploded for a 77-yard touchdown run that was the longest for the Hawks since 2013.

That, however, was the lone offensive bright spot for the Hawks – they were only able to work the ball into Carson-Newman territory just three times – as they finished the afternoon with just 242 total yards, 172 of that on the ground.

The Eagles finished with 296 total yards, but made the most of excellent field position – four of their last five drives in the second half started on Shorter's side of the field – and converted a fumble and an interception by the Hawks into a touchdown and a field goal, respectively.

After the two teams were unable to mount any threats on their first possessions of the game, the Eagles found the groove on their second series of the afternoon by mounting an 80-yard drive that culminated when Damian Baker found the end zone from seven yards out with 5:29 left in the first quarter. Carson Wise added the extra point.

The Hawks, however, didn't waste any time answering Carson-Newman and on the third play from scrimmage, McCoy

found an opening on the right side, broke three tackles and raced 77 yards for the touchdown, with Kenny Langford connecting on the point after to tie the game with 1:36 to go in the first.

The deadlock remained until late in the half when the Eagles capitalized on field position and a Shorter fumble.

Although the Hawks were able to force the home team come away empty-handed when the Eagles missed a 22-yard field goal attempt and on the next series took over on downs with a goal-line stand at their own 9, Shorter was unable to move the ball away from their own end zone and on their third series of the second quarter fumbled the ball away at the Shorter 19 to give Carson-Newman yet another attempt to break the tie.

That they did five plays later when Baker added his second touchdown of the day, this time scoring on a 1-yard run.

With 4:35 remaining in the third quarter, Carson-Newman increased its lead to 17-7 when Wise split the uprights with a 26-yard field goal and after they picked off a Shorter pass at the Hawks' 20, added three more points when Wise connected with a 36-yard FG.

Other than McCoy's output, the Hawks got 70 passing yards from quarterback DeVante James, who completed 4 of 12 passes and was picked off once.

Zach Butts headed up Shorter's defense with 15 total tackles.

**THE REAL McCoy**

Shorter fullback **B.J. McCoy** didn't waste any time getting his season off on the right foot during last week's game against Carson-Newman as the junior from Villa Rica, who is arguably the strongest running back in the Gulf South Conference, turned in a memorable performance.

McCoy ended the afternoon in Tennessee giving Shorter its most rushing yards in a game (139) and the longest touchdown run (77 yards) since 2013.

The long scoring jaunt also became the sixth-longest scoring run in the program's history and the total rushing yards he accumulated moved him into the 1,000-career rushing yards category.

Heading into today's game, McCoy has gained 1,098 yards on the ground which ranked him eighth on the all-time career rushing list and needs just 37 yards to take over the No. 7 spot held by former Hawk Antwon Appleton (2008-11.)

Having played as a freshman who assumed the starting job in the backfield last year, McCoy has not surprisingly has moved into the No. 5 slot in career carries for the Hawks having rushed the ball 255 times.

**ON THE MOVE**

- Having recorded seven sacks for the Hawks in 2014, junior defensive end **Trevaris Horton** appears to be in the same mode this year. Against Carson-Newman last week, Horton came up with his first sack of the season and the eighth of his career. He now has the sixth most career sacks in Shorter history, sharing the spot with former Hawks Daniel Hazard (2008-11) and Matt Yarborough (2005-08). Ex-Shorter great Logan Lollis holds the record with 15 career sacks.

- Senior linebacker **Dominique Henfield's** 10 tackles against Carson-Newman gives the four-year starter 192 total career tackles. He needs just 17 more to become Shorter's fifth all-time tackler.



# HAWK IN THE SPOTLIGHT

## Jordan Shaw

### Senior Safety / Jasper, Ga.

- Was named the 2014 Gulf South Conference Defensive Player of the Year – Shorter's first-ever – and was a All-GSC First Team selection. Shaw went on to claim a spot on the prestigious American Football Coaches Association Division II All-America team that was followed up with his inclusion on Associated Press Little All-America, Beyond Sports Network Division II All-America, D2Football.com All-America, Don Hansen's Football Gazette All-America and USA College Football All-America teams. Picked as the 2014 National Christian College Athletic Association Defensive Player of the Year, Shaw was also a finalist for the Cliff Harris Award presented by the Little Rock (Ark.) Touchdown Club to the nation's top small college defensive player.

- Led the GSC last year with eight interceptions for 118 yards, including a 100-yard return for a touchdown he turned in against non-conference for Mars Hill, a game in which he picked off a record three passes. Shaw became the 15th player in GSC history with at least eight interceptions in a season

## Trevaris Horton

### Jr. / DE / Phenix City, Ala.

- Named to 2014 All-GSC First Team Defense and was a Beyond Sports Network All-Super Region 2 Honorable Mention selection after leading the Hawks with seven sacks for 47 yards and 11 tackles for losses with 11 for 79 yards. Also registered 30 solo tackles and 18 assists and recorded his first career touchdown by forcing a fumble, recovering it and taking the ball 40 yards into the end zone against West Georgia. Was selected to the 26th annual USA College Football D-II Preseason All-American team.



and just the seventh player to take back a miscue for 100 yards. He also ranked third in the GSC in total tackles (81) and fourth in tackles per game (7.8) and led the Hawks in tackles for the second straight year.

- Is a 2015 All-GSC Preseason Team pick and has been named 5 Preseason Division II All-American teams.

## CHRIS BENO

### Sr. / OG / Newnan, Ga.

- Begins his final year in Georgia with the Hawks after earning 2014 All-GSC Second Team Offense honors and named a USA College Football 2nd Team All-American after being involved in 557 of the team's 570 snaps last year. Named a 2015 USA College Football D-II Preseason All-American.

## Zach Butts

### Jr. / LB / McDonough, Ga.

- Named to 2014 All-GSC Second Team after ending the year as the Hawks' third-leading tackler despite missing three games due to injury, with 34 solo hits and 25 assists and 5.5 tackles for losses. A 2015 USA College Football D-II Preseason All-American Team selection.

## SPREADING THEIR WINGS

When the Hawks play Southeast Missouri State on Sept. 26 in Cape Girardeau, Mo., the trip will mark the 10th state Shorter has competed in since the program started in 2005. In addition to their home state, the Hawks have played in Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, North Carolina, South Carolina, Florida, Mississippi and Texas.

## FRESHMAN WITH A FOOT

For the first time in four years, the Hawks' punting duties were handled by someone other than Aaron Mize, who held the job for four years before graduating. Against Carson-Newman last week, freshman walk-on **David Thompson** stepped into the role and the left-footed punter from Cleveland, Tenn., made quite a statement. In his collegiate debut, Thompson had five punts and averaged 38.4 yards, his longest measuring 46 yards. What made his performance even more notable was that all five punts came deep inside Shorter's territory, including one when Thompson delivered a 41-yard boot while standing in the Hawks' own end zone.

## ONE TOUGH CONFERENCE

It doesn't come as a surprise that four Gulf South Conference teams are currently ranked in the AFCA Division II Top 25 poll. After all, the GSC is regarded as the "SEC of Division II" thanks to a record 10 national championships. Current GSC members that have claimed titles include North Alabama (1993, '94, '95), Valdosta State (2004, '07, '12) and West Alabama (1971), while two former conference members who have since moved up to the Division I ranks have also national rings, Jacksonville State (1992) and Troy State (1984, '87).

## GETTING DEFENSIVE

Facing an offense that the week before rolled up 59 points and nearly 650 yards, the Hawks' defense cut by more than half Carson-Newman's output last week. The Hawks held the Eagles, who scored 10 of their 20 points off of turnovers that occurred deep in Shorter territory, to just 296 yards, 208 of that on the ground. This week, the defense has yet another challenge facing a Kennesaw State team that averages 57 points and 444 yards a game.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Kennesaw State is the fifth NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision opponent the Hawks have faced - they've played six FCS games - since Shorter started football in 2005 and the second FCS program from Georgia they've faced. The Hawks' previous FCS tests came against Western Carolina (2008), Georgia State (2010), Charleston Southern twice (2012 and '13) and Campbell (2012), which was Shorter's lone win against a DI program thanks to a 31-20 season-opening victory.

# Phil Jones Head Coach

Nothing excites Phil Jones more than the arrival of a new football season.

This year, however, as the football coach begins his 47th year spending his days doing the work he so dearly loves, Jones is at one of the highest points in his nearly half a century of preseason mindsets.

That doesn't come as a surprise as Jones is blessed with the return of nearly 80 returning players, including a defense in which all of last year's starters and reserves are back, a group of seniors who is providing some remarkable leadership, and one of the most talented group of first-year players.

And adding even more to the enthusiasm that Jones has, a feeling that has quickly spread throughout the team, is the arrival of an almost entirely

new coaching staff, the youngest Jones has had since that inaugural season.

"The players came in upbeat and everyone on the coaching staff is excited about that," Jones said as the Hawks prepare for the program's 11th season with a determination to make a statement in the NCAA Division II football ranks and in the Gulf South Conference, "and their enthusiasm has helped the team make the transition to the new coaches who are just as enthusiastic.

"Everything and everyone is meshing together," he said. "I'm excited about it!"

Yet Jones has found that as the 2015 campaign arrives that the mesh the Hawks have found already is one that includes what has been the foundation of the program since that first team arrived

on the "Hill" 11 years ago – relationships with each other and above all else with God.

"I can't take credit for that. It starts with the Lord," the coach, who has compiled a 54-52 record at Shorter, said. "He helped me not to be afraid when we first started and has helped me move forward."

Moving forward this season, Jones believes, is the right and only step the Hawks need to make as Shorter begins

its second year as a full Division II and GSC member and focuses on turning around what has been frustrating results in the last two years that has seen the team come up with just five wins.

But in 2015, Jones, his coaching staff, his players and everyone involved with the

Hawks football team are confident they can once again put the program in the spotlight that has shined previously on the program.

In their first full season as playing as a Division II program in 2012, the Hawks produced their sixth winning season in the eight years of the team's existence recording a 6-5 overall record and, much to the surprise of many, a 2-3 record in the conference they are a part of – the Gulf South Conference.

Just three years after starting the team, Jones saw the 2008 Hawks put the program in the national spotlight, winning their first Mid-South Conference West Division championship rolling up a record nine wins – Shorter was ranked No. 11 in the final NAIA national poll – and securing their first postseason appearance

by earning a berth in the NAIA National Playoffs.

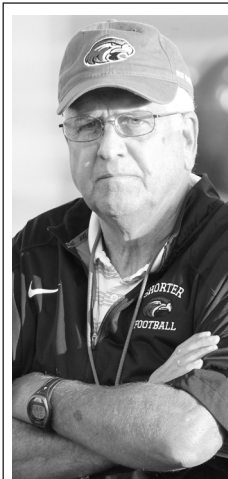
For his work that season, Jones picked up a wealth of post-season awards including Mid-South Conference West Division Coach of the Year and American Football Coaches' Association (AFCA) Region I Coach of the Year.

Jones came to Shorter in 2005 from Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, N.C. He served as an assistant coach for the Bulldogs, who won back-to-back Big South Conference championships during his tenure. Prior to Gardner-Webb, Jones served as an assistant coach at Southern Methodist University and coached under Jim Donnan at the University of Georgia from 1997-2001.

In addition to his collegiate coaching success, Jones coached Georgia high school football for 29 years, his last stop coming at Winder-Barrow High from 1984-97 where he led his teams to the playoffs eight times and compiling an 81-58-2 record in those 14 years.

In 1993, Winder-Barrow advanced to the State AAA semifinals, earning Jones the honor of 1993 AAA Coach of the Year.

A native of Thomaston, Jones graduated from Mercer in 1968. He and his wife, Janie, have two children and five grandchildren.

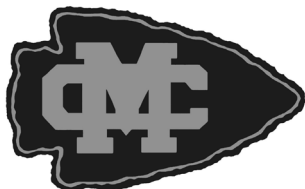
