For the second straight week, a pair of unbeaten teams will face off Saturday in the University of Dayton football team's final non-conference game of the 2015 season.

Dayton (2-0) is undefeated in 2015 after a pair of wins against NEC foes Robert Morris and Duquesne. Saturday's foe, Kennesaw State (3-0), is undefeated in football as this is the very first season of football on KSU campus.

Saturday's kickoff at Welcome Stadium is 6 p.m. ET. It is the first of two night games this year.

The Flyers knocked off Duquesne 24-13 on Sept. 19 behind PFL Player of the Week performances by Connor Kacsor (244 yards, 3 TD's) and Cameron Stubbs (2 int, 6 tackles).

The Flyers were picked to finish second in the Pioneer Football League in this year's poll of the league's coaches. This is the 23rd season of the PFL. UD's 11 titles are the most in league history.

Dayton finished 8-3 overall and 6-2 in the PFL in 2014. The Flyers finished tied for second in the Pioneer Football League and had their 37th winning season in the last 38 years last year.

Rick Chamberlin is in his eighth season as UD's head coach and returns 14 starters (seven offense, six defense, one specialist) from 2014.

Dayton is led by senior running back Connor Kacsor, who is UD's career record holder in rushing yardage. A preseason All-American, Kacsor was the 2014 PFL Offensive Player of the Year after gaining 1,547 yards with 17 TD's.

GOOD NEWS WORTH REPEATING

The Flyers enter the season with the fourth-best winning percentage (.738, 124-41) in FCS football since 2000 AND have produced the most football Academic All-Americans (22) at any level of competition in the same time frame. The top five in winning percentage are North Dakota State (.845), Harvard (.799), Montana (.775), Dayton (.738), and San Diego (.698).

STREAKING

UD has not been shut out in a school-record 433 straight games, the best such active string in all of college football. The last team to shut out the Flyers was Marshall, 9-0, on Oct. 16, 1976. That is also the all-time FCS record.

SERIES STUFF

- This is the first meeting between Dayton and Kennesaw State.
- But this is not the first meeting between Dayton and a school from Georgia. The Flyers dropped games against Oglethorpe in 1929 and 1930.
- The Stormy Petrels also defeated schools like Clemson, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech and Wake Forest during that time.
- The school dropped football at the start of WWII and has not brought it back to campus.
- It may be too late, but at the risk of providing too much information, the Stormy Petrel (pronounced PEA-trell) is a type of shore bird.

SCOUTING THE OWLS

- Kennesaw State is one of four schools beginning or re-starting football this season, and is the only one with a win at this point.
- The Owls start three seniors, seven juniors, one sophomore, 11 redshirt freshmen and one true freshman.
- Junior DB Derrick Farrow was the Big South Defensive Player of the Week after week two, with five tackles and three forced fumbles.
- Redshirt junior QB Trey White is the team's leading rusher (48 carries, 257 yds. 5.4 avg., 4 TD). He is also 13 of 25 passing (.520) for 352 yards and two scores, with one interception.

PFL POWER

- The Pioneer Football League is in its 23rd season. The original (and now the only) Division I strictly need-based football league began with charter members Butler, Dayton, Drake, Evansville, San Diego and Valparaiso.
- UD's 96-31 PFL mark is the best in PFL history.

600 CLUB

- The Flyers were the 11th NCAA FCS team (and the first west of the Alleghenies) to win 600 games in its football history in 2008.
- The 16 members of the club, heading into the 2015 season are: Yale (884), Harvard (848), Penn (830), Princeton (804), Dartmouth (676), Delaware (674), Lehigh (671), North Dakota State (671), Lafayette (669), Dayton (649), Northern Iowa (641), Cornell (633), North Dakota (625), Colgate (625), Holy Cross (613) and Brown (.601).
- Of the 600 Club members, Dayton has played the fewest seasons (106, nine fewer than Northern Iowa's 115).



THE MAN AT THE TOP

- Rick Chamberlin is now in his eighth season in charge of the Flyer football program. His record is 57-23.
- He is third all-time in wins at Dayton, behind two members of the College Football Hall of Fame -- Mike Kelly (246 wins) and Harry Baujan (124).
- Chamberlin is also in his 41st season as part of the Flyer football program. A Flyer All-American linebacker in his playing days, he has been a part of 351 of UD's 651 wins – 26 as a player, 268 as an assistant coach, and 57 as a head coach. He has also been a part of 452 of UD's 1,037 games.
- The Springfield, Ohio native is the 23rd head football coach since the program began in 1905. He is the first of the 11 modern era coaches to have lettered for the Flyers, and the second to be a graduate of the University of Dayton (Pete Ankney was the first when he coached in 1963 and 1964).
- Chamberlin, 59, had been on the Flyer coaching staff for 29 seasons before being named head coach. First as linebackers coach and then as defensive coordinator, Chamberlin helped mold the Dayton D's reputation for its preparation and execution as a unit. Under Chamberlin's guidance as an assistant and now as a head coach, the Flyers have led the Pioneer Football League in scoring defense in nine of the last 12 seasons.
- A four-year letterwinner (1975-78) for the Flyers, Chamberlin was named to the Football Coaches Association Small College All-America team. He was the third Dayton player to be named a First Team All-American, and was the first defensive player. He was inducted in to the UD Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989.

KACSOR NAMED TO STATS WATCH LIST

- Connor Kacsor has been named to the STATS, LLC Player of the Year Award Watch List. The award goes to the nation's top football player who plays in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision
- Kacsor is the only offensive player from the PFL named to the Payton Watch List this year. He is the second Dayton player to be named to the watch list. Steve Valentino was named in 2010.
- Kacsor is everything you want in a running back. He is powerful (301 yards vs. Georgetown), fast (three TD's of 50 yards or more vs. Morehead State), durable (47 carries vs. Davidson), dependable (65 of his 81 yards at Marist came in the fourth quarter with UD protecting a lead) and clutch (four TD's in five OT's at Davidson).

GROUND GAINER

- Already the career rushing record holder at the Dayton, redshirt senior Connor Kacsor is the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year.
- He was a marked man at Robert Morris, with 33 carries for 72 yards. Fifty-three of his yards came in the second half.
- Kacsor ran 40 times for 244 yards and three TD's in the Duquesne win. After the Dukes took a 13-3 lead with 7:53 left in the third quarter, Kacsor carried the ball 22 times for 150 yards to lead the Flyers to the win. He was PFL co-Offensive Player of the Week.
- Those 244 yards are the best in FCS in 2015.
- He is currently second in FCS football in rushing yards per game (159.0).
- He was fifth in FCS football in rushing yards per game (140.6) in 2014.
- Kacsor was named a Preseason All-American by Stats, LLC and Lindy's. His 1,457 yards in 2014 were the third-best Flyer single-season total, behind Gradlin Pruitt (1,591) and Dave Jones (1,803).
- He was named First Team Preseason All-PFL for the second straight season.
- He ran for a Dayton-record 301 yards in last season's opener against Georgetown. It was the second-best single-game effort in the PFL, just 12 yards short of the league record held by Sean Bennett of Evansville.
- He now has five of the top nine Flyer single-game rushing performances of 200 yards or more. (Gary Kosins has two, Dave Jones has one and Jermaine Bailey has one).
- Kacsor has 15 games of 100+ yard efforts in 32 career games, with 12 in his last 20.
- Five of those 15 are for 200 yards or more.

JUST IN TIME JESKE

- With the Flyers limited to 16 yards in their first six possessions at Robert Morris., Dayton turned to redshirt freshman Alex Jeske to spark the offense late in the second quarter.
- Jeske completed his first three passes, and for the game was 11 of 17 for 162 yards with an interception and a TD. He also carried the ball six times for 41 yards and a rushing touchdown.
- With Jeske at the helm, Dayton gained 277 yards in total offense in a little more than a half.
- In his first career start (Duquesne), he was 15 of 26 passing for 206 yards.
- He currently leads the PFL in yards per completion (14.15) and yards per attempt (8.56). passing efficiency (135.4),

TO SERVE AND PROTECT

- On the Dayton offensive line, center Shane Toub and tackles Zac Morgan and Jimmy Vogel return as starters.
- Toub and Morgan started all 11 games last year, while Vogel has 15 career starts (8 last year due to injury).

TO REALLY SERVE AND PROTECT

- Offensive guard Patrick Nuzzolese is a volunteer firefighter when he is home in Port Washington, N.Y. on Long Island. He celebrated his fourth anniversary with his “other team” last April.
- He was nominated for the AFCA Allstate “Good Works” Team.
- Nuzzolese is currently rehabbing a knee injury suffered during camp.

GOOD HANDS PEOPLE

- Senior captain Cory Stuart led UD with five catches for 91 yards in the RMU win.
- Seven different players caught passes in the season-opening win at Robert Morris.
- In the Duquesne win, Jack Euritt (87 yards) and Tyler Tumpane (41) led UD with five receptions.
- Euritt leads the Flyers this season with seven catches for 104 yards (14.9). Stuart is second (six for 94, 15.7).
- The Dayton receiving corps returned four players with double-digit receptions last year.
- Stuart was third on the team with 35 catches (10.9 avg) in 2014.
- Connor Kacsor caught 21 balls out of the backfield (5.8).
- Then true-freshman Tyler Tumpane had 18 catches (11.2)
- Tight end Ian Palin pulled in 13 passes (9.8).

ROLE REVERSAL

- The top two yards-per-catch averages so far in 2015 belong to running backs.
- In a small sample size, Connor Kacsor has two catches with an 18.5 average, and Jared Ruffing has two for 18.0.

CHRISTOPHER CLUB

- Senior linebacker Christopher Beaschler leads the PFL in tackles per game (12.0).
- Beaschler also leads the Flyers in sacks (2.0) and TFL (3.5)
- He had a career-high 18 tackles at Robert Morris.
- It was also the most tackles by a Flyer in a single game in the last six years.
- He was one of seven players who were First Team All-PFL and First Team Academic All-PFL in 2014.
- He was second in the league in tackles per game (10.1) last year.
- A 2015 team captain, Beaschler was named Preseason First Team All-PFL.

BALLHAWKS

- Danny Leach and Cameron Stubbs are two of the 19 players tied for the lead in FCS interceptions per game (1.0).

DANNY BOY

- Team captain and senior safety Danny Leach was the first PFL Defensive Player of the Week after two interceptions, four tackles and a pass break up in the Robert Morris win.
- His 93-yard TD return in the second quarter was UD's third-longest ever.
- He currently leads FCS football (tied) in interceptions (1.0 per game) and fourth (tied) nationally in passes defended (1.5).
- He was one of three true freshmen to letter in 2012.
- He was third on the team in total tackles (67) and solo hits (42) in 2014.
- Leach was the only player on the team with an interception, a pass broken up, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a sack in 2014.

CAD CAM DESIGN

- Cameron Stubbs was named PFL Defensive Player of the Week when he intercepted two passes in the Duquesne win.
- He was second on the team with six tackles.
- He currently leads FCS football (tied) in interceptions (1.0) and fourth (tied) nationally in passes defended (1.5).
- Stubbs also leads the PFL in kickoff returns (tied, 24.3).

DAYTON DEFENSIVE DEPTH

- Three players -- Christian Searles, Nolan Harmotto and Jack Crain -- are tied for second on the team in total tackles (13).
- Searles' nine solo hits are also second.
- Harmotto leads the team with three passes broken up.

SUPER SUDNICK

- Senior defensive end Nate Sudnick led Dayton and was tied for fifth in the PFL in sacks (0.50 per game) in 2014.
- He had six tackles with a sack at RMU.
- He joined Connor Kacsor and Chris Beaschler as a Preseason First Team All-PFL selection.

MIGHTY EIGHT

- Eight Flyers had at least one fumble recovery in 2014, and seven of them returned this year -- Nate Sudnick and Ryan Schwenke, Danny Leach, William Will, Austin Alber and Christopher Beaschler, Christian Searles.

SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMS

- Dayton blocked six kicks in 2014, the most by UD in 12 years.
- The Flyers have blocked two in the first two games of 2015.
- The Flyers blocked three kicks and scored a special teams "defensive" TD at San Diego when Jack Crain recovered a punt blocked by Zach Elias.
- Versus Drake, Cameron Stubbs turned an extra point attempt into two points for the Flyers after scooping up the blocked kick and returning it 81 yards.
- UD was second in the PFL as a team in kickoff return average (21.2).

KAPTAIN KACZKOWSKI

- Senior Nick Kaczkowski has been designated by the coaches as UD's special teams captain for the second straight year.
- He blocked a punt at RMU.
- Kaz had 12 special teams hits in 2014.
- He is also the third-string long-snapper.

ALSO A COMPLETE SENTENCE

- William Will is on the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List for the second straight year. The Mitchell Award goes annually to the top non-FBS kicker in college football.
- At Robert Morris, his first field goal attempt was blocked due to a breakdown in the line, but he was two-for-three in the game. His 37-yarder with 2:32 left proved to be the game-winner. He also recovered a fumble.
- In a matter of 15 months, Will went from walk-on tryouts to being the 2013 First Team All-Pioneer Football League placekicker. In his first year of collegiate action as a redshirt freshman he was 10 of 12 on field goals and 41 of 43 in PAT's. He was five-of-six in field goals from beyond 30 yards and was UD's leading scorer with 71 points.
- Last year, he had 84 points (14-19 FG, 36-38 PAT).
- He opened scoring for the 2014 season with a 49-yard field goal, the longest by a Dayton kicker in 30 years.
- He is 17-of-21 between 30 and 49 yards in his career.
- Will led the PFL and was tied for 20th in FCS in field goals per game (1.20).

PIONEER FOOTBALL LEADERS

- UD led the PFL in rushing offense (195.5), pass defense (189.0), turnover margin (+10) and opponent 3rd down conversions (29.8%, 51-171) in 2014.
- The Flyers were also second in scoring offense (30.4), pass defense efficiency (105.4), interceptions (17), kickoff return average (21.2), sacks allowed (16), and time of possession (31:33).
- Dayton was also third in total offense (388.8), sacks against (15), and opponent 1st downs (18.5).

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

- In the last 15 years, the University of Dayton football program has produced 22 Academic All-Americans, the most of any college football team.
- In the history of the Academic All-America program, UD football has had 52 Academic All-Americans.
- Among schools playing Division I football, only Nebraska (106), Penn State (62) and Notre Dame (58) have had more. Oklahoma (51) and Ohio State (50) are next.
- The Flyers also had a PFL-record 76 players on the 2014 PFL Academic Honor Roll, the most in the PFL for the 20th time in the 22-year history of the league.

FOUR ARE ASHE SPORTS SCHOLARS

Four University of Dayton football players -- Michael Gray, Branden Johnson, Dan Ney and Shaquille Tensley -- were named 2014 Arthur Ashe Sports Scholars last spring. The award is selected by the magazine staff at Diverse: Issues in Higher Education.

DAYTON AND THE CAMPBELL TROPHY

- UD has had at least a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, the major award of the NFF's Scholar-Athlete Award program (the academic Heisman if you will), for nine straight years.
- Among D-I schools, the Flyers are one of eight institutions with a semifinalist in the last nine years. The others are Austin Peay, Bucknell, Montana, Nebraska, Rutgers, South Dakota State and Texas.
- In 2007, safety Brandon Cramer was one of 15 finalists for the trophy. As a finalist, he earned an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship.
- Cramer was also the 2007 Division I football Academic All-American of the Year.

WELCOME MAT

- UD moved to Welcome Stadium in 1974
- The word "Welcome" implies hospitality, but UD has been anything but hospitable to its opponents at home, where it is 212-46-2 (.819).
- The "Welcome" is not a greeting, but an honor to the late Percival Welcome, longtime AD for the Dayton Public Schools.

FLYER FAMILY

Six current members of the Flyer football team had relatives who also played for UD.

- Two whose fathers played -- Austen Alber (Tim, 1986-88), Anthony Diorio (Rob, 1983-85), and four who had brothers -- Andrew McCormick (Pat, 2006-08), Luke Welsh (Ben, 2008-12)), Tucker Yinger (Mitch, 2010-14) and coach Charley O'Dell (Jack, 2004-07).

FLYER FOR HIRE

Former Dayton cornerback Kyle Sebetich spent the preseason as a non-roster invitee in the Green Bay Packers camp.

- The Kenosha, Wisc. native was signed by the Packers in March, after spending parts of 2014 on the New York Giants practice squad.
- He was injured late in camp, but hopes to be signed to a practice squad when he rehabs.
- Two other former Flyers played in Europe this summer -- Ross Smith (Potsdam Royals) and Zach Elias (Kirchdorf Wildcats).
- Smith set league records for receiving yards, passes caught and touchdowns caught.

SUPER STAT

- When Jon Gruden coached the Tampa Bay Bucs to the Super Bowl championship in 2003, he became the second UD grad to coach a Super Bowl winner.
- Former UD co-captain and Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Noll won four as coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers.
- Noll started at center and linebacker for the Flyers and graduated in 1953 before playing in the NFL.
- Gruden played quarterback at Dayton and earned his degree in 1986.
- UD became only the third school (now there are four) to have two alumni coach Super Bowl winners. The others are San Jose State (Bill Walsh and Dick Vermeil), Arkansas (Jimmy Johnson and Barry Switzer), and Eastern Illinois (Mike Shanahan and Sean Payton).
- At the time of their wins, Gruden was the second-youngest coach to win a Super Bowl and Noll was the fifth-youngest.
- As a matter of fact, UD has ties to 19 Super Bowl rings. In addition to Noll's four and Gruden's one, six former members of Dayton coaching staffs own a total of 14 Super Bowl rings between them.
- They include current Saints offensive coordinator Joe Lombardi (XLIV). Lombardi, an Air Force Academy grad and the grandson of Vince Lombardi, began his coaching career at Dayton. He coached for three seasons on Mike Kelly's staff while stationed at Wright-Patterson AFB.

GAME 1 -- DAYTON 27, ROBERT MORRIS 24
MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. - The Flyers came from behind twice in the second half to pull out a hard-fought 27-24 win at Robert Morris on Saturday. Dayton trailed by 10 at halftime, gained a lead, lost a lead, tied the game with 6:15 left and took the deciding lead with 2:32 to go on a 37-yard field goal by William Will. Robert Morris got the ball back twice in the game's final minutes. The first possession ended on Danny Leach's second interception of the day, and the second ended at the Dayton 37-yard line when UD defensive end Nick Surges sacked Colonial quarterback Matthew Barr.

SCORING

- After a scoreless first quarter, Robert Morris scored a field goal and a TD to take a 10-0 halftime lead.
- Dayton scored 17 unanswered points in the third quarter to lead 17-10 heading into the fourth..
- RMU scored the next two touchdowns to lead 24-17 with 12:53 to go in the game.
- The Flyers tied it 24-24 with 6:15 remaining on an Alex Jeske 13-yard run, and one possession later, took the game-deciding lead on Will's second field goal of the game.

STATS

- Jeske, a redshirt freshman, came off the bench late in the first half to spark the UD offense. He completed his first three passes, and for the game was 11 of 17 for 162 yards with an interception and a TD. He also carried the ball six times for 41 yards and a rushing touchdown.
- Cory Stuart led all receivers with five catches for 91 yards and caught the TD pass.
- Connor Kacsor ran the ball 33 times (23 in the second half) for a tough 72 yards.
- Safety Danny Leach intercepted two passes on the day, and scored Dayton's first TD on a 93-yard return. It tied the game when it looked like RMU was going to take a two-touchdown lead, and it also tied the third-longest return in Dayton football history. Mark Kasmer and Sean Gorius both had 100-yarders in 1997 and 2001 respectively. Dan Thobe also had a 93-yard return in 1992.
- Leach also had four tackles and forced a fumble.
- Linebacker Chris Beaschler had a career-high 18 tackles (9 solo) with two sacks. He also had a pass batted away.
- Nolan Harmotto had nine tackles, two passes broken up and a QB hurry.
- Freshman punters Sean Smith and Chris Papalia had impressive debuts. Smith averaged 45.0 yards on three punts with one inside the 20. Papalia's lone punt was a 40-yarder that went out at the seven.

NOTES

- Dayton has scored in 432 consecutive games, the longest active streak in college football. The streak is also the FCS record, and goes back to 1976.
- The Flyers lead the series with RMU 16-2, and has won the last 13 meetings.

GAME 2 -- DAYTON 24, DUQUESNE 13

DAYTON - The University of Dayton moved to 2-0 on the season thanks to a dominating performance from Connor Kacsor en route to a 24-13 win over Duquesne University at Welcome Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Flyers trailed 6-3 at the half, but UD put together 250 yards of total offense in the second half and handed the Dukes their first loss of the season. Kacsor led the Flyers offense with 244 hard-earned ground yards, while finding the end zone three times on the afternoon.

SCORING

- Dayton opened the scoring with a William Will field goal from 46 yards to take a 3-0 lead in the first quarter.
- Duquesne recovered a fumble in the end zone to take a 6-3 lead at the end of the opening quarter.
- The Dukes opened the scoring in the second half with a 26-yard passing touchdown to go ahead 13-3.
- UD scored 21 unanswered points, 14 of which came in the third quarter.
- Kacsor capped off the scoring with a 34-yard scamper in the fourth quarter.

STATS

- Kacsor, a redshirt senior, tallied 157 of his 244 yards in the second half.
- He finished the game with 40 rushes and three second half touchdowns.
- Alex Jeske had 206 passing yards on the afternoon.
- Redshirt sophomore Jack Euritt led the Flyers with five receptions for 87 yards.
- Cornerback Cameron Stubbs had two interceptions to go along with six tackles.
- This was the second consecutive game that UD hasda player with two picks.
- Christian Searles led Dayton with eight tackles.

NOTES

- Dayton has scored in 433 consecutive games, the longest active streak in in college football. The streak is also the FCS record, and goes back to 1976.
- UD has won two straight against Duquesne at Welcome Stadium, with the margin of victory of 11 points being the largest margin of victory for the Flyers since 2001 (when UD won 42-16).
