Kickoff for the sold out game is slated for 4 p.m. and will be televised locally on WUPA-TV (Atlanta's CW69). Jon Nelson (play-by-play), D.J. Shockley (analyst) and Ashley Rose (sideline) will describe the action. The contest will also be streamed on the Big South Network.

An audio broadcast will be available at www.KSUOwls.com with Brian Giffin, Tutan Reyes and Art Eckman reporting on the action.

GAME DAY CENTRAL: A Game Day Central page has been created at www.KSUOwls.com/gameday where fans and media can find all information pertaining to game day.

THE MARCHING OWLS DEBUT: Adding the pageantry of the first home game, will be The Marching Owls,

Kennesaw State's marching band. The roughly 300 musicians and color guard members are under the direction of Debra Traficante.

BOHANNON MAKES SUCCESSFUL HEAD COACHING DEBUT:

Brian Bohannon made a successful head coaching debut last week at East Tennessee State as the Owls recorded an impressive 56-16 victory over the Buccaneers in Johnson City, Tenn.

OWLS PLAY AT FCS LEVEL: Kennesaw State will play at the Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. KSU joined the Big South Conference as an associate member on Sept. 4, 2013.

A LOOK AHEAD: The Owls will be back in action Saturday, Sept. 19, when they host Division II opponent Shorter at Fifth Third Bank Stadium beginning at 1 p.m.

DEBUT PROGRAMS IN 2015: Kennesaw State is one of four institutions who have debuted football in 2015. Along with the Owls, East Tennessee State (FCS), Finlandia University (Division III), located in Hancock, Mich.

and Lyon College (NAIA) in Batesville, Ark. started football programs this fall.

A LOOK BACK: Kennesaw State wrote a compelling opening chapter to its history with a dominant 56-16 victory East Tennessee State on Sept. 3. The Owls rolled up 512 yards of offense, including 416 on the ground. Seven different KSU players found the end zone as the Owls scored 49 unanswered points in building a 56-13 lead. Redshirt junior quarterback Trey White scored the first TD in program history and connected with redshirt freshman Justin Sumpter on a 69-yard scoring play, while redshirt running back Jae Bowen scored on runs of 2 and 1 yards. Redshirt defensive lineman Nick Perrotta had the game-changing play of the game, intercepting a pass late in the second quarter and returning it 19 yards for a touchdown.

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS: Thursday's 56-16 win over East Tennessee State marked a night of firsts in the history of the Kennesaw State football program. Here is a list of a few of the firsts:

- **First Offensive Play:** Trey White 4-yard rush
- **First Touchdown:** Trey White 6-yard run (1st quarter)
- **First Passing Touchdown:** White 69 yards to Justin Sumpter (3rd quarter)
- **First Defensive Tackle:** Taylor Henkle (1st quarter)
- **First Defensive Touchdown:** Nick Perrotta 19-yard INT return (2nd quarter)

SCOUTING EDWARD WATERS: The Tigers are currently 2-1 on the season following a 51-7 loss to Morehouse College on Saturday. Edward Waters opened its season with wins over University of the Faith (76-7) and University of God's Chosen (57-8). Head coach Alvin Wyatt, Sr. is in his third season leading the Tigers and has an all overall record of 22-27, including an 8-9 mark at Edward Waters.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

Trey White (R-Jr., Quarterback, Atlanta, Ga.)

- Made collegiate debut and saw first football game action since senior year (2011) in high school
- Guided the Owls to a 56-16 win in program's inaugural game at East Tennessee State on Thursday (Sept. 3)
- Rushed for 96 yards on 16 carries and scored KSU's first touchdown (6-yard run)
- 2-for-6 passing for 96 yards, including a 69-yard TD pass to Justin Sumpter on second play of second half
- Engineered KSU on five scoring drives

Darnell Holland (Fr., Running Back, Bowdon, Ga.)

- Had two rushes for 83 yards, including 63-yard TD run
- Had 23-yard kickoff return
- Totaled 106 all-purpose yards

Team Notes

- The Owls were 5-for-5 in red zone scoring opportunities (5 TDs)
- Four different players Trey White; 96; Chaston Bennett; 87; Darnell Holland; 83; and Micah Reed, 78) rushed for 70 or more yards.
- The Owls averaged 8.1 yards per play
- Kennesaw State had five touchdown drives of 50 or more yards, including four of 65 yards or more
- The 56 points are the most scored by a debuting FCS program dating back to 2008, and the 40-point win is the second largest during that same time period. KSU is one of just two teams to open against another FCS program among 10 institutions that have started a program. Charlotte, which debuted as an FCS program and has since moved to the FBS level, defeated Campbell, 52-7, in 2013.
- The 56 points by the Owls tied for the fifth most scored in FCS play during the opening weekend and led Big South Conference teams
- The 512 total yards gained led Big South Conference teams and KSU's 416 yards rushing were the third-highest total nationally
- After trailing 13-7 in the second quarter, the Owls scored 49 unanswered points. A total of seven players scored touchdowns, including

redshirt freshman Jae Bowen, who scored twice on short runs.

- Freshman placekicker Justin Thompson was 8-for-8 on extra point attempts
- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Justin Sumpter caught two passes for 96 yards, including 69-yard TD reception
- Redshirt freshman quarterback Jake McKenzie saw playing time in the fourth quarter and had a 7-yard touchdown run

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Redshirt junior defensive lineman Nick Perrotta had a game-changing 19-yard interception return for a TD late in the second quarter that gave the Owls a 21-13 lead. He finished with four tackles, including two for loss.
- Kennesaw State limited ETSU to 98 rushing yards (2.6 yards per carry)
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Mason Harris tied for the team lead with seven tackles, including three for loss and a sack for 10 yards. He also had two quarterback hurries and a forced fumble.
- Redshirt freshman Taylor Henkle tied for the team lead with seven tackles, including one for loss, and had a pass breakup. He also recorded the first defensive tackle in program history.
- Redshirt defensive back Dante' Blackmon had four tackles and returned an interception 23 yards.

SMASHING DEBUT: Kennesaw State is the sixth different program to win its first game as members of the Big South Conference, joining Gardner-Webb and Elon in 2002, Coastal Carolina in 2003, Stony Brook in 2008 and Monmouth in 2014. Meanwhile, the Owls' 56 points at East Tennessee State was the most scored by a Big South member in a season opener against an FCS opponent, and the fourth-most points scored overall in an opening game of a season since the league's formation in 2002.

OWLS FLY INTO BIG SOUTH RECORD BOOK: One game into its history, Kennesaw State has already written itself into the Big South Conference record book:

- The Owls' 416 yards and six touchdowns rushing in their debut game against East Tennessee marked just the 10th time in league history that a football member gained at least 415 yards on the ground with six rushing TDs. The last to do it was Presbyterian on Sept. 6, 2014 against Bluefield (523/7). KSU's performance was just the fifth such effort against an FCS opponent.

THE VIEW FROM THE SIDELINE: Head coach Brian Bohannon, who spent most of his career as an assistant coach in the press box on game day, has moved from the coaches' booth to the sideline in 2015. Prior to last Thursday's opener, Bohannon last coached a game from the sideline during his final season at Georgia Southern in 2001.

IN THE BOOTH: Offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Grant Chesnut, quarterbacks coach Cody Worley, defensive line coach Kevin Downing and defensive backs coach Chris Bland will be positioned in the booth.

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: As a startup program, Kennesaw State will feature a young team that is dominated by freshmen and redshirt freshmen. Of the 105 players listed on the Owls roster, 73 are either true freshmen (20) or redshirt freshmen (53). The roster also includes 11 sophomores, 16 juniors and five seniors.

THE SENIORS: The five seniors on the Kennesaw State roster include Chaz Cheeks (DL, Gainesville, Ga. / Georgia Tech), Brett Gillespie (OL, Kennesaw, Ga. / North Greenville), Ryan Godhigh (RB, Acworth, Ga. / Harrison HS), Mason Harris (DL, Fort Oglethorpe, Ga. / South Carolina) and Prentice Stone (Marietta, Ga. / Eastern Kentucky).

TWO-DEEP BREAKDOWN: Head coach Brian Bohannon released the Kennesaw State two-deep on Friday (Aug. 28) and 27 players are either freshmen or redshirt freshmen. On offense, there are 15 freshmen or redshirt freshmen listed, including seven as starters. Defensively, 12

players fall into the above categories, with six being starters.

TRYOUT TO THE TWO-DEEP: A handful of players who took part in tryouts over the last year and a half, have made significant impressions on the coaching staff and earned their way onto the two-deep. Redshirt junior defensive lineman Nick Perrotta, redshirt sophomore linebacker Izzy Sam and redshirt senior Ryan Godhigh were part of the initial tryout on March 22, 2014. Additionally, redshirt senior PJ Stone (wide receiver) and redshirt freshman defensive back Shawn Reynolds have gone from tryout hopefuls to earning spots on the Owls two-deep.

THE QUARTERBACK POSITION: Redshirt junior quarterback Trey White is listed as the starting quarterback and backed up by redshirt freshman Jake McKenzie. White, a transfer from The Citadel, prepped at St. Pius X Catholic High School in Atlanta. McKenzie is a former all-state player from Monroe Academy in Monroeville, Ala.

LEADING THE WAY: Redshirt freshman quarterback Chandler Burks (Douglasville, Ga. / South Paulding HS) became the first recruit to verbally commit to Kennesaw State when he let head coach Brian Bohannon know of his intentions to attend KSU in the summer of 2013. He also was the first signee after inking his name to a National Letter-of-Intent on Feb. 5, 2014. Burks was one of 29 players who were part of the initial signing class.

RECRUITING GEORGIA: When head coach Brian Bohannon assumed the challenge of building a program, he said he was committed to recruiting the state of Georgia. He and his staff have stayed true to that plan as 92 of the 105 players on the roster are from Georgia. There are three players each from Alabama and Florida, two from Texas, and one each from California, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, South Carolina and Tennessee.

A GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE: Kennesaw State will face a challenging schedule during its inaugural season. Six of the Owls' 10 opponents posted winning records in 2014, including five of six Big South Conference teams. Non-conference foe Dayton (8-3), along with Big South rivals Liberty (9-5), Monmouth (6-5), Charleston Southern (8-4), Coastal Carolina (12-2) and Presbyterian (6-5) all were on the plus side of the win-loss ledger a year ago.

SCOUTING THE BIG SOUTH CONFERENCE: The Big South Conference is considered one of the country's top NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) conferences. According to HERO Sports, the Big South Conference is ranked second among the 13 conferences, behind only the Missouri Valley Conference, home to four-time defending national champion North Dakota State. STATS FCS has listed the Big South as the fourth-best conference, trailing the Missouri Valley, Colonial Athletic Association and Big Sky Conference. The Big South Conference has had two teams advance to the FCS playoffs in each of the last three seasons.

FLYING HIGH: The inaugural 2015 season can be labeled the "Year of the Bird". In addition to the Kennesaw State Owls, five opponents on KSU's schedule have a type of bird as part of their mascot. Those teams include Shorter (Hawks), Point (Skyhawks), Monmouth (Hawks), Coastal Carolina (Chanticleers) and Liberty. Although Liberty's, nickname is the Flames, it also has "Sparky the Eagle", who was introduced on campus in 2006.

KENNESAW STATE-ALABAMA STATE AGREE TO 4-YEAR SERIES: Kennesaw State and Alabama State jointly announced on Monday (Aug. 31) an agreement on a four-year series that will begin in 2017 and run through 2020. The two teams will meet for the first time on Sept. 16, 2017 at Fifth Third Bank Stadium before switching venues to The New ASU Stadium on Sept. 15, 2018. The remaining two games will be played Sept. 14, 2019 in Kennesaw before wrapping up the current agreement on Sept. 19, 2020 in Montgomery, Ala.

"Let me just first say how humbled and honored I am to be here today," Bohannon said in his opening remarks. "This is something you look forward to in our profession and I'm honored to be a part of an institution that is as special as this one is. I'm truly excited and it's surreal for me to hear 'first head football coach at Kennesaw State.'"

"I also want to give special thanks to University President Dr. Dan Papp, Vaughn Williams, the search committee and the people I met with during my interview," Bohannon added.

"My family is important to me and that's the culture I want to bring to KSU. People are excited to be here and to be in this department and that's what I want to continue," Bohannon said. "It was a surreal moment for me last night looking back on what's gotten me to this podium today. I started out on the field at age eight with my mom dropping me off. I've watched my dad coach and that's what I've learned from. It's had a huge affect on me and my path here today."

"My family, the coaches I've worked with, they've all been influential and I can't thank them enough and I'll never be able to," Bohannon added. "This is the plan laid out for me and I've followed it and that's why I'm here today."

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul

Since his arrival at Kennesaw State, Bohannon hit the ground running as he worked to assemble a staff, made numerous speaking engagements, and traveled the state of Georgia recruiting. He signed his first recruiting class of 29 players on Feb. 5, 2014, and added 16 future Owls to the nest on Feb. 4, 2015.

A native of Griffin, Ga., Bohannon has 17 seasons of coaching experience at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) levels, all of which have come while working with Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson.

During Bohannon's time at Georgia Tech in 2008, the Yellow Jackets finished in the top four nationally in rushing offense every season, including in 2010 when they led the nation in rushing for the first time in school history.

No team in college football rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech as the Yellow Jackets accumulated more than 20,000 yards on the ground during his last five seasons on The Flats.

In 2012, Georgia Tech broke school records for total offense and rushing yards. The Yellow Jackets also averaged a school-record 40.0 points per game in conference play.

Two B-backs - David Sims and Zach Laskey - combined to rush for more than



1,300 yards. Two quarterbacks - Tevin Washington and Vad Lee - combined to run for more than 1,200 yards. Washington broke the school record for rushing touchdowns in a season (20).

Under Bohannon's direction, former Georgia Tech quarterbacks Washington and Joshua Nesbitt emerged as two of the most prolific signal callers in Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) history. Nesbitt and Washington combined to rush for more than 5,000 yards and rank first and third, respectively, in ACC history for career rushing yards by a quarterback.

Under Bohannon, four players rushed for more than 1,000 yards in a season -- B-back Jonathan Dwyer in 2008, Dwyer and Nesbitt in 2009, and B-back Anthony Allen in 2010.

Dwyer was a first-team All-ACC selection (2008, 2009). Nesbitt was the first team All-ACC quarterback in 2009, and Allen was first-team all-conference in 2010. Dwyer and Allen advanced to the NFL.

Before arriving at Georgia Tech, Bohannon spent six years as wide receivers coach at

Navy. He was part of a staff that returned the Midshipmen to the national spotlight. Navy won 35 games over four years, earning a school-record four consecutive bowl berths and a school-best four straight Commander-In-Chief's Trophies.

Navy's offense put up remarkable numbers in 2007. The Midshipmen ranked first nationally in rushing (348.8 ypg), 10th in scoring (39.3 ppg.), and 22nd in total offense (444.1 ypg.) and ninth in sacks allowed (1.08 pg). Navy's rushing attack averaged a nation's best 318.7 yards per contest in 2005 as the Midshipmen went to a bowl game for a third straight year, won a second consecutive bowl game and captured the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for a third-straight year.

The Midshipmen led the nation in rushing (323.2 yards per contest) and set school records for rushing yards per game, total rushing yards (4,202), rushing yards per attempt (5.5), rushing touchdowns (44), total offense (5,506), total offense per game (423.5) and yards per play (6.0) in 2003.

Bohannon coached the wide receivers (1997-99) and defensive backs (2000-01) at Georgia Southern.

During Bohannon's five seasons in Statesboro, Georgia Southern advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, finishing as national runner-up in 1998 and claiming back-to-back national championships (1999 and 2000).

A four-year letter winner and standout as a wide receiver at Georgia, Bohannon started his coaching career at West Georgia before earning his first full-time position at Gardner-Webb (N.C.) as wide receivers coach in 1996.

Bohannon earned his bachelor's degree in general business from Georgia in 1993 and a master's in business education from West Georgia in 1996. He is married to the former Melanie Cobb and the couple has three children, sons Blake Patrick and Braden Thomas, and daughter Brooke Anna. The family resides in Woodstock, Ga.

Practices are open to the media during the pre-practice session and through the first three periods Monday through Wednesdays. The remainder of the practice is closed to all media. Post-practice interviews will be conducted outside the Kennesaw State locker room at Fifth Third Bank Stadium.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Kennesaw State home games are issued for working media only. Because of severe space limitations, seating will be based on a priority system. Individual game credentials must be requested two (2) weeks prior to the date of the game.

All members of the media must request credentials online at www.KSUOwls.com/FBCredentials.

Please keep in mind that credentials authorize an accredited organization for news coverage of the game. ANY unauthorized use of credentials subjects the bearer to ejection from the stadium and the accredited organization to revocation of all its credentials for future KSU athletic events.
