A I Skinner, a former Division I national coach of the year and two-time BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year, has been named the new head coach of the Kennesaw State men's basketball program, Director of Athletics Vaughn Williams announced on Sunday (April 26).

Skinner, who becomes the sixth head coach in program history, brings 22 years of Division I head coaching experience to Kennesaw State.

Skinner most recently served as associate head coach at Division I Bryant University in Rhode Island.

"I am extremely honored and excited to announce that AI Skinner has accepted our offer to become the next head coach of Kennesaw State men's basketball," Williams said. "It is a great compliment to the University and Department of Athletics to attract someone of AI's stature and record of accomplishments.

"Coach Skinner embodies every value, characteristic and skill set that we look for when choosing head coaches to lead our student-athletes," Williams added. "He has distinguished himself at the highest level of college basketball as evident by his nine NCAA Tournament appearances. He also has a stellar history of graduating his players as every men's basketball player who stayed four years at Boston College graduated.

"We look forward to Al bringing those attributes to Kennesaw State and building a men's basketball program that regularly challenges for Atlantic Sun Conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances, while at the same time instilling into our student-athletes those characteristics and values that are essen tial to being successful," Williams said.

#### **HEAD COACH AL SKINNER**

A current member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Ethics Coalition, Skinner compiled a 385-291 (.570) career record while guiding his teams to nine NCAA Tournament appearances and four conference titles during tenures at the University of Rhode Island and Boston College. His teams posted ten 20-plus win seasons.

"My lifelong passion has been basketball. I am passionate about coaching young men to be successful team members on winning basketball teams," Skinner said. "With the assistance of the alumni, student body, faculty, President Dan Papp, Director of Athletics Vaughn Williams and Owl fans, we will work tirelessly to build a basketball program Kennesaw State will be proud of. I appreciate the opportunity I have been given to coach the KSU basketball team."

The winningest coach in BC history, Skinner spent 13 seasons at The Heights, compiling a 247-165 (.560) record from 1997-2010. He took Boston College to six NCAA Tournaments in a seven-year stretch, leading his 2005-06 team to the Sweet 16. Four of his teams finished the year ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including the 2001 and 2007 clubs that concluded those seasons at No. 7.

After guiding the Eagles to a 27-5 overall record and the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Skinner was named 2001 National Coach of the Year by Chevrolet/CBS, ESPN, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News and the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA). He also earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Skinner earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year again in 2005 after leading Boston College to a 25-5 mark and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Eagles accomplished something no Big East team had done before by starting the season 20–0. During the streak, the Eagles beat two ranked opponents and, were one of two teams (Illinois) in the country to begin the year 20–0. Following a win over No. 9 Syracuse in early February, the Eagles vaulted to No. 3 in both the AP and coaches' polls, marking the highest ranking for any Boston College basketball team.

Prior to his time at BC, Skinner spent nine seasons as head coach at Rhode Island, leading the Rams to a 138-126 (.523) mark.

Skinner took over as head coach at URI in 1988 after serving as an assistant on the Rams' bench from 1984-88.

During his tenure in Kingston, he led Rhode Island to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths (1993 and 1997) and two more National Invitational Tournament (NIT) appearances (1992 and 1996), as well as three 20+ win seasons. He was named the Atlantic-10 Coach of the Year in 1991-92 and was inducted into the University of Rhode Island Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000.

Skinner comes to Kennesaw State after serving two seasons as associate head coach under longtime friend Tim O'Shea at Bryant University where the Bulldogs compiled a 34-29 (.540) overall record, including a 22-12 (.647) mark in the Northeast Conference. The two have a long history of sharing a bench as O'Shea spent 14 years as an assistant under Skinner at Rhode Island and Boston College.

Skinner first broke into coaching as an assistant at Marist College in 1982 following successful stints in the ABA and NBA from 1974-80 (Nets, Pistons, 76ers). Drafted by the ABA's New York Nets in the eighth round of the 1974 draft, Skinner was named to the 1974-75 ABA All-Rookie Team and led the Nets to an ABA Championship a year later.

Prior to his professional playing career, Skinner spent three years on the court at the University of Massachusetts from 1971-74, becoming the only player in Minuteman history to be named a three-time All-Yankee Conference selection.

A team captain and All-America Honorable Mention in 1973-74, Skinner remains one of the most decorated players in UMass basketball history, concluding his career with 1,235 points, 749 rebounds and 320 assists in 79 games. Skinner was inducted into the UMass Athletics Hall of Fame in 1982, and his No. 30 jersey was retired by the Minutemen on Feb. 18, 2004.

Skinner and his wife, Donna, have two grown children, Vaniecia and Andre.

#### THE ALL-TIME SERIES VERSUS FLORIDA GULF COAST

The Owls are 6-11 all time against Florida Gulf Coast and the Eagles have won the last nine games between the two teams. Last season in Fort Myers, the game came down to the final possession, but Gulf Coast ended up getting the victory 54-53.

#### **OWLS STAY HOT, TOPPING HATTERS 92-82**

Looking to keep the momentum going after sweeping the two Atlantic Sun leaders a week ago, Kennesaw State did just that beating Stetson 92-82 in a game where they led for over 38 minutes to get to 10-18 overall and 6-6 in league play.

Senior point guard and A-Sun Co-Player of the Week Yonel Brown scored 28 points and was second on the team with seven rebounds.

#### Post Play Stepping Up

With the team winning three straight A-Sun games and four of five games, Aubrey Williams and Bernard Morena have really stepped up. Williams has scored in double figures in all four of the wins and Morena has scored in double figures in two of them.

On the defensive end of the floor, the Owls have outrebounded their opponents in three of those four wins by five rebounds. Against Stetson, the team pulled down nine more rebounds than the Hatters. That is the biggest rebound margin in A-Sun play and second biggest margin for the Owls this season.

#### **Family Basketball Connection**

Kendrick Ray comes from a family that has produced its share of talent. Ray's older brother, Allan, played at Villanova and was named Big East Player of the Year his senior season in 2006 after averaging 18.5 points per game. That team made it to the elite eight that season.

His sister Brittany Ray played at Rutgers and was their leading scorer during her senior season in 2009.

Kendrick has kept the family tradition alive as he is currently second on the team averaging 18.4 points per game.

#### **Skinner's Assistant's have Success**

Al Skinner is the only head coach in the Atlantic Sun to have four former assistant coaches as NCAA Division I head coaches. Ed Cooley is at Providence, Bill Coen is at Northeastern, Tim O'Shea is at Bryant and Pat Duquette is the head coach at UMass Lowell.

#### **Owls Win Three Straight**

With the win against Stetson, Kennesaw State has won three straight against A-Sun opponents for the first time since the 2009-10 team won six conference games in a row.

#### **Racking up the Minutes**

Yonel Brown not only leads the Owls in minutes, playing 1,093 on the season, but he leads the nation averaging 39.0 minutes per game. He has played all 40 minutes in 18 of the 28 games this season, and he played 42 minutes in the overtime game against Elon.

#### Two Guards Lead the Way

Kendrick Ray and Brown are the highest scoring tandem in the A-Sun and they didn't disappoint against North Florida and Jacksonville. Ray led all scorers with 25 points against UNF and Brown finished with 22 points to combine for 47 in the game. Then, against Jacksonville Brown led the team with 27 and Ray chipped in with 24. It is the ninth time this season that the two have combined for at least 40 points and it was the fifth time they've combined for 50 points.

Overall, Brown is second in the conference averaging 19.2 points per game and Ray is third averaging 18.4. In conference play, the two have stepped it up even more as they are one and three in the standings as Brown averages 21.5 points per game and Ray averages 20.3 points per game.

#### **Lighting it Up from Outside**

Kennesaw State leads the A-Sun in three-point shooting percentage in conference play. The team shoots from behind the arc at a 41.7 percent clip. The next closest team is North Florida, who makes 39.9 percent of there threes.

#### **Sharing the Ball**

The team has had more assists than turnovers in 11 of 15 games. In three of those games, the Owls accumulated at least 20 assists.

Against Jacksonville, the team had a season high with 21 assists on 32 made field goals. The 21 assists is the most since the Owls had 22 and 25 in games during the 2008 season.

#### Offense Clicking in Conference Play

Since A-Sun play started, Kennesaw State has increased its conference scoring the most compared to its season average. After a 92 point performance against Stetson, the team averages 72.8 points per game for the season and is averaging 80.4 points per game in conference play.

During the three game win streak, KSU has been scoring at a historic clip as they have poured in 283 points over averaging 94.4 points per game.

#### **Home Sweet Home**

The Owls finished 8-6 in the KSU Convocation Center this season. With the win against Jacksonville, it matches the most wins at home since the team won eight in 2009-10.

#### **Balanced Scoring Attack**

When Kennesaw State has won this season, they have had multiple players chipping in on the offensive end of the floor. In seven of the 10 wins this season, the team has had at least four scorers in double figures and in two of those games, there were five in double figures.

#### .500 Record in the A-Sun

KSU currently has a 6-6 record in Atlantic Sun play with two games remaining in the regular season. The Owls haven't been .500 in league play since the first two seasons the team played in Division I. During the 2005-06 season the team finished 10-10 in the A-Sun and during the 2006-07 season, the team had a 9-9 conference record.

#### **KSU BY THE NUMBERS**

This will be Al Skinner's **1st** season as the head coach at Kennesaw State.

#### **Coach Skinner Introduced**

Kennesaw State named Al Skinner the sixth men's basketball coach in school history on April 26, 2015. Skinner has a career record of 390-305 in his 23rd season and has taken his team's to either the NCAA tournament (9 times) or NIT (3 times) a total of 12 times.

#### 1,000 Points Club

Yonel Brown scored his 1,000th point in one of his favorite places to play in Assembly Hall at Indiana on December 22. Needing 15 points, he made a layup while getting fouled and then hit the free throw with 16:42 remaining in the game to reach the 1,000 points mark. He is the first Owl since Delbert Love in 2013 to reach the 1,000-point mark.

#### **Weekly Awards**

The Owls have been awarded for some great performances throughout the season by the Atlantic Sun as the team has won a weekly award four times.

Brown and Ray have each won A-Sun Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week twice this season. After the game at Indiana, Brown was named A-Sun Player of the Week after pouring in 26 and added five assists, three steals and three rebounds. Ray had 22 points against the Hoosiers and was named Newcomer of the Week.

Ray won his first Newcomer of the Week award after having two double-doubles in a row against Elon and Florida A&M. Brown was named Co-Player of the Week after the first game of the season, when he led all scorers with 34 points against Alabama.

#### **SportsCenter Top 10**

Kennesaw State has landed on ESPN's Top 10 plays twice this season. The first occasion was when Kendrick Ray dunked on 6'10" Chinanu Onuaku of Louisville on a fast break.

In the next game against Chattanooga, Yonel Brown put up a shot from halfcourt to beat the shot clock, that bounced off the top of the backboard and swished through the net.

#### **Tough Non-Conference Schedule**

Heading into A-Sun play, Kennesaw State's non-conference schedule ranked 23rd in the country based on the NCAA rankings.

The Owls faced eight teams in the top 100 with four of those being in the top 50 RPI. No other team in the A-Sun played more than five teams in the top 100.

#### Reaching 100

Kennesaw State scored over 100 points in three games this season against Reinhardt, Lipscomb and North Florida. That is the most times a Kennesaw State team has reached the century mark since the team played at the NAIA level in 1993-94. When the Owls scored over 100 points against Reinhardt, it was the first time going over the century mark since joining the D-I ranks. The last time the team reached the century mark was in the 2004-05 season in a 103-61 victory over UNC Pembroke on Feb. 19, 2005.

#### **30-Point Performances**

Brown and Ray have combined for five 30-point performances this season. Brown has had three as he scored 34 against Alabama, 31 against Elon and 34 against Stetson. Ray has had two 30-point games scoring 30 against Mercer and 31 against FGCU.
