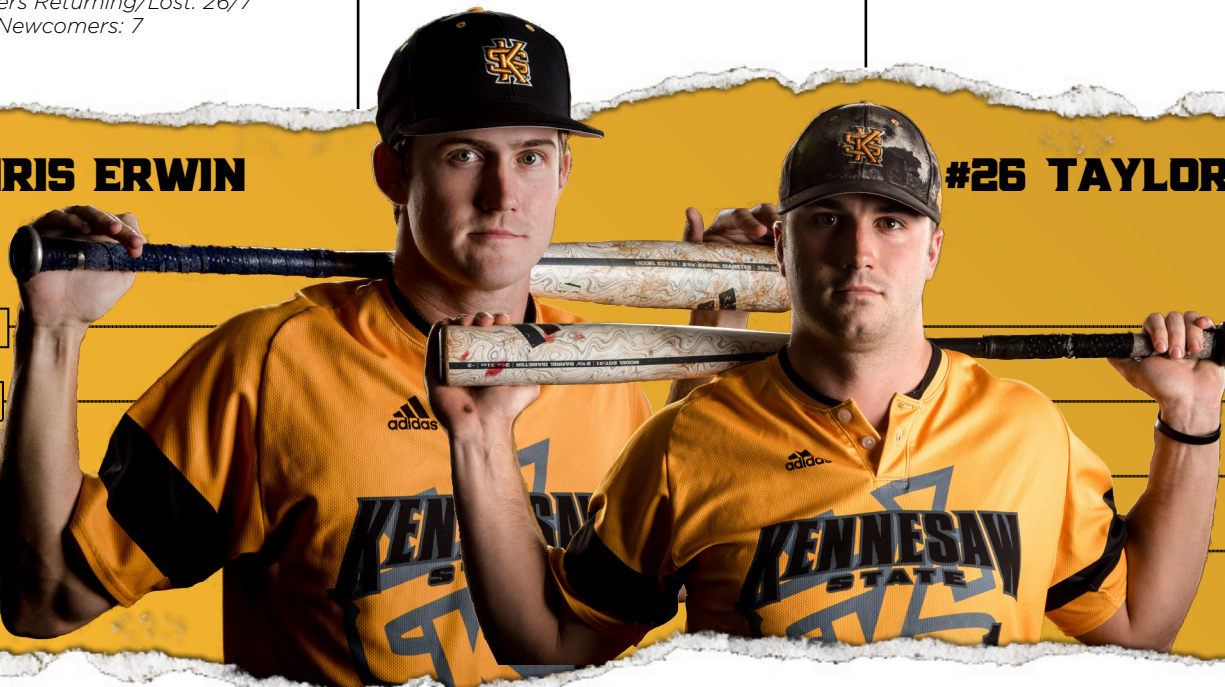

KENNESAW STATE SET FOR WESTERN CAROLINA, #12 OKLAHOMA THIS WEEKEND

The Owls hit the road for their sixth road game this season, traveling to Cullowhee, N.C., to take on Western Carolina at Hennon Stadium Thursday afternoon. Kennesaw State then returns home for a three-game series with #12 Oklahoma at Stillwell Stadium, which will air on ESPN3.

ON DECK

- Kennesaw State continues its non-conference slate, traveling to Cullowhee, N.C., to take on Western Carolina Thursday evening before taking on #12 Oklahoma for three games at Stillwell Stadium. The Owls are 2-3 on the road and 5-5 at home.
- Head Coach Mike Sansing is back for his 26th season with the Black and Gold. He is the second-youngest coach on the 1,000-win list, and is one of 13 active coaches with 1,000 victories who have coached at least 10 seasons of D-I baseball.
- The Owls' seven wins has Sansing sitting at 949 career victories at Kennesaw State, and sits one shy of the 950 mark, and 51 wins away from reaching 1,000 career wins as the Black & Gold's skipper.
- Taylor Allum continues to be KSU's hottest hitter at the plate, going 6-for-14 (.429) with two home runs, three RBI and scoring two runs over four games last week.
- Allum leads the team in batting average (.429), hits (21), home runs (7), RBI (19) and slugging percentage (.857). His seven HR is a career-best, as Allum totaled a combined four long balls in his first two seasons (2015-16).
- The one-two punch of Allum and junior Austin Upshaw has been a boast for the Owls' lineup, as the first baseman has helped Allum by totaling a .328 (20-for-61) BA, 20 hits, a team-high six doubles, four HR and 17 RBI. The two have combined to drive in 36 of KSU's 91 runs (40 percent).
- Freshman reliever Taylor Wilkes made his sixth appearance on the mound Sunday afternoon, working 3.0 innings and allowed just one hit. The Owls pulled away to win 5-4 and Wilkes picked up his first collegiate victory. He also is tied for second on the roster in appearances (6) and trails just Will Bice (7 app.) for most on the staff.
- KSU plays a total of 56 games in the regular season, 33 of them coming at home and 23 on the road. The Owls take on 16 (eight home, eight away) midweek tilts and opens ASUN action on the road at North Florida on March 31.
- The Owls return 26 members from 2016, a team that won 17 games in the ASUN and became the first team since 2010 (FGCU) to win each regular-season conference series.

ALLUM KEEPING HOT

- Junior outfielder Taylor Allum earned his first career ASUN Player of the Week honors after producing seven RBI, two home runs and going 8-for-12 (.667) in four games (March 1-5), announced on Monday, March 6.
- Allum, a Grayson, Ga., native, produced in a big way offensively during the Owls' 2-2 week. The left-handed hitter totaled hits in all four games, with three of them being multi-hit games.
- He week began with a 2-for-3 performance on the road at Georgia, totaling a home run and two RBI. His big day at the plate helped Kennesaw State knock off the Bulldogs at Foley Field.
- Allum then followed with a big weekend at Middle Tennessee, going 6-for-9 (.667) with five RBI, a home run, and three runs scored.
- His four RBI day on Saturday marked a new career high. Allum enters the new week on a five-game hitting streak and has tallied at least one hit in eight of his 10 starts.
- He continued his hitting ways with another hit at Auburn Wednesday, extending his hitting streak to six games. Allum has totaled at least one hit in nine of his 12 games played, and five multi-hit games.
- Allum continues to be KSU's hottest hitter at the plate, going 6-for-14 (.429) with two home runs, three RBI and scoring two runs over four games last week (March 8-12)
- Allum leads the team in batting average (.429), hits (21), home runs (7), RBI (19) and slugging percentage (.857). His seven HR is a career-best, as Allum totaled a combined four long balls in his first two seasons (2015-16).
- For the month of March, he is hitting .522 (12-for-23) with three HR, eight RBI, a .913 slg%, and a .607 on-base percentage.



Senior OF **Chris Erwin** has batted .348 (9-for-19) at the plate in the month of March.

PICKING IT UP IN MARCH

- Senior Chris Erwin and junior Grant Williams have picked things up offensively in the month of March, combining to go 15-for-43 (.348) at the plate, driving in 10 runs, scoring 12 runs, and have tallied 11 walks.
- Erwin has started five games, going 7-for-19 (.368), driving in four runs, scoring five runs and tallied six walks going into the new week. The left-handed hitter has totaled a hit in four of his five games, including a 3-for-3 performance versus High Point last Saturday.
- Meanwhile, Williams has totaled a .333 BA (8-for-24) at the plate, knocking in six runs and plating seven in six starts. The second baseman has totaled at least one hit in five of his six games, including a two-hit and three-hit performances at Middle Tennessee.

K-KOUNTER ADDING UP

- Kennesaw State's pitching staff has totaled 10 or more strikeouts over its first seven game, jumping out to 13.5 strikeouts per nine innings, which ranked third in the nation and first in the ASUN Conference.
- Since then, the Owls have struck out 63 (7.8 K's per nine), and have reached 10 or more punch outs in two of their last eight games.
- KSU is averaging 10.2 strikeouts per nine innings.
- The latest Owl to rack up big strikeout numbers is junior RHP Tony Dibrell, who totaled 13 punch outs last Friday versus High Point.
- Dibrell's 13 K's marked the most punch outs in a single game since Chris Erwin's 15-strikeout performance at Georgia Southern on May 12, 2015.
- It marked the second-most strikeouts in a single game in KSU D-I history since joining the ASUN in 2006.

BLACK & GOLD DEBUTS

- Kennesaw State welcomed seven newcomers this year to the roster and head coach Mike Sansing has already seen many make an impact throughout the first seven games.
- Junior catcher Forrest Bramlett made his debut in the lineup versus Western Michigan, going 3-for-6 with three RBI and a home run on Opening Day.
- Freshman reliever Taylor Wilkes made his sixth appearance on the mound Sunday afternoon, working 3.0 innings and allowed just one hit. The Owls pulled away to win 5-4 and Wilkes picked up his first collegiate victory. He also is tied for second on the roster in appearances (6) and trails just Will Bice (7 app.) for most on the staff.
- Freshman Jordan Krueger made his first collegiate appearance out of the bullpen for the Owls last Sunday versus Winthrop. He worked a scoreless ninth inning and did not give up a hit. Krueger has two appearances, totaling a 4.50 ERA and has allowed just three hits and one run.
- Freshman catcher Daniel Series made his first start behind the dish last Sunday versus High Point. He threw out his first career runner on Sunday.

DYNAMIC FRESHMAN DUO

- Freshman duo Terence Norman and Garrett Hodges each made their debut in the lineup versus Savannah State, going a combined 6-for-9 with two RBI.
- Norman fell a home run shy of hitting for the cycle, and drove in a run in his first at-bat with the Owls to jumpstart his 3-for-6 night at the plate.
- In four starts (six games), Norman is batting .353 (6-for-17), tallying one double, one triple and three RBI.
- Meanwhile, Hodges has totaled a .360 (9-for-25) batting average in six starts (eight games).

THINGS TO KNOW

- Senior Erich Stahl was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List, which the award is given to the top reliever in all of D-I Collegiate Baseball. Stahl totaled eight saves and a 3.67 ERA in his first season with the Owls.
- Kennesaw State exploded for 19 runs against Middle Tennessee, marking the fourth-most runs scored in a single game since 2006. The Owls scored 18 runs versus MT on Feb. 16, 2014 at Stillwell Stadium.
- The Owls have recorded 10 or more hits in a single game for the eighth time at Auburn. Kennesaw State is 6-2 when out-hitting opponents in a single game.
- Taylor Allum leads the team with 21 hits and has seven multi-hit games, which is a team best. He has four two-hit games and three, three-hit games. Austin Upshaw comes in second with six multi-hit games, while Jeremy Howell and Griffin Helms each have five.
- Senior Jeremy "Worm" Howell has started 133 games and played in 169 games in the Black and Gold uniform. If he continues his pace for games played, the senior should end his career in the Top 10 for games played and started.
- The Owls' seven-run second inning explosion versus Winthrop marked the first time since March 24, 2013 KSU plated seven in a single game at Stillwell Stadium
- The seven-run inning marked the fifth time since 2013 the Owls scored seven runs in a single inning – 200 plus games over that span, including putting up seven in one inning against Georgia Tech at Russ Chandler Stadium on April 21, 2015.

HEAD COACH MIKE SANSING

SANSING ERA

- Head Coach Mike Sansing enters his 26th season as the acting manager for the Black and Gold, compiling a 949-527 overall record at Kennesaw State.
- The skipper is 51 wins away from winning his 1,000th game as the head coach at Kennesaw State, adding on to his resume of the winningest coach of all-time at KSU.
- Sansing won his 1,000th game overall as a head coach on March 27, 2015, when the Owls defeated USC Upstate in a 5-0 shutout at Stillwell Stadium.
- Coach Sansing is the second youngest coach on the 1,000-win list. Tony Robichaux of Louisiana is also 55 but was born Sept. 10, 1961
- There are 13 active coaches with 1,000, who have coached at least 10 seasons of D-1.





HEAD COACH MIKE SANSING



MIKE SANSING Head Coach • 26th Year West Georgia • 1984

Since being hired in the fall of 1991 on the campus of Kennesaw State University, Mike Sansing has been nothing short of remarkable. The winningest head coach in the school's rich baseball history, Sansing has led the Owls to seven national tournaments, including a pair of national titles, winning the NAIA title in 1994 and earning the 1996 NCAA Division II crown.

The skipper added another memorable season to the record books in 2016, leading the Owls to their first regular season championship in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Sansing guided KSU to a 17-4 mark in the ASUN, winning every series in the regular season – the first team to do that since 2010 in the ASUN. His guidance helped land his first ASUN Coach of the Year honors in 2016, and helped guide five players to the All-Conference Second Team and David Chabut to the All-Freshmen ASUN Team as part of the remarkable 2016 run.

Sansing continued his storied career in 2015, winning his 1,000th career game on March 27 against USC Upstate in a 5-0 triumph, lifting Sansing to the prestigious milestone. Sansing was a finalist at the Atlanta Sports Awards for Coach of the Year honors and led several players to postseason awards, including Jordan Hillyer and Travis Bergen to First Team All-Conference selections, and Taylor Allum named to the Louisville Slugger Freshmen All-American Team.

After 25 seasons at Kennesaw State, Sansing's career record now stands at 1,044-547 for a .656 winning percentage in 28 years of collegiate coaching, which included a three-year stint as the head coach at Shorter College from 1989-91 where he won 102 games. He also has compiled a 942-519 (.644) overall record at Kennesaw State since his arrival in 1992,

winning his 900th game at KSU's skipper on March 31, 2015 against Western Carolina in a 9-2 victory.

In the historic 2014 season, Sansing led the Owls to a slew of firsts, bringing home the first Atlantic Sun Conference Championship in program history with a 7-1 victory over Lipscomb, taking the school's first ever NCAA Division I Regional title and a trip to the Super Regional round in Louisville.

The program's longest tenured head coach, Sansing has guided the Owls move in the NCAA from Division II to Division I and has successfully moved Kennesaw State into a full-fledged DI member with relative ease. During the mandatory four-year reclassification period, Sansing's squads have produced 116 wins, two second-place conference finishes and has had eight players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, while coaching 24 A-Sun All-Conference selections.

In 1994, as a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, Sansing's Owls defeated Southeastern Oklahoma for the institution's first ever team national championship. In 1996, as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Sansing's Owls defeated St. Joseph's (Ind.) for the Division II crown. Under Sansing's leadership, the Owls were named as the "Best Division II Program of the 1990's" by Baseball America.

In addition to the two national championships, Sansing has also led the Owls to a pair of national runner-up finishes, five regional titles, four conference regular season championships, three conference tournament championships, one district regular season title and one district championship.

A plethora of accolades have been bestowed upon Sansing since his arrival at Kennesaw State in 1992.

HEAD COACH MIKE SANSING



In January of 2009, Sansing earned a prestigious honor of being inducted into the Georgia Dugout Club Baseball Hall of Fame.

After the championship season of 1996, he was named the NCAA Division II National Coach-Of-The-Year. The 1994 crown earned Sansing the NAIA National Coach-Of-The-Year Award and the Georgia Dugout Club Coach-of-the-Year honor.

Sansing has also won the South Atlantic Regional Coach-of-the-Year award three consecutive years from 1996 through 1998. He was named Peach Belt Conference Coach-of-the-Year in 1995 and again in 1998.

Sansing's knowledge of the game and former success as a player has helped him mentor a slew of All-America selections and major league baseball draftees. Under Sansing's nurture, the Owls have had the Small College Player-of-the-Year in pitcher Donnie Thomas, who was also named NCAA Division II Pitcher-of-the-Year.

In 1999, Sansing coached Jason Jones to the NCAA Division II Position Player-of-the-Year award. Also, Sansing has coached 16 All-Americans and has seen 35 of his players drafted by major league baseball teams and a total of 49 sign MLB contracts.

In 2009, Sansing and his staff had six players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, including the program's highest draft pick in right-handed pitcher Chad Jenkins, who was selected as the No. 20 overall pick in the first round by the Toronto Blue Jays. In addition, in the same draft, pitcher Kyle Heckathorn was selected as a supplemental first round pick of the Milwaukee Brewers. The Owls were one of only two programs including the University of North Carolina to have two players selected in the first round.

Since making the move to DI, there have been 28 players drafted under the tutelage of Sansing including four in 2012. In 2012, the Owls saw Ronnie Freeman selected in the fifth round (183 overall) by the Arizona Diamondbacks, followed by Will Howard (22nd - 672), Travis Dean (22nd - 696) and Josh Carr (28th - 874). Others to be selected since the becoming a NCAA Division I member are pitchers Bryan Blough, Ryan Rodebaugh, Justin Edwards, Kenny Faulk, Jason Freeman, Mike Bohan, catcher Jace Whitmer, infielder Tyler Stubblefield (twice) and outfielder Josh Whitaker.

In 2014, Sansing guided the school's highest draft pick in Max Pentecost, who went with the No. 11 overall pick to the Toronto Blue Jays. Sansing's history of getting Owls drafted continued in 2015, as Travis Bergen (212 overall), Kal Simmons (226 overall), Jordan Hillyer (416 overall) and Will Lowman (586 overall) marked the eighth consecutive season at least one Owl got drafted in the annual event under Sansing.

Sansing has produced eight major league players during his illustrious coaching career. In 2001, Sansing saw his first former player make it to the big leagues when Willie Harris (KSU-1999) made his major league debut for the Baltimore Orioles. Harris, currently playing for the New York Mets, has played for the Washington Nationals, Chicago White Sox, Boston Red Sox and Atlanta Braves during his 10-year major league career.

Since then, pitcher Brian Mallette (Milwaukee Brewers), outfielder Jason Jones (Texas Rangers), pitcher Brett Campbell (Washington Nationals) and pitchers Jason Childers (Tampa Bay Rays) and Jenkins have all made it to the big leagues. Most recently was Jenkins in 2012 when he made his debut, hurling three innings of shutout ball in a 4-1 loss to the Tampa Bay Rays.

Prior to arriving at Kennesaw State, Sansing was the head coach at Shorter College in Rome, Ga. where he led the Hawks to the Georgia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference title in 1991. Over his three years at Shorter, Sansing had a .648 winning mark while compiling a 102-55 record.

Sansing began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the State University of West Georgia from 1985-86 before moving to Southern Polytechnic University in Marietta from 1987-88.

Before stepping into the coaching realm, Sansing had a stellar career as a player for both Gordon Junior College and West Georgia. He garnered all-conference honors in each of his four seasons as well as being named a three-time team Most Valuable Player. In his senior season at West Georgia, Sansing had a career year while being the Braves' Triple Crown leader. Sansing finished his final year with a .406 batting average, eight home runs and 34 runs batted in.

A native of Atlanta, Ga., Sansing and his wife Barbara make their home in Woodstock with their two sons, Kyle and Brad.

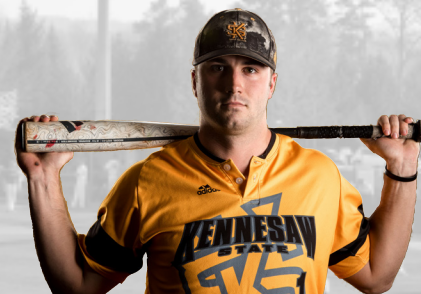
