#### **THE ALL-TIME SERIES VERSUS FGCU**

The Owls are 6-16 all time against Florida Gulf Coast with the Eagles winning 14 straight contests.

Last season, the Owls had a look to tie the score trailing by three at the buzzer, but the attempt was blocked spoiling their comeback attempt.

#### **SCOUTING FGCU**

FGCU comes into the KSU Convocation Center riding a six-game winning streak after the second-half comeback against Lipscomb.

The Eagles are only allowing 61.7 points per game in ASUN play, which is over 12 points better than the next best team.

They're the only team still a perfect 4-0 in the ASUN led by senior Brandon Goodwin, who went to Norcross High School in Norcross, Georgia.

Joe Dooley is in his fifth season with FGCU and has led them to two straight NCAA Tournaments.

#### **SKINNER ENTERS THIRD SEASON**

Al Skinner enters his third season as head coach of Kennesaw State. Last season, the team posted the most wins KSU has ever had in the Division I era with 14 and secured its first ASUN Tournament victory at USC Upstate since 2010.

He hit a milestone a season ago against N.C. A&T notching his 400th career victory as a head coach.

#### PLAYING AROUND WITH THE STARTING LINEUP

Skinner has used five different starting lineups through the 18 games this season trying to find the right combination on the floor.

Against Carver Bible, Isaac Mbuyamba received his first career start.

Previously, Tyler Hooker had been put in the starting lineup and scored in double figures in eight of the 12 games he's started.

In the game against Bethune-Cookman, he set a career high with 23 points and also had five steals.

<u>Defense Coming Around</u>
Against Jacksonville and North Florida, the Owls forced 17 turnovers. That is the second most turnovers that KSU has forced this season in any games.

In the first four ASUN games, the Owls lead the league averaging 8.3 steals per game.

**Getting to the Free Throw Line** 

In ASUN action, Kennesaw State has averaged getting to the line 22.0 times through the first four games.

The Owls are not only getting to the line at a high clip, but they're making 70.8 percent of their attempts.

Earlier in the season, Kennesaw State was aggressive taking the ball to the basket against Bethune-Cookman and it paid off as the Owls got to the free throw line 42 times with 36 of those opportunities coming in the second half.

Going to the line 42 times is the most since Kennesaw State went to the charity stripe 44 times against Chattanooga during the 2014-15 season. In that game against the Mocs, the Owls made 34 free throws.

<u>Masterson Heats Up in the Second Half</u> In the final 20 minutes of games in the KSU Convocation Center, Nick Masterson has been on fire making 27-43 shots.

Over the last two games between North Florida and Stetson, he has barely missed going 12-16 from the floor. Against the Ospreys, he scored 21 points in the final 20 minutes and against Stetson he was 5-5 with 13 points.

<u>Scott Leads the Way on Offense</u> Scott leads the team averaging 16.8 points per game and stepped up for the Owls against Stetson scoring a season high 32 points on 11-19 shooting.

The 32 points was one of the sophomores career high which ironically was also against Stetson.

Masterson Shoots at a High Percentage

Against Stetson, Masterson found holes in their zone and got hot and went 10-12 from the floor for 28 points. He made 5-6 threes and was a perfect 5-5 in the

Masterson is making 52.9 percent of his threes despite other defenses keying on him in the Owls offense. At home, he's even better as he is 23-38 from behind the arc and making a staggering 60.5 percent.

When you combine his shooting percentage with two-point field goals, three-point field goals and free throws, Masterson has a total shooting percentage of 70.8 percent. That is the seventh best mark in the country.

<u>Going Small</u>
With the game close early against Stetson, Skinner went to a small lineup putting Anthony Wilson in forcing Masterson to play at the 4.

The lineup immediately opened up the Owls offense as Wilson was a spark on teh defensive end getting steals and blocks and finding Masterson and Scott on the perimeter.

The Owls outscored the Hatters by 13 points with Wilson on the floor the remainder of the first half.

<u>Clarke Brings Durability</u> Junior Kyle Clarke was one of only two players to see action in all 32 games last season

This year, he has played in 16 of the 17 games.

In fact, over his career he's only missed six games that the Owls have played in.

<u>Wilson Returns from Injury</u>
Last spring, Wilson suffered a knee injury and rehabbed his way back to play his first game against Bethune-Cookman this season.

The sophomore is getting stronger and stronger on the court as he had his best game in an Owls uniform against Stetson finishing with 12 points, nine rebounds, five assists, three steals and three blocks.

It was the third time this season that he has scored in double figures.

#### **KSU BY THE NUMBERS**

This is head coach Al Skinner's third season as head coach of the Owls.

Kennesaw State finished with four wins during non-conference play with all four of them coming at home.

The team has used five different starting lineups this season. That is the most that Coach Skinner has used since being at KSU.

After playing a bunch of road games to start the season, the Owls played 6 of their last 7 games at home.

Tyler Hooker had 8 assists in his second start this season at Washington to set a career high.

This is the 13th season that Kennesaw State has been playing in Division I.

James Scott leads the team averaging 15 points per game.

Nick Masterson scored a season high and led the team with 23 points against Georgia Southern.

Nick Masterson and James Scott combined to score 60 points against Stetson.

Offense Heats Up Against Carver
Kennesaw State finished non-conference play by posting 98 points against
Carver. That is the most points the team has scored since the 2015-16 season
when the Owls scored 101 against North Florida.

In home games this season, KSU has averaged over 77 points per game.

Bench Provides a Lift
Against North Florida, the Owls were in some foul trouble early and went to their bench and they provided a lift scoring 20 of the teams 34 first half points.

The group was facing a deficit when they came into the game and brought the Owls back to within one at hafltime.

The Owls bench scored 44 points in the game against Carver, which was a season high.

Kennesaw State's bench has scored more than 40 points in two games this season with the other one being at Florida State.

**Mbuyamba Gets First Career Start** 

Isaac Mbuyamba has provided a lift off the bench all season and he was rewarded by being moved into the starting lineup against Carver.

By Mbuyamba getting the start, it allowed Jankovic to come off the bench giving the Owls more offensive punch with the second unit. Jankovic scored a season high 19 points on 9-13 shooting.

<u>Tough Non-Conference Schedule</u> Through the first 15 games of the season, Kennesaw State played six teams in the top 100 based on RPI rankings.

Out of those six opponents in the top 100, Butler, Florida State and Texas Tech are all in the top 50.

On the Road

Through November, Kennesaw State only played at home two times as opposed to seven road games.

Fortunately, after playing Texas Tech on the road, the Owls won't leave the state of Georgia for seven straight games. The only road game in that stretch will be at Mercer on December 28.

Picked to Finish Fifth

Kennesaw State was picked to finish fifth in the ASUN Coaches Poll and the ASUN Media Poll. In Skinner's first two seasons, the team was picked to finish

Last season, the Owls finished in a tie for fourth at the end of the season.

Kennesaw State will have two new jerseys this season with a gray and a black jersey to go along with their white and gold jerseys.

The black jersey has sleeves on it making KSU one of two schools in the country to have one of its primary road jerseys to have sleeves. The other school is with a primary jersey with sleeves on it is Northwestern State.

Not only do the Owls have new jerseys this season, but KSU will be playing on a new court this season with the KS logo in the center of the floor.

Coach Skinner is one of the very few Coaches in Division 1 Basketball, to have 4 of his former assistants, currently serving as Head Coaches-Tim O'Shea at Bryant University, Ed Cooley at Providence College, Bill Coen at Northeastern & Pat Duquette at U Mass-Lowell.

Coach Skinner has not only had the same staff for all three seasons, but he had previously coached two of his three assistants at prior schools.


Michael Cotton transferred to Boston College after originally going to Oklahoma to play for Skinner for his junior and senior season before graduating in 2000.



Al Skinner, a former Division I national coach of the year and two-time BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year, was named the head coach of the Kennesaw State men's basketball program on April 26, 2015.

In his first two seasons at Kennesaw State, he guided the Owls to their most wins in a season in the Division I era and the best ASUN finish since the 2006-07 season.

Last season, the team had 14 wins including a victory in the ASUN Tournament over USC Upstate. It was the first tournament victory for the Owls since 2010.

Overall, the guard play has thrived in Skinner's continuity offense as Kendrick Ray set new single-season scoring records in both season's he played under Skinner, and Nick Masterson finished second in the country making 54.1 percent of his three-point field goals.

The Owls offense was prolific from the outside finishing second in the country in three-point field goal percentage during the 2016-17 season.

Ray was awarded for his tremendous senior season by becoming the first Kennesaw State player to be named ASUN First Team All-Conference.

Those two guards weren't the only players to develop under Coach Skinner and his staff. Forward Aubrey Williams averaged a double-double throughout his senior season and was named ASUN Second Team All-Conference after being the sixth man in his first season with the Owls.

Skinner has guided his teams to nine NCAA Tournament appearances and four conference titles during tenures at the University of Rhode Island and Boston College. His teams posted ten 20-plus win seasons.

The winningest coach in BC history, Skinner spent 13 seasons at The Heights, compiling a 247-165 (.560) record from 1997-2010. He took Boston College to six NCAA Tournaments in a seven-year stretch, leading his 2005-06 team to the Sweet 16. Four of his teams finished the year ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including the 2001 and 2007 clubs that concluded those seasons at No. 7.

After guiding the Eagles to a 27-5 overall record and the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Skinner was named 2001 National Coach of the Year by Chevrolet/CBS, ESPN,Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News and the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA). He also earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Skinner earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year again in 2005 after leading Boston College to a 25-5 mark and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his time at BC, Skinner spent nine seasons as head coach at Rhode Island, leading the Rams to a 138-126 (.523) mark. Skinner took over as head coach at URI in 1988 after serving as an assistant on the Rams' bench from 1984-88.

During his tenure in Kingston, he led Rhode Island to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths (1993 and 1997) and two more National Invitational Tournament (NIT) appearances (1992 and 1996), as well as three 20+ win seasons. He was named the Atlantic-10 Coach of the Year in 1991-92 and was inducted into the University of Rhode Island Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000.

Skinner came to Kennesaw State after serving two seasons as associate head coach under longtime friend Tim O'Shea at Bryant University where the Bulldogs compiled a 34-29 (.540) overall record, including a 22-12 (.647) mark in the Northeast Conference.

Skinner first broke into coaching as an assistant at Marist College in 1982 following successful stints in the ABA and NBA from 1974-80 (Nets, Pistons, 76ers).

Prior to his professional playing career, Skinner spent three years on the court at the University of Massachusetts from 1971-74, becoming the only player in Minuteman history to be named a three-time All-Yankee Conference selection.

A team captain and All-America Honorable Mention in 1973-74, Skinner remains one of the most decorated players in UMass basketball history, concluding his career with 1,235 points, 749 rebounds and 320 assists in 79 games.

Skinner and his wife, Donna, have two grown children, Vaniecia and Andre.
