» Head coach Al Skinner enters his 25th season as a head coach and third at Kennesaw State. Last season, he picked up win number 400 against N.C. A&T during the 2016-17 season.

» Kennesaw State pushed its record to 2-0 in February after defeating North Florida for the third year in a row in the KSU Convocation Center.

» Nick Masterson was named ASUN Player of the Week after averaging 24.0 points per game in the Owls two wins last weekend. He scored 28 against North Florida as well as scoring his 1,000th career point and then followed that up with 20 points against Jacksonville on Senior Night. He was 9-11 on three-point attempts for the weekend.

» James Scott has been a dynamic player on offense this season leading the team averaging 16.7 points per game. The sophomore has scored in double figures in 20 of the 24 games he has played. He's been on a tear recently scoring 30 points against USC Upstate followed up with 17 against North Florida.

» With three games remaining in the regular season, KSU currently sits in a tie for fourth in the standings. This weekend, the Owls will play conference leading FGCU on the road and Stetson, who sits behind the Owls.

A WIN AGAINST FGCU WOULD:

- Be the fourth victory in a row for the Owls.
- Keep the Owls undefeated in February.
- Snap a 15 game losing streak to FGCU
- Give the Owls their fourth victory in a row.
- Be the second victory on the road for KSU this season.

THE ALL-TIME SERIES VERSUS FGCU

FGCU has dominated the series winning 15 in a row against Kennesaw State.

Earlier this season, the Owls held FGCU to only 66 points, but the Eagles defense also bottled up Kennesaw State's offense to only 49 points.

Overall, KSU is 6-17 overall in the series.

SCOUTING FGCU

FGCU has already clinched the 2017-18 ASUN regular season championship and is currently 11-0 in the ASUN.

They have won 12 straight games and have showed no signs of slowing down through conference play. In their last game against USC Upstate, the Eagles trailed by 15 at halftime, but stormed back to outscore the Spartans by 32 points in the second half.

FGCU is led by two guards in Brandon Goodwin and Zach Johnson.

Joe Dooley is in his fifth season as head coach at Florida Gulf Coast.

SKINNER ENTERS THIRD SEASON

Al Skinner enters his third season as head coach of Kennesaw State. Last season, the team posted the most wins KSU has ever had in the Division I era with 14 and secured its first ASUN Tournament victory at USC Upstate since 2010.

He hit a milestone a season ago against N.C. A&T notching his 400th career victory as a head coach.

PLAYING AROUND WITH THE STARTING LINEUP

Skinner has used six different starting lineups through the 26 games this season trying to find the right combination on the floor.

The most recent switch was going back to Kyle Clarke at point guard after Tyler Hooker had started the previous 16 games. Since Clarke has been put back in the starting lineup, the Owls are 4-1 and have won two games in a row.

With the current starting lineup, the Owls have won three games in a row by an average of 18.7 points per game.

**Cutting Down on Turnovers**

In three of the last five games, Kennesaw State kept their turnovers to single digits. In fact, the most turnovers the team has had in those five games is 11.

In the two games against USC Upstate this season, the Owls averaged 6.5 turnovers per game finishing with seven in the first meeting and six in the latest meeting. Those are the two lowest outputs this season. Against North Florida, the team only had nine turnovers.

KSU has had single-digit turnovers in five games this season.

The six turnovers against Upstate were the least this season and least since the team played North Florida a season ago in the KSU Convocation Center.

Masterson Reaches 1,000

Nick Masterson was big in one of his final regular season games in the KSU Convocation Center leading the team with 28 points going 6-6 on three pointers. He came into the game 14 points away from getting 1,000 career points and he came out looking to score. He hit his fourth three pointer of the half at the 7:31 mark in in the first half to reach the milestone.

There has been an Owl reach the 1,000-point mark the last three seasons as Yonel Brown did it two seasons ago, Kendrick Ray did it last season.

Player of the Week

For his effort last week leading the team to two wins and scoring his 1,000th career point, Masterson was named ASUN Player of the Week. It is his first career weekly honor and the first Owl to win a weekly award this season.

He averaged 24.0 points per game against UNF and Jacksonville leading the team in scoring in both games. He went a combined 9-11 on his three-point attempts.

Second Half Comebacks

In three of the last four wins, the Owls have trailed in the second half. Against UNF, KSU trailed by six with 5:49 left and went on a 12-2 run to take back the lead and seize control to get the win.

The other two games came against USC Upstate where KSU trailed by as many as 13 in the second half before making a comeback to get the win on the road.

At home, Kennesaw State didn't let the Spartans build a lead and instead caught fire in the second half outscoring them 57-32 in the second half to get their biggest win of the season.

Wilson Has Career Day

Against USC Upstate, Anthony Wilson lifted the Owls with 22 points, six rebounds and four assists in 19 minutes of action. His final two points were the biggest, as he hit a turnaround jumper with 1.4 seconds remaining to give the Owls the 81-80 victory.

He followed that performance up with the teams first double-double of the season against NJIT. He finished the game with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

Last spring, Willson suffered a knee injury and rehabbed his way back to play his first game against Bethune-Cookman this season.

Since returning from injury, it was the fifth time this season that he has scored in double figures. It was his first career 20-point game.

Masterson Shoots at a High Percentage

After winning ASUN Player of the Week after being on fire last weekend, Masterson continues to shoot one of the best clips in the country.

Masterson is making 53.5 percent of his threes, which is the best mark in the country according to KenPom.com. Last weekend, he went 9-11 from behind the arc.

He shoots 91.7 percent from the free throw line and has only missed five attempts all season.

When you combine his shooting percentage on two-point field goals, three-point field goals and free throws, Masterson has a total shooting percentage of 68.7 percent. That is the ninth best mark in the country.

Scott and Masterson Carry the Offense

Scott and Masterson have carried the offense through ASUN play. The two are averaging a combined 35.6 points per game.

Masterson is averaging 18.7 and Scott is averaging 16.9 per game. They have been the top two scorers for Kennesaw State in eight of the 11 ASUN games this season including both games last weekend.

Offense Heats Up In the New Year

Since the turn of 2018, Kennesaw State's scoring has picked up. The Owls have scored over 80 points five times and 90 points in three games.

After scoring 93 against USC Upstate, the Owls put 89 on the board against North Florida in two big wins for Kennesaw State.

The team's season high during conference play is 98 against Carver Bible. The team shot 57 percent from the floor that day.

Bench Provides a Lift

In both meetings against North Florida this season, Kennesaw State's bench was huge for the Owls.

In the second meeting led by Tyler Hooker, Bryson Lockley and Anthony Wilson, KSU's bench outscored UNF's 35-18.

In the first matchup, the Owls were in some foul trouble early and went to their bench and they provided a lift scoring 20 of the teams 34 first half points.

That group has scored more than 40 points in two games this season with one of them being at Florida State.

Getting it Done When It Matters

Head coach Al Skinner always has his team playing their best basketball heading into February and it's shown in his first three years with the program. This year, the Owls are 3-0 so far in the final month of the regular season.

In his three seasons with Kennesaw State, they're 12-5 overall in the month of February.

This February, the team isn't only winning, but winning by a wide margin. In their last three wins, the Owls are beating their opponents by an average of 18.7 points.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule

During the Owls non-conference season, Kennesaw State played six teams in the top 100 based on RPI rankings.

Out of those six opponents in the top 100, Butler, Florida State and Texas Tech are all in the top 50.

On the Road

Through November, Kennesaw State only played at home two times as opposed to seven road games.

Fortunately, after playing Texas Tech on the road, the Owls had a stretch where they didn't leave the state of Georgia for seven straight games. The only road game in that stretch will be at Mercer on December 28.

Picked to Finish Fifth

Kennesaw State was picked to finish fifth in the ASUN Coaches Poll and the ASUN Media Poll. In Skinner's first two seasons, the team was picked to finish seventh.

Last season, the Owls finished in a tie for fourth at the end of the season.

New Look

Kennesaw State will have two new jerseys this season with a gray and a black jersey to go along with their white and gold jerseys.

The black jersey has sleeves on it making KSU one of two schools in the country to have one of its primary road jerseys to have sleeves. The other school is with a primary jersey with sleeves on it is Northwestern State.

Not only do the Owls have new jerseys this season, but KSU will be playing on a new court this season with the KS logo in the center of the floor.

Coaching Tree

Coach Skinner is one of the very few Coaches in Division 1 Basketball, to have 4 of his former assistants, currently serving as Head Coaches-Tim O'Shea at Bryant University, Ed Cooley at Providence College, Bill Coen at Northeastern & Pat Duquette at U Mass-Lowell.

Familiarity With the Staff

Coach Skinner has not only had the same staff for all three seasons, but he had previously coached two of his three assistants at prior schools.

Michael Cotton transferred to Boston College after originally going to Oklahoma to play for Skinner for his junior and senior season before graduating in 2000.

Skinner was an assistant at Rhode Island when Carlton Owens played for the Rams. Owens is still the all-time leading scorer in Rhode Island history and the only Ram to score over 2,000 career points.

Al Skinner, a former Division I national coach of the year and two-time BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year, was named the head coach of the Kennesaw State men's basketball program on April 26, 2015.

In his first two seasons at Kennesaw State, he guided the Owls to their most wins in a season in the Division I era and the best ASUN finish since the 2006-07 season.

Last season, the team had 14 wins including a victory in the ASUN Tournament over USC Upstate. It was the first tournament victory for the Owls since 2010.

Overall, the guard play has thrived in Skinner's continuity offense as Kendrick Ray set new single-season scoring records in both seasons he played under Skinner, and Nick Masterson finished second in the country making 54.1 percent of his three-point field goals.

The Owls offense was prolific from the outside finishing second in the country in three-point field goal percentage during the 2016-17 season.

Ray was awarded for his tremendous senior season by becoming the first Kennesaw State player to be named ASUN First Team All-Conference.

Those two guards weren't the only players to develop under Coach Skinner and his staff. Forward Aubrey Williams averaged a double-double throughout his senior season and was named ASUN Second Team All-Conference after being the sixth man in his first season with the Owls.

Skinner has guided his teams to nine NCAA Tournament appearances and four conference titles during tenures at the University of Rhode Island and Boston College. His teams posted ten 20-plus win seasons.

The winningest coach in BC history, Skinner spent 13 seasons at The Heights, compiling a 247-165 (.560) record from 1997-2010. He took Boston College to six NCAA Tournaments in a seven-year stretch, leading his 2005-06 team to the Sweet 16. Four of his teams finished the year ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including the 2001 and 2007 clubs that concluded those seasons at No. 7.

After guiding the Eagles to a 27-5 overall record and the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Skinner was named 2001 National Coach of the Year by Chevrolet/CBS, ESPN, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News and the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA). He also earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Skinner earned BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year again in 2005 after leading Boston College to a 25-5 mark and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his time at BC, Skinner spent nine seasons as head coach at Rhode Island, leading the Rams to a 138-126 (.523) mark. Skinner took over as head coach at URI in 1988 after serving as an assistant on the Rams' bench from 1984-88.

During his tenure in Kingston, he led Rhode Island to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths (1993 and 1997) and two more National Invitational Tournament (NIT) appearances (1992 and 1996), as well as three 20+ win seasons. He was named the Atlantic-10 Coach of the Year in 1991-92 and was inducted into the University of Rhode Island Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000.

Skinner came to Kennesaw State after serving two seasons as associate head coach under longtime friend Tim O'Shea at Bryant University where the Bulldogs compiled a 34-29 (.540) overall record, including a 22-12 (.647) mark in the Northeast Conference.

Skinner first broke into coaching as an assistant at Marist College in 1982 following successful stints in the ABA and NBA from 1974-80 (Nets, Pistons, 76ers).

Prior to his professional playing career, Skinner spent three years on the court at the University of Massachusetts from 1971-74, becoming the only player in Minuteman history to be named a three-time All-Yankee Conference selection.

A team captain and All-America Honorable Mention in 1973-74, Skinner remains one of the most decorated players in UMass basketball history, concluding his career with 1,235 points, 749 rebounds and 320 assists in 79 games.

Skinner and his wife, Donna, have two grown children, Vaniecia and Andre.
