Dr. F. Javier Cevallos is Kutztown University's 11th president. Inaugurated into office in 2003, hallmarks of his presidency include progressive initiatives focused on inclusive outreach and an international perspective. In addition to overseeing the creation of new programs across the academic spectrum, President Cevallos has presided over a period of tremendous growth, both in the number of students seeking enrollment at KU and expansion of on-campus facilities and academic programs.



Cevallos began his academic career as an assistant professor of Spanish at the University of Maine at Orono. After three years in Maine, he moved to the University of Massachusetts, where he rose to the rank of full professor within eight years. From that point he held several positions in university administration and governance.

In 1996, Cevallos was named a fellow of the American Council of Education, an honor bestowed upon college administrators who show great leadership potential.

Since coming to Kutztown, Cevallos has led the campus community in programs which open the university to students from all backgrounds. His outreach efforts have helped establish the university as a welcoming and nurturing environment for students from traditionally underserved populations.

During his tenure, Cevallos has worked to form and strengthen ties with universities in Ukraine, India, China, Ecuador, and more. Artists, teachers, and professionals come to campus from many countries to conduct workshops, lectures, and classes, while KU students travel the globe to pursue their studies as part of a "study abroad" program.

The 21st century has been a time of change for the "beacon on the hill." With an enrollment of 10,000 students, KU is the third largest university in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education of 14 universities. Because of this expansion, the university has embarked on a program of renewal and growth.

Recently completed residence halls and

apartments comprise nearly a third of the new additions on campus. Soon to go online is the Academic Forum, a totally modern facility featuring technologically-advanced classrooms and lecture halls devoted to serving the needs of students competing in the information age.

Keeping pace with national trends in personal health, a recreational center, totally funded by student contributions, has been added to an already large line-up of fitness activities

available directly on campus. Future projects include a new heating plant and even more residential living spaces.

In order to preserve the traditional while moving into the future, the university has converted many of its teaching spaces to smart classrooms with interactive computer learning stations and Internet access, offering distance learning opportunities that enable students to work off-campus while participating in KU coursework.

"Today, we are attracting students whose needs include a comprehensive education well-versed in the modern research and publication tools," Dr. Cevallos said. "At the core is a sound educational foundation in the liberal arts. A university degree is not singularly a preparation for the world of work or graduate school; higher education must serve as the model for lifelong learning."

In addition to the leadership Cevallos provides on campus, the president also gives generously of his time and energy offering guidance and leadership to the community. Among the many organizations he serves are Good Shepherd, Hawk Mountain and Minsi Trails Boy Scout Councils, Olivet Boys and Girls Club, Reading Public Museum, Reading Musical Foundation, St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center, WLVT/Lehigh Valley PBS, and the United Way of Berks County.

Cevallos and his wife, Josee Vachon, a professional French-Canadian folk singer, live in the president's residence on campus with their two children, Alex and Caroline, both of whom attend area public schools.



Greg Bamberger **Director of Athletics**

Greg Bamberger became Kutztown University's director of athletics on May 1, 2005.

Bamberger came to Kutztown from Glenville State College in West Virginia, where he served as director of athletics beginning in January 2002.

Prior to taking over as director of athletics, Bamberger was an assistant football coach and lecturer at Glenville for three semesters. He was the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and coached the offensive line for the Pioneers.

From 1997 until 2000, Bamberger was a district sales coordinator for AFLAC. Bamberger previously served as assistant football coach at the Virginia Military Institute and Southeast Missouri State.

Bamberger earned his master's degree in sports administration from Temple University in 1989. He is a 1982 graduate of Duke University with a bachelor's degree in management sciences. He was a three-year starter for the Blue Devils' football team, serving as co-captain in 1981. Bamberger was born in Abington, Pa., and is a graduate of Phoenixville High School. He and his wife, Bernadette, have three children.

Raymond Monica became the 14th head football coach at Kutztown University in March of 2006.

“Kutztown is a university that is growing and moving forward. I’m excited to get the football program headed in the same direction,” Monica said. “We want to compete for the PSAC East championship and get into the Division II playoffs. We want to be a physical football team and be talented in all aspects of the game – offense, defense and special teams.”

Monica, 39, came to Kutztown after serving as defensive coordinator at Division I-A Temple University for eight seasons, including the last seven as assistant head coach. During his tenure at Temple, Monica also guided the inside linebackers and defensive line.

Prior to Temple, Monica coached for nine seasons at the University of North Alabama, during which time the Lions won three NCAA Division II national championships from 1993-95.

A native of Garyville, La., Monica is a graduate of East St. John’s High School in Reserve, La. He enrolled at Nicholls State University in 1985. After one season with the Colonels, he transferred to Northeast Mississippi Junior College, where he played quarterback and earned all-state honors for two seasons. He signed with Southern Illinois University (Carbondale) and went through spring drills, before a back injury ended his playing career.

Monica began his coaching career as a student assistant coach, guiding the running backs at Northeast Mississippi Junior College in 1988. He moved on to North Alabama in 1989. There, he coached the running backs while completing his bachelor’s degree in health, physical education and recreation, which he received in 1990.

Monica served as defensive line coach at the University of North Alabama (UNA) from 1992-97. In 1993,



UNA’s defense ranked in the top four nationally in pass defense, total defense, rush defense and scoring defense. North Alabama won its first Division II national championship that season. The 1994 season brought the second-straight national championship, and the Lion defense finished second nationally in all four defensive categories.

In 1995, the Lions won their third-straight NCAA title. The UNA defensive front produced three All-Americans and two National Football League draft choices, while leading Division II in both rushing defense and scoring defense. During the three-year championship run, North Alabama posted a remarkable record of 41-1.

At Temple, Monica was hailed as one of the top assistant coaches in college football. In *Sports Illustrated’s* 2003 College Football Preview, Monica was cited as one of college football’s seven “Wise Guides.” The article praised him as “the best in the nation at getting ordinary players to do extraordinary things.” The accolade came after the Owl defense was recognized as one of only eight in the country to finish in the top 20 in total defense in both 2001 and 2002. Temple’s defense ranked 19th nationally, allowing just 312.6 total yards per game in 2001. The success was recognized in the post season, when Monica and then Temple head coach Bobby Wallace directed the Blue defense in the 2001 Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic. In 2002, the Owl defense ranked 18th nationally, allowing 315.7 total yards per contest.

Monica mentored several future NFL players while at Temple, including 2002 Big East Conference Defensive Player of the Year and All-America DT Dan Klecko, All-America LB Rian Wallace, as well as DE Raheem Brock, DT Russell Newman and DE Calvin Wilkinson.

Monica and his wife, Linda, are the parents of Ray (12), Lindsey (8) and Austin (1).



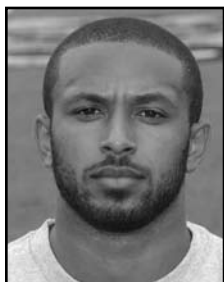
Jeff Chillot **Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks**

Jeff Chillot is in his first season with the Kutztown University football coaching staff. Chillot is the offensive coordinator and is responsible for the quarterbacks. Chillot came to KU from Albright College, where he coached for 13 seasons. He was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1999-2005, during which time his offenses led the conference and ranked nationally in several statistical categories. From 1996-98 he coached wide receivers, and he was the defensive line coach from 1993-95. He assisted with special teams during the bulk of his tenure with the Lions. Prior to Albright, Chillot spent the 1991-92 seasons coaching at Pottstown High School. He is a 1988 graduate of Shippensburg University, where he played defensive back for two seasons. He was an all-league defensive back at Pottstown St. Pius X High School from 1981-83.



Mike Silecchia **Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers**

Mike Silecchia joined the Golden Bear football coaching staff this season as the defensive coordinator, bringing over 25 years of collegiate coaching experience with him. Silecchia came to Kutztown from Frostburg (MD) State, where he served for three years as the offensive coordinator/offensive line coach. Previously, Silecchia served as head coach at Lebanon Valley College (LVC) for six seasons. He coached 31 All-Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) selections and LVC's initial first-team All-America selection in program history. Prior to becoming the head coach at Lebanon Valley, Silecchia served as the offensive line coach at Lycoming College from 1995 to 1998. He helped the Warriors advance to the NCAA Division III national quarterfinals in 1995, the national semifinals in 1996 and the national championship game in 1997. Lycoming also won two MAC Championships and registered two undefeated league seasons during Silecchia's stay. Silecchia began his collegiate coaching career at Mansfield University, where he served as an assistant from 1978-1982. He then moved to the high school ranks as head coach at Athens (1982) and North Penn (1983-1985) before returning to Mansfield as the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator from 1985 to 1995. Silecchia graduated from Mansfield in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in general studies and also earned his master's degree in special education from Mansfield in 1984.



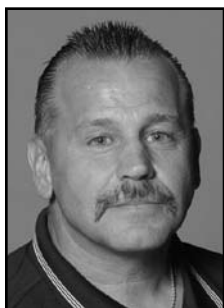
Michael Baldwin **Running Backs**

Michael Baldwin joins the KU coaching staff after completing a stellar playing career for the Golden Bears last fall. He will coach the running backs. A three-year co-captain and four-year starting safety, Baldwin was the 2005 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Defensive Player of the year. He was named to the All-PSAC East team in 2004 and 2005. Also, Baldwin was named to the Associated Press Little All-America and *ESPN the Magazine* Academic All-America second teams. He was a first team Daktronics All-Northeast Region pick in 2005, and was a three-time CoSIDA Academic All-District selection, earning first team honors in 2004 and 2005. Additionally, Baldwin was named the 2005-06 KU Male Senior Athlete and Senior Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Baldwin graduated in December 2005 with a degree in criminal justice.



Jarrad Brennan **Defensive Line**

Jarrad Brennan is in his first season on the Golden Bear football coaching staff. Brennan will coach the defensive line. He comes to Kutztown from Temple University, where he has spent the past six seasons assisting the football program. Brennan started at temple as a student manager in 2000, before becoming an administrative assistant, while also assisting with offensive tackles and tight ends, from 2001-05. Prior to Temple, Brennan spent the 1999 season as offensive line coach at his alma mater, Nativity BVM, in Pottsville. Brennan is a 1995 graduate of Nativity. His brother, Mike, is the head coach at Mount Carmel High School.



Jody Cwik **Offensive Tackles/Tight Ends**

Jody Cwik (pronounced swik) is in the second season of his second stint with the Kutztown University coaching staff. Cwik is responsible for coaching the tight ends and offensive tackles. Cwik began his coaching career at then Kutztown State College, as an assistant freshman coach in 1977. He received his bachelor's degree from Kutztown in 1978 in secondary education, and his master's in education in 1987. Cwik served as head coach at Pottstown High School from 1998-2003 and at Freedom High School in Bethlehem from 1988-93. He was an assistant at both schools (Pottstown, 1996-97; Freedom, 1980-87) before taking over the reigns as head coach. He also was an assistant coach at Emmaus (1995), Wilson {Easton} (1994) and Reading (1979). Cwik teaches in the Bethlehem Area School District.



Greg Kosciolek **Offensive Line**

Greg Kosciolek (pronounced kuh-shoo-lik) is in his third season on the Kutztown football coaching staff. He is responsible for the offensive line, concentrating on guards and centers. Kosciolek came to the Golden Bears via Shippensburg University, where he spent two seasons as a graduate assistant, coaching tight ends. In addition to those responsibilities, he also coached the offensive line and long snappers and was responsible for the defensive scout team and video editing. Kosciolek played collegiately at New Haven University, where he was a three-year starter at tight end.

The Summit Hill, Pa., native spent 2001 working as a child care counselor for Kids Peace, a center for troubled teens located in Schnecksville, PA.



Steve Moyer **Wide Receivers**

Steve Moyer is in his eighth season with the Golden Bear coaching staff. He is in his second year coaching receivers, a position he also mentored from 1998-99. He was KU's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2000-03. As coordinator, he produced two of the top four scoring offenses in KU history. Moyer came to Kutztown from Upper Perkiomen High School, where he served as head coach from 1986-97. In 1997, Moyer's team was 9-1 and was the PAC-10 Conference Co-Champion and Class AAA District I runner-up. He was named the *Pottstown Mercury* Coach of the Year for the second-straight

season. Prior to Upper Perkiomen, Moyer spent 12 years at Red Land High School, including three years as head coach. He has also spent time on the coaching staff at the University of Pittsburgh and Freedom High School. Moyer was a three-year starter at Pittsburgh, where he ended his career as the school's all-time leading receiver. He graduated in 1972 with a degree in secondary education. Moyer also holds a master's degree from Shippensburg.



David Hand **Defensive Backs**

David Hand enters his first season as a member of the Kutztown University football coaching staff. Hand will coach the defensive backs. He comes to Kutztown from St. Joseph's Preparatory School, where he served as the football team's strength and conditioning coach since 1998. During his time at St. Joseph's, Hand served as recruiter and defensive coordinator. Hand has taught elementary school in the Philadelphia School District since 2004. He is a 2001 graduate of LaSalle University with a degree in social science.

2005-06 Dixon Trophy



For the first time in school history, Kutztown University is the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented on an annual basis to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference play-offs and/or regular-season records. Each institution's point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

Kutztown, the runner-up the past two years, totaled 140 points, edging Shippensburg by one and a half points.

Student Recreation Center

The brand new, 64,623 square foot student recreation center opens in the fall of 2006. The facility, located between Keystone Hall and University Field, will be THE place to be for student recreation and fitness on campus. Among the amenities are a nearly 9,000 sq. ft. fitness center and weight room, two group fitness studios, two racquetball courts, an indoor rock climbing wall, a synthetic surface gymnasium with curved walls for indoor sports, a synthetic surface half gymnasium, a suspended jogging track (approx. 1/10 mile), an office suite for recreational services staff, a meeting room, retail space/snack bar and locker rooms with jacuzzis.



Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venue on campus.

University Field

During the summer of 2005, Kutztown University embarked upon major renovations to University Field, the home of the Golden Bear football, track & field and field hockey teams. Kutztown replaced the natural grass field with new, state-of-the-art, synthetic athletic turf. In addition, the track surrounding the field was re-surfaced and lights were installed. Along with the use by the intercollegiate teams, the field is utilized by student intramurals and recreation. The final phase of construction, the activation of lights, will happen this fall. A-Turf, a New York-based company and one of the leaders in the synthetic athletic turf industry, installed the new field. The field system is Premium RS-45, which contains sand and rubber infill mixed into the synthetic grass over the padding, which is designed for long-term durability and to reduce the effects of impact on the body.

Around the new field lies a 5,600-seat stadium. The stadium has been the site of PSAC Championship track & field meets and hosts the annual spring commencement ceremony. It features a state-of-the-art scoreboard that debuted in the fall of 2001.

Keystone Hall

The home of the Golden Bears, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. It was also the location of President George W. Bush's visit in 2004. Keystone Hall houses the Golden Bear sports medicine department, designated locker rooms for intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The football coaching staff and locker room are located in the west wing of Keystone Hall.



Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.



Keystone Field House

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and is used by all teams for indoor practices, overflow athletic events, camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as former President Clinton's address during his visit in 1994.

Hoping to put a disappointing 2005 season squarely in the rear-view mirror, Kutztown University will have a new driver at the wheel to begin a fresh era of Golden Bear football in 2006.

Raymond Monica became the 14th head coach at Kutztown University since 1927 this past spring. He takes over a team that went 2-8 in 2005, including a 2-4 record in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division.

Monica brings to Kutztown eight years of experience at the Division I-A level as the defensive coordinator at Temple, as well as National Championship experience on the coaching staff at North Alabama, which won three-straight Division II titles from 1993-95.

For the first time in 2006, Kutztown will play home night football games with the addition of lights at University Field. Paired with the installation of artificial turf before last season, Kutztown boasts one of the finest playing venues in the region.

The 2006 Golden Bears will feature 14 returning starters, 34 returning letterwinners, and an infusion of new talent hoping to make an immediate impact.

OFFENSE

The Golden Bear offense returns seven starters, who hope the experience gained last year will help improve upon an offense that struggled to find its rhythm last fall. KU ranked in the bottom five in the PSAC in total offense (268.1 yards/game), rushing offense (114.7), passing offense (153.4) and scoring offense (19.0 points/game) last year.

The offensive inconsistency of last year – which included a school record 582 yards of total offense against Mansfield but also a streak of 234:59 of game time between offensive touchdowns – will be the number one project in pre-season camp this year.

Look for some new wrinkles in the KU offense under the direction of offensive coordinator **Jeff Chillot**, who joined KU's staff after successfully guiding nearby Albright's potent offense.

QUARTERBACKS: Kutztown returns its first and second string quarterbacks from last year to provide solid leadership under center. **Kyle Spotts (jr. Tamaqua/Tamaqua)** started eight games last year, completing 128-of-270 passes for 1,297 yards. He tossed 11

touchdown passes and was picked off nine times. Spotts was injured against Millersville and missed the final two games of the season. **Shane Martin (so. New Holland/Garden Spot)** filled in admirably. He completed 20-of-34 passes for 237 yards and three scores, with one interception. Also returning is **Jim Kelly (jr. Ambler/Upper Dublin)**.

RUNNING BACKS: Kutztown's running game will be anchored by two-year starter **Maurice Adams (jr. West Chester/Henderson)**. Adams rushed for 662 yards and two touchdowns on 151 carries last season. In two years, the 2004 second-team All-PSAC East back has over 1,300 yards and eight scores. Pushing for carries will be **Tyler Dinnis (so. Doylestown/Central Bucks West)**, who came on strong at the end of the 2005 season. Dinnis carried the ball 26 times for 167 yards – with 93 of those yards coming in the final two games of the year.

The fullback position will be manned by **Joe Strauss (r-fr. Lititz/Warwick)**, along with **Travis Barron (jr. Coatesville/Bishop Shanahan)**, who had 67 yards and a TD on 11 carries last year, and **Drew Varano (so. York/Dallastown)**, a converted lineman.

WIDE RECEIVERS: The wide receiver corps may be the most intriguing on the 2006 roster, with two returning starters and a key newcomer.

The returning starters are **Larry Baumgardner (jr. New Oxford/New Oxford)** and **Brett Harbach (sr. West Lawn/Wilson)**. Baumgardner led the team last year with 38 catches for 447 yards and eight touchdowns. Four of those TD grabs came against Mansfield, tying a single-game school record. Harbach caught 16 passes for 111 yards and a TD.

The key newcomer is **Maurice Humphrey (so. New Britain, CT/Berlin)**, a transfer from Penn State. Humphrey, who will be a sophomore this season, was the Nittany Lions' second-leading receiver in 2003 with 30 catches for 410 yards and a TD. Humphrey should join Harbach in the starting lineup, with Baumgardner seeing plenty of time on the field as the third receiver.

Redshirt Freshman **Andrew McKeefery (r-fr. Newark, DE/St. Mark's)** will look to break into the rotation, along with returners **Steve Michels (r-fr. New Holland/Garden Spot)** and **Anthony Braciszewski (so. South-**



ampton/William Tennent).

TIGHT ENDS: Two-time first-team All-PSAC East (2003, 2004) tight end **Jason Henley (sr. Gilbertsville/Boyertown)** returns for his senior season. Henley caught 16 passes for 134 yards and a touchdown last year, bringing his career total to 57 catches for 526 yards and seven scores. Converted quarterback **Dan Onorato (so. Malvern/Malvern Prep)** will provide depth at the position.

OFFENSIVE LINE: The offensive line returns two senior starters from last year's squad. Center **Raymond Yannuzzi (sr. Wallingford/Strath Haven)** will anchor the line, entering his third year as a starter. **Dustin Woodward (sr. Lancaster/Penn Manor)** started eight games last year, including six at tackle. Woodward is expected to start at left tackle.

Nick Cresta (so. Wallingford/Strath Haven) is penciled in at the right guard slot. Cresta started 10 games last year on the defensive line, tallying 44 tackles. **Rick DiStefano (jr. Quarryville/Solanco)** is the front runners to start at left guard. **Darrell Martin (so. Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg)** also returns at guard. Battling for the other tackle spot will be returners **Tyler Romberger (r-fr. Muir/Williams Valley)** and **Randy Chilcoat (jr. Dallastown/Dallastown).**

DEFENSE

The 2005 Golden Bear defense was a big-play unit, with 25 sacks and 19 forced fumbles. The defenders returned 15 of those fumbles for 239 yards, including four taken back for touchdowns. The defense returns six starters from last year, which ranked eighth in the PSAC in rush defense (170.9 yards/game), 10th in total defense (358.3), pass defense (187.4) and scoring defense (25.8 points/game). Coach Monica will welcome new defensive coordinator **Mike Silecchia** to the staff as the defenders look to improve upon last year's numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE: KU's defensive line returns two starters from last year and another who saw starting action in 2004. Defensive end **Mike Grosso (sr. Hackettstown, NJ/Pope John)** will headline the defense in 2006. Grosso tallied 56 tackles, including a team-high 14 for loss and 6.5 sacks to earn 2005 All-PSAC East first-team honors. **Kevin Branco (so. Hellertown/Saucon Valley)** is likely to start at the opposite end. Branco

notched 27 tackles, including four for loss and two sacks with three fumble recoveries. **Mark Irwin (so. Newtown/Council Rock North)** also returns to the fold. He had 21 tackles, including a sack last season.

Also back is defensive tackle **Scott Smith (jr. New Oxford/Delone Catholic)**, who tallied 42 tackles with three for loss and 1.5 sacks. **Matt Breiner (so. Lehighton/Lehigh)** returns to the team this fall after sitting out in 2005. Breiner started seven games at tackle in 2004, notching 15 tackles. **Craig Croman (fr. York/York Catholic)** is also vying for time at defensive tackle.

LINEBACKERS: Strongside linebacker **Tom Cressman (jr. Sellersville/Pennridge)** is the lone returning starter from last year's linebacker corps. Cressman was impressive in his first year as a starter, totaling 47 tackles, including seven for loss and six sacks for 37 yards. He also forced three fumbles. Cressman should be joined in the starting lineup by returning veteran **Dan Chominski (sr. Boothwyn/Chichester)**. Chominski, who is expected to fill the middle linebacker spot, had 31 tackles last fall. **Sam McKellar (so. Allentown/Dieruff)** is slated to start at weak-side linebacker. He had nine stops in limited action last year.

Pushing for playing time will be **Dan Schwartz (fr. Reading/Pius X)**, **Dan Cresta (jr. Aston/Sun Valley)** and **Carl Thomas (sr. Philadelphia/Germantown).**

DEFENSIVE BACKS: The defensive secondary, a traditional strong suit for the Golden Bears, returns two starters and several veterans with playing experience in 2006. **Justin Gibbs (jr. Pottstown/Pottstown)**, a starting cornerback last fall, and **Brian Bingnear (jr. Boothwyn/Chichester)**, a starting safety, lead the way. Gibbs had 34 tackles with two interceptions and seven pass breakups. Bingnear had 53 tackles with three breakups. Gibbs may slide over to safety, where **Lenny Brown (so. Broomall/Marple Newtown)** and **Brian Burke (sr. Langhorne/Neshaminy)** (23 tackles) will also compete for playing time.

With Gibbs at safety, both starting cornerback positions will now be up for grabs. **Cory Porrino (sr. Orwigsburg/Blue Mountain)** was named the most improved player on the defense in the spring, after tallying 17 tackles in 10 games in 2005. **Brent Howard**

(jr. Perkiomenville/Boyertown) switches from receiver to defensive back this year. **Nate Rabenold (r-fr. Lehigh/Lighthouse)** and **Macus Watson (jr. Philadelphia/Harrington)** will look for reps.

SPECIAL TEAMS: KU returns its starting punter and a veteran placekicker.

Ryan Nye (so. Reading/Holy Name) returns to handle the punting chores. Nye averaged 37.0 yards on 67 punts last fall, including a long of 63 yards and 10 inside opponents 20 yardline. **Steve Sandberg (so. Quakertown/Northeast)** saw some action on kickoffs last year and will challenge Nye for the field goal/

PAT kicker duties in 2006.

Humphrey and Harbach are slated to handle the bulk of the returns. Harbach averaged 6.6 yards on 10 punt returns last year. Gibbs also saw time as a kick returner last year, averaging 20.5 yards per return.

The 2006 season begins on September 9, when the Golden Bears host Clarion at 6:05 PM at University Field. The schedule features the new mandated 10-game PSAC slate. Each PSAC team will play six divisional contests and four "crossovers" against the opposite division.

While Kutztown University's student-athletes strive for excellence on the playing fields, they have also been achieving it in the classroom. During the 2005-06 academic year, the overall grade-point average (GPA) of student-athletes was 2.84, the third-highest average on record.



The previous year (2004-05), the student-athlete GPA was 2.91, which was not only an all-time high, but surpassed the overall student-body average of 2.89.

Perhaps more impressively, while joining their new classmates in adjusting to life away from home - with the added adjustment to college athletics - freshman student-athletes had a 2.54 GPA. That mark was 0.10 higher than that of the overall freshman class.

Golden Bear student-athletes also placed high numbers on the fall and spring Dean's Lists in 2005-06. In the fall, 65 student-athletes earned Dean's List recognition, while 76 garnered the honor in the spring. Dean's List recognition is accomplished by achieving a 3.60 or better GPA during the semester.

Additionally, KU placed 94 Golden Bears among the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar-Athlete list in 2005-06. That total is the second-highest in school history, behind the record of 103 in 2004-05. PSAC Scholar-Athlete status is achieved by maintaining a 3.25 GPA.

The football team is a strong contributor to the academic success of Golden Bear Athletics. Ten football players combined for 13 dean's list recognitions in 2005-06, while 11 players earned PSAC Scholar-Athlete status.

Michael Baldwin and Greg Mitchell headed the list of Golden Bear football's scholars.

Baldwin became the first player in program history to be named *ESPN the*

Magazine Academic All-America and Associated Press Little All-America. He was named to the second team of both. Baldwin also won KU's 2005-06 Male Senior Athlete and Senior Scholar-Athlete of the Year Awards, the first player to sweep those honors. Additionally, Baldwin

was named to the PSAC Fall Academic Top 10.

Baldwin and Mitchell were both selected to the 2005 *ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District II Football Team*.

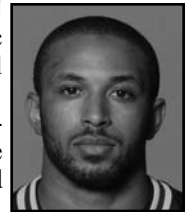
Baldwin was selected to the first team, while Mitchell was recognized on the second team.

Baldwin, a safety, graduated in December with a degree in criminal justice and a GPA of 3.78.

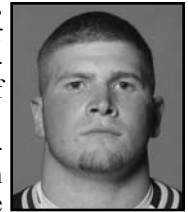
Mitchell, a linebacker, also graduated in December with a degree in secondary education-mathematics and a GPA of 3.69.

Baldwin and Mitchell continue a legacy of standout student-athletes on the football team. Linebacker Alex Daecher was named the PSAC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the league's highest academic honor, in 2001-02. He was also a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America selection, earning the honor in 2000 and 2001.

In the late 1990s, Rob Holmes '96 and Jason Stephens '98 were singled out for their academic prowess. The duo, Holmes in 1996 and Stephens in 1998, won Burger King National Scholar-Athlete of the Week honors. With their awards came a \$10,000 endowed scholarship that has helped support members of the current team.

The tradition we know as Kutztown University football today began over 100 years ago, when KU was known as Keystone Normal School. Keystone won all five games it played during the initial 1895 season, including a 10-4 win over Reading High School. The school fielded a team until 1905, when the sport was suspended due to a serious on-field injury. In 1923, football became, for the mostpart, a permanent fixture of the campus

Those initial seasons set the foundation for football and athletics in general at KU. The early teams were nicknamed the “Golden Avalanche,” and featured many competitive players and teams. The current nickname of “Golden Bears” was adopted in 1961.

Since then, KU has had its share of prominent players who have received national attention and fame on the football field. Additionally, numerous Golden Bears have gone on to successful coaching, teaching, business and many other careers. The individuals listed on this and the following pages are prime examples of the many fine men who call Kutztown University their alma mater.

Dallas Cowboys, 1974-78

Doug Dennison opened the doors to the NFL when he joined the Dallas Cowboys' roster in 1974. A member of KU's Hall of Fame, Dennison was a running back with "America's Team" during the glory years of Coach Tom Landry and Hall of Fame quarterback Roger Staubach.



Bruce Harper, RB

New York Jets, 1977-84

Bruce Harper, a standout for the New York Jets in the late 1970s, set an NFL record as a kick returner. Harper was a running back for the Golden Bears under head coach George Baldwin. He is also a member of the KU Athletic Hall of Fame and in 2003, was named to the New York Jets' All-Time Team as a punt/kick returner.

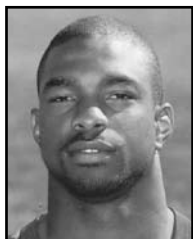


Andre Reed, WR

One of the top receivers in National Football League history, Andre Reed played for the Golden Bears in the early 1980s. Reed, who played in four Super Bowls for the Buffalo Bills, is a member of the Kutztown University Athletic Hall of Fame. In 2000, Reed played for the Washington Redskins before retiring in 2001. In 2002, Reed was inducted into the Division II Football Hall of Fame.

John Mobley was the 15th pick overall and the first pick of the Denver Broncos in the 1996 NFL Draft. Mobley started at linebacker for the Broncos in each of his seven seasons, helping Denver to back-to-back Super Bowl Championships in 1998 and 1999.

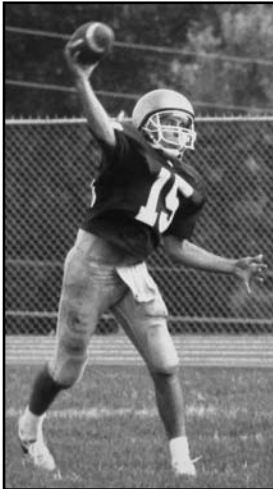
