#### PREVIEW:

A tough week sits ahead for the streaking Lamar University baseball team, and it all starts at 4 p.m. on Wednesday at the Baylor Ballpark when the Cardinals visit the Bears for a step into non-conference action before McNeese State visits for the return to Vincent-Beck Stadium in a weekend, conference tilt.

#### SCOUTING THE OPPONENT :

- Baylor enters the contest after dropping a heart breaker on a walk-off at Oklahoma in Big 12 action Sunday. The loss gave Oklahoma the series. The Bears come in at 16-16 on the season and 4-5 in league play. They are 12-10 when playing at home.
- The Bear starter Nick Lewis is 1-3 on the season with a 5.87 earned run average. He's worked 30.2 frames and has given up 20 earned runs with 14 walks and 18 strikeouts.
- Sheppard Dylan leads the offense in all triple crown categories (.344/31/5) and has a team-best 27 runs scored.
- Kameron Esthay has a .333 batting average, followed by Matt Menard (.329) and Justin Arrington (.318).
- As a team, Baylor hits at a .278 clip and average of 5.5 runs a game. It's pitching staff has allowed 163 runs (5.1), 137 of those earned (4.3). The staff has a 4.33 ERA.
- The Bears have faced on Southland Conference opponent, Sam Houston. They downed the Bearkats 5-1.

### BIG RED RANKED FOR THE FIRST TIME IN MORE THAN EIGHT YEARS

- Monday morning Collegiate Baseball Newspaper announced that the Lamar University baseball team was ranked in its Top 25, giving the Cardinals their first ranking since March of 2009- also CBN
- For two-straight weeks, Lamar was in the others receiving votes section of the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll. According to WarrenNolan.com, LU was ranked 33rd in that poll this week.
- In 2009, LU broke into the rankings at 23rd, and before that it had not been ranked since the start of the 2004 season.

### HIBBS TABBED SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Will Hibbs was picked as the Southland Conference Pitcher of the Week, as voted on by SIDs of the league, the conference announced Monday.
- He was the third player of the week from Big Red, first pitcher this season (Jacoby Middleton, Reid Russell).
- He pitched the Cardinals to their first shutout of the season, in a 1-0 win, with a complete game in which he only allowed five hits and six base runners (one reached on error). He struck out 10 batters and did not issue a walk.
- The senior only allowed two hitters to make it into scoring position and no Islander made it further than second base.

### THE STREAK LIVES

- The Cardinals hold the nation's longest active win streak (15), six ahead of No. 1 Miami's nine-game streak.
- They trail the longest streak in the country by two games, set by No. 3 Florida. They also lead the country in the active streak for consecutive road wins (7).
- The streak is the longest in LU history since it won 19 in 1980, and the school record was set one year prior with 20.
- While on the streak, the Cardinals are hitting at a .325 clip, led by Stijn van der Meer (.435), Robin Adames (.358) and Reid Russell (.356). Jake Nash (.323) and Chaneng Varela (.316) also have .300 averages. The offense has scored at a 8.9 runs per game clip with 40 doubles, four triple and 19 homers.
- Pitching and defensively, Lamar has a 3.67 ERA and allows opponents to score at a 4.6 run clip. All combined, it has given up 34 extra base hits.

### IMPRESSIVE CAREER STREAK STILL ON THE LINE

- With his single in the final game of the Corpus Christi series, Stijn van der Meer extended his hit streak to 22 games and his reached base steak to an even 30 games- the longest know in the Lamar University record books.
- With a base knock, the senior would tie Chad Bunting for the third longest hit streak in school history, and the 22 games is the longest LU has seen since Sam Bumpers had a school record 28-gamer in 2014.
- Cutter McDowell is on a 16-game reached base streak, the longest of his career.
- Reid Russell had his 18-game hit streak snapped in the final game of the ACU series on an 0-for-5 day. His streak was the seventh best in school history. It lasted 34 days and he hit .460 with 20 RBI and 15 runs scored while on it.

### VAN DER MEER AVERAGE ON THE CLIMB

- His streak opened with the UTRGV series, and heading into the set van der Meer only had a .22 batting average. Since the streak has opened the shortstop has gone 38-of-91 (.418)and has raised his team-leading batting average to .362.
- He's had 12 multiple hit games in the 22 games, including a 4-of-5 day in the finale with Abilene Christian.
- The Dutchman has been a huge part of the win streak leading the team with a .435 batting average (27-of-62) and an on-base percentage of .532. He's notched 18 runs and 11 RBI.

• The senior has not recorded a base hit in only four games this year and has been on in every game but one (SEMO, 4.20).

### RUSSELL POWERS THE BIG RED LINEUP

• Lamar hasn't seen this type power surge from an individual in its lineup since the school record holder Michael Ambort was on the lineup card. Ambort hit 11 long balls in 2007, two seasons after he set the school record of 18 in 2005. Russell is on pace to finish just short of him at 17.

• He leads an offense that has already eclipsed the past two seasons' combined long balls with 32. The highest single campaign total before this season was 43 in 2010.

• LU hit four home runs against Arizona and Abilene Christian this season. It also powered over three dingers in the finale against Central Arkansas, and the series openers versus New Orleans and at Abilene Christian. It has nine games with two or more long balls this season.

• Russell pushed a homer streak to five with a first-inning bomb against UCA, but it was snapped in the opener against UNO. The NCAA record for consecutive games with a long ball is eight.

### BULLPEN IS CRUCIAL

• LU's bullpen has been vital to the ball club this year, and will be the catalyst to get the Cardinals where they want to go.

• Through 32 games, the bullpen has just two less decisions than the starting staff. Heading into the series, Cardinal starters are 13-4 on the year while the bullpen is 12-3 with 11 saves.

• The ACU series is the first and only weekend series that bullpen wasn't a factor in a win-loss decision.

• The starting staff has a collective ERA of 3.42 when on the mound while relievers have a mark of 3.94.

### DON'T EVER COUNT THEM OUT

• The Cardinals have turned into something of the Cardiac Kids. They have overcome six-, eight- and nine-run deficits all this season along with three walk-offs.

• They were down 8-0 by the middle of the second inning to No. 5 LSU, but chipped away to grab a 12-11 win. Did the same thing against Nicholls when they were down 10-1 in the fifth. The Cardinals were down 12-6 in the fifth to Corpus Christi, but rallied for a 15-12 victory.

• Brendan Satran roped a walk-off singled down the left field line in the 10th inning of the second game of the season to defeat Southeast Missouri State, 2-1.

• Bryndan Arredondo slapped a walk-off homer in the ninth inning of the lone game LU took from North Dakota State. He was down to two outs in a hitter's count.

## **LAMAR TABBED FOR NINTH PLACE**

- Lamar was projected to finish ninth this season in the Southland Conference by both the league's coaches and sports information directors.
- Big Red finished last season in 11th place after a disappointing 21-31 overall record and 10-19 Southland Conference Record.

## **THE EXPERTS HAVE SPOKEN**

- Three Cardinals were listed on D1Baseball.com's Southland Conference Top Prospects, including Will Hibb's fifth place standing. Enrique Oquendo was ranked 12th and Stijn van der Meer was 14th.
- All three are seniors this season.

## **THE LAST HOORAH**

- The 2016 season will be the 40th overall (39th at Lamar) and final season for head coach Jim Gillian as a collegiate head coach. The former Cardinal pitching ace, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Bill Vincent in 1970.
- Counting his playing and graduate assistant days, he has faithfully served Lamar for well over 40 years and has seen nearly every Cardinal win.
- Just last season, he accomplished something that only 18 coaches in the history of the NCAA did before him, attain 1,300 career wins.
- He's accounted for a staggering 29 30-win seasons, eight 40-win seasons and one 50-win season. His 1981 squad set the school record for wins in a season at 54.
- He's been inducted into the Southland Conference Hall of Honor and the Texas Baseball Hall of Fame.

## **HEAD COACH IN WAITING**

- Now an assistant at Lamar, former LSU player and assistant Will Davis was tabbed to take over as head coach of the program starting in 2017.
- Davis, 31, saw tremendous success with his alma mater, including a 2009 College World Series Championship. That season wrapped up with a 56-17 record, one of three 50-win seasons with him on staff.
- He's been a part of four College World Series teams, three Southeastern Conference Championships and five SEC Tournament Championship teams. The Louisiana-native advanced to at least NCAA Regionals every season but one along with five SEC West Division Championships.
- Under his tutelage, LSU's outfielders have gained a reputation as being one of the best position groups in the nation. In 2013, the Tiger outfield committed just one error in 68 games. He helped in the development of Mikie Mahtook, now a major leaguer with the Tampa Bay Rays. He was an All-SEC Defensive Team selection along with Laird (2015) and Andrew Stevenson (2014-15).
- Offensively, he helped with the development of position players at the plate. Last season, the Tigers led the SEC in 10 offensive categories, including batting average with a .322 mark. In 2014, they ranked second in the league in scoring (6.3 runs per game) and slugging percentage (.415). LSU led the conference in hits (722), doubles (128) and total bases (1,023), and ranked second in batting average (.305), runs (439), runs batted in (394), home runs (47), on-base percentage (.389) and slugging (.432) in 2013.

For the better part of 38 years, head coach **Jim Gilligan** has been the face of the Lamar University Baseball. The skipper has been around and influenced the program since his playing days back in 1967, but alongside his wife LaVerne, Gilligan announced his plans to retire at the conclusion of the 2016 season during a press conference Monday afternoon in the Dauphin Athletic Complex.

Gilligan, who is a former pitching ace for Lamar University from 1967-68, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Bill Vincent in 1970 after a brief stint in Detroit's Class-A affiliate in New York.

In 1972, he took his first head coaching job and led Western New Mexico to a 10-10 record. After one year, his alma mater came calling; he answered and took over as head coach in 1973. Other than a brief stint as a professional club coach from 1987-1991, he's been the skipper since.

"We are extremely grateful for all that Jim has done for Lamar University, the athletics department and especially the baseball program," said Director of Athletics Jason Henderson. "Jim's passion for Lamar University and baseball is unmatched.

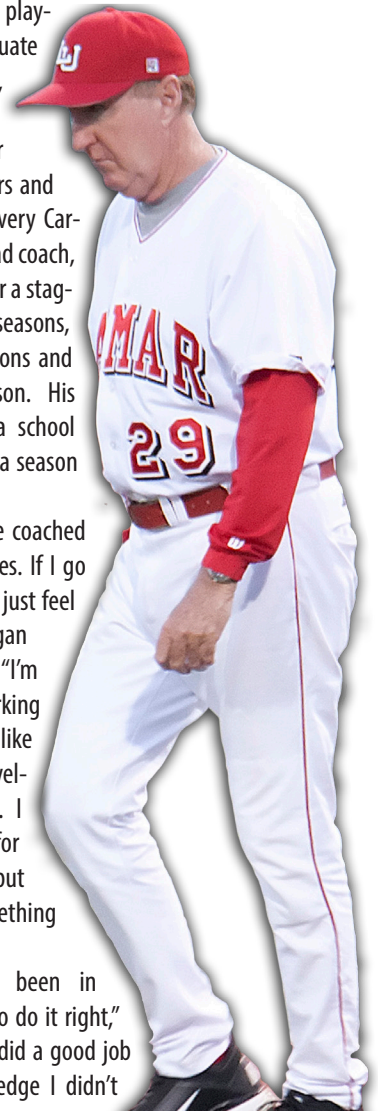
"The mark that he has left on collegiate baseball and Lamar University will never be forgotten," he said. "We are excited to celebrate his career this upcoming season and look forward to a great 2016 campaign."

Just last season, he accomplished something that only 18 coaches in the history of the NCAA did before him, attain 1,300 career wins. That win came in a 7-6 season-opening victory over New Mexico State, and by the end of the season Gilligan claimed with 1,320 wins. His career record stands at 1,320-875-1, and all but two of Lamar's 12 conference championships were won under Gilligan's tutelage.

Counting his playing and graduate assistant days, he has faithfully served Lamar for more than 40 years and has seen nearly every Cardinal win. As a head coach, he has accounted for a staggering 29 30-win seasons, eight 40-win seasons and one 50-win season. His 1981 squad set a school record for wins in a season at 54.

"It's time. I've coached here for six decades. If I go seven decades, I'll just feel old," said Gilligan with a chuckle. "I'm going to miss working with the players. I like watching the development of players. I don't have plans for what I'll do yet, but I'm sure I'll do something targeted that way.

"I've always been in pursuit of trying to do it right," he said. "I think I did a good job of gaining knowledge I didn't



have.”

The six-time league coach of the year considers one of his greatest accomplishments to be his induction into the Texas Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004. He went in alongside Houston Astro greats Jeff Bagwell and Craig Biggio and Rangers’ Kenny Rogers.

He was also inducted into the Southland Conference Hall of Honor, and joined eight of LU’s best, J.B. Higgins, F.L. McDonald, Billy Tubbs, Belle Mead, Sonny Jolly, Katrinka Jo Crawford, Paul Zeek and Chris Stroud.

The City of Beaumont loved him so much that in 2010 it voted unanimously to rename a stretch of Florida Avenue running adjacent to Vincent-Beck Stadium to Jim Gilligan Way. Additionally, he was honored as a Distinguished Lamar Alum in 2012.

During his tenure, Gilligan guided the Cardinals to 12 NCAA Regional Tournaments, the most recent being 2010 after his group swept its way through the Southland Conference Tournament in Corpus Christi. From 1976-1981, a span of six years, he ran through four NCAA Regionals and worked up a 296-108-5 record during the time period. Three times in his career he went to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments, including three-straight from 2002-04. In those three seasons he accumulated a 117-58 record.

His 1976, 1977, 1993, 2002, 2003, 2004 seasons all netted him league coach of the year honors, all were Southland Conference honors except the 1993 award. He alone has more SLC Coach of the Year honors than every current program in the conference except Northwestern State.

His head coaching career is split into two periods. His first phase spanned

from 1973-86 to which he led the Cardinals to seven league championships and six NCAA appearances.

His teams played twice in the NCAA Regional Finals, one step from a shot at the College World Series, but fell in both. He earned his 500th career victory in 1986, and was the youngest coach to ever do so at the time.

When he returned in 1992, Gilligan had to revive a struggling Cardinal program that had a 120-152-1 record in his absence. The worst of those in the season before he returned at 18-34. In 1992, he improved the Cards to a 32-21 record and followed that with a Sun Belt Conference Championship in 1993. Since that championship, he has won two more league crowns, three tournament championships and made five NCAA Regional appearances.

During his stint away from Lamar, Gilligan managed the 1987 Salt Lake Trappers of the Pioneer League. That team broke a 68-year professional record by winning 29 consecutive games. To recognize the achievement, the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, N.Y., created a permanent display featuring Gilligan’s No. 29 jersey, a number he still proudly wears today. Before becoming Salt Lake’s manager in 1987, he served as the Trappers’ pitching coach in 1986. In that season Salt Lake had the best pitching staff in the league and led the Trappers to the Pioneer League Championship.

The skipper claimed three-straight conference championships from 1975-77, which was only the second time a team in the league had done so. He accumulated 33 wins and only 12 losses in league play during that span, and the Cardinals did not drop a single conference series during the 1977 campaign.

When the Southland Conference celebrated its 50th anniversary, it released five all-decade teams and Gilligan was listed on four of them. For the 1960s, he was listed on the team as a pitcher, and for the 1970s, 1980s and 2000s, he was listed as a coach. Gilligan is the Southland Conference’s and Lamar’s winningest coach.

In 2003, Gilligan guided Lamar to its 11th regular season title and a spot in to a NCAA Regional hosted by Texas. Big Red came within one win of advancing a NCAA Super Regional after pushing the host Longhorns to a championship game. UT pulled out a 6-3 win over the Cardinals and went on to the College World Series.

Gilligan has coached 133 all-conference selections, 79 major league draftees, six major leaguers and four All-Americans during his career. Joe McCann (1976-79) is one of only two players to be named All-Southland Conference for four seasons, and Mike Laudig (1976-78) is one of only 13 to take the honors three times.

He has coached one Southland Conference Player of the Year, four Hitters of the Year and nine Pitchers of the Year.

“I would be slighting several teams to narrow down my favorite moment,” he said. “There are so many great players to come through here.”

His trademark has always been getting the most out of his players, especially the pitching staff, having been a pitcher himself. A former southpaw for LU, Gilligan led Lamar’s 1967 staff in victories (five), earned run average (2.54) and strikeouts (60).

“If I didn’t play here, I’m not sure that I would have started coaching,” said Gilligan. “I don’t think I would have gotten into this business for any other program but our own.”

He graduated with a bachelor’s degree in 1969 and earned his master’s degree the following year. He and LaVerne, who was always instrumental in the success of the annual Lamar Baseball Banquet and securing outfield billboard sponsors, reside in Beaumont.
