ABOUT THE EXPLORERS

- The Explorers have dropped their last three games, most recently falling to Saint Joseph's, 64-63, in the final seconds of the game. La Salle held a lead heading into the fourth quarter, however the Hawks were able to pull away. For the first time since 2010, five different Explorers scored in double figures.
- Over the last 11 games, the Explorers are shooting 41.2% from the field and 31.7% from long range. Both are better than the season averages of 34.4% FG and 25.1% 3FG. Given the increase in shooting percentage, La Salle is also scoring 59.4 points per outing over that span, which is 4.6 points better than the season average.
- At least one Explorer has scored a career high in points in 11 of the last 19 games.
- The Explorers are first in the A-10 in both steals (243) and steals per game (9.0). The 243 steals have La Salle ranked 57th nationally.
- Senior **Jeryn Reese** is the team's active leading scorer with 8.1 points per game. Sophomore **Michelle Nicholls** (7.9 ppg), junior **Shalina Miller** (7.7 ppg), and junior **Sofilia Ngwafang** (7.0 ppg), and are the next top scorers.
- On the glass, senior **Jeryn Reese** (6.6 rpg) and junior **Shalina Miller** (6.2 rpg) are topping the team in rebounds.
- Junior **Shalina Miller** is fourth in program history in blocks with 99 and is currently second in the conference in blocks (52) and blocks per game (1.9). Her 52 deflections also have Miller ranked 34th in the nation.
- Senior **Jeryn Reese** has been on fire as of late. The Mansfield, Ohio native has dropped 10 or more points in five of her last seven games, averaging 12.0 ppg over that span.

The correct spelling of our University is "La Salle", with a space in the middle. Please do not use "LaSalle."

ONE OF A KIND

With over 1,100 schools across three divisions in the NCAA, the La Salle Explorers are the only institution with the nickname 'Explorers.'

FAKE NEWS?

La Salle University's nickname – the Explorers – was announced by The Collegian in March 1932 as the winning entry to a student contest. However, in the fall of 1931, a Baltimore sportswriter covering the La Salle/St. John's (Md.) football game erroneously alluded to La Salle as being named for the French explorer La Salle, not St. John Baptist de La Salle. Were the two events related? We'll never know for sure.

SERIES HISTORY - RICHMOND

Richmond holds the all-time series, 20-7, including 13 of the last 14 games. In the series that dates back to 1987, La Salle's last win came on the road in 2017. The Explorers and Spiders battled earlier this season when Richmond visited Philadelphia and took the victory 74-60.

EXPLORERS ACCOMPLISH FEAT FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2010

In a close game against Saint Joseph's on Sunday, Feb. 17, La Salle had five players finish with double digit point totals for the first time since the team defeated Tulsa, 86-73, on December 5, 2010. Against the Hawks, freshmen **Shayla Sweeney** (13), **Janay Sanders** (10), junior **Shalina Miller** (12), senior **Jeryn Reese** (10), and sophomore **Michelle Nicholls** (10) each notched 10+ points.

BACK TO SCORING

Prior to coming to La Salle, senior **Jeryn Reese** played two seasons at Owens Community College and was one of the team's top scorers. Since coming to 20th and Olney, Reese hasn't been able to consistently establish herself until recently. The Mansfield, Ohio native has registered double-digit point totals in five of her last seven games (12.0 ppg), setting a new career high twice. In fact, she's set a new career mark eight different times this season.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

Eight different Explorers have led the team in scoring this season. In the nation, there are only seven other schools who have eight or more players who have led or shared the team lead in scoring in a game this season - Boise State (10), South Carolina (10), Milwaukee (10), Detroit Mercy (9), Baylor (8), Lehigh (8), and Texas (8).

BLOCK MONSTER

Junior **Shalina Miller** has established herself as one of the best blockers in the Atlantic 10. Sitting near the top of the rankings in both blocks and blocks per game, the Philadelphia, Pa. native has registered at least one block in 23 of her 27 games played this season. Of those 23 games, she's recorded multiple blocks in 14 contests, including three or more in 10 games.

NICHOLLS, NGWAFANG SCORE CAREER HIGHS IN FIRST A-10 WIN

La Salle picked up its first Atlantic 10 win of the season as the Explorers edged Rhode Island, 77-71, in the team's annual kids' day game. The Explorers' 77 points are a season high for the team, while sophomore **Michelle Nicholls** (23) and junior **Sofilia Ngwafang** (18) set career bests in the game. Nicholls also added a career mark with seven assists. Not only was the victory the first conference win of the season, but the first in head coach **Mountain MacGillivray's** career.

REESE, SANDERS SHINE IN NORTH CAROLINA

When the Explorers travelled to Davidson to take on the Wildcats, senior **Jeryn Reese** and freshman **Janay Sanders** scored 18 points apiece - career highs for both. Reese neared a double-double, corralling eight rebounds in the contest. For the rookie, the game was her first back in her home state since coming to La Salle. Sanders grew up just a few miles from Davidson and turned out nearly 70 fans at the game.

EXPLORERS NEARLY DOWN ATLANTIC 10 PRESEASON FAVORITE

In a conference battle against Duquesne, La Salle nearly took down the preseason Atlantic 10 favorites. The Explorers led the game through most of the first three quarters before the Dukes mounted a fourth quarter run. In the game, three players registered double-digit point totals - sophomore **Rayshel Brown** (14), junior **Shalina Miller** (13), and sophomore **Michelle Nicholls** (10). Miller completed the double-double by corralling 10 rebounds.

REESE, BROWN HAVE DOMINANT PERFORMANCES AGAINST GW

In the Explorers loss to George Washington, senior **Jeryn Reese** and sophomore **Rayshel Brown** had lifetime performances. Reese registered her first career double-double with career bests in points (14) and rebounds (11). Brown also dropped a career high (21), while tying her lifetime mark in rebounds (8).

CONFERENCE TIME, RAYSHEL SHINES

Since Atlantic 10 play started, sophomore **Rayshel Brown** has played her best basketball. The Staten Island, N.Y. native is averaging a team best 12.1 ppg, shooting an impressive 44.7% (38-of-85) from the floor.

OUCH!

On January 3, sophomore **Deja King** broke her ankle in practice and will miss the remainder of the season. King was the team's leading scorer, second best rebounder and led the team in assists at the time of her injury. At the end of January, classmate **Rayshel Brown** tore her meniscus, sidelining her for the remainder of the year.

PAIR COME CLOSE TO DOUBLE-DOUBLES

In the team's loss against UMass, junior **Shalina Miller** and freshman **Janay Sanders** neared double-doubles. Miller scored nine points on the game, adding eight rebounds, four steals, and three blocks. Sanders, who landed on the A-10 and Big 5 Weekly Honor Roll, dropped 10 points, while adding eight assists, six rebounds, and three steals.

MACGILLIVRAY INKS FIRST SIGNING CLASS

Head coach **Mountain MacGillivray** announced the addition of three Explorers as part of the team's 2019 recruiting class. **Kayla Braxton-Young**, **Christina Kline**, and **Jordon Lewis** will suit up for La Salle during the 2019-20 season. More details on page 36.

REESE GOES OFF

In the team's loss to VCU, senior **Jeryn Reese** set a career high with 13 points. The Mansfield, Ohio native shot 42% (5-of-12) from the floor, adding five rebounds, three assists, and a steal.

EXPLORERS FARE WELL IN FRIARS HOLIDAY CLASSIC

In the team's tournament in Providence, La Salle picked up its first back-to-back wins of the season as the Explorers took down Northern Kentucky and Pepperdine on consecutive days. After falling to hosting Providence, La Salle has won three of its last five contests. In the win over the Norse, sophomores **Michelle Nicholls** (21 points) and **Deja King** (16 points) set career highs from the floor. In the final game of the tournament, freshman **Kayla Spruill** dropped a career best 15 points in her 16 minutes of play. King was named to the all-tournament team after averaging 10.3 points/game, 5.0 rebounds/game, 2.7 steals/game in 32 minutes per contest. The Trenton, N.J. native shot 35.3% from the field and 85.7% from the free throw line.

CAREER DAY FOR BROWN LEADS TO A-10/BIG 5 RECOGNITION

Sophomore **Rayshel Brown** dropped a career high 20 points against St. John's leading to a spot on the conference's and Big 5's weekly honor roll. In the game, Brown shot 57.1% (8-of-14) from the floor, including a perfect 100% (3-of-3) from long range. Brown's efforts helped La Salle set season bests in field goal (40.4%) and three point (47.1%) percentages.

FIRST STEP FOR MOUNTAIN

La Salle's win over Norfolk State not only marked the first of the 2018-19 season for the Explorers, but the first of head coach **Mountain MacGillivray's** career. The rookie head coach saw four of his players notch double figures in the 62-52 win over the Spartans. Sophomore **Michelle Nicholls** notched a game high 17 points to set a career high, while junior **Shalina Miller** registered her first double-double of the season (14 pts., 10 rbs.).

KING PICKS UP A PAIR OF WEEKLY ACCOLADES

In a 1-1 week for the Explorers, sophomore **Deja King** was named to the Atlantic 10 and Philadelphia Big 5 Weekly Honor Roll as she dropped 13 points against Penn and Norfolk State. On the week, the Trenton, N.J. native shot 50% from the floor, including 50% from long range, adding 3.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists per contest.

POSITIVE SIGNS SHOWN AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED BEAVERS

Despite the outcome of the game, La Salle showed some positive signs in the team's loss to #9/9 Oregon State. Against the Beavers, freshman **Janay Sanders** dropped 12 points, setting a career mark. Collectively, the Explorers forced 19 Beaver turnovers, which is the most by any team this season, including the past two defending NCAA national champs (South Carolina and Notre Dame). La Salle had its best turnover margin at +9 with a season low 10 give ups.

Despite the outcome in the season opener against Howard, La Salle set a new program record for team rebounds in a game with 61. Against the Bison, the Explorers corralled 24 offensive boards and 34 defensive. The prior record of 58 rebounds was set in 1989 against St. Mary's.

FIRST GAME, NO PROBLEM

In her first career game on Tuesday against Howard, freshman **Kayla Spruill** made the most of her 21 minutes of play. The Baltimore, Md. native scored nine points in her debut for the Explorers, adding 10 rebounds.

NEW YEAR, NEW COACH

On April 21, 2018, **Mountain MacGillivray** was named the ninth head coach in La Salle women's basketball history. MacGillivray comes to 20th and Olney after a nine-year stint at Quinnipiac. During his tenure with the Bobcats, MacGillivray helped the team to seven straight 20 win seasons, including four trips to the NCAA Tournament and three to the WNIT. No stranger to Philadelphia, he started his coaching career at nearby Archbishop Carroll where he was an assistant coach for over a decade.

ALL DAY, CHRIS DAY

A familiar face in Philadelphia Big 5 women's basketball, **Chris Day**, was named associate head coach in May of 2018. Prior to serving as the head coach at Vermont for two seasons, Day was an assistant at Penn, Saint Joseph's and La Salle. While at Penn, Day helped guide the Quakers to two Ivy League Titles and NCAA appearances.

ESHE RETURNS TO EXPLORERS

Head coach **Mountain MacGillivray** retained assistant coach/recruiting coordinator **Dalila Eshe** for her third season with La Salle. The former WNBA second round pick played her college ball at Florida, where she was an All-SEC selection.

BOO COMES TO THE BENCH

Making her coaching debut in 2018-19, **Gillian 'Boo' Abshire** joins the Explorers staff. A familiar face to head coach Mountain MacGillivray, Abshire played four years for the head man at Quinnipiac. During her playing days, she was instrumental in the Bobcats success. In her senior campaign, she set the NCAA single season record for assist-turnover ratio.

TWO BEST FRIENDS THAT ANYONE COULD HAVE

It all started in the late 1980s at Archbishop Carroll High School. Then student managers, **Mountain MacGillivray** and **Chris Day** worked with the girls team at Carroll. Since then, the two have been waiting to coach together at the collegiate level and finally they are. More on page 33-34.

ESPN+ MAKES ITS DEBUT

This past summer, the Atlantic 10 signed a TV deal with ESPN+ for all women's basketball games to be aired on ESPN+. ESPN+ can be accessed on all mobile devices and online. All A-10 matchups and home non-conference La Salle games will be broadcast.

TV TIME

Aside from the team's air time on ESPN+, La Salle will be featured three times on TV throughout the season. When the Explorers take on Penn at the Palestra for a Big 5 matchup, the game will be broadcast on NBC Sports Philadelphia. For the non-conference bout against the PAC 12's Oregon State, the Explorers will see air time on the PAC 12 Network. When the team heads to Saint Joseph's, La Salle will be featured on national TV with the game being aired on CBS Sports Network.

INTERNATIONAL AIR TIME

All Explorers' home games and select away games will also be available via an international stream through the Atlantic 10 and ESPN+.

FROM THE BIG 10 TO THE BIG 5

Junior **Kate Hill** transferred to La Salle this season after spending two years at Rutgers. In her time at Rutgers, the Toronto, Ontario native appeared in 30 games for the Scarlet Knights, including eight starts. During her final season at RU, she earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

MOUNTAIN MACGILLIVRAY

Head Coach
Temple '96 | First Season

Mountain MacGillivray, a Philadelphia native who helped lead Quinnipiac to seven straight 20-win seasons and a trip to the Sweet 16 in 2017, was appointed the ninth head coach in La Salle University women's basketball history, it was announced on April 21, 2018.

"We are excited to welcome Mountain back home to Philadelphia as he takes over leadership of our women's basketball program," Bradshaw said. "He's been a key member of an exceptional program at Quinnipiac over the last few years and has been an integral part of their success both in recruiting and game preparation. His deep roots in Philadelphia high school basketball will help attract the top local talent from the area to La Salle."

MacGillivray spent the previous nine seasons at Quinnipiac, including the last three as the associate head coach. The Bobcats had tremendous success during MacGillivray's tenure, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in four of the past five seasons, including three wins in NCAA play over the last two seasons.

Quinnipiac went undefeated in the MAAC in 2017-18 for the third time in six years, winning the conference regular season title for the fifth time in six seasons. After earning the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament with a victory over Marist in the MAAC title game, the Bobcats earned a No. 9 seed and defeated Miami (Fla.) in the opening round.

"I am honored to have the opportunity to coach at La Salle

University," MacGillivray said. "The challenge of building a championship program at this proud and historic University is thrilling and I am excited to get started."

In 2016-17, MacGillivray helped Quinnipiac to a pair of upset wins in NCAA Tournament action, defeating Marquette and Miami (Fla.) en route to the Sweet 16. The Bobcats have won four conference championships and averaged 26 wins over the past seven seasons, and head coach Tricia Fabbri won MAAC Coach of the Year four times with the contributions of MacGillivray.

Prior to Quinnipiac, MacGillivray served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of New Hampshire for two seasons from 2007-09, helping the Wildcats improve their finish in the conference in both seasons.

MacGillivray got his start in collegiate coaching as an assistant at the University of Vermont in 1999-2000, guiding the Catamounts to the NCAA Tournament that year after winning the America East regular season and tournament championships.

MacGillivray has 13 years of experience coaching at the high school and AAU levels, helping turn Archbishop Carroll High School in Radnor, Pennsylvania into one of the most successful prep programs in the country. He also guided the Philadelphia AAU Lady Running Rebels from 2000-02 and Delaware Valley Comets AAU team in 2006.

A 1996 graduate of Temple with a degree in Journalism, MacGillivray and his wife, Grace, have seven children: Chiara, Mary, Brigid, Sean, Catherine, Joseph and Theresa.

DAY, MACGILLIVRAY REUNITE, TRY TO TURN AROUND LA SALLE

PHILADELPHIA — La Salle head women's basketball coach Mountain MacGillivray and his associate head coach, Chris Day, laughed and joked like the old friends they are as they spoke Monday about the paths that led them both to 20th & Olney.

This pairing did not happen by chance.

The seeds were sown 30 years ago when they served as managers in the girls basketball program at Archbishop Carroll High School. MacGillivray, a 1991 grad, was a sophomore at the time. Day, who graduated a year later, was a freshman.

Day would videotape the games and MacGillivray did the play-by-play, among many other tasks. Those humble beginnings grew into separate coaching careers. Day quickly became one of the best high school athletes in Delaware County of the early 1990s, and went on to become the head women's basketball coach at Widener and the University of Vermont, along with assistant coaching gigs for the girls team at Carroll and the women's programs for Widener, Duquesne, La Salle, Saint Joseph's, Indiana and Penn.

He also spent time as an assistant football coach at Widener and was the track coach for a year at West Chester East. MacGillivray served as an assistant at Carroll for 13 seasons before moving to assistant women's coaching positions at Vermont, New Hampshire and Quinnipiac universities.

Regardless of where they were, however, MacGillivray and Day always stayed close.

"We prepared for a lot of teams

over the phone together," said MacGillivray, who played baseball for the Patriots.

"Yes we did," added Day, an All-Delco standout in football and track during his scholastic career at Carroll. "We shared tons of ideas, how to guard people, what they had, recruiting, all that."

Now they're sharing those ideas together as part of the same staff. Although La Salle is off to a rocky start (0-5), it was a pairing that was meant to be.

It was Day who heard through the coaching grapevine that there was going to be an opening at La Salle last spring and the man who encouraged his best friend to go for the job. MacGillivray had just completed his ninth season as an assistant at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, Conn. and his third as the associate head coach.

The Bobcats were coming off their third MAAC title in four years and fourth trip to the NCAA Division I women's tournament in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 run in 2017. MacGillivray had a great situation. He was comfortable, happy, coaching at a winning program and able to provide for his large family, which includes his wife Grace and their seven children.

"I had no interest in leaving a great program as an assistant just to be the head coach, so my name was on the marquee," MacGillivray said.

He threw his hat into the ring, anyway.

"Coaching in the Big 5, bringing my family back to Philadelphia and being at a Catholic university, that was too much to pass up,"

MacGillivray said. "It takes a lot just to put yourself out there to do it, just to go for the job. You have to stress out your head coach. You have to stress out your family and then you don't get it, so I didn't even know if I wanted to get involved. But the more I thought about those three things: Being in the Big 5, being back home and being at a Catholic university, I was like, 'I have to do it.'"

MacGillivray applied for the job, with one condition.

"I said if I get it I want you," MacGillivray said of Day. "Would you do it? How much would it take? We were negotiating the whole time."

The offer came at an interesting time for Day. He had just finished his second season as the head coach at Vermont, albeit under a cloud.

In early April, Vermont athletic director Jeff Schulman confirmed television and published reports that the university was "Investigating certain aspects of the women's basketball program." Specifically the school was looking into Day's 'verbal interaction' with the players, according to an unnamed source in the television report.

The investigation caught Day by surprise, but came to an end without a report when he tendered his resignation on April 26. Less than two weeks later Day joined MacGillivray as his associate head coach.

Day said the investigation was not the reason for his resignation. It was the opportunity to bring his family home and coach with his best friend.

“I can’t speak on everything,” said Day, who went 17-42 in his two seasons in Burlington. “The best way to phrase it is that there were a couple of curveballs that were thrown at me that were unexpected. It made me think, when Mountain got the job, is this meant to be? Is this going to be our final chance to ever come back home?”

Day had left Philly twice before only to return to his roots. He left Duquesne after a year to take an assistant coaching job at La Salle, which led to a seven-year stint at Saint Joseph’s. He then went to Indiana only to return for a post at Penn, which led to the job at Vermont.

No matter where he was, though, his hometown area was always on his mind.

“I told many people that the only reason I would leave Vermont was to come back to Philly,” Day said.

And so, when the opportunity presented itself to return home for a third time, Day jumped at it.

“The biggest thing for me, at this point in my career, if I’m going to make a move to be a head coach or go somewhere else, coming home and working with someone who understands family is important,” Day said. “I have five kids. I have one in college and four younger. As you get older, it’s important to work with someone you know understands about family and (MacGillivray), with seven (children), understands that.”

MacGillivray and Day understand one another other and work well together. It dates to their days at Carroll when they served as managers, first under Linus McGinty and later Barry Kirsch.

“The behind-the-scenes meetings with Linus and Barry, oh my goodness,” Day said. “We

learned so much from them ... A lot of our base is what we learned at Carroll, running the Loyola Marymount transition, that type of stuff.”

“They treated us more like assistant coaches than managers,” MacGillivray said. “We talked about basketball nonstop. They taught us the way they did things. They encouraged us to get in there and work with the players and help them out, so I can’t say enough about the opportunity that Linus gave us and that Barry gave me, specifically. That was huge.”

Now MacGillivray and Day are trying to use those lessons learned at Carroll, and many other stops along the way, to turn around an Explorers program that has had just one winning season (17-13 in 2016-17) in the last 11 years.

They know what it’s going to take to achieve that goal.

“Patience,” they responded in unison.

Three decades ago they talked about coaching together on the collegiate level and now it’s a reality. It’s only fitting that it comes at La Salle, where both reached the pinnacle of their high school athletic careers.

As a senior, MacGillivray helped Carroll win the Catholic League baseball title at La Salle’s DeVin-

cent Field. A year later, Day won the 100- and 200-meter dashes at the Catholic League championships at McCarthy Stadium.

Talk about karma.

“It was just a sign,” Day said. “Whatever was going on up there at Vermont and Mountain getting the job here, it was just crazy. The Lord spoke again. He keeps calling me home and we listened again. It was nothing that went down. It was just me saying, ‘OK, what’s happening is unfortunate. I could easily fight it and be fine.’ Nothing happened. There was no report. But it was like, ‘Why do all this and have this hanging over me? Are people going to be side-eying me? It was like I was being told to go home and coach with my best friend. The Lord spoke. I listened and here we are.”



JERYN REESE LOOKS TO REGAIN SCORING TOUCH IN SENIOR SEASON FOR LA SALLE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

PHILADELPHIA - If there was just one thing that Jeryn Reese always did on a basketball court, it was scoring.

As a senior at her Ohio high school, Reese averaged 19.5 points and went past 1,000 for her career.

In two seasons at Owens Community College in Ohio, the 6-foot forward was twice named all-Ohio Community College Athletic Conference and averaged 13.7 points and nearly 10 rebounds.

When Reese signed to play at La Salle for the 2017-18 season, the Explorers believed they had recruited a proven scorer who would add consistent points off the bench.

In her first season at La Salle, Reese averaged 11.5 minutes in 24 games. She averaged just 1.3 points and had a season high of four points on four occasions. After shooting better than 50 percent in her final season at the community college level, Reese shot just 37.8 percent in her first season of Division I.

"It was definitely an adjustment," Reese said. "My first year here was tough at the beginning. Obviously, from junior college to here, the girls are bigger and faster, but I expected that.

"As time went on, I got into it, and now I feel I'm settled in."

Reese is the first to concede she expected more from herself during her first season competing at an Atlantic 10 school.

But the dynamics of being a transfer student can be complicated. There were established

players and turmoil with head coach Jeff Williams being in the final year of a contract that would not be renewed.

"I expected to be on the back-burner a bit because there were established players here as scorers," Reese said.

That won't be the case this season.

For Reese, it is the rare second chance to make a first impression.

"It's his first time meeting us and our first time meeting him," said Reese, who is suddenly the lone returning senior, "but everybody loves Coach Mountain.

"He just brings something different. The atmosphere is just better. I feel there is more positive vibes. I feel like the players and the coaches really mesh well together."

A new coach generally means new opportunities for players to earn bigger roles, and Reese said she is looking forward to that.

"It's a level playing field for everybody on the team," she said. "I feel it is perfect timing for me honestly. I get to prove myself and make an impression on [MacGillivray] and show him what I'm capable of, which is a good thing."

"That's a good thing for all of the girls on the team."

So far, Reese said that MacGillivray has run a

system that gives players more freedom to take shots.

"He wants everybody to be a shooter," Reese said. "Last year, everybody had a role, but Coach Mountain wants everybody to be able to play every role and do everything on the court.

"If you can shoot it, then shoot. If you can dribble, then dribble. As long as you make good decisions, he doesn't want you to hold back.

"That's more relaxing for a player. It's less thinking about stuff and getting more into the flow of the game. If a good shot comes to you, take it. That's how I'm used to playing."

Scoring is something Reese could always do, and she wants to show she can do it at La Salle.

PHILADELPHIA – Three new faces will be joining the La Salle women’s basketball team next season after signing National Letters of Intent (NLI), announced head coach Mountain MacGillivray. Kayla Braxton-Young, Christina Kline, and Jordon Lewis will suit up for the Explorers next fall.

Hailing from nearby Newark, Del., Braxton-Young plays her high school ball at Paul M. Hodgson Vocational Technical High School, where she also plays lacrosse and volleyball. Coming off of a Second Team All-State season as a junior, Braxton-Young enters her senior campaign as the second all-time scorer in school history. When she comes to La Salle, she plans on majoring in education.

“Having Kayla become an Explorer was a great step in getting a Philadelphia area player to join our program,” MacGillivray said. “She can see the floor, handle the ball, score from the perimeter, and defend the basketball. It’s a real bonus to get her as part of our first recruiting class.”

Joining the Explorers all the way from Winter Garden, Fla., Kline is finishing out her high school career at West Orange High School. Aiding her team to a 26-5 record and claiming the district title, the 5-10 guard plays AAU for SMAC Florida. Kline holds a 3.7 unweighted GPA as she wraps up her senior year. She plans to major in criminal justice at 20th and Olney.

“We are really excited to have Christina Kline join our program,” MacGillivray said. “She’s going to bring a serious long-range shooting threat to the floor.”

Our final signee comes to La Salle from the Lonestar State, living in Houston, Texas. Lewis plays forward at Westside High School where she was named First Team All-District in each of her first three seasons. In the midst of her senior season, this 5-10 Texan skipped a grade in grammar school and plans on majoring in biology at La Salle.

“Jordon has a great work ethic and she’s a great competitor,” MacGillivray said. “She brings versatility to the perimeter, she can play inside and out, and defend almost every position on the floor. We’re excited to have her as part of our program.”

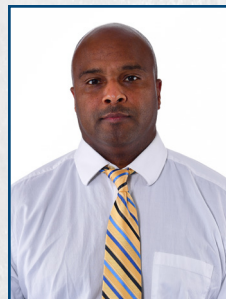
