NEWS & NOTES

-La Salle (14-11, 7-6 A10) returns back to Tom Gola Arena for the final time this season after a 73-65 victory over the Saint Louis Billikens on Saturday, Feb. 19.

-The Explorers took a 3-point lead after the first minute of play and never looked back generating as much as a 22-point gap in the second quarter of the game. La Salle sunk 16 3-point buckets in the contest, the most made in a single contest this season. Five Explorers ended the night in double-digits marking the first game since 2019 that five players have reached the mark in a single game.

-The Explorers continue to lead the conference in free throw percentage shooting 75.9% from the line this season. La Salle has won the turnover battle in 18 of its contests, including the last six straight, this season and currently sits second in the league in turnover margin (2.68). The squad ranks fourth in assists averaging 14.48 per game.

-Kayla Spruill recorded her 19th game in double figures this season including her sixth-straight. Spruill went 6-of-12 from the field including 4-of-8 from deep and 1-of-2 from the line. The contest against Saint Louis marked the fifth this season in which the senior has sunk four 3-point buckets in a game. She currently leads the conference and ranks third in the nation for her performance from beyond the arc shooting 47.2%.

-Claire Jacobs put together her 10th game in double figures with 13 points. Her three 3-point buckets in the contest marks the ninth time this season she has sunk at least three buckets from deep in a contest.

-Jaye Haynes and Amy Jacobs both landed in double figures against the Billikens with 12-points each. The game marked Haynes' third consecutive game and 10th overall with 10+ points while Jacobs' four 3-point buckets tied her career-high.

-Masciantonio continues to be the leading helping hand for the Explorers averaging 4.7 assists per game. She currently ranks first in the league and 13th in the nation in assist to turnover ratio (2.57). She led the team against Saint Louis with seven assists and added 12 points of her own.

The correct spelling of our University is "La Salle", with a space in the middle. Please do not use "LaSalle."

ONE OF A KIND

With over 1,100 schools across three divisions in the NCAA, the La Salle Explorers are the only institution with the nickname 'Explorers.'

FAKE NEWS?

La Salle University's nickname - the Explorers - was announced by The Collegian in March 1932 as the winning entry to a student contest. However, in the fall of 1931, a Baltimore sportswriter covering the La Salle/St. John's (Md.) football game erroneously alluded to La Salle as being named for the French explorer La Salle, not St. John Baptist de La Salle. Were the two events related? We'll never know for sure.

OH WHAT A YEAR!

The 2020-21 season was unlike any other due to the COVID-19 pandemic. La Salle returns to some normalcy this season with an earlier start and will welcome fans back into Tom Gola Arena at TruMark Financial Center for the first time since the 2019-20 season.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

Two Explorers have landed in the national rankings in a number of categories. **Kayla Spruill** is currently ranked third nationally and first in the conference in 3-point field goal percentage at 47.2%. She continues to lead the Atlantic 10 and sits 18th nationally in free throw percentage, 88.3%.

Molly Masciantonio is 13th nationally and first in the A-10 in assist turnover ratio recording 2.57. The senior's 4.7 assists per game puts her at 51st nationally and fourth in the league.

Currently, La Salle ranks 35th in the nation and first in the conference in free throw percentage with 75.9%. The Explorers also currently rank 12th nationally in three-point field goals attempted (689), 15th nationally in three-point field goals per game (8.9) and 19th nationally in three-point field goals made (222). La Salle sits second in the A-10 in each of the categories. The Explorers also rank 74th nationally and first in the league in steals per game averaging 9.1 per contest. La Salle's 2.68 turnover margin is good for first in the A-10 and 69th in the nation.

LAST TIME THEY MET

- The Explorers trail the Dukes 20-30 in the all-time series having dropped the contest against Duquesne in Pittsburgh earlier this season. The loss came after the Explorers ended the Dukes' run in the A-10 tournament last season.

-A victory in Tom Gola Arena on Wednesday would mark the first win for the Explorers on their home court since defeating Duquesne at home during the 2006-07 season. Since that game, La Salle has only won three contests against the Dukes out of 16 meetings between the two teams.

FASTEST TO 500

Junior **Claire Jacobs** made La Salle history last season becoming the fastest Explorer to earn 500 points in program history reaching the milestone in just 35 games.. With 820 points in two seasons, Jacobs sits just 180 points away from the 1,000-point milestone. The Perth, Australia native led the Explorers scoring efforts averaging 16.3 points per game last season recording double-digit scoring efforts in all but four contests. She registered 20+ points in seven games including a season-high 27 points twice.

Jacobs came out fast and furious during her freshman campaign and set a new freshman single game record with 29 points on two different occasions, passing **Suzi McCaffrey's** 28 points over Towson State in 1983, and the freshman season record with 412 points, besting **Micahya Owens'** 411 in 2013-14. That total makes her one of seven freshmen in program history to score 300 points and one of two at 400+. Her rookie performance landed her on the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team and Second Team All-Big 5.

SMOOTH SO STRONG

Senior **Kayla Spruill** aka, Big Smooth, led the Explorers from the 3-point range last season. She shot 43.2% (41-95) from the arc to rank first in the Atlantic 10. The Baltimore, Maryland native earned All-Conference Second Team and All-Big 5 Second Team. She is currently shooting 47.2% this season (58-123), ranking first in the A-10 and third in the nation. She has sunk four 3-pointers in five contests this season. Her 3-point bucket to start the fourth quarter in the game against Fordham on Jan. 9, 2022 pushed her to 1,000-career points. She is now just the 26th Explorer to reach the milestone.

2020-21 HISTORY LESSON

Head coach Mountain MacGillivray's third season came with its own set of challenges. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the 11/30 start-date marked the latest start of a season for the Explorers since 1994-95 (Dec. 1).

The Explorers made their eighth-consecutive appearance in the Atlantic 10 Championship Tournament, marking the third-straight appearance under the tenure of MacGillivray. La Salle made it to the second round for the first time since the 2017-18 season.

La Salle marked its largest deficit, 29, twice last season including once against Saint Joseph's on the road on Jan. 8. The Explorers dropped the contest 65-36, but turned around to claim the second game of the series just two days later (Jan. 10) at home, 81-66.

During the 2019-20 season the Explorers swept Saint Joseph's in the regular season for the first time in program history. The victory inside Hagan Arena on 2/15/10 was the first inside that building for La Salle since 1988.

The Memphis, Tennessee native will provide much needed support in rebounding for La Salle. Crawford ranked third in rebounded during the 2018-19 season at Ole Miss with 3.7 boards per game. She led her team at Morehead State last season with 8.7 rebounds per game.

LINE CHANGE

Head coach **Mountain MacGillivray** sometimes utilizes a unique approach in terms of substitutions. Mountain MacGILLIVRAY

HEAD COACH | FOURTH SEASON | TEMPLE '96

Mountain MacGillivray, a Philadelphia native who helped lead Quinnipiac to seven straight 20-win seasons and a trip to the Sweet 16 in 2017, was appointed the ninth head coach in La Salle University women's basketball history in April of 2018. He begins his third year at the helm of the program in 2020-21.

During the 2019-20 campaign, MacGillivray's Explorers showed vast improvements from year one to two of his tenure, including the program's best start since 2006 at 6-1. The Blue & Gold more than doubled both its overall (13) and Atlantic 10 (7) win totals in year two. The victory over the Penn State Nittany Lions was La Salle's first over a Power 5 program since November 2015 and first over a Big 10 school since taking down Northwestern in December of 1988. The Explorers also swept Big 5 and A-10 rival Saint Joseph's for the first time ever. A gritty win over the Hawks inside Hagan Arena was the first since 1998.

In the same season, Kayla Spruill nearly doubled her points and tripled her rebounds per game to earn the

title of Big 5 Most Improved Player. Claire Jacobs set a La Salle freshman record with 29 points in a game (on two different occasions) and 412 points for the year. These totals, along with her continued success throughout the year led her to earn All-Big 5 Second Team honors and a spot on the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. Rounding out a trio of impressive performances for the 2019-20 season, Kate Hill finished fifth in the nation for assist to turnover ratio at 2.95.

Prior to MacGillivray and his staff taking over the program, Shalina Miller only recorded 49 blocks collectively in her freshman and sophomore campaigns. In her final two seasons with MacGillivray and co., Miller recorded 144 deflections for 193 career blocks to claim the program's all-time record. She also set the single season mark in back-to-back seasons. Her efforts in 2019-20 landed her on the Atlantic 10 All-Defensive team.

MacGillivray spent the previous nine seasons at Quinnipiac, including the last three as the associate head coach.

The Bobcats had tremendous success during MacGillivray's tenure, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in four of his last five seasons, including three wins in NCAA play over the final two.

MacGillivray's role with the Bobcats evolved through the years and one of his greatest responsibilities is within the recruiting of prospective student-athletes. His success in the recruiting landscape has only improved through the years as his last two incoming classes featured the four highest-ranked recruits in program history. In his eight years with the Bobcats, MacGillivray helped guide 18 All-Conference players, including 10 in his final three seasons, as well as three Defensive Player of the Year award winners and three Tournament MVPs.

Quinnipiac went undefeated in the MAAC in 2017-18 for the third time in six years, winning the conference regular season title for the fifth time in six seasons. After earning the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament with a victory over Marist in the MAAC title game, the Bobcats earned a No. 9 seed and defeated Miami (Fla.) in the opening round.

In 2016-17, MacGillivray helped Quinnipiac to a pair of upset wins in NCAA Tournament action, defeating Marquette and Miami (Fla.) en route to the Sweet 16. The Bobcats won four conference championships and averaged 26 wins over that seven year span, and head coach Tricia Fabbri won MAAC Coach of the Year four times with the contributions of MacGillivray.

Prior to Quinnipiac, MacGillivray served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of New Hampshire for two seasons from 2007-09, helping the Wildcats improve their finish in the conference in both seasons.

He got his start in collegiate coaching as an assistant at the University



of Vermont in 1999-00, guiding the Catamounts to the NCAA Tournament that year after winning the America East regular season and tournament championships.

MacGillivray has 13 years of experience coaching at the high school and AAU levels, helping turn Archbishop Carroll High School in Radnor, Pennsylvania into one of the most successful prep programs in the country. He also guided the Philadelphia AAU Lady Running Rebels from 2000-02 and Delaware Valley Comets AAU team in 2006.

A 1996 graduate of Temple with a degree in journalism, MacGillivray and his wife Grace have eight children: Chiara, Mary, Brigid, Sean, Catherine, Joseph, Theresa, and Emily.

DAY, MACGILLIVRAY REUNITE, TRY TO TURN AROUND LA SALLE

PHILADELPHIA – La Salle head women's basketball coach Mountain MacGillivray and his associate head coach, Chris Day, laughed and joked like the old friends they are as they spoke Monday about the paths that led them both to 20th & Olney.

This pairing did not happen by chance.

The seeds were sown 30 years ago when they served as managers in the girls basketball program at Archbishop Carroll High School. MacGillivray, a 1991 grad, was a sophomore at the time. Day, who graduated a year later, was a freshman.

Day would videotape the games and MacGillivray did the play-by-play, among many other tasks. Those humble beginnings grew into separate coaching careers. Day quickly became one of the best high school athletes in Delaware County of the early 1990s, and went on to become the head women's basketball coach at Widener and the University of Vermont, along with assistant coaching gigs for the girls team at Carroll and the women's programs for Widener, Duquesne, La Salle, Saint Joseph's, Indiana and Penn.

He also spent time as an assistant football coach at Widener and was the track coach for a year at West Chester East. MacGillivray served as an assistant at Carroll for 13 seasons before moving to assistant women's coaching positions at Vermont, New Hampshire and Quinnipiac universities.

Regardless of where they were, however, MacGillivray and Day always stayed close.

"We prepared for a lot of teams over the phone together," said MacGillivray, who played baseball for the Patriots.

"Yes we did," added Day, an All-Delco standout in football and track during his scholastic career at Carroll. "We shared tons of ideas, how to guard people, what they had, recruiting, all that."

Now they're sharing those ideas together as part of the same staff. Although La Salle is off to a rocky start (0-5), it was a pairing that was meant to be.

It was Day who heard through the coaching grapevine that there was going to be an opening at La Salle last spring and the man who encouraged his best friend to go for the job. MacGillivray had just completed his ninth season as an assistant at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, Conn. and his third as the associate head coach.

The Bobcats were coming off their third MAAC title in four years and fourth trip to the NCAA Division I women's tournament in six seasons, including a Sweet 16 run in 2017. MacGillivray had a great situation. He was comfortable, happy, coaching at a winning program and able to provide for his large family, which includes his wife Grace and their seven children.

"I had no interest in leaving a great program as an assistant just to be the head coach, so my name was on the marquee," MacGillivray said.

He threw his hat into the ring, anyway.

"Coaching in the Big 5, bringing my family back to Philadelphia

and being at a Catholic university, that was too much to pass up," MacGillivray said. "It takes a lot just to put yourself out there to do it, just to go for the job. You have to stress out your head coach. You have to stress out your family and then you don't get it, so I didn't even know if I wanted to get involved. But the more I thought about those three things: Being in the Big 5, being back home and being at a Catholic university, I was like, 'I have to do it.'"

MacGillivray applied for the job, with one condition.

"I said if I get it I want you," MacGillivray said of Day. "Would you do it? How much would it take? We were negotiating the whole time."

The offer came at an interesting time for Day. He had just finished his second season as the head coach at Vermont, albeit under a cloud.

In early April, Vermont athletic director Jeff Schulman confirmed television and published reports that the university was "Investigating certain aspects of the women's basketball program." Specifically the school was looking into Day's 'verbal interaction' with the players, according to an unnamed source in the television report.

The investigation caught Day by surprise, but came to an end without a report when he tendered his resignation on April 26. Less than two weeks later Day joined MacGillivray as his associate head coach.

Day said the investigation was not the reason for his resignation. It was the opportunity to bring his family home and coach

with his best friend.

"I can't speak on everything," said Day, who went 17-42 in his two seasons in Burlington. "The best way to phrase it is that there were a couple of curveballs that were thrown at me that were unexpected. It made me think, when Mountain got the job, is this meant to be? Is this going to be our final chance to ever come back home?"

Day had left Philly twice before only to return to his roots. He left Duquesne after a year to take an assistant coaching job at La Salle, which led to a seven-year stint at Saint Joseph's. He then went to Indiana only to return for a post at Penn, which led to the job at Vermont.

No matter where he was, though, his hometown area was always on his mind.

"I told many people that the only reason I would leave Vermont was to come back to Philly," Day said.

And so, when the opportunity presented itself to return home for a third time, Day jumped at it.

"The biggest thing for me, at this point in my career, if I'm going to make a move to be a head coach or go somewhere else, coming home and working with someone who understands family is important," Day said. "I have five kids. I have one in college and four younger. As you get older, it's important to work with someone you know understands about family and (MacGillivray), with seven (children), understands that."

MacGillivray and Day understand one another other and work well together. It dates to their days at Carroll when they served as managers, first under Linus McGinty and later Barry Kirsch.

"The behind-the-scenes meetings with Linus and Barry, oh my goodness," Day said. "We learned so much from them ... A lot of our base is what we learned at Carroll, running the Loyola Marymount transition, that type of stuff."

"They treated us more like assistant coaches than managers," MacGillivray said. "We talked about basketball nonstop. They taught us the way they did things. They encouraged us to get in there and work with the players and help them out, so I can't say enough about the opportunity that Linus gave us and that Barry gave me, specifically. That was huge."

Now MacGillivray and Day are trying to use those lessons learned at Carroll, and many other stops along the way, to turn around an Explorers program that has had just one winning season (17-13 in 2016-17) in the last 11 years.

They know what it's going to take to achieve that goal.

"Patience," they responded in unison.

Three decades ago they talked about coaching together on the collegiate level and now it's a reality. It's only fitting that it comes at La Salle, where both

reached the pinnacle of their high school athletic careers.

As a senior, MacGillivray helped Carroll win the Catholic League baseball title at La Salle's DeVincent Field. A year later, Day won the 100- and 200-meter dashes at the Catholic League championships at McCarthy Stadium.

Talk about karma.

"It was just a sign," Day said. "Whatever was going on up there at Vermont and Mountain getting the job here, it was just crazy. The Lord spoke again. He keeps calling me home and we listened again. It was nothing that went down. It was just me saying, 'OK, what's happening is unfortunate. I could easily fight it and be fine.' Nothing happened. There was no report. But it was like, 'Why do all this and have this hanging over me? Are people going to be side-eyeing me? It was like I was being told to go home and coach with my best friend. The Lord spoke. I listened and here we are.'"



LA SALLE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH MOUNTAIN MACGILLIVRAY CHARTED A UNIQUE PATH TO 20TH AND OLNEY

It's his given name, not a nickname. Mountain MacGillivray knows how many conversations will start there.

"You can imagine, every time I say my name," La Salle's first-year women's basketball coach said.

He's making a hotel reservation. It's Mountain. M-O-U

"Milton? Malcolm?"

You expect maybe a guy wearing overalls – not someone who grew up in Overbrook, Columbia by 64th, "right behind the 7-Eleven."

Back to the name. We're not done there.

"He'll tell you: He's got his repertoire of stories of where he got the name," said Mountain's former boss, Tricia Fabbri, the head women's coach at Quinnipiac. "Feel out the person, tell the story."

"I have like five go-to stories," Mountain said. "You call them stories. But they're lies."

Some more plausible than others.

"I've never walked away with someone believing my mother was the second woman to climb Mount Everest," he said.

But second woman is a nice touch.

"First would never work, and it's more verifiable," Mountain said.

He'll also say his mom went into labor while flying over the Rocky Mountains.

"That's not true," Mountain added.

Or he might say his father was a big baseball fan and he is named for Kenesaw Mountain Landis, the first commissioner of baseball.

"I would like that one to be true," Mountain said, since he played baseball at Archbishop Carroll High and for a time at Temple.

The real story? His old boss knows it.

"His mom and dad were hippies," Fabbri said.

"It was 1973," Mountain said. "My dad was 20; my mom, 19. They wanted to name me something different. If I was a girl, it would have been Sunshine."

"It fits him," Fabbri said. "There's only one Mountain."

Which gets to his path to being a Big 5 head coach. Which also sounds fictional. Not how he got this La Salle job. Quinnipiac's big-time success made this move make sense. You don't get to the NCAA Sweet 16 out of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference without all sorts of things hitting on all cylinders.

It was the path to Quinnipiac, to coaching at all, that is, well ... Mountainous.

"I know a ton of women's basketball coaches," said Bobbi Morgan, head coach at Haverford College. "He's probably had the most interesting path."

She's had an interesting one herself, since it was always a dual one: sports journalism and coaching. Morgan used to be sports editor of the Main Line Times.

"Mountain was an Archbishop Carroll student when he started writing for me," said Morgan, whose own Haverford team just won the Centennial Conference to qualify for the NCAA Division III tournament. "Then he went to Temple. I think he majored in journalism."

Mountain was a baseball player at Carroll, an optimistic one. There was a conversation with his coach when he was a junior, how he was going to be all-Catholic the next year.

"Mountain, you have to play to be all-Catholic," the coach told him. (Postscript: He played, was all-Catholic.)

While Mountain was at Carroll, he got cut from the hoops team, and



ended up being a manager for the girls' team. (Not unique; his assistant coach, Chris Day, was a two-sport athlete at Carroll, but also managed the girls' hoops team, their friendship cemented.)

That began when his old CYO coach saw Mountain at the 7-11 near his house. Mountain didn't know this coach was also the junior varsity girls' coach at Carroll, and was surprised when the coach asked him if he wanted to help out.

"I didn't even know girls played basketball," Mountain said.

It turned out his cousin Nancy ["like third cousin, once removed"] was one of the better players at Carroll. And the head varsity coach at the time, Linus McGinty, asked Mountain to do play-by-play for the game film, since McGinty was practically falling asleep watching it. So that was fun right off the bat.

"They were a really good team," Mountain said. "Like top 15 in the country. They played Dawn Staley and Dobbins Tech at St. Joe's. I started to see I could pick up 'Hey, when you missed a shot, you did this. When you made a shot, you did this.' I wasn't very good as a player. I had a decent eye for mechanics."

Mountain also helped Morgan coach a Narberth League team. He stopped baseball while at Temple,

as McGinty asked him to go on Carroll's staff.

"I was really excited," Mountain said. "Then he takes the job at O'Hara. I was crushed. I was so upset. I wouldn't have gone to O'Hara for a million dollars – maybe a million dollars."

He hadn't really overlapped with the new Carroll coach, Barry Kirsch, an assistant, but Kirsch kept the offer out there, and Mountain ended up being on his staff for 13 years.

"He really taught me everything I know," Mountain said. "I learned the game at his hand."

He also began coaching with the Comets AAU program. The Gallagher family, who had started that Delaware County-based program – "they had a full half-court in the backyard, with a light. Every night in the summer, there would be three-on-three games, for five, six hours." A who's who's of Delaware County hoops rolled through. (John Gallagher left those games in his backyard to become Hartford's head men's coach.)

Joan Gallagher knew Mountain's cousin, and her college assistant coach became the head coach at Vermont and offered Mountain a part-time, \$5,000-a-year job. He took it, working breakfast at the Sheraton in the mornings.

The money just wasn't survivable, though, since he was planning to get married. When Cathy Rush offered him a job running her camp, he grabbed it. "Working for Cathy Rush gives you an air of legitimacy," Mountain said of the former Immaculata coaching legend.

At Carroll, he remembers not getting a guard the staff had wanted, losing her to O'Hara, but that same player, Kara Cassidy, ended up going to Quinnipiac as an assistant years later, then left for Penn and recommended that Mountain replace her. It didn't hurt that she knew his third cousin once removed.

"It's so amazing how intertwined Philadelphia basketball is," Mountain said.

He knows La Salle doesn't have the same facilities as Quinnipiac had. He had expected to be there, he said, as long as Fabbri was there. But being a Big 5 head coach? He had to go for that opening.

He was talking on the phone, on a recruiting trip in Florida, just beating last week's snow out of town, explaining how he could sell La Salle's tradition and the opportunity for playing time and specific majors.

"It's a big deal to young women to have a degree that fits what they're looking for," he said.

Most of all, he can sell himself.

"They're Philly people," Morgan said of his whole family. "I forget what parish."

And if he tells you it's easier to climb Mount Everest than to take his particular path to a head-coaching job, you might have to believe Mountain on that.



LA SALLE'S MOLLY MASCIANTONIO IS ABOUT MAKING MEMORIES AND GOOD VIBES ON THE COURT

Molly Masciantonio is warm, personable, and almost impossibly smiley. Her eyes light up when she talks about basketball and her career at La Salle, and it's no surprise as to why.

"I grew up loving basketball since the age of 4," she said. "My parents knew right when I picked up a basketball that I was going to be playing. It didn't matter what division, anything, I wanted to keep playing it."

After an excellent run at Archbishop Carroll, where she was three-time All-Catholic, two-time All-Delco, two-time All-Mainline, and one-time All-State, Masciantonio got her collegiate basketball start at Holy Family University. Following her freshman season at the Division II program, the 5-foot-10 guard transferred to La Salle.

"I grew up going to all the Big 5 school games," said Masciantonio, a Morton, Delaware County native. "So when La Salle reached out and I spoke with the coaches, I knew that this was exactly where I wanted to be. I love the city; I love the coaches. They felt like family, and I just had to stay local and choose La Salle."

"Family" is a pretty accurate descriptor for the women's basketball team for this upcoming season. After not being able to spend an ample amount of time together outside of practices and games last season, this more normal season, and specifically the environment at La Salle, is setting up this team for success.

"We're very prepared," said Masciantonio, who scored 7.7 points per game in her first season for La Salle. "Last year, we weren't able to work out in the summer, so we had to start a little later than usual. But having this summer really prepared us for this moment. We're getting in shape; we're getting stronger. I think we're prepared and excited for it to start."

"Our team is actually really close this year. We all get along. I'm closest with Kayla Spruill – she's a senior too – and Jaye Haynes. She's a local too, so we were here all summer, just us two, building bonds."

"They are like family to us," she said. "We see them every day ... most of the people here have been playing together since two years, three years ago, so having them every year just keep building stronger bonds and having connections with them on and off the court. Off the court, mental health and all that is just as important as on the court, and they've been the mediators to our family. They help us to stay together and be positive."

"I think because it is a small school, we have a lot of support. Grades-wise, schoolwork, you make stronger bonds when there's less people and less distractions, so it's nice to have that support system being a smaller school and being together."

COVID-19 made it difficult to have that sense of community last season, but Masciantonio only used that to fuel her passion for the sport even further. Even though there weren't fans cheering in the stands, she knew that there were still plenty of people keeping up with the games and rooting for La Salle to do well from home.

"Obviously, we didn't like how it was," she said of fans not being at games. "But I personally was grateful that we were even able to play. It does matter about fans, but your sport is your sport, and you should love playing it. I know some conferences and divisions couldn't play their sport, so I was lucky just to be able to play."



So what does that mean for this season, where she's stepping into the team as one of the most experienced names and brightest stars on the roster?

"Obviously, we want to win, that's our main goal," she said, a smile forming on her face. "I'm trying to be a vocal leader, I have a new position this year as a point guard, so I'm trying to be ... kind of a role model so the younger girls can look up to me. So far, the vibe has been amazing at practice. Everyone's been cheering, it's just good vibes this year, so I'm trying to keep it up."

Masciantonio quotes head coach Mountain MacGillivray, "'Be where your feet are.' So if I'm in class, I focus on class. You don't worry about basketball, you don't worry about other off-court stuff. If you're on the court, you worry about on the court. If you're home, you focus in on your family. That's really what helped me."

Masciantonio might not be a coach herself, but she has some inspiring words of her own for young female players that love basketball just as much as a young Masciantonio did all those years ago.

She would tell them, "Keep doing it until you don't like it anymore. Never feel pressured to do something you don't want to do, but if you love it, keep going. And you are going to have a lot of people who say you can't do it and struggles along the way, but if you keep going, it will be worth it."

As for herself, Masciantonio's personal goals are relatively simple.

"I just want to not have any regrets, I want to put everything on the court, make memories," she said. "Because time flies, you know, I'm already a senior. [Not too long ago], it felt like I was a freshman or senior in high school. So it's just about making memories and getting better."



LA SALLE'S KAYLA SPRUILL AND HER BIG JUMP

"We still want you here."

When you've torn an ACL for the second time - first one, left knee ... then the right knee - those words stay with you. Kayla Spruill was scared. She's been counting on a full scholarship to college, had felt like she'd earned it. But would those schools stay with her?

"They'd seen me play my freshman year," Spruill said of La Salle, but that was before the first tear. Even after that, the Explorers saw her, saw her game still was top-shelf, and offered a scholarship. She hadn't committed anywhere when she tore the other ligament.

"Might not happen," Spruill thought to herself.

"We still want you here," La Salle's coaches told Spruill. She didn't hesitate to commit.

There was a coaching change, but at that point, Mountain MacGillivray, the new Explorers coach, didn't see any down side as he took over a rebuilding project. This 6-footer from Baltimore could make an open shot. He kept an open mind.

"She was naturally quiet and reserved, and she was not at her peak conditioning," MacGillivray said. "No one on the team was, so that was a big advantage for her."

As a freshman, Spruill started nine games, but her coach didn't see the competitiveness he wanted. "If she made a shot or two, she stayed in."

"The first game, I was really, really nervous," Spruill said of her freshman year, back on the court after missing so much time after her second knee injury. "These girls are all bigger. Everyone is a lot more aggressive. I was just real tentative in games and in practice."

Toward the end of the season, coach and player had a heart-to-heart.

"The kid we had this year doesn't play next year," MacGillivray remembers telling Spruill. "You can't play on this team being the same personality."

Off the court, he noted, "She's the best kid in the entire world. On the court, not fired up or aggressive."

He added to her, "If you do make that change, you're a kid who fits the system really well."

If you're guessing a coach doesn't say all this publicly if it didn't work out, congrats. Read on. Spruill came back a new player.

"From day one, she was the best player on our team," MacGillivray said. "Both ends. Efficient offensively. Rebounded and defended really well. If I was betting, I don't know if I would have bet that. Now, she's telling people what to do in practice. Her jump is something."

After averaging 11 points and 6.1 rebounds a game as a sophomore, Spruill was named most improved player in the Big 5.

"When I took over, it was really hard for a lot of the kids to pick up my expectations, what I wanted," La Salle's coach said. "Kayla didn't have a problem with that. She understood the offense. She's playing chess to other people's checkers a lot of times."

"It just felt good, just knowing my teammates were able to count on me," Spruill said of the jump she made last season.

There were some big nights, including 24 points and 12 rebounds against St. Joseph's, and winning a thriller at Penn State. "I'll remember that game forever," she said.

Maybe 13-17 overall and 7-9 in the Atlantic 10 doesn't sound like the top of the world, but both more than doubled the previous season's win totals. It's been awhile since La Salle could move into a new season with hopes on the rise.

"The momentum, it really felt like we could do anything," Spruill said of last season's progress.

This season ... they definitely still want her here.



INSIDE THE L: BOUNCING BACK

Going through one torn ACL is enough to make any athlete go mad. Forced to sit out for an extended period of time coupled with the risk of not being the same player you were prior to the injury, it's every athlete's nightmare.

How about two ACL injuries?

Imagine having to go through the grueling rehab and recovery that comes with a torn ACL and then turning around and having to do it again.

Still not scared? How about having to go through two ACL surgeries, along with the rehab and recovery that comes with it, in a two-year span, all while you're in high school.

One torn ACL is bad enough in high school because it can affect a player's recruitment to a school as well as any potential scholarship opportunities. But two?

You might as well call it quits at that point.

But La Salle women's basketball sophomore wing Kayla Spruill didn't. And her perseverance (as well as her athletic ability, of course) got her to where she is now.

When Spruill was in her sophomore season at the Western School of Technology and Environmental Science in Maryland, she tore her right ACL during her AAU season.

"The recovery took nine months, I believe," said Spruill. "And that was because it was my first one and I was trying to make sure everything was for sure okay when I went back."

Fast forward two years to her senior season and Spruill found herself under the knife once again.

This time, repairing a tear in her left ACL.

"It was kind of discouraging a little bit, especially the second time it happened, because it was my senior year and that's when it really counts," described Spruill. "You like to get colleges to look at you, but it was mainly just having my family around and having them look after me and telling me it's going to be fine, keep pushing, keep trying to get better and it'll be okay."

"That was pretty hard to have to keep coming back and it was the same injury over and over again. And it wasn't like anything I could do to avoid it, so it made it even harder."

Even though she suffered not one, but two torn ACLs during her high school career, Spruill still managed to earn a scholarship and she chose to attend La Salle.

However, when you suffer two gruesome injuries such as those, it can affect your mental state and subsequently the way you play on the court.

Recalling her freshman season with the Explorers, Spruill explained her hesitations and the fear that came with playing. "Every time there would be a loose ball or someone comes at me a little too quick, I would kind of have second thoughts like, 'Oh, let me back away quick' or 'Let me cover my knees so no one runs into me.' And it kind of put me in a place where I was kind of afraid to play or do more than what was expected because I was afraid of what would happen."

Once Spruill was able to talk to La Salle Head Women's Basketball Coach Mountain MacGillivray as well as her parents about this, she knew that injuries were inevitable and there was nothing she could do other than play as hard as she could.

"I think it was definitely my mindset and accepting that my injuries can't define how I play anymore," Spruill said. "If something happens, it's just going to happen. I can't be afraid to get hurt so I guess just trying to go head first."

According to MacGillivray, when



Spruill arrived on campus to begin her freshman year, there were no noticeable effects, but former assistant coach Dalila Eshe, who recruited Kayla, said that she was a step slower and less bouncy.

"I still kind of had a limp where I would favor one side, so when I would shoot, sometimes it would be really off balance because I'd be landing on one side," Spruill explained.

Now, a sophomore and a fixture in the Explorers starting lineup, Spruill has that step and that bounce back.

After a fully-healthy offseason and working with new Strength & Conditioning coach Russell Wooten, Spruill has been the beneficiary of a much improved season.

When asked about the offseason preparation, Spruill said, "Okay, I can go head first, just do everything I want to do. We got a new coach, Coach Russell, and he knew about my injuries. And even though sometimes I had to be accommodated for, he always knew when to

push me, like 'I know your knees might be hurting now, but you have to keep moving, keep pushing forward,' trying to get better and stronger."

This season, Spruill has seen an uptick in all statistical categories. She is second on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg) as well as second in rebounding (5.8 rpg). She's scored in double digits in 14 games this season and has netted 15+ points four times. Spruill earned Big 5 Player of the Week honors after averaging 21 points and 10.5 rebounds against Richmond and Saint Joseph's, she's started in 22 of 24 games, and had an eight-game streak of scoring 10+ points from Dec. 30 to Jan. 26.

"I don't know if I expected this big of a jump, but she was really challenged," MacGillivray said. "Kayla is a naturally quiet and laid back personality and she's been challenged to break out of that mold on the basketball court. I don't need her changing outside of basketball, but I needed her to be more vocal, be more intense, and there was a notable difference from the day

she arrived for the first time on campus this summer.

"She's been, on both ends of the floor, the best player on our team."

Only a sophomore, Spruill still has the remainder of this year as well as two more seasons left at La Salle to continue her progression. Her future is bright, no doubt, and a clean bill of health for the remainder of her time at La Salle is all anyone could hope for.

"I just expect to progress every year," Spruill added. "It should be something that's getting better, whether it's more rebounds, more points, more assists, whatever, just always trying to get better every year and have it be consistent."
