Whats at Stake: After sweeping a three-game series against Nevada in Ruston, the Lady Techsters head to California for a three-game series against the Fresno State Bulldogs. Tech is currently in fourth place in the WAC standings but could move up as high as No. 2 with a sweep over Fresno State. The Lady Techsters will finish anywhere from second to fourth in the final WAC regular season standings depending on what happens this weekend. Fresno State is currently in second place in the WAC standings and needs just one win this weekend to clinch the No. 2 seed.

Techsters vs. Fresno State: Louisiana Tech will try to do something its never done before ... beat Fresno State on its home field. Fresno State leads the all-time series against LA Tech 25-4, including an 11-0 mark in Fresno. However, as one-sided as overall series has been, Tech has won 3 of the last seven times the two teams have met, including defeating the 10th ranked Bulldogs 3-2 on its way to the 2008 WAC Tournament title in Honolulu. Tech has beaten the Bulldogs at least once in three of the last four years, including a 1-0 victory in 10 innings in Ruston last season.

National TV Debut: Louisiana Tech will be playing on national television for the first time in its program's history when the Lady Techsters face Fresno State Friday night on ESPN. Holly Rowe (PxP) and Garland Cooper (Analyst) will provide the call of the game.

T-Spoon Talk: Although former WNBA legend Teresa Weatherspoon coaches the Louisiana Tech women's basketball team, she doesn't play favorites. At the request of Lady Techster head softball coach Sarah Dawson, Weatherspoon gave a 30-minute pep talk following practice the night before LA Tech hosted Nevada in a three-game series. Weatherspoon's talk focused on sacrifice, team building and unity. Tech promptly posted its first three-game series sweep of the year winning all three against Nevada. Weatherspoon was at the doubleheader Saturday against the Wolf Pack, wearing her #11 Lady Techster softball jersey the team had given her as a token of its appreciation.

Senior Class: Four Louisiana Tech players will be playing their final regular season WAC series this weekend as Kylie Bassett, Jessica Kirby, Sarah Offutt and Amberly Waits come to the sunset of their Lady Techster careers. Bassett signed with Tech in 2005 but redshirted her true freshman year while Kirby, Offutt and Waits were all part of the 2006 recruiting class.

Chance to Make Their Mark: With one regular season series and the WAC Tournament remaining, this senior class has a chance to do something that no other senior class has done in 11 years -- win 120 games (average 30 wins) in their careers. Kylie Bassett, Jessica Kirby, Sarah Offutt and Amberly Waits have led Tech to 118 wins over their careers and need just two more to get to 118. The last senior class that averaged 30 wins a season was the graduating class of 1999 (that class won 137 games). NOTE: Tech had to vacate 19 wins last year due to NCAA sanction for using an ineligible player.

Krieg vs. the Long Ball: Heading into this weekend's series against Fresno State, LA Tech junior Meghan Krieg has allowed only 12 home runs in 203.2 innings of work this season. In her career, Krieg has only allowed 19 home runs in 454.0 innings of work (or one every 24.0 innings of work). She has only allowed more than one home run in a game one time in her career (she allowed two home runs in an 8-5 loss to Hawaii April 17).

Waits Named WAC Preseason Player of the Year:

Tech senior Amberly Waits was named the Western Athletic Conference Preseason Player of the Year by the league coaches this year. Waits is the reigning WAC Player of the Year as she became the first LA Tech player to ever win the award following a record-setting junior campaign that saw her set single season records for batting average (.488), hits (81), home runs (17), RBI (62) and total bases (155).

Bassett Named Preseason All-WAC

Tech senior first baseman Kylie Bassett was also named to the Preseason All-WAC team by the league coaches. Bassett was a first team all-league selection as a junior after a campaign that saw her hit 13 home runs and 37 RBI.

Tech Sets Program Mark for All-Conference Honorees:

Last year Louisiana Tech placed a program record five players on the all-conference first and second teams, surpassing the previous best of four (2004, 2006, 2008). Junior shortstop Amberly Waits, junior first baseman Kylie Bassett, and senior outfielder Danielle Sheridan were named to the first team while senior outfielder Emma Barnes and sophomore pitcher Meghan Krieg were named to the second team.

WAC Winning Record Is First: Louisiana Tech posted a 12-8 mark in WAC play last year, the first time since joining the league in 2002 that the Lady Techsters recorded a winning record in league play. The 12 wins

Home Run Derby: Last year Louisiana Tech hit a program record 59 home runs, easily surpassing the previous record of 34 (in 2008). Tech came on strong down the stretch, hitting 35 over its final 19 games of the season. This season, Tech has hit 39 home runs in 42 games -- the second most in program history. Tech ranks 36th in the country, averaging 0.95 home runs per game.

Productive At Bats: Senior catcher Jessica Kirby has made the most of her at bats this year, recording a team-high and career-high 36 RBI despite hitting only .214. Kirby has 36 RBI with only 25 hits this year. She recorded only 23 RBI all of last season and her previous career-high was 29 in 2008 -- when she was named first team all-WAC.

Fabulous Freshman

Freshman infielder Meghan Knowles has been impressive early in their careers. Knowles has recorded a .306 batting average with 15 RBI and two home runs. She ranks second on the team in batting average. Knowles has also come up big in crucial times this year including a two-out, three-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the seventh inning in a 6-4 win over Utah State March 26.

Frandrup Shines in Circle

Freshman Janna Frandrup made the most of her second career start in the circle, pitching a complete-game win over Boise State April 24 in the second game of a doubleheader. Frandrup allowed only three runs -- one earned -- on six hits while walking none for her first collegiate victory. It was only her second career start.

Frandrup Tough Through 4 Innings

In her last three starts in the circle, freshman Janna Frandrup has been tough through the first four innings and then has struggled somewhat after. Frandrup's ERA over the first 4 IP in the last three games is 1.75 allowing only 11 hits in a total of 12 innings. However, in those same three games, Frandrup's ERA has been 10.5 from the fifth inning on allowing 13 hits in a total of 4.2 innings.

2008 WAC Tournament Champs: Louisiana Tech posted perhaps the most impressive run of any team in the country during its march to the 2008 Western Athletic Conference Tournament title in Honolulu May 7-10. The Lady Techsters entered the tournament as the No. 4 seed and proceeded to post four straight wins over the top 3 seeds (all ranked in the Top 25) while not losing a game in the double elimination tournament. Tech defeated No. 3 seed (#22) Hawaii 2-1, No. 2 seed (#10 Fresno State) 3-2, and No. 1 seed (#17) Nevada 4-3 and 2-1 to win the title. Tech entered the tournament with an all-time mark of 10-60 against those three teams.

Quiroga Connects: Sophomore reserve catcher Valerie Quiroga hit home runs in back-to-back plate appearances this past week. In a pinch hit role with two outs in the bottom of the seventh of a 6-2 loss to New Mexico State April 10, Quiroga hit a solo home run over the left field wall. Then in her first plate appearance as the starting catcher in Tech's win over Grambling State April 13, Quiroga blasted a home run over the left field wall. Prior to the two home runs, Quiroga had only one home run in her first 84 collegiate plate appearances. After batting only .132 last year with seven hits in 53 at bats with no home runs and 1 RBI, Quiroga is batting .275 this year with 11 hits in 40 at bats along with three home runs and 10 RBI.

Goza Goes West: After playing her first two seasons at Ole Miss, junior third baseman Molly Goza transferred to Louisiana Tech this fall. During her career at Ole Miss, Goza made 18 starts while seeing action in 40 games. She was named to the SEC Honor Roll both years. Her career highlight on the field was hitting a three-run home run against Tennessee as a sophomore. Goza has made 28 starts for the Lady Techsters this year and is batting .213 with three home runs and 10 RBI.

Arizona to Ruston: Freshman Janna Frandrup is a long way

from home as the Phoenix, Arizona native signed with the Lady Techsters out of Greenway High School. Head coach Sarah Dawson actually came across Frandrup while in California watching Gracie Goulder, the younger sister of former Bulldog baseball player Albie Goulder. Although Tech didn't land Goulder, they did come away with Frandrup who played on the same travel ball team as Goulder.

Texas Glory Connection: Louisiana Tech head coach Sarah Dawson and the Lady Techster coaching staff have quite a pipeline going with the Texas Glory, a travel ball organization based out of Texas. Out of the current Lady Techster roster, seven players played for the Texas Glory at some point prior to signing with LA Tech including Meghan Knowles, Amanda Parsonage, Amberly Waits, Michelle Jones, Meghan Krieg, Kallan Thompson and Christina Gamboa.

Did You Know: A lot of people don't realize that Louisiana Tech has made nine NCAA Tournament appearances (1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1995, 2008) and three College World Series appearances (1982, 1985, 1986).

Quality Losses: Although Louisiana Tech doesn't have a marquee win on its schedule at this point of the season, the Lady Techsters have lost to Top 25 ranked (RPI 33) Notre Dame 1-0, Top 16 ranked Hawaii (RPI 7) 3-1 and 8-5, (RPI 37) Arkansas 5-3 in nine innings, and (RPI 38) Auburn 1-0. In the losses to Notre Dame and Auburn, Tech's Meghan Krieg pitched two-hitters while in the loss to Arkansas the Lady Techsters led 3-2 in the bottom of the ninth.

Next Year's Additions: Louisiana Tech has already signed five new players for next year, including infielder Emma Eichman (Fossil Ridge HS), infielder Katelynn Hill (Hebron HS), pitcher Erin Kipp (Bullard HS), outfielder Cassie Krieg (Sonora HS) and catcher/third baseman Tricia Van Winkle (Coppell HS). All five hail from the state of Texas.

Krieg Number 2: Louisiana Tech junior Meghan Krieg will reunite with her younger sister Cassie next year. Cassie is one of Tech's five signees for next season as the outfielder from Sonora, Texas will get to play with her older sister Meghan again. The duo played together at Sonora High School.

And the hits just keep on coming ... literally ... for Louisiana Tech head coach Sarah Dawson and the Lady Techster softball program.

While shattering numerous team and individual offensive records, Louisiana Tech has recorded two of the best seasons in the last 15 years as head coach Sarah Dawson continues to rebuild a program that participated in numerous college world series and NCAA Tournaments during the 1980s and early '90s.

Dawson, who is set to begin her eighth year as the Lady Techster head coach, has done it by recruiting her type of players and molding them into winners both on and off the diamond.

The success of the last two years is proof that her philosophy and coaching method is paying off.

During Dawson's tenure at LA Tech, the Lady Techsters have boasted some impressive results ... on the field and in the classroom.

On the field, Tech has:

- recorded a trio of top-four finishes in the highly-competitive Western Athletic Conference, including back-to-back fourth place finishes over the last two seasons.
- captured the 2008 WAC Tournament title, defeating four Top 25 ranked teams in four days (Tech has posted eight wins over Top 25 teams in the last two years).
- earned a berth in the 2008 NCAA Tournament where it defeated SEC foe Auburn twice before eventually falling to national runner-up Texas A&M. It was Tech's first NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- finished ranked 33rd in the country in the 2008 USA Today/NFCA Division I poll.
- placed 23 players on the All-Western Athletic Conference team, including 14 first teamers. This includes 14 different players garnering awards over the last seven seasons.
- placed 25 players on the Louisiana Sports Writers all-state team, including 10 first teamers.
- seen shortstop Amberly Waits become the first LA Tech player to ever win the WAC Player of the Year Award in 2009. Waits was also named the LSWA State Hitter of the Year.
- hit 59 home runs in 2009, shattering the previous mark of 34 (set in 2008). Tech ranked 19th in the country in home runs per game.
- seen its team ERA improve from 5.07 in 2006 to 2.49 in 2009; its team fielding percentage rise from .935 in 2006 to .964 in 2009; and its team home run total rise from 26 in 2006 to 59 in 2009.

Off the field, Tech has:

- had 50 student-athletes earn Academic All-WAC awards
- posted its best Academic Progress Rate (APR) ever with a 987 in 2007-08.
- recorded hundreds of community service hours, including raising more than \$8,000 for the local chapter of DART with the charity softball game against Fresno State this past April.

Dawson, now 12 years removed from her playing days where she was an All-American pitcher at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe), works tirelessly as a head coach to help mold her players into great softball players, top-notch students and first class citizens.

Part of Dawson's philosophy involves getting her players actively involved in service projects so they learn how to be an integral part of their community. During her time at Tech, Dawson's players have averaged over 200 hours of community service, ranging from visiting nursing homes, working with area churches and helping with the Louisiana Tech student-athlete Halloween carnival.

In addition to community service projects, Dawson incorporates the NCAA's CHAMPS/Lifeskills Leadership Program on a regular basis with her team. Throughout the school year, Dawson arranges speakers to talk to her players about such topics as domestic violence, drugs and alcohol, sexual responsibility, interviewing skills, and other areas that will impact their lives.

Dawson and her coaching staff along with the players instituted a recycling program in the Louisiana Tech Athletic Department.

Dawson also emphasizes education, and it has paid off during her tenure at Louisiana Tech. During the previous seven years at Tech, a total of 50 of LA Tech softball players have earned Academic All-Western Athletic Conference honors, ranking among the most in the league during that time.

The team also recorded its highest single year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score ever with a 987 for the 2007-08 season.

Dawson, who has compiled a 153-245 record at Tech in her seven years, has also had a positive effect on her players on the playing field during her time at Louisiana Tech. Dawson's competitive spirit rubs off on her players.

She brings that competitiveness and dedication that helped her garner success as a collegiate and professional player to the Louisiana Tech program.

Twenty-three of her players have earned all-Western Athletic Conference honors, including at least one every year and a program-record five in 2009. Junior shortstop Amberly Waits became the first LA Tech player to ever earn the WAC Player of the Year award as she was an easy selection in 2009 after winning the WAC Triple Crowe (led league in average, home runs and RBI).

Dawson has also had 17 of her players named to the Louisiana Sports Writers Association all-state team, including Waits who was named the 2009 Hitter of the Year and outfielder Emma Barnes was named the state Freshman of the Year in 2006.

Dawson's effect on her players can be seen in a number of different ways, including their lives following college. Three of her former players are currently or have coached in the Division ranks including current Tech assistant Amber Miles as well as Marla Pinkston and Eric Chernicky.

Prior to coming to Louisiana Tech in 2000, Dawson served as an assistant coach at UL-Monroe from 2000 through 2002 and at Marshall University in 1999.

During her four years on the mound at UL-Monroe, she produced some incredibly impressive numbers that still rank on the NCAA Division I all-time single season and career records list.

In her career, Dawson amassed a record of 120-56 while registering 151 complete games, 1,242.1 innings pitched, 1,280 strikeouts and 74 career shutouts. Her complete games, innings pitched, strikeouts and career shutouts all ranked in the top 10 in NCAA Division I history while her 120 career wins ranked sixth.

In 1997 during her senior season at UL-Monroe, Dawson earned a spot on the Louisville Slugger NCAA Division I All-American first team.

She still holds the school record for career victories, lowest earned run average (0.69), inning pitched, strikeouts, shutouts, games pitched, games started and complete games.
