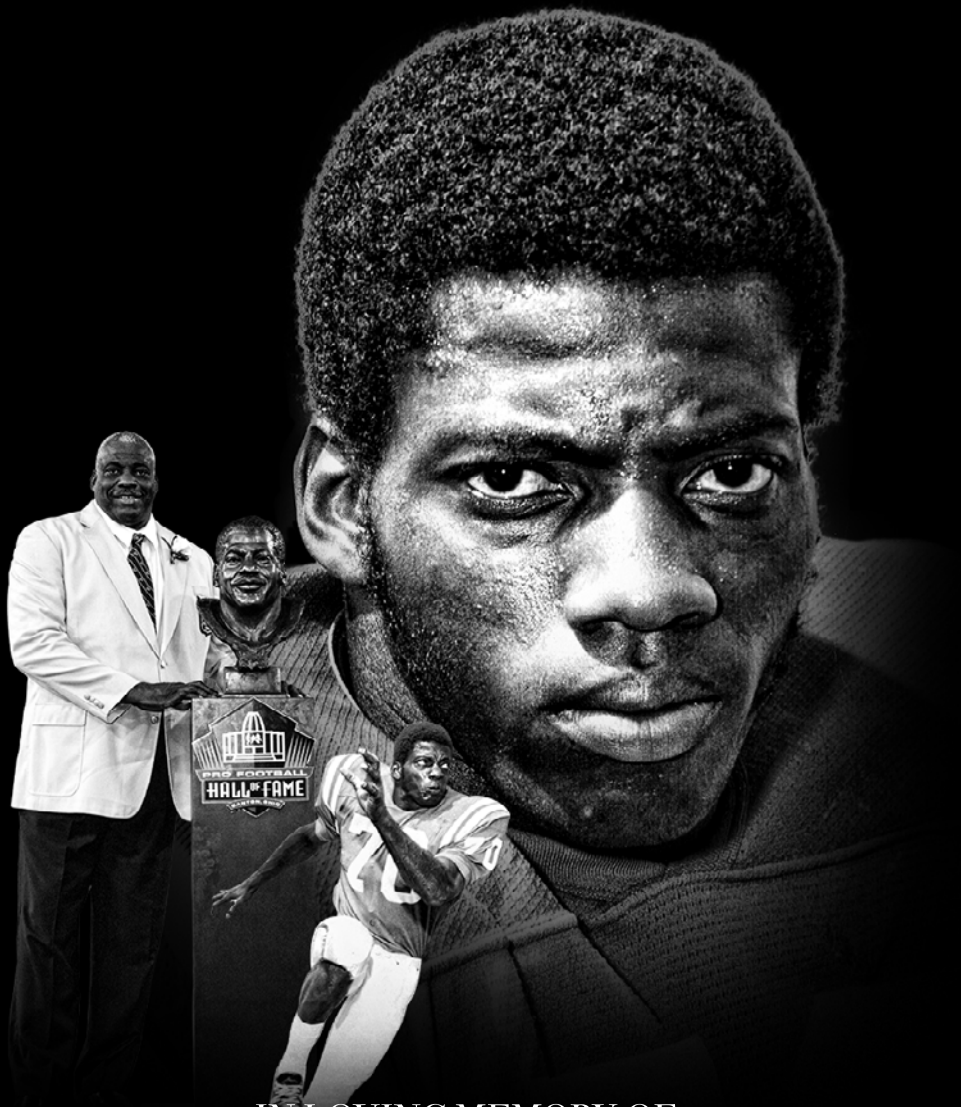

LOUISIANA TECH INTRODUCES WOOD AS NEW DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS, VP

Louisiana Tech President Les Guice introduced Dr. Eric A. Wood as a Vice President and the Director of Athletics during a press conference held in the Chris Richardson Suite of the Joe Aillet Stadium Press Box Friday.

Wood, a former student-athlete at Sacred Heart University who is also 22-year veteran of collegiate athletic administration, comes to Ruston following a five-year stint at UCF, where he spent the past four years as the Deputy AD for Competitive Excellence.

He becomes the first Director of Athletics in LA Tech history to also serve as a Vice President.

"I'm proud to welcome Eric and his family to Louisiana Tech and Ruston," said Dr. Guice. "His record of accomplishment shows Eric's qualifications, and interacting with him quickly convinces you he is something really special. He is a dynamic, charismatic individual who leads with intelligence and character. It's a rare combination, and we're very fortunate to have him on our team."

The Bronx, New York, native has served in a variety of roles within athletics administration for more than two decades. In addition to his time at UCF, Wood has held full-time positions at the University of Arkansas, the Atlantic Coast Conference, Wake Forest University and the University of New Haven. He also served as a graduate assistant at both the NCAA national office and Clemson University early in his career.

"I want to thank Dr. Guice, Brooks Hull, Steve Davison,

Mary Kay Hungate, Samuel Speed, and Dr. Donna Thomas for the opportunity to serve as the next Vice President and Director of Athletics, but more importantly for the opportunity to join the Louisiana Tech family," said Dr. Wood. "After meeting the search committee, I could feel the genuine love they have for Louisiana Tech, and I just knew I wanted to serve alongside them."

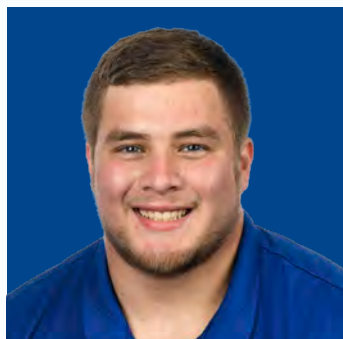

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Skip Holtz enters his eighth year as the head coach at Louisiana Tech after former Louisiana Tech University President Dr. Dan Reneau introduced him as the 33rd head football coach of the Bulldogs during a press conference on Friday, Dec. 14, 2012 in the Jarrell Room of the Charles Wylly Athletic Center.

During his tenure, Holtz has built not just a winning program, but a consistent winning program as the Bulldogs have recorded six straight winning seasons and six straight bowl victories.

In 2019, Holtz guided LA Tech to a 10-win season which marked the first time since 1984 that the program produced double-digit victories. The 10th win came in the 2019 Walk On's Independence Bowl as the Bulldogs shut out the Miami Hurricanes, 14-0, in Shreveport. It was the first shutout in Independence Bowl history and the only shutout of the 2019 bowl season. With the victory, the Bulldogs are now the only team in the nation to win six consecutive bowl games from 2014 to 2019 (tied for fifth longest in FBS history).

LA Tech won all six games at Joe Aillet Stadium as well, marking the first time since 1973 that the program produced an undefeated season of 6-0.

In 2018, Holtz guided the Bulldogs to an 8-5 overall record and a 31-14 victory over Hawaii in the 2018 SoFi Hawaii Bowl. This was followed by a 2017 season when the team closed out the regular season with two victories to become bowl eligible and then overpowered SMU, 51-10, in the inaugural DXL Frisco Bowl.

In 2016, Holtz earned Conference USA Coach of the Year honors after he guided the Bulldogs to yet another highly successful campaign as LA Tech finished the season with a 9-5 overall record, a Conference USA West Division title and a thrilling 48-45 victory over No. 25 Navy in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl. It marked the Bulldogs' first win over a Top 25 team since 2005.

The 2016 team had arguably the greatest offensive in school history, producing a program-record 620 total points and 7,206 total yards. The Bulldogs averaged 44.3 points per game that year, the second most in FBS. Holtz led another potent offensive team in 2015 to a 9-4 record after dismantling Arkansas State, 47-28, in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

It was in his second season at the helm that the program started its winning streak as Holtz and the Bulldogs enjoyed a five-win improvement, going 9-5 and taking the Conference USA West Division title in the program's second year as a member of the league. The season was capped off with a 35-18 win over Big Ten opponent Illinois in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl at Cotton Bowl Stadium.

In 2014, Holtz engineered an offense that was ranked fourth most improved with an average of 37.4 points per game, while Louisiana Tech was the national leader in points off of turnovers on the

defensive side of the ball.

In his first season, Holtz inherited a team that lost 35 seniors with seven being invited to NFL camps (two through the NFL Draft) and brought together the team as it entered a new conference (Conference USA) under a new President and new Athletics Director, going 4-8.

In his seven years at LA Tech, Holtz has amassed 56 victories as head coach which is the third most in program history. He has had 14 players selected in the NFL Draft, the most in C-USA. Among them are defensive tackle Vernon Butler who was selected in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers with the 30th overall selection as well as defensive backs L'Jarius Sneed and Amik Robertson who were taken with back-to-back picks in the fourth round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Kansas City Chiefs and Las Vegas Raiders, respectively.

Holtz has coached five All-Americans and 48 All-Conference USA selections (first or second team) while having seven players garner specialty awards – Cody Sokol (2014 C-USA Newcomer of the Year), Jeff Driskel (2015 C-USA Newcomer of the Year), Ryan Higgins (2016 C-USA Most Valuable Player), Carlos Henderson (2016 C-USA Offensive Player of the Year and Special Teams Player of the Year), Teddy Veal (2017 C-USA Newcomer of the Year), Jaylon Ferguson (2018 C-USA Defensive Player of the Year) and J'Mar Smith (2019 C-USA Offensive Player of the Year).

Holtz had spent the past three seasons as the head football coach at the University of South Florida. He also served as the head coach at the University of Connecticut and East Carolina University where he won back-to-back Conference USA titles with the Pirates in 2008 and 2009. He also led his teams to five consecutive post-season bowl games between 2006 and 2010.

Holtz has participated in 21 postseason games in his coaching career, including 13 as a head coach and eight as an assistant coach. Of the 13 games as head coach, 11 occurred in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and two occurred in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

Holtz was honored in 1996 with the National Football Foundation Man-of-the-Year Award and was a member of the Foundation's ethics committee. He was also the recipient of the Franciscan Life Center's St. Francis Award in 1995, an honor given for his dedication and support of Christian values and outstanding athletic achievements.

Born March 12, 1964, in Willimantic, Connecticut, Louis "Skip" Holtz spent the first two years of his life in Connecticut, while his father served as the top football assistant on the Huskies' staff from 1964-65. He was a prep quarterback at Fayetteville (Ark.) High School, while his father was the head coach at the University of Arkansas.

He attended Holy Cross Junior College in South Bend, Ind., for two years before transferring to Notre Dame in 1984. Holtz earned his bachelor's degree in business management in 1986 and was a football letterwinner for the Irish that same year, appearing in all 11 games as a special teams member and backup flanker.

Skip and his wife, Jennifer, are the parents of three children: Louis Leo (Trey) Holtz III (currently on staff as the inside receivers coach), Chad Fitzgerald Holtz and Hailey Elizabeth Holtz.

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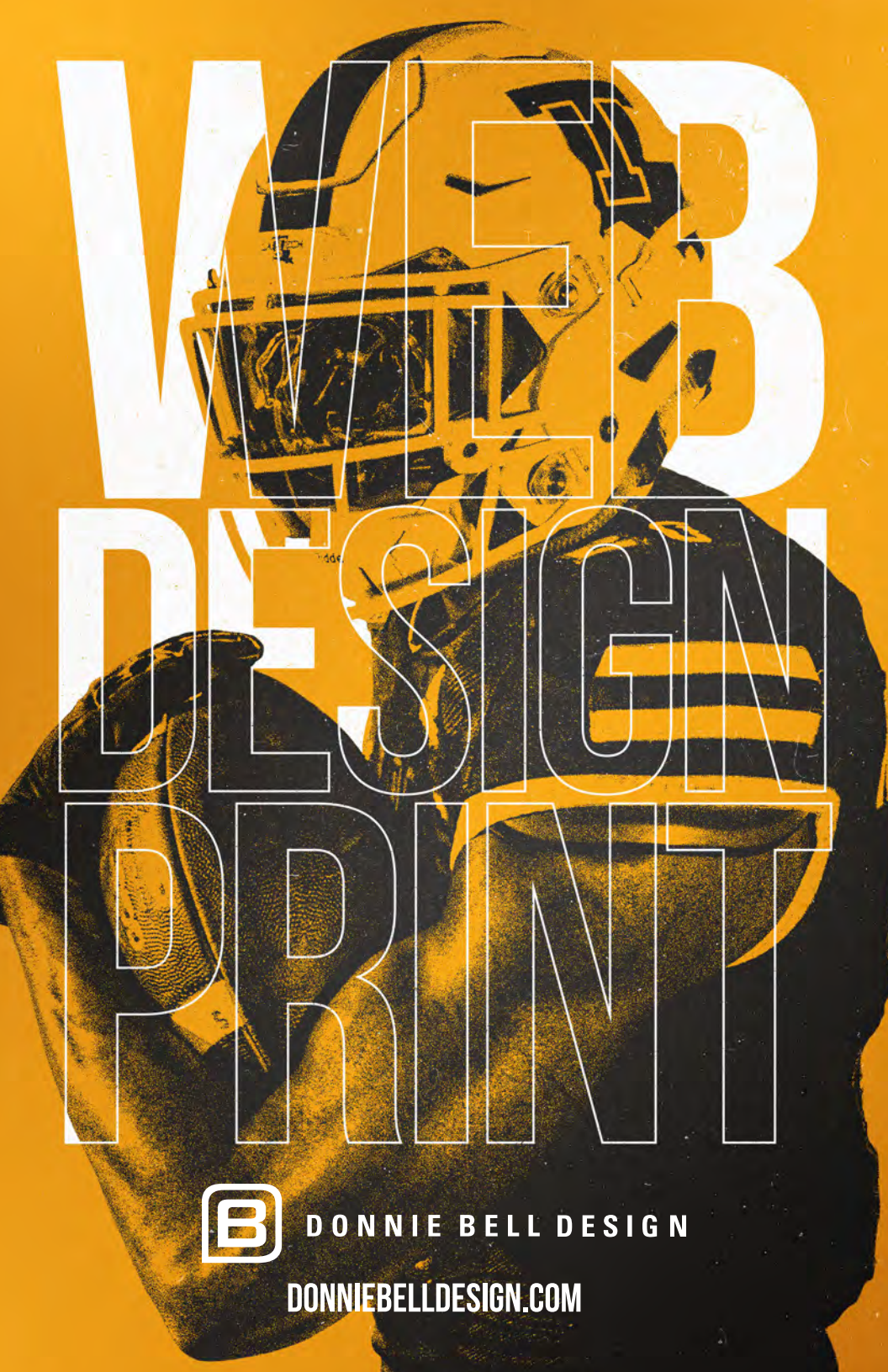
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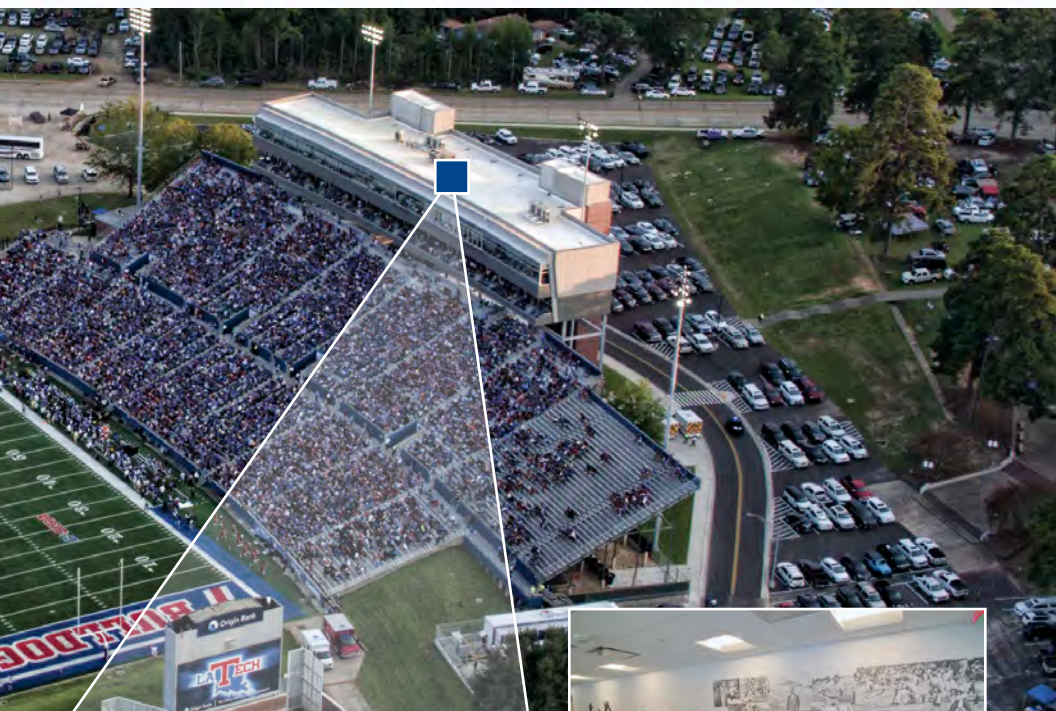


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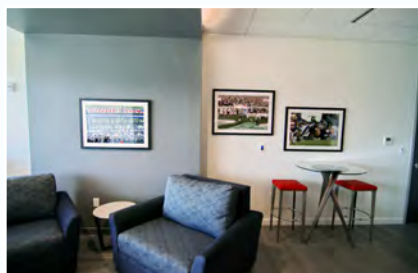
- Is a three-story, 70,000-square-foot facility.
- Is a \$20-million plus facility and includes a state-of-the-art strength and conditioning complex utilized by all 16 of the University's athletic programs.
- Weight room is more than twice the square footage of the previous one. Double height space maximizes natural light and includes a field view of Joe Aillet Stadium as well as a supplement and nutrition bar.
- Second story includes the football coaches' offices as well as team and position meeting rooms.
- Houses a 143-seat capacity, theatre-style meeting room with state-of-the-art sound and video equipment used for team meetings, athletic department press conferences and other events.
- Club level includes luxury premium seating options with 302 chair back seats, multi-functioning dining space seating up to 360, a private dining room with field view, and a full service commercial kitchen.





PRESS BOX/SUITES

- Is a two-story, 30,000-square-foot facility, plus a camera deck on the first level.
- Is a \$16.7-million press box and guest suite facility. An additional \$1.9 million was invested in other stadium improvements, including LED lighting, a permanent west side ticket booth, renovations to the west side bathrooms and aesthetic improvements to stadium entry points.
- Houses 13 luxury suites plus the Presidential Suite. Each luxury suite holds 20 supporters and includes 12 outdoor seats, indoor lounge furniture, a kitchenette area and a big screen TV.
- Includes a two-level media work area, two times the square footage of the former press box. The second floor also includes all of the booths needed for national television broadcast, radio broadcast and the various game-day components.

ACCESSIBILITY

In an effort to provide expedited entrance and help with social distancing, clear bags will be mandated at all Louisiana Tech Athletics events. Specified gates on each side of the stadium will be designated for bag checks. Signs are posted to direct fans with bags on where to enter.

CONCESSIONS

A variety of concessions are located in six convenient areas surrounding Joe Aillet Stadium. Refreshment stands are on both the east and west sides of the stadium.

EVENT STAFF & SECURITY

Ushers and security personnel are located at various areas in Joe Aillet Stadium. There are no ushers in the general admission sections located on the east side.

FIRST AID

Two first aid stations are available for fans at Joe Aillet Stadium. The stations are located behind Section O on the east side and Section E on the west side.

GATE INFORMATION

- The gates at Joe Aillet Stadium open 90 minutes prior to kickoff.
- Visiting Team Student-Athlete Pass List is located on the southeast corner at Gate 6.
- Home Team Student-Athlete Pass List is located on the southwest corner at Gate 5.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found is located at the first aid stations on either side of the stadium. Following games, lost items will be taken to the Athletics Facilities Office located in the Thomas Assembly Center.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Please be aware of the following items that are not allowed in Joe Aillet Stadium:

- No ice chests or coolers
- No umbrellas
- No pets (excluding service animals)
- No laser pointers/lights
- No video cameras or tripods
- No oversized bags
- No weapons, including pocket knives or tools (Swiss Army Knives, etc.)

Restrooms are located on both sides of the stadium near concession areas behind Sections O and E.

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LA TECH TO HONOR 1990 FOOTBALL TEAM

BULLDOGS REMEMBERED 30 YEARS LATER

Going bowling in December is something Louisiana Tech fans have become accustomed to during Skip Holtz's tenure in Ruston.

The Bulldogs currently owns the nation's longest bowl win streak at six games.

But, 30 years ago — in 1990 — the Bulldog faithful were hungry for a bowl berth.

Tech fans know the story. The University made the decision to move from Division I-AA (today, known as the FCS ranks) to Division I-A (now known as FBS) in the mid-1980s.

It was a move that didn't prove easy in the early transitional years.

The 1988 team took the initial brunt of the decision. With only 65 scholarship players, Tech lost games by scores of 60-0, 66-3 and 56-17. But despite a 4-7 record and some lopsided outcomes, Tech showed signs potential for future years.

The following season (1989) saw a 5-4-1 record with respectable performances at Florida and Auburn. With Joe Raymond Peace and his never-say-die mentality at the helm of the program, a group of hard-nosed 19- and 20-year olds were turning into bowl contenders.

Enter 1990.

"In my mind, the 1990 team was a culmination of the 1988 and 1989 teams; a culmination of those three years," said Alan Apple, one of the starting offensive lineman on those teams. "It was going through that crucible of games that we had against Houston and

Florida State and Florida that prepared us to get to the point of being ready for 1990."

Peace agrees.

"That's a good way of surmising it," said Peace, who coached the Bulldogs through the 1995 season and who entered the LA Tech Hall of Fame last fall. "It truly was. The grind that we went through in '88 and '89 was all a carry over to 1990."

Apple might be the perfect example of the toughness that those teams embraced. As a redshirt freshman at Tech in 1988, Apple and Bulldogs opened the season in Starkville against Mississippi State. A tight end at the time, Apple saw action on special teams and a few offensive plays.

A few hours after the completion of his first collegiate game, Apple received news that his mother had been killed in a plane crash returning to Texas after watching her son play in Starkville. The following Saturday, Apple — who buried his mother just days before — suited up and played in a 60-0 loss to Houston ... ironically at Independence Stadium.

Get knocked down. Get up. Keep fighting. That was the mindset of those Peace-coached teams.

"We had a bunch of scrappers," remembers longtime Bulldog fan Dwayne Woodard. "Joe Raymond's boys simply weren't going to take anything off of anybody."

Russ Golden, who played for the Bulldogs from 1989 through 1992, vividly remembers that team's mindset that it took from its head coach.

"I remember Coach Peace saying, 'We'll lock the gates and we will beat their (behinds),' " said Golden. "Our philosophy was that when we play at home, we win. And there is nothing stopping us from that."

Louisiana Tech will honor the 1990 team Saturday during the Bulldogs home game against UAB. Kickoff is slated for 2:30 p.m. at Joe Aillet Stadium. More than 25 players, coaches and support staff are expected to return for the weekend.

In so many ways, the 1990 team helped kick start the program's success on the highest level of collegiate football. The early days were critical to what Tech has been able to accomplish over the past three decades.

"You can look (at other schools) that are still struggling more than two decades into the experiment," said Woodard. "1990 was a big year and (the Independence Bowl) was a big ball game. We had four or five years in the first decade (of FBS) where if the bowl system that is in place today was in place then, we would have gone bowling."

The 1990 campaign didn't start promising. Tech lost its opener at East Carolina 27-17 and then dropped a 27-21 decision to Western Michigan in the third game of the year. Wins over Arkansas State (40-7) and UL-Lafayette (known as USL back in the day) gave the Bulldogs a 3-2 mark heading into a road showdown at No. 5 ranked Auburn.

Many people felt that the Bulldogs showing at Jordan-Hare Stadium was the first true sign that Tech belonged on the FBS level. Although Auburn defeated Tech 16-14 on a controversial field goal on the final play of the game, the Bulldogs showed they could play with one of the nation's top teams.

"(That performance) helped solidify it," said Peace. "That we had made the progress and recruited well enough to be competitive. We felt like we could be competitive with anybody in the country."

"We went in to win that game," said Apple. "We should have won that game. Losing was not acceptable. The fact we played well was not a surprise to us. It felt more like we let one get away. That was our mentality."

Golden recalls a player-only meeting in the team hotel the night before the Auburn contest.

"It was called by the seniors," said Golden. "Eddie Brown was asking, 'Why can't we win? Who thinks we can't win?' Not a person in the room thought we couldn't win that game. I think that team had a level of confidence. We believed in ourselves. It was just a lot of grit. That came from Joe Raymond. He never once allowed us believe that there wasn't anyone we couldn't beat."

Tech reeled off four more wins following the loss to the Tigers, setting up the season finale against Colorado State. Earl Bruce and the Rams came to Joe Aillet Stadium as the favorite. The Rams led 30-14 in the second half before the Bulldogs never-say-die mentality took with Tech scoring the final 17 points of the game for a 31-30 victory.

The win upped the Bulldogs record to 8-3 and earned the program a berth in the Independence Bowl

and a date with the Maryland Terrapins. It would be Tech's first bowl berth since 1978 and its first as a member of the FBS ranks.

The hype for Tech fans was real. The Bulldog faithful showed up in force in Shreveport as a record-setting crowd of more than 50,000 watched the contest.

"The main thing I remember was just the size of the crowd," Woodard said. "That was the most people I had ever seen at Independence Stadium and 95 percent of them were there to pull for Tech. That was the thing that really, really stood out."

"It was a wonderful feeling," said Peace. "It didn't surprise me. I thought the Tech fans and alumni were so excited about getting back to a bowl game and about the way that team represented them on the field. It was a way to show their support and gratitude by showing up for that game."

Longtime LA Tech Sports Information Director Keith Prince, a member of the LA Tech Athletics Hall of Fame, remembers the excitement surrounding the end to the 1990 season.

"Joe Raymond and his crew just caught the fancy of our fans as the year wore on," said Prince. "They were just so gritty. It was his personality. They just fought to the end. It led into a real feeling of excitement leading into (the Independence Bowl)."

"I remember just how good a game it was. How good a scene it was. How fired up our people were. There was a lot of interest. It created a great atmosphere."

What did it mean for those Bulldog players?

"We had played in some packed stadiums and maybe even sellouts," said Apple. "But they had always been 90 percent against us and 10 percent for us. When we were playing Maryland in the Independence Bowl, it was almost all red and blue."

"I can remember at one point, we were in the huddle during a timeout. All of a sudden our fans started the wave going around Independence Stadium. It made it all the way around a few times. The atmosphere was just a little different."

"I remember pride," said Golden. "I remember thinking man this is a home game for us. We brought out a home crowd. I remember being in the stadium just watching the people file in and being overwhelmed. We filled the place up, and I remember just being prideful. We earned this, and we got the support of the locals and felt like we were going to do everything we could to give them the best show we could."

And a show out, they did.

The Bulldogs and the Terrapins played one of the most exciting games in Independence Bowl history, a game that ended in a 34-34 tie when Chris Boniol connected on a field goal on the final play of the game (this was before the overtime period in college football).

It is a game and a team that Bulldog fans still talk about three decades later.



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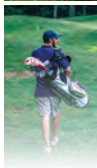
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Louisiana Tech University and President Les Guice share a rich history together that spans five decades and has produced family ties deeply rooted in a passion for the Bulldogs and Lady Techsters. From an architecture student stepping on the campus for the first time in 1972 to an appointment as Louisiana Tech's 14th President in 2013, Dr. Guice has shown an unwavering commitment to leadership and service to his alma mater.

Most recently, Guice's leadership in promoting a spirit of teamwork has helped the campus community and the City of Ruston work together to overcome the enormous challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic that came on the heels of the tornado that plowed through the campus and community in April 2019.

Yet unparalleled educational experiences and unparalleled campus growth have continued. The Integrated Engineering and Science Building opened last fall. The new baseball, softball, and soccer facilities are being built. Work is ongoing for new green space, intramural fields, and student housing along Tech Drive south of the railroad tracks. Add to that additional parking lots, green space and beautification at the site of the recently demolished Harper and Harris Halls, and plans to build a much-needed Tech Pointe II.

One of Dr. Guice's first achievements at Tech was earning a bachelor of arts in architecture in 1976. Discovering a passion for engineering under the mentorship of Professor Jack Painter, Dr. Guice went on to earn a master's degree in civil engineering from Tech in 1978. While working on his master's degree at Louisiana Tech, Dr. Guice also discovered a passion for teaching and education as a profession.

Dr. Guice accepted a position as an assistant professor of civil engineering at Louisiana Tech in 1978 and was promoted to associate professor in 1981. A few short years after earning his PhD in civil engineering from Texas A&M University in 1986, Dr. Guice was named the interim department head of civil engineering in Louisiana Tech's College of Engineering in 1988 and earned the permanent department head position and full professorship in 1989. As department head, Dr. Guice initiated the formation of the Civil Engineering Advisory Board and the Civil

Engineering Distinguished Alumni recognition program, both of which significantly enhanced alumni participation and significantly enhanced fundraising for the department.

Throughout the next decade, Dr. Guice would continue to distinguish himself as an academician, researcher, administrator, and leader. His dedication to his students, his faculty, and the University would lead to his appointment as Dean of Louisiana Tech's College of Engineering and Science (COES) in 1999. As Dean, Dr. Guice continued to encourage and support innovations in the curricula. The College's faculty became increasingly successful in securing external funding for the integrated curriculum which resulted in a transformative redesign of programs throughout the College.

Dr. Guice's leadership and vision also reinvigorated the Engineering and Science Foundation to more effectively serve the needs of the College. He initiated a new integrated strategic plan, known as "COES 2010," and capital campaign, "Tech's BEST," which led to major advancement of the college and to funding for an Eminent Scholar Chair, 15 Professorships, \$500k Scholarship Fund, and several new laboratories and facilities.

Dr. Guice's leadership also helped to guide the Institute for Micromanufacturing (IfM) toward a focus on the emerging field of nanotechnology. With the hiring of key nanotechnology faculty in numerous disciplines, further expansion of research laboratories, establishment of an interdisciplinary engineering PhD program with a nanotechnology track, and initiation of a BS in Nanosystems Engineering, the IfM and COES established strong research and education nanotechnology programs that have received national recognition.

In 2004, Dr. Guice's performance and accomplishments as dean led to his appointment as Tech's vice president for research and development. During his tenure as vice president and, beginning in 2012, as executive vice president, Tech has significantly increased patents, licenses/options, start-up companies, SBIR grants with affiliated companies, and has established strong industry partnerships for commercialization of technologies. Dr. Guice also led the establishment of Tech's first two technology incubators, the Rawle and Humana Enterprise Centers.

With a focus on the future and a progressive vision for economic development, Dr. Guice has led the planning and development of the Louisiana Tech Enterprise Campus – a research park connecting the university and downtown Ruston. Enterprise Campus' first



building, Tech Pointe, was completed in 2012 and is now home for several companies and organizations, including an Air Force-funded Cyberspace Research Laboratory. With the completion of Tech's new College of Business building and renovation to University Hall as a home for interdisciplinary entrepreneurship and innovation activities, the first phase of Enterprise Campus was completed.

Dr. Guice's reputation for exemplary leadership and service is further evidenced by the many statewide and Conference-USA-wide organizations he has founded or chaired, and he's been honored with numerous awards, both locally and statewide. Currently he serves as chair of the C-USA Board of Directors.

As Tech's president, Dr. Guice is the chief executive officer of north Louisiana's only Carnegie Foundation national research university and one of only two public universities from Louisiana recognized in the top tier of national universities in the U.S.

News and World Report. Dr. Guice leads a University that consistently receives high marks in affordability, in starting salaries for graduates, and in providing graduates with the best returns on investment.

Throughout his career, Dr. Guice has contributed to and played a central role in creating the culture and vision for the future of Louisiana Tech; he continues that commitment as president. Dr. Guice's focus on campus-wide engagement, building and growing relationships, and leadership in forging a path toward advancement of the University's academic and athletic programs, research and commercialization activities, and economic development efforts means that Louisiana Tech University's best days are yet to come.

Dr. Guice is a native of Monroe and grew up in Bastrop. He and his wife, Kathy, have three sons – Kyle, Chad, and Bret – and four grandchildren, Christopher, twins Everly and Elizabeth, and the youngest, Evie.

"YA GOTTA LOVE IT"

On Sept. 19 in Hattiesburg, Miss., Dave Nitz began his 46th season broadcasting Louisiana Tech Football, which puts him in the Top 5 of guys broadcasting one college program's football games for the most seasons.

When Dave's calling a game, listeners, whether they realize it or not, know that the guy on the radio would rather be no place else than at the ballgame.

On the mic in a game, that's his wheelhouse, where the colors come alive, where you can tell you're listening to a guy who loves what he does.

The first play-by-play he did was in his backyard in his hometown of Milton, West Virginia. The only child of a coal miner, a bat boy on his dad's baseball teams beginning at age three and a kid who loved sports, Dave would shoot hoops alone and pretend he was whoever the stars were on the West Virginia Mountaineer's baseball teams, literally calling his own shots.

His break came when he was 19 and he started calling high school football games in Spencer, West Virginia. So off Dave went to do Game No. 1, Spencer vs. Glenville.

That was more than 4,000 athletic events ago.

He worked at more than a dozen stations during the next dozen years, did play-by-play for William & Mary and Georgia Southern for a while, and found himself with no ball to call when his latest employer decided to quit carrying sports. So, he answered an advertisement for the Louisiana Tech job back in 1974.

Tech fans are glad he did.

He's been on the road and on the air ever since, calling not just Bulldog football games but also men's basketball, baseball and for a long stint women's basketball.

The legendary "Voice of the Bulldogs" was enshrined into the LA Tech Athletics Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2011 and recently was inducted into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2019.

Ya gotta love it.

Louisiana Tech fans can tune into the "Voice of the Bulldogs" Dave Nitz and color analyst Teddy Allen on the LA Tech Sports Network this fall for all live game broadcasts for the Bulldogs' 11-game schedule as well as the weekly Inside Tech Football with head coach Skip Holtz.

For the 23rd straight year, the LA Tech Sports Network will team up with KXKZ-FM (107.5) Ruston as the flagship station for Tech Athletics.

Fans can also access all live audio through the Louisiana Tech mobile app which is available for download on the iTunes App Store or Google Play.

The LA Tech Sports Network team will host a 90-minute pre-game show prior to each kickoff and a 30-minute post-game show.

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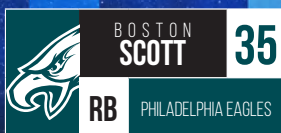
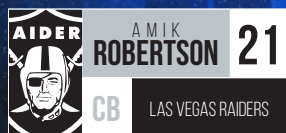
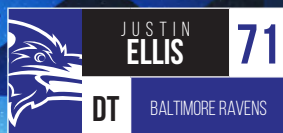
