/// BY THE NUMBERS

The LA Tech football equipment truck will travel 1,221 miles to Newark, Delaware. The truck will leave Ruston on the morning of Nov. 6 and return in two weeks after Tech's trip to Washington State.

Running back Andrew Burnette took off for a 67-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter against Sam Houston, marking the Bulldogs' longest rush of the season. It was one of two runs of 50+ yards in the game.

Tech's 55 points against Sam Houston were the most scored by the Bulldogs since Sept. 26, 2020, and the most in the Sonny Cumbie era. The total also tied for the sixth-most points scored by Tech in a CUSA game and the most since 2016.



- · Louisiana Tech will hit the road for the first of two cross-country trips as the 5-3 (3-2 Conference USA) Bulldogs aim for their first six-win season since 2019. They will face one of CUSA's newest members, 4-4 (2-3) Delaware, on Saturday at 2 p.m. CT. The game will be broadcast on ESPN+.
- Saturday will be the second all-time meeting between the Bulldogs and Fightin' Blue Hens and the first in 43 years. Delaware leads the series 1-0 after defeating LA Tech 17-0 in the 1982 NCAA Division I-AA semifinals in Ruston. This weekend marks the first meeting between the two programs played in Delaware.
- LA Tech improved to 5-3 last Friday after defeating Sam Houston 55-14 on homecoming. The 55 points were the most scored by the Bulldogs since Sept. 26, 2020, when they put up 66 against Houston Baptist, the highest total in the Sonny Cumbie era. The score also tied for the sixth-most points in a CUSA game for the Bulldogs, the most in a league matchup since 2016.
- The Bulldogs' offense racked up 646 total yards, the third-most ever in a CUSA game by LA Tech and the most in a single game since Oct. 12, 2019, versus UMass. The Bulldogs rushed for 426 yards, the third-most in program history and the most in a game since 1991, while scoring six rushing touchdowns, tied for the fourth most in program history (most since 2015).
- Jacob Fields intercepted the team's 13th pass of the season and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown. The Bulldogs lead the FBS with six defensive touchdowns, matching the program record set in 2011. In total, Tech's defense has forced 15 turnovers, including 13 interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

Sonny Cumbie was welcomed to Ruston as the 34th head football coach in Bulldog history on December 1, 2021.

In his third season at the helm in 2024, Cumbie led LA Tech to its first bowl appearance since 2020, facing nationally ranked Army in the Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl. The Bulldogs ultimately finished fifth in CUSA with a 5-8 overall record with a 4-4 mark in the league.

Cumbie served as the primary play caller for the first four games before handing the reins to co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Nathan Young. The Bulldogs averaged 333.5 yards per game, which ranked fourth in CUSA in passing offense, highlighted by a 329-yard, six-touchdown performance against Middle Tennessee. LA Tech averaged 110.0 rushing yards on the ground, registering six 100-yard rushing outings and two games with 200+ yards.

LA Tech's defense was one of the best in the nation during the 2024 regular season, finishing 11th in the nation in total defense (301.9 yds per game), which was first in the CUSA, 23rd in pass defense (181.8 yds per game), and 30th in run defense (120.1), which was also a league best. The Bulldogs allowed 20.5 points per game which was tied for the 25th best mark in the nation and second in CUSA.

Tech had nine All-CUSA players in 2024, highlighted by a pair of first-team selections, David Blay (defensive line) and Tru Edwards (wide receiver). Quarterback Evan Bullock was named to the All-CUSA Freshman Team after starting the final 10 games of the season. In addition to earning First-Team All-CUSA honors, Blay was named to the Phil Steele All-American Honorable Mention Team after recording 46 stops, 10.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. Blay became the third player during Cumbie's tenure to earn All-American honors, joining running back Marquis Crosby (2022) and defensive back Michael Richard (2023).

In 2023, Cumbie served as the primary play caller for the Bulldogs' offense that ranked fifth in the CUSA with 384.7 yards of total offense per game while ranking third in first downs gained with 243. The Bulldog offense was among the conference leaders in passing plays over 10 yards (2nd, 123), 20 yards (2nd, 46) and 30 yards (3rd, 22).

Under Cumbie's tutelage, LA Tech had 10 All-CUSA players in 2023, highlighted by first-team selections, Smoke Harris (wide receiver/punt returner), Blake Ochsendorf (punter), and Willie Roberts (defensive back). Freshman defensive back Michael Richard was named CUSA Freshman of the Year and garnered First-Team Freshman All-America honors from The Athletic.

Cumbie garnered his first win as head coach at Louisiana Tech with a dominant 52-17 triumph over Stephen F. Austin on Sept. 10, 2022 at Joe Aillet Stadium. A win in which LA Tech accumulated a season high in total offense (516 yards) and rushing (300 yards). The Bulldogs claimed two wins in Conference USA play with a 41-31 win over UTEP in the CUSA opener (Oct. 8) and a 40-24 shellacking of Middle Tennessee (Nov. 5).

LA Tech garnered a total of 15 all-conference selections in 2022. Wide receiver Tre Harris, defensive lineman Keivie Rose, and wide receiver/return specialist Smoke Harris all earned First-Team All-Conference USA honors while defensive back Myles Brooks was named second-team all-conference. Harris was named a semifinalist for the Fred Biletnikoff Award and Brooks was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl and NFL Combine following the conclusion of the season. Redshirt freshman running back Marquis Crosby was named Honorable Mention Freshman All-American by College Football News after a breakout season in which he rushed for 918 yards and nine touchdowns on 183 carries. His 918 rushing yards ranked sixth nationally among all FBS freshman.

Under his tutelage, Cumbie's quarterbacks ranked 32nd nationally in passing yards per game with 267.2 a contest. Quarterback Parker McNeil threw for a season-high 424 yards in a loss at North Texas which was the most by a Bulldogs since Ryan Higgins in 2016.

Cumbie spent the previous 12 years as an assistant coach in the Big 12, including two stints at Texas Tech (2009-13, 2021) and one at TCU (2014-2020). He served as offensive coordinator for nine years for the Red Raiders and Horned Frogs and worked under some of the top coaches in college football, including Mike Leach, Tommy Tuberville, Kliff Kingsbury, and Gary Patterson.

Cumbie came to LA Tech after serving as the offensive coordinator at Texas Tech in 2021, including serving as the interim head coach over the final four games of the season. This was his second stint in Lubbock, after beginning his college coaching career with the Red Raiders in 2009.

He also served as the quarterbacks coach and the offensive coordinator at TCU during his seven seasons in Fort Worth, Texas. During his tenure at TCU, Cumbie oversaw the Horned Frogs' quarterbacks and served as the sole offensive play caller each of the final four years. TCU boasted the Big 12's second-best league record (38-25) and its third-best overall mark (58-30) over his seven seasons, which coincided with six bowl appearances.

His impact was felt immediately at TCU as the program broke the Big 12 record with a 21.4 points per game improvement, the largest by any team nationally since 1999-2000 (Northwestern). TCU ranked No. 2 in scoring (46.5) and No. 5 in total offense (533.0) on the way to a 12-1 record.

The 2015 Horned Frogs once again lit up the scoreboard, ranking No. 3 in total offense (562.8) and No. 7 in scoring (42.1) on the way to an 11-2 record and a win over Oregon in the Valero Alamo Bowl (rallying from a 31-0 halftime deficit).

NEW LEADERSHIP



UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT DR. JIM HENDERSON

Dr. Jim Henderson became the 15th president of Louisiana Tech University on Jan. 1, 2024. His ties to the institution go back more than 80 years when his father, Clem Henderson, was recruited to play for famed LA Tech football coach, Joe Aillet. His mom, Martha, was a two-time Tech grad.

Henderson previously served as the president and CEO of the University of Louisiana System, one of the nation's largest University systems. As the longest-serving UL System president, he led the Universities of Louisiana in the creation of a strategic framework that charged its member institutions to produce the most educated generation in Louisiana's history. Through various Systemic initiatives such as Compete LA, the Reginald F. Lewis Scholars, and the challenges associated with a global pandemic and fiscal uncertainty, he developed a notion of System that will continue to benefit each of the nine institutions for decades to come.

Henderson also served as president of his alma mater, Northwestern State University, where he reinvigorated student life and campus culture leading to the highest enrollment in the school's 135-year history. Before taking the helm of NSU, Henderson served as chancellor of Bossier Parish Community College. During his tenure, the institution ranked among the five fastest growing colleges in the nation for five consecutive years.

VP/DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS **RYAN IVEY**

Ryan Ivey was introduced as Vice President and Director of Athletics on Feb. 29, 2024, bringing to Ruston more than 18+ years of experience in intercollegiate athletics with the past 11 as an athletics director at Stephen F. Austin, Austin Peay, and Texas A&M-Commerce.

He spent more than five years in Nacogdoches, Texas at SFA, leading the department through a conference transition from the Southland Conference to the Western Athletic Conference, raising private support that included the launch of the Purple Lights Fund that helped secure the four largest single gifts in the department's history, and increasing ticket sales by 189 percent.

Under his leadership, the Lumberjacks celebrated 18 conference championships, three NCAA Tournament appearances, and the 2019 Bowling National Championship.

Prior to joining SFA, Ivey spent three years (2015-18) at Austin Peay in Clarksville, Tennessee, where he helped raise \$6.5 million in gifts which were funneled into facility improvements and the athletic departments budget on top of increase football and basketball ticket revenue.

His first Director of Athletics position came at NCAA Division II Texas A&M-Commerce. During his two-year stint with the Lions, the athletic programs experienced new heights by winning six team Lone Star Conference championships in the 2014-15 season, the most ever in Lion Athletics history.

LUCKY NO. 13

Tech's defense recorded its 13th interception of the season last Friday against Sam Houston, as Jacob Fields picked off a pass early in the fourth quarter and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown. The Bulldogs rank fifth in the FBS with 13 interceptions, their most in a season since 2018.

HAVE A DAY CLAY

First-year Bulldog Clay Thevenin had a game to remember against Sam Houston, as the junior college transfer rushed for a career-high 143 yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries. Thevenin broke runs of 50 and 25 yards while averaging 13.0 yards per carry. It marked his first game with multiple touchdowns. He leads the team with 439 rushing yards and six scores this season.

SHOWED OUT ON O

The Bulldogs' offense racked up 646 total yards, the third-most ever in a CUSA game and the most in a single contest since Oct. 12, 2019, versus UMass. LA Tech rushed for 426 yards, the third-most in program history and the most in a game since 1991, while totaling six rushing touchdowns, tied for the fourth-most ever and the highest since 2015. Running backs Omiri Wiggins (136) and Clay Thevenin (143) each surpassed 100 yards, marking the first time two Bulldogs eclipsed the century mark on the ground in the same game since Nov. 18, 2017, versus UTEP. Both players set career highs in the win. It marked Wiggins' second career 100-yard game.

STARTING FAST

LA Tech scored a touchdown on its opening drive for the fourth straight game and has scored on its opening drive in five consecutive contests. The Bulldogs opened with a field goal against Southern Miss before stringing together four straight opening-drive touchdowns against UTEP, Kennesaw State, WKU and Sam Houston.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

LA Tech is ranked fifth with 18 first-time starters in the FBS this season. The list includes players that have made their first FBS start this season. Jalen Mickens became tech's latest first time starter against WKU.

EVERY WAY POSSIBLE

After nine weeks, LA Tech became one of six teams nationally to score touchdowns by fumble return, interception return, and on special teams. The Bulldogs joined Virginia, South Florida, Kansas State, San Diego State and South Carolina after Devin Gandy returned a kickoff for a touchdown against WKU.

MICKENS MAKES A START

True freshman wide receiver Jalen Mickens made his first start of the season against WKU last Tuesday. Mickens became the second true freshman to start this year, joining linebacker Zheric Hill, who started at middle linebacker against Kennesaw State. The Texas native caught three passes for 28 yards and has appeared in all seven games, recording nine receptions for 100 yards and one touchdown.

STOPPED FOR A LOSS

Tech's defense recorded double-digit tackles for loss for the second time this season, finishing with 10 against WKU, two shy of its 12 in the opener versus Southeastern. Sifa Leota led the team with 3.0, marking his second game this year with three or more. Michael Richard, Mekhi Mason and Emmanuel Oguns added 1.5 TFLs each, while Cedric Woods recorded one. Mason leads the team with 9.5 TFLs, followed by Leota with 7.5.

<u>Marlion magic</u>

Fourth-year wide receiver Marlion Jackson has seen his number called more over the past three games, coming off a career performance against WKU with six receptions for 103 yards, his first 100-yard game. The Georgia native has recorded at least 40 receiving yards in every game with a catch this season and has tallied 13 receptions for a career-high 238 yards and one touchdown. Jackson needs one more catch to match his career-high 14 receptions he set in 2024.

BIG GAME BAKER



/// BULLDOG NOTES

Blake Baker became Tech's first quarterback to register a 300-yard passing game since 2023, setting career highs in yards, completions and attempts after finishing 31 of 45 for 340 yards. The redshirt sophomore also rushed for 49 yards, marking the second time this season he has led the Bulldogs on the ground. Baker surpassed 1,000 career passing yards in the loss and has completed 81 of 127 passes for 989 yards and four touchdowns this season, along with 219 rushing yards and two scores on 64 carries.

HOME COOKING

LA Tech will look to win its fifth straight home game when it hosts WKU on Tuesday night. Dating to last season's finale against Kennesaw State, the Bulldogs have outscored opponents 136-34 while averaging 34 points per game during that four-game stretch and giving up 8.5 defensively. The Bulldogs have not won five straight at home since the 2019 season when they finished 6-0 at Joe Aillet Stadium.

DEFENSIVE CONSISTENCY

The Bulldogs have had seven players start in all six games on the defensive side of the ball. The breakdown includes all three safeties (Michael Richard, Jakari Foster, Jacob Fields), Jhamal Shelby Jr. at corner, Sifa Leota at linebacker and defensive linemen Emmanuel Oguns and Zion Nason.

BACK IN BLUE

LA Tech will debut its blue helmet for the first time in 2025 when it hosts Western Kentucky on Tuesday night. The Bulldogs are 1-1 in the alternate helmet, which debuted last season in a 48-21 win over Middle Tennessee on Oct. 10. Tech lost 33-30 to New Mexico State in the blue helmet the following week.

<u>SINGLETON IS ALL ALONE</u>

Junior college transfer wide receiver Marques Singleton Jr. caught his first career FBS touchdown pass when Blake Baker found him alone in the corner of the end zone on Tech's opening drive against UTEP. Singleton leads the team with 15 receptions through the first five games and has recorded multiple catches in every contest. He ranks third on the team with 99 receiving yards.

DOWN HILL

True freshman linebacker and Ruston high product Zheric Hill, has started to make an impact at his linebacker position after making his college debut on special teams against New Mexico State. After not recording any statistics against the Aggies, Hill has finished with back-to-back five tackle performances versus Southern Miss and UTEP. Hill filled in nicely against the Miners after losing Mekhi Mason to a targeting call and Kolbe Fields to injury. The Ruston product recorded two solo tackles and three assists in the win, giving him 10 stops on the year.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

The Bulldog defense intercepted five passes against UTEP, the most by a Louisiana Tech defense since recording five interceptions against Central Arkansas in the 2007 season opener. Safety Jakari Foster and linebacker Alonzo Jackson Jr. each returned an interception for a touchdown, marking Tech's first game with two defensive scores since Dec. 20, 2017, against SMU in the Frisco Bowl. LA Tech has now tallied five defensive touchdowns (three interceptions, two fumbles), leading the nation. The Bulldogs will look to match their six defensive touchdowns from the 2011 season with one more score.

CAREER DAY FOR THE BIG FELLA

Tech tight end Eli Finley was named the Week 4 John Mackey Player of the Week after recording a career-high 154 yards on six receptions in the win over Southern Miss. He became the first Tech tight end with 100 receiving yards in a game since 2009, and his total is the most by an FBS tight end this season. Finley leads the Bulldogs with 14 catches for 231 yards. His 231 ranks fifth among tight ends and 99th nationally. He had receptions of 72 and 47 yards in the win.

10 GETS SIX

Linebacker Kolbe Fields recorded his first career interception return for a touchdown in Tech's 30-20 win over Southern Miss, returning a pick 48 yards to give the Bulldogs a 23-10 lead. He added a team-high nine tackles, 0.5 TFLs and 0.5 sacks, earning CUSA Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. The New Orleans native has led the team in tackles in three of four games and leads the Bulldogs with 38 stops on the season.

GANDY GETS 1K

Wide receiver Devin Gandy surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards after recording 38 yards against Southern Miss. Gandy transferred to Louisiana Tech with 892 career yards after five seasons at Sacramento State. The first-year Bulldog has caught seven passes for 126 yards through four games, with three of those receptions going for 25 yards or more. Gandy has caught 75 passes for 1,018 yards and six

scores in his career.

DOWNFIELD DOGS

The Bulldogs' offense registered eight plays of 20 yards or more against NMSU, including five passes and three rushes for a total of 267 yards. LA Tech had a combined five plays of 20-plus yards in the first two games before logging eight against the Aggies. Three went for 40 or more yards, highlighted by Blake Baker's 56-yard pass to David Pierro, a 42-yard pass from Trey Kukuk to Marlion Jackson and a 40-yard connection from Baker to Jalen Mickens. Devin Gandy added two explosive plays with receptions of 25 and 20 yards. Baker led the ground game with a 38-yard run, followed by Kukuk (24) and Clay Thevenin (22).

RUNNING WILD

The LA Tech offense ran for 353 yards on 65 attempts against New Mexico State. The 65 carries marked the program's most in a game since 2011 and the fifth most in school history. The 353 yards were the most in a game since the Bulldogs posted 367 against Northwestern State in 2023 and tied for the 10th most in program history. Blake Baker became just the second quarterback in program history to rush for more than 100 yards in a game, finishing with 103 yards. Running backs Omiri Wiggins and Clay Thevenin each added 68 yards, while Andrew Burnette tallied 41 yards, followed by Trey Kukuk with 40.

PICK CITY

The LA Tech defense added two interceptions against New Mexico State, giving the Bulldogs five through three games. LA Tech finished with five interceptions in 13 games last season. Jakari Foster leads the team with two, while Kam Franklin, Michael Richard and Zion Nason each have one.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

Sonny Cumbie saw his team record 574 total yards of offense in the win over New Mexico State, the most in a game under his tenure. The Bulldogs rushed for 353 yards and added 221 through the air. Tech posted 406 yards in the first half alone, marking the first time since 2012 that a CUSA team has tallied 400 yards of offense in a half. The Bulldogs racked up 551 yards of offense against Middle Tennessee in 2024, along with 516 yards against SFA and 504 yards against North Texas in 2022.

CEDRIC SET FOR 50

Sixth-year senior cornerback Cedric Woods will play his 50th game as a Bulldog on Saturday against New Mexico State. The Monroe

native joined the team in 2020 and is one of four current players remaining from the Skip Holtz era.

Woods has started 47 of his 49 career games, including 10 as a true freshman in 2020. He started all 12 games in 2021, appeared in three games with one start in 2022 due to injury, and returned to start 10 games in 2023 and 12 in 2024.

GANDY GETS HIS FIRST

It was a night of firsts for Sacramento State transfer wide receiver Devin Gandy, who made his first FBS start and caught his first FBS touchdown against No. 3 LSU in front of more than 100,000 fans Saturday night. Gandy hauled in a 33-yard reception from quarterback Blake Baker late in the fourth quarter to get the Bulldogs on the board. The sixth-year player has reeled in two passes for 43 yards and one touchdown through two games.

LIVING BEHIND THE LINE

The LA Tech defense raised its season total to 20 tackles for loss after recording eight against LSU. Nine players registered at least half a tackle for loss, while five finished with one or more. The Bulldogs have had 14 players record at least half a tackle for loss this season. Tech is tied for sixth nationally with 20 TFLs. Mekhi Mason leads both the team and the nation with six, followed by Sifa Leota with 3.5 and Kolbe Fields with 2.5.

HAVE A DAY BIRTHDAY BOY

Second-year Bulldog Mekhi Mason had a 21st birthday to remember against Southeastern, setting career highs in tackles, tackles for loss and sacks. The Syracuse transfer was named Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week after recording nine tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and one pass breakup. Mason's 4.5 tackles for loss are the most by any player in a game this season and the third most in a single game in program history.

SPREAD IT AROUND

Eight different players caught a pass in the opener against SLU. Tight end Eli Finley led the team with four grabs, followed by receiver Marques Singleton Jr., who snared three passes. Dedrick Latulas, Omiri Wiggins, Devin Gandy, Jacob Fields, Jalen Mickens and Dane Benedix all caught one pass each.

WENT AND TOOK IT

The LA Tech defense set the tone early against SLU as Jakari Foster intercepted a pass on the

game's opening drive. The Bulldogs forced two more turnovers in the second half, with defensive lineman Zion Nason picking off a pass in the red zone and returning it 25 yards, followed by a forced fumble from Amari Butler that was scooped up and returned 80 yards for a touchdown by Oklahoma State transfer Kam Franklin.

BULLDOG DEBUT

LA Tech had 25 players make their Bulldog debuts in the win over Southeastern.

Of those, four earned their first start — three on offense and one on defense. Quarterback Trey Kukuk, wide receivers Marques Singleton Jr. and Dane Benedix debuted as starters on offense, while defensive lineman Emmanuel Oguns made his debut and start on defense. All four are junior college transfers.

LEVEL UP

Running back Andrew Burnette and wide receiver Tre Averhart joined the program, this summer after transferring from Keiser University, an NAIA program in Florida. The duo helped lead Keiser to the 2023 national championship and a return trip to the title game in 2024.

Burnette rushed for 2,338 yards and 31 touchdowns on 360 carries across two seasons with the Seahawks, earning third-team All-America honors in 2024. Averhart recorded 40 receptions for 539 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

CALIFORNIA CONNECTION

When looking to fill holes at the skill positions, one thing stands out on Louisiana Tech's roster this season — the 10 players from California, the third-most populous state represented on 2025 roster.

The Bulldogs added 10 transfers from California, including eight from the junior college level, one from the FCS and one from the FBS.

The breakdown includes nine players on offense and one on defense. Tech added two quarterbacks, five wide receivers, two tight ends and one defensive back. The trio of Trey Kukuk, Dane Benedix and Brayden Bockler all played together at Saddleback College, while Teddy Booras and David Pierro were teammates at Diablo Valley College.

FREAK ON THE FIELD

Every college football season, Bruce Feldman, a national college football insider for The

Athletic, puts out his "College Football Freaks List", and LA Tech running back Omiri Wiggins checks in at No. 86 on the 2025 Freaks List. Feldman relies on intel from coaches, schools, teammates, parents, NFL scouts, NFL Scouting Combine trainers and agents.

Wiggins, a 5-10, 206-pound junior, saw action in all 13 games with 11 starts last season. He finished the season with 527 rushing yards and four scores on 111 attempts. Wiggins also caught 20 passes for 126 yards and two scores. The Lafayette native can squat 585 pounds, bench 340 pounds, while recording 21.9 max velocity and a 34.5 inch vertical.

THE PIERRO BROTHERS

Wide receiver David Pierro, a transfer from Diablo Valley College, and cornerback Jordan Pierro, a transfer from Fresno State, both joined LA Tech's roster this summer, becoming the first pair of brothers on the team since 2013. The Bulldogs last had brothers on the roster in 2013 with twins Jon and Richard Greenwalt, along with Beau and Lyle Fitte.

David is a 2022 graduate of Clovis West High School, while Jordan graduated in 2024. Jordan comes to Ruston after redshirting at Fresno State last season. David joins Tech after recording 92 receptions for 1,225 yards and 10 touchdowns across two seasons at Diablo Valley.

BOTH SIDES OF THE FIELDS

In high school, Jacob Fields recorded 156 tackles, eight interceptions and three forced fumbles on defense, while adding 22 touchdowns and 1,108 all-purpose yards on the offensive side of the ball in his career.

The Texas native signed with LA Tech as a defensive back but was quickly moved to running back prior to the start of his freshman season in 2023 due to injuries in the room. He appeared in 11 games with one start against Nebraska, while registering 26 carries for 105 yards and two touchdowns on the season. Fields also hauled in 12 passes for 97 yards.

In 2024, Fields moved back to the defensive side of the ball and played in all 13 games with eight starts at safety. He tallied 54 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

In 2025, fans can expect to see Fields on both sides of the Field as he has been lining up at both safety and receiver during spring practice and fall camp.

The junior is believed to be one of Tech's first

two-way players in more than 50 years. On record, Joe Hinton (1957-60), Leo Sanford (1947-50) and J.W. Slack (1957-59) are three of the Bulldogs' top former two-way stars, each earning induction into the LA Tech Hall of Fame.

FRESH TURF

The Bulldogs will play on a new surface this season at Origin Bank Field at Joe Aillet Stadium as a turf upgrade took place for the first time in 10 years. The new-look design now features the Origin Bank logo.

The playing surface is Pivot 1.5 by Hellas and was developed at the Center for Turf Innovation (CTI) with college and professional athletes. Pivot combines traditional sports fibers with newer thinner fibers that look and feel more like natural grass.

MCCOWN ON THE CALL

Former Bulldog quarterback and Louisiana Tech Athletics Hall of Famer Luke McCown will serve as color analyst alongside Malcolm Butler for ESPN+ broadcasts of Tech's first two home games (Aug. 30 vs. Southeastern, Sept. 13 vs. New Mexico State). McCown, the program's all-time leader in passing yards (12,994), completions (1,088) and attempts (1,827), played 14 years in the NFL and previously worked as a sideline reporter for the LA

Tech Sports Network (2021-22).

HOME GROWN DOGS

LA Tech's roster features seven players from Ruston High School, which is the second most players from a single high school on an FBS roster this season. Fresno State leads the nation with eight.

The Bulldogs' hometown group includes three 2025 graduates in Dylone Brooks, Zheric Hill and Zander Hayes, followed by 2024 grads Jadon Mayfield, Jacoryian Crowe and Will Fendley. Christian Davis is the most experienced of the group, graduating from Ruston in 2023.

REPLACING RECEPTIONS

Tech must replace 173 receptions lost to graduation and transfers from 2024. Eli Finley leads the returning pass catchers with 27 receptions at the FBS level, followed by Marlion Jackson (26), Omiri Wiggins (20) and Jay Wilkerson (13). The Bulldogs added experienced junior college standouts Marques Singleton Jr. (128 catches), David Pierro (92), Chase Grosfeld (77) and Dane Benedix (49), along with Sacramento State transfer Devin Gandy (68).

LEAGUE ON NOTICE

LA Tech linebacker Kolbe Fields enters his third season with the program, and the redshirt senior has already put the league on notice after being voted the 2025 Conference USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. He earned All-CUSA second-team honors in 2024, his first season as a starter.

The New Orleans native started in 11 games last season, recording 71 tackles (38 solo, 33 assists), nine tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and two pass breakups. He recorded three games with double-digit tackles and led Bulldogs in tackles four times.

IN FOR THE DOG HAUL

The Bulldogs have eight players on this year's roster that have been at LA Tech for at least four seasons. Cedric Woods enters his sixth year with the team, while Kenneth Bannister, Ean Burch, and Josh Cobbs enter their fifth. Brett Canis, Landon Nelson, and Jhamal Shelby Jr. round out the list as four-year members of the program. Woods leads the group with 48 games played, followed by Canis (23), Bannister (22), Nelson (21), and Cobbs (20).

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

For the second straight season, Louisiana Tech will have multiple players with Bulldog blood-lines on its roster. Jackson Bradley, son of Josh Bradley (TE, 1995-97); Brayden Curry, son of DJ Curry (WR, 2000-03); Kaegan Kent, son of Marty Kent (K, 1994-97); and Jay Simon, son of John Simon (RB, 1998-01), have all followed in their fathers' footsteps as Bulldogs. Jay and Brayden enter their second season with the program, while Jackson and Kaegan are first year players.

John Simon recorded over 3,700 yards and 15 touchdowns during his four seasons in Ruston. He caught 262 passes for 2,596 yards and 10 scores. Simon rushed for 1,121 yards and five touchdowns on 213 attempts. Josh Bradley caught 131 passes for 1,591 yards and 20 scores during his three seasons with the Bulldogs. He recorded 500+ yards in each of his three seasons. DJ Curry starred for the Bulldogs for four seasons, catching 171 passes for 2,241 yards and 17 touchdowns. Marty Kent made 50 career field goals for LA Tech and connected on 129 of 133 extra points.

DEGREE IN HAND

Louisiana Tech will have 10 players on this year's roster who have already earned their

bachelor's degrees. Brett Canis, Landon Nelson, Jay Wilkerson and Cedric Woods graduated from Tech, while Tre Averhart, Andrew Burnette, Jonathan Denis, Devin Gandy, Benji Johnson and Caleb Sims transferred into the program after earning degrees at their previous schools.

ALL ACROSS AMERICA

The Bulldogs will travel to two new states this season when they visit Delaware State and Washington State. Tech's contest against the Blue Hens in Newark, Delaware, will mark the 34th state the Bulldogs have played in, while their matchup one week later in Pullman, Wash., will be the 35th. The Bulldogs will also visit Georgia and Missouri for just the second time in program history.

In their travels, the Bulldogs will play games in all four time zones this season: vs. Southeastern (Central), at Kennesaw State (Eastern), at UTEP (Mountain) and at Washington State (Pacific). It will be the first time since 2012 that Tech has played in all four time zones.

STAFF UPDATES

Joining the Bulldog coaching staff this season includes six new coaches with five on the defensive side of the football and one on offense.

Tony Franklin | Offensive Coordinator

Returns to Louisiana Tech for his second stint as the OC after previously holding the same role for three seasons (2010-12). Led the Bulldogs to a 9-3 record in 2012 while leading the nation in scoring offense (51.50 ppg) and total offense (577.92 ypg). Was most recently the OC for Army Sprint Football in 2022.

Luke Olson | Defensive Coordinator

Comes to LA Tech after leading Jacksonville State to a Conference USA Championship in 2024 as the Gamecocks' defensive coordinator. He brings over a decade of defensive coaching experience at the FBS level, including two seasons as a DC. Served as the DC for one season at Tulsa in 2022.

Carlton Buckels | Cornerbacks

Buckels, who brings over 20 years of collegiate coaching experience to Ruston, arrives after a two-year stint as the cornerbacks coach at TCU. The Louisiana native coached NFL Draft picks in each of his first two seasons with the Horned Frogs. Buckels has also spent time at Tulsa and Baylor.

Josh Creech | Linebackers

Creech comes to Ruston after spending the 2024 season as the defensive coordinator at Midway High School in Waco, Texas. Prior to

joining the staff at Midway HS, Creech spent six seasons as a defensive analyst at SMU (2018-21) and TCU (2022-23).

Sam Carter | Safeties

Carter joins the Bulldog coaching staff after serving as the cornerbacks coach at Purdue in 2023 and 2024. Carter arrived in West Lafayette after gaining experience throughout the SEC in stops at Missouri, Arkansas and Ole Miss.

Paul Randolph | Defensive Line

Randolph comes to Ruston following a oneyear stint at Oklahoma State in the same role. Randolph arrived in Stillwater after serving as the defensive line coach at Indiana for the 2022 and 2023 seasons. He brings 27 years of collegiate coaching experience, with 24 years spent coaching the defensive line. He has spent 15 seasons at the Power Five level and has coached in 17 bowl games during his career.

COLLECTING CUSA AWARDS

Louisiana Tech and Houston are the only two teams that have garnered every individual award in Conference USA history. The Bulldogs have had at least one specialty award winner in seven of the their 11 seasons in CUSA.



2025 GAME RECAPS | GAME ONE: LA TECH 24, SOUTHEASTERN 0 | RUSTON | AUG. 30



RUSTON - Louisiana Tech's defense stole the show in the season opener, pitching a shutout and powering the Bulldogs to a 24-0 victory over Southeastern Louisiana on Saturday night inside Joe Aillet Stadium.

LA Tech (1-0) kept SLU (0-1) off the scoreboard for all four quarters, forcing three turnovers and coming up with big stops to preserve the Bulldogs first shutout since . . . the last time they played in the Joe which was the home finale last season against Kennesaw State.

The starting linebacker trio for the 'Dogs were a menace all night. Kolbe Fields and Sifa Leota tallied 13 tackles each, and Mekhi Mason added nine stops (4.5 tackles for loss) and two sacks as part of a relentless effort that held SLU to just 3.6 yards per play.

The turning point came midway through the third quarter when defensive back Kam Franklin scooped up a fumble and raced 80 yards for a touchdown, stretching LA Tech's lead to 24-0. That defensive score capped a dominant third quarter in which the Bulldogs scored three touchdowns in a span of just over seven minutes.

LA Tech's offense found rhythm after a sluggish first half. Starting quarterback Trey Kukuk threw for 130 yards and a touchdown, connecting with Omiri Wiggins on a 17-yard strike to open the third-quarter surge. Running back Clay Thevenin added a 2-yard touchdown run after ripping off a 33-yard gain earlier in the drive.

Special teams also delivered, as Drew Henderson drilled an 18-yard chip shot just before halftime to give the Bulldogs a 3-0 edge at the break.

LA Tech finished with 262 yards of total offense but leaned heavily on its defense, which not only posted the shutout but also recorded four sacks, 11 tackles for loss, and held SLU to 0-for-2 on fourth down.

GAME NOTES

- With the win, LA Tech now leads the all-time series versus SLU, 30-7-2. The Bulldogs have won 10 straight over the Lions, the longest active winning streak against any opponent.
- LA Tech won its 12th straight season opener at home.
- The Bulldogs recorded their first shutout in a season opener since 1996, which came against Middle Tennessee. This was the first shutout against the Lions since 1972.
- LA Tech has now registered back-to-back shutouts at home for the first time since 1959-60 (shutout Kennesaw State, 33-0, in last season's home finale).
- Eli Finley led the Bulldogs in receiving with 59 yards on four catches (second most receiving yards in a single game by the tight end).
- Sifa Leota set career highs in both tackles (13) and tackles for loss (3.5).
- Mekhi Mason recorded a career-high 4.5 tackles for loss, which included two sacks. It is the third most tackles for loss in a single game in program history (most since 2018).

2025 GAME RECAPS | GAME TWO: LSU 23, LA TECH 7 | BATON ROUGE, LA. | SEPT. 6



BATON ROUGE, La. - Louisiana Tech's defense battled for four quarters inside a sold-out Tiger Stadium, but the Bulldogs could not overcome No. 3 LSU in a 23–7 setback Saturday night in front of 101,667 fans.

LA Tech (1–1) held LSU (2-0) to just two touchdowns on the night and forced a trio of field goals, but the Tigers leaned on a balanced offensive attack and a defense that limited the Bulldogs to 154 total yards.

LA Tech's defense kept the game within reach, racking up eight tackles-for-loss. Mekhi Mason led the way with 11 tackles, including a sack, while Christian Davis, Jadon Mayfield, and Jojo Odom also registered sacks to help the Bulldogs bring down LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier three times. Michael Richard also created the lone turnover on the night, grabbing an interception on the Tigers opening drive to quickly silence the crowd.

Offensively, the 'Dogs got into LSU territory three times but were forced to punt all three. It was not until late in the fourth quarter when Blake Baker who came in at quarterback connected with Devin Gandy on a 33-yard touchdown strike to put LA Tech on the scoreboard, capping a 13-play, 74-yard drive.

Gandy led Tech with 33 receiving yards, while Eli Finley added four catches for 18 yards. Baker and Trey Kukuk combined for 96 passing yards against a fast LSU secondary. On the ground, Clay Thevenin paced Tech with 22 rushing yards, while Kukuk added 16.

Special teams kept the Bulldogs in it as well, with John Hoyet Chance averaging 38.4 yards on nine punts, pinning the Tigers inside their own 10 four times.

LSU struck first with a late first-quarter touchdown pass and added a field goal before halftime. The Tigers extended their lead to 17–0 in the third and tacked on two more field goals in the final frame, including one that was forced by the Bulldog defense stuffed the Tigers on three straight plays from inside the 3-yard line, to stay out of reach.

GAME NOTES

With the loss, LA Tech now trails in the all-time series versus LSU, 1-20. The 16-point loss was the second closest margin of victory for the Tigers in the series in the last 15 meetings.

With the announced attendance of 101,667, it was the fourth largest crowd that LA Tech has played in front of.

With a late touchdown, the Bulldogs extended their streak of scoring to 213 games (have not been shut out since 2008).

The Bulldog defense totaled 8.0 tackles for loss, the most they have ever had against the Tigers (on record). They had a combined 7.0 in the last two meetings.

The Bulldog defense tallied five pass breakups. They also had six against Southeastern in the season opener (first time with 5+ PBUs in back-to-back games since 2023).

Mekhi Mason registered a game-high 11 tackles, giving him back-to-back games with double-digit tackles. He also had a game-high 1.5 tackles for loss, giving him 6.0 for the season

through two games.

Michael Richard recorded his first career interception as a Bulldog.

Eli Finley led the Bulldogs in total receptions for a second straight game, reeling in four grabs.

Devin Gandy registered his first career touchdown as a Bulldog.

2025 GAME RECAPS | GAME THREE: LA TECH 49, NM STATE 14 | RUSTON | SEPT. 13



RUSTON - Louisiana Tech opened Conference USA play with authority Saturday night, running past New Mexico State 49–14 at Origin Bank Field at Joe Aillet Stadium.

LA Tech (2-1, 1-0 CUSA) controlled the line of scrimmage from start to finish, piling up 353 rushing yards on 65 carries. Quarterback Blake Baker, making his first start of the season, led the effort with 103 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while also throwing for 182 yards and a score. Running backs Omiri Wiggins (68 yards, TD) and Andrew Burnette (41 yards, TD) added to the Bulldogs' depth in the backfield, with Clay Thevenin chipping in 68 yards of his own.

The Bulldogs jumped out to a 10–0 first-quarter lead behind a booming 55-yard field goal from John Hoyet Chance and a 40-yard touchdown strike from Baker to Jalen Mickens. Burnette's 11-yard touchdown run and a 42-yard pass from Trey Kukuk to Marlion Jackson stretched the lead to 24–0 early in the second quarter.

NM State (2-1, 0-1 CUSA) briefly clawed back into the game with two quick scores — Logan Fife connecting on long touchdown passes to Brodrick Malone (41 yards) and P.J. Johnson III (38 yards) — cutting the deficit to 24—14. But LA Tech steadied itself before halftime, adding a short field goal by Drew Henderson to take a 27—14 lead into the break.

The third quarter was a punt fest with both teams combining for seven punts and zero points. However, the fourth quarter was all Bulldogs. The defense forced three total turnovers, including a pivotal play early in the fourth when Jacob Bradford scooped up a fumble and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown.

From there, the rout was on: Baker scored on a one-yard keeper and Wiggins broke free for a 17-yard score as LA Tech piled up 22 points in the final period.

While the offense wore down the Aggies with its rushing attack, the Bulldog defense clamped down. LA Tech limited NM State to just 27 yards on the ground and shut them out over the final 30 minutes. Kam Franklin and Jakari Foster each grabbed interceptions, while Kolbe Fields led the team with 10 tackles.

In all, LA Tech outgained New Mexico State 574—308, dominated time of possession by more than 11 minutes, and converted 11-of-19 third downs.

GAME NOTES

- With the win, LA Tech now leads the all-time series versus New Mexico State, 9-6. The Bull dogs have now won five straight home-opening CUSA games.
- The Bulldogs improved to 9-4 in CUSA openers.
- LA Tech rushed the ball 65 times, the fifth most in a single game in program history. It is the most ever by the Bulldogs in a CUSA game and the most since 2011.
- The Bulldogs rushed for 353 yards, tied for the 10th most in a single game in program history. It is the most in a single game since 2013.
- LA Tech's 49 points are the ninth most the Bulldogs have ever scored in a CUSA game (most since 2019).
- The Bulldog defense scored two touchdowns. It marked the first time since 2016 that LA Tech has scored multiple defensive touchdowns in the same season.
- LA Tech registered two interceptions, bringing its season total to five (matching all last season). This is the first time since 2013 that the Bulldogs have registered at least one INT in each of the first three games of the season).
- The Bulldog defense allowed just 27 yards on the ground, the fewest in a single game since

2014 at Southern Miss.

- Blake Baker rushed for a game-high 103 yards, becoming just the second quarterback in program history to rush for 100+ yards in a single game.
- John Hoyet Chance made a 55-yard field goal, tied for the third longest in program history.
- Kolbe Fields led the Bulldogs in tackles with 10. It marked the fifth time in his Bulldog career he has recorded double-digit tackles in a single game.

RUSTON - Louisiana Tech rode a dominant first half and a game-changing defensive score to knock off rival Southern Miss, 30-20, Saturday night inside Origin Bank Field at Joe Aillet Stadium.

LA Tech (3-1) posted all 30 of its points in the first half, building a 20-point lead at the midway point. That was all the scoring the Bulldogs needed as the defense limited USM (2-2) to just two scores in the second stanza to win the renewed rivalry that dates to 1935.

The 'Dogs came out firing in the opening quarter. Following a 3-and-out by the defense, LA Tech marched 74 yards in just two plays to grab the early lead on a one-yard keeper by quarterback Blake Baker. Setting up the easy score was a 73-yard catch-and-run by tight end Eli Finley who was wide open over the middle.

After the Golden Eagles quickly answered, kicker Drew Henderson booted a 24-yard field goal and Omiri Wiggins added a three-yard touchdown run to send the Bulldogs in front, 17-10, after one.

The second quarter proved decisive. Linebacker Kolbe Fields jumped a route and returned an interception 48 yards for a touchdown to give LA Tech a two-score cushion. Just before halftime, Clay Thevenin powered in from a yard out to cap a 14-play, 80-yard drive, sending the Bulldogs into the locker room with a commanding 30-10 lead.

USM controlled much of the second half statistically – finishing with 514 total yards compared to LA Tech's 340 – but the Bulldogs' defense bent without breaking. The Golden Eagles were stuffed on a goal-line stand in the third quarter and managed just a field goal and a late touchdown, never fully erasing the early deficit.

Baker finished an efficient 15-of-21 through the air for 239 yards and 29 yards on the ground. Finley led all receivers with six catches for a career-high 155 yards. Wiggins paced the ground attack with 49 rushing yards.

Defensively, Fields anchored the effort with nine tackles and the pick-six, while Mekhi Mason and Sifa Leota each added seven tackles. The linebacker trio also combined for two tackles-forloss, three pass breakups, and two quarterback hurries.

GAME NOTES

- With the win, LA Tech now trails in the all-time series with Southern Miss, 18-36. The Bulldogs have won three of the last four meetings.
- LA Tech picked up its 650th win in program history.
- The Bulldogs have won four straight at home (averaging 34.0 points per game) and have outscored their opponents 136-34 in those games.
- LA Tech improved to 8-0 all-time when scoring 30+ points against USM. Each of the last six victories by the Bulldogs has coincided with scoring at least 30 points.
- The Bulldogs scored all 30 points in the first half, the most this season in the stanza.
- Three different Bulldogs rushed for a touchdown for the second straight game Omiri Wiggins, Blake Baker, and Clay Thevenin.
- The Bulldog defense scored a touchdown for the third time this season (most since 2015).
- Eli Finley registered a game-high and career-high 155 receiving yards. It marked the first time since Dennis Morris (2009) that a Bulldog tight end registered 100+ receiving yards.

- Kolbe Fields posted his second career interception (first pick six). It is the first pick six by a Bulldog linebacker since Trey Baldwin in 2021.
- Opponents are now 0-for-4 on fourth downs against the Bulldogs. Southern Miss failed on two attempts.

EL PASO, Texas -Louisiana Tech used a dominant defensive effort and two interception returns for touchdowns to defeat UTEP 30-11 on Saturday night at the Sun Bowl.

LA Tech (4-1, 2-0 CUSA) was able to overcome four turnovers (came into the game with only one this season) by picking off UTEP (1-4, 0-1 CUSA) quarterbacks five times, scoring twice to stay perfect in league play.

LA Tech struck first midway through the opening quarter as Blake Baker connected with Marques Singleton Jr. on a 5-yard touchdown pass to cap a 10-play, 60-yard drive, giving the Bulldogs a 7-0 lead at the 6:14 mark of the first quarter. This TD was set up by an interception by Sifa Leota followed a tipped ball from Mekhi Mason.

After a scoreless second quarter, LA Tech stretched the margin to double digits late in the third. Following a Miner turnover, Drew Henderson drilled a 37-yard field goal to make it 10-0 with 5:47 to play in the third period.

UTEP finally got on the board early in the fourth quarter on a 38-yard field goal from Tanner Cragun, trimming the deficit to 10-3 at the 14:55 mark.

But the Bulldogs' defense immediately took control. Less than five minutes later, Jakari Foster stepped in front of a pass and sprinted 67 yards up the sideline for a pick-six, pushing the lead to 17-3 with 10:22 remaining.

LA Tech extended the advantage on its next possession, grinding out a 42-yard march that ended with Clay Thevenin's 4-yard touchdown run, making it 24-3 with 4:58 left.

UTEP answered quickly when Skyler Locklear hit Wondame Davis Jr. for a 35-yard touchdown, followed by a successful two-point conversion pass to Josh Schuchts, cutting the score to 24-11 at the 3:34 mark.

But any hopes of a Miner comeback were dashed just two plays later. Alonzo Jackson Jr. skied in the air for the ball and returned an interception 23 yards to the end zone, diving across the goal line to seal the 30-11 victory.

Behind the two defensive touchdowns and five total interceptions, LA Tech's defense controlled the game, holding UTEP to just 145 passing yards and one score through the air. Baker finished 18-of-26 for 137 yards and a touchdown, while Singleton led the Bulldogs with five receptions.

GAME NOTES

- With the win, LA Tech now owns an 18-3-1 advantage in the series versus UTEP. The Bulldogs have won 12 of the last 13 meetings against the Miners.
- LA Tech improved to 9-1 all-time against UTEP at the Sun Bowl.
- LA Tech is now 4-1 on the season (first time since 2019).
- This marks the fifth time the Bulldogs have started 2-0 in CUSA play.
- The Bulldogs have allowed 11 or fewer points in three straight meetings against the Miners (just three total touchdowns).
- LA Tech shutout UTEP in the first half, marking the first time the Miners have not scored in the first half at home since 2017.
- The LA Tech defense recorded a season-high five turnovers, the most in a single game since 2022 against Middle Tennessee. It was the most by the Bulldogs in a road game since 2012 at

Illinois. All five were interceptions, the most in a single game by LA Tech since 2007 against Central Arkansas.

- It marked the first time that LA Tech recorded two pick-sixes in the same game since the 2017 Frisco Bowl against SMU.
- The nine combined turnovers are the most in a single game since 2012 at Illinois.
- The Bulldogs recorded two defensive touchdowns, bringing their season total to five through five games. That is already the most since the 2019 season.
- This was LA Tech's first win when committing at least four turnovers since the 2024 season opener against Nicholls (had five that game).

KENNESAW, Ga. - Louisiana Tech jumped out to a strong start Thursday night, but turnovers proved costly in a 35-7 setback at Kennesaw State inside Walens Family Field at Fifth Third Stadium.

LA Tech (4-2, 2-1 CUSA) looked sharp early, getting a 3-and-out by the defense on the opening drive faced and then marching 70 yards on their opening possession and capping it with a one-yard touchdown run by Omiri Wiggins to take a 7-0 lead.

The defense forced punts on each of the Owls' first three series, holding Kennesaw State (4-2, 2-0 CUSA) to just 34 yards in the opening quarter.

Momentum shifted in the second quarter when starting quarterback Blake Baker left the game with an injury. Already without CUSA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and star linebacker Kolbe Fields, LA Tech saw its depth tested on both sides of the ball. KSU took advantage, scoring 14 unanswered points before halftime — one being a 15-play, 92-yard drive for a touchdown and the other coming just one play after an interception thrown by Trey Kukuk.

The Owls stretched the margin with three second-half touchdown passes from Dexter Williams II, who finished 27-of-36 for 290 yards and four scores. Kennesaw State ended up outscoring LA Tech 28-0 after the opening period.

The Bulldog defense, which had forced at least one turnover in every game this season (13 total), was unable to come up with a takeaway. Meanwhile, two Bulldog interceptions were directly converted into 14 Owl points.

Evan Bullock, who made 10 starts for the Bulldogs last season, saw his first action at quarter-back this season, going 11-of-21 for 112 yards. Wiggins paced the rushing attack with 67 yards and the team's lone touchdown, while Marlion Jackson led all LA Tech receivers with 49 yards. Defensively, Jacob Fields registered a team-high nine tackles.

GAME NOTES

- With the loss, the series between Louisiana Tech and Kennesaw State is now tied, 1-1.
- LA Tech shutout KSU in the first quarter, marking the fourth time this season (out of six games) they have now allowed their opponent to score in the first stanza. The Bulldogs have only surrendered 17 total points in the first quarter.
- The LA Tech defense tallied five tackles-for-loss. They have not had at least five TFLs in five of the six games this season.
- This marked the first time this season the Bulldog defense was not able to create a takeaway.

RUSTON - Louisiana Tech battled back from a 13-point deficit, taking the lead in overtime but WKU answered with a walk-off two-point conversion to edge the Bulldogs, 28-27, on Tuesday night inside Origin Bank Field at Joe Aillet Stadium.

LA Tech (4-3, 2-2 CUSA) got off to a quick start as usual, scoring a touchdown on its opening drive for the fourth straight game. However, WKU (6-2, 4-1 CUSA) scored 17 unanswered points to take a 20-7 advantage at halftime.

Devin Gandy's 85-yard kickoff return (Music City Miracle-style) to open the second half ignited the comeback, trimming the deficit to six just 15 seconds into the third quarter.

LA Tech's defense stiffened from there, holding the Hilltoppers scoreless for the remainder of regulation. John Hoyet Chance connected on back-to-back 24-yard field goals in the fourth quarter to erase the deficit and send the game to overtime tied 20-20.

In the extra frame, the Bulldogs got the ball first and running back Andrew Burnette proceeded to cap a five-play, 25-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run up the middle to give LA Tech its first lead since the opening quarter.

However, WKU's George Hart III responded with a four-yard score, and the Hilltoppers elected to go for the win — converting a gutsy two-point pass from quarterback Rodney Tisdale Jr. to K.D. Hutchinson that sealed the 28-27 final.

Blake Baker had a strong season under center, completing 31-of-45 passes for 340 yards and a touchdown, spreading the ball to 10 different receivers (also had a team-high 49 yards rushing). Marlion Jackson led the group with 103 receiving yards on six receptions, while Clay Thevenin added 52 through the air and 35 on the ground.

Defensively, the Bulldogs were led by Jacob Fields (11 tackles) and Jakari Foster (10 tackles) while Sifa Leota had eight tackles, including 3.0 tackles-for-loss and two pass breakups. Kameron Carter provided the lone turnover for LA Tech with an interception in the fourth quarter.

LA Tech outgained WKU 449-340 in total offense and converted 10-of-19 third downs.

GAME NOTES

With the loss, the series is now tied at 6-6 against WKU. Six of the last eight meetings have now been decided by one score.

The Bulldogs held the Hilltoppers scoreless in the second half. It marked the fifth time this season that LA Tech's defense has held an opponent to zero points in a half.

The Bulldog defense tallied 10 tackles-for-loss, marking the second time this season with double-digit TFLs.

Ten different Bulldogs caught a reception versus WKU.

Blake Baker set new career highs in completions (31), passing attempts (45), and passing yards (340). He became the first Bulldog since Hank Bachmeier (Nov. 11, 2023 versus Sam Houston) to throw for 300+ yards. He also became the 28th Bulldog in program history to throw for 300+ yards in a single game.

Blake Baker also led the Bulldogs in rushing with 49 yards on the ground. It marked the second time this season Baker has led the team in passing and rushing in the same game.

Marlion Jackson posted a career-high 103 receiving yards, which led the Bulldogs. It marked the third time in his career with 75+ receiving yards in a single game and his first game with 100+

vards.

Tre Averhart caught his first reception as a Bulldog, which also resulted in a touchdown. Jacob Fields led the Bulldogs in total tackles with 11, a new career high for the defensive back. Jakari Foster tallied a season-high 10 tackles, one shy of tying his career high which he set last season against UTEP.

Sifa Leota registered a game-high 3.0 tackles-for-loss, marking the second time he has had at least three TFLs in a single game (had 3.5 in the season opener against Southeastern).

RUSTON - Louisiana Tech delivered a frightfully dominant performance on Halloween night Friday, steamrolling Sam Houston 55-14 behind a relentless rushing attack at Origin Bank Field at Joe Aillet Stadium.

LA Tech (5-3, 3-2 CUSA) totaled 646 yards of offense, piled up 425 rushing yards and six touchdowns on the ground while averaging nearly 11 yards per carry, scoring multiple touchdowns in every quarter.

The Bulldogs wasted no time setting the tone. On the opening drive, Blake Baker connected with Devin Gandy for a 36-yard touchdown to give LA Tech an early 7-0 lead. Moments later, Clay Thevenin found the end zone from six yards out, capping a 58-yard drive to make it 14-0 after one quarter.

Thevenin struck again early in the second with a 50-yard burst, and Baker added a 1-yard keeper later in the frame to push the halftime margin to 27-0.

Sam Houston (0-8, 0-5 CUSA) briefly found life after the break with a 28-yard touchdown run by Elijah Green, but LA Tech answered immediately. Omiri Wiggins punched in a 16-yard score, and Thevenin followed with his third touchdown of the night — a 25-yard sprint that made it 41-7 late in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs' defense then joined the fun, as Jacob Fields jumped a route and returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown early in the fourth. On the next possession, Andrew Burnette provided the exclamation point, racing 66 yards to the house to seal the 55-14 victory.

Baker finished 17-of-21 for 221 yards and one passing score, while Thevenin (143 yards), Wiggins (136), and Burnette (72) led a ground game that turned the Joe into a Halloween horror show for the Bearkats.

GAME NOTES

With the win, LA Tech now leads the all-time series against Sam Houston, 3-2-1.

The 55 points was the most points scored by the Bulldogs since Sept. 26, 2020, when they put up 66 against Houston Baptist (most in Sonny Cumbie era). It tied for the sixth-most points scored by LA Tech in a CUSA game (most since 2016).

LA Tech scored multiple touchdowns in all four quarters (first time since Sept. 26, 2020, against Houston Baptist).

LA Tech scored a touchdown on its opening drive for the fourth straight game.

The Bulldogs scored 27 points in the first half, marking the third time this season LA Tech has put up 27+ points in the first stanza.

The LA Tech offense put up 646 total yards, the third most ever by the Bulldogs in a CUSA game. It was the most in a single game since Oct. 12, 2019 versus UMass.

The Bulldogs rushed for 425 yards, the third most in a single game in program history (most since 1991). The team also totaled six rushing touchdowns, tied for the fourth most in program history (most since 2015).

The Bulldogs had two running backs — Omiri Wiggins and Clay Thevenin — rush for over 100 yards, marking the first time since Nov. 18, 2017 versus UTEP that two Bulldogs eclipsed 100 yards on the ground in the same game. Thevenin (143) and Wiggins (136) both tallied career highs.

Clay Thevenin scored three times on the ground, the first Bulldog to do so since Omiri Wiggins ran for three TDs last season against Kennesaw State.

Blake Baker registered a touchdown throwing and rushing, the second time this season he has done so

Andrew Burnette took a rush 67 yards for a touchdown, marking the longest rush of the season by a Bulldog.

Devin Gandy posted a team-high and season-high 78 receiving yards on just two receptions. One of those went for a touchdown, his second receiving TD of the season.

Jacob Fields registered an 85-yard pick-six, the sixth longest defensive return in program history (longest since 2009). It was LA Tech's sixth defensive touchdown of the season, which leads the country.
