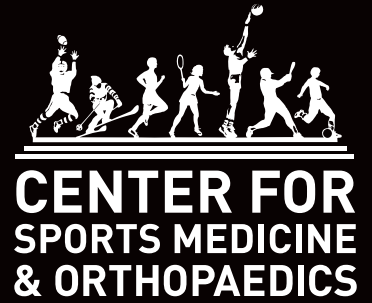

## Lee University President : Dr. Phil Cook



Dr. Phil Cook began his term as the eighteenth president of Lee University on July 1, 2025. Cook brings over 30 years of experience in higher education, most recently serving as President and CEO of the North American Coalition for Christian Admissions Professionals (NACCAP) beginning in 2021.

Of his experience in higher education, the lion's share is with a specific focus on enrollment management, as NACCAP is an association for enrollment professionals, and his prior experience was in service at Lee University in the enrollment sector. From 1997 to 2021 he held every administrative position in the unit from Assistant Director of Admissions to Vice President for Enrollment Management. He led the enrollment team during an extended period of consistent, dramatic growth that revolutionized the university's profile on the landscape of Christian higher education.

During his long stint as a Lee employee, Cook also gained a familiarity with other aspects of university life, as he served as a resident director and as Director of Student Events and also found time to serve as a sponsor of the men's social service club Alpha Gamma Chi, as an instructor in both the School of Religion and the Office of First Year programs, as moderator of Dixon Center chapel services, and even as the public address announcer for Lee University home basketball games. This track record not only speaks of a significant long-term commitment to Lee University, but also an investment into the day-to-day lives of its students.

Cook holds a PhD in higher education administration from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, a Master of Divinity from the Church of God School of Theology, and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Lee.

An ordained bishop in the Church of God, he is married to Tonya Cook, and they have three children and two grandchildren.

## Lee University Chancellor : Dr. Charles Paul Conn



Charles Paul Conn remains as chancellor of Lee University after serving as president and chancellor for the past year. Conn served that institution as president for thirty-four years, becoming president in 1986, after fifteen years as a member of the psychology faculty at the same institution. During his administration, the university saw significant growth: enrollment increased from 1000 to over 5000, the physical campus was enlarged substantially, and the school's reputation as a regional leader was firmly established.

**EDUCATION:** Conn earned the Ph.D. degree in psychology from Emory University in 1974. Subsequently, he has spent three years at Harvard University as a postdoctoral student, studying with Lawrence Kohlberg (1978), David Breneman (1993), Derek Bok (1998), Suarez Orozco (2003), Robert Kegan (2008), and Rick Weissbourd and Nancy Hill (2018). He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard Divinity School in 1982 and 2023. He did his undergraduate work at Lee College and Georgia State University, and earned a M.A. degree at Emory.

**LEADERSHIP:** He has served on the Board of Directors of numerous higher ed organizations, including the Council of Independent Colleges, and chairman of the President's Council of the Southern States Athletic Conference. He served six years as a Commissioner of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, including two years on the Executive Committee of the Commission on Colleges. He has served on the Executive Committee of the Appalachian Colleges Association, on the board of the Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association, and on the national board of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Conn served nine years (2015-2024) on the Board of Commissioners for the Chattanooga Airport Authority.

**PERSONAL:** Conn is married to Darlia McLuhan; together they have three children and ten grandchildren.

## Athletic Director : John Maupin

John Maupin is in his third year as the Lee University Athletic Director. He was named as the Athletic Director in June of 2023 after an outstanding coaching career as the Director of Golf with Lee, including winning the first NCAA D2 National Championship in school history in 2022.

In his first two seasons as the Athletic Director, Maupin saw the Flames and Lady Flames win an unprecedented fourth and fifth straight GSC All Sports Trophy. The Lee 2024-25 athletic teams ranked 28<sup>th</sup> out of over 300 NCAA DII schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup Standings.

Maupin came to Lee in 2008 as the men's golf coach after a decorated playing career with Berry College from 2003-2007. He served as a team captain and was named to the Dean's List in 2007. Maupin was selected to multiple All-Conference and All-Region teams and guided the Vikings to three National Tournament appearances.

As a coach, Maupin led his Flames and Lady Flames to a dominating run of success over his 15 years as head coach. After several conference titles and national tournament appearances in the NAIA, Maupin's teams continued their run of excellence in the NCAA and the Gulf South Conference. The Lady Flames won three GSC titles and made two National Championship appearances while the Flames capped off an amazing 2022 postseason run by winning the NCAA DII National Championship, the first team title in any sport for Lee since joining the NCAA. The Flames won the South Region title in 2021 and are the only program to make three straight appearances in NCAA National Championship Match Play, after a quarterfinal berth this past season.

John and his wife Jayne have three children Addie, Jackson, and Annie. Jayne was a successful collegiate golfer at Berry College. She is currently an Instructional Coach at Ocoee Middle School.

# 2026 COACHING STAFF

## EMILY RUSSELL

Coach Russell enters her 23<sup>rd</sup> year as head coach of the Lady Flames. Her tenure ranks No. 1 on the entire Lee athletic coaching staff. She has proven to be a winner, just like she was as a record-setting pitcher for the Lee University softball team 27 seasons ago. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from Lee, as well as a Master of Arts in Teaching from Lee.

Already the winningest coach in the history of Lee softball, Coach Russell reached a major milestone in her career on April 15, 2023, when the Lady Flames defeated longtime rival Union University 7-0 for her 700<sup>th</sup> win. Her overall record stands at 749 wins against 455 defeats and one tie. She has directed her teams to six seasons of 40 or more wins, two of those with more than 50 wins.

The 2025 team posted a .500 overall season mark (25-25) and 12-20 in rugged GSC play. Coach Russell's total record is at a strong 749-455-1. She is currently the winningest head coach on the Lee staff, just ahead of baseball's Mark Brew who has 734 victories.

The Lady Flames had four hitters post batting averages of over .300 as Russell's club finished the 2024 season with a 20-27 mark and 14-16 in the rugged GSC. The 2023 year saw her team drop several games in the last innings and finish the season at 15-34.

The 2022 club completed the season with a 29-23 record and were 17-12 against rugged Gulf South Conference opponents. The Lady Flames made their deepest run-er in the GSC tournament, falling to Alabama Huntsville in the semifinal round..

The Lady Flames finished the 2021 season with a 17-23 overall mark and 14-16 in GSC play. The 2020 season suddenly ended when the NCAA ordered play halted due to the Covid19 virus. The season closed with the Lady Flames holding a 13-10 overall mark and standing 4-5 in the Gulf South Conference standing.

In 2019 her Lady Flames were forced to battle an unusual number of injuries to key players and finished at 22-31 overall and 10-19 in Gulf South Conference play. During the 2018 year her club posted a 28-28 mark. In 2017, Russell's club ended with a 36-20 mark and advanced all the way to the NCAA South Super Regional before falling to No. 5 and fellow Gulf South Conference member West Florida. It was the first trip to the NCAA Championship stage in program history.

The Lady Flames ended the record-setting season ranked No. 15 in the final NFCA Top 25 poll, marking their first ever NCAA ranking. Lee won the South Region 2 Bracket with three straight victories over GSC rivals. The Lady Flames defeated Alabama Huntsville (7-4) and defending national champion North Alabama twice (4-2, 3-2) to advance on as one of the final 16 teams in the NCAA D2 National Tournament.

In 2015 the Lady Flames finished 36-19 and 18-11 in the Gulf South Conference. Lee won the NCCAA Mid-East Region Tournament and finished third in the NCCAA World Series. For the third straight year Russell coached the national player of the year as Kaylie Drew won the honor (NCCAA) after smashing 18 home runs for the Lady Flames. Russell led the Lady Flames into NCAA Division II and the Gulf South Conference in 2014. Lee finished with a record of 25-24 and had a conference mark of 13-14.

In 2010, Russell's Lady Flames earned a 57-5 record, finishing as the Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) regular season and tournament champions, on their way to a No. 2 NAIA National Ranking. That same year, the Lee ladies also competed in the NAIA National Tournament for the first time since 2007, their sixth trip overall. For their outstanding season, Coach Russell was named the SSAC Coach of the Year. Russell directed the Lady Flames to the SSAC regular season and tournament crowns in 2006, finishing the season with a sparkling record of 55-14. The 2005 Lady Flames finished second in the SSAC regular season, third in the SSAC tournament, and fourth in the NAIA Region XIII Tournament.

In 2004, Coach Russell led her team to the school's first TranSouth Tournament Championship, an NAIA Region XI championship, and the program's third trip to the NAIA National Tournament. For their success, Russell and her staff were named the 2004 NAIA-Softball Coaches Association's Coaching Staff of the Year.

While pitching at Lee, Russell hurled an amazing 305 innings during the 2000 season. She struck out 194 hitters in those 305 innings, at that time a school record. After her playing days for the Lady Flames, she traveled to Europe and pitched professionally for two summers.

The Lee coach makes her home in Cleveland and is married to Sean Russell. The couple has two sons, Tyson, and Carson.

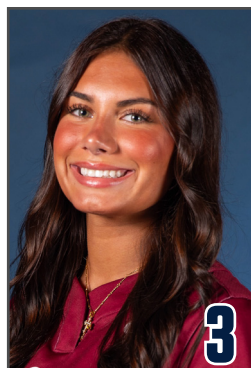

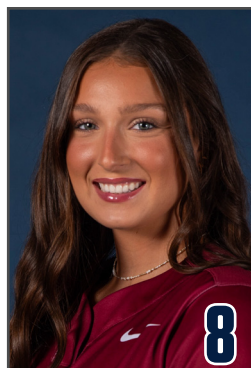

Butler Softball Field was opened in 2004 and is home to Lee's softball team. The complex features seating for 150 fans.

The facility underwent significant renovations in the summer of 2015 with new fencing and irrigation system put in place to make Butler Field one of the premiere venues for softball in the area. Butler Field has two bullpen areas behind the right field and left field lines and a concession stand directly behind home plate for fans to buy merchandise, programs and enjoy food and drinks. The infield was redone by Dura Edge in the fall of 2024.

Fans who want to catch a Lady Flames' home run can camp out in the spacious field beyond the outfield wall and join the enthusiastic student

section known as "The Bomb Squad".

Located at the corner of 18th and Parker streets and in front of the beautiful Bowdle and O'Bannon halls, the park blends in nicely, especially with the always bright green and well-kept outfield grass and the near-perfect infield. Butler Field was the site of the 2007 Southern States Athletic Conference Tournament and was one of ten NAIA Opening Round sites in 2013.

For those who enjoy walking and looking for a break between games, Cliff Schimmels Park is located just across Parker Street and has quickly become a hot spot for Lee students and the general public of Bradley County.

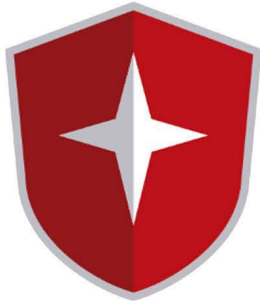

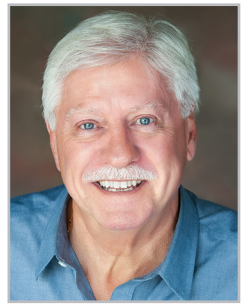

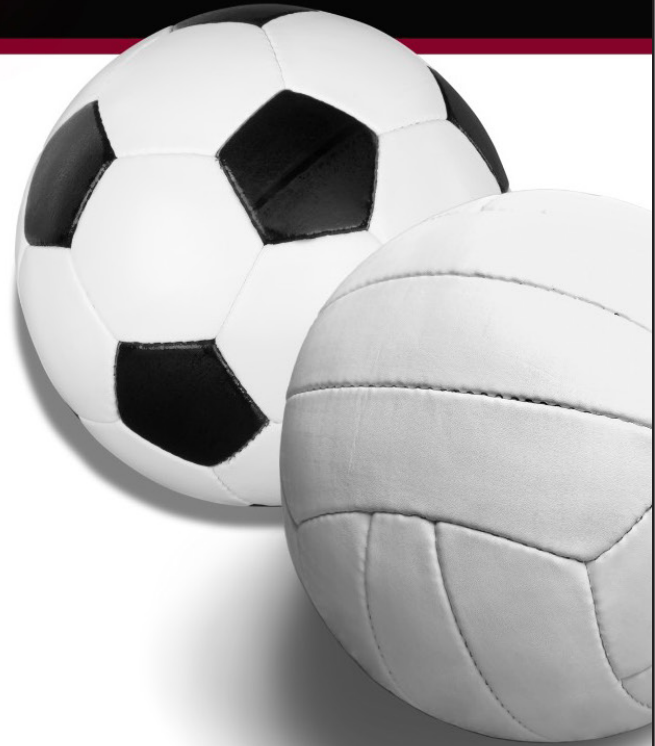
