OUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Lee University President: Dr. Phil Cook



Dr. Phil Cook began his term as the eighteenth president of Lee University on July 1, 2025. Cook brings over 30 years of experience in higher education, most recently serving as President and CEO of the North American Coalition for Christian Admissions Professionals (NACCAP) beginning in 2021.

Of his experience in higher education, the lion's share is with a specific focus on enrollment management, as NACCAP is an association for enrollment professionals, and his prior experience was in service at Lee University in the enrollment sector. From 1997 to 2021 he held every administrative position in the unit from Assistant Director of Admissions to Vice President for Enrollment Management. He led the enrollment team during an extended period of consistent, dramatic growth that revolutionized the university's profile on the landscape of Christian higher education.

During his long stint as a Lee employee, Cook also gained a familiarity with other aspects of university life, as he served as a resident director and as Director of Student Events and also found time to serve as a sponsor of the men's social service club Alpha Gamma Chi, as an instructor in both the School of Religion and the Office of First Year programs, as moderator of Dixon Center chapel services, and even as the public address announcer for Lee University home basketball games. This track record not only speaks of a significant long-term commitment to Lee University, but also an investment into the day-to-day lives of its students.

Cook holds a PhD in higher education administration from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, a Master of Divinity from the Church of God School of Theology, and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Lee.

An ordained bishop in the Church of God, he is married to Tonya Cook, and they have three children and two grandchildren.

Lee University Chancellor: Dr. Charles Paul Conn



Charles Paul Conn remains as chancellor of Lee University after serving as president and chancellor for the past year. Conn served that institution as president for thirty-four years, becoming president in 1986, after fifteen years as a member of the psychology faculty at the same institution. During his administration, the university saw significant growth: enrollment increased from 1000 to over 5000, the physical campus was enlarged substantially, and the school's reputation as a regional leader was firmly established.

EDUCATION: Conn earned the Ph.D. degree in psychology from Emory University in 1974. Subsequently, he has spent three years at Harvard University as a postdoctoral student, studying with Lawrence Kohlberg (1978), David Breneman (1993), Derek Bok (1998), Suarez Orozco (2003), Robert Kegan (2008), and Rick Weissbourd and Nancy Hill (2018). He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard Divinity School in 1982 and 2023. He did his undergraduate work at Lee College and Georgia State University, and earned a M.A. degree at Emory.

LEADERSHIP: He has served on the Board of Directors of numerous higher ed organizations, including the Council of Independent Colleges, and chairman of the President's Council of the Southern States Athletic Conference. He served six years as a Commissioner of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, including two years on the Executive Committee of the Commission on Colleges. He has served on the Executive Committee of the Appalachian Colleges Association, on the board of the Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association, and on the national board of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Conn served nine years (2015-2024) on the Board of Commissioners for the Chattanooga Airport Authority.

PERSONAL: Conn is married to Darlia McLuhan; together they have three children and ten grandchildren.

Athletic Director: John Maupin


John Maupin is in his third year as the Lee University Athletic Director. He was named as the Athletic Director in June of 2023 after an outstanding coaching career as the Director of Golf with Lee, including winning the first NCAA D2 National Championship in school history in 2022.

In his first two seasons as the Athletic Director, Maupin saw the Flames and Lady Flames win an unprecedented fourth and fifth straight GSC All Sports Trophy. The Lee 2024-25 athletic teams ranked 28th out of over 300 NCAA DII schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup Standings.

Maupin came to Lee in 2008 as the men's golf coach after a decorated playing career with Berry College from 2003-2007. He served as a team captain and was named to the Dean's List in 2007. Maupin was selected to multiple All-Conference and All-Region teams and guided the Vikings to three National Tournament appearances.

As a coach, Maupin led his Flames and Lady Flames to a dominating run of success over his 15 years as head coach. After several conference titles and national tournament appearances in the NAIA, Maupin's teams continued their run of excellence in the NCAA and the Gulf South Conference. The Lady Flames won three GSC titles and made two National Championship appearances while the Flames capped off an amazing 2022 postseason run by winning the NCAA DII National Championship, the first team title in any sport for Lee since joining the NCAA. The Flames won the South Region title in 2021 and are the only program to make three straight appearances in NCAA National Championship Match Play, after a quarterfinal berth this past season.

Coach Fabre enters her third year of leading the Lady Flames. She has directed her clubs to two winning seasons and owns an overall record of 36-31 in her first terms as a head coach.

Despite losing one of her top players to a season-ending injury nothing was going to derail the 2024 determined Lady Flames as they reached the semifinal round of the Gulf South Conference Tournament for the first time since 2017 and ended the season with a winning mark of 19-16.

In her first year of directing the Lady Flames, the former Lee NAIA All-American led her club to its first winning record (17-15) since 2018 and the team earned a spot in the Gulf South Conference Tournament.

As a player Coach Fabre was a member of three Lee teams that reached the Final Four of the NAIA National Tournament (2008-2011). The three-time all-conference selection and scholar athlete helped the Lady Flame compile an incredible 140-20 record.



Coach Fabre played under legendary coach Andrea Hudson, who ranked as one of the top coaches in NAIA history before stepping down in 2021 with over 850 wins during her 30-year career.

The Jackson, Tenn., native earned her bachelor's degree in Elementary Education in 2012. After graduating with honors, she joined Adventures in Missions and was a team leader from 2013-2016 where she visited 15 different countries and assembled teams for specific mission work in each country.

Her coaching career began in June of 2016 when she returned home and was named head coach of the University School of Jackson volleyball team. She served in the position for one year before joining the Union University staff.

Coach Fabre served as assistant coach for Gulf South Conference rival Union University from 2017-2022. She worked alongside former head coach, Darrin McClure to transform the Bulldog program into a perennial GSC contender.

Fabre is married to former Lee University baseball player and coach Joe Fabre. The couple reside in the Cleveland area with their three boys, Jett, Boaz and Crew Charles.



CECE BLANCHARD

Coach Blanchard begins her third year as an important part of Head Coach Christa Fabre's team at Lee. The pair directed the 2024 Lady Flames to a 19-16 record. The team earned a spot in the semifinal round of the Gulf South Conference Tournament for the first time since 2013. A year earlier Fabre and Blanchard combined to direct the 2023 to the program's first winning year since 2018 (17-14).

Blanchard served as an assistant coach at the University of Alabama in Huntsville for four seasons. At UAH she began as a volunteer assistant, then in 2020, was promoted and became the assistant coach for the Charger program.

Before her time at UAH, she worked one season as a student assistant at Union University. She was a four-year player

with Union, competing from 2014-17. During her senior season Blanchard played under Coach Fabre, who was the assistant coach at Union at the time. As a standout player, she appeared in 118

matches and played in over 380 sets. The former Bulldog had 720 kills and 280 digs as an outside hitter. She was also a three-time GSC academic honor roll member.

Said Coach Fabre, "Cece has been a huge part of our success as a program over the last two seasons. She is a dynamic coach, finding ways to connect with our athletes and consistently bringing energy into our gym. She has contributed to the recruiting process as well and has brought in some phenomenal athletes that I believe will keep us moving in the right direction. Cece is more than a coach that I work with, she is family. I am so grateful for her work and investment in our program here at Lee!"

A native of Huntsville, Ala., Blanchard graduated from Madison Academy before playing collegiately at Union.

PAUL DANA WALKER ARENA



Paul Dana Walker Arena is home to the men's and women's basketball teams and the volleyball team and has seating for up to 2,000 fans.

The first game in the arena was played on November 3, 1983 and over the years the facility has been the site of many thrilling basketball and volleyball contests.

In 2005, Lee completed a project to upgrade the facilities at Walker Arena and an additional 500 seats were added to the arena's north elevation in the form of a new mezzanine level. Additionally, the lobby was tripled in size to accommodate the growing number of students and fans attending athletic events.

In 2017, 700-plus chair-back seats were added to the lower boxes on each sideline. In the summer of 2023, a brand new hardwood floor was laid down. Two new video boards and LED lights were installed prior to the 2024-25 school year.

Walker Arena was constructed in memory of former Lee basketball player, Paul Dana Walker As he returned home from a Lee College Homecoming game on November 19, 1980, Paul and his wife were involved in a fatal automobile accident. Paul Dana Walker was killed instantly and his wife, Julie, suffered multiple injuries but survived the horrible collision.
