#### **OUR LEADERSHIP TEAM**

#### Lee University President: Dr. Phil Cook



Dr. Phil Cook began his term as the eighteenth president of Lee University on July 1, 2025. Cook brings over 30 years of experience in higher education, most recently serving as President and CEO of the North American Coalition for Christian Admissions Professionals (NACCAP) beginning in 2021.

Of his experience in higher education, the lion's share is with a specific focus on enrollment management, as NACCAP is an association for enrollment professionals, and his prior experience was in service at Lee University in the enrollment sector. From 1997 to 2021 he held every administrative position in the unit from Assistant Director of Admissions to Vice President for Enrollment Management. He led the enrollment team during an extended period of consistent, dramatic growth that revolutionized the university's profile on the landscape of Christian higher education.

During his long stint as a Lee employee, Cook also gained a familiarity with other aspects of university life, as he served as a resident director and as Director of Student Events and also found time to serve as a sponsor of the men's social service club Alpha Gamma Chi, as an instructor in both the School of Religion and the Office of First Year programs, as moderator of Dixon Center chapel services, and even as the public address announcer for Lee University home basketball games. This track record not only speaks of a significant long-term commitment to Lee University, but also an investment into the day-to-day lives of its students.

Cook holds a PhD in higher education administration from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, a Master of Divinity from the Church of God School of Theology, and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Lee.

An ordained bishop in the Church of God, he is married to Tonya Cook, and they have three children and two grandchildren.

#### Lee University Chancellor: Dr. Charles Paul Conn



Charles Paul Conn remains as chancellor of Lee University after serving as president and chancellor for the past year. Conn served that institution as president for thirty-four years, becoming president in 1986, after fifteen years as a member of the psychology faculty at the same institution. During his administration, the university saw significant growth: enrollment increased from 1000 to over 5000, the physical campus was enlarged substantially, and the school's reputation as a regional leader was firmly established.

EDUCATION: Conn earned the Ph.D. degree in psychology from Emory University in 1974. Subsequently, he has spent three years at Harvard University as a postdoctoral student, studying with Lawrence Kohlberg (1978), David Breneman (1993), Derek Bok (1998), Suarez Orozco (2003), Robert Kegan (2008), and Rick Weissbourd and Nancy Hill (2018). He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard Divinity School in 1982 and 2023. He did his undergraduate work at Lee College and Georgia State University, and earned a M.A. degree at Emory.

**LEADERSHIP:** He has served on the Board of Directors of numerous higher ed organizations, including the Council of Independent Colleges, and chairman of the President's Council of the Southern States Athletic Conference. He served six years as a Commissioner of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, including two years on the Executive Committee of the Commission on Colleges. He has served on the Executive Committee of the Appalachian Colleges Association, on the board of the Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association, and on the national board of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Conn served nine years (2015-2024) on the Board of Commissioners for the Chattanooga Airport Authority.

PERSONAL: Conn is married to Darlia McLuhan; together they have three children and ten grandchildren.

#### Athletic Director: John Maupin


John Maupin is in his third year as the Lee University Athletic Director. He was named as the Athletic Director in June of 2023 after an outstanding coaching career as the Director of Golf with Lee, including winning the first NCAA D2 National Championship in school history in 2022.

In his first two seasons as the Athletic Director, Maupin saw the Flames and Lady Flames win an unprecedented fourth and fifth straight GSC All Sports Trophy. The Lee 2024-25 athletic teams ranked 28th out of over 300 NCAA DII schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup Standings.

Maupin came to Lee in 2008 as the men's golf coach after a decorated playing career with Berry College from 2003-2007. He served as a team captain and was named to the Dean's List in 2007. Maupin was selected to multiple All-Conference and All-Region teams and guided the Vikings to three National Tournament appearances.

As a coach, Maupin led his Flames and Lady Flames to a dominating run of success over his 15 years as head coach. After several conference titles and national tournament appearances in the NAIA, Maupin's teams continued their run of excellence in the NCAA and the Gulf South Conference. The Lady Flames won three GSC titles and made two National Championship appearances while the Flames capped off an amazing 2022 postseason run by winning the NCAA DII National Championship, the first team title in any sport for Lee since joining the NCAA. The Flames won the South Region title in 2021 and are the only program to make three straight appearances in NCAA National Championship Match Play, after a quarterfinal berth this past season.

#### **COACHING STAFF**

#### **CALEB MORGAN**

#### DIRECTOR OF MEN'S AND WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY | 13TH SEASON

Caleb Morgan has developed the Lee cross country and track and field teams into one of the nation's best. He begins his 13<sup>th</sup> season as head coach of the cross country programs and will be leading the track and field programs for the 14<sup>th</sup> year.

Before joining the coaching ranks, he enjoyed a tremendous career as a runner for the Flames. Morgan graduated from Lee in the spring of 2011. While at Lee he became the first male to qualify and compete in the NAIA Indoor Track and Field Nationals. He also served as team captain all four years and was a three-time outdoor track national qualifier. He set the school record for the indoor mile, the outdoor 1500m, and the outdoor 800m. His other running achievements include 2012 Tennessee State Half-Marathon Champion (1:14.09) and the 2011 Georgia 10-miler State Champion (53:48).



Morgan is a native of Cleveland, Tenn., and attended Walker Valley High School. He is married to former Lee University runner Kristin Cretton and the couple has three children Luke, Elijah, and Blaise.

During the 2018-2019 school year, Lee became the first program in the GSC history to sweep men's and women's cross country and track titles (all six championships in the same year). In 2014 during Morgan's second year as head coach, he directed the men's cross country program to an unofficial GSC title and an NCCAA National Championship.

**MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY:** The men's cross country team has won seven GSC Championships and six South Region Championships. Lee won four-straight GSC titles from 2015-2018 and three more from 2022 to 2024. They also recorded back-to-back South Region titles in 2016 and 2017; and are the four-time defending Region Champions heading into the 2025 season. During postseason probationary period while transitioning to the NCAA the Flames won the 2014 NCCAA National Championship. Lee has advanced to the NCAA DII Nationals the last nine seasons (no championship held in 2020) and posted its highest finish of 14th place in 2023.

**COACHING AWARDS:** 2014 NCCAA Coach the Yea; GSC Coach of the Year 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2022, 2023 and 2024; South Region Coach of the Year 2016, 2017, 2021, 2022 and 2024; and GSC Coach of the Decade (2010-2019).

#### **WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY:**

Morgan has directed the Lee women's cross country team to eight consecutive Gulf South Conference Championships (2017-2024), as well as South Region Championships in 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. The women's cross country team has advanced to nationals (top 32 teams) the last eight seasons (no championship held in 2020) with their highest national championship finish being eighth in 2021.

**COACHING AWARDS:** GSC Coach of the Year 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024; South Region Coach of the Year 2019, 2022, 2023 and 2024; and GSC Coach of the Decade (2010-2019).



### TONI CARDENAS ASSISTANT COACH | 4<sup>TH</sup> SEASON

Toni Cardenas is in her fourth year as an Assistant Coach for the men's and women's cross country and track and field programs. She was voted the USTFCCCA South Region Women's Assistant Coach of the Year following the 2024 Outdoor season.

She was a three-year member of the Lady Flames cross country and track & field squads. In cross country, she earned NCAA First Team All-American and All-South Region honors in 2021. Cardenas was All-GSC First Team all three years at Lee and added another All-South Region award in 2019.

On the track, she was an NCAA All-American, All-South Region and All-GSC First Team in the 2021 Indoor and Outdoor seasons. In 2020, Cardenas earned All-South Region and All-GSC Second Team during the Indoor season.

Cardenas made her way to Lee from Omagh, Northern Ireland. She now lives in Cleveland with her husband Brandon.
