SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh will play its first Football Bowl Subdivision opponent in 15 years as the Mountain Hawks head to Annapolis, Maryland to face Navy. The Mountain Hawks will be looking to bounce back from their first loss of the season last weekend against Villanova. Lehigh's defense did its best to keep the Mountain Hawks in the game, but the Villanova defense limited Lehigh to less than 200 yards of total offense and nine points. The Mountain Hawks' improved defense will be tested by Navy's triple option attack as the Midshipmen regularly rank among the nation's top rushing teams. Navy used a fourth quarter rally to top Memphis 22-21 in its home and conference opener last weekend.

KEY STATS

- Lehigh ranks seventh in the FCS averaging 10.0 tackles for loss per game.
- Running back Dominick Bragalone became Lehigh's all-time leading rusher against Saint Francis. He is tied for Lehigh's career rushing touchdown record and is two touchdowns and 18 points shy of Lehigh career records in those categories.
- Lehigh's 176 yards of total offense versus Villanova were its fewest since gaining just 129 in a loss at New Hampshire in 2010.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN

Andy Coen is in his 13th season as the head coach of the Lehigh football program. He holds a career record of 83-57 and now ranks second in school history in career victories. In 12-plus years as the Mountain Hawks leader, Coen has produced 131 All-Patriot League honorees, 25 All-Americans and 236 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll selections. Coen has now led Lehigh to five Patriot League Championships in 12 seasons. Coen is a two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year (2010 and 2016) and is a three-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, finishing as high as sixth in 2011. *(Coach Coen's complete bio can be found on page 14)*

NAVY HEAD COACH KEN NIUMATALOLO

Ken Niumatalolo is in his 11th season as head coach at Navy. The all-time winningest coach in school history, Niumatalolo owns a 85-49 career record. He led Navy to a school-record 11 wins in 2015 and won his first eight games against Army. Niumatalolo has won five bowl games and has led Navy to five Commander-in-Chief's trophies. A 1989 graduate of the University of Hawai'i, Niumatalolo has spent the last 20 years on the coaching staff at Navy.

THE SERIES

Lehigh and Navy are meeting for the 22nd time, and the first time since 1987. Navy leads the all-time series 14-6-1, but it was Lehigh who won the most recent meeting 24-9 in 1987. These programs met 17 times between 1889 and 1913 and then rekindled the series with four games in a five season span (1983, 1984, 1986 and 1987).

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (9/19/87) - Lee Blum rushed for 125 yards and threw a touchdown pass to lead Lehigh over Navy 24-9 on homecoming in Annapolis. The win was Lehigh's sixth over the Midshipmen (and first since 1912) and broke a four-game losing streak against Navy. It was also Lehigh's first win over a Division I-A team since a 13-12 win over Army in 1983. Blum rushed for 125 yards on 28 carries, caught two passes for 27 yards and returned a punt for eight yards. His touchdown pass, a 16-yarder to John Gorman for Lehigh's second touchdown, was the first pass of his career. Mark McGowan completed 16-of-25 passing attempts for 192 yards and two touchdowns. Rich Curtis collected a nine-yard McGowan pass in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. Clifton Hubbard led the defense with 15 tackles, while Don Ferrell added 10. Lehigh led 17-2 at the half before both teams scored touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

BACK TO THE OLD LINE STATE

Saturday's game will mark a homecoming for three Mountain Hawks. Senior defensive back **Kareem Montgomery (Baltimore/McDonogh)**, senior defensive lineman **Julian Lynn (Ijamsville/Oakdale)** and junior offensive lineman Nick Rosen (**Ellicott City/Marriotts Ridge**) are Maryland natives.

BRAGALONE'S RECORD-SETTING DAY

Lehigh's season-opener was a memorable one for senior running back Dom Bragalone, who set one school record and tied another in the Mountain Hawks' win over Saint Francis. Bragalone carried 29 times for 137 yards and three touchdowns against the Red Flash. His 28th carry, a 10-yard rush in the fourth quarter, gave him Lehigh's career rushing record, passing the mark of 3,696 previously held by Rabih Abdullah '97. The three rushing touchdowns give Bragalone 42 for his career, tying Rod Gardner '77 for that school record. Bragalone won his fifth career Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week award on Sept. 3. His string of 100-plus yard regular season games ended at eight after leaving the Villanova game in the first quarter.

COEN CLIMBING THE LADDER

Lehigh head coach Andy Coen is now two wins shy of Bill Leckonby's school record for career coaching wins in football. Leckonby led Lehigh to 85 victories from 1946-1961. Coen took over second place late in the 2016 season, passing the legendary John Whitehead, head coach of the 1977 national championship team.

WELCOME BACK

Lehigh returns just three of the nine players named to last season's All-Patriot League teams, led by All-America running back Dominick Bragalone, who was Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year last season and is also the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year in 2018. A three-time first team All-Patriot League selection, Bragalone joins quarterback Brad Mayes and kicker/punter Ed Mish as returning All-Patriot League selections from 2017. Mayes joined Bragalone on the preseason all-league team announced in late July along with sophomore offensive lineman Chris Fournier.

RUSHING TO VICTORY

In 12-plus seasons under Andy Coen Lehigh has had trouble winning games when it rushes for fewer than 100 yards. The Mountain Hawks have failed to reach the century mark 41 times under Coen and are 14-27 in those games. When Lehigh has surpassed 100 yards during that time, it is 69-30. Lehigh eclipsed the 100 yard mark in nine of 12 games last year and has gained more than 150 yards on the ground in 32 of 56 games dating back to the start of the 2013 season.

FROM COAST TO COAST

The Lehigh coaching staff prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 16 states (plus Canada) are represented on the Mountain Hawks roster, including California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Montana, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Ontario, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia. The state with the most representation is New Jersey, as 23 Mountain Hawks hail from the Garden State.

PENNSYLVANIA PROUD

The Mountain Hawks' roster features 19 student-athletes from the state of Pennsylvania including four who played high school football in the East Penn Conference (formerly Lehigh Valley Conference) or Colonial League. Lehigh's local contingent consists of senior running back **Jake Buskirk (Whitehall/Whitehall)**, senior wide receiver **Cam Richardson (Fogelsville/Northwestern Lehigh)**, freshman kicker **Tucker Eighmy (Bethlehem/Notre Dame Green Pond)** and freshman defensive back **T.J. Rakowsky (Erwinna/Palisades)**.

LAST TIME OUT

LEHIGH VS. No. 12/11 VILLANOVA

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (9/8/18) - Lehigh's defense held its own throughout most of day against No. 12/11 Villanova but an uncharacteristically tough day for the Mountain Hawks' offense resulted in a 31-9 Wildcats win on Fan and Alumni Appreciation Day at Goodman Stadium.

Senior Ed Mish gave Lehigh the early lead with a 21-yard field goal in the first quarter before the Wildcats reeled off 31 straight points. The Mountain Hawks scored their lone touchdown on a 26-yard pass from senior Brad Mayes to junior Devon Bibbens with 5:12 to play.

Villanova ran 74 total plays for 405 yards of total offense, while the Wildcats, fresh off a win over FBS member Temple last week, limited Lehigh to just 176. The Wildcats (2-0) held a 33:56-26:04 advantage in time of possession.

Lehigh (1-1) battled defensively, racking up four sacks and 10 more tackles for loss, but fell victim to a couple big plays.

Senior linebacker Mark Walker led the Mountain Hawks with 11 tackles, including a sack and three tackles for loss. Safety Sam McCloskey added eight tackles and three pass breakups.

Mayes completed 18-of-35 passes for 144 yards and a touchdown on Saturday. Behind a strong second half, Bibbens hauled in five passes for 73 yards and the Lehigh touchdown. Senior Conner Bianchini added four receptions for 22 yards.

Lehigh mustered just 32 yards on the ground, with Dom Bragalone limited to 18 on seven rushes and freshman Rashawn Allen carrying nine times for 24 yards.

Villanova's Zach Bednarczyk completed 16-of-29 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns, along with the one interception. Jarrett McClenton caught six for 114 and two scores, while Jalen Jackson was the top rusher with 69 yards on 12 carries.

DEFENSE DOING ITS PART

In recent years, the Mountain Hawks have been carried by a high-powered offense that ranked among the best in the FCS. This season, Lehigh's offense has started slowly, but through two games the defense has shown improvement. Lehigh allowed an average of 41 points and 477.7 yards of offense per game last season, but through two games has allowed 25 points and 352.5 yards per game. The Mountain Hawks have totaled 20 tackles for loss, five sacks and two interceptions through two games. Lehigh has also been much improved in third down defense, allowing opponents to convert at 28 percent, after allowing 37.5 percent last season. Senior safety Sam McCloskey, senior linebacker Mark Walker and sophomore rover Divine Buckrham are tied for the team lead with 15 tackles.

PREPARING FOR THE TRIPLE OPTION

Lehigh's rush defense has been one of the primary areas of improvement through two games this season, but that unit will be tested by Navy's hard-to-prepare-for triple option attack. The Mountain Hawks ranked near the bottom of the FCS last season, allowing 242.3 yards per game on the ground. Lehigh has allowed 248 total rushing yards in two games, highlighted by limiting Saint Francis to just 58 rushing yards, its fewest allowed since yielding 55 in a Patriot League win at Bucknell in 2015. Navy has rushed for an average of 295 yards per game through two games this season.

TOTAL DOMINATION

Running back Dominick Bragalone returns for his senior season after establishing himself as one of the top offensive players in the FCS last year. Bragalone was the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and a consensus first team All-American after leading the FCS with 1,388 rushing yards, 18 rushing touchdowns and 22 total touchdowns, while averaging a FCS-best 12 points per game. The South Williamsport, Pa. product became the first Lehigh runner to post three 1,000-yard rushing seasons in his career. Bragalone ran for 100-plus yards in Lehigh's final seven regular season games in 2017, highlighted by a career-high 218-yard effort at Fordham and a 201-yard, four-touchdown game against Holy Cross; Lehigh's first individual 200-yard rushing games since 2003. Bragalone became Lehigh's career rushing leader and tied the career rushing touchdown record against Saint Francis. He is now two total touchdowns and 18 points shy of Lehigh's career records in those categories. Bragalone finished seventh in the balloting for last year's Walter Payton Award and appears on the preseason watch list for this year's award.

GOOD DAYS FOR MAYES

Senior quarterback Brad Mayes had a big 2017 in his first season as Lehigh's full-time starter. Mayes completed 64 percent of his passes for 3,886 yards and 31 touchdowns, posting the second highest single-season totals in school history for those last two categories. Mayes ranked in the top seven among FCS passers for passing yards, passing yards per game and touchdown passes. A first-team All-Patriot League selection, Mayes was a two-time league Offensive Player of the Week last season, including the final week of the regular season when he was named MVP of the Lehigh-Lafayette game after throwing for 333 yards and three touchdowns in Lehigh's come-from-behind victory. Mayes set Lehigh's single-game passing mark with 524 yards at Yale as a sophomore. The Tampa native joins Bragalone on the preseason watch list for the Walter Payton Award. Mayes completed 76 percent of his passes against Saint Francis, but has thrown for just 267 yards in two games this season.

A STEP UP IN COMPETITION

Saturday's game with Navy will mark Lehigh's first against the Midshipmen since 1987 and its first game against a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision since 2003. The introduction of merit-based financial aid (scholarships) for Patriot League football prior to the 2013 season has expanded the opportunities for league schools to play up against FCS competition. Since the split of Division I to I-A and I-AA (now FBS and FCS) in 1978, Lehigh is 3-5-1 against FBS opponents (not counting games against the Ivy League, which didn't officially drop down to the FCS until 1982). This will be Lehigh's 10th game against a FBS opponent with eight of the 10 coming against Army or Navy, which compete in the Patriot League with Lehigh in most other sports.

THROWN FOR A LOSS

Lehigh's early season defensive performance has been highlighted by an ability to make stops in the opponents' backfield. The Mountain Hawks had 10 tackles for loss in each of their first two games. Coming into this season, Lehigh had 10 or more tackles for loss just twice since the start of the 2013 season. Lehigh had 11 tackles for loss in wins against Georgetown in 2015 and Holy Cross in 2016. Junior Colin Nace leads Lehigh with 4.5 tackles for loss, while senior Mark Walker has four and sophomore Jack Kircher has three.

A FIFTH YEAR FOR KELSEY

Lehigh's roster regularly features student-athletes who earned fifth years of eligibility due to medical hardships. The Mountain Hawks had three last year but have just one this season in wide receiver Sasha Kelsey, who lost his third season due to an injury. Kelsey has seven catches for 55 yards in two games, ranking second on the Mountain Hawks in receptions.

WORKING OVERTIME

The Mountain Hawks have played 11 overtime games since overtime rules were established prior to the 1995 season. Lehigh is 7-4 in overtime games, with its most recent overtime game being the double overtime come-from-behind triumph versus Central Connecticut State in the 2013 season-opener.

TURNING THE TIDES ON TURNOVERS

Creating more turnovers defensively has been a major area of focus for the Mountain Hawks in recent years. Lehigh had a plus-9 turnover margin with 21 takeaways in 2016 but had negative turnover margins with just 13 takeaways in 2014, 2015 and 2017. The Mountain Hawks won the turnover battle in just three games last season, but all three were key league wins (Colgate, Bucknell, Holy Cross). Lehigh is minus-2 through two games with four giveaways and interceptions by senior Donavon Harris and junior Keith Woetzel.

THE GUYS UP FRONT

A cohesive, veteran offensive line contributed to Lehigh's offensive success over the last three seasons. That line was led by a trio of three-year starters, all of who were multi-time All-Patriot League selections, in tackles Tim O'Hara and Zach Duffy and center Brandon Short. Lehigh did a little more shuffling last year, using six different combinations over 12 games, with Chris Fournier and Jackson Evans earning starts as freshmen, becoming the first Lehigh freshmen to start on the offensive line for the Mountain Hawks since Will Rackley in 2007. Fournier and Evans will play major roles in replacing the three veterans in 2018, with Fournier moving to left tackle and Evans sliding in at center. Junior Nick Rosen and senior Liborio Ricottilli return as starters at guard. Freshman Justin Gurth has started Lehigh's first two games at right tackle, while senior Tim Wagner has started twice at center for an injured Evans.

JUST FOR KICKS

After earning first team All-Patriot League honors as a kicker and punter as a sophomore, injuries limited Ed Mish at times in both capacities last season. Now healthy, Mish looks to regain the form that saw him go 62-for-62 on extra points (a school record for PATs made) as a sophomore, while averaging 43 yards per punt. Mish became Lehigh's career leader in extra points last season and earned second team All-Patriot League honors as a kicker. Mish eclipsed the 200 point mark against Saint Francis and currently sits 20 points behind Erik Bird's career record for kick scoring at Lehigh. Mish currently holds Lehigh's career record for net punting average at just under 42 yards per punt.

NEW LOOK RECEIVING CORPS

Over the previous two seasons, Troy Pelletier and Gatlin Casey proved to be one of the top receiving tandems in the FCS. Pelletier set a number of Lehigh and Patriot League records as a four-year contributor, while Casey added 1,989 receiving yards and 26 touchdowns over his final two seasons. Those departures will create opportunities for other receivers to emerge. Five receivers have at least four receptions through two games, led by senior Luke Christiano, who has 10 catches for 75 yards. Junior Devon Bibbens led Lehigh with five catches for 73 yards and a touchdown versus Villanova.

A FRESH START

Lehigh has added 21 first-year student-athletes to its 2018 roster, including several who could contribute right away. Five freshmen appear on Lehigh's depth chart (page 11), and five have seen action in Lehigh's first two games, including Justin Gurth, who has started both at right tackle. Rashawn Allen and Alex Snyder saw time at running back and tight end, respectively, while Austin Dambach and T.J. Rakowsky appeared on special teams. Gurth is the third Lehigh freshman to start on the offensive line in the last two seasons after the Mountain Hawks had not started a freshman on the line since eventual All-American and NFL draft pick Will Rackley in 2007.

KEY RETURNERS IN THE SECONDARY

The secondary was expected to be an area of strength for Lehigh heading into the 2017 season, but key contributors Donavon Harris and Sam McCloskey were both lost to season-ending injuries by mid-September. Both players are back for their fourth seasons and both were named team captains. In their absences last year, then-sophomore Marquis Wilson and then-freshmen Divine Buckrham gained valuable experience. All five starters in the secondary have made early season contributions. McCloskey and Buckrham are tied for the team lead in tackles, junior Riley O'Neil had eight tackles and two tackles for loss versus SFU, Harris picked off a pass versus Saint Francis and Wilson intercepted the Red Flash's game-tying two-point conversion attempt early in the fourth quarter.

NO PASSING, NO PROBLEM

Lehigh has had one of the top passing offenses in the FCS over the last few seasons but the Mountain Hawks did not need a big passing day to beat Saint Francis. Quarterbacks Brad Mayes and Tyler Monaco completed 74 percent of their passes but gained just 181 yards, with no touchdown passes as Lehigh's offense came from three Dom Bragalone touchdown runs. Since the start of the 2013 season, Lehigh had won just three previous games in which it has passed for less than 200 yards (Holy Cross and Colgate 2013 and at Bucknell in 2017) and had won just twice without throwing a touchdown pass (at Cornell in 2014, Holy Cross in 2017).

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Following the 2017 season, Lehigh placed 17 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll. Fourteen of those 17 selections are back this season, including senior Harrison Kauffman, who earned Academic All-Patriot League honors and CoSIDA Academic All-District honors last season. Kauffman owns a 3.45 GPA in finance. Sophomore Zac Troxell leads the Mountain Hawks with a 3.79 GPA in business. Senior Brian Olshanski, junior Alex Motley and sophomore Pete Haffner are all cumulatively over 3.60.

SCOUTING NAVY

Navy is 1-1 on the season. The Midshipmen dropped their opener at Hawai'i on Sept. 1 but used a fourth quarter rally to beat Memphis 22-21 in their home and American Athletic Conference opener last week. Navy was picked third in the AAC's West Division following a 7-6 season in 2017 that was capped by a 49-7 win in the Military Bowl. Quarterback Malcolm Perry has taken the reins of Navy's option attack and leads the Mids with 274 rushing yards and three touchdowns through two games. Zach Abey, a one-time starting quarterback, who is now working as a receiver, has five rushing touchdowns through two games. Fullback Anthony Gargiulo and safety Sean Williams serve as Navy's captains. Williams leads the Mids with 14 tackles and two forced fumbles this season.

Running back **Dom Bragalone (South Williamsport, Pa.)**, defensive lineman **Harrison Kauffman (Kalispell, Mont.)** and defensive backs **Donavon Harris (Burlington, Twp., N.J.)** and **Sam McCloskey (Altoona, Pa.)** will lead this year's squad. McCloskey will serve as a captain for the second consecutive season.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

Lehigh was picked second in the Patriot League preseason poll, announced in late July. The Mountain Hawks garnered 63 points and 3-of-14 first-place votes in the poll of the league's head coaches and SIDs. Colgate, which shared last year's league title with Lehigh, was picked first with the remaining 11 first-place votes. Lehigh tied for third place in the preseason of its 2016 championship season and was picked first last year.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN



A fiery and passionate leader with a unique ability to motivate and inspire today's student-athletes, Andy Coen is in his 13th year as Lehigh's head football coach. During his time as the Mountain Hawks leader, Coen has produced 131 All-Patriot League honorees, 25 All-America se-

lections and 236 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll student-athletes.

A two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year, Coen has guided Lehigh to five Patriot League titles in 12 seasons in Bethlehem, including back-to-back titles in 2016 and 2017. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award on three occasions, finishing seventh in 2010, sixth in 2011 and 11th in 2016.

In 12 seasons, Coen has amassed an overall record of 82-56 (.594) and a 52-20 (.722) mark against Patriot League foes. Coen sits in second place on Lehigh's career coaching wins list and enters 2018 three wins behind Bill Leckonby for the top spot.

A second-half surge powered the Mountain Hawks to their 12th Patriot League title in 2017. Lehigh rebounded from an 0-5 start to go 5-1 in Patriot League play with Coen's Mountain Hawks claiming the championship with a come-from-behind 38-31 win over Lafayette in the regular season finale. Lehigh once again boasted one of the top offenses in the FCS, as the Mountain Hawks ranked in the top 10 in scoring, passing and total yardage.

The Mountain Hawks were led by junior running back Dominick Bragalone, who earned consensus All-America honors after leading the FCS in rushing and scoring. Bragalone was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, as was record-setting wide receiver Troy Pelletier, who became a four-time All-Patriot League selection and a two-time All-American.

Off the field, defensive linemen Jimmy Mitchell and Harrison Kauffman were CoSIDA Academic All-District selections and Academic All-Patriot League honorees.

Coen led the Mountain Hawks to their 11th Patriot League title in 2016. After an 0-2 start, Lehigh reeled off nine consecutive victories, capped by a 45-21 win over rival Lafayette to cap an undefeated Patriot League season. Coen was named Patriot League Coach of the Year for the second time.

Thirteen players garnered All-Patriot League honors, led by quarterback Nick Shafnisky who was the league and ECAC Offensive Player of the Year. Wide receiver Troy Pelletier went on to earn the first All-America honors for a Lehigh football student-athlete since 2013.

Offensive lineman Micah Tennant and nose guard Jimmy Mitchell garnered Academic All-Patriot League honors, with Tennant also earning first team Academic All-America honors.

Lehigh finished 2015 with a 4-2 league mark. A 49-35 win over rival Lafayette, Lehigh's sixth in the last eight years over the Leopards clinched a winning campaign at 6-5. A balanced offensive attack kept Lehigh in every game with quarterback Nick Shafnisky leading the Patriot League's top-ranked offense. Freshman

tailback Dominick Bragalone became the first Lehigh freshman to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season and was named Patriot League and ECAC Rookie of the Year as well as being named a finalist for the FCS Freshman Player of the Year award.

Eight Mountain Hawks garnered All-Patriot League honors in 2015 with sophomore wide receiver Troy Pelletier and junior linebacker Colton Caslow recognized for the second time.

Seniors Cody Kondas and Chris Ruhl earned Academic All-League recognition. Ruhl was also a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

Coen coached five All-Patriot League performers in 2014 including three-time All-League offensive tackle Ned Daryoush and punter Austin Devine. Pelletier was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given to the nation's top freshman.

The Mountain Hawks posted their fourth consecutive winning season in 2013 with an 8-3 mark. Coen mentored nine All-Patriot League selections including wide receiver Lee Kurfis, who led the FCS in receiving yards per game and earned All-America honors.

Under Coen's guidance, Lehigh posted its third consecutive ten win season in 2012. Lehigh posted its fifth straight win over Lafayette and finished in the top 20 of both national polls for the third straight season.

Coen coached 11 student-athletes to All-Patriot League honors, with a trio of seniors recognized as ECAC All-Stars. Seniors Zach Barket and Ryan Spadola were CoSIDA Academic All-District selections, while Barket became Coen's first Academic All-American.

In 2011, Coen guided the Mountain Hawks to their best season in a decade, one that featured an 11-2 overall record, a 5-0 Patriot League record and Lehigh's tenth football championship. The Mountain Hawks won 10 straight games, including a 40-38 win at Towson in the second round of the NCAA playoffs. Lehigh finished in the top six in both polls and captured its eighth Lambert Cup en route to being named ECAC FCS Team of the Year.

With quarterback Chris Lum leading the way, Lehigh ranked among the top five nationally in passing offense and scoring offense. Lum finished second in the voting for the Walter Payton Award.

Five Mountain Hawks garnered All-America recognition, led by Lum and Spadola. Academically, Spadola and Barket were Academic All-District selections.

The 2010 season saw Coen guide the Mountain Hawks to their ninth league championship and Lehigh's first outright league title since 2001. The Mountain Hawks won ten games for the first time since 2001 and posted the first undefeated Patriot League season in seven years.

Lehigh qualified for the NCAA playoffs for the first time since 2004 and went on the road to defeat Northern Iowa 14-7 for the Patriot League's first playoff win in seven years, while finishing the season ranked 14th nationally. For his team's success, Coen was named Patriot League Coach of the Year.

Eighteen players were named to All-Patriot League teams, while four players earned All-America honors, including offensive lineman Will Rackley '11 who was Lehigh's first Associated Press first team All-America since 2004 and was drafted by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the third round of the NFL Draft.

The 2009 Mountain Hawks led the nation in sacks with 39. Linebacker Matt Cohen '10 became the first player during Coen's tenure to earn a major award from the Patriot League as he garnered Defensive Player of the Year accolades. Cohen went on to earn All-America laurels from four different outlets while Rackley was honored by one.

During the 2008 season, Coen led Lehigh to a 4-2 Patriot League mark, which included a 31-15 victory

over archrival Lafayette. Nine players earned spots on the All-Patriot League teams, while four student-athletes garnered All-America accolades. Off the field, 12 Mountain Hawks were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll, led by Brendan Van Ackeren '09 who was also named Academic All-District.

In 2007, Lehigh ranked second in the Patriot League in scoring defense (21.1 ppg) and scored 30 or more points on four occasions, including a 45-0 shutout win over Georgetown - the program's first shutout victory since 2002. Coen coached 10 All-Patriot League selections and six All-Americans; marking the first time since 2004 Lehigh produced an All-American.

Coen led the Mountain Hawks to a share of the Patriot League Championship in his first-ever season as a head coach in 2006. The Mountain Hawks boasted a balanced attack on both sides of the ball, topping the Patriot League in scoring offense (27.2 ppg) and defense (20.2 ppg). The New Jersey native mentored 14 All-Patriot League selections.

Coen became the 28th head football coach in Lehigh history on January 3, 2006. That announcement marked his return to Lehigh, where he spent six seasons as an offensive line coach - including four as the team's offensive coordinator.

Coen returned to Lehigh from Penn, where he spent six years as the offensive coordinator with the Quakers. In his six seasons in Philadelphia, the Quakers captured three Ivy League titles, including a top ten national finish in 2003.

In his first stop at Lehigh (1994-99), Coen was a part of three Patriot League championship teams, including the 12-1 1998 squad. That team set a school mark for the most wins in a season, while reaching the NCAA Division I-AA quarterfinals.

Coen produced ten All-Patriot League offensive linemen at Lehigh, while his teams twice finished in the national top ten in passing offense (1996, 1998). During Coen's tenure as coordinator, Lehigh produced four consecutive 1,000-yard rushers, including Rabih Abdullah '97, who remains Lehigh's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,696). Abdullah later went on to become the first Lehigh player to win a Super Bowl as a member of the 2004 New England Patriots.

Before his original stint at Lehigh, Coen spent coached at the United States Merchant Marine Academy and also worked as a graduate assistant at Minnesota and James Madison.

A native of Cherry Hill, N.J., Coen earned his bachelors in history from Gettysburg College in 1986.

Coen and his wife Laura have three children: a daughter, Molly and two sons, Nolan and Finn.
