



## 2020-2021 ACADEMIC/ATHLETIC ACHIEVEMENTS

*...made possible by the support of alumni, parents & friends*

- All 25 teams had GPA's of 3.0 or higher in the spring.
- 485 student-athletes (75.43%) had a GPA of 3.0 or higher in the spring.
- 51 student-athletes (9.93%) earned a 4.0 GPA in the spring.
- Two programs won Patriot League/EIWA Championships.
- Wrestling won its fourth consecutive EIWA championship and 38th overall.
- Women's Basketball won its fourth Patriot League Tournament championship and first since 2010.
- Men's Lacrosse earned the Patriot League's automatic bid to the NCAA Championships, its first since 2013 and had the best regular season record in the league.
- Three programs (Women's Lacrosse, Softball and Baseball) finished second within the Patriot League.
- Four individuals won individual EIWA titles (Jaret Lane, Malyke Hines, Jake Jakobsen, Jordan Wood).
- Jordan Wood '21 became the fifth Lehigh wrestler to win four EIWA titles. He was the 13th EIWA wrestler to accomplish the feat and the first heavyweight to do so.
- All 10 Lehigh Wrestling EIWA Tournament entrants qualified for the NCAA Championships.
- Lehigh student-athletes won seven Patriot League major postseason awards and one EIWA major postseason award.
- Four Lehigh coaches were recognized as Patriot League/EIWA Coaches of the Year: Pat Santoro (Wrestling), Jill Redfern (Women's Lacrosse), Kevin Cassese (Men's Lacrosse) and Sean Leary (Baseball).
- Four student-athletes were recognized as All-Americans. Mike Sisselberger '22 from Men's Lacrosse was a consensus first-team All-American. Sondra Dickey '20 from Women's Lacrosse was a third-team All-American. James Spence '21 and Anthony Tangredi '22 from Men's Lacrosse were recognized as honorable mention All-Americans.
- Carley Barjaktarovich '22 from Softball was named Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for Softball and was the league's Defensive Player of the Year.
- Conor Gaffney '20 from Men's Lacrosse was recognized as Lehigh Athletics' Graduating Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Gaffney is a two-time Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a two-time Academic All-American (2021 results pending).
- Twenty-seven student-athletes selected to Academic All-Patriot League teams.
- Record of 19-9 against Lafayette in all sports.

The Lehigh Athletics Partnership is pleased to host its annual Golf Classic at Saucon Valley Country Club for what is about to be its 36th year. Originally the idea of Keith Rust '57 and Joe Workman '53 back in 1985, this elite golf event has been enjoyed by Lehigh alumni, family members, and friends ever since.

It has been very gracious of Saucon Valley Country Club to welcome our community so warmly. Saucon Valley is an exclusive club whose members enjoy one of the finest golf complexes in the country. In previous years we have played on Saucon Valley's Old Course. The Old Course has been the host site of seven USGA national championships: the 1951 U.S. Amateur, the 1983 U.S. Junior Amateur, the 1987 U.S. Senior Amateur, two U.S. Senior Opens, 1992 and 2000, and the 2009 U.S. Women's Open. The club is set to host the 2022 Senior Open as well.

This year we will play on the second oldest course at Saucon, the Grace Course. Construction on the Grace Course began in 1951, and this 18-hole course was completed in 1957. It was named in honor of Mr. Eugene Gifford Grace, Honorary Chairman of the Board at Saucon, who was long regarded as the Club patriarch. Designed by the father-and-son team of William and David Gordon, the Grace Course was superbly conceived and is significantly different from the Old Course. The Grace Course traverses the gently rolling terrain that was once a working farm, and is always in superior condition.
