For the fourth straight game, the Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Lacrosse Team will play on a Saturday. The Bears were scheduled to play their first mid-week game this week but Wednesday's matchup at Anderson was postponed due to COVID-19 protocols.

DROPPING DIMES

For the first time in a span of 25 months, the Bears handed out 12 assists in a game. Against Limestone, Lenoir-Rhyne dished out 12 helpers which hasn't happened since an April 6, 2019 game at Lincoln Memorial that saw the Bears defeat the Railsplitters 17-5.

TOP-15 CLASHES GO TO LR

Lenoir-Rhyne has played two of the top teams in the region and the nation and came away victorious in both contests. The Bears have earned back-to-back wins over No. 13 Belmont Abbey and No. 12 Limestone by a combined score of 30-18 in those two contests. Lenoir-Rhyne now owns 16 all-time wins against ranked opponents and have won three straight against ranked foes.

MOFFAT JOINS 100-POINT CLUB

With his six-point effort against Limestone, junior Myles Moffat became just the seventh player in program history to reach 100 career points. In just 29 career games, Moffat has 58 goals and 42 assists.

Moffat joins teammate Eric Dickinson in the 100-point club and is now seventh in program history with his 42 assists.

BIOGRAPHY

Greg Paradine started the Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Lacrosse program and has been the only coach in program history after his hiring in 2009. Paradine, a graduate and all-american at the University of North Carolina, has brought LR to unmatched heights during his tenure.

Paradine was named the 2018 USILA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading the Bears within one goal of advancing to the National Championship. Paradine has guided the Bears to four South Atlantic Conference Regular Season Championships, one SAC Tournament title and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. He owns a 91-58 all-time record and is a four-time South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year.

Paradine's Bears won 24 straight SAC regular season games, going three straight seasons with a perfect 8-0 league mark. The Bears have been nationally ranked 58 times, including being as

high as No. 3 in the nation and had a 27-week stretch of being ranked in the top 10. Paradine engineered two wins over Limestone when the Saints were ranked No. 1 in the nation, including an 18-16 win in 2020 which was nationally broadcast on the Lacrosse Sports Network.

In his tenure, 43 players have been selected to the All-Conference squad and eight have been All-Americans. He had two players win SAC Player of the Year accolades and two others be named SAC Freshman of the Year. Academically, Paradine has had two players win SAC Scholar-Athletes of the Year awards and one be named the SAC Elite 20 Award Winner.

Paradine came to LR after serving as an assistant coach for seven years at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina. He was a four-year member of the Tar Heels lac team and played on four ACC Championship teams and played won a National Championship in 1991.

COUNTDOWN TO 100

Lenoir-Rhyne enters the game with 94 wins in program history, all coming under head coach Greg Paradine. The Bears have a chance to hit the 100-win mark this season.

CLOSE CALL

Lenoir-Rhyne has won all seven matchups against the Pioneers. However, back in 2017, the two teams played to overtime. In that game, then-freshman Eric Dickinson scored the game-winner 45 seconds into the first overtime period to give Lenoir-Rhyne a 12-11 victory.

DICKINSON CLOSING IN

Senior Eric Dickinson already owns the program record for most career goals and points but is looking to complete the triple crown and become the all-time leader in assists as well. Dickinson is third in program history with 74 career assists and is just seven shy from tying Sam Ashton's program record which has stood since 2014. With five assists, Dickinson can pull into a second-place tie with Mike Hanlon's 79 all-time helpers. Dickinson has also played in 60 career games, one shy of moving into the top five in program history and can break that record which stands at 66 by Joe Buduo.

STANLEY MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Senior defensemen Connor Stanley is moving up the record book with his 44 career caused turnovers. Stanley, who tied the program record with five caused turnovers against Limestone, moved into fourth place in program history. Stanley is four away from third place and eight away from second place. However, he will be a distant second behind Collin Lett's 111 all-time caused turnovers from 2015-18.

4-0?

Lenoir-Rhyne is looking to start 4-0 for just the second time in program history. The 2018 Bears also won their first four games before dropping a 13-12 contest against #14 Colorado Mesa.

AGAINST THE BEST

Lenoir-Rhyne owns a 16-21 all-time record against ranked opponents, including an 8-11 mark against ranked opponents at home. LR has knocked off the number one team twice in program history and owns eight wins over teams ranked in the top 10 in the nation.

ABOUT THE PIONEERS

Tusculum won four straight to open the season before dropping a 12-9 contest against Newberry on Saturday. Lenoir-Rhyne will be the first ranked opponent

that Tusculum will play against so far this season.

POTW

This game features each of the SAC Players of the Week. Offensively, Isaiah Hines earned the honor while LR's Connor Stanley was the league's Defensive Player of the Week.

POSTSEASON BID

Lenoir-Rhyne is looking for its third NCAA Tournament bid. The Bears made the fields in 2017 and 2018 and were bound for a bid in 2020 but the tournament was canceled. The Bears advanced to the National Semifinal game in 2018 and were just one goal away from advancing to a National Championship game before falling 12-11 against No. 6 Saint Leo on May 20. That game was hosted by the Bears who beat Colorado Mesa 14-12 in the previous round.

PRESEASON HONORS

On top of being picked as the preseason favorite by the South Atlantic Conference coaches poll, the Bears placed five on the Preseason All-Conference squad. Dickinson, Connor Stanley and Noah Johnson were picked First Teamers while Moffat and Noah Flasch were tabbed as Second Team selections. As a team, Lenoir-Rhyne had 10 of the 11 first-place votes and were picked to finish ahead of new SAC member Limestone.

PRESEASON HONORS PART

II

Lenoir-Rhyne had three players named Preseason All-Americans by USILA. Eric Dickinson was named a First Team Preseason All-American, while Zach Bodeau was named a Second Teamer at faceoff. Rounding out the trio was Myles Moffat who was selected as an Honorable Mention Preseason All-American.
