SAC OPENER

This marks the South Atlantic Conference opener for Lenoir-Rhyne who was supposed to open with Coker last Saturday but that game was postponed. This will mark the first-ever conference meeting for the Bears and Limestone as the Saints entered the South Atlantic Conference after a long run in Conference Carolinas.

PRESEASON EXPECTATIONS

The Bears were predicted to finish first in the preseason South Atlantic Conference Coaches' Poll . The Bears also have remained steady in the national polls, sitting at No. 7 for a second straight week.

Limestone was predicted to finish second in the conference but dropped from No. 5 to No. 12 in the USILA poll. The Saints dropped a 12-3 decision at Wingate on Saturday. The three goals are tied for the fewets in Limestone men's lacrosse history and the nine-goal margin of victory is the worst loss for Limestone since 2006.

TOP-15 CLASH GOES TO LR

In their most recent game, Lenoir-Rhyne beat Belmont Abbey in a clash of top 15 teams in the nation on Feb. 20. The Bears scored the final three goals of the game to top No. 13 Belmont Abbey by a final score of 14-11 on a chilly afternoon.

After falling behind 4-1 early, LR rallied back thanks to a four-goal performance from Toron Eccleston and three goals and two assists from Bryce Reece.

HONORS FOR JOHNSON

Thanks to his 15 saves against the Crusaders, Noah Johnson earned the South Atlantic Conference Defensive Player of the Week Award.

BIOGRAPHY

Greg Paradine started the Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Lacrosse program and has been the only coach in program history after his hiring in 2009. Paradine, a graduate and all-american at the University of North Carolina, has brought LR to unmatched heights during his tenure.

Paradine was named the 2018 USILA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading the Bears within one goal of advancing to the National Championship. Paradine has guided the Bears to four South Atlantic Conference Regular Season Championships, one SAC Tournament title and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. He owns a 91–58 all-time record and is a four-time South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year.

Paradine's Bears won 24 straight SAC regular season games, going three straight seasons with a perfect 8-0 league mark. The Bears have been nationally ranked 58 times, including being as

high as No. 3 in the nation and had a 27-week stretch of being ranked in the top 10. Paradine engineered two wins over Limestone when the Saints were ranked No. 1 in the nation, including an 18-16 win in 2020 which was nationally broadcast on the Lacrosse Sports Network.

In his tenure, 43 players have been selected to the All-Conference squad and eight have been All-Americans. He had two players win SAC Player of the Year accolades and two others be named SAC Freshman of the Year. Academically, Paradine has had two players win SAC Scholar-Athletes of the Year awards and one bee named the SAC Elite 20 Award Winner.

Paradine came to LR after serving as an assistant coach for seven years at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina. He was a four-year member of the Tar Heels lax team and played on four ACC Championship teams and played won a National Championship in 1991.



COUNTDOWN TO 100

Lenoir-Rhyne enters the game with 93 wins in program history, all coming under head coach Greg Paradine. The Bears have a chance to hit the 100-win mark this season.

LONG LAYOFF

With the game at Coker being postponed, the Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Lacrosse Team will go a full two weeks in between games.

LOOKING FOR NUMBER ONE

Lenoir-Rhyne has never defeated Limestone in Hickory. One of the two wins came in Gaffney, while the 2020 win was a nuetral game in Cornelius at the Lacrosse Crown Classic.

LAST TIME VS. LIMESTONE

The Bears topped Limestone 18-16 in Cornelius almost a year ago to the day. On March 8, the Bears beat No. 1 Limestone thanks to a pair of hat tricks from Will Canata and Myles Moffat. Bryce Reece tallied two goals and three assists for a team-high five points. Defensively, Noah Johnson had 16 saves. For the Saints, Larson Sundown (1g, 6a) and Tyler Papa (4g, 1a) were the team leaders but neither player is on the 2021 Limestone roster. Sundown transfered to Division III Rochester Institute of

Technology and Papa is now playing for Michigan.

RANKED BEARS

For the 63rd week in team history, Lenoir-Rhyne is nationally ranked. The Bears come in as the No. 7 team in the nation and own a 48-12 all-time record as a ranked team.

AGAINST THE BEST

Lenoir-Rhyne owns a 14-21 all-time record against ranked opponents, including a 6-11 mark against ranked opponents at home. LR has knocked off the number one team twice in program history and owns eight wins over teams ranked in the top 10 in the nation.

ABOUT THE SAINTS

Limestone is led by Owen Consoletti who has nine goals, six assists and 15 points on the year. He is the only Saint to reach double figures in points after three gams although Frank Smith sits at nine. The duo of Dakota Kirsch-Downs and Christopher Parrott are 44-75 on the faceoff and William Baxter gives up 10.06 goals per game.

SLOW FOURTH QUARTERS

Limestone has only scored four goals in their three games in the fourth quarter. Defensively, the Saints have only allowed four goals in the quarter.

Limestone outshoots opponents 23–19 in the fourth quarter.

POSTSEASON BID

Lenoir-Rhyne is looking for its third NCAA Tournament bid. The Bears made the fields in 2017 and 2018 and were bound for a bid in 2020 but the tournament was canceled. The Bears advanced to the National Semifinal game in 2018 and were just one goal away from advancing to a National Championship game before falling 12–11 against No. 6 Saint Leo on May 20. That game was hosted by the Bears who beat Colorado Mesa 14–12 in the previous round.

PRESEASON HONORS

On top of being picked as the preseason favorite by the South Atlantic Conference coaches poll, the Bears placed five on the Preseason All-Conference squad. Dickinson, Connor Stanley and Noah Johnson were picked First Teamers while Moffat and Noah Flasch were tabbed as Second Team selections. As a team, Lenoir-Rhyne had 10 of the 11 first-place votes and were picked to finish ahead of new SAC member Limestone.

PRESEASON HONORS PART

Lenoir-Rhyne had three players named Preseason All-Americans by USILA. Eric Dickinson was named a First Team Preseason All-American, while Zach Bodeau was named a Second Teamer at faceoff. Rounding out the trio was Myles Moffat who was selected as an Honorable Mention Preseason All-American.
