### 95 DAYS LATER

#### **INDY GETS THE ROAD DUB**

It has been 95 days in between the season opener between these two teams back on Feb. 5 with Indianapolis coming away with a narrow 12-11 victory in Hickory to open the campaign with a top-10 win over the Bears who were ranked No. 2 at the time. The Greyhounds ran out to a 10-5 lead with 3:35 left in the third quarter but LR came all the way back to even the game at 10. However, Indy would score twice in the final 3:15 to come away with the victory.

#### **GAME 1 LEADERS**

Indianapolis had a four-goal, one-assist effort from Ben Foster in the first matchup this season against LR and Drew Billig tallied two goals and four assists. The Greyhounds only turned the ball over nine times in the game and went 2-for-2 with the extra man. For the Bears, Toron Eccleston had four goals and an assist and Joe Venazio made his LR debut with three goals and an assist. The Bears turned it over 20 times, the second-most turnovers in a game this season.

#### **ONLY HOME LOSS**

The Greyhounds handed LR the only loss at Moretz Stadium this season as LR finished the year with a 9-1 mark at home after winning the SAC Tournament on their own turf last weekend. LR has gone 24-2 in their last 26 home games with only losses to No. 9 Indianapolis and No. 6 Wingate (2021).

#### **BACK TO HICKORY**

This is the second trip that Indianapolis will make to Hickory this season and the third in the past two years. The Greyhounds made the NCAA Tournament last year which was hosted by LR but they fell to Wingate in the NCAA Quarterfinal round. Indy erased an 8-3 Wingate lead and rallied all the way back to tie the game at nine with 1:40 to play. However, a costly late turnover in their own end gave Wingate the game-winning goal with eight seconds to play.

### **BIOGRAPHY**

Greg Paradine started the Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Lacrosse program and has been the only coach in program history after his hiring in 2009. Paradine, a graduate and all-american at the University of North Carolina, has brought LR to unmatched heights during his tenure.

Paradine was named the 2018 USILA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading the Bears within one goal of advancing to the National Championship. Paradine earned his second National Coach of the Year honor in 2021 after he led the Bears to a National Championship game and the highest national ranking in program history (#2). Paradine has guided the Bears to five South Atlantic Conference Regular Season Championships, two SAC Tournament title and three NCAA Tournament appearances. He owns a 106–60 all-time record and is a four-time South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year.

Paradine's Bears won 24 straight SAC regular season games, going three straight seasons with a perfect 8-0 league mark. The Bears have been nationally ranked 71 times, including being as high as No. 2 in the nation and had a 27-week stretch of being ranked in the top 10. Paradine engineered two wins over Limestone when the Saints were ranked No. 1 in the nation, including an 18-16 win in 2020 which was nationally broadcast on the Lacrosse Sports Network.

In his tenure, 49 players have been selected to the All-Conference squad and 13 have been All-Americans. He had three players win SAC Player of the Year accolades and two others be named SAC Freshman of the Year. Academically, Paradine has had three players win SAC Scholar-Athletes of the Year awards and two been named the SAC Elite 20 Award Winner while Mitch Linklater earned the prestigious NCAA Elite 90 award.

Paradine came to LR after serving as an assistant coach for seven years at his alma mater, the University of North Carolina. He was a four-year member of the Tar Heels lax team and played on four ACC Championship teams and won a National Championship in 1991.

### **LENOIR-RHYNE NOTES**

### NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

This marks the fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the past five years for Lenoir-Rhyne who own a 3-3 all-time mark in NCAA postseason play, including last year's run to the NCAA Championship game. The Bears enter as the four seed which is the worst seed LR has ever had. In their prior three tournament appearances, the Bears were either the 1 or 2 seed.

UIndy will be making their third trip to the NCAA Tournament since the program started in 2016. The Greyhounds won their only two tournament games in program history in 2019 when they dispatched of both Queens and Belmont Abbey in overtime before falling to top seed Limestone in the regional final. In total, the Greyhounds are 2–2 in tournament play with three of the four games being decided by one goal.

### **RANKED HISTORY**

Lenoir-Rhyne is 25-26 all-time against ranked opponents including a five-game winning streak to close out this year. Lenoir-Rhyne is 15-13 all-time at home against ranked opponents.

#### ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Lenoir-Rhyne leads all of Division II in total attendance and average attendance. The Bears total attendance of 5,773 is 1,800 more than any other school in Division II and the average attendance of 577 is 137 more per game than

any other Division II team. The LR/ Limestone SAC Championship game at Moretz Stadium was the second-most attended game on campus in Division II this season and LR holds the third, fourth and fifth most attended on campus games this year including the game with UIndy to start the season.

### MOFFAT CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior Myles Moffat became one of just three players in Lenoir-Rhyne history to ever top 200 career points when he did so earlier this season.

### BACK-TO-BACK

With a 14-11 win over No. 3 Limestone, the Lenoir-Rhyne Bears earned their second straight South Atlantic Conference Tournament title and the third in program history. The Bears and Saints also split the SAC Regular Season crown thanks to identical 9-1 records in the conference.

### BREAKING THE ASSIST MARK

In a dominating 22-2 win over Coker, the Bears broke the program record for most assists in a game. LR handed out 19 helpers on those 22 goals, topping the previous mark of 18 assists set back in 2014. Myles Moffat led the way with a quartet of assists.

### DR. JOHNSON

Goalie Noah Johnson was named the South Atlantic Conference Tournament

Most Valuable Player after the win against Limestone as he recorded 14 saves in the victory.

### EIGHT ON THE ALL-CONFERENCE LIST

For the second consecutive season, Lenoir-Rhyne placed eight players on the All-SAC team as announced by the league on Thursday. The Bears had three on the first team (Victor Powell, Mitchell Linklater and Toron Eccleston) and two more on the second team (Noah Johnson, Myles Moffat). Rounding out the selections were a trio of third teamers in John Paulus, James Brugger and Tommy Aguilar.

### SCOUTING THE GREYHOUNDS

Indy will come into Wednesday's contest on a 2-game losing streak with back-to-back losses to Lindenwood in the GLVC Championship and Limestone. The Greyhounds sports the third-best scoring defense in the nation and only allow opponents to score 7.94 goals per game. Indy also takes care of the ball as evidenced by their 15.4 turnovers per game which ranks sixth in the nation. Goalie Austin Barnett is fourth in the nation in goals-against average at 7.88. Indy had 12 named to the All-GLVC team with yle Basch bringing home Specialty Player of the Year honors and four were named First Team All-Conference. Drew Billig ranks sixth in the nation in assists per game at 2.59.

### **WINNING STREAKS**

LR's 10 game winning streak ranks as the third-longest active winning streak in Division II. LR only trails Tampa's 18-game streak and Mercy's 11-game winning streak as the longest in the nation. The Bears eight-game home winning streak is also the third-longest in Division II trailing Tampa (24 games) and Limestone (13 games).
