IT'S WORTH NOTING...

~ Villanova makes its first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament since 2004, when the Wildcats advanced to the quarterfinals. This is Villanova's 18th all-time appearance in the NIT and it owns an all-time record of 24-17. It earned the 1994 NIT title with an 80-73 victory over Vanderbilt at Madison Square Garden.

~ The 70-point plateau remains a key indicator of the Wildcats' fortunes in 2022-23. Villanova is 15-3 this season (.833) when holding opponents below that threshold. It is 2-13 (.133) when foes register 70 or more points.

~ Redshirt junior forward Eric Dixon (Willow Grove, Pa.) leads Villanova in scoring this season at 15.3 points per game. He is also its top rebounder with a 6.4 rebound per outing average. In 92 career games, he has scored 921 points (10.0 ppg).

~ This marks Villanova's first visit to the state of Virginia since 2015, when it dropped an 86-75 decision to the University of Virginia in Charlottesville during its 2016 NCAA national championship campaign.

~ Guard Caleb Daniels was named winner of the BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award last week and followed that news up with a productive BIG EAST Tournament. The native of New Orleans contributed 17 points, five rebounds, three assists and zero turnovers in Villanova's most recent outing, an 87-74 loss to Creighton in a BIG EAST Tournament quarterfinal.

~ Since 2000, Villanova has appeared in a postseason tournament in 23 of 24 seasons. From 2000-04, the Wildcats made five consecutive NIT appearances. From 2005-11 and 2013-22, Villanova earned 17 NCAA berths and earned two national titles.

Recapping the BE Tournament

Villanova entered the 2023 BIG EAST Tournament presented by Jeep as the No. 6 seed. It handily defeated Georgetown in its opening round matchup 80-48 to advance to a quarterfinal clash with No. 24 Creighton.

The Bluejays built a 32-23 halftime advantage and the Wildcats weren't able to quell the Bluejays' firepower in the second half. Creighton tallied 55 points over the final 20 minutes on its way to an 87-74 win.

"I thought our defense to start the game wasn't bad," said Villanova head coach Kyle Neptune. "(Ryan) Kalkbrenner is obviously a great player. They made a point to go to him often. Our defense wasn't bad. I thought they got into transition a little too much and hurt us there.

"As the game went on, we had to play catch up and we got a little loose defensively because of that."

In the win over Georgetown, the Wildcats featured a balanced attack with five players in double figures led by freshman Cam Whitmore, who finished with 19 points.

"I thought we played really hard from the beginning," stated Neptune. "They didn't really score on us in the halfcourt. We got back and got stops in transition. That was something we really talked about in our gameplan. Proud of our guys' effort."

Free Throw Proficiency

When he was establishing an NCAA Division I record for consecutive free throws made in 2000 - a mark since broken - former Wildcats' guard Gary Buchanan liked to describe visits to the line as "free points".

Buchanan once drained 73 in a row during 1999-2000. The St. Louis, Mo., native can take a measure of pride in the performance of the current Wildcats in this part of the game.

Since the early weeks of the season back in December, the Wildcats have led the nation in Free Throw Percentage. Entering this week's action they are the only team in America converting better than 80 percent of its attempts from the line (.8231).

As the NCAA and NIT Tournaments get underway, Villanova has converted 442-of-537 attempts at the line.

Its percentage leader at the line, graduate student Brandon Slater, ranks seventh in individual Free Throw Percentage (.9175).

Last season, Villanova established a single season NCAA record in Free Throw Percentage by converting .830 of its attempts from the line on its way to a BIG EAST Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Final Four in New Orleans.

Justin's Journey

With less than two minutes to play in the NCAA South Region Final last March in San Antonio, Justin Moore was playing the best basketball of his college career. A short while later, he fell to the floor with what would later be diagnosed as a tear in his right Achilles tendon.

Moore underwent surgery days later and then flew to New Orleans to watch his teammates face Kansas in the Final Four.

The rehab process began shortly thereafter and among those offering encouragement was fellow Maryland native Kevin Durant. Moore returned to practice with the Wildcats on Christmas night and spent the days after that re-acclimating himself to live basketball competition.

He returned to the game lineup as a starter on Jan. 29 vs. Providence and received a huge ovation from a crowd of 15,503 at the Wells Fargo Center when he was introduced.

"It meant a lot," said Moore afterward, "to feel the love from the fans."

Added head coach Kyle Neptune: "I'm sure a lot of people were telling Justin to shut it down, to not play this season. A lot of guys may have listened to that. But Justin is a special guy who wanted to be out there again with his brothers."

There was rust in the early going as Moore jumped into BIG EAST action. In his first two appearances against the Friars and Marquette, the Fort Washington, Md., native was 4-of-17 from the field while averaging 7.0 points per game.

But as Moore has settled in, the results have only gotten better. The 6-4 guard was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll in the final week of the regular season after averaging 20.0 points per game in a win at Seton Hall and loss to Connecticut.

Injury Impact

A full lineup only became a reality for Villanova in mid-February

Villanova's health travails began last summer. Moore, of course, was sidelined for the entire preseason while recovering from surgery on his torn Achilles tendon. But there were other significant health setbacks that often limited the Wildcats in practices leading up to their opener vs. La Salle on Nov. 7

Caleb Daniels missed two weeks in October after suffering a broken nose. Brendan Hausen was sidelined for a period by a concussion in October. Longino missed three weeks in October with left knee soreness. Trey Patterson missed multiple weeks with a sports hernia.

Villanova played its first 24 games this season without at least one of its top six leading scorers. It played 12 games this season without two of them. The group of Daniels, Dixon, Whitmore, Brandon Slater, Moore and Longino, has lost a combined 36 games to injury to this point.

In contrast, Villanova's top six scorers by average in 2021-22 missed a combined five games over the course of a 38-game season (Daniels missed three games and Moore two).

The Dixon Docket

Last week, the BIG EAST coaches chose Dixon a second team all-league choice. Here's a bit more on the ways he has impacted the Wildcats in 2022-23:

The native of nearby Willow Grove, Pa., scored in double figures in 28 of the Wildcats' 33 games during the regular season. He ranks seventh in the BIG EAST in scoring (15.5 points per game); 10th in rebounding (6.4 rebounds per game) and 14th in Field Goal Percentage (.499).

The 6-8 forward also enters the BIG EAST Tournament 41-of-109 from beyond the 3-point arc (.387).

Dixon has started Villanova's last 70 games after spending his first active season as a reserve (2020-21).

Whitmore Honored

Cam Whitmore came to Villanova as a McDonald's All-American with an impressive string of prep accomplishments.

The 6-7 native of Odenton, Md., gave the Wildcats an immediate

jolt when he played his first game of the regular season against Oklahoma on Dec. 5 at Well Fargo Center. His skill and impact only grew from there, as he earned BIG EAST Freshman of the Week four times over the course of the regular season.

On March 8, he was named the BIG EAST Freshman of the Year, becoming the third Wildcats' player to win that honor since 2017 (Omari Spellman and Jeremiah Robinson-Earl previously took home the trophy).

Stated Whitmore at the awards' press conference: "Missing the first seven games with the thumb injury, I didn't really expect this. My teammates and coaches were there for me, helped me get through it, and really helped guide me to this point."

Bench Boost

One of the benefits of the renewed health among stalwarts such as Moore and Longino is that it has bolstered Villanova's depth.

In Villanova's 80-48 victory over Georgetown at the BIG EAST Tournament on March 8, the Wildcats owned a 25-8 edge in bench scoring with a pair of freshmen, Mark Armstrong and Brendan Hausen, leading the way with 10 points each.

Indeed, Armstrong and Hausen have provided some exciting glimpses of what their skills are over the course of the 2022-23 campaign.

Armstrong, a dynamic guard from South Orange, N.J., by way of St. Peter's Prep, appeared in all 33 games for the 'Cats, earning six starts. He averaged 19.5 minutes, 5.1 points and 1.9 rebounds for the Wildcats. In addition, he sank 21-of-23 free throw attempts (.913).

Hausen, meanwhile, offers a perimeter shooting threat in his tool kit. The Amarillo, Tex., native is 26-of-61 from beyond the 3-point arc on the season (.426).

Senior Chris Arcidiacono provides defense and intangibles while Longino is among Nova's best perimeter defenders.

Dumont Inked Letter of Intent

Villanova announced the signing of 6-8 Jordann Dumont on November 15 to a national letter of intent. The senior at Hamilton Heights Christian Academy in Chattanooga, Tenn., will enroll at Villanova in the fall of 2023.

A native of Montreal, Quebec, Canada, Dumont is a promising guard/forward with a varied skill set. Last season he averaged 23 points, nine rebounds and three assists per game. Thus far in 2022-23, he has averaged 23.5 points and 9.5 rebounds per outing. He is a nominee for the 2023 McDonald's All-American Game.

"We're excited to welcome Jordann and his family to the Villanova community," stated Wildcats head coach Kyle Neptune. "Jordann is a long, skilled athlete who really fits our culture. We know he'll work hard to become the best Villanova player he can be."

Dumont is the first athlete to officially sign a letter of intent since Neptune succeeded Jay Wright as the Wildcats' head coach last April. Current Villanova freshmen Mark Armstrong, Brendan Hausen, and Cam Whitmore originally signed national letters of intent in November 2021 and then reaffirmed their choice of Villanova after Neptune assumed command upon Wright's retirement.

Home Court Data

Villanova's campus home court is Finneran Pavilion. The original facility opened in 1986 and was renovated during the 2017-18 basketball season. The lead gift for the \$65 million transformation was made by the late William B. Finneran, for whom the facility was renamed in 2018.

The Wildcats are 333-67 (.832) in the building all-time. In 2021-22, Villanova was 9-1 (.900) in its on-campus home floor. The Wildcats are 40-5 in the facility (.889) since it reopened as Finneran Pavilion in 2018-19, including 7-2 on campus this season (.778).

The Wells Fargo Center serves as Villanova's "home away from home" for five games this season. The Wildcats were 3-0 at the Center in 2021-22 after a one-year hiatus from the facility due to COVID-19. They were 3-2 in South Philadelphia thus far this season (.750) with wins over Oklahoma (70-66, Seton Hall (58-54), and Creighton (79-67) and losses to Providence (70-65) and Connecticut (71-59).

Brizzi Departs

Redshirt freshman guard Angelo Brizzi (Warrenton, Va./Highland H.S.) placed his name into the transfer portal on Dec. 30 and is no longer with the Wildcats.

"Angelo has made the decision to enter his name into the transfer portal," stated Villanova head coach Kyle Neptune. "We appreciate his contributions to our program and how he has represented Villanova in a first-class way. We wish Angelo the best as he approaches the next step in his basketball career."

Brizzi spent the 2021-22 as a redshirt, practicing with the Wildcats but not appearing in games as Villanova advanced to the NCAA Final Four. This season, Brizzi appeared in nine games, averaging 10.8 minutes, 2.0 points and 1.9 rebounds per game.

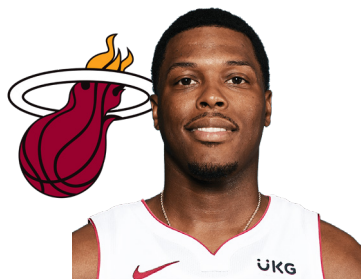

Kyle Neptune was named the William B. Finneran Endowed Head Men's Basketball Coach at Villanova on April 20, 2022. Neptune returned to Villanova after a one season stint as head coach at Fordham University, where he guided the Rams to 16 victories. In the two seasons prior to his arrival, the Rams had totaled 11 wins.

As a Villanova assistant coach from 2013-21, Neptune was a part of a run that produced 233 victories, seven BIG EAST regular season titles, four BIG EAST Tournament crowns and two NCAA national championships. Among the Wildcats legends whom Neptune helped tutor in this span were Ryan Arcidiacono, Mikal Bridges, Jalen Brunson, Josh Hart, and Collin Gillespie.

After a four-year playing career at Lehigh University that concluded with his graduation in 2007, Neptune began his coaching career as a video coordinator for the Wildcats in 2008. He was part of a staff that helped guide the 'Cats to an NCAA East Regional championship and the program's first NCAA Final Four appearance in 24 years.

In 2010, Neptune joined the staff at Niagara University. He spent three seasons working with Purple Eagles before accompanying head coach Joe Mihalich to Hofstra University in the summer of 2013. A few months later, Neptune was named as an assistant coach at Villanova.

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Neptune was named head coach at Fordham University after helping the Wildcats advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2020-21. The Rams won a second round Atlantic 10 Tournament game and reached the Quarterfinals for the first time since 2007. Fordham also established a program record for its defensive metrics, finishing 44th in the Kenpom.com rankings.

That portfolio helped Neptune become a finalist for the Joe B. Hall Award honoring the nation's top first-year head coach.

Neptune (37) is just the sixth leader of the Men's Basketball program since 1936. That illustrious lineup includes Alexander Severance (1936-61, 413 wins); Jack Kraft (1961-73, 238 wins); Rollie Massimino (1973-92, 357 wins); Steve Lappas (1992-2001, 174 wins); and Jay Wright (2001-22, 520 wins).

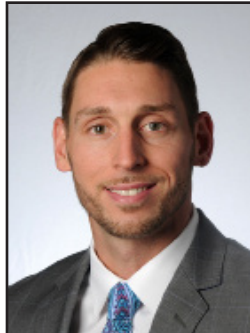

Kyle Neptune's Villanova looks a lot like Jay Wright's Villanova — for now

VILLANOVA, Pa. — The head coach's sneakers. The music on the radio during a recruiting road trip. Slightly less cursing. Oh, and a little more pre-practice film. That's it. After rooting around the Finneran Pavilion during Villanova media day and talking to Wildcat players, that's the sum total of the differences between Kyle Neptune and Jay Wright.

Most of which can be summed up under one big umbrella: Neptune is 23 years younger than his predecessor. "Yeah, I mean Coach Wright was like a father figure to all of us," says assistant coach Mike Nardi, who played for Wright. "Nep's more like a cool uncle. You still have that respect for him; it's just different." The cool uncle, for example, is wearing sweet, Villanova light blue/dark blue Jordans. Wright never wore high tops. The cool uncle opts for Jay-Z while riding down the road with assistant coach George Halcovage for a recruiting trip. "Jay liked the Chainsmokers. I miss the Chainsmokers," Halcovage says. "Right," explains senior guard Chris Arcidiacono, cutting to the chase. "That's the music my dad listens to." The old guy cussed more, and the new guy likes film a little bit more.

Otherwise? Otherwise, it is business as usual, down to which hand goes up and which down during drills, how practice is run, and of course, how practice ends — the huddle breaks with the familiar refrain repeated ad nauseam under Wright. "Attitude." Media day even starts on Wright's Elvis time. That is to say, a good 15 minutes later than scheduled. "I mean, no difference really," junior forward Eric Dixon says. "Everything. How we huddle up, what we do, it's all the same."

It's not, of course. It is, in truth, exactly the opposite. Things are very, very different at Villanova. The man who won two national championships and crafted both a style of play and a culture that now ranks as the standard bearer in men's college basketball is off somewhere being Jay Wright for a living. He spent the summer posing for pictures in golf foursomes, gripping and grinning his way through various corporate appearances, and serving as the grand marshal for the Ocean City Night in Venice boat parade. He has not been out recruiting or trying to figure out what to do without Collin Gillespie and sans Justin Moore for the foreseeable future. He flitters in every now and again — he showed up at Hoops Mania, and visits an occasional practice — but for all intents and purposes, Jay Wright has left the building.

In his place is a man who has coached 32 games and won 16 of them. Neptune makes no apologies for doing everything the way his predecessor did. Neptune is a disciple, his coaching teeth cut at Villanova first as Wright's video coordinator, and later as his assistant. "This was my first real coaching job," Neptune says. "How to run a practice, how to run a program, I learned all of that stuff here. So what this place is, I believe in, so it will be very, very similar." In his lone year as a head coach, at Fordham, he tried very hard to mimic what he was taught under Wright, though the steep grade of the learning curve made actual implementation difficult. When he returned to the mothership, to a roster filled with seven returning players who were reared in Villanova, he saw absolutely no reason to upset the apple cart. "I mean it's the whole 'if it's not broke, why fix it,' right?" Nardi says. No, there is no real arguing that point. It would make zero sense to come in and turn Villanova into something else entirely for the sheer vainglorious need to put your own imprint on things.

Pressed, Neptune admits he'd like to play a little more up and down this year, and go deeper into his lineup. But that is more in response to personnel than a purposeful shift away from Wright, who kept his rotation especially tight. Villanova this year does not have an obvious go-to star, at least until Moore returns from his Achilles

injury. There is no bail-out player, no Gillespie or Jalen Brunson to hand the ball off to when the game is on the line and exhale. Instead, Neptune starts the season with a bunch of upperclassmen role players (Caleb Daniels, Brandon Slater, Arcidiacono and Dixon) and some very talented freshmen (Mark Armstrong, Cam Whitmore and Brendan Hausen) to choose from. Consequently, Neptune has no choice but to fiddle with the lineup, to try out combinations and rotations to see what works. And he's got a lot of guys who can shoot and move, so why not get up and down?

But there also is a fine line between changing just for the sake of change, and making something your own. In Neptune's 19-minute press conference with the media, Wright's name was referenced directly or indirectly 24 times. He was not in the building, but he was certainly floating around in its air. Neptune didn't seem to mind. "I never focused on not being him," he said. "I mean, he's a Hall of Famer, to me the best coach in college basketball the last 10 years. I would like to be a lot like him, if you know what I mean?"

But the full break hasn't happened yet. Neptune is still very much the man who replaced Jay Wright; not yet the head coach at Villanova. Some of that is time. He has not publicly performed the act of coaching the Wildcats, after all. At some point, though, there probably needs to be at least a subtle exorcism— not a throw-everything-away-and-embark-on-a-brand-new-frontier shift, but subtle tweaks that make this Neptune's team.

Hubert Davis did that. He found a way to play the Hubert version of the Carolina Way. He opted out of the more traditional two-big approach and spread the floor with shooters, a la Brady Manek. By extension, UNC took more 3s than it did the year before (38 percent of total field goal attempts, up from 27, per KenPom). It wasn't a complete reversal, but a subtle shift that Davis made intentionally. By the end of last season, North Carolina was Hubert Davis' team. He was not the placeholder, sitting in for Roy Williams, nor was he asked about replacing his boss any longer.

Odds are Neptune will find his detours, too.

For now, he's at least got the shoes.

The elephant in the gym? Jay Wright is not there anymore at Villanova.

Your eyes glance all around Villanova's nearly-empty Finneran Pavilion. Upper and lower decks, Davis Club, Fitzgerald Club. Nope ... this is no prank. Jay Wright isn't in charge anymore. He has left the building.

You can't say it's the elephant in the gym, the seismic coaching transition in progress on the Main Line. Every other question to every Villanova player at Wednesday's basketball media day was about the transition.

Eventually, Kyle Neptune himself won't be hit with a constant slew of replacing Jay questions. That will just take a while.

"It's all right," Neptune said after his own little media scrum. "Listen, every question I got asked all the time last year, same thing."

Last season, Neptune was doing a one-year stint as Fordham's head coach, after almost a decade as a Wright assistant. Let's assume Neptune is nervous, excited, maybe even worried sometimes about what his predecessor will think about this or that.

Let's also stipulate it's a dream scenario for a 37-year-old coach. Sure, the expectations and pressures are real. In reality, they are roughly the same as Wright faced every season — get to the second NCAA weekend, go from there. Accomplish that enough times, elite talent will keep showing up, giving you a chance to make some history.

Asked all sorts of ways how he's approaching his task, Neptune crystallized it in a sentence.

"I'm holding the line," Neptune said.

As for how he handled trying to differentiate himself from Wright, his successor said, "I never focused on not being him. I mean, he's a Hall of Famer, to me the best coach in college basketball the last 10 years. I would like to be a lot like him, you know what I mean?"

It still feels odd, almost jarring. Probably the majority of Villanova students weren't born when Wright took over as head coach in 2001.

As for how often Wright actually is around, Neptune said, "I would like for him to be around more. I try to beg him to come around. He retired for a reason. He wants his personal time and his space. He's always there if I need to call him. I call him often. We talk often. He does come by practice, but he's definitely not here anymore."

His players, meanwhile, handled Wright-to-Neptune questions like it was a layup drill.

"The main difference would have to be, just coming from a younger voice," said Wildcats sophomore wing Jordan Longino. "Although Coach Wright comes with a lot of energy and a lot of aggressiveness, I think Coach Neptune has been really eager from the jump, almost building the same habits, but came in with a little more energy, to get us locked in from the first day we got here."

On the court ...



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“Same principles, same scheme essentially — building the same habits,” said Longino, who got cleared to fully practice three weeks ago after surgery to repair a meniscus tear in his left knee that caused him to miss last season’s NCAA Tournament. (Longino said he’s been a full go at practice the last two weeks, feeling great.)

Normally, this 2022 media day still would have been about change. Collin Gillespie and Jermaine Samuels gone after last season’s Final Four run. (Although Samuels was at Wednesday’s practice, before heading off to Pacers G League camp.) New faces getting assimilated. (There still were plenty of questions about freshmen Cam Whitmore, Mark Armstrong, and Brendan Hausen coming in.) There were injury updates. Justin Moore remains on track for a possible in-season return from his Achilles tear. Caleb Daniels is out for a bit with a broken nose, expected to be a full go for the start of the season.

Back to the big change that isn’t so big a change ...

“Same kind of values, same kind of principles,” said junior big man Eric Dixon. “Just a different voice behind it.”

There must be some little differences at practice?

“Honestly, no,” Dixon said. “You’ve got the same pyramids, the same ATTITUDE wristbands, the same VILLANOVA BASKETBALL wristbands ...”

Same catchphrases ...

“Humble and hungry, defend and rebound, all that kind of stuff,” Dixon said.

“His name is different,” said veteran forward Brendan Slater. “Other than that, it’s the same thing. ... Just a different face.”

Maybe a little louder?

“I’ll give him that,” Slater said. “Coach Nep is maybe a little bit louder. I think that comes with age, though. I was told by Kris Jenkins and Taj Bell and the guys before me, they tell me that Coach Wright was a little bit louder when he was younger. I think that comes with age.”

If there’s another difference, Slater said, “Coach Nep, he gets straight to the point ... Coach Wright will come at you with 15 different sentences and it’ll be the same thing in 15 different ways.”

A knock at the old coach? Nah, don’t read it wrong.

“Coach Wright is so smart and so witty,” Slater said.

“We probably watch a little bit more pre-practice film,” said senior guard Chris Arcidiacono. “Probably the only real difference.”

Who curses more?

“Uh, Coach Wright,” Arcidiacono said.

The new coach probably shares more musical tastes with his players. If Wright liked the Chainsmokers, “That’s someone my dad would like,” Arcidiacono said. “Them, Coldplay, U2 ...”

Another reporter walked up to Arcidiacono.

“With the coaching change ... what have you found so far, some of the similarities, some of the differences?”

Holding the line, they could all say, just leave it at that as a theme for 2022-23 at Villanova.

‘He’s one of the keepers of the flame’: Villanova’s Eric Dixon is becoming the best version of himself

During a preseason practice last year, Eric Dixon let a shot fly from beyond the three-point arc.

Former Villanova basketball coach Jay Wright wasn’t mad about the shot — heck, he once compared Dixon’s shooting potential to that of 2016 NCAA title game hero Kris Jenkins — but he wanted to use it as a teaching moment.

“We don’t want you shooting that shot yet,” Wright told Dixon, then a redshirt sophomore, putting emphasis on the last word.

It wasn’t that Dixon wasn’t a proficient shooter. The Abington High grad shot plenty of three-pointers in high school — around 200 or so, Abington coach Charles Grasty told The Inquirer via telephone this week.

It was more that Villanova, with four good shooters surrounding Dixon in a starting unit that went on to reach the Final Four, didn’t need Dixon to take that shot, especially not early in a shot clock and especially not often.

The yet in Wright’s response was doing a lot of work. It was supposed to. That Eric Dixon was Eric Dixon 2.0, a player whose development was going to be tested, really tested, for the first time. He had done what many before him had when he arrived on campus, taking a redshirt season to work on his body and his skills. He played sparingly as a reserve during the 2020-21 season (8.2 minutes per game) and was going to be starting for the first time.

Fast-forward to March 20, 2022. It’s late in a Round-of-32 game vs. Ohio State. The Wildcats are up five, but two minutes have lapsed without either team scoring, and the game needs a moment. Collin Gillespie backs his man down toward the basket as Dixon sets a screen on the perimeter for Justin Moore. Dixon’s defender isn’t even paying attention to him. He’s under the rim, waiting to help when Gillespie makes his move. Gillespie whips a pass out to a wide-open Dixon stationed behind the three-point line. He catches, shoots, swishes, and sends Villanova to the Sweet 16.

He didn’t shoot a lot of threes last season, but Dixon, who averaged 9.1 points and 6.4 rebounds, made 48.6% (17) of his 35 attempts (0.9 attempts per game).

We’re only three games into the 2022-23 season, with Wright gone and Kyle Neptune now in charge, and Dixon has already shot seven times from deep. He made 2 of 4 in a season-opening win over La Salle, went 0-for-2 in a loss to Temple, and knocked down his only three-pointer during Monday’s 60-50 win over Delaware State.

Dixon is shooting more, period, not just from beyond the arc. He’s averaging 14.3 shots per game, up from 6.8 last season.

Part of that is because Villanova is dealing with injuries to two starters, Moore (Achilles) and top freshman Cam Whitmore (thumb). The other part is that we’ve arrived at Eric Dixon 3.0.

“This is why we recruited him,” said Neptune. “This is what we envisioned.”

‘Our community is super proud’

Growing up three blocks away from your high school coach has its perks. Especially when a pandemic brings on a quarantine period and there aren’t many open basketball courts around.

Grasty, the Abington High coach who helped Dixon become a 2,000-point scorer in high school, has a court in his backyard. So Dixon would text his Willow Grove neighbor and former coach that he was coming over to work out at various times. He wasn’t alone. Former Abington players Lucas Monroe, now at Penn, and Robbie Heath, who played at Pepperdine, would be there, too.

“It was great,” Grasty said. “I could just take my son out in the backyard and see how hard they’re working.”

There aren’t many who work harder than Dixon. Chris Arcidiacono, Dixon’s Villanova teammate and high school opponent (Neshaminy), says Dixon might be the hardest worker he’s been around in three-plus seasons at Villanova.

Grasty sees it, too. He remembers when Dixon, who is listed at 6-foot-8, 255 pounds, used to be able to eat whatever he wanted to. Times changed. Dixon’s first task as a redshirt was to work on his body. There were a lot of salads.

Even a few years later, Grasty is still impressed. He saw Dixon after the La Salle game last week (20 points, a career-high 17 shot attempts) and the first thing he told him was how good his body looked.

“Once he got to school, it clicked that he had to work a lot harder,” Grasty said. “Not saying he didn’t work hard in high school, but he was so good and so dominant that he could get away with some of those things.”

Grasty said he’s also seen Dixon become more mature and develop as a man. Dixon still comes back to Abington from time to time and talks to the current players.

“To have our family and the community turn on the TV and see all his hard work paying off, our community is super proud, super happy,” Grasty said.

A keeper of the flame

Asked to compare the Abington version of himself to this version of himself, the player and the person, Dixon pointed to things like discipline, pride in his defense, and pride in “getting stops.”

Like many Villanova stars before him, Dixon, a preseason second-team All-Big East selection, doesn’t like to talk himself up. He does, though, have a pretty good sense of how he got here and how it all happened. He said he would go through those redshirt workouts and think about the players who sat out before him. The list included NBA players Eric Paschall, Mikal Bridges, and Donte DiVincenzo.

“I’m not the first guy that’s gone through and done this in this program,” Dixon said. “That’s just kind of what

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this program is, a bunch of guys who just work hard. Everyone’s path is different, and this just happens to be mine.”

Right now, it’s paying off. With Moore and Whitmore out, Dixon has been a steadying presence on offense. While his team struggled to shoot in a game vs. Delaware State on Monday, Dixon dominated inside with 17 points. Through three games, Dixon is leading the Wildcats in scoring at 18.3 points per game.

Is this the best he’s ever felt on the basketball court? Dixon didn’t take the bait to praise himself. He did, though, shed light on how he’s a different version.

“It’s funny,” Dixon said. “I’m at a spot in my career where, seeing [freshman] Brendan Hausen come in [Monday night] and we’re on the defensive end, trying to get a stop and he looks over at me like, ‘E, get in a stance, let’s get a stop.’ I’m like, OK, yeah, let’s do it.”

“I’m ready to go. But him being so locked into it, it just reminds you how special this place really is.”

Extra special for guys like Dixon, who have seen it in every form.

“He’s done it all,” Neptune said. “He’s been a player that didn’t play at all. He’s been a player that played spot minutes. He’s been a player who has gotten things done in big games.

“In this program, once you’ve been a part of a team and gotten things done in live action, we think about it like, ‘All right, this dude is a player and now he’s one of the keepers of the flame and it’s his job to make sure the younger guys know what it is to be a competitor in this program.’”

Villanova is 2-5. What's going on with the Wildcats?

Let's get this out of the way with Villanova at 2-5 under a first-year head coach: Kyle Neptune didn't cause this.

He just has to fix it.

We've already seen that merely continuing a championship culture won't fix it. What's going on with 'Nova right now, even if nobody saw it coming, everyone can point to all sorts of factors in play. Let's go through them, while also pointing out ... No, Jay Wright didn't leave the cupboard bare when he retired, didn't get out because he knew this squad was about to free-fall. Quite the opposite. In deciding it was time to go, Wright just could not have known the cupboard would open and a couple of important pieces would fall to the floor.

Sports, at its core, is about applying pressure to an opponent, in all sorts of ways. In basketball, that pressure must be applied at both ends of the court. You can't simply strategize that pressure into a game plan. You need talent ... you need speed.

Villanova has three core players who have proven themselves in all sorts of ways. Eric Dixon, Caleb Daniels, and Brandon Slater are holding up their end, with offensive efficiency ratings that stand up. (Daniels, for instance, has the highest KenPom.com offensive rating of his career.)

So what's the problem? Those three are being asked to replace proven stars, while the players tasked with replacing these three as complementary players aren't quite ready for such major roles.

The new players may have terrific careers. They just play like new players, meaning they make some smart plays but then maybe aren't in the right position on the next play. Neptune wasn't wrong to start games playing his veterans. It just isn't working. That isn't a shot at Chris Arcidiacono. I'm a Chris Arch proponent. His nine points, six assists, and zero turnovers didn't cause Villanova to lose Sunday to an undermanned Oregon team. It almost salvaged a W. But can Villanova afford playing someone 73% of the minutes if he's taking less than four shots a game?

The biggest factor right now: There is little elite about Villanova on the defensive side. The Wildcats don't force turnovers or defend the three-point line particularly well over 40 minutes. This isn't the kind of thing you can easily fix by giving promising freshmen more time. They're more likely to be the ones who get confused on assignments.

Right now, it comes down to Villanova getting badly outshot by opponents at the three-point line. Relying so heavily on threes, while shooting 31.4% (241st in Division I) and giving up 37.9% (300th in D1) simply isn't a winning formula.

When Portland more than doubles your three-point percentage, you've got issues. When Delaware State outshoots you, you've got issues, even if you win the game. Sure, 'Nova missed open looks in that one. The Wildcats also allowed Delaware State (still winless in Division I play) to shoot a higher three-point percentage than in any other D1 game. It's no longer possible to shrug that off as bad luck.

Villanova has worked best in recent glory years by using a switching man-to-man defense. Right now, the Wildcats don't have the personnel to do this. When you're not forcing turnovers, opponents can seek out mismatches. With this group, they're finding them.

There is the big issue, right there. Losing Collin Gillespie is tough. But not having Jermaine Samuels right now may



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be bigger. In his veteran years, Samuels applied pressure at both ends, causing mismatches while cleaning up for teammates.

Not having Justin Moore right now obviously is massive. Last season, he was Villanova's top defensive stopper, a future NBA player. He applies pressure at both ends. His return from Achilles surgery does not have a date attached.

Cam Whitmore was supposed to be the kind of player who could apply pressure, but thumb surgery has kept him out, and now the freshman will have to jump on a moving train. But his absence has been massive. Playing for USA Basketball, Whitmore showed he is the kind of explosive forward that opponents have to always account for, possession by possession.

You know all that. Neptune knows all that. Jordan Longino never hitting the ground fully healthy is another factor. One fewer player who is able to apply extreme pressure.

Slow offensive starts have plagued Villanova. In five of their seven games, the Wildcats have scored four points or less in the first five minutes. That puts pressure on themselves.

What can be done about that? Maybe this is jumping the gun, but should Neptune consider starting Brendan Hausen? That's not a knee-jerk reaction to Hausen making five of eight threes against Oregon. The man can shoot. That's why Villanova recruited him. Right now, Villanova needs a shooter to relieve some pressure off the other guys. Dixon and Daniels are holding up their end from long range, but everyone else has struggled.

Does that solve everything? It does not, and may cause other problems, since Hausen will need help defensively. There are no easy answers to this puzzle. But maybe let Longino settle into a super-sub role. Keep getting Mark Armstrong more minutes since he can apply pressure with his speed. (I like what I've seen from Angelo Brizzi, but there are only so many minutes to go around.)

If Whitmore and Moore are back soon, this season still can be salvaged. Villanova still can be what you expected. If not, this has turned out to be a rebuilding year that few saw coming. There was a complete awareness within Villanova's program that the nonconference schedule offered few breathers. Also, a chance to kick 'Nova when it's down — Big East teams will line up for that chance.

Is it possible to contemplate Villanova missing March Madness? KenPom.com says yes, predicting the Wildcats will finish 15-16. Those odds obviously will change if Whitmore and Moore return, but it gets late early when you're putting together an NCAA resumé. (True for Temple, too. Doesn't help the Owls that the Villanova W doesn't even count for much right now.)

This 'Nova team hasn't quit on anything. Almost coming back to win at Michigan State and hanging with Iowa State suggests the Wildcats still have the same old "attitude."

It just isn't enough right now. It's not a sign of panic to admit that.

With five-star freshman Cam Whitmore healthy, Villanova's 'room for growth' just got a lot bigger

Villanova coach Kyle Neptune did his best Friday, and again Saturday, after his team's 70-66 win over Oklahoma, to temper expectations around star freshman Cam Whitmore and his Villanova debut.

So, let's get those caveats out of the way: Whitmore injured his right (shooting) thumb in an early October practice, and surgery kept him away from real basketball for seven weeks. It was back in June — when Whitmore scored 30 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in a win for Team USA in the final of the U18 FIBA Americas Championships — that he last played a competitive game. He hadn't played a minute of basketball in a college environment.

The list went on.

Even when it was decided that Whitmore would make his debut on Saturday, it was inside an NBA arena that housed an announced crowd of more than 17,000 and against a veteran Big 12 team on a six-game winning streak.

All of those cautions were contextual fodder when Whitmore, a 6-foot-7, 232-pound wing from Maryland ranked among the best players in the 2022 freshman class, quickly rose from the bench less than three minutes into the game and went to the scorer's table to check in.

And with all that context, Neptune said he was "shocked" at how well Whitmore played. His final stat line in 20 minutes (he was on a minutes restriction): seven points on 3-of-7 shooting (1-for-4 from three-point range); three rebounds; three steals; two turnovers. He finished plus-4.

"Normal human beings would've been just completely discombobulated," Neptune said. "To his credit, I think he gave us a big boost, especially defensively."

Whitmore said he felt some nerves coming into the game, and they showed during his first stint on the court. He missed his first three shots and, with his thumb taped, looked a bit uncomfortable controlling the ball.

When he checked in the second time, with six minutes left in the first half, it became clear what Whitmore's presence in the lineup means for a Wildcats team that entered the game on a four-game losing streak and still is searching for an identity under first-year coach Neptune.

Neptune praised Whitmore's defense. The first defensive possession after he checked in for the second time showed what Villanova can be with Whitmore on the floor. Oklahoma used a screen at the top of the key that forced forward Brandon Slater — playing the "5" in Villanova's small-ball lineup — to help out on the wing. It freed Oklahoma big man Tanner Groves to release toward the basket. But Whitmore read it perfectly, dove into the passing lane, and grabbed the first of his three steals. A fast break the other way ended with an open Mark Armstrong three-pointer that capped a 10-0 Villanova run and pulled the Wildcats within one.

The next offensive possession, Whitmore, 18, drilled a step-back three-pointer from the wing, his first collegiate basket. He also got Villanova's next bucket when he drove right at 6-9 forward Jacob Groves, a 210-pound, 21-year-old senior, and used his body to force separation for an easy layup.

With five-star freshman Cam Whitmore healthy, Villanova's 'room for growth' just got a lot bigger

Whitmore's athleticism and talent — he's a projected NBA lottery pick and could be Villanova's first one-and-done player since Tim Thomas — were obvious.

But even more critical for a 3-5 Villanova team, with work to do to get back into the NCAA Tournament picture and a grueling Big East schedule just two weeks away, was what Whitmore did for Neptune's rotations. The Wildcats went smaller a few times without big man Eric Dixon on the floor and used Whitmore and Slater's ranginess in the frontcourt. Whitmore a few times played at the tip of Villanova's 1-2-2 press. Other times he was in the middle. When the Wildcats switched defensively with Whitmore on the floor, they had fewer mismatches.

Neptune had said that the early part of this season, with or without Whitmore in the lineup, would be about figuring out the team's rotations. Villanova has three "wily veterans," (a fourth if you count injured guard Justin Moore), Neptune said, and then a lot of younger, inexperienced guys.

"When you have a young team, guys can get a lot better," Neptune said. "Your room for growth is much more."

Neptune was speaking generally, but Saturday made clear that the room for growth is much larger with Whitmore than it was without him.

Late in the second half of the Villanova-St. Joseph's game, a text came in.

"Slowly ... becoming a Chris Arch guy"

The texter has seen a lot of Villanova basketball games.

I texted back: "Welcome"

I don't know if I qualify as a Chris Arcidiacono "guy," but I've certainly seen his value in key spots for Villanova over recent seasons, and think he deserves a little more affection from 'Nova's own fan base. I didn't have him playing the fourth-highest total of minutes on 'Nova's team so far this season. But I also didn't have Arcidiacono with the highest KenPom.com offensive rating so far among Villanova's top 2022-23 regulars while also being one of his team's better perimeter defenders.

That brings us to a chicken/egg question.

Would Chris Arch have as high a rating, thus bringing more value to his team, if he shot a little more, or would his value decrease?

Evidence provided Saturday on Hawk Hill says maybe just a little more would bring a little more. Obviously, the evidence gets skewed a bit when you take three three-pointers and make them all ... but when one of those threes is a late dagger during a close game, that's a piece of evidence, too.

When nobody on either team forces as many fouls as the seven Chris Arch forced from St. Joe's during Villanova's 71-64 victory ... evidence.

Four assists with zero turnovers ... more evidence.

'He's a gamer'

Brandon Williams doesn't need any evidence. The Philly Pride travel-team coach has always been a Chris Arch guy.

"He's a gamer in a winner's body," Williams messaged after the St. Joe's game.

The rest of what Williams messaged gives more insight into this player's 'Nova career: "He'll never try to do more than what he's asked to do, but he'll never shy away from a big moment. And his intangibles ..."

Williams listed heart, leadership, and love for the game.

"... never leave his side."

The St. Joe's game hit a sweet spot in terms of Arch contributions. There were times early in the season as 'Nova struggled when maybe the 6-foot-4 senior passed up looks that were worth taking ... He has taken only

eight two-point shots all season, made only two. If those are the instructions, fine. But you want defenses worrying about all of your offensive players, and if they don't have to worry about Arcidiacono from certain spots on the floor, that can be an issue.

Let's get to another bottom line: This game indicated that Villanova needs him. Arch's turnover rate is second to Eric Dixon among the 'Nova regulars. As new players are assimilated into the offense, that steady hand shouldn't be dismissed, whatever his minutes.

Also, that three-pointer from up top for a 66-57 lead with 2 minutes, 20 seconds left after a crucial Caleb Daniels offensive rebound isn't the first big shot Arcidiacono has hit in his career. He took only one shot last season in a jump ball of a game with Seton Hall, a similar deal to this, after a scramble and a pass out. Swish.

Arcidiacono said himself that the last few of those seven forced fouls came when St. Joe's had to foul late. True, but the other ones, he legit forced with his own body control, in a game when such things mattered, since this afternoon was no E-ZPass ride to a 6-5 record.

Afterward, it seemed obvious which players Villanova would bring into the postgame news conference. Brandon Slater had made a career-high five three-pointers to lead 'Nova with 19 points. Eric Dixon had 16 points and 12 rebounds, but that's what the Wildcats have come to expect from their big man. Chris Arch's 14 points ... Let's guess he'd walk into the press room with Slater. He did.

"I just got done telling our staff — he's been terrific," St. Joe's coach Billy Lange said in his own presser just before, although his own guard, sophomore Erik Reynolds, had been the star of the game, with 27 points. "This is not [an] accident. He's had a great career here. Part of that is, he's grown up under leadership and guidance from guys like Collin Gillespie and Jermaine Samuels and it passes on down the line."

Part of it was hit on by the St. Joe's student section. In case you didn't know, Chris has an older brother named Ryan, who did a thing or two at Villanova, including in the last 4.7 seconds of the 2016 NCAA title game. Lange also mentioned, "Great family, he's got great pedigree."

Ignoring the chants

Fast forward to Chris at the foul line a number of times late in Saturday's game, facing the St. Joe's student section as he shot.

"Ryan's better," the Hawks fans slow-chanted.

That in itself was kind of funny since the average St. Joe's student was 12 or 13 years old when Ryan Arch finished his great 'Nova career with that famous pass to Kris Jenkins.

Hey, Ryan was better than 99 percent of the players that have ever put on a uniform at any Big 5 school. Deciding on 'Nova, Chris knew such chants would be baked into his career. They'd be a good thing, since it would mean he'd be on the court. He didn't hesitate to sign on.



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“I think that’s who he’s been all season,” Villanova coach Kyle Neptune said Saturday when asked about Arcidiacono being a steadying influence on this game. “His entire career, he knows exactly what we do here. He was literally born into it. He knows exactly what we expect from him and he always comes out and tries to execute.”

It wouldn’t be a shock to see his minutes come down if Justin Moore is on the court later in the season. Maybe Arch takes a backseat again, who knows. Also, the continuing maturation of freshman guard Mark Armstrong is important for Villanova. This game, ‘Nova’s three big-time freshmen — Armstrong, Cam Whitmore and Brendan Hausen — combined for only 10 points. The vets took charge of this one.

Did Chris hear the chants?

“Yeah, I heard it, but I just focus on the game,” Arcidiacono said. “I’ve been dealing with that for forever. ... The team helped me out with that, and I think I did a good job, too.”

He was stone-faced out there ... no salute to the SJU students after made free throws.

“I’m just so locked into the game — but I do hear it,” Arcidiacono said.

Quieting the crowd. Does that motivate him?

“No, anything that motivates me comes from the game,” Arch said. “I try not to worry about anything on the outside. You’re going to have outside noises and forces coming at you in every single game at every arena.”

The ball in his hands ...

“Nothing new,” he said.

Maybe the only questionable decision Arcidiacono made was at the very end. He had an open layup, 15 seconds left. He pulled it back out, got fouled two seconds later, made one of two free throws for the final point of the game. Not a crazy play, done for the right reasons — selfless in fact, trying to burn off seconds. The risk-reward just might have been better taking the shot. By now, Chris Arch has earned the right to take the shot.

Veteran leadership has Villanova on right path

RADNOR – Finals are over and the non-conference schedule is complete. Now Villanova can concentrate on the 20-game gauntlet that is the Big East.

That's going to be the true test of whether or not the Wildcats are worthy of the NCAA tournament, something Villanova has not missed since 2012.

The league schedule makers didn't do Villanova any favors, pitting the Wildcats against a red-hot St. John's squad, No. 2 Connecticut and No. 24 Marquette to get conference play started. At least the games against the Red Storm and Golden Eagles are at home.

Since every game is a test, the Wildcats passed the first one with flying colors, with a 78-63 victory over the Red Storm at the Pavilion Wednesday night.

It wasn't pretty. Games against St. John's never are because of the style the Red Storm likes to play. They want to make the game chaotic with pressure defense and an up-tempo offense. And early on, the Red Storm dictated the tempo and opened up a 29-18 lead with 6:16 left in the first half.

But as they have done ever since the calendar changed from November to December, the Wildcats did not panic. They maintained their cool under St. John's relentless pressure.

"I was really proud of our guys' poise, especially the back half of the first half and into the second half," Villanova coach Kyle Neptune said.

Poise is a Villanova trademark and it's been on display of the past three weeks as the Wildcats have put together a five-game winning streak to offset a 2-5 start, the worst in 30 years. So what has changed in that short span?

Nothing, redshirt junior Eric Dixon said.

"We just come in every day with a growth mindset," Dixon said. "We all believe in each other. We've never given up on each other. We've never had a doubt that we could be a good basketball team and we still have a ways to go."

There's no question the Wildcats are a better team than the one that ended November three games under .500.

Cam Whitmore's return from the injured list certainly helped. He missed the first seven games with a broken thumb. Moving freshman Mark Armstrong into the starting lineup and bringing sophomore Jordan Longino off the bench has made a difference, too. Longino has a year under his belt and having a player with some experience coming off the bench is better than relying on all freshmen in a reserve role.

But it has been the steady play of the upperclassmen, Caleb Daniels, Brandon Slater, Eric Dixon and Chris Arcidiacono that has allowed the Wildcats to turn things around.

That's the way it is at Villanova. Upperclassmen lead the way. That hasn't changed under Neptune, which isn't a



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surprise since much of what he learned about the coaching profession came at Jay Wright's side.

Arcidiacono came up huge down the stretch in Villanova's win over Saint Joe's last Saturday, and was solid against the Red Storm. He had five assists and just one turnover in 31 minutes against the Red Storm's pressure.

Dixon and Slater have been big in the past two games, too. Dixon followed up a 16-point, 12-rebound effort against the Hawks with 18 points, six boards, two assists and a blocked shot against the Red Storm.

Slater, meanwhile, appears to have found his offensive rhythm. He finished with 16 points. That came on the heels of a season-high 19 point effort against Saint Joe's.

While their offensive production has been solid, it's on the defensive end where the Wildcats have made the most improvement. Teams were scoring 71 points per game and shooting 45.5 percent overall and 37.9 percent from 3-point range after seven games. The Wildcats have cut those numbers to 67.1, 43.3 and 34.9 in just five games.

Again, that comes from the upperclassmen showing the younger guys the way it's done and that's what Daniels, Slater, Dixon and Arcidiacono have been doing like those who came before them.

The Wildcats have a long way to go before you can start talking about whether or not they have what it takes to be an NCAA tournament team, but the upperclassman are making sure the team is headed in the right direction.

"Veteran leadership is always the best way to go," Neptune said. "Thank God we've got those guys."

Assessing Kyle Neptune during a tough rookie season at Villanova

Let's imagine an alternate scenario last spring at Villanova after Jay Wright retired. A national search. Find the most accomplished coach available, no ties to 'Nova required.

The results this season may have been similar.

Start with not having Justin Moore, which means your three best players from last season are gone. Throw in a Justin Longino injury. It's hard to overstate the importance of that. Even when Longino plays, I'm told he's not practicing. Last season, I had Longino as the 'Nova player most likely to have a strong NBA career. I expected that to translate to a big step up this season, to him being more of a 'Nova weapon. Not having that puts more pressure on the rest.

We can't know what Villanova's record this season would have been under Coach Alternate Scenario, but I'm not thinking it would be pretty. I don't think it would be too pretty under Wright.

That's assuming all the players stayed and the recruits still showed up with a different coach. A massive assumption in this day and age.

Now imagine Villanova fans asking questions about why Villanova had to go find something new and shiny instead of trying to run it back with a former Wright assistant.

Booooooooo

It could have easily played out this way. It wasn't like Kyle Neptune was the automatic heir apparent. Villanova honchos could have stayed the course in a different way with associate head coach George Halcovage. They could have reached back to the recent past and gone with Quinnipiac coach Baker Dunleavy, a former top Wright assistant who may have been the choice except Quinnipiac hasn't reached the NCAA Tournament under Dunleavy.

Neither did Fordham last year, but Neptune improved the Rams in his one year in the Bronx and was heavily involved in recruiting the current players on the 'Nova roster.

Maybe the school did toss around the idea of going after a big-name head coach, but which of those big names would have wanted to follow Wright?

All that, old business. Neptune has the job. He seems to have the loyalty of former players, no small thing.

Listen, and you'll hear it's not all sweetness and light at the Pavilion. Even if you were booing the coach and his substitution moves, not the players, a couple of times at the end of the Georgetown game, there was booing, game on the line. Sure, Neptune needs to be able to take getting his moves questioned. Neptune is well compensated to take some heat. (And he grew up in Brooklyn.)

Maybe you are entitled, since you've had to pay a 10-year seat licensing fee just to buy your tickets in the updated Finneran Pavilion. Villanova hoops is big business now. The team was .500 but the building was full. But



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it also sounds entitled.

If Neptune wanted another ball handler, specifically Chris Arcidiacono, in there for offense once his team had a narrow late lead and wanted star freshman Cam Whitmore back in for defense — the moves didn't backfire. You can also see Neptune placing more trust in freshman guard Mark Armstrong paying dividends.

The rationale for giving Neptune the job, to provide continuity, has not paid off in ... ho, hum, another NCAA team. What that means: Neptune now has to prove himself, and his era will not be looked at as a continuation of the Wright era. A blessing or a curse? To be determined.

Yes, it has been ugly this season. What exactly does this 9-10 Villanova team do well? ("Shoot free throws" was the answer I got asking this on press row. But that's about it.) While the offense often hasn't looked cohesive — personally, I'd rather see more offense run through Eric Dixon — the defensive struggles have been the real killer.

When Neptune looks at himself, how does he think he's done? What can he get better at doing?

"Eh, I think every coach would tell you, every game, you think of all the things you can get better at," Neptune said.

For instance?

"Everything," Neptune said. "Literally everything. Whatever it is. Defensively, we can get better. Offensively. Our habits can get better. I think that's the mark of a good coach, when they're never satisfied. Even if we were undefeated right now, I would be like, 'We can better, somehow.' For me personally, I'm always looking to get better in every facet of the game."

He's not giving up any debates he's had with himself, but he's not whistling past Villanova's record.

"It's tough, man," Neptune said. "I'm not going to lie. Everyone — you're in this business because you're a competitor. Everyone loves to win, everyone hates to lose. I'm no different. After a loss, you're sick, hurt like everybody else."

There's always a tendency to want to see more of a hyped young player. I got plenty of emails and messages in 2018-19 suggesting that playing a sophomore named Gillespie over a freshman named Quinerly was a mistake. Sticking with Collin Gillespie worked out all right for 'Nova.

If Neptune had known Moore wasn't going to be back right now, Longino wasn't going to be Longino this season, Whitmore was going to have his own early physical setback ... could he have looked back and said 'Nova could use some help from the transfer portal?

"I think it's easy to go hindsight," Neptune said. "I think if you have that team, that's a pretty formidable team. We just trusted our guys. I mean, looking at this year, even with all the injuries we've had, we've been in every



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game, we've had a chance in every game."

It's hard to say if that will make people feel better or worse about the record and not winning more 50-50 games.

"We know that's one stop, one rebound, one time diving on the floor, etc." Neptune said. "If you add all those guys, who knows. But we've just got to think, we are where we are now, we've just got to get better."

One challenge, Neptune said: "In today's game, not a lot of teams play young guys."

He's got older guys, too. Maybe he's preaching patience not so much with the young guys as with his use of them.

"It's pretty unique for Villanova," Neptune said. "Everybody kind of talks about how we don't play younger guys. We've got three [first-year] guys out there in the rotation. I think they're good enough to be out there. They're getting better day by day. What Cam does now I think is impressive. Mark Armstrong is a beast defensively, especially on the perimeter. As those guys get better — their best basketball is way ahead of them. They're good and they have so much room for improvement."

Judging a coach on his first season ... too soon. Can we all agree on that?

Will Neptune get this all together? Who can know? But how does booing a coach in his first year help answer the question?

Hard lessons for Cam Whitmore in what might be his lone season at Villanova

Let's get the most important thing out of the way, because it bears repeating over and over: Cam Whitmore is 18 years old and won't turn 19 until July.

The 6-foot-7 Villanova freshman is an adult, but in so many ways he's just a kid, navigating his first season playing college basketball with NBA draft lottery expectations hanging over every move he makes like a cloud.

He arrived at Villanova — recruited by Jay Wright as one of the highest-rated prospects in program history — as most 2023 NBA mock drafts slotted him in the top 10, especially after his MVP performance for Team USA in the U18 FIBA Americas championships.

Whitmore entered the 2022-23 season slated to be Villanova's first real one-and-done since Tim Thomas.

And based on most mock drafts, that reality is still the most likely one. They still project Whitmore to go in the lottery, and most have him inside the top 10, some even in the top five.

But the path hasn't been perfect. Whitmore acknowledged some difficulties this season, saying last week that his time at Villanova has been "a struggle, to be honest."

"He probably came in with one of the craziest surroundings and all the hype ... that can get in someone's head," said veteran Villanova forward Brandon Slater. "With all of that coming at you, he's handled that really well. I don't know if me, as a freshman, I could handle it like that."

Whitmore, who missed the first seven games with a thumb injury, made his debut and impacted the game in an early December win over Oklahoma, scored 21 points against Penn and had a highlight-reel dunk (the first of many) in his second game, then went for 19 in a win over Boston College. Those represented some of the early highs.

There have been lows, too. Whitmore looked out of sorts and shot just 3-for-10 with three turnovers in 19 minutes in a narrow win over St. Joseph's. He looked overmatched at times — six points on seven shots and three fouls in 22 minutes — in a tough road environment in a loss to Connecticut. That game provided Whitmore with his "welcome to college basketball" moment, he said Thursday. It happened when he drove to the basket and had his shot attempt swatted by UConn junior Andre Jackson.

Then, after being the Wildcats' best offensive player in the first half vs. Marquette at home, Whitmore turned it over a few times early in the second half and was seemingly benched over the final seven minutes while Villanova struggled to score.

"Put in Whitmore!" fans shouted at coach Kyle Neptune.

Whitmore again looked outmatched at times Friday night at Madison Square Garden in what turned into a sloppy, physical Big East game. Star lottery pick? He was just one of the guys, making two baskets on 10 shots while turning it over four times in a 57-49 win against St. John's.



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In the five games before that, however, Whitmore played 31.8 minutes per game while averaging 15 points and grabbing 3.6 rebounds and 2.0 steals. He shot 10 of 20 from beyond the three-point arc and 53% from the field in the four games before Friday.

It had been his best stretch, but Villanova hadn't beaten a team not named Georgetown during it.

So, where do things stand with Whitmore, and how do we evaluate whether his 13 games have been a success for Villanova — and him — or not?

Not yet seasoned

Allan Ray spent a lot of his youth playing against older competition, including in pickup games on New York City playgrounds. But when Ray started practicing with his Villanova teammates as a freshman in 2002, all it took was one hard screen to separate his shoulder.

“The thing that stands out most is the physicality,” said Ray, who played one season with the Boston Celtics before spending more than a decade playing professionally overseas. “You’ll go to the lane and your opponent is so much stronger than you. They can snatch the ball out of your hands.”

Even Whitmore, at 232 pounds, has had some adjusting to do. The Big East is chock-full of experienced players.

Neptune called Whitmore a “young 18 years old.” Whitmore missed most of Villanova’s summer workouts while with Team USA and then was injured in the weeks leading up to the season. While Villanova is 20 games into its season, Whitmore has barely hit the midway point when it comes to practices and games.

“I feel like Cam is a raw talent that isn’t really seasoned yet,” said Ray, who watches every Villanova game and relays his thoughts via Twitter. Ray said he’d like to see Whitmore improve his off-ball defense and slow down a little more.

There have been NBA flashes, though. Plenty of them. Ray acknowledged one on a basket Whitmore didn’t even make. It was a December game against Boston College, and Whitmore split a double team with a low dribble, then got into the lane and elevated for a one-handed dunk. He was fouled, however.

“I was like, ‘Wow,’” Ray said.

Slater has seen a few of those “wow” moments this year, too.

“It stands out to you how athletic he is,” Slater said of Whitmore. “His body is just way more developed for an 18-year-old than normal or what you usually see.”

A ‘selfless’ presence

Neptune has had more one-on-one teachable moments with Whitmore than any other player on the team. Those moments have occurred after pulling Whitmore out of a game quickly following a mistake, outside of the hud-

dle during a media timeout, and even while Whitmore is on the floor.

The mere fact that Whitmore was on the floor for defensive purposes down the stretch in a home win against Georgetown last Monday was a step in the right direction, even if it came at the expense of Neptune being booed for subbing out Whitmore for Chris Arcidiacono on offense, a move Neptune said was made to put more ball handlers on the floor to break Georgetown's pressure.

"There's a lot of people in his situation that would try to make it all about themselves," Neptune said. "I think he's done a great job trying to buy in and learn our concepts and coming out and making his best effort to execute what we ask him to execute. That's all we can ask of him."

Asked to evaluate Whitmore after last Monday's win over Georgetown, Slater said the freshman is "very selfless and he wants to get better. He wants to win."

That showed when Whitmore dove on the floor for a loose ball against the Hoyas. Yet it hasn't always looked like that. Whitmore at times has looked disengaged both on the court and on the bench.

Over the last few weeks, however, he seems more lively and engaged with his teammates.

"As long as you have that want, especially a talented guy like Cam, it just helps the team in so many ways," Slater said. "His energy, his defense, his rebounding, him being active ... certain stuff like that, it matters and helps a lot for a team that might not have many players because of injuries."

The "selfless" part also included Christmas gifts, as Whitmore, who has NIL deals, gave Beats by Dre headphones to his teammates in December.

What scouts are saying

Whitmore said recently that he's not focused on his NBA draft rankings.

"I'm in college right now," Whitmore said. "That's a couple more months [away]. I'm learning the system and learning how to play [at Villanova]."

Asked to evaluate his game, Whitmore said he'd like to continue improving his jump shot and tighten up his handle. Whitmore has 27 turnovers compared to just 10 assists.

But even if Whitmore says he's not thinking about it, others around him probably are. And so are NBA personnel. There have been plenty of pro scouts at Villanova games this season.

The Inquirer asked a few NBA scouts after the Georgetown game to assess where Whitmore is and how he impacted his draft stock over his first 12 games. The scouts, of course, spoke on the condition of anonymity.

"I think it's been a tough go for him," one wrote in a text message. "Between the injury, roster fit around him and some of his on-court habits, he definitely hasn't helped himself. He is still very much a first-round pick but



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there's not the same level of momentum that he had coming off his all-star game performances last spring."

Another scout said Whitmore is "obsessed with scoring."

"He's capable, but he's not an elite scorer," the scout wrote. "Improved shooter. Guards the ball. Lost off the ball. Needs to pass it some. A real talent. Tad small."

Where does he fit in the draft order?

"Draft is fluid," that scout said. "Cam, like others, will move up and down. Never thought he was 8. 12 to 15 felt right. Maybe in June, he's 8."

The scout pointed to three of Whitmore's last four games before Friday: "Zero, one, and two rebounds. Can't happen."

The fourth of those games, however, was the Jan. 13 loss at Butler. Whitmore took just eight shots (including the attempts he was fouled on), but he grabbed eight rebounds to go with his 12 points and three steals. He grabbed another seven rebounds Friday, after the scout's assessment.

And in the two-rebound performance, an 88-80 loss to Xavier, Whitmore had a season-high 26 points on 11-of-18 shooting, including 3-for-7 from beyond the arc.

It's the perfect example of where things stand with Whitmore. Even when he tried to do everything he could to will Villanova to a much-needed signature win on its home floor — scoring from deep and showing off his athleticism above the rim — he's supposed to do more. That's the complicated reality for a teenager taking part in a complicated Villanova season.

More than an hour before Villanova and Georgetown tipped off in an early January Big East game, Capital One Arena in Washington was fairly quiet. There was some music playing while players on both teams shot around and worked on individual drills, but the arena was mostly empty.

On the Villanova end of the floor, sophomore reserve forward Trey Patterson was the only scholarship player shooting at one point, the rest of his teammates back in the locker room preparing for what would be a Villanova win.

All of them, except Collin O'Toole, a walk-on. Things are never really quiet when O'Toole is around and there is work to be done.

"Let's go!" O'Toole yelled as Patterson put shots up. "Do what we do! Forty minutes, blue!"

He was essentially talking to one player, but it didn't matter. It was the same voice and same energy then as it was more than an hour later when the ball was tipped.

"That's just what we do," O'Toole said. "It's almost like a habit at this point. When someone is there with you, you just have to try to motivate them and share energy and get them ready."

"Really, it's just trying to share energy through yelling to get their nervous system going."

It might get their nervous system going, but it takes a toll on his voice.

"You just kind of get used to it," O'Toole said. "It's kind of weird. It's almost like my body and voice is almost trained. It'll be gone today and then come back. It's gone the day after and comes back. It's almost like it knows what it's doing."

He takes a steady dose of cough drops and lozenges, too, about 30 a week, he estimated.

If you've been at a Villanova game this season, you've probably heard the hoarse voice on the bench or during warmups. To this 'Nova team, those are just the dulcet sounds of O'Toole, the lone walk-on and loudest person in a Wildcats uniform, a coach's son who hopes his time at Villanova will prepare him for a coaching future of his own.

Like father, like son

So, why is O'Toole here at Villanova and not in Pittsburgh, where his father, Tim, is the associate head coach on Jeff Capel's staff?

Beyond the obvious nepotism angle — "I wanted to try to go out on my own and learn something for myself," the player said — Villanova had been a draw for O'Toole for years. Even when he was a 12-year-old living in California while Tim was on the staff at Stanford (before he coached at Cal), O'Toole watched from afar. For his younger years, he was closer, as the family lived in the northeast while Tim was the head coach at Fairfield while Jay Wright was building Villanova into a national power.

He liked what he heard about the culture, the coaching, and how tight-knit the players were. Then, when he was accepted into the university and visited, he “fell in love.”

O'Toole spent last season, his freshman year, as a practice player and joined the active roster this season.

College is supposed to be what prepares a student for their future as it is, but for O'Toole, who wants to be a coach, being a Villanova walk-on is like having the best possible internship. He's basically just a player-coach who doesn't play. His duties include mastering the scouting report, knowing what Villanova's next opponent is going to do so he can run it against his teammates in practice. He has to be a positive force in the locker room.

“He knows everything we do,” Villanova coach Kyle Neptune said. “We have a saying that everyone's role is different, but everyone's status is the same. No matter who you are in the program, what you do for us is extremely important.”

O'Toole has to be available, sometimes at off hours. O'Toole said he worked a lot this summer with Eric Dixon, who would ask him to come to the gym and rebound for him. That would happen from, say, 9 to 10 p.m., then Brandon Slater would shoot from 10:30 to 11:30. More recently, he has helped Justin Moore work out on his road to recovery from Achilles surgery in March.

Slater said he can see the coach's son side of O'Toole in “the way he just demands respect from you.”

Slater wanted to make one thing clear, too, when talking about O'Toole: “He's a really good basketball player.” Slater pointed to a recent practice for proof. There are people at Villanova's practices tasked with tracking stats, and one day O'Toole had more rebounds during a practice than anyone else. O'Toole is listed at 6-foot-1.

Just another example of a coach's son, Slater said.

“He knows how to move his body and get into spots,” Slater said. “The things he says and the words he uses. He'll pull me aside and tell me what happened on a play [if] I didn't see that on that play.”

The coach's son comes out in the voice, too. O'Toole said his father is “out-of-his-mind nuts, one of the most passionate guys I know.”

Like father, like son.

A Villanova tradition

O'Toole doesn't have to look very far both physically and into the future to see how his current role is a training ground for what could be next.

On Villanova's bench right now are a few people who took his path, including video coordinator Tim Saunders and graduate manager Kevin Voigt.

“I think being here is giving me an advantage and that’s part of the reason why I wanted to be here so bad,” O’Toole said.

There are others who weren’t walk-ons who went from a Villanova uniform to the Villanova bench, like Baker Dunleavy, now the head coach at Quinnipiac, and current assistants Mike Nardi and Dwayne Anderson.

For O’Toole and the others before him, however, it’s a bit different. Nardi and Anderson helped their teams reach Elite Eights and Final Fours, respectively. Success for O’Toole isn’t necessarily measured the same. O’Toole has checked into one game this season: the final seconds of a blowout win over Boston College in December.

“You’ve got to really put it into perspective,” Slater said. “This guy is sacrificing his life and time with his family, friends, and loved ones to be with us. He came back to practice with us during Christmas. He’s here during the break. He’s here with us grinding. And on top of that, he probably won’t get in.”

It’s a reality he chose. He watched some of his father’s teams when he was younger, and was always drawn to the role players and walk-ons, he said. In high school, playing at Pittsburgh Central Catholic and then at St. Thomas More School in Connecticut, he loved being the energy guy above all else.

“Everyone is a competitor,” O’Toole said. “Obviously they would love to play, but I have no issue finding motivation to do my job every day, and I love it.”

Don’t believe him? Just listen and watch. It won’t be hard to see or hear.

A little post-return pain symbolizes a gain for Villanova's Justin Moore

RADNOR — Justin Moore was sore Monday, which was to be expected. Such aches and pains come with playing your first basketball game in nearly 10 months, which is what Moore did Sunday in a 70-65 home loss to No. 17 Providence.

Afterward, the 6-foot-4 senior guard wasn't surprised that he was a little achy.

"That's what a recovery day is for," Moore said.

Moore was back at practice Tuesday as the Wildcats (10-11 overall, 4-6 Big East) prepared for what will be a difficult Midwest road trip. First up is a rematch with No. 14 Marquette (17-5, 9-2) Wednesday night in Milwaukee (8:30 p.m./FS1) followed by a showdown with surging Creighton Saturday night in Omaha, Neb. (7:30 p.m./FOX29).

Marquette is tied for first place in the Big East with Xavier and has won three straight over the Wildcats, including a 68-66 triumph at the Pavilion on Dec. 31. Creighton has won three of the last six meetings with the Wildcats, including the last two in Omaha.

Moore didn't play in the first meeting with the Golden Eagles. He saw 31 minutes in Sunday's loss to Providence, his first game in 309 days since rupturing his right Achilles tendon in last season's regional final victory over Houston. Moore scored five points, grabbed four rebounds and had four assists. While having Moore in the lineup did not result in a victory, it did give the team a huge lift.

"It was great," forward Eric Dixon said. "We've all been around him and seen how much work he's put in to get back on the floor. I think for us it was really exciting to see him out there, more so for him than anything else."

Moore's return gives the Wildcats another much-needed body and a veteran presence out on the floor that opened up opportunities for his teammates.

"He's Justin Moore," Dixon said. "Defenses pay a lot of attention to him. He's an All-American caliber of guy. Defenses are going to play him more so that's going to open more things up for us."

Freshman Cam Whitmore benefited from Moore's presence. The 6-7 forward tallied 21 points on 8-for-16 shooting overall and 4-for-8 from 3-point range.

"I think he adds everything to the lineup," Villanova coach Kyle Neptune said of Moore's presence. "You add a decision-maker. You add a shooter. You add someone they have to guard out there. Any time you add a player of that magnitude it changes everything. Guys can get easier opportunities."

"All the guys have to do just a little bit less. Caleb Daniels gets a couple more plays where he doesn't have to do all the heavy lifting. It makes it easier on Eric Dixon, and just right on down the line. Guys get easier opportunities and guys have to do just a little bit less."

While Moore is 100 percent physically it's going to take a little time for his game to reach that point. At times,



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he looked a little slow on defense and struggled to find his rhythm on offense. He was 2-for-8 overall and 0-for-4 from 3-point range.

“I think it was impressive,” Moore said of his performance. “Being able to hold my own out there, guys trying to attack me and stuff like that. To play that many minutes coming off an Achilles injury, not many people can do that, so I was really proud of myself.”

As for the future, that remains up in the air. Moore has one more year of eligibility thanks to the coronavirus pandemic. He could come back or leave and see what a pro career has in store for him.

“I’m not sure what I’m going to do,” Moore said. “I’m just focused on the now. I’m finally back playing and trying to contribute to the team.”

Villanova does not need to panic. It needs to remember its past

VILLANOVA, Pa. — While Eagles fans dissolutely drown themselves in a stream of pain-killing Bud Light, over in the city's leafy western suburban sports pocket, it all is feeling a bit too Ritz and riesling for a crowd more accustomed to its brie and chardonnay.

Villanova is 12-13, and a middling 6-8 in the Big East, trying to stave off the program's first losing season in 11 years, and in need of a New York miracle to keep its run of nine consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances alive. There are signs of life, courtesy of a two-game winning streak against DePaul and Seton Hall, but they are negligible gains for a fan base that has forgotten what it is to struggle.

Consequently, folks are itchy if not downright twitchy when it comes to first-year coach Kyle Neptune, and by extension, the Villanova brain trust. Once heralded as a smart and seamless decision to keep the roster intact, the transfer of power from Hall of Famer Jay Wright to his former assistant now is being labeled as arrogant, as if Villanova athletic administrators thought any old hamster could keep the wheel running smoothly.

Cocooned in the quiet of his office, Neptune sits at the conference table and appears legitimately at ease. He doesn't search for what people are saying, therefore he doesn't know — though he's smart enough to guess. When people ask how he's doing, telling him to ignore the naysayers? "That's when I know people are killing us."

To say that he doesn't care would be inaccurate because he cares deeply — just not about what people think of him. He cares that the outcomes aren't landing on the positive side of the ledger with more frequency, that he hasn't solved the riddle of the season just yet. But he's also not weeding into the morass of his mentions, or sulking at home, despondent that the sky is falling around him. His focus is considerably narrower. "How can we get better tomorrow?" he asks. "What can we do better in practice? How can we better prepare? That's it."

Which, to anyone skilled in the language of one Jerold Wright, ought to sound familiar. This is the same tact Wright took when things got bumpy early in his career and despite what people remember now, things did get bumpy. In fact what is happening to Neptune now is eerily similar to the start of Wright's run at Villanova, when people scoffed that Wright was in over his head, and nothing more than a fancy suit. Before they rode his coattails to Springfield, they got out the pitchforks for him, too.

Then, after that first hiccup of a few too many NITs passed, came the five consecutive years when Villanova steadfastly refused to get out of the first weekend of the NCAA Tournament. When no matter how high their seed was, how gaudy their record, the Wildcats could not get to the Sweet 16.

Everyone demanded answers then, too. Poked around on the Wildcats' failings, convinced that either the league wasn't good enough or the players weren't good enough or somehow the entire thing was systemically built to fall. Too reliant on 3s. Not tough enough. People would present their findings to Wright, and he would nod his head and maddeningly say over and over again that he didn't judge his team on its March performance. He only cared if players got better every day, and would measure their success on the totality of the season. It infuriated people who just wanted the guy to bleed a little bit.

Sound familiar? Like his predecessor, Neptune is the last person to tell the critics that they're wrong. He accepts



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the heat, the skepticism and the frustration but he's also as contentedly myopic as they are angry. "My goal is to constantly get better, and be the best team we can be by March," he says.

The question is: Can they?

The short answer is: They already are. And the reason is simple: Justin Moore. Those refusing to allow any wiggle room for Neptune's failures are also being almost willfully ignorant. Until Jan. 29, Neptune did not have his best player available, and until Saturday, when Jordan Longino returned from injury, did not have his entire roster at his disposal.

That impacts any team. That especially impacts Villanova. Wind back to 2003-04 again, to the season no one wants to compare to this season. That was Wright's third year, and people were done offering him a mulligan. He had four four-star players (Randy Foye, Allan Ray, Curtis Sumpter and Mike Nardi) and a McDonald's All American — though Jason Fraser played the bulk of the season on knees that would never be quite right during his collegiate career.

Yet with freshmen and sophomores making up the first seven in the rotation, those Wildcats learned the hard way that talent doesn't usually trump experience. They seemed to almost invent new ways to lose. Of the 15 regular-season games the Wildcats lost, 12 were decided by seven points or less. In the last four games that year they rallied from 17 down only to lose at the buzzer to Seton Hall; against Syracuse, Gerry McNamara hit six consecutive free throws in a five-point win; Emeka Okafor blocked Foye at the end of regulation and again in OT in a loss to UConn; 18 turnovers turned out to be the difference in a 3-point loss to Miami.

Fast forward to the present. Neptune has three four-star players (Eric Dixon, Brandon Slater and Moore) though his five-star, McDonald's All-American, Cam Whitmore, also missed most of preseason practice plus the first seven games with a thumb injury. There is talent, but there is inexperience. Villanova is young — the 10th youngest team in the Big East (only Marquette is less experienced) and No. 162 nationally — and incredibly so by its own standards.

Only once in the last nine years have the Wildcats been younger (in 2020 when Villanova finished 18-7 before COVID-19 shut everything down). It is even younger when you consider that, of the "returning Final Four team" critics crow that Neptune inherited, the leading scorer in every single NCAA Tournament game either is gone (Collin Gillespie and Jermaine Samuels graduated) or could not play (Moore). Of the returning players aside from Moore, Dixon averaged 8.3 points per game and Caleb Daniels 10.5 in the five tourney games. "We had older guys who needed experience in certain roles, and young guys who needed experience, period," Neptune says. "That's our reality."

That's not Villanova's typical reality. Since an intentional paradigm shift following a discouraging 13-19 finish in 2012 when Wright thought he got caught chasing talent instead of fit, Villanova has not been a program built on the dizzying tower of one-and-done talent. It's been erected steadily and carefully, one elder statesman (usually a guard) passing the torch to the next. From Foye to Gillespie there was always someone ready.

And then ... hard stop. The player up next tore his Achilles in the Elite Eight. Heading into his senior season,



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with 78 starts under his belt and a steady rise in minutes played and points scored, it was Moore's turn. He would be the wizened guy that the Wildcats always seem to have, the one opponents moaned had been around forever. Instead, he made his 2022-23 debut in the 21st game of the season.

By Neptune's evaluation, Moore is still only about 60 percent healthy. Yet the coach says, given the chance to start a team, he'd start with Moore. "Sixty percent of Justin Moore is that valuable," Neptune says. "He's our best defender. He's our best decision maker. He's our most intelligent guy and he's our most versatile. He can guard anybody."

The numbers tell the story. Per CBB Analytics, from Nov. 7 to Jan. 20, when Moore wasn't available, Villanova:

- Ranked in the 38th percentile in defensive efficiency
- 18th percentile in assists per game
- 16th percentile in field goals attempted
- 44th percentile in 3-point field goal percentage (33.5)
- 39th percentile in defensive effective field goal percentage (51.3)
- 55th percentile in 3-point percent defense (35 percent)

In the last five games with Moore in the lineup, let's rerun the numbers:

- 80th percentile in defensive efficiency
- 99th percentile in assists per game
- 82nd percentile in field goals attempted
- 92nd percentile in 3-point field goal percentage (35.6)
- 96th percentile in defensive effective field goal percentage (40)
- 86th percentile in 3-point percent defense (28.2)

"He just makes things easier," Neptune says.

The beauty of college basketball is that every sin of the season's first four months can be forgiven in March. Villanova will require a hefty dose of good fortune to reach absolution. Its lone path to the NCAA Tournament runs through Madison Square Garden and the Big East tournament.

Neptune isn't even thinking about it. He's holed up, looking for incremental improvements. Like that team 19 years ago, the Wildcats have been in virtually every game. Of the Wildcats' 13 losses this year, 11 have been by nine points or fewer. Which can be drunk from a glass half empty (they lost) or full (they were in it). Neptune, no surprise, is keying on the latter. He remembers watching film of close losses with Wright. Everyone else would do what everyone else does — watch the frantic last few possessions — except for Wright. "Yeah, well, what about the other 38 minutes?" he'd ask.

Not long ago Father Rob Hagan, the team chaplain, shared a homily with his team. Hagan has been at this a while, so blending hoops, hopes and homilies comes pretty easily. Well aware of the Wildcats' struggles to finish games, he talked about boiling water. The message stuck with Neptune so much that, mid sentence, he walks



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over to his desk to grab his phone and fact check.

Water, he explains, boils at 212 degrees. Hagan's point? One degree less and it doesn't boil. "So it's not the last play," Neptune says. "Maybe it's a missed offensive rebound on the first possession, or a steal, or a turnover, or a dive for a loose ball when you didn't dive. We had to get better in those moments. And I think we are. You can't complain. You can't say we didn't have enough because we were in it, so clearly we did. Maybe our margin for error is small, but we have enough. We just have to concentrate on what we can control — one practice, one game at a time.'

Jay Wright couldn't have said it better.

Can Villanova get back in NCAA picture? Hmm.

As Villanova finished off Creighton, an NBA scout wondered out loud, “Could they win the Big East Tournament?”

The question of the moment, not just for 17,114 want-to-believers inside the Wells Fargo Center Saturday, but for the rest of the Big East, maybe hearing some footsteps, and for the greater college hoops world. Could they?

“Nobody wants to see that team in the Garden — nobody,” said Creighton coach Greg McDermott right after his team went down, 79-67.

It’s easy for the outside world, even an opposing coach, to say that. McDermott talked about how Villanova has “too many guys” who have experienced postseason success. But that muscle memory had been supplanted by opposite memories this season.

The relevant fact, beyond Villanova rounding into form at the right time, is whether ‘Nova players themselves believe it. These late-season games are beyond crucial for ‘Nova, after so many close losses all season. Until a week ago, the muscle memory just wasn’t there.

Tuesday, Villanova went to Xavier and gave the Musketeers their first Big East home loss. If Wildcats players are to believe in themselves in New York City next month, a road win like that against an NCAA-bound team was a necessity.

To believe they could string together some wins against the top teams ... this game Saturday was just as big. Xavier couldn’t be a one-off. Forget that stuff about the next game being the most important one. This one was the most important one. Could ‘Nova look like it belonged among the Big East teams headed for March Madness?

Well, yes.

Now, Villanova is capable of beating the upper-echelon teams. Two in a row suggests, add them to the list of teams capable of winning the whole thing in New York.

Maybe short of winning the Big East, the NCAA selection committee should look at how this is an entirely different team with Justin Moore back on the court and now in the flow of things. But that’s putting their fate in the hands of outsiders who will have varying opinions. In New York, Villanova controls its own fate.

It’s easy to say that, yes, when Eric Dixon makes six three-pointers and scores a career-high 31 points, Villanova is tough to beat. The Big East tournament will be a wild survival test for everyone. But this game went beyond one shining Dixon performance. Consider that Moore, who scored 25 at Xavier on Wednesday, was the perfect floor leader this time, from the start, working with Dixon on a two-man game that had Creighton’s defense guessing wrong.

Moore only had eight points, but the rest of his stat sheet told the story ... eight assists, zero turnovers. His dribble drives inside, keeping that dribble alive as he surveyed options – seemed like old times, since that’s what

Afterward, Wildcats coach Kyle Neptune harped on his defense getting the job done, and the D is much improved from early in the season. But the stat that stands out ... three turnovers for the game. None in the second half. This group believes in itself again.

You see up and down the lineup. Defenses can’t load up on Cam Whitmore, so the freshman found lanes to get 17 of his own. Fellow top rookie Mark Armstrong was huge off ‘Nova’s bench, scoring 11 points, using his quickness in the service of other details, such as getting on the floor for a second-half steal, grabbing a weak-side rebound, finding his own lanes to the hoop.

Dixon’s performance went beyond getting hot from the outside. He never forced any shots. About a dozen of his points came in immediate response to Creighton scoring. The Bluejays did not play a bad game of basketball. Yes, they missed 12 straight threes, from the first half into the second. But even as their shots didn’t fall they didn’t play panicky ball. They only committed six turnovers of their own.

“You know, we’ve got one of the elite defensive players at the rim,” McDermott said of 7-foot-1 Ryan Kalkbrenner. “Villanova was able to turn our defense inside-out with Dixon’s ability to stretch the floor. Then, once he hit some, we’re caught in between some, should we go, should we stay? Now we’re giving threes and we’re giving up layups. They did a great job of attacking us ... whenever we tried to switch something up, they had an answer for that as well.”

Whether it’s too late or not for this season ... we’ll soon find out. But nobody is dismissive of Villanova right now. They’ve flipped that script.

“You could see it coming as you watch them on film since Justin has returned,” McDermott said afterward. “Frankly, I was afraid of this.”
