GAME NOTES

The Lindenwood women's hockey team (3-13-0, 3-3-0 CHA) will close out the 2021 calendar year with a two-game series against St, Thomas (4-11-1, 2-11-1 WCHA). Game one on Friday is set for 7:10 p.m., while the series finale will begin at 2:20 p.m., all from Centene Community Ice Center in Maryland Heights, Mo.

Lindenwood and St. Thomas will meet for the first time this weekend. The Lions are coming off a series sweep of RIT by scores of 4-1 and 3-1, respectively.

The Lions' special teams was a key factor in picking up two wins last weekend, as Lindenwood netted five powerplay goals in the series, including three in the 4-1 win. Lindenwood was a perfect 8-8 on the penalty kill against the Tigers.

Lindenwood found late success in the second game against RIT when Maddison Stitt found the back of the net with two seconds remaining in the second frame to tie the game, 1-1. Stitt netted her second goal of the game late in the final frame, helping Lindenwood pick up the 3-1 victory.

Natalie Ferenc was strong in goal for Lindenwood as the West Bloomfield, Mich. native compiled a total of 40 saves, earning a pair of victories. The junior netminder has been between the pipes for all three wins by the Linns this season.

The Lions bring a balanced attack offensively, seeing seven players have three or more goals on the season. Valarie Caldwell leads the way with five tallies, while Megan Wagner and Sierra Burt have four apiece. Burt also has nine assists, which rank eighth best in the CHA.

St. Thomas enters the weekend with a record of 4-11-1, including a 2-11-1 mark inside WCHA play. The Tommies dropped both games of a home and home with Minnesota State last weekend and have lost sixconsecutive games.

SERIES HISTORY

Lindenwood and St. Thomas will meet for the first time in 2021-22. The Tommies are in their first season competing at the Division I level.

Before the jump to DI, the Tommies were Division III spending time in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference

This season, St. Thomas has compiled a record of 4-11-1, including a 2-11-1 mark inside the WCHA. Two of those win have come on the road, while two victories have come on home ice.

St. Thomas boasts 12 newcomers on this years roster including three transfers and nine freshman,

The Tommies are led offensively by Abby Promersberger who leads the team with six points on four goals and two assists so far this year. Luci Bianchi is second on the team in goals with three and points with five.

Alexa Dobchuk and Saskia Maurer have spit time between the pipes this season. Dobchuk leads the team in saves with 310, compiling an .896 save percentage and a 4.28 goals against average. Maurer boasts a 3.07 goals against average and a .919 save percentage so far this season.



HEAD COACH | SHELLEY LOONEY

Shelley Looney is entering her third season as the head coach of the Lindenwood women's ice hockey team in 2021-22.

Navigating the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020-21, the Lions finished 2-14-1 during the season, including a mark of 2-13-1 within the conference. The team picked up a series sweep at RIT, winning 2-0 in game one, and 5-1 in game two. Looney coached Annika Asplundh to CHA Goalie of the Week honors following the two-game series at RIT. Under Looney, Sierra Burt and Bailey Coyne both finished as the team leader in points with eight.

In her first season, Looney and the Lions compiled a record of 5-24-5, 3-15-2 CHA in 2019-20. The Lions claimed four CHA Player of the Week honors, including three CHA Goalie of the Week accolades. Lindenwood had a pair of players with double-digit points, including Sierra Burt who registered 11 assists to lead the team.

The Lions earned a 1-1 tie against No. 4 Clarkson University on October 25. Lindenwood earned a two-game sweep against RIT on January 17 and 18, posting wins of 3-0 and 2-0, respectively. It was the first time the Lions shutout a CHA opponent in back-to-back games since joining the league. Lindenwood registered a 3-2 victory over the top team in the conference, Mercyhurst, on February 7.





On November 1, 2019, Looney and the 1998 U.S. Women's Olympic Team was inducted into the 2019 U.S. Olympic & Paralympic Hall of Fame. Looney scored the game-winning goal in the gold medal game, to secure the country's first Olympic gold in women's hockey.

Looney came to Lindenwood after spending many years with USA Hockey, finding great success as a player and a coach. In 1998, Looney scored the game-winning goal to lead the United States to an Olympic gold medal in Nagano, Japan. Looney served as the head coach for the 2017 and 2019 World University Women's National Team. Looney was an assistant coach for the 2016 World University Women's Hockey National Team. She assisted the coaching staff for the 2010 U18 and 2004 U22 Women's National Teams. Looney has also worked as the Chief Evaluator at Annual District Development Camps, while serving as a head coach and coaching director of select development festivals.

In her five years prior to Lindenwood, Looney served as the Director of Hockey for the Buffalo Bison Youth Hockey Organization. Looney designed and implemented hockey development curriculum to help maximize the potential of boys and girls of all ages across 25 different teams. Looney was a key contributor in the player recruitment at all college levels.

In a feature aired on February 17, 2019 by NBC Sports, Looney was highlighted on the 21st anniversary of scoring the game-winning goal in the gold medal game of the 1998 Winter Olympics as part of celebrating 2019 Hockey Day in America. Looney and the Buffalo Bison hockey organization was recognized by Discover Card for their commitment to empower girls and women through sport. Discover Card awarded \$10,000 to the organization and arranged a day with the Stanley Cup for the youth program.


In 2016, Looney was named as the head coach of the girls' varsity ice hockey program at The Nichols School in Buffalo, N.Y., a top 10 private preparatory hockey programs in North America.

In 2015, Looney was co-head coach with the Buffalo Beauts of the National Women's Ice Hockey League (NWHL). The Beauts were one of four inaugural professional women's teams, which included four USA Hockey National Team players. Previously, the New Jersey Colonials brought Looney on board from 2006-12 as the girls coaching director.

Looney spent the 2004-05 season as the assistant coach of the University of Vermont. Prior to her time in Burlington, Looney was an assistant coach on the USA Hockey UI7 Boys National Team Development Program.

During her playing career, Looney won the gold medal at the 2005 IIHF Women's World Championships and a silver medal at the 2002 Olympic Games in Salt Lake City, Utah. Looney is a seven-time silver medalist at the IIHF Women's World Championships, and a two-time gold medalist at the IIHF 4 Nations Cup Tournament.

Looney earned her Bachelor of Science degree in recreation and leisure studies from Northeastern University.
