

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

The Lindenwood men's basketball team (7-9, 2-1 OVC) will return to Hyland Arena on Saturday for a 3:30 p.m. tipoff against Tennessee State (9-7, 1-2 OVC) for OVC action in St. Charles, Mo.

Lindenwood is coming off of an outstanding come-from-behind win over Little Rock on the road. The Lions were down by 20 points in the first half, but roared back to earn their second conference victory. Keenon Cole led the charge, as we went 8-of-10 from the field, including a perfect 5-of-5 from three-point range. Chris Childs dropped a team-high 23 points, as he was 50 percent from the floor and made all eight of his free-throw attempts, including four in the final 10 seconds.

Lindenwood won its second-consecutive game for the first time this season, as the Lions were previously on a three-game losing skid. After three conference games, Cole is boasting a scoring average of 17.3 points with 9.0 rebounds per game. A big part of his success is an outstanding 10-of-11 clip from behind the arc. Cam Burrell is averaging 11.1 points and 8.0 rebounds per contest, while Chris Childs has collected 14.0 point per game.

Tennessee State enters St. Charles after falling by nine points to SIUE on Thursday. The Tigers had a pair of 20-point scorers in Jr. Clay (22) and Marcus Fitzgerald Jr. (21). Clay leads the Tigers with 17.4 points per game, while Fitzgerald Jr. is right behind him with 15.4 points per night.

OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

PLAYER

Jacob Polakovich, F • 6-9, 245, Sr. • Grand Rapids, Mich. • Southern Indiana Polakovich had 27 points and 26 rebounds in the team's 86-81 win over Southeast Missouri on Thursday. It marked just the 11th 20/20 game by an OVC player over the past 13 years (and one of five at the Division I level this season). The 26 rebounds are the most by a NCAA player at any level this season (Division I, II or III), was one short of the USI single-game record and the most by an OVC player since before the 2002-03 season. In that win, he hit 11-of-18 field goals (61.1%) and 5-of-9 free throws while dishing out a career-high five assists and committing only one turnover in 39 minutes. He capped the week with nine points, 10 rebounds, two assists, a block and steal at Eastern Illinois. For the week Polakovich averaged 18.0 points, 18.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists/game while shooting 53.6 percent (15-of-28) from the field. He has tallied three double-digit rebounding games (including two 20-plus efforts) in his last four games. He currently leads the OVC in rebounding (11.1/game) and is fifth in field goal percentage (53.2%). Others Nominated: Dan Luers, Eastern Illinois; Cam Burrell, Lindenwood; Jordan Jefferson.

NEWCOMER

Keenon Cole, F • 6-7, 215, Jr. • Streamwood, III. • Lindenwood Cole, a transfer from Polk State, averaged 15.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.0 steals and 1.0 blocks/game while hitting 68.8 percent (11-of-16) from the field and 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from 3-point range in two games. The junior hit 4-of-5 3-pointers and was 8-of-10 overall from the field as the Lions topped Tennessee Tech 82-64 for its first OVC victory. Cole tallied 23 points and added seven rebounds and two steals in 19 minutes off the bench. He opened the week with eight points, nine rebounds and two blocks in 25 minutes at Eastern Illinois. Cole ranks second in the OVC in 3-point percentage (47.2%) and eighth in total field goal percentage (52.1%).

FRESHMAN

Chris Walker, G • 6-6, 195, R-Fr. • Wellington, Fla. • Little Rock Walker averaged 9.D points, 5.D rebounds and 2.D assists/game while hitting 4D percent (6-of-15) from the field and 3-of-3 from the free throw line in a pair of games. In the team's DVC-opening win over UT Martin, he came off the bench to score 11 points on 3-of-5 3-point shooting while adding three rebounds, one assist and one block. At Tennessee State he added seven points, a team-high seven rebounds and a team-best three assists in 19 minutes. It marks the third time this season he has been named DVC Freshman of the Week. Others Nominated: Kyle Thomas, Eastern Illinois; Jerome Beya, Tennessee Tech.

OTHER NOTABLE PERFORMANCES

Below are other notable performances from the past week.

- Mark Freeman (G, Sr.), Morehead State. Averaged 24.0 points/game including hitting 14-of-14 at the free throw line in two games. Had a careerhigh tying 30 points in road victory at Tennessee State (his former school).
- Cam Burrell (F, Sr), Lindenwood. Averaged 18.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks/game while hitting 57.7 percent (15-of-26) from the field. Had 19 points and 11 rebounds in win over Tennessee Tech.
- Jr. Clay (G, Grad.), Tennessee State. Moved into 10th place on the OVC career steals list during the week. Clay averaged 21.0 points, 5.5 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals/game and hit 50 percent (15-of-30) from the field and 50 percent (9-of-18) from 3-point range.
- KJ Simon (G, Sr.), UT Martin. Averaged 18.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks/game. Had season-highs of 24 points, seven rebounds and five 3-pointers against Little Rock.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Conference play began last week ... Home teams were 9-1 in the 10 games, with only Morehead State (at Tennessee State) winning on the road ... Eastern Illinois is the only team with a 2-0 Conference mark, with eight other teams are 1-1 ... This year, teams will play an 18-game round robin schedule ... Southern Indiana's Jacob Polakovich had 27 points and 26 rebounds in the team's win over SEMO on December 29; it was one of just 11 20/20 games by an OVC player over the past 13 years ... His 26 rebounds are the most by a NCAA player this season (Division I, II or III); Polakovich has a pair of 20-plus rebound games this season, making him the only Division I player to achieve that feat ... UT Martin has won eight consecutive home decisions to start the 2022-23 campaign, which is the longest such streak in the program's NCAA Division I Era (since 1992) and longest since UT Martin won 10 games to begin the 1985-86 season; UTM now has nine wins this season, one more than all of 2021-22 (8) ... Each of the three new OVC schools picked up their first Conference wins last week ... Southern Indiana is now 7-0 at home this year; this week they face former GLVC foe SIUE for the first time since January 7, 2008 ... MSU's Mark Freeman scored his 1.000 career point last week; he has played at Tennessee State. Illinois State and Morehead State ... Morehead State's Preston Spradlin won his 100th career game last week ... SIUE reached the 10-win mark the earliest it had since the 2004-05 season (14 games) ... SIUE is 23rd nationally in free throws made/game (16.5) ... UT Martin is 17th nationally in scoring offense (82.8 points/game) and 20th in rebounding (40.33/game) ... Morehead State is ninth in 3-point field goal defense (27.3%) ... Eastern Illinois is 24th in turnovers forced per game (17.27) ... Tennessee State ranks 69th nationally in field goal percentage (47.1%), the only OVC team in the Top 100 ... TSU's Jr. Clay moved into 10th place on the OVC career steals list (221); Clay leads the OVC in assists and is only 78 away from going that career Top 10 ... Little Rock's Myron Gardner leads the OVC in double-doubles (8), which ranks fourth nationally ... Little Rock had to play its first home OVC game (Dec. 29 vs. UT Martin) at Simmons Bank in North Little Rock due to a ruptured water coil at the Jack Stephens Center which made its court unplayable; the team will be back in its home arena with a portable court beginning with its two home games this week.

20/20 Games: Southern Indiana's Jacob Polakovich had 27 points and 26 rebounds in the Screaming Eagles win over Southeast Missouri on December 29. It marked the first 20/20 game by an OVC player since the 2019-20 season (when Austin Peay's Terry Taylor and UT Martin's Quintin Dove each had one in the month of February). Overall it was just the 11th 20/20 game by an OVC player over the past 13 seasons. The 26 rebounds was the most by an OVC player dating back to at least the 2002-03 season (the single-game record was 38 set in 1956-57).



Lakes Ties OVC Single-Game 3-Point Record: Southern Indiana graduate student Trevor Lakes tied the OVC single-game 3-pointers record when he made 10 (of 16) in a victory over IUPUI. He is the fifth player in OVC history to achieve the feat and first since the 2018-19 season.

Eastern Illinois Pulls Off BIG Upset: Eastern Illinois entered the December 21 game at lowa as a 31.5-point underdog but shot 72 percent from the floor in the second half on its way to a 92-83 victory It was the largest upset (by point spread) in the past 30 seasons. Over the past 30 years, teams that were 30 or more point underdogs had been 0-558 in such games. It also snapped lowa's 24-game home non-conference win streak and was the fourth win over a Power Five school in ElU's history.

Triple-Doubles: Lindenwood senior guard Chris Childs registered the 23rd all-time triple-double in OVC history on November 30 in a win over East-West University. He had 11 points, 11 assists and 10 rebounds in 29 minutes of action. There has been at least one triple-double in the OVC in six of the past seven seasons (2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19, 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23).

Taylor and Stewart Named to Lou Henson Award Watch List: SIUE guard Ray'Sean Taylor and UT Martin guard Parker Stewart have been named to the 2022-23 Lou Henson National Player of the Year Award Watch List by CollegeInsider.com. The award, which is presented annually to the top midmajor player in division I college basketball, honors the former Illinois and New Mexico State head coach who won 775 games in 41 seasons.

New Teams: The OVC welcomes three new teams this year in Lindenwood, Little Rock and Southern Indiana. Little Rock moves over from the Sun Belt while Lindenwood and USI are reclassifying from Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC). The trio marks just the 22nd, 23rd and 24th full-time members in the 75-year history of the OVC.

All Teams Eligible for OVC Tournament: Both reclassifying teams, Lindenwood and Southern Indiana, are eligible to compete and win the OVC Tournament Championship this season. Should a transitioning school win an OVC Tournament Championship, the AQ shall be awarded to the tournament runner-up. Should the tournament runner-up also be a transitioning school, the AQ representative shall be the highest seed going into the tournament.

OVC Basketball Championships Held at Ford Center in Evansville For Sixth Consecutive Year: The OVC Men's and Women's Basketball
Championships will be held March 1-4 at the Ford Center in Evansville,
Indiana. It marks the sixth-straight season the event will be held in the
building after a long run in Nashville. The Ford Center, which opened in
2011, is an 11,000-seat arena located in the core of Evansville's downtown
district. The 290,000-square foot facility serves as home of the University
of Evansville's men's basketball team and the Evansville Thunderbolts of the
Southern Professional Hockey League. The Ford Center also serves as host
to numerous sporting events and concerts on an annual basis. In September
2019, the OVC signed a three-year extension to keep the event at the venue
through 2023, with an option for a fourth-year (2024), which was exercised
in fall 2022.

OVC Tournament Championship Format: Once again the OVC Tournament will include a merit-based format. The format, which began in 2011, has the top eight men's and women's teams qualifying for the tournament. The No.

I and 2 seeds will receive two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds will receive one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round will include the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. The women's bracket also uses a merit-based bracket.

Recent Postseason Success: OVC teams have won at least one national postseason game in 12 of the past 13 postseasons. Morehead State won a NCAA game in 2009, Murray State won in the NCAA Tournament in 2010, Morehead State won in the NCAA's in 2011, Murray State won in the NCAA's in 2012, Eastern Kentucky won in the CIT in 2013, Belmont (NIT) and Murray State (CIT) won games in 2014, Eastern Illinois (CIT), Eastern Kentucky (CIT), Murray State (NIT) and UT Martin (CIT) scored victories in 2015 (the four different teams to record a victory in the single postseason was an OVC record), Morehead State (CBI) and UT Martin (CIT) won in 2016, Belmont (NIT) and UT Martin (CIT) scored wins in 2017, Austin Peay (CIT) and Jacksonville State (CBI) won in 2018 and Belmont and Murray State in 2019 (NCAA) before no postseason was held in 2020. A streak of 11-straight years ended in 2021 (when only one team made the reduced postseason), and the OVC began a new streak with Murray State winning in the NCAA Tournament in 2022.

OVC Players in the NBA: Five former OVC men's basketball players made National Basketball Association (NBA) rosters for 2022-23. In 2021, Cameron Payne helped Phoenix advance to the NBA Finals. It marked the fourth time in the past six years an OVC player had competed in the NBA Finals. In 2020 Ja Morant was named the NBA Rookie of the Year, making him one of three players from a non-Power 5 Conference to win the award since 1983-84 (joining Damian Lilliard of Weber State in 2012-13 and Larry Johnson of UNLV in 1991-92).

OVC to Produce 10-Game Linear Television Package and Use "Wild Card" Selections: The OVC will produce a national television package in 2022-23 that will include nine men's basketball games and one women's basketball contest that will air on the ESPN Family of Networks. Five of the seven regular season games and the men's tournament semifinals will air on ESPNU with two regular season games airing on ESPNews. The Men's Championship game will air on ESPN2. Each of the regular season games will be "wild card selections" with the matchup picked approximately two weeks ahead of the game.

Simon Named Preseason Player of the Year: The 2022-23 OVC Preseason Men's Basketball Team was headlined by UT Martin senior guard KJ Simon. He is the first Skyhawk to be named OVC Preseason Player of the Year since 2008-09, when All-American and future NBA player Lester Hudson earned the honor. Overall, seven different schools were represented on the team with Tennessee State leading the way with four picks. Southeast Missouri, SIUE and UT Martin had two selections apiece while Morehead State, Southern Indiana and Tennessee Tech each had one pick. Other returning All-OVC selections from last year who made the preseason team were Southeast Missouri sophomore guard Phillip Russell and Tennessee State graduate guard Jr. Clay while SIUE sophomore Ray'Sean Taylor earned All-Newcomer honors. Two other players previously earned All-OVC accolades before transferring away from the league and then back this season. Those players are Morehead State senior guard Mark Freeman and UT Martin graduate guard Parker Stewart. The team was rounded out by Southeast Missouri senior quard Chris Harris, SIUE sophomore forward DeeJuan Pruitt, Southern Indiana senior guard Jelani Simmons, Tennessee Tech graduate guard Ty Perry and a trio



of Tennessee State players in sophomore guard Marcus Fitzgerald Jr., senior guard Dedric Boyd and graduate forward Zion Griffin.

Morehead State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and communication directors, Morehead State has been picked the preseason favorites for the 2022-23 season. It marks the first time since 2009-10 that the Eagles have been tabbed the preseason favorites. The Eagles were one of five different teams to pick up first-place votes, tallying seven top picks to finish with 138 points. They finished ahead of Tennessee State who had two first-place votes (130 points), UT Martin who had seven first-place votes (120 points), Southeast Missouri who had two first-place votes (115) and SIUE who picked up two first-place votes (111 points). The poll was rounded out by Little Rock (102), Southern Indiana (68), Tennessee Tech (62), Eastern Illinois (31) and Lindenwood (23).

Men's Basketball Experimental Rules for Second Half Media Timeouts in Conference Play: This season in Conference men's basketball games, the league will participate with a NCAA Experimental Rule which establishes a standard media timeout format for the second half of all OVC men's basketball regular season and conference tournament games (the experimental rule does not pertain to non-conference games). The rule establishes the standard media timeout format for all OVC games which requires electronic media timeout marks that occur after the first stoppage of play following the 17-, 14-. 11-, 8- and 4- minute marks in the second half. The experimental rule, which was approved by the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel, is designed to help standardize the traditional "floater" media mark in the second half.

The 2022-23 Season: The 2022-23 season marks the 75th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 74 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

ESPN+: This year marks the fifth of the OVC's media rights deal with ESPN to air games on ESPN+, the multi-sport, direct-to-consumer video service from The Walt Disney Company Direct-to-Consumer & International segment. This season over 200 men's and women's basketball regular season Conference games and non-conference games will be streamed on ESPN+. Fans can subscribe to ESPN+ for \$9.99 a month (or \$99.99 per year) or as part of a bundle with Disney+ and ad-supported Hulu (\$13.99/month). ESPN+ is an integrated part of the ESPN App (on mobile and connected devices). More information can be found at www.OVCSports.com/ESPN.



KYLE GERDEMAN | HEAD COACH | FOURTH SEASON



Kyle Gerdeman enters his fourth year at the helm of the Lindenwood men's basketball program in the 2022-23 season. The Lions concluded the 2021-22 season with a 12-17 record, making it to the GLVC Tournament for the second-consecutive season. Jacoby Ross garnered second-team all-GLVC acolades, as he led the team with 19.3 points per game. Kevin Caldwell Jr. averaged 14.0 points and 4.0 rebounds per night, as he was named the James R. Spalding Sportsmanship nominee.

Lindenwood scored a season-high 101 points in a win over Missouri S8T, in which the Lions won by 35 points with the help of 41-of-72 shooting from the field. The Lions ranked inside the top-50 in free-throw percentage (81.1 percent) and blocked shots per game (4.1). Lindenwood was atop all NCAA Division II teams a the charity stripe, knocking down 439 on 541 attempts. Ross ranked 40th in the country with his 561 total points on the season. The Lions lost thier first game of the season, but rattled off wins in five of their next six games. Lindenwood registered a big upset in late January, as the Lions took down No. 21 Truman State by a final of 78-68 inside Hyland Arena.

The 2020-21 season was shortened due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Lions went 10-10 on the season, including a 10-9 mark in the GLVC. After playing all conference games during the regular season, the Lions finished fifth in the GLVC. Lindenwood led the league with an average of 81.9 points per game, with the help of a conference-leading free throw percentage of 80.1. The Lions played tight defensively, registering 7.05 steals per game with a turnover margin of +2.55, which was second-best in the GLVC.

The Lions were led by TJ Crockett who led the GLVC by more than eight points per game with is 27.5 average per contest. Crockett was named a D2CCA All-American as he was one of the nation's leading scorers across all levels of collegiate basketball. Crockett was recognized as an NABC all-district performer, as he was third in the nation with his 550 points at the time he received the award. Crockett was a unanimous first-team all-GLVC selection, as he added four GLVC Player of the Week honors.

The Lions clawed their way through the end of the season, as the team battled through injuries. Lindenwood earned an upset win over No. 25 Missouri-St. Louis early in the season. Lindenwood defeated Southwest Baptist by a final of 91-90 in two overtimes at the end of January. The following week, the Lions used overtime again to take on Missouri S&T on the road. On senior night, the Lions utilized overtime for the third time to earn a 116-109 victory over McKendree. In that game, Crockett set the program and GLVC record with 54 points in one game. The Lions won four of their final six regular season games, three of which were games won in overtime. The three overtime victories set a program record for most in a single season.

In his first year as head coach of the team in 2019-20, Gerdeman guided the Lions to a 12-16 record, including a 6-14 mark within the GLVC. Under Gerdeman, the Lions played some of their best basketball at home, finishing 9-6 within the friendly confines of Hyland Arena during the season. Lindenwood was known for its high-powered offense, as the team was ranked second in the GLVC in points per game as a unit, putting up 81.2 points per game. The team also was one of the better squads at limiting turnovers, as the team finished fourth in the conference with a ± 2.54 turnover margin. The Lions closed out the season with wins in three of their final four games, all of which came at home. TJ Crockett set career-highs in nearly every offensive category en route to a spot on the second-team All-Conference team for Lindenwood.

Gerdeman became the program's 20th head coach in program history and led the Lions into their first season as members of the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) in the 2019-20 season. Gerdeman came to Lindenwood after spending seven seasons at Central Michigan, playing an integral part in the Chippewas success on and off the court. The Chippewas reached the Mid-American Conference Tournament semifinals in 2018-19, finishing the season with a 23-12 record. Over the last five years, the team never had a losing season, including three seasons with at least 20 wins. Over his seven seasons at Central Michigan, the Chippewas posted a 121-108 record (.528).

Off the court, Gerdeman oversaw the program's academic success, which took major strides under his direction. During his tenure at Central Michigan, 19 Chippewas earned Academic All-MAC honors and from 2014-16 the program placed more student-athletes on the academic honor roll than any other institution in the conference. Prior to his arrival at Central Michigan, Gerdeman spent three years as an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State, which was preceded by three years as the head coach at Moberly Area Community College (Mo.). Gerdeman, a native of Wright City,

Mo. totaled a combined nine seasons serving as an assistant coach at Mineral (Mo.) Area College, at Moberly, and at East Central College (Mo.). Gerdeman holds an undergraduate degree from Southeast Missouri State University and a master's degree in education from Central Methodist University.

With her husband, George Sibley, pioneer educator Mary Sibley founded Lindenwood as a school for young women in 1827. Lindenwood was committed to combining professional issues with academic pursuits, the social with the intellectual, and the spiritual with the physical. In short, Mary Sibley brought holistic higher education to the American frontier.

Lindenwood became a Presbyterian college in 1853 and still maintains a historical relationship with the Presbyterian Church. In 1918, Lindenwood became a four-year college, and in 1969, Lindenwood attempted to strengthen its financial base by becoming co-ed. The school altered its name in 1974. The Lindenwood Colleges referred to the school's individual operations for men and women and also to its accelerated evening program, the Lindenwood College for Individualized Education, and its graduate programs.

During the '70s and '80s, the school struggled with a changing economy and accumulated substantial indebtedness. Enrollments began to decline, and by the spring of 1989, the number of day students had dropped below 1,000. As well, institutional change during those decades had led to some loss of clarity of mission. In view of





these fiscal and cultural challenges, the Board of Directors resolved to "refound" the school by returning to the fundamental precepts of individualized, holistic, values-oriented higher education that combines the practical with the academic. A president experienced in financial management and organizational revitalization was hired to lead the whole Lindenwood community in its collective renewal initiative. The result was a period of rapid growth and innovation that enabled the college to become the higher-education leader that it is today.

At the height of its revival, Lindenwood College became Lindenwood University in 1997. Enrollment burgeoned, and new construction arrived in late 1997 with the Hyland Performance Arena. By 1998-99, the annual enrollment approached 9,500, the faculty was growing, and the school balanced its budgets and increased revenues.

In 2000, Lindenwood dedicated the first of eight new residence halls to be constructed over the next decade—the first such construction in more than 30 years. In 2002, Lindenwood built the beautiful new Spellmann Campus Center. The 136,000-square-foot J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts opened in 2008.

The growth has not slowed. Additional construction has included expansion and renovation of Harmon Hall, now the home of the Robert W. Plaster School of Business and Entrepreneurship, and the 120,000-square-foot Evans Commons opened to great fanfare in 2011. A new athletics building was added in 2012 adjacent to Harlen Hunter Stadium, corresponding with Lindenwood's transition to the NCAA Division II.

Lindenwood opened in 2017 a 100,000-square-foot Library and Academic Resources Center at the front of the campus. The building serves as a hub for student services and academics.

Academically, Lindenwood has grown as well with extension of its longstanding general accreditation, the addition of numerous specialized accreditations for individual programs, and the addition of a number of degree programs, including the school's first doctoral degrees in the School of Education.

Mary Sibley ran a tightly managed school with a resourceful spirit and a clear purpose. She would have been proud of today's Lindenwood.
