OVERVIEW

Southeastern Louisiana University returns home for a crucial Southland Conference battle when it faces defending league champion McNeese State at Strawberry Stadium.

The Lions return to action after a strong second-half rally fell short in a 28-21 setback last Saturday at league-leader Central Arkansas. Southeastern trailed 28-0 early in the third quarter before coming back and having a chance to send the contest to overtime.

Playing its third game under acting head coach Tommy Condell, Southeastern looks to remain unbeaten at home, but will face a strong challenge from a McNeese State team that is second among FCS schools in total offense and scoring offense.

Quarterback Brian Babin has established himself as one of the top quarterbacks in the Southland Conference and the nation, averaging nearly 270 yards through the air with 17 touchdowns. Jay Lucas has averaged 4.6 yards per carry while catching 38 passes out of the backfield for the Lions while newcomers Chris Wilson and Simmie Yarborough have recorded 38 receptions each.

Tommy Connors and Mark Newbill have paced a Lion defensive unit that leads the Southland Conference in turnover margin while ranking fourth in total defense.

When Mike Lucas was named the 14th head football coach in Southeastern Louisiana history on December 14, 2006, his main focus was to quickly stabilize a young program that was affected by two seasons of distractions.

But with his many years of experience in the Southland Conference, learning under some of the league's legendary mentors, and gaining the trust and admiration of his players, Lucas has the Lions back on track as they enter their fourth season in one of the top football conferences in the Football Championship Subdivision.

Officially named head football coach at the end of the 2006 campaign after serving the previous two seasons as defensive coordinator, Lucas is familiar with the ingredients that are needed to be a consistent winner in the Southland Conference.

Lucas took over the program on an interim basis for the final three games of the 2006 season before embarking on his first full season as head coach in 2007. With a new quarterback and tremendous youth on the defensive side of the ball, the Lions showed dramatic improvement and played with the heart and determination needed to win championships.

Southeastern finished the 2007 season with a 3-8 record, but the foundation for a successful gridiron future was laid under Lucas' guidance.

Offensively in 2007, Southeastern relied on the play of All-SLC running back Jay Lucas along with first-year starter Brian Babin, who made great strides during the season at quarterback and fifth-year wideout Byron Ross, who provided the Lions on of the top deep threats in the league.

With an extremely youthful defense, featuring as many as seven true freshmen on the field at one time, Southeastern displayed Lucas' hard-nosed style of play in every game during the season. Highlighted by Tommy Connors, a sophomore and one of the elder statesmen on the defensive side, and true freshman Mark Newbill, the Lions finished near the top of the FCS national rankings in turnover margin.

Under Lucas' guidance as Southeastern entered the SLC in 2005 after spending the previous two years as an independent, the majority of the Lions' defensive numbers improved across the board despite facing a much stiffer schedule including a full-conference slate.

As newcomers to the SLC, the Lions were no cubs, especially on defense where they were third overall, behind only conference co-champs Nicholls and Texas State, in total defense (349.5 YPG), were second in pass efficiency defense (115.7), third in rushing defense (146.3 YPG) and first in opponent first downs allowed (181). Following the season, defensive back Charles Hall signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Browns pushing the total number of defensive NFL signees coached by Lucas to eight. Six

Lion defenders earned all-Southland notice while Duriel Adams was also named all-Louisiana.

Although the hard work of the players, coaches and staff are critical, at least part of the Lions' success in 2005 could be attributed to Lucas' familiarity with the Southland. No stranger to the SLC, Lucas previously served as defensive coordinator and assistant head coach for veteran Ron Randleman at Sam Houston State for 15 years repeatedly producing defensive units that ranked among the best in NCAA Division I-AA football and the Southland Conference.

During his time at SHSU, Lucas guided the Bearkat defense among the top 15 in national defensive statistical categories 11 times and led the Southland in defensive statistics five times. The defense set several school records in his tenure including marks for most quarterback sacks (52, 2001) and fewest points allowed (13.2 ppg, 1991). Under Lucas, the Bearkat defense turned out seven defensive players who signed National Football League contracts and two who were NFL draft choices.

Lucas coached 41 defensive players who earned All-Southland honors a total of 65 times. Prior to joining the SHSU staff in 1987, Lucas previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern New Mexico where his squad led the Lone Star Conference in total defense and scoring defense and ranked third nationally in punt returns.

He and his wife, Wendy, have two sons, Tyler (21), a senior quarterback at Cornell University, and Torin (19), a freshman catcher on the Southeastern baseball team.

Thomas Condell, a native of Utica, N.Y., is in his second year as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Southeastern and is responsible for all aspects of the offensive team and staff. Condell comes to Hammond with over a decade of coaching experience at the professional and collegiate level.

His innovative offense saw an increase in total offense by nearly 50 yards per game and the school's single-season rushing record was set by Jay Lucas. Brian Babin, in his first season as the Lions' starting quarterback, finished fourth in the Southland Conference in passing yards, was fifth in total offense and fifth in passing efficiency.

Prior to his arrival, Condell spent the last three seasons in the Canadian Football League, serving as the offensive coordinator for the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 2006. Prior to that, he was the pass game coordinator and coached both receivers and quarterbacks for two seasons with the Ottawa Renegades.

During his time in Ottawa, Condell handled all the play calling duties for the Renegades. Under his direction, quarterback Kerry Joseph became the third player in CFL history to pass for 4,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in the same season. In addition, wide receiver Jason Armstead set a new Renegade standard for receiving yards in a single season.

No stranger to the state of Louisiana or the Southland Conference, Condell coached at Louisiana-Monroe (2001-03), Stephen F. Austin (1999-2001) and McNeese State (1998).

Condell served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at ULM for his final two seasons in Monroe and was the fourth-youngest offensive coordinator in Division I-A. In those two seasons, the Indian offense produced a 46 percent increase in scoring per game and a 36 percent increase in total yards per contest. In 2002, the team produced a 2,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season for only the second time in school history.

In 2001, he served as ULM's special teams coordinator. ULM improved upon its kick return and punting averages under Condell's watch.

At SFA, Condell was the pass game

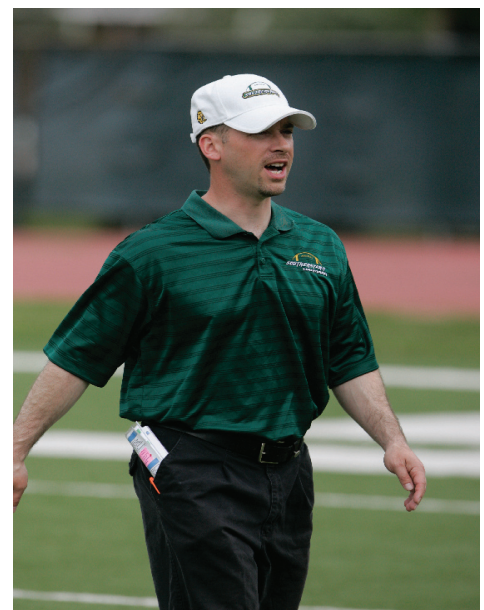
coordinator and receivers coach for three seasons and was responsible for all in-game play calling. In 1999, Condell's troops won the Southland Football League title. In 2000, the unit led the SFL in first downs and third-down conversion rate, while ranking second in the league in total offense and scoring.

McNeese State advanced to the I-AA Playoffs during Condell's one season as tight ends and offensive line coach in Lake Charles. Condell was responsible for scripting plays and coached All-SFL tight end Pat Matthews.

Other stops for Condell include seasons with the CFL's Winnipeg Blue Bombers, the Albany Firebirds of the Arena League, Hamilton College and Illinois Wesleyan University.

Condell also played collegiately at Lock Haven University and Cortland State, where he was a part of two ECAC championship squads. Condell earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from S.U.N.Y. at Cortland and his master's degree in kinesiology from Stephen F. Austin.

Condell is married to the former Mandy Sciba. The couple resides in Ponchatoula with their two sons, Caleb (2) and Luke (1).

LUCAS TO BE SIDELINED FOR REMAINDER OF SEASON

Southeastern Louisiana University football coach Mike Lucas will be sidelined for the remainder of the 2008 season.

Lucas, in his second year as head coach at Southeastern, underwent a heart valve procedure on Thursday. Offensive coordinator Tommy Condell has is serving as acting head coach, beginning with Southeastern's game against Northwestern State on Oct. 18.

"I have total faith in Tommy Condell, my coaching staff and our student-athletes in continuing to build on the foundation of a championship football team," Lucas said.

"We know that Coach Lucas is disappointed that this comes in the middle of the season," said Interim President John L. Crain. "Our main concern right now is that he gets the care that he needs. We're looking forward to him returning to work as soon as he gets well. Our thoughts and prayers are with him and his family."

"Obviously, our thoughts and prayers are with Mike and his family and we look forward to his return to the sidelines at Strawberry Stadium," Southeastern Director of Athletics Dr. Joel Erdmann said. "This is a great opportunity for all Southeastern fans to rally around and embrace these student-athletes and the entire team."

Babin threw for a career-high 330 yards and two touchdowns against South Dakota ... the junior went 30-for-42 for 272 yards and four first-half touchdowns at Stephen F. Austin ... Babin opened the season with 182 passes without an interception before SFA's Jerrel Barnett picked off a fourth-quarter pass ... Babin completed 27-of-44 passes with no interceptions against USD ... Babin missed the Mississippi State game after suffering a concussion on the final play of the

Lucas, who ranks fifth in school history with 126 career receptions, has caught a pass in 24 consecutive games - the longest streak among any current player ... junior college transfer **Jasper Duckworth** (Mt. Olive, Miss.) carried five times for 34 yards in his Southeastern debut at Alcorn State ... Duckworth led the Lions with 55 yards, including a 36-yard scamper, against North Dakota.

Walter Vaughn (Spalding, Ga.) has started every game this season for the Lions after missing the final nine games of the 2007 campaign with an injury ... Vaughn tallied a career-high seven tackles at Stephen F. Austin ... DE **Steven Honore** (New Roads, La.) missed the North Dakota game due a death in the family ... Honore was credited with four tackles and a sack at Alcorn State after playing at linebacker in 2007 ... his sack early in the third quarter against South Dakota forced a Noah Shepard fumble and led to a Southeastern field goal ... Honore added four tackles, including two for loss, against Northwestern State ... Honore has recorded sacks in consecutive games against Northwestern State and Central Arkansas ... DT **Devin Boutwell** (Buras, La.) missed the North Dakota game with a back injury ... Austin ... Connors added 11 tackles against North Dakota and added 10 stops against South Dakota ... Connors was named the Southland Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week after his game against UND ... FS **Trey Douglas** (Hammond, La.) made a career-high 11 tackles, including eight solos against Mississippi State ... Douglas added an interception late against North Dakota ... FS **Travis Williams** (Ocean Springs, Miss.) posted seven tackles, one off his career high, while forcing and recovering a fumble at MSU ... Turner set a school-record in 2007 for most field goals in a season (17) and finished second among FCS kickers in field goals made ... he set a SLC-record of 13 consecutive field goals made and is 25 for his last 29 ... Turner has scored 171 points in his career ... P **Cody Samples** (Ripley, Miss.) averaged 43.8 yards per punt on six attempts at Alcorn State ... his 58-yard punt in the second quarter was his career-best ... KR **Andre Cryer** (Kentwood, La.) had a 100-yard kickoff return called back by a penalty against South Dakota.

LANAUX TO REDSHIRT 2008 SEASON

Head coach **Mike Lucas** announced after the Lions' 38-35 win over North Dakota that senior receiver **Merrick Lanaux** (Hammond, La.) will redshirt the 2008 season ... Lanaux, who will have one season remaining, has not played since injuring a hamstring during pre-game warm-ups against Alcorn State ... Lanaux needs 11 catches to tie former Lions **Ray Mahfouz** and **Ray Perkins** for 10th place in school history ... with one touchdown reception, Lanaux will tie **Tommy Arbour** for eighth-place with 10 and with 57 yards, Lanaux will tie **Jeffery Howard** for eighth-place in receiving yards ...

AGAINST FBS (FORMALLY I-A) INSTITUTIONS

Southeastern has kept up its tradition of taking on the Big Boys as it faced Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) opponents Mississippi State and Louisiana Tech this season ... Southeastern faced three FBS schools in 2007, falling at New Mexico State (35-14), Orange Bowl champion Kansas (62-0) and Tulane (35-27) ... Since the program's resurrection, Southeastern has played 10 games (going 0-10) against the top level of college football beginning with a 28-0 loss at Troy in 2003 ... Two years later, Southeastern tangled with Tulane (playing its 11 games in 11 different stadiums after the damage caused by Hurricane Katrina) in LSU's Tiger Stadium and lost a narrow decision, 28-21, before dropping games to NMSU (30-15), Southern Miss (45-0) and Texas Tech (62-0) in 2006.

TURNER EARNS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NOTICE

After recording a record-breaking year in 2007, placekicker **Jeff Turner** (Houston, Texas) was selected as a Preseason Third-Team All-America among Football Championship Subdivision schools by the *Sports Network* ... Turner, a 5-foot-10, 190-pound junior, was one of three players selected from Southland Conference schools joining Nicholls State's **Lardarius Webb**, who was a first-team selection at free safety, and quarterback **Nathan Brown** of Central Arkansas, a third-team pick ... As a sophomore, Turner converted on 17 of 20 field goals and was 28-for-29 in extra point attempts. He led the Southland

Conference in points per game and was fourth scoring while finishing second among FCS kickers in field goals per game ... Turner, who was a Preseason First-Team All-Southland Conference selection, tied a SLC record with 13 consecutive field goals made, which included a league single-game record with six field goals at Texas State. Turner's extra point against Mississippi State passed Ray Perkins for eighth-place in school history with 121 points.

LIONS "IN THE ZONE"

Southeastern were very successful in the red zone in 2007, and have had repeated success in 2008 ... after converting on 27 of 30 attempts (90%) in the zone in 2007, Southeastern is 20-for-22 (91%) in eight games this season with 17 scores coming on touchdowns ... defensively, the Lions have had some success holding opponents in the red zone, ranking third in the Southland Conference at 25-for-32 (78%) ... the Lions had two stops against Alcorn State, including a hold on fourth-down after the Braves drove to the Southeastern 8.

OWEN "WALKING ON DEAD FISH"

Sophomore **Johnny Owen** (LaPlace, La.) plays one of the feature roles in the soon-to-be-released "Walking on Dead Fish," a documentary narrated by Terry Bradshaw (who was also an Executive Producer). Owen was a prep standout at Brother Martin High School in New Orleans before Hurricane Katrina forced Owen and family (and nearly 20,000 New Orleanians) to move to nearby LaPlace. Owen finished his senior year at East St. John High School, where he was the Wildcats' starting running back ... the movie opened last weekend in New Orleans with a pair of showings.

LUCAS AND THE CENTURY MARK

After finishing second in the Southland Conference in rushing last season, **Jay Lucas** took his game to the level most thought of after a blue-chip career at Baton Rouge's Redemptorist High School. In 2007, Lucas rushed for a school-record 1,239 yards with 12 TDs. Lucas averaged 7.2 yards per carry and posted six 100-yard games.

ON OPENERS

Southeastern has a 36-21-3 record in season-opening games dating back to 1930 ... The Lions dropped their last two openers (both against New Mexico State and former coach Hal Mumme) before defeating Alcorn State, 34-28, last week in Lorman ... the Lions won their first three after reviving the program in 2003 ... in road openers dating back to 1946, Southeastern has posted an 12-9-1 record ... prior to its win in Lorman, the Lions' last victory to open the season on the road came at McNeese State (17-7) in 1982.

LIONS PERFECT IN HOME OPENERS SINCE RETURN

Since returning football to campus in the 2003 season, Southeastern has been perfect in season-opening games going 6-0 ... the Lions, who defeated South Dakota on Sept. 13, earned wins over Division II Arkansas-Monticello in 2003 (22-17) and 2004 (46-32) before picking up a win over Alcorn State (48-21) in the 2005 debut ... in 2006, Southeastern defeated Jacksonville (Fla.), 41-13, and blasted Division II Kentucky Wesleyan, 79-7, in last season's home opener ... since its 2003 win over UAM, Southeastern has averaged 49.0 points per game as it has outscored its opponents, 245-103.

ON SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE OPENERS

Southeastern's 21-3 win over Stephen F. Austin in last year's SLC opener marked the first time the Lions opened conference play with a victory ... Southeastern opened its first SLC slate in 2005 dropping a 30-15 decision to 14th-ranked Texas State at Strawberry Stadium before falling at Nicholls State, 14-10, in last year's SLC opener in Thibodaux ... the win by the Lions also marked the first time since 1976 (a 28-12 win over Tennessee-Martin in the Gulf South Conference opener) that Southeastern won its opening conference game.

A total of 29 newcomers have seen action for Southeastern this season, including 21 in the Lions' Southland Conference opener at Stephen F. Austin ... two of the newcomers to the 2008 roster (Chris Wilson, Quinten Pierre) were in the starting lineup for the Lions at SFA.

AT HOME SINCE THE RETURN

The Lions have been solid at home in Strawberry Stadium since returning football in 2003 ... The Lions are 20-10 in the friendly confines with a 3-0 mark this season ... Southeastern posted a 5-1 mark in 2003 (its only loss was to top-ranked McNeese State) and went 5-2 in 2004 ... Southeastern was 3-2 last season with wins over Kentucky Wesleyan, Stephen F. Austin and Nicholls State ... The Lions were 2-2 in 2005 and went 2-3 in 2006.

THE ROAD HAS NOT BEEN KIND

Since returning football for the 2003 season, the Lions are 5-27 when playing outside of Strawberry Stadium, including an 0-6 record in the past two seasons ... Southeastern, which is 1-4 this season, snapped a 12-game road losing skid in the season-opener on Aug. 30 with a 34-28 win at Alcorn State ... two of the five road wins came in 2004 as the Lions knocked off nationally-ranked McNeese State in Lake Charles and Jacksonville ... Southeastern picked up its first-ever road win as a member of the Southland Conference with a 45-23 win at Stephen F. Southeastern and "Defensive MVP" have been common when describing the Bayou Bowl - the high school football all-star game pitting teams from Louisiana and Texas. The last four defensive MVPs, dating back to the 2004 event with **Keithshone Dantzler**, have signed with Southeastern. Following Dantzler in earning Defensive MVP honors have been **Tommy Connors (2005)**, **Ryan Godare (2006)** and **Devin Jones (2007)**.

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

Southeastern is 2-8 against FCS (formally I-AA) ranked opponents since 2003 ... its latest decision was a 28-21 loss at No. 12/13 Central Arkansas on Oct. 25 ... the biggest win against a ranked opponent to date for the Lions since returning football came in 2004 as they knocked off then sixth-ranked McNeese State, 51-17, in Lake Charles ... In 2003, top-ranked McNeese State defeated the Lions 52-21 at home while No. 24-ranked Sam Houston State handed the Lions a 45-17 defeat in 2004 ... Also in 2003, No. 20 Northwestern State slapped an 87-27 defeat on the Lions in Natchitoches ... In the 2005 season, the Lions dropped a decision at home to No. 14 Texas State followed by a loss at 23rd-ranked Northwestern State and a 37-13 win over No. 20 McNeese State ... Southeastern fell to fifth-ranked McNeese State (45-17) on Oct. 27, 2007 in Lake Charles.

LIONS-COLONELS PUSHED BACK TO NOV. 22

Southeastern Louisiana's regular-season finale at Nicholls State, scheduled for Nov. 20, has been moved back to its original Nov. 22 date in an announcement from both schools on Tuesday ... The game, which was to be played Nov. 20 before a statewide audience on Cox Sports Television, was pushed back to its original date after damage at John L. Guidry Stadium last month by Hurricane Gustav forced the removal of the light pole structures ... Kickoff for the game will be at 1 p.m. ... The game, which is played for the River Bell Trophy, will mark the 18th time the schools have faced each other on the gridiron with the Colonels holding a 9-8 lead. Southeastern claimed last year's contest, 17-13, for its first win over the Colonels since 1981.
