- The Columbia Theatre for the Performing Arts is a venue for a wide range of educational and entertaining events. Fanfare, the annual festival of the arts, has entertained and educated thousands of patrons over the past 24 seasons.
- Multiple service-learning courses provide students the opportunity to serve their communities while participating in hands-on learning.

Academic Excellence

- Incoming freshman ACT average composite scores (21.4) last fall exceeded both the state and national averages. Highly qualified students entering Southeastern – those with ACT scores of 24 and above – have increased nearly 50 percent in the past five years.
- In a report issued by the Southern Regional Education Board, Southeastern's master's degree program in education was rated among the best in the southern states in preparing future school principals and other education leaders.
- The School of Nursing has been named the Nursing Program of the Year three times in the last 10 years by the Louisiana State Nurses Foundation.
- Southeastern in 2008 was named a "Great College to Work for" by The Chronicle of High Education. The only

Louisiana institution to be recognized in the survey, Southeastern received high marks in 10 different areas, including collaborative governance, job satisfaction and confidence in leadership.

- Southeastern has been named to the 2010 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, recognizing the university as a front-runner for its involvement in volunteering, service-learning and civic engagement. The award was made by the Corporation for National and Community Service.
- In order to encourage students to complete their undergraduate degree in four years, Southeastern offers a unique "Progression Scholarship" to students who demonstrate satisfactory progress toward graduation.
- Southeastern's redesigned mathematics courses have increased success in courses often considered "barriers" to student success. In two years, the college algebra success rate has improved by 27 percent and the withdrawal rate is steadily falling.

Successful Alumni

- Alumni of Southeastern are successful in all areas of business, government, and entertainment. Recently recognized as distinguished alums are Good Morning America anchor Robin Roberts, internationally recognized opera





Southeastern is the third largest university in Louisiana, offering 70 undergraduate and graduate degree programs that are nationally accredited. Southeastern now offers five new post-graduate degree programs, including the university's first doctoral program in Educational Leadership and unique master's degree programs in Integrated Science and Technology, Organizational Communication, Applied Sociology, and the Master of Arts in Teaching.

Our classes are small in size, interaction is high, and faculty, not graduate students, teach 99 percent of our classes.

Southeastern also is one of the major providers of distance education among state universities. Our main campus and satellite centers in Baton Rouge and St. Tammany and Livingston parishes are equipped to handle e-learning activities, and students have access to computer labs in classroom buildings, residence halls, the War Memorial Student Union and the Sims Memorial Library. A Student Help Desk is available by phone, and Student Productivity Services allows students to check out laptops, external drives, digital cameras, and other equipment.

The Southeastern Channel, Southeastern's education access cable channel operated in cooperation with Charter Communications and airing in several area parishes, offers original programming and telecourses that can be taken for college credit.

Southeastern's Honors program offers an alternative academic track in all departments and majors, and our Study Abroad program allows our students to explore the globe.

Under the direction of head athletic trainer Cary Berthelot, the Sports Medicine program at Southeastern is at the forefront of athletic training in the state and region.

Through a diligent preventative maintenance program, Berthelot's staff helps to limit injuries through pre-participation physical exams, preventative maintenance rehab programs, taping, bracing and padding and education.

Southeastern also utilizes a dedicated staff of physicians in various specialties along with other health care professionals many of who donate their time to provide the highest level of care for Lion student-athletes.

Southeastern also sports one of the few nationally accredited undergraduate athletic training programs in the state providing student athletic trainers both classroom and on-the-job experience to prepare for a career in sports medicine.

We educate our student athletes to improve daily by providing them the tools to reach their full potential. We do this while teaching the values of hard, intelligent, consistent work. This leads to increased performance capability, decrease injury potential and the development of a total student athlete.

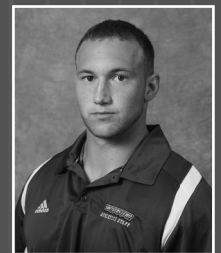

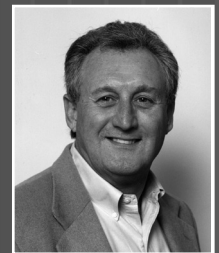

Russell Carollo '80 - Pulitzer Prize Winning Author and recipient of the Gerald R. Ford Prize for Distinguished Reporting on the National Defense, and the Society of Professional Journalists' national award for investigative reporting.

Andre Coudrain '79 - Board member of the University of Louisiana System, the governing board of Southeastern and the largest university system in Louisiana. Is the Hammond city attorney.

Calvin Fayard '65 - Attorney, key role in leading the litigation team in the Combustion, Inc. environmental class action suit. The precedent-setting suit was settled on behalf of more than 10,000 Livingston Parish residents.

Mayson Foster - Current Mayor of Hammond. Retired as president and chief operating office at Citizens National Bank in 1997. Served in leadership positions with Hancock Bank and Parish National Bank.

Bob Fresneda - Managing Director for ReadSoft North America, a document automation software company whose global headquarters are in Sweden.

John Fred Gourrier - Co-wrote "Judy in Disguise", a parody of The Beatles song "Lucy in the Sky with Diamonds". The song became enormously successful, ironically knocking another Beatles song ("Hello, Goodbye") out of the No. 1 chart position on the Billboard Hot 100 for two weeks in January 1968.

William J. Handal '74 - Minister of Finance for the Republic of El Salvador. Distinguished himself in the business world with a long time career with Taca International Airlines.

Dr. Nancy Douglas Joyner '67 - Dean, Lutheran College Washington Semester in Arlington, Va.

Dr. John Kenelly '57 - Professor of Mathematics at Clemson University. Known nationally for his interest in using technology to revitalize mathematics instruction.

Billy Kennedy '86 - Guided Southeastern to the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Championships, currently the head coach at Murray State University.

Albert Kuhn '65 - Vice President at IBM, heads IBM's Global Delivery Project, a \$4 billion, five-year information technology out-tasking program between the IBM and American Express.

Nate Lofton - Currently playing basketball with the Harlem Globetrotters, led Southeastern to the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Championships.

Bob Odom '57 - Former Louisiana Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry, who served from 1980-2008. Now in the private sector, operates a consulting company to work with farmers on a statewide and national basis.

Charles O'Drobinak '53 - Rose through the ranks to become a member of the top policy board of national accounting giant Price Waterhouse.

Woody Oge '67 - Site director for Avondale Operations, a division of Northrop Grumman Ship Systems.

Dr. Clea Parker '48 - Ninth President of Southeastern Louisiana University

John Pieno, Jr. '62 - Chairman of the Florida Sterling Council since its inception in 1992. A retired Navy Captain, former Secretary of the Department of Administration, has worked as an executive in the defense industry, and as a Washington congressional liaison.

The selection of Duhe, who earned Academic All-America honors for the second consecutive year, and Cryer marked the third time in the past four years that Southeastern has produced multiple Academic All-Americans.

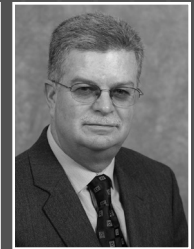

“I liked what I saw at Southeastern from the start but when my wife Jacki and I met the people, we knew we had found a home,” Bellairs said. “My whole life I have spent time in college towns; growing up, as a coach, and as an administrator, and I have been blessed by living in some great places. When I started preparing for the interview I was very impressed with the campus and the attention Southeastern paid to supporting the students; but when I met the people -- the faculty, coaches, and members of the community -- I wanted to be a part of it.”

At Southeastern, Bellairs will oversee 15 NCAA Division I affiliated programs that compete in the Southland Conference. Since joining the Southland in 1997, the Lions have captured 21 regular-season or

served as senior associate director of intercollegiate athletics from 2005 to 2008 and head basketball coach from 1993 to 2005 at VMI in Lexington, Va. Responsibilities included marketing and promotions, ticket operations, management of the licensing program and serving as director for all key athletic facilities. There he created new pricing strategies, athletic department promotions and new revenue streams. As head basketball coach, he was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year, the Virginia Coach of the Year and the “Sports Illustrated” Unknown Coach of the Year.

Bellairs also served as assistant basketball coach at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va., from 1988 to 1993, where his teams saw one NCAA tournament appearance and five NIT appear-

Athletic Administration

Bart Bellairs, former director of intercollegiate athletics at Savannah State University in Savannah, Ga., and a senior athletics administrator at Virginia Military Institute was named the 15th Director of Athletics at Southeastern on Nov. 24, 2009.

Bellairs succeeds Joel Erdmann, who accepted a similar position at the University of South Alabama in August. Southeastern men’s golf coach Tim Baldwin has served as interim director since Erdmann’s departure.

“We are excited to welcome Bart Bellairs to our staff,” said President John L. Crain. “He has a broad range of accomplishments in athletic administration and shares Southeastern’s focus on the ‘student’ part of the student-athlete equation. He has a proven track record in inspiring his athletes and staff to achieve their full potential, whether in the classroom or in athletic competition. And he has experience in handling marketing, promotion, fundraising and budgetary issues, important skills in these days of tightened

tournament championships, including four regular-season titles in women’s soccer, three in women’s tennis, two in men’s basketball and two in men’s golf. Southeastern also claimed the Southland Men’s All-Sports Trophy in 2008-09, highlighted by the 2009 Men’s Outdoor Track and Field championship with the women’s soccer team earning its first-ever berth to the NCAA Championships.

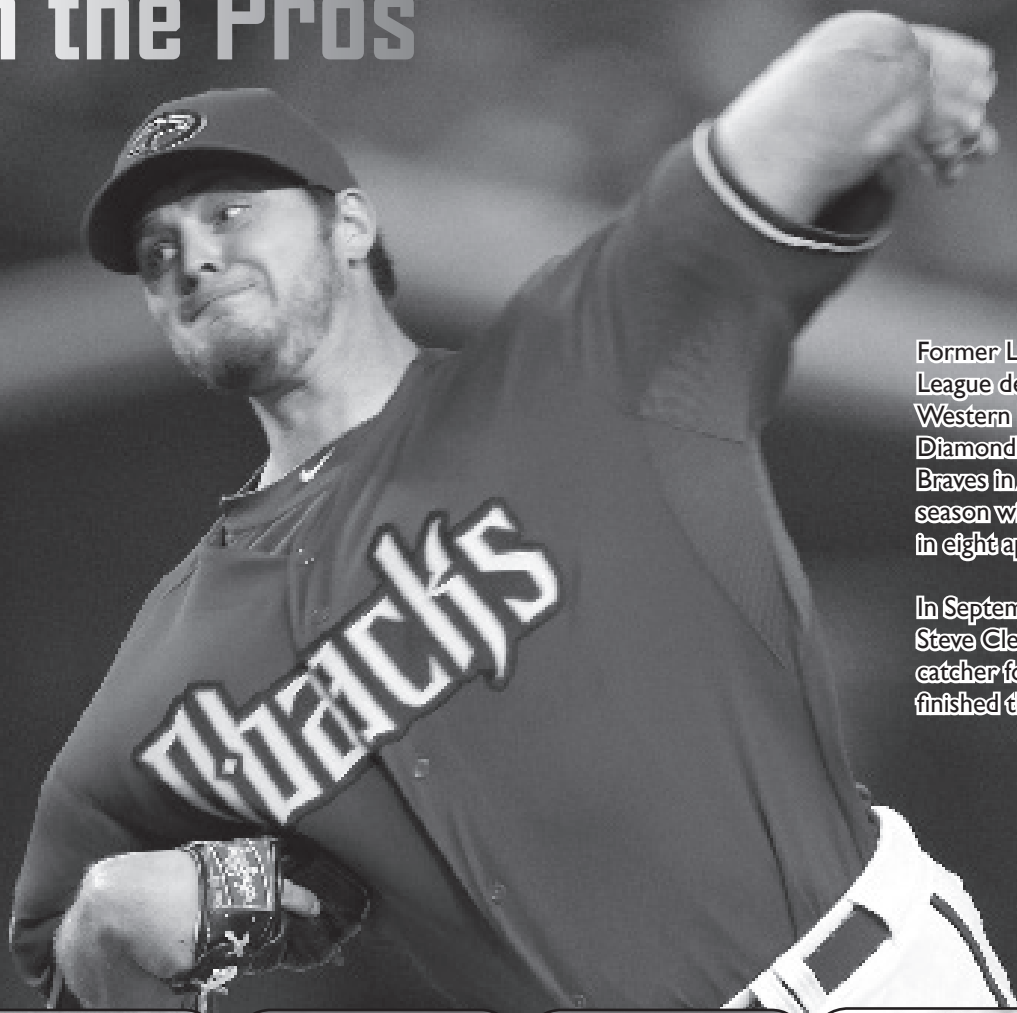
Prior to his move to Hammond, Bellairs was at Savannah State, an NCAA Division I program, with 15 teams, since July 2008. There he implemented an academics success plan that included an academic “road map” for each student-athlete from registration to graduation. He developed a Title IX/Gender Equity program that involved reworking the athletic budget to resolve long-time problems with staffing, facilities and scholarships. During his tenure at Savannah State, football, men’s basketball, softball and women’s volleyball teams all saw significant improvement in seasonal wins.

"THE PAT" > HOME OF THE LIONS

Since opening day of 1992, the Southeastern Louisiana baseball program has been able to call Pat Kenelly Diamond at Alumni Field, consistently named one of the best stadiums in the conference, state and region, its home.

Known as "The Pat", which has hosted the 1992 Trans America Athletic Conference Championship as well as the 2004 Southland Conference Championship, has undergone a series of aggressive makeovers in the past few years.

"We know facilities are a major feature student-athletes evaluate when they are making decisions about where they should attend college and compete athletically," said Southeastern Director of Athletics Bart Bellairs. "This facility takes us a step further in our goal of providing first class support of our baseball team."

During the 2011 season, a new hitting facility was constructed behind the left field fence. The project, made possible by a generous donation by Hammond residents John and Georgianne Poteet, is a covered 3,000-square foot lighted facility to allow use in inclement weather.

Prior to the 2003 season, a new LED message center-enabled scoreboard was installed. The outfield fence was also upgraded, and new foul poles were placed down the foul lines.

The field underwent a massive upgrade before the 2008 campaign. New Bermuda Tifway 419 sod replaced the old grass, and concrete was poured in front of the dugouts. Rainouts are infrequent at Alumni Field, as a complex drainage system installed in the outfield in 2003, can drain the playing surface within 20 minutes.

Other improvements included an upgrade to the press box, the installation of a brick wall fencing down the foul lines and waterproofing the grandstand to keep fans sheltered from the rain.

Heading in to the 2008 season, Alumni Field got another minor facelift as the dugouts received new brick facing to match the foul line walls, and new handcrafted permanent wooden benches replaced the old portable stainless steel models.

The stadium, which is named in honor of all Southeastern alumni and dedicated to Hall of Fame coach Pat Kenelly, comfortably seats 2,500

spectators with box seats at field level, an elevated grandstand with chairback seats and backed bleachers, as well as two sections of bleachers down the foul lines.

Crowds of more than 3,000 can be accommodated, with crowds in excess of 3,500 in attendance for recent matchups with nationally-ranked opponents such as LSU, Tulane and Southern Miss.

Plans are underway to improve the facility, including relocating the home bullpen behind the left field fence and the installation of new lighting.

"I believe this is one of the nicest facilities in the south," Southeastern coach Jay Artigues said. We have a lot of plans underway to make sure that we keep adding to it and improving. Our goal is to make sure Alumni Field remains one of the best fields in college baseball."

The past four seasons, Alumni Field crowds have put Southeastern consistently near the top of the Southland Conference stadings in attendance. In 2010, Southeastern drew a league-high 27,931 fans over 33 home dates and averaged 846 fans per game - good for second in the confer-

ence.

In 2009, Southeastern drew 18,302 fans over 27 home dates and averaged 677 fans per game - second in the league. In 2008, crowds totaled 19,944 fans over 31 home dates for an league-high average crowd of 643 fans. In 2007 the Lions averaged a league-high 630 fans over 28 home dates for an total season attendance of 17,648, helping continue a tradition of creating a noticeable home field advantage for Lion baseball.

In its first 19 years, the Lions have posted a 338-226 record at Alumni Field, winning nearly 60 percent of its games. The Lions posted a 25-8 mark at home in 2010.

The Coach Pat Kenelly Baseball Diamond

The Alumni Field "Baseball Diamond" is named in memory of Coach Pat Kenelly. Coach Kenelly served with distinction at Southeastern from 1948 to 1977 as Assistant Football Coach, Head Baseball Coach, Head Football Coach, and Athletic Director.

Meanwhile, the expanded training facility provides all Lion student-athletes with top -of-the-line treatment and conditioning equipment.



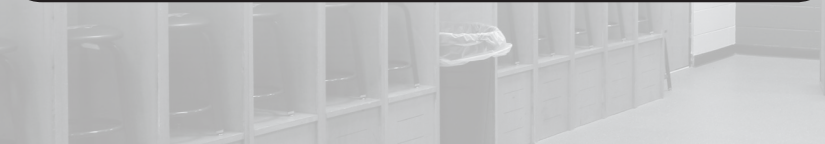

From New Orleans (I-55 North)

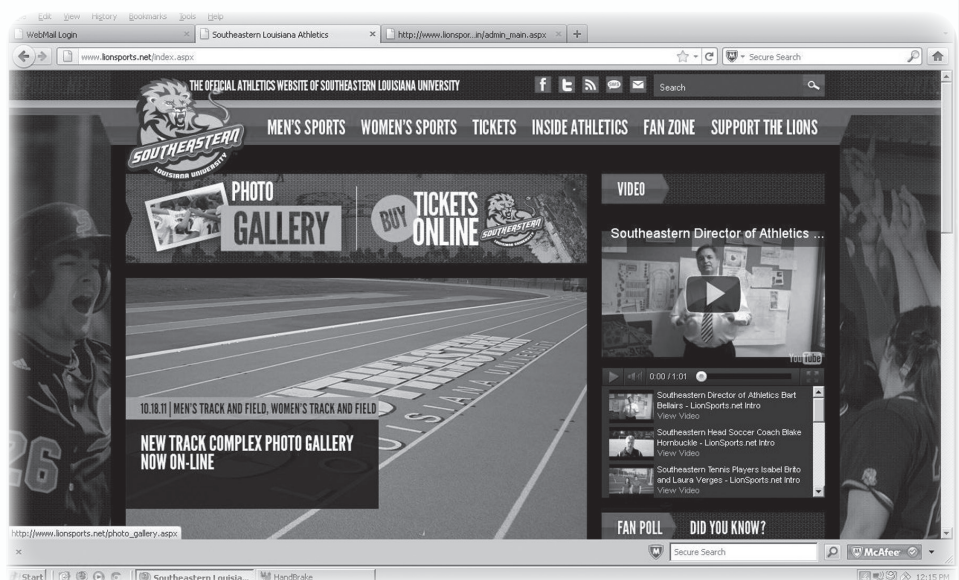
Exit I-55 at University Avenue (Exit 32/LA 3234), follow the same directions as from Baton Rouge.

2012 Lions Outlook

Lions look to continue most successful era in school history

Fresh off the most successful three-year run in school history, Southeastern looks to reload despite losing some of the most star-studded players ever to wear the Lion uniform.

Southeastern tallied 112 wins the past three seasons, topping the 1992-94 run by two wins, with the help of players like Justin Boudreaux, Josh Cryer, Brandon Efferson, Cass Hargis, Jeff Harkensee and Tyler Watkins. The Lions will look to talented returning players and newcomers alike to fill the void.

"I don't know if we'll ever replace Cass Hargis," head coach Jay Artigues said. "But we've got a guy [Harry Slade] who is very talented. Harry played Division I baseball his freshman year and was Freshman of the Year in his conference."

The Lions will open the season at home for the fourth time in five years as Indiana State comes to Alumni Field for a three-game series (Feb. 17-19) and Louisiana-Lafayette makes an early appearance (Feb. 22) in Hammond.

Eastern Illinois, the Lion's season-opening opponent from 2008-10, returns to Southeastern (Feb. 24-26) after a one-year hiatus to close out the opening homestand.

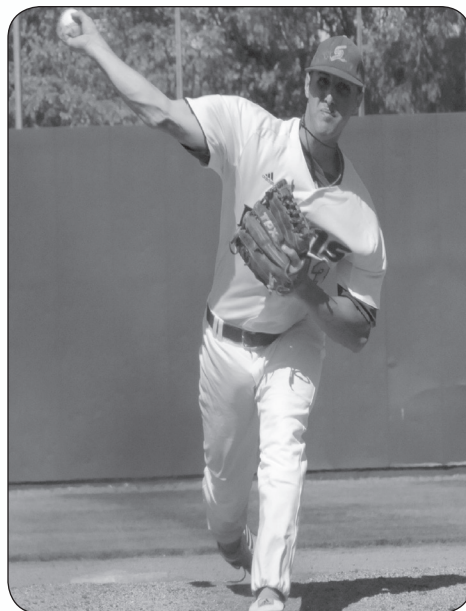
Southeastern will face another Northern school, Central Michigan, for two games in a unique three-team setup at McNeese State (March 2-3). The Lions will squeeze in a non-conference game against their Southland foe as well.

Marquee matchups inside the friendly confines of Pat Kenelly Diamond at Alumni Field include visits by ULL, the Tulane Green Wave (March 27), the Alabama Crimson Tide (April

11) and a pair of mid-week games against Mississippi State (March 13-14).

Other home matchups include Jackson State (March 21) and a pair of games against Alcorn State (March 7 and 28).

During the course of the four-month season, the Lions will travel to Jackson State (March 6), ULL (April 3), Tulane twice (Feb. 28 and April 17), LSU (April 25) and South Alabama (May 1).



Stefan Lopez led Southeastern in saves and was an honorable mention All-Southland Conference selection in 2011.

Southeastern opens Southland Conference play with a pair of games at Nicholls State March 9 and 11 sandwiched around a single-game matchup in Hammond. The Lions also travel to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (March 16-18), Lamar (March 30-April 1), Texas-San Antonio (April 20-22), Northwestern State (April 27-29) and Sam Houston State (May 11-May 13).

The Lions will host Southland rivals Nicholls State (single game March 10), Texas-Arlington (March 16-18), Central Arkansas (April 5-7), Texas State (April 13-15), Stephen F. Austin (May 4-6) and McNeese State (May 17-19) before competing in the Southland Conference Tournament May 23-26 in San Marcos, Texas.

PITCHING

Southeastern lost its top two starters, Brandon Efferson and Tyler Watkins, to graduation. Efferson was selected in the 37th round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim and spent the summer pitching in their minor league system. Between Efferson and Watkins, the Lions lose 18 wins and almost 200 innings off the pitching staff.

Southeastern will look to a pair of experienced returning arms to lead the weekend rotation.

"Joseph Koon did a really good job of developing his slider this past summer," Artigues said. "Because of that he's keeping right-handers off of him. He has a chance to be our Friday night guy."

Last season Koon picked up wins against Central Florida and Sacred Heart as a starter.



Brock Hebert led Southeastern in on-base percentage and stolen bases and was the second-leading hitter on the team. Hebert was named a second team selection at second base on the 2012 pre-season All-Southland Conference team.

Junior lefthander Jordan Hymel already has 20 career starts under his belt, including victories against Eastern Illinois, Lamar, South Alabama, Texas State, Tulane and a trio of wins versus UL-Lafayette.

"Jordan is coming back strong," Artigues said. "He was a Freshman All-American and we have him penciled in as a weekend starter."

Beyond the righty-lefty combination Southeastern is developing solid starting depth.

"Buck Bernard, a lefthander from Pearl River, and Kaleb Manuel, a righthander from LSU-Eunice, are competing for a weekend spot," Artigues said. "We also have Josh Janway who can start or relieve."

In the bullpen, the Lions possibly have the best trio of relievers in the Southland Conference. Jason Greenleaf had the lowest ERA on the staff, Josh Janway had six saves as a sophomore and Stefan Lopez struck out multiple hitters in 13 of his 21 outings last season. Lopez was an Honorable Mention on the 2011 All-Southland Conference squad.

"With Greenleaf, Janway and Lopez we're going to be solid in the bullpen," Artigues said. "If our starters do a good job and give us six solid innings we can shorten the game. Pitching is going to be one of the strengths of our club this season."

The Lions have a pair of southpaws returning to the bullpen, Matt Pittari and Steven Poche, and right-hander Dylan Hills will be concentrating full-time on pitching this season after working as a two-way player his freshman season.

"I think you'll see Dylan develop by leaps and bounds this year," Artigues said. A bevy of newcomers will also lend depth to

the Lion pitching staff.

"We also have very talented freshmen in Andro Cutura, Kyle Keller, Brennan Marque, Tanner Rainey, Layton Tromba and Taylor Veillon, and sophomore transfer Sean Kennel," Artigues said. "You'll hear a lot about them during their time at Southeastern."

CATCHERS

Southeastern returns a veteran corps that will work with the Lion pitching staff. After splitting time behind the plate with Lion record-setter Josh Cryer early in the season, Jacob Fisher settled into his role as Southeastern's starting catcher. Fisher started 41 of the Lions' 57 games last season

"Jacob did a great job last year," Artigues said. "He provided a lot of leadership behind the plate. And Torin Lucas brings us a lot of valuable experience."

The seniors will have to compete for playing time with talented freshmen Sam Roberson and Tyler Stoddard.

"Sam will step in as our number two catcher," Artigues said. "He swings the bat well enough, you may find him in the lineup somewhere else, maybe first base or designated hitter."

Stoddard spent the fall making his presence known on the gridiron, tying for the Southeastern team lead in tackles.

"Tyler is a big, strong, physical kid and he competes very hard," Artigues said. "He's a little behind because he missed all fall, but we know how athletic he is."

INFIELD

Southeastern's 2012 infield could be a matchup nightmare for opposing head coaches. The Lions feature multiple players that can play more than one position.

Sophomore Britt Gautreaux, juniors Brock Hebert and Ben Hernandez, freshman Brett Hoffman, and seniors Jonathan Pace and Michael Rutland will all compete for starting time at multiple positions.

"Jonathan Pace will be a staple of our lineup, but where he plays will depend on whether there is a lefty or righty on the mound," Artigues said. "He's a solid leader with good hands. He can play first just as well as third."

Pace led the Lions with a .343 average last season while splitting time between first and third base. Joining Pace at first will be Gautreaux.

"Britt Gautreaux will play some first and some outfield," Artigues said. "If his bat comes around, he'll definitely be in the lineup."

At third Pace will split time with Rutland and Hoffman.

"Brett is a little bit ahead defensively. He's a very solid third baseman, but he's a freshman. He has to learn to make adjustments at the plate. Right now Michael Rutland has the offensive advantage."

Hoffman was a high school shortstop and could see some time in the middle infield with Hebert and Hernandez who can each play second or short.

"We wanted to move Brock Hebert over

to short in the fall, but Ben is a shortstop,” Artigues said. “Ben did an excellent job all fall and won the shortstop job. They’ll be competing with each other, but one will be the shortstop and the other will be at second base.”

Also vying for playing time will be freshmen Kyle Bracey, Andro Cutura, Cody Rabalais and Tanner Rainey.

OUTFIELD

With the possibility Cody Gougler will see significant time as the designated hitter, Southeastern could be looking at an all-new outfield in 2012. Gone will be the power bat and solid defense of Jeff Harkensee in left as well as Southeastern’s all-time hits leader and center field ball hawk Cass Hargis.

“Cody is our returning starter in right

field,” Artigues said. “But Alex Marse had a good fall before he was injured and at the time was penciled in as our starting right fielder. If he comes back strong, Alex will be in right and Cody will be our DH.”

Gautreaux is also competing for time, leaving the Lions three solid options in right field while transfers Slade and Ladd Rhodes, respectively, will man center and left field.

“Ladd can hit in the one, two or six hole,” Artigues said. “He swings the bat well from the left side and is very athletic. He was a quarterback in high school and played centerfield in junior college. Our outfield is going to be very athletic this year.”

Adding depth to the outfield will be freshmen Bracey and Adam Michel and sophomore transfer Ryan Downing.

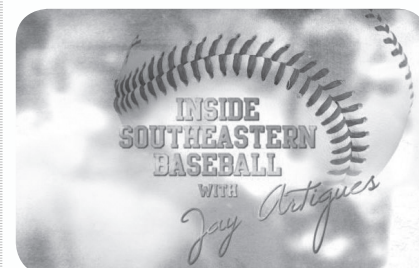
ON TELEVISION

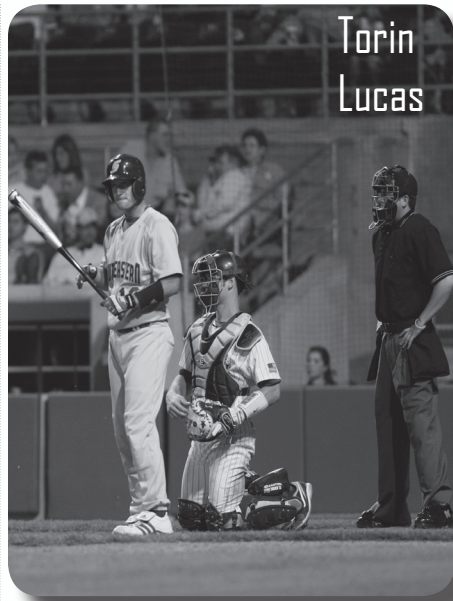

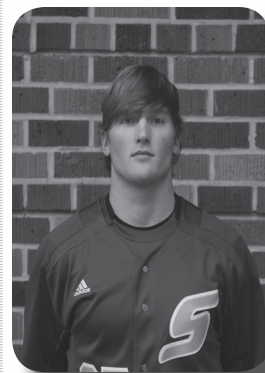

Jay Artigues, who took over as head coach of the Southeastern Louisiana University baseball program following the 2005 season and has averaged more than 36 wins per year in his 13 seasons as a head coach, enters his seventh campaign at the helm of the Lions' baseball program.

Artigues, a native of Bay St. Louis, Miss., inherited a program that had not finished above .500 since 1998; after a 23-32 finish in his first year at Southeastern the Lions have had five straight 30-plus win seasons, including a school record 40 wins in 2010.

Under Artigues the Lions have established themselves as a growing force in the region having posted marquee victories over LSU, Tulane, South Alabama and Southern Mississippi. In 2010, the Lions also posted a three-game sweep at SEC power Mississippi State.

In 2011, the Lions garnered national attention as they took two of three games from Florida International to open the season and ended Garrett Wittels attempt to break the Division I consecutive-game hit-streak record. The next weekend Southeastern swept the South Alabama Tournament, including wins over SEC-power Alabama, Conference USA member Central Florida and the host Jaguars.

In 2011, shortstop Justin Boudreaux was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 14th round of the Major League Baseball Draft and the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim drafted starting pitcher Brandon Efferson in the 37th round. In each of Artigues' six years as head coach of the Lions, at least one Southeastern player has been drafted in the MLB Draft. Senior Josh Cryer was named a Capital One Academic All-American becoming the first Lion baseball player to ever earn the honor. In August, former Lion Wade Miley made his Major League debut with the Arizona Diamondbacks.

In 2010, the Lions set another first after being nationally ranked at the Division I level for the first time in school history. The Lions were nationally ranked for eight straight weeks reaching as high as No. 17. Southeastern opened the 2010 campaign winning their first 11 games en route to a 40-19 overall record and 21-12 mark in Southland Conference play. Besides its sweep over Mississippi State, Southeastern also posted a

two-game sweep of in-state rival and Sun Belt Conference Champion UL-Lafayette as well as wins over South Alabama and Tulane.

In 2010, All-American Chris Franklin was drafted by the San Diego Padres in the 12th round of the MLB Draft. In 2010, lefthander Jordan Hymel was named Freshman All-American after posting a 7-1 record on the mound.

In 2010, Artigues was named the Louisiana Sportswriters Co-Coach of the Year.

In 2009, Artigues guided the Lions to a 37-22 record and their best-ever finish in the Southland Conference (21-12, second overall). The Lions were led on the mound in 2009 by Franklin, who posted a 5-2 record while recording a school record 12 saves with a team best 2.60 ERA. The Lions went 12-3 down the stretch before falling in the semifinals of the Southland Conference Tournament.

In 2008, Artigues molded a pitching staff that was one of the most formidable in the league, leading the Southland Conference in team ERA (4.26) and strikeouts (481) while also taking the individual crowns in both categories. Southpaw Wade Miley led the Southland Conference recording 119 strikeouts and Brent Varnado claimed the SLC ERA title with a 3.33 mark. Miley became the highest-drafted player in Southeastern history when the Arizona Diamondbacks selected picked in the first round of the 2009 MLB draft.

Prior to becoming the 15th head baseball coach in Southeastern's history, Artigues spent four seasons at Pearl River Community College where he guided the school to a 168-51 record. The Wildcats won three conference championships and advanced to the JUCO World Series during his tenure. In his final season at PRCC, Artigues led the Wildcats, who began the season ranked

No. 7 in the country to a school-record 46-12 mark and a No. 1 ranking in the final JUCO national regular-season poll.

In his first season at PRCC, Artigues led the Wildcats to 42 wins and a berth in the JUCO World Series in Millington, Tenn. PRCC finished the year as the South Division Conference Champions, Region XXIII Champions and Central District Champions with Artigues earning Region XXIII and Central District Coach of the Year honors.

Before returning to Pearl River In 2001, where he was a two-year letter winner and was a first team All-State and All-Region selection, Artigues

spent three seasons at Bossier Parish Community College and posted a 107-57 record. In his final season at Bossier Parish, Artigues led the Cavaliers to a school-record 46 wins and a No. 8 ranking in the final NJCAA poll.

In each of his three college head coaching stops

Artigues has the school record for wins in a season at each school (46 at Bossier Parish, 46 at Pearl River and 40 at Southeastern).

Artigues began his coaching career in 1992-93 as an assistant at Spring Hill College where he assisted in coaching the hitters and infielders. He served as Dean of Students and head baseball coach at St. Louis Catholic High School in Lake Charles, La., where he led the Saints to the

Class 2A state quarterfinals in 1996.

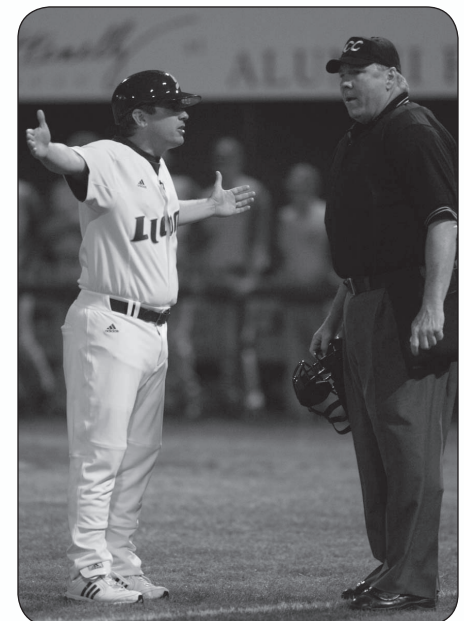
Artigues moved to Hammond in 1996 and served as athletic director and head baseball coach at St. Thomas Aquinas High School, leading the Falcons to the state playoffs while administering the school's athletic department.

Artigues then moved on to the college ranks accepting a job at UNO where he was a volunteer assistant coach in 1998 under head coach Tom Schwaner.

As a player, Artigues spent two seasons at PRCC where he was an All-State and All-Region selection. He then went on to play two seasons at Belhaven

Fourth Season at Southeastern

Matt Riser enters his fifth season on Jay Artigues' staff and his fourth as a full-time assistant coach. Riser serves as the Lions' primary hitting coach while working extensively with the Southeastern outfielders. He also serves as the third-base coach during games and the program's recruiting coordinator.

Under Riser's guidance, the Lions' offense has seen major improvements the past three seasons while averaging a .297 team batting average. The Lions led the Southland Conference in five offensive categories in their record-breaking 2010 season and had five All-Conference Players, including 12th-round draft pick Chris Franklin.

Riser coached Southeastern's newly crowned all-time hit king Cass Hargis all four seasons and previous record holder Ty Summerlin for two seasons. Summerlin was drafted in the 30th round after his senior season by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Riser also has coached three All-Americans in his four seasons, including two Fresh-



men All-Americans.

In 2008, centerfielder Hargis was named Freshman All-American in Riser's first season, and Franklin was named an NCBWA All-American after his campaign in 2009.

Riser, a Picayune, Miss., native, began his coaching career after completing his collegiate career at Tulane, where he played in 2005-06. Prior to his time in New Orleans, Riser played under current Southeastern head coach Jay Artigues for two seasons at Pearl River Community College.

Riser played in 108 games in two years with the Green Wave. As a senior, he played in all 64 games and made 57 starts, finishing the season with three home runs, 37 RBI and 16 doubles, helping Tulane to a NCAA Regional Final Appearance. In 2005 Riser played a vital role in helping Tulane to the 2005 College World Series, playing in 44 games as a junior.

At PRCC, Riser earned All-Region XXII honors and Region XXII Defensive Player of the Year honors as a sophomore, helping PRCC to the state title. He batted .376 as a sophomore and .347 as a freshman, while compiling 110 hits, 30 doubles and 109 runs scored in his two-year junior college career. Riser prepped at Picayune Memorial High and was an All-State pick as a senior.

Riser earned his degree in biomedical engineering from Tulane University in 2007. He is married to the former Jeanette Marie Craft, and the couple live in Hammond.

Daniel Latham enters his first season with Jay Artigues' staff. Latham serves as the Lions' pitching coach and assists recruiting coordinator Matt Riser with recruiting efforts.

Latham spent the 2011 season as the pitching coach at VMI, and guided the Keydets' pitching staff to the fourth-lowest team ERA in school history. The 4.78 ERA was third-best in the Big South Conference. The pitching staff also recorded the fourth-fewest walks-per-nine and fourth-most strikeouts in VMI history. The Keydets also compiled the second-most saves in school history as closer Mike Devine was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List.

Prior to VMI, Latham served two seasons as a volunteer assistant at High Point in North Carolina. He was the pitching instructor, first base coach and camp director for the Panthers. The 2010 squad recorded the most NCAA D1 wins and Big South

wins in school history. Panthers closer Jeremy Berg signed a free-agent contract with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim after the 2009 season.

While at High Point, Latham also served as the Director of the Panthers Baseball Club, maintaining all aspects of the program and serving as the head coach of the 15-and-under squad.

During the summer of 2008, Latham served as a pitching instructor at Madisonville's Sandlot Baseball Academy and as head coach for the 12 and under Louisiana Knights USSSA program.

Latham, a Covington native, was a member of the 2007 Appalachian League Champion Elizabethton Twins after being drafted in the 15th-round of the MLB Draft out of Tulane.

A closer while a four-year member of the Green Wave baseball squad, Latham recorded 13 career wins and racked up a school-record 43 saves (sixth-most in NCAA history) during his time in the Cres-

cent City. His 122 career appearance, 121 in relief, ranks second all-time for Tulane and sixth in Conference USA history. Latham's 121 career relief appearances are the 15th-highest total in NCAA history.

At Tulane, Latham participated in three NCAA Regionals, two Super Regionals and made one trip to the College World Series. He won a CUSA championship, was named to the 2004 CUSA All Freshman Team, earned All-Star honors in the Cape Cod League (2006), was a 2007 pre-season All-American (NCBWA third-team) and placed on the CUSA Commissioner's Honor Roll all four seasons.

Latham earned his degree in communications from Tulane in 2007. He resides in Hammond.

At Southern Miss, Maxie hit .266 in 99 career games with 13 home runs and 55 RBI while splitting time between catcher and designated hitter. He was a member of the Southern Miss 2009 College World Series team.

During his senior year at North Forrest High School, Maxie was named a Louisville Slugger Pre-Season All-American, an AFLAC All-American, a Wendy's High School Heisman State Finalist and the Mississippi High School Baseball Player of the Year.

Frank Misuraca (1959)

Named to the NAIA All-American team as a utility player after hitting .317 in 1958 and .293 in 1959.

Billy Ladner (1961)

Ladner was named to the NAIA All-American team as an outfielder after hitting .342 with five home runs in 1961.

Andy Davis (1976)

Named to The Sporting News second team All-American selection on a team picked by pro scouts. Davis, named to the World Series all-tournament team as a junior, batted .349 in leading the Lions to a third place finish in the nation.

Gus Malespin (1979)

Named to the Coaches' All-American team in the college division ranks. Malespin had an outstanding season for the Lions, hitting .375.

Jeff Williams (1996)

Williams was named to the Mizuno/Collegiate Baseball All-American Third Team becoming the first Lion to be named to a Division I team. Williams won a school-record 12 games and tied a school-record with 125 strikeouts. He was a starting pitcher for his native Australia in the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta and was a member of the 2004 Australian team that captured the Silver Medal at the Athens Games.

Macky Waguespack (1999)

Named to the American Baseball Coaches Association All-American First Team, Waguespack pounded out a school-record 23 home runs and 82 RBI.

Cass Hargis (2008)

Named to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, Ping! Baseball All-Freshman Honorable Mention, and Southland Conference Honorable Mention squads in his first season. Finished among the team leaders with a .333 batting average, five home runs and RBI. Finished second on the team with a .489 slugging percentage and finished fourth with a .398 on-base percentage.

Chris Franklin (2009)

Franklin was named a third-team All-American as a relief pitcher by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after setting a school-record with 12 saves, ranking 17th nationally. Posted a 5-2 record with a 2.60 earned run average.

Jordan Hymel (2010)

Hymel was named to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American squad after posting a 7-1 record in 17 appearances with 11 starts. The southpaw helped Southeastern to a school-record 40 wins and finished fourth on the team in innings pitched (64.0) and was fifth in strikeouts.

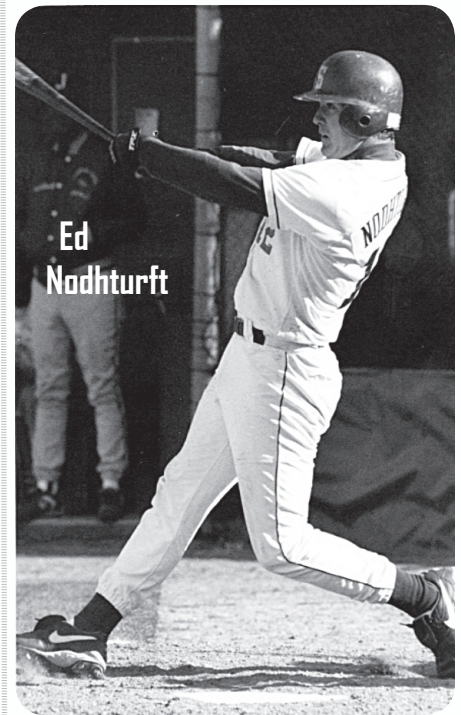

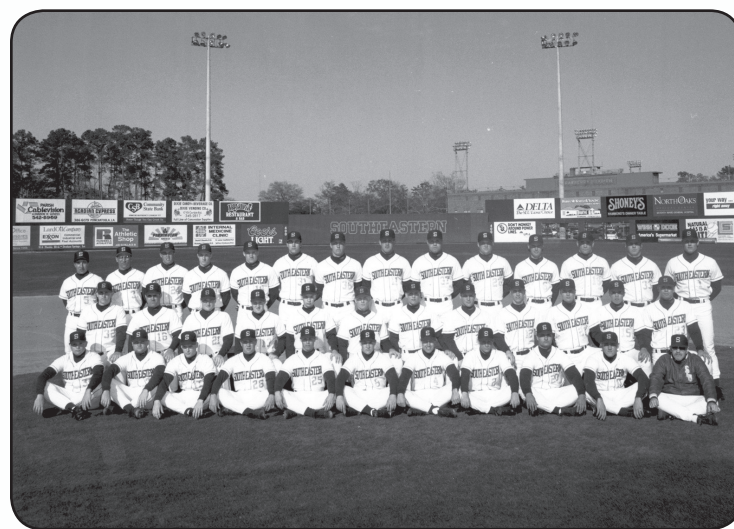
