Fourth Year at Southeastern • ULM, 1981 • 21-16 at SLU

A veteran coach and Louisiana native, **Frank Scelfo** was named the 16th head football coach in school history on January 30, 2018.

The 2020 season was moved to the spring of 2021 and Scelfo led the Lions to a 4-3 record in a season that featured all four road games being played against ranked opponents. The Lions finished the unique spring season ranked No. 20 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and No. 21 in the AFCA Coaches FCS Top 25.

Under Scelfo's tutelage, senior quarterback **Cole Kelley** won the Walter Payton Award – the Heisman Trophy of the FCS – as the nation's best offensive player and was a consensus All-American choice. Kelley was joined on the Stats Perform All-America team by junior defensive back **Ferlando Jordan**, marking Jordan's second straight year to earn All-America recognition.

Kelley, the Southland Conference and Louisiana Offensive Player of the Year, led a Lion offense that ranked in the top 10 nationally in passing offense, scoring offense, total offense, pass efficiency, third down conversion percentage, fourth down conversion percentage and red zone offense. Southeastern placed 17 student-athletes on the 2020-21 All-Southland Conference teams.

In 2019, in just his second year at the helm of the program, Scelfo was named Southland Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Lions to the third NCAA FCS playoff appearance in school history.

In the opening round, Southeastern overcame a 17-point deficit to rally past No. 8 Villanova for a 45-44 victory – the second playoff win in program history. SLU finished with an 8-5 record and earned regular season wins over No. 6 Jacksonville State and No. 6 Central Arkansas. Scelfo's squad was ranked 18th in the final AFCA Coaches poll and 19th in the final STATS FCS Top 25.

Scelfo saw 10 different student-athletes earn All-Southland Conference honors under his tutelage. He also had four players earn All-Louisiana recognition. The Lion offense finished ranked among the FCS leaders in total offense (484.8 ypg, 2nd), passing offense (354.4 ypg, 2nd), first downs (322, 5th) and scoring offense (36.6 ppg, 12th).

Jordan was named All-American by STATS, The Associated Press and HERO Sports following the season. Senior Isaac Adeyemi-Berglund, who was the No. 3 overall pick in the CFL Draft, became the first COSIDA Academic All-American in program history and earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District 6 team for the second straight season.

The Lions finished with a 4-7 overall record in their first season under Scelfo, posting a 4-5 record in Southland Conference play. Among SLU's victories were a win at FCS playoff participant Lamar and a victory over No. 11/12 McNeese.

Scelfo's charges in his debut season included 10 All-Southland Conference players.

Juwan Petit-Frere, Bransen Schwebel and Devonte Williams were all named to the first team, while Petit-Frere also earned All-American honors from the AFCA. Schwebel, Adeyemi-Berglund and Jon Miller also represented SLU on the Southland All-Academic Team with Adeyemi-Berglund claiming CoSIDA Academic All-District 6 accolades.

Scelfo's inaugural season at the helm of the program saw his Lions play a part in the department's Southland Strong Community Service Award for the 2018-19 campaign. Prior to the 2018 season, Scelfo announced the program's

partnership with CASA (Court-Appointed Special Advocates) in the Hammond area.

Scelfo came to Hammond with over 30 years of coaching experience. Scelfo took over the Southeastern program after spending the previous two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at UTSA. In 2016, his offense set 15 school records and helped the Roadrunners to their first-ever bowl game, the Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

Prior to his time in San Antonio, Scelfo coached for three seasons with the NFL's Jackson-ville Jaguars as an offensive assistant working with the quarterbacks. In his final season in Jackson-ville, **Blake Bortles** threw for 4,428 yards and 35 touchdowns under Scelfo's tutelage.

In 2010 and 2011, Scelfo was the quarterbacks coach at the University of Arizona. During his tenure with the Wildcats, he tutored future NFL quarterbacks **Nick Foles** and **Tom Savage**. Foles, a third-round draft pick in 2012, was the Super Bowl LII MVP after leading the Philadelphia Eagles to a 41-33 victory.

The three seasons prior saw Scelfo serve as the offensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech. Scelfo's stint in Ruston included a 2008 Independence Bowl victory – the Bulldogs' first bowl victory in three decades.

Before heading to north Louisiana, Scelfo spent 11 seasons on the staff at Tulane, including the final eight as the Green Wave's offensive coordinator. Scelfo was the recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach for a 1998 TU squad that was one of two FBS teams to finish undefeated that season, recording a 12-0 mark and a Liberty Bowl victory.


Scelfo's Green Wave offenses were ranked among the national passing leaders in five different seasons and four Tulane quarterbacks – Patrick Ramsey, J.P. Losman, Lester Ricard and Shaun King – went on to play in the NFL. A total of eight Tulane players were selected in the NFL Draft during Scelfo's time in the Big Easy, highlighted by two-time Pro Bowl running back Matt Forte.

Scelfo's Tulane offenses produced the school's all-time passing leader in Ramsey, the program's all-time rushing and all-purpose yardage leader in **Mewelde Moore** and **Roydell Williams**, who set the school's career record for touchdown receptions. Moore was only the second player in NCAA history to top both 4,000 rushing and 2,000 receiving yards under Scelfo's guidance.

Scelfo's coaching career began at Prairie View High School in Bastrop, where he served as head coach for the 1982-83 seasons. He also coached at Jesuit High School (1984), River Oaks High School (1985-86), Vidor High School (1987), Orangefield High School (1988), Chapel Hill School (1989-91), Kilgore College (1992-94) and Galena Park North Shore High School (1995).

Scelfo was a four-year letter winner on the baseball diamond at ULM from 1978-81, earning the school's Athlete of the Year award as a senior. He earned his bachelor's degree from his alma mater in 1981, before completing his graduate studies in 1983.

He and his wife, Holly, are the parents of two sons, Anthony and Jordan. Anthony, who coaches the Southeastern tight ends and serves at the team's pass game and recruiting coordinator, played both football and baseball at Tulane and was selected in the 2008 MLB Draft by the Tampa Bay Rays. Jordan played baseball and football teams at SLL's Southland rival LIW from 2012-15

About Southeastern

Southeastern climbed into the top 10 in the national rankings for the first time since 2014 on Monday, as the Lions moved to No. 9 in both the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and AFCA FCS Coaches Top 25.

The Lions (5-1, 3-0 SLC) are off to a 5-1 start to the season for the first time since 1980. SLU heads into Saturday's game on a fourgame winning streak, which is tied for its longest under head coach Frank Scelfo.

Southeastern opened its home schedule last Saturday with a 61-24 victory over HBU. On the way to their highest point total of 2021, the Lions set new season highs 634 total yards, 238 rushing yards and 34 first downs.

In the win over HBU, senior quarterback and reigning Walter Payton Award winner Cole Kelley tied a career-high for the second straight week with five passing touchdowns, throwing for 396 yards on 31-for-38 passing. Kelley connected with Austin Mitchell for a pair of touchdowns, while Nick Kovacs, CJ Turner and Gage Larvadain were also on the other end of Kelley scoring tosses.

The Lion offense is averaging 50.7 points and 569.5 yards per game this season. SLU leads the nation in third-down conversion percentage (59.5), completion percentage (74.6) and tackles for loss allowed per game (3.0), while also ranking among the FCS national leaders in scoring offense (2nd), total offense (2nd), first downs (188, 2nd) and passing yards per game (404.7, 3rd).

Armed with a plethora of explosive receiving options and guarded by a stalwart offensive line, Kelley is ahead of his production pace from the spring, when he claimed the FCS version of the Heisman. The Lafayette, Louisiana native has thrown for 2,395 yards, 23 touchdowns and five interceptions on 195-for-258 passing, while also rushing for a team-high seven touchdowns.

Kelley currently leads the nation in completion percentage (75.6), while sitting second in FCS in completions per game (32.5), passing touchdowns, passing yards, points responsible for (182) and total offense (440.0 ypg).

He's completed passes to 16 different receivers with Mitchell (38 catches, 496 yards, six touchdowns), Turner (27-464-5 TD) and **Nolan Givan** (27-245-1 TD) the most prolific targets. Kovacs (3 TD), Larvadain (2 TD), Tim Wilson Jr. (2 TD) and Cephus **Johnson III** (2 TD) all have multiple touchdown receptions.

The Southeastern defense limited HBU to 295 total yards - including just 56 on the ground. Jack Henderson and Brandon Barbee each recorded interceptions, while Josh Randall recovered a fumble for a touchdown. Alexis Ramos led the Lions with five tackles, as he, Chinedu Ogbonna, Garrett Crawford, Rodney Sopsher and Bryce Cage were all credited with tackles for loss.

Opponents are averaging 31.7 points and 385.2 yards per game versus Southeastern. Ramos leads the team with 37 tackles, followed by Alphonso Taylor (26), Herman Christophe (24), Matt Wright (19) and **Donniel Ward-Magee** (19). Crawford paces the squad with 4.5 tackles for loss.

The SLU defense is fourth in FCS with 10 interceptions this season. Taylor and **Zy** Alexander each have two picks, while Henderson, Barbee, Ferlando Jordan, Justin Douglas, Justin Dumas and Terrell Carter have one apiece.

On special teams, Larvadain is second nationally with 35.3 yards per kickoff return. **Mateo Rengifo** is a perfect 4-for-4 on field goals, while Austin Dunlap is averaging 42.8 yards per punt on eight punts this fall.

About Northwestern State

The Demons will be looking for their first home win of the season when SLU visits this Saturday. Last Saturday, a 21-3 halftime deficit was too much for NSU to overcome in a 35-17 loss to McNeese.

Northwestern State is averaging 16.5 points and 361.2 yards per game through six games. Kaleb Fletcher (120-for-187, six touchdowns, four interceptions) and Zach Clement (18-30, 220 yards, 0 TD, O INT) have both seen time under center with Jay Griffin IV (28 catches, 298 yards, two touchdowns) and Kendrick Price Jr. (17-271-2 TD) serving as the top targets. All-Southland performer Scooter Adams leads NSU with 286 rushing yards, despite missing the past two games.

Opponents are averaging 30.3 points and 407.8 vards per contest versus the Demon defense. Jomard Valsin leads NSU with 39 tackles, as he and Isaiah Longino share team-high honors with 5.5 tackles for loss. **PJ Harrington** paces Northwestern State with two interceptions, while Jared Pedraza has a team-high three fumble recoveries.

Series vs. Northwestern State

Saturday will be the 65th meeting between the longtime in-state rivals. Southeastern leads the all-time series, 35-29, having won the last nine meetings with the Demons.

- Southeastern Louisiana kicker Mateo Rengifo drilled the game-winning 21-yard field goal with two seconds remaining to give the No. 18 Lions a thrilling 27-24 victory over Northwestern State at Strawberry Stadium. - The Lions (2-1, 2-1 Southland) scored the final 13 points of the game to erase a 10-point fourth quarter deficit. For the second straight week, NSU (0-2, 0-2 Southland) saw an upset bid of a nationally-ranked opponent fall just short, as the Demons fell to SLU for the ninth straight time.

- The difference in the ball game came in the kicking game, as Rengifo was a perfect 3-for-3 on PAT's and knocked in both of his field goals. Meanwhile, NSU kicker Eddie Godina had three field goals blocked - two by Ferlando Jordan and one by Jack Henderson. Jordan was named Southland and LSWA Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts.

- Southeastern finished with 477 total yards of offense in the victory. Cole Kelley threw for 338 yards and a touchdown on 28-for-39 passing, while also rushing for a touchdown and catching a touchdown. Kelley was named the LSWA Offensive Player of the Week after his performance.
- CJ Turner was Kelley's top target, hauling in nine passes for 127 yards, while Javon Conner grabbed seven passes for 73 yards. Morgan Ellison highlighted the SLU ground game with 10 carries for 81 yards.
- Defensively, Alexis Ramos paced SLU with 17 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack on the way to being named LSWA Defensive Player of the Week. Donniel Ward-Magee added 10 stops, while Justin Douglas recorded his first interception as a Lion.

Game Notes:

- The No. 15/17 Southeastern Louisiana University football team scored 22 straight points in the second half to pull away for a 49-28 victory over North Alabama in the season opener for both teams at Braly Stadium
- The game marked the end of one the most challenging weeks ever for the football program at SLU (1-0). The contest was originally scheduled to be played in Strawberry Stadium, but the effects of Hurricane Ida on the Hammond area and SLU campus forced the game to be moved to Florence, where UNA (0-1) was a tremendous host, offering proceeds from the contest to the Southeastern program.
- Southeastern faced adversity against a game host, trailing 21-20 midway through the third quarter. SLU turned it on from that point, outscoring the home-standing Lions, 28-7, over the final quarter and a half.
- Reigning Walter Payton Award winner and SLU senior quarterback **Cole Kelley** led an efficient Southeastern attack that controlled the ball for nearly 37 minutes and converted 10-of-15 on third downs on the way to a 495-yard performance. Kelley finished 30-for-41 for 263 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for another score on the way to being named Southland Confernece Player of the Week.

- Kelley connected with 11 different receivers, as Nolan Givan, Austin Mitchell and Cephus Johnson III all caught touchdowns. Taron Jones led SLU's 232-yard rushing attack, finishing with 11 carries for 85 yards and a touchdown. Johnson III also rushed for a score in Saturday's win.
- Alphonso Taylor led Southeastern with nine tackles, while Mike Mason, Tainano Gaulua and Arlen Williams each recorded a sack. Ferlando Jordan became the Southland Conference's all-time leader with his fifth interception returned for a touchdown of his career and was named Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his ef-
- Jaylen Gipson threw for 350 yards, four touchdowns and an interception on 23-for-46 passing for UNA. His top target was Takairee Kenebrew, who caught seven passes for 132 yards and three touchdowns. Southeastern limited the North Alabama running game, holding the Lions to 54 yards on the ground.

Game 2 (9.11.21) Louisiana Tech 45 No. 13/15 Southeastern 42 Ruston, La. (Joe Aillet Stadium)

Game Notes:

- In a game that featured over 1,000 yards of offense, Louisiana Tech held off No. 13/14 Southeastern Louisiana University, 45-42, in nonconference football action at Joe Aillet Stadium.

- SLU (1-1) gave the Bulldogs (1-1) all they could handle in the first meeting between the two in-state rivals since 2008. The Lions came up just short of ending its 26-game losing streak versus FBS opponents. Ultimately, 10 penalties for 100 yards and three turnovers were too much for Southeastern to overcome in its upset bid.
- The Lion offense rolled to 598 total yards and 32 first downs against the Conference USA member Bulldogs. Reigning Walter Payton Award winner and SLU senior quarterback Cole Kelley threw for a career-high 495 yards on 44-for-59 passing, throwing for three touchdowns and two interceptions. Kelley's single-game yardage total was the second-highest in program history, with only Martin Hankins' 588 yards versus Arkansas-Monticello in 2004 topping Kelley's output.
- Austin Mitchell (nine catches, 89 yards), CJ Turner (8-131) and Tim Wilson Jr. (7-72) were the top targets for Kelley, as all three members of the trio caught touchdown passes. Turner's performance marked his eighth 100-yard receiving performance of his career – a new program record. Kelley also rushed for a pair of touchdowns, while **Taron Jones** also found the end zone on the ground for the second straight game.
- Alexis Ramos led SLU with 10 tackles, while Tainano Gaulua collected a sack for the second time in as many games. Zy Alexander recorded his first interception as a Lion.
- The Bulldogs finished with 448 total yards, including 198 on the ground. Marcus Williams Jr. led LTU with 99 yards on 18 carries, while Greg Garner recorded a pair of rushing touchdowns. Austin Kendall finished with 217 passing yards, a touchdown and an interception on 19-of-27 passing for Louisiana Tech.
