# HOME OF LION SOCCER



Women's Soccer  
at Sullivan Field

Throughout the last decade, Loyola Marymount University's Sullivan Field has served as an official training site for some of the world's greatest soccer teams, not to mention, a frequent practice site for various Major League Soccer teams when visiting Los Angeles to face the LA Galaxy.

In addition to hosting the best in the world, Sullivan has been a true "advantage" for the Lions in recent years. The Lions have posted winning records in four of the last five seasons at Sullivan Field, accumulating an impressive 28-13 record at home.

The 1994 FIFA World Cup, the world's largest single-sport event, was played over a 31-day span between June 17 and July 17 in nine different venues throughout the United States. Sweden, Italy and Argentina were among the teams that prepared for competition at LMU prior to their final matches.

Four years later, LMU once again welcomed soccer teams from many different nations. The field was used as a practice site for the World Cup exhibition Gold Cup Tournament.

Most recently, the Lions' home field served as the training facility for the 1999 Women's World Cup held in June and July. LMU was host to Italy and Nigeria as the two teams prepared for the international competition. In addition, the Los Angeles Galaxy trains at Sullivan Field in the offseason and the field was the practice site of the South Korean National Team two years ago.

Beginning in 2002, Sullivan Field will be a practice site for the annual Rose Bowl game.

## How to Get to Sullivan Field

Loyola Marymount University is located in the Westchester District of Los Angeles. From Los Angeles International Airport, proceed north on Sepulveda, to Lincoln Boulevard (Highway 1). Continue 1.5 miles west and turn right at Manchester Boulevard. At the first stoplight, approximately two blocks, turn left on Loyola Boulevard. From the 405 Freeway (north or south), exit Howard Hughes Pkwy and go west to Sepulveda. Make a left on Sepulveda and proceed to 80th street and make a right. Take 80th street to Loyola Blvd and make a right to enter the campus. Parking is available in the lot immediately to your left. Sullivan Field is located on the right hand side as you enter the campus gates.

# Gregg Murphy

## H E A D C O A C H



One of the outstanding young minds in college soccer, Gregg Murphy begins his seventh season as head coach of the LMU women's soccer program.

Murphy, who assumed coaching responsibilities in July 1996, came to LMU after serving a successful stint as head coach of both the men's and women's programs at Chapman University in Orange, Calif. He boasts a wealth of experience as both a player and a coach.

Murphy's success as a coach, and the success of his players on the field, has brought unparalleled success to LMU. His teams have seen greater accomplishments with each passing season. The past six seasons the Lions have been dominate at Sullivan Field, winning 72 percent of their games (28-11-4). During the 2000 season he enjoyed the 100th win of his career against UNLV, and led the Lions to their best-ever finish in conference history (5-2), including a shutout victory against nationally ranked Santa Clara (No. 22). They finished the season ahead of Santa Clara and the University of San Diego in the conference standings, both of whom earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In 1999, Murphy led the Lions to a 13-6 mark that included a "top 20" national ranking at No. 19. In addition, four Lions were named to all-conference teams. In 1998, the Lions posted their best record ever at 12-2-5, not losing a game at home. In that season, for the first time in LMU women's soccer history, the squad was ranked among national leaders in three different categories (No. 3 in shutouts per game-0.68, No. 9 in team defense-0.58 GAA, No. 23 in winning percentage-76.3).

Off the field, Murphy continues to stress the importance of developing a complete student-athlete. His squads were honored in 1997 and 1998 by the athletic department for having the highest cumulative team GPAs in the department. The Lions again finished the 1999-00 and 2000-01 academic years with impressive cumulative team GPAs of 3.075 and 3.14, marks respectively.

Murphy came from Chapman, his alma mater, where he became the full-time coach of the women's program in 1990. He gradually built the program into one of the most successful in the region. He guided the team to its first winning season in 1992 and fol-

lowed with four consecutive winning campaigns. The 1994 squad finished with a 13-6 overall record competing as an NCAA Division III independent, while the 1995 squad posted a school-best 13-5 record and was ranked third in the West Region.

On the men's side, Murphy led the Chapman program to dramatic improvements. He inherited a struggling program in 1990, but increased its win total each season, capping the program's rise with a 17-4-1 record and a trip to the 1995 NCAA Division III Final Four. His men's teams, which were ranked among the West Region's top-three squads in his last three seasons, captured the 1995 West Regional championship. For his efforts, Murphy was named the 1995 NCAA West Regional Coach of the Year.

Murphy built his Chapman teams around players who were able to balance student-athlete responsibilities both in the classroom and on the soccer field. His squads consistently had among the highest grade point averages in the athletic department, yet his recruiting techniques helped land numerous all-state, all-region, and even U.S. National Team players.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Murphy established rich ties to Chapman as a player. A four-year letterwinner (1981-84) for the Panthers, he earned all-conference honors three times and All-America honors twice. In 1984 he played for the West Regional team and was named an alternate on the U.S. National Team. He

remains one of Chapman's greatest scorers with 24 goals, 12 assists, and 60 career points. Upon graduation, Murphy played two seasons of professional soccer for the Los Angeles Lazers reserve team of the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL).

With far-reaching contacts in the soccer world, Murphy holds a USSF National "A" Coaching License. He served as an Olympic Development Program (ODP) state coach (Under-16) from 1994-97 and a U.S. Soccer Regional Assistant Coach (Under-17) in 1997. In addition, Murphy was a member of the evaluation staff for the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer, and served on the Inner City Program committee with the 1994 FIFA World Cup. He served as a technical advisor for the United States Soccer Federation during the 1999 Women's World Cup. He's currently the head coach for the Under-16 Region IV girls' team.

Murphy originally began his head coaching career at the prep level at Santa Ana Foothill High School (1986-88) and then served as an assistant at Anaheim Canyon High School (1988-90).

Born on Nov. 21, 1962 in Colorado Springs, Colo., Murphy is a 1981 graduate of Mitchell High School in Colorado Springs. He graduated in 1986 from Chapman University with a bachelor of arts degree in business management.

He and his wife Tina and their 3 year-old son Jack reside in Orange, Calif. with their two dogs, Guernsey and Doodle.

# Michelle Myers

## ASSISTANT COACH

Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana. Under her helm (1992-95), the Monarchs amassed a three-year record of 46-20-11, including back-to-back South Coast League Championships in 1994 and 1995. In addition, Myers led the team to a CIF semifinal appearance in 1994 and a quarterfinal trip in 1995.

Before taking over the varsity program, Myers guided Mater Dei's junior varsity team to the 1990 and 1991 Angelus League Championships while compiling an overall record of 39-5-2. Her first taste of coaching came in the dual role of junior varsity head coach and varsity assistant coach at Los Altos High School in the S.F. Bay Area.

An outstanding collegiate player, Myers played four seasons at Santa Clara University. As a senior, she helped the Broncos to a 10-4-3 overall record and a No. 17 national ranking, the first national ranking in program history. In her four seasons (1984-87) at SCU, the team totaled an overall record of 46-17-10.

A 1984 graduate of Rosary High School in Fullerton, Calif., Myers earned All-Freeway

League, All-Orange County and All-CIF honors in both soccer and softball. As a member of the JUSA U-18 select team, she earned a bronze medal in the Norway Cup.

On the club level, Myers coached with the Wolfpack Soccer Club in Fountain Valley, Calif., for three years (1995-97). She served on the advisory board for the United States Academy (formerly International Soccer Select) in Sarasota, Fla., where she guided the Under-19 team to Sweden's Gothia Cup and Denmark's Dana Cup in the summer of 1995 and 1996. Myers has also worked for CYSA-South since 1996 for the Olympic Development Program (ODP). Currently, she serves as an assistant coach for the Cal South Under-17 state team. She also works as a scout for the ODP under the direction of former national team coach Steve Sampson.

Myers is a 1988 magna cum laude graduate of Santa Clara with a bachelor's of science degree in combined sciences. She was born March 18, 1966 in Harbor City, Calif. Myers currently resides in Playa del Rey, Calif.

Michelle Myers begins her seventh season as an assistant coach with the LMU women's soccer program.

She joined the program in 1996 after serving one year as head coach of the women's program at Rancho Santiago Community College in Santa Ana, Calif. Myers inherited the program in its second year of existence and led a youthful squad to a 9-10-1 overall record in 1995.

Before moving to the college ranks, Myers spent three seasons guiding one of the top prep girls' soccer programs in Southern California at

## Mathes Mennell

### ASSISTANT COACH

Mathes Mennell enters his first season with the LMU as an assistant to Gregg Murphy, serving as the goalkeeper coach. He joins the team after spending the last two seasons at the United States Air Force Academy as an assistant coach for the Falcons men's soccer team. Mennell joined LMU as a men's assistant coach in June of 1998 until February of 2000 when he left to finish his military commitment with the U.S. Air Force.

A 1996 Air Force Academy graduate, Mennell was a standout goalkeeper for the Falcons from 1992-1995. He was a three-year starter who earned All-MPSF first-team honors as a junior and honorable mention accolades in his sophomore and senior seasons.

Following graduation, he continued his soccer career spending time in the A-League with the Colorado Foxes and the USL Premier League Pikes Peak Stampede. In 1996 and 1999 Mennell played for the All-Air Force team. Also in 1996 he was a member of the United States All-Armed Service team which qualified for the World Military Championships.

Currently a USSF "B" licensed coach, Mennell enters his sixth year of collegiate coaching. In addition to his time at LMU and Air Force he has been active youth soccer serving as a Region IV Olympic Development Program staff coach.

A native of Bristol, Tenn., Mennell and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Redondo Beach, Calif., with their two Bassett Hounds, Hoss and Copper.



## Kelly Cooke

### ASSISTANT COACH

Kelly Cooke begins his seventh year as a volunteer assistant coach with the LMU women's soccer program.

A graduate and four-year letterwinner at Chapman University, Cooke served as an assistant men's soccer coach at Chapman for 12 years beginning in 1985. In 1990 he assumed responsibilities of assisting the women's program for the following six seasons. Cooke came to LMU when head coach Gregg Murphy was hired in the summer of 1996.

2002 Lions' Coaching Staff



*With a strong core of returning veterans and an athletic group of newcomers, Head Coach Gregg Murphy and the 2002-03 Lions look to make a serious run for the West Coast Conference Championship.*

The Loyola Marymount University women's soccer team will rely on a stingy defense and some explosive offensive players to return to the top of the West Coast Conference. The Lions though are looking forward to the challenge ahead, as five of the eight conference teams earned invitations to the College Cup in 2001.

The West Coast Conference was one of only three conferences in the nation to have four teams ranked in the final top 25 last year. Two of the conference's teams went to the Final Four and one became national champion.

"We are very optimistic this season and looking forward to a great year," LMU Head Coach Gregg Murphy said. "We felt that we played some very good soccer last fall and are looking to forward to another exciting year."

**DEFENSE**

Leading the way this season will be junior central defender Laura Trask. After earning second-team All-WCC honors and the teams defensive player of the year award, Trask will be the focal point of a Lion squad that held its opponents to just 23 goals in 17 matches (1.4 per game).

"Laura is a fantastic student of the game," Murphy said. "She's a soccer junkie. Last season, because of some injuries to our top

defenders, we had to move her to the back. It was tough, since she is one of our most dynamic offensive threats. But she added a completely different aspect to our defense, which helped us immensely."

Joining Trask, as defensive mainstays, will be juniors Jennifer Cefalia and Jamie Shoma, along with sophomore Kylie Beren.

"Both Cefalia and Shoma have a lot of confidence," Murphy said. "Shoma is a very capable defender and is ready to have a strong season. Cefalia is a great conditioned athlete and is really an anchor from the front to the back. Beren had a goal her freshman season and we are confident she will only improve upon that this year."

Senior Annie Beltran and redshirt freshman Sara Aldama, both of whom had tremendous Springs, will also be vying for a starting position.

Freshmen Jennifer Horn and Heather Allen are two members of a recruiting class ranked seventh in the West Region by Soccer Buzz Magazine. The Lions had the top class among West Coast teams according to Soccer Buzz.

"We look for both Jenn and Heather to be key contributors this year," Murphy said. "They could be among the top four defenders. They are tenacious players and we feel that both of them could have an impact on our team this year."

**GOALKEEPER**

Anchoring the defense will be senior goalkeeper Elizabeth Skhal. Last season, Skhal earned honorable mention All-WCC honors, while recording 54 saves for a 1.37 goals against average. Both marks ranked fifth in the league.

"Beth is very athletic and technically quite strong," Murphy said. "She missed a good portion of September last season with a foot injury, but that allowed our other goalkeepers to gain some valuable game experience."

Junior Autumn Moody and sophomore Kelly Yukihiro took advantage of the playing time. Moody averaged 0.25 shutouts per game, which ranked ninth in the conference, while Yukihiro appeared in five games and started two.

**OFFENSE**

One of the key focus points for the Lions heading into the 2002 campaign will be goal scoring. In 2001, the Lions were able to create quality chances but were unlucky in the finishing department.

They were however able to score against Portland and Saint Mary's, both of whom ranked in the top 15 nationally in goals against average. The goal against the Gaels led to a 1-0 victory when they were ranked No. 7 late in the season. It was the second victory over a ranked opponent for LMU, who knocked off No. 24 Michigan on August 31.

The Lions outscored their opponents 9-7 in their last eight games, posting a 4-4 record. Three of those losses were by a single goal. Looking to up their scoring output will be senior Myka Peck and junior Shari Nishikawa. Peck earned honorable mention

all-conference, while Nishikawa started all 15 games she appeared in. Fellow upperclassmen **Jill Dobens** and **Haleigh Roach** will also be back after solid 2001 campaigns.

"Jill is our most dangerous returning offensive player," Murphy said. "She does a nice job of creating for others and Haleigh is a tremendous playmaker. She has good vision and we look for her to score some from outside the 18-yard box."

Also looking for playing time will be **Stephanie Tobin** and **Kristen Frawley**, both of whom are hard workers with a good nose for the goal.

Rounding out the squad will be freshmen **Caroline Dugoni**, **Kellie Schroeder**, **Jessica Hanson**, **Sheena Jarvis**, **Kelly Lewandowski**, **Katherine Arias** and **Lori Sims**.

"We are hoping for Lewandowski and Schroeder to make an immediate impact," Murphy said. "They are both potent goal scorers. We expect all of our freshmen to push the returnees to make this team as good as it can be."

#### SCHEDULE

LMU will showcase one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Eight of the Lions' 19 contests will be against teams that were among the nation's top 25 last season, including two that advanced to the College Cup.

"Our philosophy on scheduling has been to put together a more demanding schedule each year," Murphy said. "We want to be the best and to do so we have to play the best. We don't get any weekends off and we need to be ready to battle or else we aren't going to get the outcome we want."

The Lions will have the luxury of opening the 2002 season with three consecutive home games, before experiencing the rigors of the road. They will have 13 games this season at Sullivan Field.

The Lions will play host to San Jose State on August 31 at 1 p.m., to

begin the 2002 season, followed by a Sept. 2 date with San Diego State. The team will then play Loyola-Chicago on Sept. 8 before traveling to Winston-Salem, N.C., for the Wake Forest Nike Tournament. The Lions will take on the host Demon Deacons on Sept. 13 and wrap up the tourney with a Sept. 15 match-up against Vanderbilt.

Following its trip to North Carolina, LMU will return home for four consecutive matches at Sullivan Field. After contests with Cal Poly and Loyola Maryland on Sept. 20 and 22, respectively, national power Southern Methodist will visit Los Angeles on Sept. 27. Following the contest with the Mustangs, a Sept. 29 contest with Washington State will mark the first of three consecutive Pac-10 schools on the LMU schedule.

On Oct. 4, the Lions will travel to USC to take on the Trojans, before coming home on Oct. 6 to take on UCLA, which completed last season with the No. 5 ranking.

UC Irvine will be the final non-conference opponent for LMU, before the Lions open West Coast Conference action with Pepperdine at home on Oct. 18. The Lions will then travel north to take on Portland and Gonzaga on the weekend of Oct. 13, before returning home for contests with San Diego and defending national champion Santa Clara, the following weekend.

On Nov. 3, the Lions will head to San Francisco to take on the Dons, before returning home for the season finale with St. Mary's on Nov. 9.

The NCAA Tournament will begin Nov. 15 at sites yet to be determined.

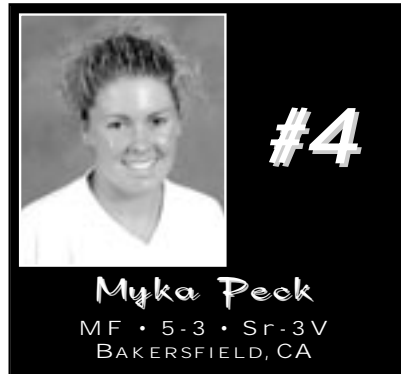

## 2001 FINAL STANDINGS

**W**hen the West Coast Conference first got its start back in 1952, the founders really had only one goal in mind... to create a convenient way for five Bay Area schools to play basketball. What has grown from that original vision some 51 years ago is a cohesive athletics league which is competitive at the national level in 13 sports; baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball. Seven of the league's members - the University of Portland, Gonzaga University, Loyola Marymount University, Saint Mary's College, the University of San Diego, the University of San Francisco and Santa Clara University - participate in men's and women's soccer. Pepperdine University, the eighth WCC member, fields only a women's team.

The league, which celebrated its 50th anniversary last year, was chartered by five institutions (San Francisco, Saint Mary's, Santa Clara, San Jose State and Pacific) as the California Basketball Association, playing its first game on Jan. 2, 1953. After two seasons of play under that name, the conference expanded to include Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine in 1955, and became the "West Coast Athletic Conference" in 1956. The name was shortened in 1989. The current alignment has remained unchanged since 1979, making the WCC the third most stable conference in the nation. Only the Ivy League and Pacific-10 conferences have been together longer. The eight current members of the WCC span the western coast of the United States from Canada to Mexico. Though the locales range from the pine forests of eastern Washington state to the sun drenched beaches of Southern California, the combined excellence in athletics and academics sets the conference apart on the national scene and draws the individual institutions together in a common mission.

The West Coast Conference, among the nation's best soccer conferences, has seen its soccer fortunes rise steadily over the past 11 years, an upswing that happens to coincide with the league's move to a men's round-robin schedule in 1988. To date, the WCC owns six national soccer championships, with San Francisco's men's team earning four (1966, 1975, 1976, 1980), Santa Clara's men's team owning one (1989) and Santa Clara's women's team earning one last year (2001).

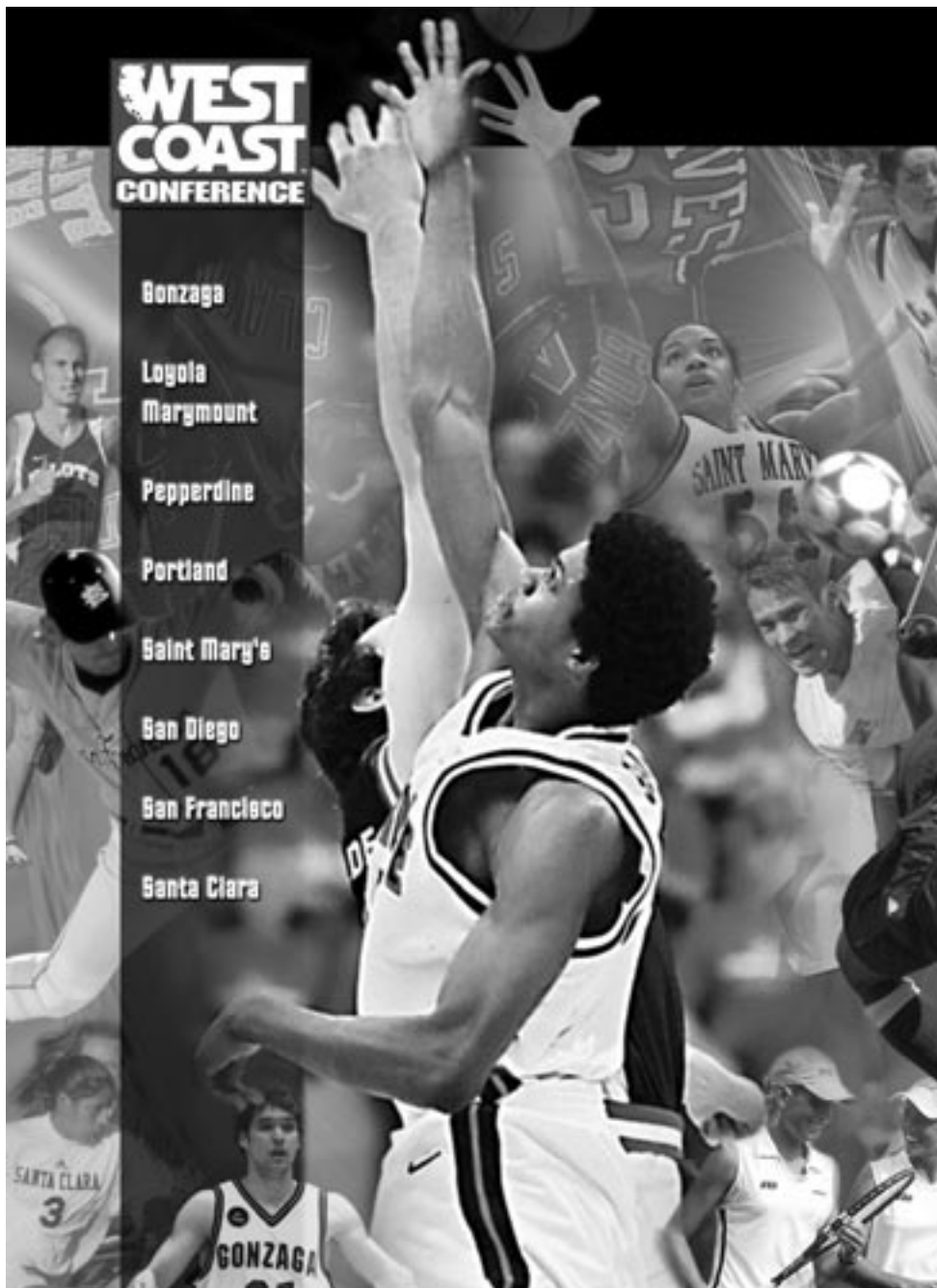

**Dr. William Husak**  
*LMU Director of Athletics*

**D**r. William S. Husak begins his fifth year as the Athletic Director at Loyola Marymount University. Since taking over the program in 1998, LMU has reached a new level of success. With the implementation of the 10-year strategic plan, the future is bright for LMU athletics.

Husak's first appointment as a collegiate athletic director has focused on developing a team of coaches, support staff and administrators who believe that LMU's athletics program can be among the elite in the nation. His first four years have been marked by enhancing the support of the athletic teams through the creation of the Student-Athlete Academic Center and the Lions Strength and Conditioning Center, increased scholarship and operational support and enhancing the coaching and support staff.

The past two years have been two of the most successful seasons in school history as the Lions won over 55 percent of its dual competitions. Since 1998, LMU has claimed eight conference championships and 10 NCAA postseason appearances. Off the field, the Lions have had a 50 percent increase in national scholar-athletes as 159 claimed the honor in the 2001-02 academic year, the most in school history. Last year 85 student-athletes were named to the West Coast Conference honor roll.

Husak attributes the current success and the future growth of the program on the staff that is in place. Since he took over the program, the coaching and administrative staffs that lend support to the more than 330 student-athletes has more than doubled in size. At the conclusion of the 2002-03 athletic year, a full-time head coach will lead each of the 17 varsity sports sponsored at LMU. When Husak took over, only nine of the programs were led by full-time coaches.

In addition, support for the student-athletes was enhanced with the addition of six brand new support staff positions, which included an athletic academic coordinator, marketing/promotions manager, corporate relations manager, assistant athletic trainer, and an assistant media relations director.

"Although much has been accomplished, there is still a great deal to achieve," Husak said. "If our athletics program is truly to become consistently great, we must achieve the objectives of our campaigns for facilities and endowments. We can not do this without the support of all those who believe that athletics is an integral part of the LMU experience for not just the student-athletes but all who are associated with this great University."

Husak comes from a long and accomplished background as an administrator, fundraiser and professor.



**Rev. Robert B. Lawton, S.J.**  
*LMU President*

**R**obert B. Lawton, S.J., fourteenth president of Loyola Marymount University, is a classicist, scripture scholar, administrator, and priest.

Born in Cumberland, Maryland, he entered the Society of Jesus in July 1965.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Fordham University (summa cum laude) with a major in classics in 1971, he went on to earn his Ph.D. in Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations from Harvard University in 1977 where he was a Danforth and a Woodrow Wilson Fellow. He was ordained on June 13, 1981.

From 1977 to 1979, Father Lawton served in several positions at Georgetown University, including assistant professor in the Department of Theology. After a year of further studies in Germany, he taught Hebrew and Aramaic at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome from 1982 to 1984.

In 1984, he became an Assistant Dean of Georgetown College and, in 1989, he was named its Dean. Prior to accepting the position of president at Loyola Marymount in May of 1999, he was a trustee of the University of Scranton, and Fairfield University. He is a trustee of Loyola Marymount, Boston College, and the William H. Hannon Foundation.

Father Lawton holds the rank of professor in LMU's Departments of Theological Studies and Classics.

As the former senior associate athletic director at California State University Long Beach, he enjoyed a successful career in both the academic and athletic arena over a span of 18 years. From 1993-1998, he served as the director of the 49er Athletic Association, and helped raise \$6 million towards a \$22 million capital campaign for construction of CSULB's athletic complex, The Pyramid.

While at CSULB from 1983-1997, Husak served as an assistant commissioner for the California Collegiate Athletic Association. There, one of Husak's main responsibilities included supervising officials for the conference. Between 1986 and 1993 he served as chairman of CSULB's physical education department. As an associate professor of physical education at CSULB between 1979 and 1986, he established the university's Motor Behavior Laboratory.

A 1972 graduate of State University of New York (SUNY) at Cortland, Husak holds a master's degree and Ph.D. in physical education from Texas A&M University. He and his wife of 30 years, Tish, live in Long Beach and have three sons, Greg, 28, Todd, 24 and Jon, 22.
