

LOYOLA MARYMOUNT PLAYS UCLA IN FIRST ROUND OF THE 2002 NCAA COLLEGE CUP

Friday, Nov. 15, 2002 - 8:30 p.m. - Marshall Field

Just Briefly

The Lions ended their regular season with a 0-0 double overtime tie against Saint Mary's on a rainy, muddy Sullivan Field last Saturday. LMU's record stands at 10-6-3 overall, 3-3-1 in the West Coast Conference. LMU goalkeeper Elizabeth Skhal faced eight shots and made two saves.

Up Next

The Loyola Marymount University women's soccer team was selected to the 64-team NCAA College Cup Tournament. The Lions are set to face No. 3 UCLA (16-3-0/8-1 Pac 10) in the opening round of the postseason tournament. The match will take place this Friday at 8:30 p.m. on Frank W. Marshall Field at Drake Stadium on the Bruin campus. USC (10-7-3/5-4-0 Pac-10) will take on San Diego (11-6-3/3-3-1 WCC) in the first match of the evening beginning at 6:00 p.m. The winners of the two matches will play in the second round, Sunday, Nov. 17 at 1 p.m., also at Marshall Field. The Lions enter their first ever NCAA Tournament after being overlooked in both 1999 and 2000. LMU fell, 3-2, to the Bruins on Oct. 6 at Sullivan Field. San Diego capitalized on a penalty kick to earn a 2-1 victory over LMU on Oct. 25, while USC and the Lions played to a 2-2 double-overtime tie on Oct. 4. The Lions are one of five WCC teams to advance to the NCAA tourney. Five of the Lions' six losses were by one goal.

LMU Against the NCAA Field

The Lions have played 11 teams this season that were selected to the College Cup, posting a 3-6-2 record. LMU handed No. 5 Pepperdine its only loss of the season during a 1-0 decision on Oct. 13 and downed Loyola (Md.) 2-1 on Sept. 22. LMU also beat Washington State 1-0 on Sept. 29. The 11 schools, representing over half of LMU's schedule have a combined record of 143-54-20, for a .659 winning percentage. The Lions scored eight goals to their opponents' 10, during the 11 matches.

All-West Coast Honors

Seven members of the LMU women's soccer team earned All-West Coast honors this season, voted on by the league coaches. Junior defender Laura Trask earned first-team honors, while fellow junior Shari Nishikawa was named to the second team at midfield. Seniors Myka Peck and Beth Skhal, along with freshmen Kellie Schroeder, Jennifer Horn and Lori Sims garnered honorable mention recognition.

Freshmen Shine

Freshman Kellie Schroeder continues to fuel the Lion offense. Schroeder pushed her team leading goals total to six with the goal she collected against San Francisco. It was her third game-winning goal of the season, which is tied for third in the WCC. The other two came in games against UC Irvine (10/10/02) and Gonzaga (10/20/02). Schroeder is part of the Lion recruiting class that was ranked as the seventh best incoming class by *Soccer Buzz* magazine. The Albuquerque, N.M., native leads the team with 12 points this season. Fellow freshman Kelly Lewandowski is second on the squad with nine points and four goals, while Jessica Hanson leads the squad with 18 shots on goal. LMU freshmen have combined for 30 of the team's 60 points.

Athlete of the Month

For her outstanding play, Kellie Schroeder was named Athlete of the Month during October at LMU. The selections are made by the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, which features members from all 17 sports at LMU. Schroeder scored four of the Lions' eight goals in the month of October. Of her four goals, two of them were game winners as the Lions played for the right to make the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Schroeder had both of the Lions' goals in their 2-2 tie to highly-ranked USC. She added the game winner against UC Irvine and Gonzaga.

Close Calls

Last Saturday's 0-0 tie with Saint Mary's was par for the course this season for the Lions. Of LMU's 19 games, 16 have been decided by one goal or less, including 15 straight. Of those 16 games, the Lions have won eight and tied two.

Skhal Back In Net

Senior goalkeeper Elizabeth Skhal is back to anchor the Lions' defense in goal. Skhal, who had been sidelined since late September nursing a broken hand, made her return against San Francisco on Nov. 3. The 5-9 Moorpark, Calif., native came back with a roar making eight saves in two games and collecting a pair of shutouts. Skhal owns an 7-2-1 overall record and boasts a 0.53 goals against average on the year.

Nishikawa Cracks The Record Book

Junior Shari Nishikawa's is inching her way up the all-time charts at LMU. The five assists she picked up this year gives her a total of eight career assists, which launches her into the top-10 on the all-time chart at LMU. Nishikawa is currently eighth on the career assists list tied with former Lion Bree McCann (1996-99). Nishikawa's team leading five assists this year is also among the best in the WCC. She is just four assists shy from claiming the top spot in the single-season record book. The current record is eight set by Cindy Carullo (1993-96) in 1993 and then matched by Jessica Lyon (1995-98) in 1997.

Extra Time...Again

The Lions have played in six overtime matches so far this season. LMU is not phased by the extra frame, if anything the extra minutes in the sudden victory atmosphere just feeds the Lions' frenzy. The Lions have not lost an overtime game this season, scoring two goals and owning a 3-0-3 record when playing the extra stanzas.

Defense Stands Strong

The Lions defense continues to be one of the best in the WCC and nationally. LMU currently ranks second in the WCC and 17th in the NCAA (as of Nov. 11) in goals against average (0.74) and has allowed the second fewest goals (14) of any WCC member. Lion goalkeepers Elizabeth Skhal and Kelly Yukihiro have combined for 10 shutouts this season, two behind Portland for the league lead. The 10 shutouts in 19 games is tied for 18th nationally with Sacred Heart and UCLA.

Weekend Review

vs Saint Mary's 11/9/02

The LMU soccer team ended the regular season with a 0-0 double overtime tie against Saint Mary's. Freshman Kelly Lewandowski led the Lions with three shots in the game. The weather made the playing conditions a nightmare and SMC goalkeeper Ruth Montgomery and LMU keeper Elizabeth Skhal had the daunting task of keeping a wet, muddy and slippery ball out of the net. Both keepers were a little lucky and had some help from the wind and the goalposts. LMU posted nine shots on goal. Haleigh Roach, Shari Nishikawa and Lori Sims each tallied two each. Kellie Schroeder, Laura Trask and Lewandowski each collected one. The Lions dominated both overtime periods, drawing three corner kicks to SMC's none. LMU got off four shots in the extra periods but could not find the back of the net.

LMU Head Coach

Gregg Murphy is in his seventh year at the helm of the LMU women's soccer program. Under Murphy the Lions have enjoyed unprecedented success, posting winning seasons in all but two of his years in Westchester. Murphy's record at LMU now stands at 70-49-11, while his career coaching record, which spans eleven seasons, stands at 128-101-15. An outstanding recruiter, Murphy's 2002 class was ranked seventh best in the West Region by *SoccerBuzz*. Murphy is a 1986 graduate of Chapman University.

Scouting the Opposition

The Buzz On The Bruins

The third-ranked UCLA Bruins earned the No. 7 seed in the upcoming NCAA College Cup. With their victory over Washington State to end the regular season, the Bruins improved to 15-3 overall and 7-1 in the Pac-10. UCLA, which takes a seven-match winning streak into postseason play, leads the all-time series with LMU, 7-0. Most recently, the Bruins defeated the Lions, 3-2 on Oct. 6 at LMU. Lion freshman Lori Sims and senior Myka Peck each had goals for LMU, while the Lions took a 1-0 lead over the UCLA into halftime. The Bruins have reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament the last two years, making it all the way to the College Cup Final back in 2000.

Talking About The Trojans

The USC women's soccer team (10-7-3) is making its fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance and has a 2-4 all-time postseason record. The Women of Troy played to a scoreless tie on Sept. 27 against San Diego at McAlister Field. LMU struck first against the then-ranked No. 18 Trojans on Oct. 4, but ended things with a 2-2 double overtime tie. USC leads the all-time series with LMU 5-3-2.

San Diego Back in the Show

For the fourth consecutive season the USD women's soccer program has qualified for the NCAA Tournament. San Diego (11-6-3) is 2-4 all-time in NCAA Tournament play, advancing into the second round twice, both in 1996 and 1999. Last year USD dropped a 2-0 decision to the University of Washington in first round action in Portland, Oregon. The Lions fell 2-1 to San Diego with the Toreros' game-winning goal coming on a questionable hand ball call late in the game. San Diego leads the all-time series 8-1-1.


