Series History vs. High Point

Tonight's contest is the 14th overall meeting between Longwood and High Point in men's basketball. The two schools first met on the hardwood December 1, 1984 -- a game played in Farmville and won by the Panthers 66-63 in overtime. HPU leads the overall series 9-4, including last year's 88-72 win, also played in Farmville as Issa Konare led the Panthers with 23 points and 10 rebounds. Arizona Reid added 22 points, while Mike Jefferson contributed 13 points. Michael Jefferson led the Lancers with 18 points, while Lamar Barrett had 14 points and Clayton Morgan grabbed 15 rebounds. Traditionally, these two programs have played each other close with the average margin being 9.7 points, and only three of the 13 previous games have been decided by more than 10 points.

Head Coach Mike Gillian

Mike Gillian was named the seventh men's basketball head coach at Longwood on May 2, 2003. Prior to his arrival, he had been an assistant coach for Jim Larranaga at CAA member George Mason for six years (1997-2003) after a year with Coach Larranaga at Bowling Green State (1996-97). Coach Gillian is 19-78 at Longwood, including 3-6 this season after last year's record of 10-20 that tied for the seventh-best turnaround year in Division I.

Last Time On The Floor (@American 60 - Longwood 49, Dec. 4)

Longwood dropped a 60-49 road decision at Patriot League member American University Monday night in Washington, D.C.. The Lancers (3-6) rallied from a 16-point halftime deficit to within five points with 6:06 remaining but could get no closer, led by senior Maurice Sumter with a game-high 15 points. Longwood fell behind 4-0 just 25-seconds into the contest as American jumped out to a 15-2 advantage at 13:14. The Eagles led 20-6 with 10:49 left in the first half before the Lancers closed to within 22-14 at 6:56 on a layup from sophomore Kirk Williams. American, however, outscored Longwood 13-5 the remainder of the period to lead 35-19 at the intermission. The Eagles shot 62% (16-26) from the field in the first half, compared to 24% (8-34) by the visiting Lancers. American took its largest lead at 41-23 with 16:43 left to play, and still led 47-31 at 13:43. Longwood used a 7-1 run to close to within 48-38 with 9:11 remaining as Williams scored six quick points, including a dunk off the backside lob-pass, and the Lancers continued with their momentum and were within 50-45 at 6:06, capping a 22-9 run after falling behind by 18 points. It was 54-48 after another jumper from Sumter with 4:19 on the clock, but unfortunately, the Eagles would outscore the visitors 6-1 over the final 3:39 for their homecourt victory. Sumter finished with a game-high 15 points to lead Longwood, while Williams added 10 points. Junior Lamar Barrett grabbed a game-high and career-high 14 rebounds to go along with his eight points, while senior Clayton Morgan added six points and nine rebounds. LU shot 33% (20-60) from the field, including just 10% (2-20) on three-point field goals, and 58% (7-12) at the free throw line. Longwood did out-rebound American 43-33, but committed 18 turnovers that the Eagles converted into 20 points.

Continuing Where They Left Off

Longwood entered this season with hopes of continuing as it ended last year: playing very well. Through nine games this year, Longwood has played better than the current record might indicate as the Lancers have either been ahead or have been within two possessions (six points) of leading in four of their six losses with 5:00 remaining to play. Last season, Longwood was very strong down the stretch with seven wins over the final 11 games, including six wins in the last seven home games in Willett Hall where the program was 8-4 overall a year ago. Overall, the Lancers lost eight games by just 10 points or less, including one in overtime, while three of the losses were by only three points or less.

Veteran Line-Up

Longwood returned all five starters among 10 returning lettermen from a year ago, including the top six scorers overall who combined for 79 percent (1,740 of 2,194 points) of the team's offense. Additionally, seven players returned who played at least 18 minutes per game, averaging 26.6 minutes among them overall. Each of the seven averaged at least 7.0 points per game, including three double-figure scorers. The returning starters include seniors Maurice Sumter and Clayton Morgan, along with juniors Lamar Barrett, Brandon Giles, and Dana Smith. Smith, however, is currently out of the lineup after a knee injury incurred early at Norfolk State. He underwent arthroscopic surgery on November 30, and his return to action has yet to be determined.

Experienced Bench Depth

The other five returning lettermen from last season include seniors Michael Jefferson and Husein Pistoljevic as well as sophomore Kirk Williams. A pair of senior walk-on team members return as well in Darren Holmes and Joel Rowe. Jefferson (2005-06: 12.8 points) is also currently out of action with a foot injury suffered during pre-season conditioning in September. Ironically, and unfortunate for him, he also missed 15 games last season due to ankle (both) and groin injuries.

Sumter Garners Preseason Accolades

Maurice Sumter (2005-06: 15.5 points, 5.4 rebounds) received numerous preseason accolades from various college basketball publications. A starter in all 96 games of his career, he averaged 19.2 points over the final 12 games of last season (50.3% FG). Sumter's preseason accolades include Division I Independent Player of the Year by USA TODAY Sports Weekly College Basketball Preview, Division I Independent's 'Best NBA Prospect', 'Best Defender', and All-Independent 1st-Team by Lindy's College Basketball 2006-07, and the All-Independent Team by Street & Smith's College Basketball 2006-07 Yearbook.

Mr. Consistent

Sumter, who just turned 21 on Nov. 5, has been consistent and smooth this season as he is averaging a career-best 18.1 points along with 5.4 rebounds through nine games while shooting a team-best 55% (66-120) from the field, including 36% (9-25) on three-point field goals, and 69% (22-32) at the free throw line. He adds 2.7 assists, 2.4 steals, and 1.3 blocks while playing a team-best 37.1 minutes per game -- the steals and blocks are team-highs as well. Sumter has reached double-figure scoring in 25-straight games, and 67 of 96 career contests, including 34 of his last 38 games.

1,250 Career Points

Maurice Sumter has scored 1,250 points during his 96-game career at Longwood (13.0). He currently ranks eighth all-time in scoring for the Lancers, now only four points from seventh-place (Joe Jones, 1992-96; 1,254). Sumter is also just the sixth player in the program's 30-year history to surpass 1,000 career points and 500 career rebounds. His 537 career rebounds (5.6) currently rank seventh all-time at Longwood.

Morgan Also Earns Preseason Recognition

Clayton Morgan (2005-06: 12.3 points, 8.6 rebounds) averaged 16.0 points over the final 13 games of last season (49.3% FG), and also received preseason recognition -- named Division I Independent's 'Best Rebounder' and All-Independent 2nd-Team by *Lindy's College Basketball 2006-07*. Through nine games this year, Morgan is averaging 12.3 points and a team-best 8.2 rebounds while playing 31.9 minutes per game.

Closing In On Three-Point Record

Husein Pistoljevic (2005-06: 3.3 points, 22 3FG) entered his final season with 154 career three-point field goals. Through nine games, he is a team-best 12-33 (36%) on three-pointers this year (166), currently second all-time, and needs just two more three-pointers to supplant career leader DeVonne Johnson (1992-96, 167). Pistoljevic (5.8 points) already holds the single-game record for three-point field goals, making nine against Virginia Union on February 5, 2004; also a Willett Hall record.

Day In, Day Out

Lamar Barrett (2005-06: 7.0 points, 4.0 rebounds), like Maurice Sumter, has started every game of his career (70). A former *Street & Smith's* high school All-American, he has enjoyed two-plus solid seasons at Longwood while posting 570 points (8.1) and 333 rebounds (4.8). Barrett was a Division I Independent All-Newcomer Team selection after his freshman campaign (9.7 points, 4.9 rebounds). Through nine games, he is averaging 6.3 points and a career-best 6.9 rebounds this year.

Highlights At Eleven

Kirk Williams (2005-06: 7.6 points, 4.1 rebounds) electrified crowds a year ago with his high-octane play that produced several spectacular dunks. In fact, he led the team with his 14 flushes last season that included especially-memorable slams against Liberty (Nov. 30), #4 Villanova (Dec. 10) in Atlantic City's Boardwalk Hall, and at VCU (Dec. 22). Williams led the team in field goal percentage (.569, 87-153), including 73.3% (33-45) over the final 13 games. This year, he is averaging 10.0 points and 4.4 rebounds while shooting 53% (41-77) from the field, and already has 13 dunks.

Ironman II

Brandon Giles (2005-06: 4.4 points, 3.3 assists) averaged 35.6 minutes over the final 13 games of last season, including all 45 minutes of a 93-90 OT home win past Hartford last January 28. He also averaged 4.6 assists during this late stretch of the campaign with a career-high eight assists against Hartford. Giles led the team in assists (98), and posted a career-high 21 points against James Madison (Feb. 18) -- a perfect 5-5 from three-point territory. He is averaging 4.6 points and 3.1 assists this year.

Hot At The End

Dana Smith (2005-06: 9.6 points, 4.7 rebounds) finished last season on a roll, averaging 13.4 points and 6.1 rebounds over the final nine games. He posted a career-high 21 points against Utah Valley (March 4) in the season finale, and grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds against Savannah State (Feb. 25). Smith started the final 13 games of the year and finished second on the team in dunks (11). Unfortunately, he is currently out of the lineup with the knee injury after starting the first three games this year.

Paging Dr. Rowe

Joel Rowe is an outstanding student at Longwood, compiling a remarkable 3.968 GPA while majoring in biology with a minor in psychology. This past summer, he served an undergraduate research fellowship at the MAYO Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida; assisting in the Neuropathology Lab. The Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (S.U.R.F) program was composed of college students from schools such as Harvard, Cornell, Texas, Notre Dame, and Florida. Rowe presented 'A quantitative study of leukoaraiosis' to the Mayo faculty (both MD's and PhD's) at the conclusion of his fellowship. He is a two-time Division I Independent All-Academic Team honoree.

Basketball's His Game But Football's In His Blood

Danny Wilson is one of nine children in his family, including six brothers and two sisters. Three older brothers played or play Division I football: Amos Jr. at New Mexico and Everett at North Carolina A&T, while Jacob currently plays at Western Carolina. A younger brother, C.J., currently plays at East Carolina. Amos Jr. is now playing professionally with the Johnstown (Pa.) RiverHawks of the American Indoor Football League (AIFL). A junior transfer, Wilson (6-8) is looking to make his mark in college basketball. He averaged 12.2 points (58% FG) and 9.1 rebounds last season at NJCAA Division I Louisburg (N.C.).

Like Father, Like Son

Billy Robinson Jr. is a second-generation college basketball player. His father, Billy Sr., played collegiately at Northern Illinois (1982-84). Billy Jr. averaged 12.1 points, 10.2 rebounds, and 3.0 blocks as a senior at Hammond (Md.) High School.

Win, Win, Win

Kevin Swecker helped his Mount Saint Joseph high school team to a record of 38-1 last year. The third-team All-Baltimore Catholic League selection averaged 10.5 points and was one of five starters who earned Division I scholarships. Mount Saint Joseph's 38 wins were a new Maryland high school record, and the program was ranked among the Top Ten in the final USA TODAY national high school rankings. He has played in all nine games, averaging 4.2 points while making 8-25 three-pointers (32%).

The Three-Point Stat

Longwood has made at least one three-point field goal in 123 consecutive games that date back to Nov. 26, 2002 (at Lenoir-Rhyne, W 72-68). The streak includes a high of 13 three-pointers against Virginia Union (Feb. 5, 2004).

Senior Captains

Maurice Sumter and Husein Pistoljevic are serving as team captains this year, as named by Coach Gillian. Both seniors, Sumter is a captain for the third-straight year while Pistoljevic is a captain for the second consecutive season.

Las Vegas Classic Déjà vu

Longwood will participate in the exempt four-game Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Classic December 17-23 for the second time in three years. The first two games of the event are on the road at New Mexico on December 17 at 8 p.m., and at Southern California

Longwood will play in both historic and new venues this season with road games at New Mexico, Southern California, Providence, Oklahoma, and Virginia. The venues, in order, include The Pit in Albuquerque (18,018), the brand new Galen Center in Los Angeles (10,258), the Dunkin’ Donuts Center in Providence (12,993), the Lloyd Noble Center in Norman (12,000), and the brand new John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville (15,219). Longwood also plays at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas (7,165).

Don’t Forget The Toothbrush

Longwood will play 19 of 31 games away from Farmville this season, including 17 road games and two neutral-site contests. Included among this year’s team travel plans are a nine-day trip, and a 16-day trip away from campus. The ‘short’ trip covers the four-game Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Classic from December 16-24, while the ‘long’ trip also covers four games: Providence, Yale, NJIT, and Utah Valley State from January 1-16. Game 1, November 11, 2006
Longwood 71 - Virginia-Wise 49
Farmville, Virginia

Longwood opened its 2006-07 campaign with a 71-49 home victory past visiting Virginia-Wise in Willett Hall. Senior Maurice Sumter led the Lancers (1-0) with a game-high 19 points while classmate Clayton Morgan added a double-double of 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. The NAIA Highland Cavaliers (0-2) were led by Zydrunas Rackauskas and Seth Gibson with 11 points each.

Longwood battled through a sluggish first half to lead 31-24 at the intermission behind 14 first-half points from Sumter. The 6-5 guard-forward scored five points over the final 2:13 of the period to spark a 10-3 run to close the opening 20 minutes. Freshman Kevin Swecker contributed the other five points, including a three-pointer. The Lancers shot 41% (12-29) from the floor in the first half, and were just 5-10 at the free throw line while committing 10 turnovers in a ragged opening 20 minutes.

Longwood took control of the contest in the second half, taking a 42-32 lead at 15:10 as sophomore Kirk Williams scored eight quick points, including a monstrous dunk on the back-side lob pass from junior Brandon Giles who finished with five assists. The Lancers extended the lead to 20 points at 58-38 with 9:10 remaining as Morgan tallied 10 points, including an old-fashioned three-point play inside during the 16-6 run. Virginia-Wise did manage to close to within 60-46 at 4:56, but the hosts secured the decisive triumph by outscoring the visitors 11-3 over the final 3:47 -- a closing run started with a three-pointer from Sumter.

Sumter finished with a game-high 19 points, adding a game-high six assists as well along with five rebounds and five steals for Longwood. Morgan earned his seventh career double-double with 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds, while Williams finished with 10 points off the bench for the Lancers. LU shot 47% (26-55) from the field, including 54% (14-24) after the break, 21% (3-14) on three-point field goals, and 70% (16-23) at the free throw line. The Lancers took a 40-26 advantage in rebounds, and forced 19 turnovers.

Rackauskas and Gibson each finished with 11 points to lead Virginia-Wise. The Highland Cavaliers shot 36% (16-45) from the field, including 12% (2-17) on three-pointers, and 68% (15-22) at the line.

Game 2, November 13, 2006
VCU 75 - Longwood 63
Farmville, Virginia

Longwood dropped a hard-fought 75-63 decision to visiting VCU in Willett Hall; the largest crowd to ever witness a college basketball game at Longwood with a full-capacity crowd of 2,522 in Farmville. The Rams (1-0) won their opening game under the direction of first-year head coach Anthony Grant, led by Eric Maynor with a team-high 15 points. Senior Maurice Sumter led the Lancers (1-1) with a game-high 22 points.

Longwood trailed 38-24 at halftime, and VCU took its largest lead of the night at 52-31 with 14:30 remaining on a layup from Wil Fameni. The Lancers, however, refused to quit and battled back to within 58-44 at 8:21 with a 13-6 run that included an offensive rebound and dunk by Sumter. Longwood continued its momentum and closed to within 69-58 with 2:31 left as senior Clayton Morgan scored eight quick points. Sumter followed with five-straight points for the Lancers who closed to within 73-63 but only 36-seconds remained and Maynor made two free throws for VCU at 0:26 to provide for the final margin.

VCU opened the contest with a 17-6 run just 6:05 into the game as Maynor (4), B.A. Walker (4), and Michael Anderson (6) combined for 14 quick points. The Rams extended the margin to 25-9 at 10:58 as Jamal Shuler tallied five points, including a three-pointer. Longwood managed to reduce the deficit to 27-17 with 7:10 left before the intermission as freshman Kevin Swecker came off the bench to make back-to-back three-point field goals. Walker, however, answered with consecutive three-pointers of his own to push the Rams back ahead 35-19 at 3:31 as the visitors led by 14 points (38-24) at the break.

Sumter finished with a game-high 22 points (9-13 FG, 2-3 3FG, 2-3 FT), adding five rebounds, three assists, and three blocks for Longwood. Morgan added 14 points and five rebounds, while junior Lamar Barrett added his second career double-double with 10 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for the Lancers. Swecker contributed a career-high nine points for the hosts. LU shot 39% (24-61) from the field, including 36% (5-14) on three-point field goals, and 63% (10-16) at the free throw line. The Lancers and Rams tied in rebounding at 39-39, and hosts finished with nine blocks.

Maynor finished with 15 points to lead five double-figure scorers for VCU, adding a game-high six assists. Other scoring by the visitors included Anderson (13), Fameni (12), Walker (10), and Shuler (10). Anderson also had seven rebounds, and Walker had five steals. The Rams shot 48% (28-59) from the field, including 25% (4-16) on three-pointers, and 54% (15-28) at the line while making Coach Grant a winner in his collegiate head coaching debut.

Game 3, November 15, 2006
Longwood 65 - Norfolk State 54
Norfolk, Virginia

Longwood took a 65-54 road victory at Norfolk State in Norfolk. The Lancers (2-1) outscored the host Spartans 16-5 over the final 8:48, and were led by sophomore Kirk Williams with a game-high 16 points off the bench while Tony Murphy led NSU (0-2) with 12 points.

Longwood trailed 31-26 at the intermission before taking control of the contest about midway through the second half and pulling away at the end. The Lancers closed to within 33-31 just 2:24 after the break but Norfolk State quickly took its largest lead of the game at 44-37 with 12:53 remaining. Longwood, however, stormed back with a 15-5 run that began and ended with three-point field goals by freshman Kevin Swecker to put the visitors in front for good, 52-49, at 8:48. The run included consecutive offensive rebound-dunks by Williams who also tallied six quick points. The Lancers continued to dominate the action down the stretch with their game-ending 13-5 run to provide for the final comfortable margin of victory.

Longwood had opened the game with the first points as Sumter connected on a jumper on the first possession just 17-seconds into contest. Norfolk State took advantage of a 14-2 run to lead 14-8 at 11:26. The Lancers battled back to lead 19-18 with just 5:55 left in the half as senior Husein Pistoljevic made a three-pointer and Williams added the first of his three dunks in the game. The Spartans rallied back to lead 28-21 at 1:43 before Pistoljevic nailed another trey and added 2-3 free throws when fouled on another three-point attempt. A steal and layup by Murphy made it a five-point margin for the hosts at halftime.

Williams finished with 16 points and eight rebounds to lead Longwood, making 8-9 shots from the floor while playing just 24 minutes. Sumter added 14 points and seven rebounds, adding two blocks as well, while Pistoljevic had 10 points off the bench -- making 2-3 three-pointers. Giles finished with eight points, four assists, and three steals while Swecker also had eight points -- making 2-3 three-pointers as well. Senior Clayton Morgan grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds for the Lancers, adding seven points to the attack. LU shot 44% (24-54) from the field, including 57% (13-23) in the second half, 25% (4-16) on three-pointers, and 57% (13-23) at the free throw line.

Murphy had 12 points to lead Norfolk State but made just 5-18 shots, while Calvin Brown contributed 11 points and eight rebounds. NSU shot 39% (21-54) from the field, including 13% (2-16) on three-pointers, and 46% (10-22) at the line. The Spartans committed 19 turnovers that led to 18 Longwood points.

Longwood earned its first-ever win over Norfolk State in three meetings, and it was the second consecutive road win for the Lancers who had also won their final away game a year ago (Hampton, 69-66).

Game 4, November 17, 2006
George Washington 74 - Longwood 60
Washington, D.C.

Longwood led 35-27 at halftime before host and defending Atlantic 10 regular season champion George Washington rallied for a 74-60 victory at the Smith Center in Washington, D.C.. The Lancers (2-2) led the entire first half and nearly half of the second half, led by senior Maurice Sumter with a double-double of 19 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. The unbeaten Colonials (3-0) were led by Maureece Rice with a career-high 23 points and Rob Diggs with a double-double of 22 points and 10 rebounds, also career-highs.

Longwood jumped ahead early and led 16-9 at 12:46 on a three-pointer from junior Brandon Giles. The Colonials, however, answered with five-straight points to close to within 16-14 at 11:44 only to see the visitors run-off eight unanswered points to lead 24-14 with 9:41 left in the first half as senior Clayton Morgan finished the run with three-pointer. Sumter gave Longwood its largest lead of the game at 34-22 with just 2:59 left before halftime as he tallied 17 first-half points. George Washington managed to narrow the margin to eight points at the intermission.

Longwood extended its advantage early in the second half, leading by double-digits again at 39-28 with 18:37 on the clock after an offensive rebound follow dunk by sophomore Kirk Williams. The Colonials came charging back with six-straight points, though the Lancers still led 41-36 at 14:39 on a free throw by Morgan. GW finally caught the visitors at 41-41 with 12:11 remaining on a tip-in basket as Longwood had the lead for the first 27:48 of the contest. George Washington took its first lead at 11:38 on a three-pointer by Rice that began a 22-4 run to secure the hard-fought home win. The Lancers refused to quit, however, and battled back to within 70-58 with just 1:19 left as Williams scored eight points. GW head coach Karl Hobbs emptied his bench with just 10-seconds on the clock.

Sumter finished with 19 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for his sixth career double-double to lead Longwood, adding five steals and two blocks in 38 minutes. Morgan had 14 points, four rebounds, and three assists, while Williams contributed 12 points – all scored in the second half for the Lancers. LU shot 41% (21-51) from the field, including 54% (13-24) in the first half, 29% (5-17) on three-point field goals (0-7, second half), and 65% (13-20) at the free throw line. Longwood played without Dana Smith, a junior starting guard-forward, who missed the contest with a knee injury.

Rice scored a game-high 23 points, also a career-high, to lead George Washington, while Diggs added 22 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for his own double-double – also career-high totals. Carl Elliott was limited to nine points after entering the contest with an average of 27.0. GW shot 39% (25-64) from the field, including 22% (4-18) on three-pointers, and 77% (20-26) at the line.

It was Longwood's first-ever game against George Washington, a program that finished 27-3 a year ago while winning the A-10 regular season title (16-0) and advancing to the second-round of the NCAA Tournament. The Colonials have won 67 games (67-23) over the past three seasons and had won their first two games this year by an average margin of 29 points in victories at Boston University and at home against Dartmouth. The contest was also witnessed by veteran Boston Globe sportswriter *Bob Ryan* who spoke briefly with Lancer head coach Mike Gillian afterwards outside the team locker room.

Game 5, November 20, 2006
Richmond 83 - Longwood 72
Richmond, Virginia

Longwood staged a furious second-half comeback attempt that fell short while dropping a disappointing 83-72 road decision at the University of Richmond at the Robins Center. The Lancers (2-3) rallied from a 20-point deficit with 13:23 remaining to within five points at 73-68 with 3:50 left but could get no closer. Senior Maurice Sumter led the visitors with a game-high 22 points, while Dan Geriot led the Spiders (3-0) with 19 points.

Richmond led 44-31 at halftime after shooting a torrid 74% (17-23) from the field, including an incredible 80% (8-10) on three-point field goals. Ryan Butler was perfect in 18 minutes, making 5-5 field goals, including 3-3 on three-pointers, and 1-1 at the free throw line for 14 first-half points. David Gonzalvez added 12 points off the bench, making 5-6 shots from the floor. The Spiders led by as many as 16 points in the opening period, though Longwood was able to stay in the game with 15-19 free throws as Sumter (4-4) scored 12 points and senior Clayton Morgan (4-5) added 10 points.

The Spiders quickly added two more three-pointers to start the second half and led 54-34 at 17:41. A layup by Morgan cut the margin to 56-41 with 16:00 remaining but Richmond was able to push the margin back to 20 points at 61-41 with 13:23 left to play. Longwood refused to quit, however, and proceeded to outscore the hosts 27-12 over the next 9:33 to close to within 73-68 at 3:50. Sumter scored eight points during the run, including an old-fashioned three-point play inside and a layup to close the late spurt. Sophomore Kirk Williams added six points, including a fast-break dunk, before fouling out with 7:47 on the clock, and junior Brandon Giles had five points with a long three-pointer as well. The hosts led 76-70 with just under three minutes remaining when a Lancer three-point attempt was halfway down before coming back out, a shot that would have made it a three-point game. Unfortunately, it did not go in and Richmond converted 7-8 free throws over the final 2:32 to secure its home victory.

Sumter finished with a game-high 22 points to lead Longwood, including 5-5 at the free throw line while playing 39 minutes. Morgan scored a season-high 17 points, adding six rebounds and three steals, while Giles and Williams each contributed 10 points for the Lancers. LU shot 50% (24-48) from the field, including 55% (16-29) in the second half, 33% (5-15) on three-pointers, and 79% (19-24) at the line.

Geriot led Richmond with his team-high 19 points, including 15 points in the second half. Others in double-figure scoring for the Spiders were Butler (16 points), David Brewster (13 points), Gonzalvez (12 points), and Peter Thomas (12 points). UR shot 72% (28-39) from the field, including 69% (11-16) on three-pointers, and 64% (16-25) at the line.

Game 6, November 25, 2006
Longwood 88 - Shenandoah 60
Farmville, Virginia

Longwood took an 88-60 home victory past visiting Shenandoah in Willett Hall. Senior Husein Pistoljevic led the Lancers (3-3) with both a game-high and season-high 21 points off the bench while sophomore Kirk Williams added his first career double-double with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. The Division III Hornets (1-1) were led by Jeremiah Lawrence with 19 points.

Longwood broke open a close game early in the second half with a decisive 24-1 run that turned a 42-41 deficit at 18:11 into a commanding 65-43 advantage at 8:19. The offensive explosion included eight points from Williams and six points from senior Maurice Sumter. Pistoljevic capped the scoring barrage with the first of his six second-half three-point field goals as he made 6-10 three-pointers over the final 8:19. The Lancers took their largest lead of the contest at 32 points (88-56) with 1:28 remaining on Pistoljevic's final three-pointer as the fourth-year player finished with 18 second-half points. Longwood shot 53% (17-32) from the field, including 55% (6-11) on three-pointers, over the final 20 minutes.

Longwood had led 40-36 at halftime as the visitors kept pounding the ball inside for 28 points in the paint while also out-rebounding the hosts 24-19. Shenandoah's three inside players combined for 26 of the team's 36 first-half points, including nine from Lawrence. The Lancers took their largest lead of the opening half at 35-26 with 4:00 left before the break on a pair of free throws from senior Clayton Morgan. Sumter and junior Lamar Barrett each scored eight first-half points while freshman Kevin Swecker came off the bench to contribute seven points, including a three-pointer. The Hornets had opened the game with the first three points (3-0, 19:10) for their largest lead of the entire contest.

Pistoljevic finished with a game-high, and season-high of 21 points, making 7-11 from three-point territory in 16 minutes for Longwood. Sumter finished with 15 points (7-10 FG), adding three blocks, while Williams earned his first career double-double with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, also contributing career-highs of four assists, three blocks, and two steals for the Lancers. Barrett had 10 points and a game-high six assists, and Morgan totaled nine points and eight rebounds. LU shot 50% (33-66) from the field, including a season-high 48% (12-25) on three-point field goals, and 67% (10-15) at the free throw line. The Lancers took a 46-40 advantage in rebounds, and also forced 26 turnovers -- converting to 26 points.

Lawrence finished with 19 points to lead Shenandoah, while Onyie Onunaku added 12 points and eight rebounds. The Hornets shot 36% (24-66) from the field, including 17% (2-12) on three-pointers, and 50% (10-20) at the line.

**Game 7, November 28, 2006
N.C. A&T 71 - Longwood 59
Greensboro, North Carolina**

Longwood dropped a 71-59 road decision at North Carolina A&T in Greensboro, North Carolina. The visiting Lancers (3-4) were led by senior Maurice Sumter with a game-high 19 points, while the host Aggies (2-4) were led by Glenn Nelson with 14 points.

Longwood fell behind 5-1 just 1:58 into the game before a 7-2 run gave the Lancers their only lead of the night at 8-7 with 15:44 left in the opening half on a three-point field goal from junior Brandon Giles. North Carolina A&T went back in front, though only led 13-12 at 11:42 after a lay-in from Sumter. The Aggies took advantage of a 19-10 run to take their largest lead of the first half at 32-22 with 4:58 left before the break. A pair of free throws from senior Clayton Morgan made it 34-29 at 1:27 but the hosts scored the final three points of the period to lead 37-29 at the intermission.

Longwood trailed 42-31 with 15:52 remaining before battling back into the contest, closing to within 47-45 at 11:10 on a pair of free throws by Giles to cap a 14-5 run. Sumter scored five points during the run, including a three-pointer. It remained close the rest of the way as the Lancers were still within two points at 55-53 with 6:29 left on two more free throws from Giles. NCAT, however, responded with back-to-back three-pointers to lead 61-53 at 4:23 before Sumter scored four unanswered points to pull the visitors back within 61-57 with 3:15 on the clock. It appeared that the Lancers had a defensive stop on a block/jump ball situation but it was not called and the ball bounced to an Aggie player under the basket for the layup at 2:38 that began a game-ending 10-2 run for the final 12-point margin – also the largest lead of the contest.

Sumter finished with a game-high 19 points, adding five rebounds while playing the entire 40 minutes to lead Longwood. Morgan just missed a double-double with his nine points and game-high 10 rebounds for the Lancers while Giles and junior Lamar Barrett each contributed seven points. LU shot just 35% (19-55) from the field, including 24% (6-25) on three-pointers, and 83% (15-18) at the free throw line – committing 24 turnovers that were converted into 25 points.

Nelson came off the bench to score 14 points for North Carolina A&T, while Austin Ewing and Jason Wills each added 13 points. The Aggies shot 50% (27-54) from the field, including 40% (6-15) on three-pointers, and 55% (11-20) at the line. NCAT committed 22 turnovers, though Longwood only converted into 15 points.

**Game 8, December 1, 2006
Navy 61 - Longwood 59 OT
Farmville, Virginia**

Longwood dropped a heartbreaking 61-59 overtime thriller to visiting Navy in Willett Hall. The Midshipmen (6-2) rallied from a seven-point deficit with 3:34 left in regulation before scoring the first nine points in overtime and then held on for the hard-fought road win. The tough-luck Lancers (3-5) were led by senior Clayton Morgan with a game-high 21 points, while junior Greg Sprink led Navy with 16 points.

Longwood led 46-39 with 3:34 remaining after an old-fashioned three-point play inside from Morgan. Navy, though, scored seven unanswered points to tie it at 46-46 with 1:40 on the clock as Sprink made a three-point field goal (3:13), followed by a layup (2:47), and two free throws by junior Corey Johnson (1:40). Morgan added two free throws at 1:03 (48-46), but Johnson made two more free throws at 0:53 (48-48). Senior Maurice Sumter scored inside on a layup at 0:36 (50-48), only to have Johnson make a jumper in the lane to tie it again at 50-50 (0:22). The Lancers had an opportunity to win in regulation but missed a 15-foot jumper just ahead of the final buzzer.

In OT, the Midshipmen got a three-pointer from sophomore Adam Teague at 4:35 to lead 53-50, followed quickly by a steal and layup by classmate Kaleo Kina with 4:20 left. Navy added another jumper from Sprink (3:29), and a layup by Johnson to lead 59-50 at 2:31. Longwood refused to quit, however, and battled back to within 60-57 on a three-pointer from Sumter with 44-seconds remaining. The Lancers had a potential game-tying three-point attempt with 12-seconds left that was in-and-out, and missed a putback as well before Sprink secured the outcome with 1-2 free throws at 0:09 for a four-point cushion (61-57). Morgan added a layup at the buzzer for the final narrow two-point margin of defeat.

Morgan finished with a game-high and season-high of 21 points (9-9 FT), adding nine rebounds to lead Longwood. Sumter added an outstanding all-around effort of 18 points (8-14 FG) and nine rebounds, along with game-highs and career-highs of seven assists and six steals in 44 minutes for the Lancers. Sophomore Kirk Williams contributed 12 points, including his first career three-pointer late in the game (2:05, ot), while junior Lamar Barrett grabbed a game-high and career-high 11 rebounds to go with his five points. LU shot 37% (22-60) from the field, including just 18% (3-17) on three-pointers, and 67% (12-18) at the free throw line. The hosts out-rebounded the visitors 45-37.

Sprink scored 16 points to lead Navy, adding nine rebounds, while Johnson had 12 points and Kina totaled 11 points. The Midshipmen shot 35% (20-57) from the field, including 33% (9-27) on three-pointers, and 63% (12-19) at the line. The closely-played contest witnessed seven lead-changes, and eight ties throughout as Longwood's largest lead was seven points (18-11, 5:54 - 1st) with Navy's in the extra period at nine points (59-50, 2:31).

American 60 - Longwood 49
Washington, D.C.**

Longwood dropped a 60-49 road decision at Patriot League member American University in Washington, D.C.. The Lancers (3-6) rallied from a 16-point halftime deficit to within five points with 6:06 remaining but could get no closer, led by senior Maurice Sumter with a game-high 15 points. The host Eagles (6-2) were led by Brayden Billbe and Andre Ingram with 13 points each.

Longwood fell behind 4-0 just 25-seconds into the contest as American jumped out to a 15-2 advantage at 13:14 as Ingram scored five early points. Sumter's jumper at 12:03 made it 15-6 before Ingram made a three-point field goal to help the Eagles to a 20-6 lead with 10:49 left in the first half. The Lancers closed to within 22-14 at 6:56 on a layup from sophomore Kirk Williams. American, however, outscored Longwood 13-5 the remainder of the period to lead 35-19 at the intermission. The Eagles shot 62% (16-26) from the field in the first half, compared to 24% (8-34) by the visiting Lancers.

American took its largest lead at 41-23 with 16:43 left to play, and still led 47-31 at 13:43. Longwood used a 7-1 run to close to within 48-38 with 9:11 remaining as Williams scored six quick points, including a dunk off the backside lob-pass. The Lancers continued with their momentum and was within 50-45 at 6:06, capping a 22-9 run after falling behind by 18 points. It was 54-48 after another jumper from Sumter with 4:19 on the clock, but unfortunately, the Eagles would outscore the visitors 6-1 over the final 3:39 for their homecourt victory.

Sumter finished with a game-high 15 points to lead Longwood, while Williams added 10 points. Junior Lamar Barrett grabbed a game-high and career-high 14 rebounds to go along with his eight points, while senior Clayton Morgan added six points and nine rebounds. LU shot 33% (20-60) from the field, including just 10% (2-20) on three-point field goals, and 58% (7-12) at the free throw line. Longwood did out-rebound American 43-33, but committed 18 turnovers that the Eagles converted into 20 points.

Billbe and Ingram each scored 13 points to lead American, while Derrick Mercer added 12 points as the trio combined to shoot 15-28 from the field for the Eagles. AU shot 48% (25-52) from the field as a team, including 24% (4-17) on three-pointers, and 43% (6-14) at the line.

Spiders outlast Lancers

With 72 percent shooting and early 3-point barrage, UR is able to repel late bid

University of Richmond guard Ryan Butler hit three 3-pointers in 72 seconds.

That first-half snapshot reflected UR's 83-72 win last night over Longwood before 3,150 at the Robins Center.

In the game's opening 23 minutes, the Spiders made 10 of 12 from beyond the arc. They shot 72 percent overall and hit 11 3-pointers in 16 attempts. Yet UR struggled to subdue the scrappy Lancers, who trailed by five with 3:50 left after being behind by 20 with 13:23 remaining.

Richmond (3-0) committed 20 turnovers, and watched Longwood (2-3) rally in the second half with increased aggressiveness.

Said freshman guard David Gonzalez (12 points), one of five Spiders -- four of them freshmen -- who scored in double figures: "We have good streaks, where everybody looks good and you can see the potential in everybody. Then sometimes we do things that make you realize we're freshmen."

So it goes for these Spiders, unbeaten and often uneven with four freshmen starters and two more as top reserves.

"There's plenty to build on [but] I'm disappointed with our defense," said UR coach Chris Mooney. "The staff has become accustomed to really being able to kind of control a game on defense and really make it very difficult for another team to score every time down. Tonight just seemed like [the Lancers] were able to score fairly easily.

"That's a major concern because we are not going to shoot like that every night."

Longwood was behind 76-70 with 3:02 left. Lancers coach Mike Gillian called timeout, and set up a play to open Husein Pistoljevic for a 3-pointer on the right wing. Pistoljevic was open, shot, and the ball bounced back-and-forth inside the rim before jumping out.

"We make that one shot and put some pressure on the other team, you don't know what can happen," Gillian said.

UR recovered with free throws and, while winning, were taught a lesson about the need for extended defensive intensity. The Lancers made 55 percent in the second half. They didn't collect a notable win for a program in its final season of a four-year process of reclassification to Division I because they failed to slow the Spiders.

"Pretty much everybody on our team can shoot," said Butler (16 points, 5 assists), a redshirt freshman who hit all five of his shots.

In making 10 of their first 12 3-point tries, four Spiders hit at least one 20-footer. "It's kind of frustrating, to the point where you're putting hands up and they're still hitting them," said Lancers guard Maurice Sumter (22 points). "It's like 'What do we do now?'"

When UR wasn't dropping jumpers, 6-9 freshman center Dan Geriot (19 points) worked in the lane. Gillian credited Richmond for outstanding shooting, then blamed himself for the defensive approach he chose. The Lancers usually deny all passes. That defensive pressure, Sumter suggested, leads to offensive energy.

Gillian opted to open with containing, more passive resistance to prevent back-door layups from UR in its spread offense.

"I'm never going to make that mistake again," Gillian said.

Richmond next plays at Old Dominion, Saturday at noon. The Monarchs upset Georgetown on the road Sunday night.

Grant, Rams prevail

Lancers narrow gap in the final minutes, but can't pull off an upset

FARMVILLE -- By Anthony Grant's reckoning, the Virginia Commonwealth University basketball team "left a lot on the table" last night in a 75-63, season-opening win over Longwood.

He didn't get any disagreements from his team.

The Rams cleaned up early, using their pressure to race to a 25-9 lead that quieted a sold-out house of 2,522. They maintained their appetite in the middle, with a margin that reached 21. The end, though, was cause for some antacid.

Using traps on defense and some aggressive board work on offense, Longwood (1-1) matched VCU's energy, rattled the Rams, turned Maurice Sumter loose and pared the lead to 11 with 2:31 remaining. The Lancers couldn't get it under 10, though, giving Grant a victory in his debut.

"They started using our own style against us," said VCU forward Michael Anderson, who finished with 13 points. "We got a little timid. We let their pressure dictate our offense instead of picking it apart. And I think we got tired."

VCU's defense helped Longwood part with 11 turnovers in the first half. That led to some dunks and layups. When the Rams went to a halfcourt set, they were able to get passes inside to 6-7 Wil Fameni (12 points), 6-10 Calvin Roland (eight points) and the 6-7 Anderson against Longwood's smaller lineup.

Anderson finished 5 of 8 from the floor. Fameni was 6 of 10, Roland 3 of 5.

"This offense is designed to get the ball down in the post first," Anderson said. "We can always set up for 3s, like we usually do, bombing away. . . . We want lay- ups and dunks."

Relying on 3s was standard procedure last year for the Rams, who didn't get consistent production inside. Last night, though, they were only 4 of 16 beyond the 3-point line. That was one area of concern for Grant.

Another was the misfires at the foul line (15 for 28). VCU also had a 24-16 rebounding margin at halftime, but Longwood outrebounded the Rams 23-15 in the second half.

"We've got to do a better job of finishing plays," Grant said. "When we get stops, being able to block out and rebound the basketball. When we go to the free-throw line, being able to step up and knock down free throws. Taking advantage of some of the opportunities we got on the interior today.

"To me, we left a lot on the table. Longwood had a lot to do with that. Their energy was very good for 40 minutes."

Longwood shot 39.3 percent. Sumter, though, elevated that by hitting 9 of 13 shots and finishing with 22 points. Clayton Morgan added 14.

"I told them after the game I was very proud of their effort," Longwood coach Mike Gillian said. "When you want to compete against the VCUs and some of the other programs like that, you'd better be able to turn that effort into performance to get over the hump and get that signature victory."

Five players scored in double figures for VCU: Eric Maynor (15), Anderson, Fameni, B.A. Walker (10) and Jamal Shuler (10).

"You see strides of us having the potential to be a very good basketball team," Grant said. "The one thing I try to get these guys to understand is we have to maintain our focus for 40 minutes. We have yet to put together a game [including two exhibitions] where we played our style with the intensity that we need for 40 minutes. Once we do that, we have the potential to be very good."



Longwood basketball team optimistic after last year's finish

FARMVILLE - Having gone from one win in 2004-05 to 10 last season, it would be natural for the Longwood men's basketball team to envision the next natural step in the progression: a winning season.

Lancers coach Mike Gillian isn't a fan of making predictions, though. He won't put a number out there for his team to reach.

His players, however, are a different story.

Forward Clayton Morgan said the Lancers are capable of winning 20 games. Guard Maurice Sumter said Longwood has enough talent to finish much better than just one game above the .500 mark.

"Five-hundred would be OK, but I don't even think that's good enough," said Sumter, a senior who averaged 15.5 points per game last season and was named to the all-Division I independents first team. "I think we're better than a .500 team, and we work harder than a .500 team. That's not what we're aiming for."

Longwood certainly isn't lacking in confidence. That comes from the chemistry developed during a season-ending stretch in which the Lancers won three of four games, including a breakthrough win at home against James Madison. All of the key contributors return for this season.

"It gave us a chance to get confidence and it helped us gel together as a team," said Morgan, a pleasant surprise last year who averaged 12.3 points and 8.6 rebounds per game.

The Lancers played the second half of last season without guard Michael Jefferson, who averaged 12.8 points in the 15 games he played. But after battling through injuries to both ankles and his shoulder, he tore a groin muscle, ending his season.

Jefferson's luck didn't get any better in the offseason. He had surgery to repair his chronic shoulder injury, and just when he was getting back up to speed, he broke his foot in an open gym pickup game in September.

Gillian said Jefferson will most likely take a redshirt and complete his eligibility next year, when the Lancers will compete as a full-fledged Division I member for the first time.

"He's been my roommate and teammate ever since I came here," Sumter said. "He's like a brother. Mike's injury hurts the team because he's a good player."

Longwood is in its final year of reclassifying from Division II to Division I. The Lancers will be one of the few "true" independents remaining when the transition is complete.

Six independents - New Jersey Tech, Texas-Pan American, Utah Valley State, Ind.-Pur.-Fort Wayne, North Dakota State and South Dakota State - formed a scheduling alliance and will compete in the United Basketball Conference. There will be an all-conference team and a "conference" tournament, but the winner will not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

It was an alliance borne of scheduling difficulties, especially for the far-flung Midwestern schools, one that will fall apart next season when IPFW, NDSU and SDSU join the Mid-Continent Conference.

Longwood wasn't interested in joining, mostly because the Lancers don't have problems finding games. The Lancers will play mostly a regional schedule, including games against VCU, Norfolk State, George Washington, Richmond, American, Liberty, Hampton and Virginia.

Longwood still hopes to gain an invite from the Big South Conference. But that's in the future. The present excites Gillian, who is ready to watch his team take the next step in its development. The days of Longwood being an "easy win" on an opponent's schedule are over, as evidenced by the nine-win improvement last season.

"We've got a program put together now," Gillian said. "Our challenge is to do the most we can get this and get the most out of our players and our team. Step by step, we need to keep making progress."
