SEASON PREVIEW

Anything is possible - the motto that the Lancers will carry with them this season as they look to continue their winning ways. Last season, the Lancers pulled out their first winning season since 2004-05, finishing an amazing 16-13. The team had such a turnaround that they were recognized by the NCAA as the 16th most improved team in 2007-08, while also finishing second to the University of Tennessee with most consecutive home wins.

This season, the Lancers will look to prove that anything is possible, despite losing team tri-captain and leader Keiva Small, who concluded her senior season as the team's leading scorer. With the loss of Small, senior Amber Sims and junior Becky Fernandes will look to pick up more responsibility as the team's captains. Joining the duo will be sophomore Mallory Short, who will complete the tri-captaincy.

The captains aren't the only change for the Lancers, as Jenna Gambino joins the coaching staff after spending time as an assistant at Columbia. While at Columbia, Gambino helped the Lions to a 10-18 overall record last season, and a 7-7 finish in the Ivy League. Also joining the staff will be former Lancer Rachelle Stewart, who will serve as the team's manager. Stewart returns to the team after finishing the 2007-08 season with an average of 1.2 points a game, while participating in 17 games.

The Lancers come into this season with seven letterwinners returning from a year ago, including three starters, and will welcome seven new to the Longwood line-up. Also joining the team is junior transfer Nikki Jo Rotollo, who will have to sit out the 2008-09 season, as she serves her year of academic residence per NCAA regulation. Out of the returning players, the Lancers will return their second leading rebounder from last season, senior Anna Steg. Steg finished the season with an average of 6.2 rebounds a game, pulling down a total of 179 rebounds, 82 offensive and 97 defensive.

AROUND THE PERIMETER: GUARDS (3 RETURNING; 2 LOST; 4 NEWCOMER)

The Lancers will have a mix of new and old around the circle this

year with return of Fernandes, who ended last season ranked second on the team in assists with 82. Also returning will be sophomore Krystal Garrison. Garrison had a tremendous rookie campaign, earning All-Independent Newcomer honors at the conclusion of the season, while recording 23 assists and an average of 6.3 points a game.

Newcomers Sierra Fletcher, Brooke Long, Kayla Loughner and Lindsey Martin all look to make their mark on the Lancers this season after all putting in stellar performances in their final seasons of high school ball. Fletcher joins the Lancers after averaging 21.0 points, 8.0 assists, and 5.0 rebounds a game, en route to scoring over 1,000 career points at Utica High School. Last season, Fletcher was named conference and Ohio section Player of the Year. She was also a member of the All-Ohio Black AAU basketball team that was nationally ranked.

Long averaged 14.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists, and 3.0 steals while leading Mills Godwin High School in Richmond to the Virginia State Tournament during her junior season. Loughner comes to Longwood after a shining career from Good Counsel High School, which is rated the top high school program in the nation. Martin helped guide Atlee to the Capital District Championship four consecutive seasons.

IN THE PAINT: (4 RETURNING; 3 LOST; 3 NEWCOMER)

The Lancers return a load of experience in the paint this season, with Steg, Sims, Short and sophomore Cierra Baker. Sims comes back for her senior season after finishing the 2007-08 season with 187 points (6.4 average) and 101 rebounds (3.5 average). Short and Baker both return after strong freshmen campaigns, earning their place on the team. Baker averaged 19.5 minutes a game last season, putting up a 5.6 points average, while Short played an average of 14.6 minutes for 4.9 points a game.

Joining the Lancers this season are Brittanni Billups, Morgan Smith and Emma Zieverink. Zieverink comes to Longwood after helping her high school team to the Ohio State Finals, where they lost a nail-biter at the buzzer. While she was at Williamsport, Smith was named to the Maryland All-Area First Team (2007) and the All-County First Team three seasons in a row (2005-07). Billups averaged 25.4 points, 14.7 rebounds, and 5.7 blocks per game, which led all high school players in North Carolina.

The Schedule:

This season's 27-game schedule will include a trip to the Independent Tournament. The Lancers will be hosting Central Connecticut State and NJIT in the Lancer Classic Weekend, while also playing highlighted contests against in-state and ACC members Virginia and Virginia Tech, along with road match-ups against Big East members Syracuse and West Virginia. Longwood will host Atlantic Sun member Kennesaw State and Atlantic 10 Conference member and in-state opponent Richmond as well.

The Lancers will begin the season with a trip to the Elon Classic, where they will match up against North Carolina Wilmington on November 14 at 5 p.m., and Elon on November 15 at 7 p.m. The team will then return home to host Saint Francis at Willett Hall on November 19 at 7 p.m., for the team's first home game of the season. The first 250 fans who arrive to cheer on the Lancers against the Terriers will receive free t-shirts. The Lancers' biggest home game of November will come on the 25th when they play host to the Richmond Spiders at 7 p.m. The Spiders made it to the quarterfinals of the Atlantic 10 Tournament before falling to Temple 70-62.

Following the contest with Richmond the Lancers will hit the road for arguably their toughest game of the season as they take on Big East powerhouse Syracuse. The Orange and the Lancers are set to square off on November 30 at 2 p.m. at Manley Field House in Syracuse, New York. Syracuse heads into this season after finishing the 2007-08 season with a 22-9 record, which saw them earn a birth in the NCAA Tournament.

The Lancers will rebound with a trip to Jacksonville, Florida on December 17-18 for the North Florida Holiday Classic. The team will face off with North Florida on December 17 at 7 p.m., before taking on Jacksonville State on December 18 at 5 p.m. Longwood will then return

home for a match up against Kennesaw State, who would have earned a spot in the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament last season (KSU is not eligible for post-season until 2009 due to NCAA reclassification) after finishing with an 11-5 record. The Lancers will then gear up to close-out 2008 with two tough road games; the first coming against VCU on December 28 at 2 p.m. The Rams finished last season with a 26-8 record that saw them earn a spot in the WNIT.

December ends with the Lancers taking on West Virginia. The two teams will meet on December 30 at 7 p.m. at the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers finished the season with a 25-8 record, reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament for just the fourth time in school history.

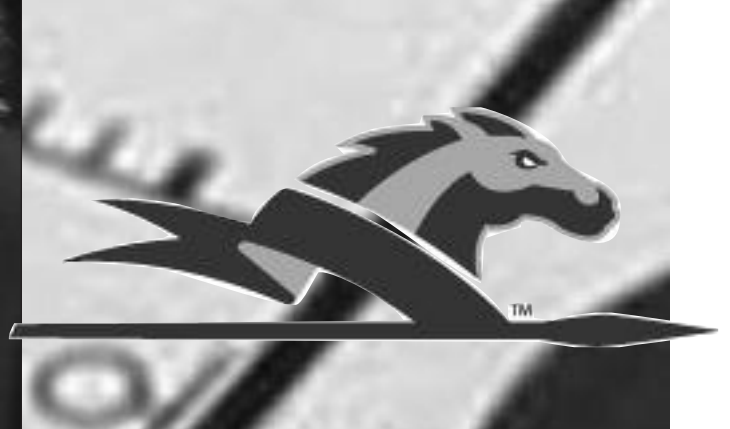
January will see the Lancers host Central Connecticut State (January 2, 7 p.m.) and NJIT (January 4, 2 p.m.) as part of the Lancer Classic Weekend. Columbia will then come visit Willett Hall on January 7 at 7 p.m., while Longwood hosts UMES on January 21 (5 p.m.) and Mount St. Mary's on January 29 (7 p.m.). The Lancers will play at Virginia Tech for the first time since the 2005-06 season. The Hokies, who made it to the first round of the ACC Tournament, lead the all-time series with the Lancers 4-2.

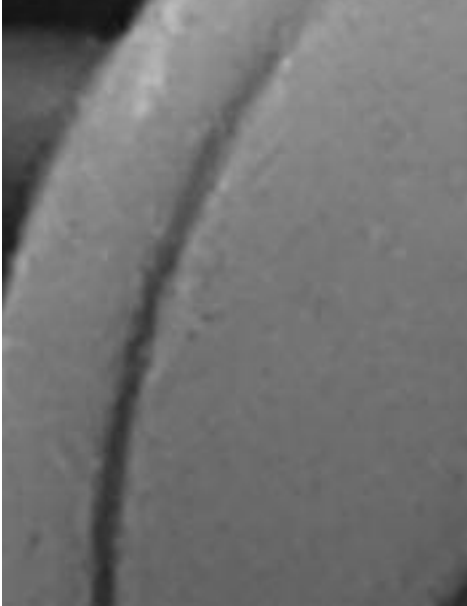
Longwood begins February on the road with a rematch against Virginia. The two teams are set to square off on February 1 at 2 p.m. in Charlottesville. The Cavaliers edged the Lancers last season, 62-49 on their way to a berth in the NCAA Tournament second round. The Lancers will remain on the road following the Virginia game to face Savannah State (February 7, 3 p.m.), Winthrop (February 10, 7 p.m.), NJIT (February 14, 2 p.m.), and Presbyterian (February 17, 7 p.m.). North Carolina Central will travel to Willett Hall on February 20 for a 7 p.m. match-up, while the Lancers will host Savannah State on February 22 at 2 p.m.

The team will head to the Independent Tournament on March 4-6 in Orem, Utah. The tournament is being hosted by Utah Valley and will feature Chicago State, UTPA, NJIT, and Savannah State.

KRISTIN CARUSO

HEAD COACH
2ND YEAR



Kristin Caruso is in her second year as the new women's basketball head coach at Longwood University during 2008-09. She is a Richmond native, 1986 graduate of Hermitage High School (Kristin Lamb), and a former four-year standout at the University of Connecticut (1986-90). Caruso had served as the associate head coach at the University of Hartford for five seasons (2002-07). Hartford had won consecutive America East Conference Tournament championships (2005-06) while making two NCAA Tournament appearances, including a first-round win over Temple in 2006, before finishing 25-9 this year en route to the second round of the post-season WNIT.

In her first season at Longwood, Caruso guided the Lancers to a 16-13 record, their first winning season since the 2004-05 season. With Caruso at the helm, Longwood pulled out victories over Gardner-Webb, NJIT and High Point. The Lancers biggest win of the season came against Radford on January 17, as the team knocked off the Wildcats 70-69, for their biggest win since becoming a Division I program. During the course of the season, two of the Lancers were named Independent Rookie of the Week, while Keiva Small and Krystal Garrison earned Division I All-Independent Team Honors. Small was named to the All-Independent First Team, while Garrison earned a spot on the All-Newcomer Team. Caruso also helped guide Longwood to the 16th most improved NCAA Division I basketball program during the 07-08 season.

Caruso helped lead Hartford to a five-year record of 99-55 overall, including 57-27 in the America East, while working with Hawks head coach Jennifer Rizzotti -- also a former Connecticut standout and graduate (1992-96). Caruso's responsibilities at Hartford included recruiting coordination and game scheduling, practice organization, game day preparation (opponent/film scouting), administrative duties, player development, and she also served as director of the Hartford summer girls basketball camp. The Hawks won the past two regular-season America East titles (2006-07), finishing 15-1 in league play each year.

Prior to Hartford, Caruso was the head coach at Marist College for four years (1998-2002, 32-79) after assistant coaching positions at Marist (1997-98), Duquesne University (1993-96), and her alma mater, UConn (1990-93), under veteran head coach Geno Auriemma. While head coach at Marist, she was responsible for all aspects of managing a Division I program with oversight of the annual operational budget as well. Caruso was the recruiting coordinator at both Marist and Duquesne while assisting with recruiting at UConn as well. She also served as the Executive Director of the Connecticut Women's Basketball Camp during 1996-97, responsible for all aspects of operation for the approximate 1,800 participants during the six-week summer period with revenue generation of over \$700,000.

Caruso earned her bachelor of science degree in education from Connecticut in 1990, and her masters degree in education from UConn in 2000. A four-year standout for the Huskies, she was the 1987 Big East Freshman of the Year as well as a three-time All-Big East selection (1987, 1989-90) while scoring 1,244 career points (sixth all-time upon her graduation, 21st currently). Caruso was also a two-year team co-captain (1989-90) and helped UConn to a pair of Big East Conference regular-season titles (1989-90) as well as the Big East Tournament championship in 1989. While playing for the Huskies, Caruso made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament her junior and senior season. Additionally, she received the Outstanding Senior Athlete Award by the UConn Club in 1990. As an assistant coach at her alma mater, she was part of three NCAA Tournament teams (1991-93) that included the 1991 squad reaching the Final Four.

Caruso and her husband, Joe, have twin sons, Robert and Joseph, born October 2006.

ANTHONY CROCITTO

ASSISTANT COACH
2ND YEAR



Anthony Crocitto is in his second year as the top assistant women's basketball coach at Longwood University during 2008-09. Previously, Crocitto served as the assistant head coach at the University of Central Florida in Orlando (2006-07) after a two-year stint (2004-06) as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Hofstra University in Hempstead, New York.

In his first season at Longwood, Crocitto helped the Lancers to a 16-13 record, their first winning season since the 2004-05 season. During the course of the season, Crocitto helped coach two Lancers to Independent Rookie of the Week honors, while also working with Keiva Small and Krystal Garrison, who both earned Division I All-Independent Team Honors. Small was named to the All-Independent First Team, while Garrison earned a spot on the All-Newcomer Team. Crocitto was also a part of helping the Lancers be named the 16th Most Improved NCAA Division I basketball program during the 07-08 season.

Crocitto brings 12 years of collegiate coaching experience to his position. He has made the following previous stops in addition to Central Florida and Hofstra, at Fairleigh Dickinson University (2002-04) in Teaneck, New Jersey, Mount Ida College (2001-02) in Newton Centre, Massachusetts, and Dowling College (1997-2001) in Oakdale, New York. He was the first assistant coach at Fairleigh Dickinson after head coaching positions at both Mount Ida and Dowling (1999-2001) where he also was the first assistant coach (1997-99). Crocitto has served as the recruiting coordinator at each of his previous collegiate coaching stops since 1997.

Crocitto coordinated a recruiting class at UCF that included three national rankings among the nation's top 50, while also assisting with



academic monitoring that led to a team GPA above 3.0 each semester. He helped accomplish the same team academic successes at Hofstra which finished 19-12 during 2005-06 en route to earning the school's first post-season win in the WNIT. At Fairleigh Dickinson, Crocitto assisted the program to a fourth-place national academic ranking as FDU posted an NCAA Division I Top Ten turnaround season (2003-04), as well. During his tenure at Division II Dowling, he helped the school to at least 15 wins during three of four seasons after the program had won just 10 games combined the previous four years, and, was also an assistant baseball coach for two seasons (1999-2001).

Crocitto has additionally served as head basketball coach at Holy Child High School in Westbury, New York (1994-96), and as director and head coach for both St. Martin of Tours Basketball program in Amityville, New York (1989-96) and Amityville Warrior AAU Basketball (1993-96). He was head baseball coach at Walt Whitman High School in Huntington, New York (1994-96), La Salle Center in Oakdale, New York (1997-98), and at Bayport/Blue Point High School in Blue Point, New York (1998-2000). Crocitto has worked numerous summer camps during his career as both a coach and administrator/director.

A native of Amityville, New York, Crocitto is married to Kristin Crocitto and earned his Bachelor of Arts in Management with a minor in psychology from Hofstra University in 1995. He and Kristin, an elementary education teacher, reside in Farmville. The couple is expecting their first child, due in January, 2009.

JENNA GAMBINO

1ST YEAR



Jenna Gambino is in her first season at Longwood after serving as the assistant coach at Columbia University during the 2007-08 season.

While at Columbia, Gambino's duties included planning and implementing practice drills, working individually with post players, recruiting and scouting opponents. In her time at Columbia, the Lions went 10-18 while posting a 7-7 record in the Ivy League.

Prior to working at Columbia, Gambino served as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College, which reached the Division III NCAA Tournament during the 2006-07 season.

Among her many duties, she coordinated plans for practices and conducted one-on-one workouts primarily with post players. During her time at Ithaca, Gambino worked towards her master's degree in exercise science with a concentration in sport psychology, which she received in August 2007.

A 2006 graduate of Stevens Institute of Technology, Gambino was twice named to the Skyline Conference First-Team and served as team captain her senior season. During her four-year career with the Ducks, Gambino totaled 1,131 points and collected 616 rebounds.

Gambino has also been involved in a variety of basketball camps. She has worked with the Staten Island Renegades, an AAU team of 11-year-old girls; she also worked at the Rising Stars Basketball Camp in Staten Island for four summers and the Philadelphia 76ers basketball camp in the summer of 2005.





GAYLE COATS

ASSISTANT COACH
2ND YEAR



Gayle Coats is in her second year as an assistant coach for women's basketball at Longwood University during 2008-09. A Richmond native, Coats comes to the program after being a part of the WNBA's New York Liberty organization from April-August 2007 where she interned as the assistant manager of video and scouting operations.

In her first season at Longwood, Coats helped the Lancers to a 16-13 record, their first winning season since the 2004-05 season. During the course of the season Coats helped coach two of Lancers to Independent Rookie of the Week honors, while working with Keiva Small and Krystal Garrison who earned Division I All-Independent Team Honors. Small was named to the All-Independent First Team, while Garrison earned a spot on the All-Newcomer Team. Coats was also apart of helping the Lancers be named the 16th most improved NCAA Division I basketball program during the 07-08 season.

While with the Liberty, Coats helped with film editing, videotaping practice, organizing scouting report information, calculating player and team efficiency, daily administrative duties and film exchange. A 2007 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Coats was a four-year letterwinner and was named co-captain her senior year while earning the team's Knight Award for Leadership that same season. Coats also excelled in the



All-NEC Academic Squad for three years and graduated with magna cum laude honors.

Coats also worked with various AAU teams in New Jersey and Virginia as both a head coach and assistant coach. While in New Jersey, Coats served as a head coach of the New Jersey Cardinals U-13 AAU Cardinals in 2006 and was both an assistant and head coach of the New Jersey Mavericks from 2004-05. In her hometown of Richmond, Coats was a member of the U-turn Sport Performance Academy where she served as a basketball and strength and conditioning coach. While at U-turn Sport Performance Academy Coats, worked on individual skill development and team strategies and conducted weight lifting, agility and conditioning workouts.

RACHELLE STEWART



MANAGER
1ST YEAR



Rachelle Stewart is in her first season as the Lancers' manager. Stewart begins her duties as manager after playing two seasons with the Lancers as a guard.

Last season, Stewart played in 17 games for the Lancers, averaging 1.2 points a game, with a .571 free throw percentage. In her junior season, Stewart appeared in four games, logging four minutes of action. Before joining the basketball team, she served as a member of the Lady Baldwin at Longwood and also served as an Ambassador for the College of Education and Human Services.

Prior to Longwood, Stewart participated in volleyball and basketball at Highland Springs, earning Capital District Academic Award for both sports. She was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and was awarded Best Team Player 2002 and 2003. She was also awarded "Who's Who Among High School Students" from 2001-04 and "Who's Who Among High School Athletes" in 2004. Stewart earned the United States Army Reserve National Scholar/Athlete Award in 2004.

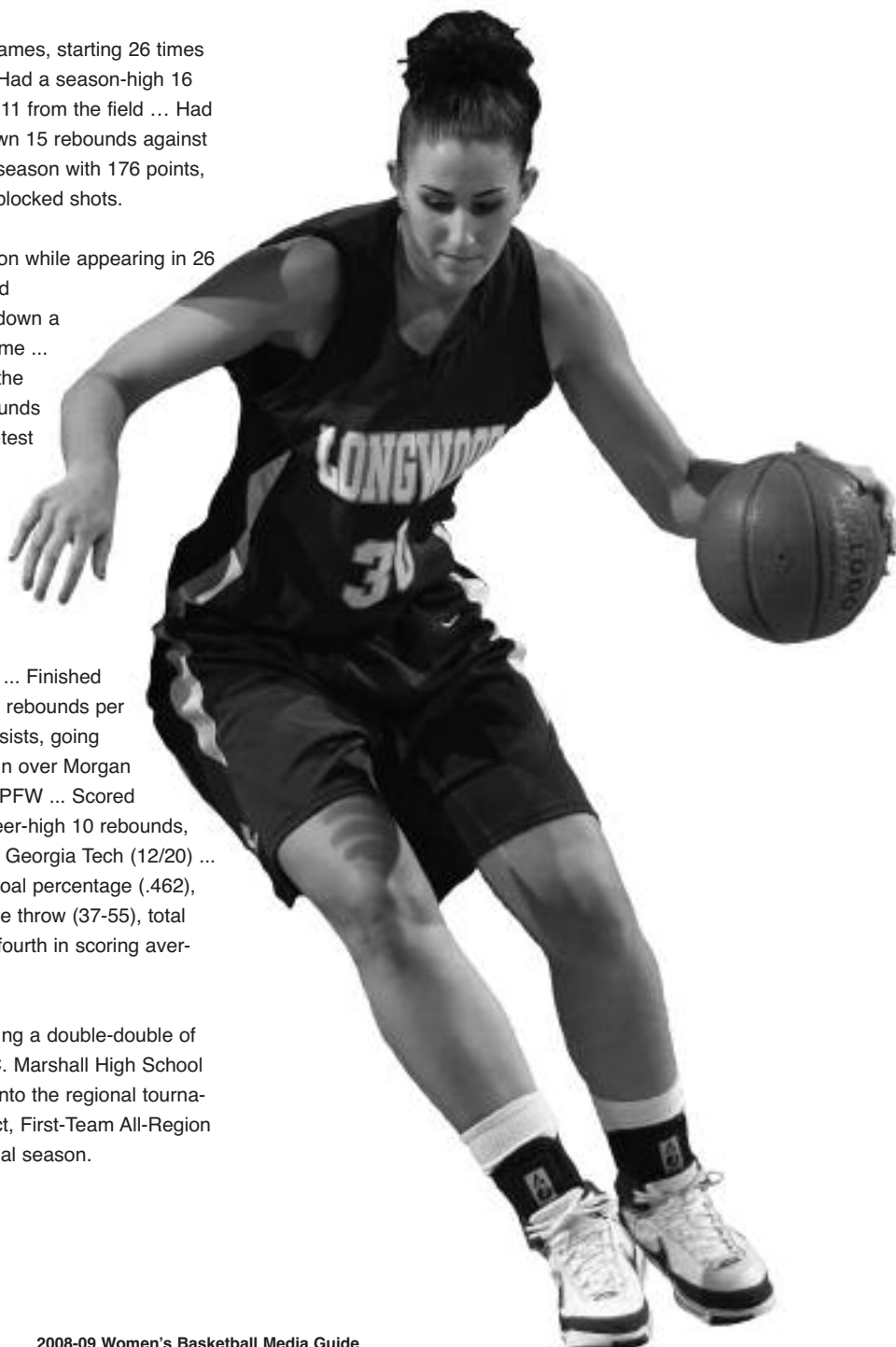

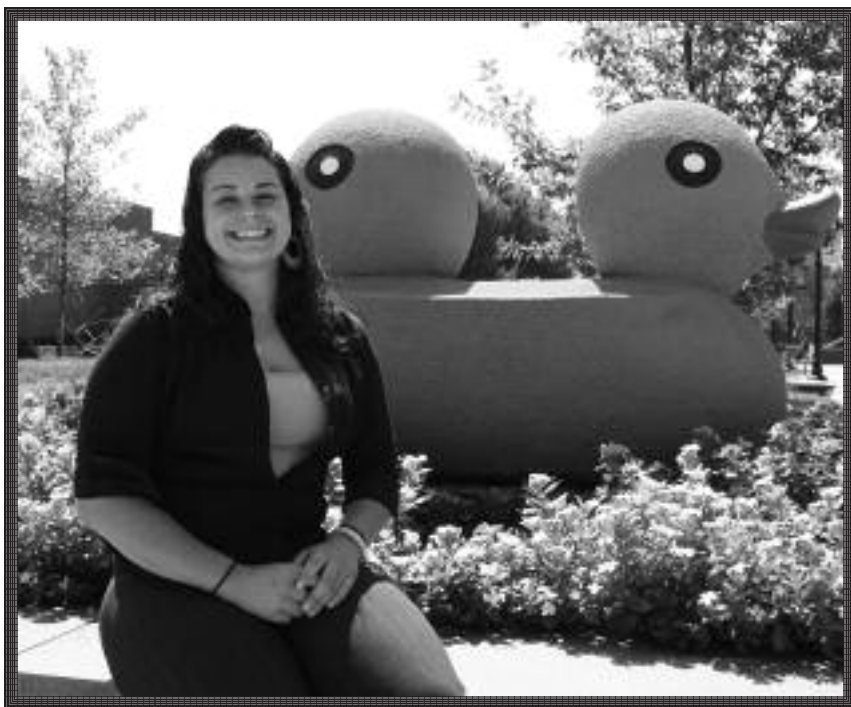

2007-08 SEASON REVIEW

The Longwood University women's basketball team finished the 2007-08 year with a 16-13 record. The team faced several tough opponents, including Virginia, Richmond, Massachusetts and Wake Forest.

The Lancers got off to a slow start, dropping their first three games of the season. Longwood started off with American, a game that proved to be a battle of the titans with American pulling out a 70-61 win. Things didn't get any easier for the team as they headed to Charlottesville to take on the Cavaliers of Virginia. The Atlantic Coast Conference team gave the Lancers a run for their money, pulling out a 62-49 win.

The Lancers first win of the season came at their annual Longwood Classic, where they hosted Howard, Campbell, and Morgan State. On November 16, Longwood would top Howard 85-73 in front of 400 fans for its first win as a fully-certified Division I program. The very next day, the

scoring game of the season. Small would however steal the show, scoring a team-high 23 points against the Running Bulldogs.

The New Year would ring in with the Lancers pulling out their seventh win of the season, taking their season record to 7-8. Longwood started 2008 with a match up against Central Connecticut State, a game in which the Lancers took with ease, winning 64-43.

The team wouldn't have long to relish in their victory, as they quickly boarded a plane for Massachusetts. The team headed to Amherst, Mass for a battle with Minutewomen of the Atlantic 10. The Lancers held their own throughout the game, but were unable to come up victorious, falling respectfully 68-58. The team would go onto close out January with a 5-2 record.

February would be just as nice for the Lancers who ended the 2007-08 season with a five-game win streak, their longest of the season. The month began with an unkind trip to Texas, where the Lancers dropped two games. Never discouraged, the Lancers pressed on, bouncing back with five wins to close out the season.

The win streak began on February 6 when High Point rolled into town and then was sent rolling on out with a 67-60 loss. The team then hit the road for their final road game of the year, facing off with Winston-Salem State and getting the better of them 65-52. The teams final three games took place at home in Farmville, with the Lancers giving their fans three stellar performances.

The first game was against Savannah State, a rematch of an earlier game in the season, which saw the Tigers pull out a victory in Savannah, Georgia. This time around things would be different with the Lancers kicking things up a notch, defeating the Tigers 69-66. Presbyterian would be the Lancers next victim, falling 73-58. The teams first winning season since the 2004-05 season would be complete when NJIT came to town. The Lancers took charge from the beginning knocking off NJIT 60-49, to not only end their season on a high note, but improve to 16-13 on the year.

Lancers would pick up their second win to improve to 2-3 on the season, as they knocked off Morgan State 74-70.

Even though the team got off to a sluggish start, senior Keiva Small came out of the gates on fire on her way to a great senior performance. Small kicked off the season with 12 points against American, which would be the start of her streak of six consecutive games in which she scored in double digits. Small would also go on to post five double-double games throughout the course of the season.

After wrapping up the Longwood Classic, the Lancers headed on the road for their next four games. The Lancers opened their road stretch against George Mason, before traveling to Richmond. Against the Spiders, the Lancers worked hard, but were unable to come out victorious falling 62-45. The Lancers would rebound quickly taking control of their final two road games, defeating both Maryland-Eastern Shore and Mount St. Mary's.

The Lancers would continue their winning ways as they headed home in December, defeating UNC Greensboro and Gardner-Webb in the warm confines of Willett Hall. Against Gardner-Webb, sophomore Becky Fernandes would end the game with 10 points, for her first double digit

LANCER RECORD BOOK



LONGWOOD BASKETBALL HISTORY

During the 2005-06 season Longwood saw an end to a 23-year era, as **Shirley Duncan** retired mid-way through the season. During her tenure, Duncan led the Lancers to a 356-263 (.565) record, including 12 consecutive winning seasons from 1983-2005 (235-108 .685) and four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances (1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97, 2002-03). Before Longwood made the jump to Division I, Duncan and the Lancers were a strong member of the Carolina-Virginia Athletic Conference (CVAC), winning the tournament Championship during the 2002-03 season, and back-to-back CVAC regular-season titles (1995-96, 1996-97).

In her final full season with the Lancers and in their second year of the four-year reclassification period in 2004-05 Longwood finished with a 15-13 overall record.

In 2002-03 season, Longwood finished with a school-record of 27-5, and was ranked as high as #19 in the Division II National Coaches Poll. The Lancers completed their eight-year membership in the CVAC with an overall record of 126-28 (.818). Duncan was named the WBCA Region 2 Coach of the Year, and the VaSID Division II-III Coach of the Year. She earned her 300th win at Longwood on January 11, 2003, a 79-67 win at Erskine (S.C.).

The Lancers were 18-12 overall during 2001-02, including a 14-6 mark in the CVAC, en route to a runner-up finish at the CVAC Tournament. During the 1999-2000 season, Duncan was selected as the CVAC Coach of the Year by a vote of her conference peers following a 20-9 record.

Duncan reached a pair of milestones during 2000-01 (21-7) record, attaining her 300th career coaching victory overall January 8, 2001 with a 67-63 triumph over Pfeiffer (N.C.), and her 275th win at Longwood came February 28, 2001 with a 77-51 victory past Anderson (S.C.).

She was named the 1996-97 WBCA District III 'Coach of the Year', and the 1995-96 CVAC 'Coach of the Year' following a 22-7 campaign, including a perfect 18-0 record during the inaugural season of CVCA competition. Duncan also served as the District III representative for the 1995-96 WBCA 'Coach of the Year' committee. Additionally, she was named the 1995 Virginia Division II-III Women's Basketball State 'Coach of the Year' in voting by VaSID after the Lancers posted a 21-8 mark during 1994-95.

Duncan was selected an 'All-American' coach in 1985 and 1986 by the American Women's Sports Federation. Her "Longwood College's Winning Out-Of-Bounds Play" was published in the February-May, 1993 Coaching Women's Basketball magazine. In addition, she was selected Virginia's Division II-III 'Coach of the Year' by VaSID after the 1983-84 season as well.

In 1990, as in her first two seasons at Longwood, she was named the College's 'Female Coach of the Year'. Duncan hosted the popular and successful Lady Lancer Basketball Camp for 13-straight years prior to 2001. In years past, she has traveled to New Jersey to conduct clinics for the New Jersey Police Athletic League coaches.

A native of Lexington, Ky., Duncan was head coach at Eastern Kentucky University from 1975-79 and led the team to a State Championship and runner-up spot in AIAW Region II. Prior to coaching at the collegiate level, Duncan coached at West Springfield (Va.) High School where her teams won four district and two regional titles from 1972-75.

A 1956 graduate of the University of Kentucky, Duncan received her masters degree in physical education from Indiana in 1961. She has chaired a national basketball officiating committee on principles and techniques, served as rules interpreter for three national women's basketball championship tournaments and was the first president of the Virginia Association for Coaches of Girls' and Women's sports.

Coach Duncan will return to Willett Hall this season, taking part in each of Longwood's women's basketball home games as a color analysis for each game carried by WSVS AM 800 this season.

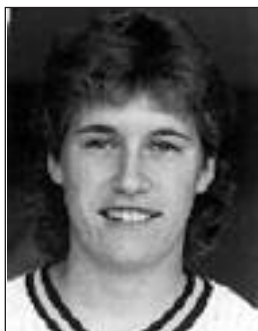

Barnette is the second leading scorer in Longwood University women's basketball history with 1,569 points, accomplishing this despite missing 20 games over her last two seasons with various injuries. Barnette holds eight game, season, and career records at Longwood, including a single-game high of 43 points (shares with Ana Litton, 94). Her number 43 jersey became the third jersey retired in the program's history.

Barnette was named to the 1989-90 WBCA/Kodak NCAA Division II All-America team, the only junior selected to the squad. Her averages of 28.4 points and 13.8 rebounds that year ranked her third and fourth, respectively, in the nation for Division II women's basketball. Named to five All-Tournament teams, Barnette additionally was named Longwood Female Athlete of the Year and Women's Basketball MVP for both 1989-90 and 1990-91.

Forbes is the fifth leading scorer in Longwood University women's basketball history with 1,480 points. She holds game, season, and career records for assists, totaling 532 in her tenure. Additionally, Forbes holds the career record for field goals made with 667. Her career scoring average of 14.0 points per game ranks seventh all-time. Her number 44 jersey was the second jersey to be retired at Longwood University.

Forbes was selected to the 1986-87 American Women's Sports Federation College Division NCAA Division II All-America team, as well as the WBCA/Kodak All-District squad. Additionally, Forbes was named AWSF Mid-South All-Region College Division and the AWSF National Player of the Week in January of 1987, as well as Longwood Female Athlete of the Year and Women's Basketball MVP in 1987.

Rama is the sixth leading scorer in Longwood University women's basketball history with 1,471 points in 82 career games. She ranks second in career field goals with 634, and her career scoring average of 17.9 ranks second as well. Her number 40 jersey was the first jersey ever retired at Longwood on March 31, 1978.

Rama was selected to the Virginia Federation of Intercollegiate Sports for Women All-State team four consecutive years. She led Longwood to a record of 52-30 during her four years. Following her career with the Lancers, Rama was drafted by, and tried out for, the Washington D.C. franchise in the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1978, though the league never really got going. Rama's biggest achievement came in 1976 when she made it to the final 12 of the United States Olympic women's basketball team tryouts.

Atkinson is a two-time honorable mention All-America (1996 and 1997), averaged 13.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 4.4 assists and 2.5 steals over her four-year career. Starting in all 115 games, Atkinson helped Longwood to an 84-31 (.704) record, including a school-record 19 consecutive wins in the 1995-96 season, and at the time the Lancers 25 wins in 1996-97 set a school-record. Atkinson helped Longwood clinch back-to-back Carolina-Virginia Athletic Conference (CVAC) titles as well as appearing in three NCAA Division II Tournaments.

Her senior year, Atkinson was awarded the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference Player of the Year, CVAC's Murphy Osborne Award-the league's highest academic honor, and Longwood's Henry I. Willett Scholar-Athlete Award, which is given to the top scholar-athlete. Also a two-time Longwood Female Athlete of the Year, two-time CVAC First-Team and All-Tournament honoree and a Virginia Sports Information Directors First-Team All-State recipient.

Atkinson holds the career record in steals (289), second in assists (504), third in free throws made (279) and fourth in both points (1,449) and three-point field goals made (96). In the single-season record book, Atkinson is second in both assists (152) and steals (96).

WILLETT HALL

Willett Hall (formerly Lancer Hall) is home to Longwood Basketball and features a 1,729-seat facility after the installation of new chair-back seating during the summer of 2007. The summer of 2006 witnessed other renovations to Willett Hall, which included new lighting, the walls being painted the Lancers' colors, the new athletics logo painted in the center-circle of the court, and new team and individual banners emphasizing the school colors. Also, the first phase of the locker room renovation project resulted in an expansion in size along with upgrading of the individual lockers. Additional enhancements to the locker rooms are expected during the summer 2008.



The Willett Hall floor was replaced in 2004 and in 2003-04 the concession stands located in the main lobby were also renovated. Willett Hall also features four locker rooms, training room, weight room, swimming pool, and other support facilities for the university's 14 intercollegiate sports. The facility was originally completed in 1980 at a cost of \$4.5 million.

Longwood University honored Dr. Henry I. Willett Jr., former Longwood University president from 1967 to 1981, on September 9, 2004 by re-naming Lancer Hall to Willett Hall. Dr. Willett oversaw Longwood's transformation into a fully coeducational institution in 1976.

Longwood women's basketball has compiled a home-court record of 224-101 during 27 seasons of action in Willett Hall, a winning percentage of .683%. During the 2002-03 season, the Lancers went undefeated at Willett Hall winning all 14 games played in Farmville.

In 2007 Willett Hall got a face lift with the construction of a state of the art athletic training room. The training room includes six medical beds for the student athletes, rehabilitation equipment and a doctors office. The training room now allows the Longwood athletic training staff to treat more athletes within the course of a day, while providing up to date medical treatment.





Over the summer of 2008 Willett Hall has undergone another phase of renovations, with the construction of the new locker rooms. The existing spaces have been completely gutted and construction has started from scratch. The women's locker room will include new lockers, carpet, showers and a brand new lounge.

Longwood is scheduled to play 11 homes games during 2008-09, including the Longwood Classic Weekend, which will be held the first week of the New Year.

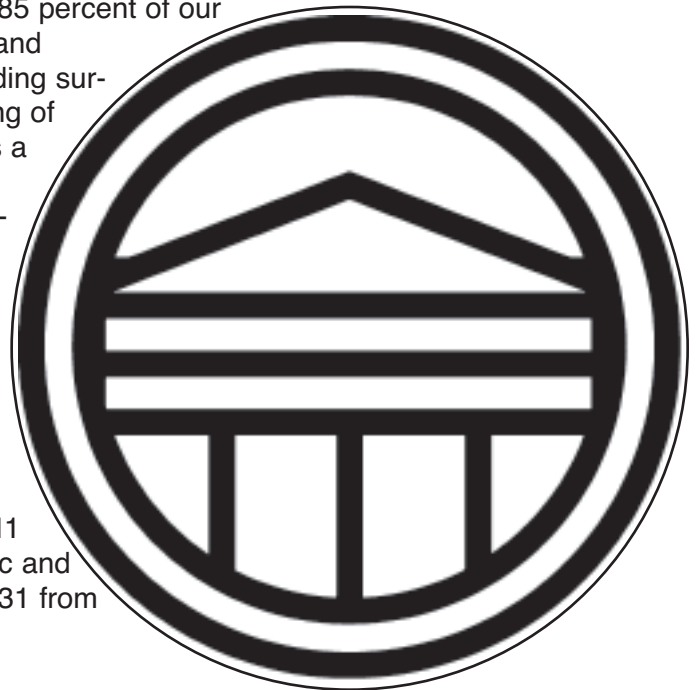

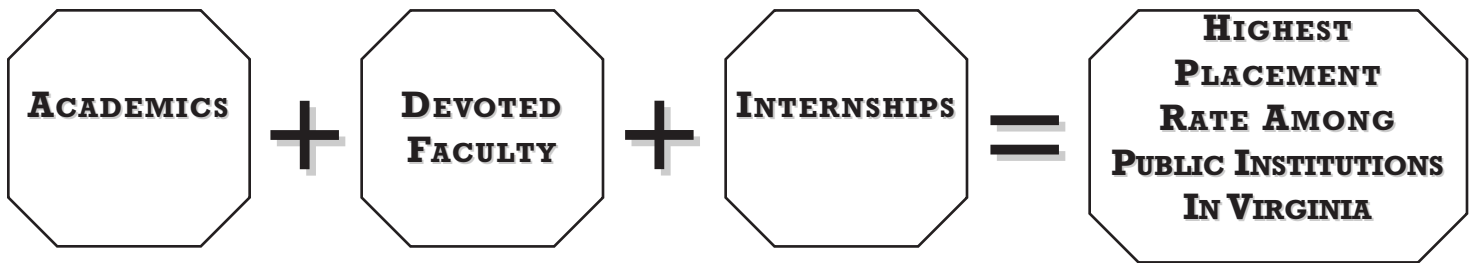

Included in these renovations is a \$250,000 renovation of the women's basketball locker room and a major face lift to our home court. She is the one who launched Longwood into the Division I sports arena.

Some Longwood students are conducting original research projects on topics such as the history of commerce along the James River, prehistoric lithic manufacturing reconstruction, software pirate culture, solar energy, applied chromatography, the militia movement, cryptography, network communication, and antibiotic resistance in bacteria.

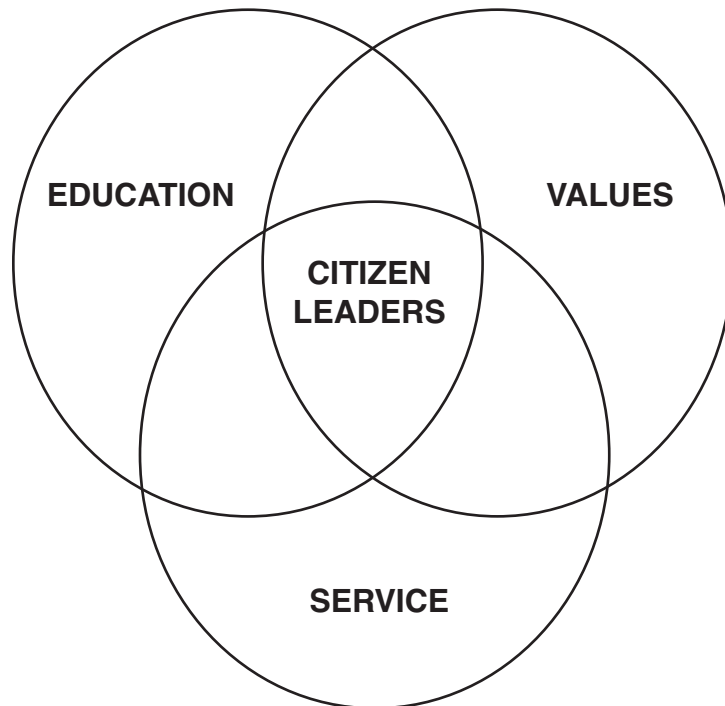
The Mission

LONGWOOD UNIVERSITY

With a legacy of learning dating back nearly 170 years, Longwood University has developed a meaningful learning environment that extends far beyond the classroom. Founded in 1839 as the Farmville Female Seminary Association, the school was a pioneer first in private and later in public education. The State of Virginia acquired the school in 1884 and renamed it as the Normal School, the first state institution of higher learning for women in Virginia. Over the years, the school expanded its curricula and had a succession of names, becoming Longwood College in 1949 and fully coeducational in 1976. On April 24, 2002, history was again made at Longwood when Governor Mark Warner signed legislation that designated Longwood as a university, effective July 1, 2002.

The legacy that began in 1839 continues today as Longwood University offers over 100 majors, minors and concentrations through its



various academic programs. Given its historical roots, Longwood University enjoys an enviable reputation for teacher preparation. But the excellence has expanded throughout the university with strong programs in the liberal arts and sciences, business, professional and pre-professional programs. Today, the coeducational, comprehensive state university has an enrollment of over 4,300 students and is comprised of three separate colleges: the Cook-Cole College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business and Economics, and the College of Education and Human Services and a graduate division offering programs in education, English, sociology, and a new MBA in Retail Management.

Under the leadership of President Patricia P. Cormier, Longwood is committed to developing citizen leaders and provides a meaningful learning environment where students learn skills, knowledge and theory and then translate learning into action by doing research, internships, field work and community service. Recognizing the value of experiential learning, Longwood is one of the few universities in the country to require all students to complete an internship or similar learning experience before graduation. Additionally, Longwood was the first institution in Virginia to require that every freshman have a laptop computer. Technology is integrated throughout the learning process—an essential

element for preparing the leaders of tomorrow.

The Longwood learning environment is enriched further by the Greenwood Library that holds 245,000 book titles, 2,100 print journal subscriptions, and some 100 electronic data bases including access to 11,000 full-text electronic journals and provides integrated technology for information retrieval from libraries throughout the world, as well as satellite reception of foreign programs and web access. This state-of-the-art facility is named in honor of Longwood's 22nd president, Dr. Janet Daly Greenwood.

Longwood students continue to rate their university as one of the most engaging in the country, according to results from the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE). In the 2002 survey, seniors rated Longwood at or above the 80th percentile on six of the nine NSSE benchmarks when compared with Masters institutions; freshmen rated Longwood at or above the 60th percentile on all nine benchmarks when compared with Masters institutions. "Student Engagement with Technology" continued to lead the way at the 90th percentile or higher. The survey was developed by national assessment experts as an alternative to the U.S. News & World Report rankings, which are strongly influenced by resources and reputation. NSSE is sponsored by The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and The Pew Forum for Undergraduate Learning.

Additionally, Longwood University is one of only 20 "high performing" institutions nationwide selected to participate in the Documenting Effective Educational Practices (DEEP) project being conducted by the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) and the American Association for Higher Education (AAHE). Basically, the main purposes of the project will be to discover what practices enhance the learning process for college students and then to share that information with colleges and universities throughout the nation. Longwood was selected for the project because it was identified as an "educationally effective institution" based upon NSSE benchmark results and "promising persistence and graduation rates." In addition, the new U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges Survey ranks Longwood with the 10th highest graduation rate (61 percent) among all master's level universities in the South.

Longwood provides a range of business services to the region and state through the Longwood Small Business Development Center, while the Longwood Center for the Visual Arts serves as an important and innovative study center and cultural resource for the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Longwood University also has a tremendous economic and cultural impact on Farmville and the surrounding communities. A recent study conducted by the Longwood Small Business Development Center estimates that university employees, students, and visitors spent over \$100 million in 2001—with 54 percent of that amount being spent in Farmville and the eight surrounding counties.

The Longwood campus, located in the heart of historic Farmville, Virginia, provides excellent facilities while reflecting the charm, beauty, and character associated with its long heritage. The campus community was enhanced recently with the opening of Brock Commons, a beautiful pedestrian promenade that provides a central focal point for the Longwood campus while eliminating traffic congestion and safety hazards. Fountains, walkways, outdoor sculpture and beautiful landscaping contribute to Brock Commons, creating a park-like atmosphere for students, faculty, staff, and the public.

The University has completely recovered from the devastating fire of April 24, 2001 that destroyed several historic buildings on campus including the Ruffners, Grainger Hall, and the signature Rotunda. A completely rebuilt Grainger Hall opened in 2004 and Ruffner Hall and the Rotunda were re-dedicated on April 23, 2005.

THE UNIVERSITY

A new four-story Science Center opened on December 6, 2005. The 70,822-square-foot facility includes 23 classrooms and laboratories, 47 faculty offices and additional research space for both undergraduate and graduate research projects. The new building, which was named in 2007 in honor of John H. and Karen Williams Chichester, Class of 1974, features a state-of-the-art, climate-controlled environment, with safety ventilation systems and hazardous materials safeguards along with a high-tech infrastructure for classrooms, laboratories, and distance learning facilities.

A greenhouse and herbarium, housing the world's largest collection of Virginia plant specimens, are located on the roof.

Most recently, a new, multi-faceted Health and Fitness Center opened in August 2007. Located on Main Street, adjacent to Frazer Residence Hall, the 74,683-square-foot, two-and-a-half story facility features a wide range of amenities including an indoor track, basketball and racquetball courts, a climbing wall, work-out rooms, juice bar, and the latest weight, exercise and training equipment. The building received a Gold Certification Rating in Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) from the U.S. Green Building Council.

One of the more popular buildings on campus is the two-story, 60,000 square foot Dorrell Dining Hall located on Brock Commons across from the Lankford Student Union. Named in honor of Dr. William Franklin Dorrell, Longwood's 23rd president, this multi-purpose facility, with its curved, colonnaded portico overlooking Iler Field, is the first on campus to utilize geothermal heating and cooling. The flexible interior design provides space for banquets, meetings, and special events along with a Grand Dining Room seating 500 and an arcade seating an additional 700.

Construction is under way for Longwood University's Center for Communication Studies and Theatre, which will house one of the university's fastest growing programs and is planned to open in Fall 2009. The three-story, 41,983-square foot building will be home to the Department of Communication Studies and Theatre, which has about 140 students majoring in communication studies and about 50 majors in theatre. The new building will have a highly flexible 174-seat "black box" theater and a studio theater, which will be used for student productions. There also will be a scene shop, a costume shop and a drafting lab.

Nearly 1,000 students reside among three campus-managed apartment communities—Longwood Landings at Mid-Town Square, Longwood Village, and Lancer Village. Some of the amenities and features of the apartments are private bedrooms (some with private baths), full kitchens (most with dishwashers), washer/dryer units, large living areas, high-speed Internet, and cable television. Two of the three communities have fitness rooms and one has a swimming pool and a game room. On campus, Wheeler and Cox Halls recently reopened following complete renovations. These residence halls now include elevators, air conditioning, bathrooms with ceramic tile and new fixtures, contemporary study rooms with modern amenities, and common areas with outside terraces.

Longwood Landings at Mid-Town Square, which opened in August 2006, is a residential village that includes four, four-story buildings with the top three floors dedicated to student housing and the ground floor devoted to leased retail space. Longwood students occupy 96 four-bedroom and 24-single-bedroom apartments. Retailers include Barnes & Noble, which operates Longwood's bookstore and includes a Starbucks Café.

Behind and alongside this area are broad malls, lawns, 11 tennis courts, four athletic fields, an indoor-outdoor swimming pool, and numerous late-20th century buildings, including the library, residence halls, the Lankford Student Union, and various academic facilities. The campus has six auditoriums ranging in size from 150 seats to over 1,200.

Willett Hall, named for former Longwood President Henry I. Willett Jr., is a health, physical education, and recreation complex located on Brock Commons. It has a newly-renovated gymnasium with 1,720

seats; a complete weight-training laboratory; a 25-meter pool with a one-meter board, underwater lighting, and observation window; a 350-seat natatorium; a modern dance studio with a floating floor and staging capacity; and one of the state's best-equipped laboratories for the study of human performance as it relates to exercise, sports, health, and the arts. A 3,000-square foot addition to Willett Hall will house a new Sports Medicine/Rehabilitation facility for the Health, Recreation, and Kinesiology programs.

Not far from campus students can enjoy the facilities at Longwood Estate which features a new complex of athletic fields for field hockey,



lacrosse, and soccer, along with a nine-hole golf course. The President's home, Longwood House, is situated on the Estate.

Longwood University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelors and masters degrees. Other accreditation includes the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education, the Virginia State Board of Education, the National Association of Schools of Theatre, and the National Association of Schools of Music. Specific program endorsements include the undergraduate Social Work Program that is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education; the undergraduate Therapeutic Recreation Program that is accredited by the National Recreation and Park Association in cooperation with the American Association for Leisure and Recreation; and the undergraduate Business Administration Program that is accredited by Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB- International).

Finally, for the tenth straight year, Longwood University was ranked among the best in the 2008 U.S. News & World Report "America's Best Colleges." The 2008 Report ranked Longwood as one of the "Top Public Universities—Master's" in the South at the #11 position. Among all Southern Universities—Master's (public and private) Longwood moved up within the top tier to position #31 from #33 in 2007. Additionally, Longwood was one of only 146 schools in the Southeast listed as a "Best Southeastern College" in the 2008 Princeton Review.

THE FARMVILLE AREA

Longwood University is located in historic Farmville, Virginia - 65 miles west of Richmond, 48 miles east of Lynchburg, and 60 miles south of Charlottesville -- the Heart of Virginia. The Town of Farmville has a population of approximately 6,800.

The Farmville Area is comprised of the town of Farmville, along with the counties of Prince Edward and Cumberland. This area serves as a retail hub and commercial activity center for eight counties of Southside Virginia and has a service market of more than 100,000 people. Education is a dominant factor in the area, with three outstanding colleges offering educational and training opportunities. In addition to Longwood University, Hampden-Sydney and Southside Virginia Community colleges are located in the area.

The Farmville Area has a diversified economy with strong manufacturing, trade, service, and agricultural sectors. Manufacturing activity centers around natural resources, textiles, and a variety of industrial and consumer goods.

The Town of Farmville is also home to the annual Heart of Virginia Festival (first Saturday in May) and many historical sites, including Appomattox Courthouse and Sailors Creek Battlefield. These points of interest make the Farmville Area a very attractive place to be. Located in and near town are churches, hotels, motels, a country club, a municipal airport, and a community hospital. Many additional points of interest are within a short distance of the Farmville area.



COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA

The Commonwealth of Virginia is one of the original 13 colonies. Named for the Virgin Queen, Elizabeth I of England, Virginia was England's first successful overseas colony and the site of the first permanent English settlement in America. West Virginia was part of Virginia until 1863.

Virginia's rich political heritage helped shape the democratic principles on which the United States was founded. Virginia played an important role in the American Revolution (1775-1783), and it entered the Union as the tenth of the original 13 states on June 25, 1788. During the American Civil War (1861-1865) the state's capital, Richmond, was also capital of the Confederacy. The state has long been nicknamed Old Dominion.

George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, and James Monroe, all Virginians, were founding fathers of the United States and were among the first five U.S. presidents. Virginia is also the birthplace of U.S. presidents William Henry Harrison, John Tyler, Zachary Taylor, and Woodrow Wilson.

Virginia is the 35th largest state in the United States, bounded on the east by the Atlantic Ocean, on the north and east by Maryland and the District of Columbia, on the west by West Virginia and Kentucky, and on the south by Tennessee and North Carolina.

According to the 2000 national census, Virginia's population was 7,078,515, ranking it 12th among the states. Virginia Beach (425,257) is one of the most popular resort destinations on the East Coast, as well as Virginia's largest city. Richmond (197,790) is the state capital and a center of banking and insurance, and of both retail and wholesale trade. The Naval Base at Norfolk (234,403) and the Naval Shipyard at Portsmouth (100,565) employ thousands of civilians and military personnel. Hampton (146,437) is important for its aviation activities such as Langley Air Force Base and a National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) facility. In Newport News (180,150) is a shipyard that builds naval ships, including air-

craft carriers. Alexandria (128,283) is part of the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. Lynchburg (65,269) is the site of light industries. Roanoke (94,911) is the largest city in western Virginia.

Civilian and military employment, mostly with the federal government, is an essential part of the Virginia economy. The Pentagon, which houses the Department of Defense, is located in Virginia and is the leading federal employer in the northern part of the state. There are also important military bases in Virginia, particularly the massive complex of army, navy, and air force bases in the vicinity of Norfolk.

Average January temperatures range from less than 32°F in the west to more than 42°F in southeastern Virginia. Average July temperatures range from more than 78°F in the southeast to less than 68°F in the western mountains. Total precipitation ranges from about 35 to more than 50 inches. Snowfalls are moderate, except in the mountain regions.

Besides Virginia, three other states - Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania - use the term common-wealth as part of their official names. The delegates to the convention in Williamsburg, when the first Constitution of Virginia was adopted on June 29, 1776, used commonwealth as the name for the new form of government. It is very likely they had in mind the Puritans' rebellion against the Crown in England more than 100 years earlier.

Pennsylvania and Massachusetts also chose to be called commonwealths after independence from Great Britain. The other 10 former colonies took the name "state," the term used in the Declaration of Independence. Kentucky was once part of Virginia. When Kentuckians joined the Union as the 15th state in 1792, it also kept the name commonwealth.

PRESIDENT

PATRICIA PICARD CORMIER

Known for her warmth, enthusiasm and dynamic personality, Dr. Cormier is now in her thirteenth year as president of Longwood University.

She has been an administrator in higher education for nearly 40 years, serving as chief academic officer at Winthrop University, in key vice presidential positions at the University of Pennsylvania where she was also an associate dean and a tenured member of the faculty, and as vice president for development and alumni relations at the Medical College of Pennsylvania.



Dr. Cormier has master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Virginia and a bachelor's degree from Boston University. Her honors include selection as one of 30 fellows nationwide to participate in the American Council on Education's fellowship program in academic administration in 1982-83, a master's degree Honoris causa from the University of Pennsylvania in 1982, election to three national honor societies, selection as a Fellow of the College of Physicians of Philadelphia, and honorary degrees from Fontbonne University and Southside Virginia Community College. She has published two highly regarded books in her field: *Community Oral Health: A Systems Approach* and *Educating the Dentists of the Future*.

In addition to her many community and collegiate responsibilities, Dr. Cormier serves as vice chair of the Lead Virginia Board, was appointed by the Governor to serve on the Information Technology Investment Board as well as the Philpott Commission and also serves on the Faculty Development Committee of the University of Virginia Medical School, and Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine Board at Drexel University. She is the past chair of the Executive Committee of the Renaissance Group, past chair of the NCAA Division II Presidents' Council, and past chair of the Council of Fellows of the American Council on Education. She served as a Commissioner on the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges, and is the past Chair of the Board of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU), a higher education organization whose membership is comprised of more than 430 colleges, universities, and systems of public higher education throughout the United States and its territories.

Dr. Cormier has worked with the campus community to develop and implement a new Mission, Vision, and Goals Statement for the University. This strategic plan for the future of Longwood is embodied in the first sentence of the Mission Statement: "Longwood University is an institution of higher learning dedicated to the development of citizen leaders who are prepared to make positive contributions to the common good of society ..."

Director of Athletics

Troy Austin

Troy Austin was appointed as the new Director of Athletics April 22, 2008 after an intensive national search. Austin had served as the interim AD at Longwood since August 2006.

Austin served in a critical role as Longwood completed the final year of its NCAA Division I Reclassification during 2006-07. He represented the department during a three-day visit to campus in September 2006 by a four-member Peer-Review Team as well as an NCAA Representative during the Division I Certification Self-Study and Evaluation process. Austin coordinated the compilation of information for the school's annual Athletics Report and Updated Strategic Plan that year as well.

Austin has supervised 14 intercollegiate athletic programs and respective coaching staffs, an administrative support staff, and operation of the Longwood Golf Course over the past two academic years. He has administered an annual budget of nearly \$6 million dollars while developing and implementing marketing strategies to brand the department. Austin has overseen facility capital upgrade projects for basketball, baseball, softball, soccer, field hockey and women's lacrosse. Prior to his appointment as interim AD, he had been the director of development for intercollegiate athletics at Longwood from October 2005 to August 2006, assisting with the department's external relations efforts, including the direction of the Lancer Club and its executive council.

Austin was the director of program development and marketing relations for the National Football League Coaches Association (NFLCA) from 2003-05. At the NFLCA, he directed the development and marketing of NFLCA programs, properties, and special events. In this capacity, Austin sought marketing partners for the NFLCA, and negotiated marketing opportunities for NFL assistant and head coaches. In addition, he oversaw the membership benefits program for the 750 active and retired NFL coaches, facilitated sponsorships with corporate partners, and served as a liaison between NFLCA and marketing partners among many other duties and responsibilities.

While pursuing his post-graduate degree at VCU (2002-03), Austin served an internship within VCU Athletics Marketing and Promotions where he contributed to the development of promotional efforts for creating and maintaining fan interest while assisting with marketing efforts to attain new sponsors. Prior to his time at VCU, he served an internship within Duke University Athletics as the Life Skills Coordinator where he directed the nationally renowned educational program, 'Verizon Read with the Blue Devils', for elementary school children.

A native of Orange, New Jersey, Austin earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in sociology, along with a certificate in markets & management from Duke where he was a four-year football letterman. A team captain as a senior, he earned the William J. Griffith Service Award and was named the team's Most Outstanding Defensive Lineman. Austin earned his Master of Science degree in sports leadership from the VCU SportsCenter.



IT'S OFFICIAL

Longwood University President Dr. Patricia P. Cormier received a letter from The NCAA dated July 11, 2007 stating that the organization's Division I Management Council Administrative Committee, acting on behalf of the Division I Management Council, has approved the recommendation from the Division I Management Council Membership Subcommittee to transfer Longwood to Division I active membership as of September 1, 2007. The Lancers competed during 2007-08 as one of three new members of NCAA Division I.

She was a four-year starter in softball for the Hokies and a three-time Academic All-American as well as the 2000 Atlantic 10 Player of the Year. Meadows is a graduate of the NACWAA/HERS Institute for Administrative Advancement and completed The Virginia Network Senior Leadership Seminar Program in 2007-08.

Assistant AD for Business Operations

Danny Sterling

Danny Sterling is in his fourth year at Longwood University during 2008-09, and in his second year as assistant athletics director for business operations after being appointed in July 2007. He also serves as a member of the department's senior management team. Sterling had been the head athletic trainer at Longwood from January 2006-07, and previously was head athletic trainer at the University of Virginia at Wise from 1995-2005, additionally serving as an assistant director of athletics at UVA-Wise from 2004-05 while assisting with the day-to-day operations of the department.



Sterling handles department budget management, oversight of travel procedures, game operations and ticket sales, the sports of field hockey along with men's and women's tennis, athletic training, and strength and conditioning. Greg Prouty is in his 16th year at Longwood University during 2008-09, and his 12th year as director of athletics media relations. He was promoted to assistant athletics director for media relations in October 2004, and is responsible for the coordination of all publicity and promotion for the 14-sport intercollegiate athletics program and its student-athletes, including administration of the athletics website while overseeing the daily operation of the office and serving as a member of the department's senior management team. Interview Policy

All Photographers must shoot from the baselines, and positions are at the judgment of the game's officials and/or the Athletics Media Relations office at all times.

Game Day Services

Parking: Media parking spaces will be available upon request on a limited basis. The media parking spaces are located in the Parking Deck, adjacent to Willett Hall, via the Redford Street entrance from Main Street. Please be sure to make your parking request when making your credential and/or photography request.

Media Services: Longwood University via the Athletics Media Relations office will provide all working media an official game program and notes, half-time box score, and a final game box score, including play-by-play scoring.

Post-Game Interviews: Head coach Kristin Caruso will be available approximately 10-minutes after each home game in the Media Room located

off the main hallway in Willett Hall. When requested, and if accommodating, visiting head coaches will be made available as well following Coach Caruso. All Interviews with requested student-athletes will take place in the Media Room approximately 20-25 minutes after each home game.
