- Longwood continues its eight-game, 12-day, three-state Spring Break road trip with a two-game stay in Spartanburg, S.C., with a pair of games at USC Upstate and Wofford Tuesday and Wednesday before heading to UNC Wilmington to round out the trip. USC Upstate played Wofford on Sunday with USC Upstate winning, 14-10.
- · Longwood is led in hitting by Michael Osinski, who is batting .333 and leads the Big South in hits (17), RBI (15), and is in the top five in runs (12), and total bases (27).
- · Justin Mitchell is tied for the team lead with a .333 average and is third in the conference in on-base percentage (.500) and second in walks (13).
- As a team Longwood leads the Big South in runs scored and RBI.

- Longwood meets USC Upstate for the first time since 1992 when the teams meet on Wednesday. The Spartans were 14-10 winners against Wednesday's opponent, Wofford.
- USC Upstate is 1-1 against Big South schools this season, winning 10-9 against UNC Asheville and losing 4-3 at Charleston Southern.
- USC Upstate has four starters hitting better than .300 on the season, led by a .396 average by junior infielder Charlie Carpenter, who has a team-high three home runs.
- J.J. Imko is second on the team with a .389 average, leading the team with nine extrabase hits and 15 RBI. Brendan Brundage is hitting .353 and Devon Ortiz is a .309 hitter.

SCOUTING WOFFORD

- Longwood meets plays Wofford for the 18th time in the series, the first since 2014, when Longwood concludes its stay in Spartanburg, S.C., Wednesday.
- Wofford is led in hitting by Brett Hash, who is hitting .319 with a team-high 10 RBI and two home runs. Hash, a senior infielder, has a hit in all 11 games for Wofford this season and went 2-for-5 with a pair of RBI and runs scored in the loss at USC Upstate.
- Alex Malsch is second on the team with a .297 batting average and has four extra-base hits.
- Starter Adam Scott has been the most effective pitcher for Wofford with 31 strikeouts to four walks on the season, but has posted a 6.89 ERA in 15.2 innings in three appearances.

GOT HEEM

 Junior right-handed pitcher Zach Potojecki made his first career Friday start at Savannah State and responded with his best career start, going 6.2 innings of shutout ball and finished one shy of the school record with 13 strikeouts.

TOP FIVE

· After finishing with the most wins since becoming a full-time Division I participant in 2008 at 32-27, and finishing tied for second in the Big South at 14-10, Longwood was picked to finish fifth in the Big South in 2017. The Lancers return their top two hitters, senior designated hitter Alex Lewis and junior shortstop Michael Osinski, who were both named to the All-Big South preseason team by Perfect Game.

ALEX THE GREAT

- After a breakout 2016, senior designated hitter Alex Lewis was named Big South All-Conference Second Team, First Team All-Region ABCA East, and All-State VaSID.
- On the season Lewis is hitting .289 (13-for-45) with a team high six extrabase hits, including his first two career triples. After hitting .250 as a freshman and .196 as a sophomore, his .369 average as a junior and .289 average this • Bastaich started every game at first year has put the senior's career average at .287 entering the week.

SAMMY THE SPARK

- Miller has been great in the lead-off role, reaching base at a rate of .412 (7-for-17) when beginning an inning. Miller leads the team with two steals.
- · Miller was money as the lead-off man in 2016. Miller reached base at a rate of .440 when leading off an inning, and led the Lancers with 40 walks and 48 runs scored, along with 19 steals.
- Miller played in a utility capacity in 2016 as the starting center fielder (28 games), left fielder (26 games), second baseman (1 game), and catcher (3 games).
- · Miller served as the primary backup catcher in 2016, and started several

games in the outfield, which he finished behind the plate.

IRON MIKE

- Junior shortstop Michael Osinski leads the team in nearly every offensive category through nine games, hitting a team-high .333 with a conference-best 15 RBI. Osinski has a team-best two home runs.
- Osinski has been the starting shortstop since early in his freshman year. Osinski started all 59 games for Longwood in 2016.

BRING HIM IN!

- Longwood leads the Big South in both runs scored (76) and RBI (69). As a team the Lancers have hit .287 (35-for-122) with runners in scoring position with three Lancers hitting better than .300 with RISP and with five or more hits.
- · Justin Mitchell is hitting .500 (6-for-12) with RISP, while Michael Osinski is hitting .389 (7-for-18), and Antwaun Tucker is hitting .313 (5-for-16).

SENIOR SEND-OFF

- Longwood graduated five seniors in 2016, Connar Bastaich, Travis Burnette, Allen Ellis, Colton Konvicka, and C.J. Roth.
- base and was second on the team with a .335 batting average and was named all-conference second team.
- Burnette was Longwood's Friday night starter and was named first team • On the season junior outfielder Sammy all-conference and second team allstate after spinning a 2.35 ERA in 99.2 innings with 85 strikeouts to 45 walks and an 8-2 record, all career bests.
 - Roth, Longwood's starting second baseman, set the record for most games played in a career at Longwood and hit his first three career home runs at Longwood. Roth works in strength and conditioning at Longwood.
 - Konvicka missed two months of the season with injuries. The converted infielder hit .276 in 34 games played.
 - Ellis made just five appearances, but was heralded for his veteran leadership in the pitching staff.

2017 BASEBALL

MIXTURE OF OLD AND NEW

- Longwood adds 13 new players to the roster after losing 12 from 2016. The Lancers bring back six starting position players and 10 of 16 pitchers from a team that made it to the Big South Championship semifinals before falling to the eventual College World Champion Coastal Carolina Chanticleers.
- Of the 13 newcomers, nine are freshmen, with three of the other five coming by way of junior college and the other two Division I transfers.
- 10 of the newbies made their debuts in the series at Elon and freshman right-handed pitcher Travis Riley got the start Tuesday against James Madison.
- Longwood has leaned on the newcomers in 2017, with as many as five of Longwood's starting nine. Freshmen Nate Blakeney, Joey Mendez, and Grant Keller have found their way into the starting lineup, while junior college transfers Justin Mitchell and Ryan Shull have held down starting positions.

ARMS RACE

- Longwood returns 10 pitchers from last season, seven of whom made at least one start in 2016.
- Longwood's top returning starter is sophomore Steven Farkas, who went 3-4 with a 4.79 ERA in 18 appearances, 12 starts. As a freshman, the lefty tossed 67.2 innings and struck out 59 batters with 36 walks. The lefty posted a 2.93 ERA through the first two months of the season, which was top-10 in the Big South at the time. Farkas has not pitched yet this season due to injury.
- Senior right-hander Luke Simpson made 13 appearances, 12 starts, in 2016 with a 1-4 record and 5.30 ERA in 52.2 innings and struck out 34 batters. Simpson is expected to be used primarily as a relief pitcher this season.
- Senior righty Devin Gould was primarily used in the back-end of the bullpen in 2016, posting a 3.10 ERA and 2-1 record in 15 appearances with one start and picked up three saves with 30 strikeouts against 17 walks in 29.0 innings pitched.

BULLISH 'PEN

- The Longwood bullpen did its job in 2016, picking up 19 saves, topped only by the College World Series champion, Coastal Carolina, which ended its season with 21. Of 184 inherited base runners only 71 scored (61 percent stranded). Longwood had a bullpen ERA of 4.49 and had 192 strikeouts with 120 walks in 242.2 innings.
- As a sophomore, left-hander
 Michael Catlin made a team-high 25
 appearances, tied with right-hander
 Cody Boydstun, who was a freshman at the time. Catlin returns with the lowest
 ERA among pitchers with a 3.00 ERA and went 4-0 in 51.0 innings pitched.
- Boydstun was the primary closer for the first half of the season, picking up five saves and had 24 strikeouts in 33.1 innings pitched.

I'LL BE GOOD BY THE WEEKEND

- Longwood put together a starting rotation of Cody Wager, Devin Gould, and Tyler Wirsu at Elon. Those three combined started nine games in 2016. Longwood inserted Zach Potojecki into this weekend's rotation.
- Longwood anticipates the return possible starters Mitchell Kuebbing and Steven Farkas soon, neither of whom have pitched this season. Kuebbing missed 2016 due to injury.

STAY RIGHT WHERE YOU ARE!

• Longwood led the Big South with 21 runners picked off in 2016, helping to control the running game. Travis Burnette was third in the conference with five pick-offs in 2016, while Ryan Jones led the league with eight.

BREAKING RECORDS

- Longwood had a number of records set in 2016, winning 32 games, 14 in conference, and 21 at home, all the most since Longwood became a fulltime Division I participant in 2008.
 Longwood's second-place finish is the best since joining the Big South in 2013.
- Alex Lewis set the record for hits in a season (86) in 2016.
- As a team Longwood set the records for hits (540) and fielding percentage (.966) in 2016.

KEEP IMPROVING

- Improvement was a key part of 2016 for Longwood baseball as the Lancers saw an increase of 10 wins overall and five conference victories.
- Senior pitcher Travis Burnette, a former outfielder at Longwood, made the biggest jump among pitchers in 2016, transforming from a swing man between the rotation and bullpen in 2015 into a bonafide ace as a senior.
- Burnette received first team All-Big South and second team all-region (ABCA East) and second team allstate (VaSID) honors. Burnette was third in the Big South with a 2.35 ERA and finished in the top 10 in batting average against, innings pitched, and strikeouts.
- As a junior, Alex Lewis made a jump of 176 points to his batting average, hitting .369 in 2016. Lewis was a second team all-conference selection and was first team all-state and all-region. Lewis made jumps in hits (86, +58), runs (35, +23), doubles (22, +12), home runs (5, +3), and RBI (45, +33) from his junior year. Lewis finished in the top five in the Big South in hits, average, and doubles.

YEAR NUMBER THREE

- Ryan Mau returns for his third season as Longwood's head baseball coach in 2017. Longwood finished 22-34 in Mau's first season, stepping up to a 32-27 mark in year two. The Lancers made it to the Big South tournament for the second consecutive year in 2016, playing their way to the championship semifinals before falling to the Coastal Carolina Chanticleers, who went on to win the College World Series.
- Longwood returns 18 letter winners, 10 pitchers, and five starting position players from last year's squad, while adding 13 players, eight freshmen.

KEEPING UP WITH LONGWOOD

 Longwood will play select home and road games on the Big South Network in 2017. Five regular season games and the entire conference tournament will be on radio on WVHL 92.9 FM Farmville, with second-year play-by-play man Darius Thigpen calling the action.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

- Former Lancer stars right-handed pitcher Aaron Myers and outfield Kyri Washington left their marks on the Longwood baseball program with Washington leading the Big South in home runs in 2016 and Myers setting the Longwood school records in strikeouts, saves, and innings pitched. Both players have moved on to play professional baseball, where they join former Lancer arm, right-handed pitcher Mark Montgomery.
- Myers is slated to attend Minor League Spring Training in Arizona for the Milwaukee Brewers, his third season in the organization after signing with as a non-drafted free agent in 2015. Myers pitched with the Rookie League AZL Brewers in 2015 and posted a 1.74 ERA in seven appearances out of the bullpen and picked up three saves in three opportunities with 14 strikeouts and no walks across 10.1 innings of work. In 2016 Myers went 4-1 with a 1.44 ERA across 43.2 innings pitched with 55 strikeouts to 11 walks. The right-hander began with the AZL Brewers and was called up to the Helena Brewers of the Pioneer League, where he spent the majority of his season. With the Helena Brewers Myers went 3-1 in 11 appearances with 11.38 ERA and struck out 44 batters with seven walks in 32.2 innings pitched. Myers is on pace to begin his 2017 season in Single-A.
- The Newport News, Va., native finished his Longwood career with a 2.93 ERA across 338.0 career innings with 319 strikeouts to just 113 walks.
- Washington only played three years at Longwood, but made a strong impact and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 23rd round of the 2015 draft. Washington began his pro career in Rookie Ball with the GCL Red Sox before making it to Short Season A-Ball with the Lowell Spinners. Between the two levels Washington hit .263 with nine doubles, one triple, 22 RBI, and his first professional home run in 2015.
- In 2016 Washington had massive success with the Greenville Drive of the South Atlantic League, where he spent the entire season. Washington

- was voted Greenville Drive player of the year after hitting .262 with 16 home runs, 45 extra-base hits, and 73 RBI in 103 games played. In his first full professional season Washington ended the season with a .487 slugging percentage and .810 OPS.
- The Prospect, Va., native hit .263 with 28 career home runs, 44 doubles, two triples and 123 career RBI for the Blue & White.
- Montgomery, a native of Williamsburg, Va., has spent his entire six-year career in the New York Yankees organization since the Yankees took him in the 11th round of the 2011 draft. Montgomery posted a 2.56 ERA in 33 appearances, all out of the bullpen, between Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Trenton in 2016 and owns a career 2.33 ERA. Montgomery struck out 63 batters with 22 walks in 45.2 innings of work in 2016 and was a part of the Triple-A Champion Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders.

WE'LL SEE YOU NEXT YEAR!

- Ryan Mau announced the signing of seven recruits to their national letters of intent during the early signing period.
- Mau's third class features three players from the Virginia and Washington, D.C., area including the top player from the D.C. area, right-hander Maceo Campbell.
