LANCER LEADOFF

- Longwood enters the week off a series loss to Presbyterian, the first place team in the conference. Longwood is in a stretch in which it plays the top four squads in four straight weekends.
- For his complete game and 13 strikeouts in the win against the Blue Hose Thursday, Cody Wager has been named Big South Pitcher of the Week.
- Wager has won the award twice this season, winning the award March 20.
- Sammy Miller is the top hitter on the squad with a .322 average and paces the team with 14 steals.
- Miller had a great game at UVA in 2016, going 3-for-3 with two runs scored, two walks, finishing a homer shy of the cycle.
- Longwood leads the conference with 330 strikeouts. Longwood is on pace for 533 strikeouts in 55 games, which would set a school record, and is eighth in the NCAA with 9.9 strikeouts per nine innings.

SCOUTING No. 13 VIRGINIA

- Longwood and Virginia meet for the fourth straight season in Charlottesville for a single game in the Longwood-UVA series. Longwood has lost nine straight games to the Cavaliers, last winning, 2-1, in 1984. In last year's loss, Longwood committed a season-high five errors.
- After finishing second-place in the Coastal division of the ACC last year, the Cavaliers enter the week second in the Coastal with a 10-8 conference record.
- Virginia leads the ACC with a .326 team batting average and is second with an .888 team OPS. Virginia is second in the ACC with 297 runs scored.
- The Cavaliers are seventh in the nation in batting average and tied with Longwood for 33rd in the country with 12 triples.
- Junior outfielder and left-handed pitcher Adam Haseley leads the ACC with a .406 batting average, good for 17th nationally. Haseley is in the top 10 in the ACC in slugging (2nd, .699), OBP (2nd, .506), runs scored (1st, 47), hits (3rd, 58), home runs (5th, 11), and total bases (3rd, 100). Haseley is also a weekend starter and is 5-1 on the mound with a 3.31 ERA in 54.1 innings across nine starts.
- Projected UVA starter, sophomore right-hander Evan Sperling, makes his eighth start of the season Tuesday and 11th overall appearance. In 31.0 innings, Sperling has posted a 6.68 ERA and a 3-2 record with 32 strikeouts with 19 walks issued. Sperling has an impressive .209 batting average against.
- Pavin Smith is second on the team with 10 home runs and is third in the ACC, sixth in the nation with 50 RBI. Smith is 10th in the ACC with a .604 slugging percentage.
- UVA has seven hitters with 30 or more games played hitting better than .290. Haseley (.406), Sameron Simmons (.378), Robbie Coman (.373), Smith (.349), Ernie Clement (.317), Jake McCarthy (.299), and Nate Eikhoff (.293) are the top hitters in the gauntlet that is the Cavalier lineup.

GOT HEEM

- Zach Potojecki struck out a career-best 13 batters at Savannah State on 3/3, one shy of the school record for a single game. Potojecki struck out 10 at Gardner-Webb on 4/9.
- Cody Wager struck out a career-high 10 batters at UNC Wilmington 3/11 and was magical again with 10 strikeouts in 8.1 shutout innings vs. Charleston Southern 3/18, taking a no-hitter two outs into the eighth. Wager then struck out 13 batters in a complete game win against Presbyterian 4/13.
- Longwood leads the Big South with 330 strikeouts on the season.
- Wager leads the Big South with 56 strikeouts and Potojecki is second with 55. Potojecki is 10th in the country with 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Longwood is eighth in the country with 9.9 strikeouts per nine innings as a team.

I GOT FIVE ON IT

- After finishing with the most wins since becoming a full-time Division I participant in 2008 at 32-27, and finishing tied for second in the Big South at 14-10 in 2016, Longwood was picked to finish fifth in the Big South in 2017
- The Lancers return their top two hitters, senior designated hitter Alex Lewis and junior shortstop Michael Osinski, who were both named preseason All-Big South Perfect Game.

ALEX THE GREAT

- After a breakout 2016, senior Alex Lewis was named Big South All-Conference Second Team, First Team All-Region ABCA East, and All-State VaSID after hitting .369 with five home runs, 45 RBI, and 22 doubles, setting the school single-season record with 86 hits. Lewis finished third in the Big South preseason player of the year vote.

SAMMY THE SPARK

- Junior outfielder Sammy Miller has been great in the lead-off role, reaching base at a rate of .405 (17-for-42) when leading off an inning. Miller is second in the conference, 30th in the NCAA, with 15 stolen bases. Miller is 23rd in the country with 0.50 stolen bases per game.

IRON MIKE

- Junior shortstop Michael Osinski got off to a hot start leading the conference in RBI for the first two months. Osinski is currently eighth in the conference with 28 RBI.
- Osinski has been the starting shortstop since early in his freshman year. Osinski started all 59 games for Longwood in 2016.

CAT DADDY!

- Longwood junior left-hander Michael Catlin has put together a solid campaign, serving as the go-to bullpen arm for the Lancers and has been one of the toughest pitchers to face in the league.
- Catlin is 49th in the NCAA with 6.19 hits allowed per nine innings and 49th with a 1.98 ERA. He leads the Big South in ERA, has a league-low .195 batting average against, is eighth in the league with two saves, and has allowed league-lows 25 hits, 12 runs, and no home runs, in 36.1 innings of work across 16 appearances.

HE'S HEADED FOR THIRD!

- Longwood leads the Big South and is 33rd in the country in triples with 12 as a team in 2017. Longwood finished 2016 with five triples.
- Longwood is led in triples by Antwaun Tucker, who leads the Big South and is sixth in the NCAA with five. Alex Lewis and Sammy Miller are second on the squad with two each.

PLACE YOUR WAGER!

- Cody Wager picked up his second Big South Pitcher of the Week honors on April 17. Wager won his first of the season on March 20.
- On 4/13 against Presbyterian Wager went the distance, spinning a complete game and picking up the win in Longwood's 2-1 walk-off victory. Wager struck out a career-high 13 batters and retired the final 11 hitters of the game. Wager did not allow an earned run in the win.
- On 3/18 against Charleston Southern, Wager came within four outs of a no-hitter, striking out 10 batters in 8.1 innings of three-hit, shutout ball.

SENIOR SEND-OFF

- Longwood graduated five seniors in 2016, Connor Bastaich, Travis Burnette, Allen Ellis, Colton Konvicka, and C.J. Roth.
- Bastaich started every game at first base and was second on the team with a .335 batting average and was named all-conference second team.
- Burnette was Longwood's Friday night starter and was named first team all-conference and second team all-state after spinning a 2.35 ERA in 99.2 innings with 85 strikeouts to 45 walks and an 8-2 record, all career bests.
- Roth, Longwood's starting second baseman, set the record for most games played in a career at Longwood and hit his first three career home runs at Longwood. Roth works in strength and conditioning at Longwood.
- Konvicka missed two months of the season with injuries. The converted infielder hit .276 in 34 games played.
- Ellis made just five appearances, but was heralded for his veteran leadership in the pitching staff.

CHAMPIONS FROM THE START

- Freshmen Nate Blakeney, Tyler Morgan, John Gregory, and Joey Mendez all won state championships in 2016, their senior seasons in high school.
- Blakeney led Wesleyan Christian Academy (High Point, N.C.) to the NCISAA 3-A State Championship with a 2-for-3 game and grand slam in the title game. Blakeney was an all-area first team selection by the Greensboro News & Record.
- Morgan picked up the save in Hanover's (Mechanicsburg, Va.) 13-12 title game win to clinch the Virginia 4A State Championship.
- Gregory, Morgan's teammate at Hanover, went 2-for-4 with an RBI in the title game and was an all-conference first team selection in the regular season.
- Mendez, an all-state preseason selection at Riverdale Baptist (Upper Marlboro, Md.), led the team to its second consecutive NACA Division I Championship.

BULLISH 'PEN

- The Longwood bullpen did its job in 2016, picking up 19 saves, topped only in the Big South by College WorldSeries champion Coastal Carolina, which ended its season with 21. Of 184 inherited base runners only 71 scored (61 percent stranded).
- As a sophomore, left-hander Michael Catlin made a team-high 25 appearances, tied with right-hander Cody Boydston, who was a freshman at the time. Catlin returns with the lowest ERA among pitchers with a 3.00 ERA and went 4-0 in 51.0 innings pitched.
- Boydston was the primary closer for the first half of the season, picking up five saves and had 24 strikeouts in 33.1 innings pitched.

I'LL BE GOOD BY THE WEEKEND

- Longwood put out a starting rotation of Cody Wager, Devin Gould, and Tyler Wirsu to begin the year. Those three combined started nine games in 2016. Longwood inserted Zach Potojecki in the series at Savannah State.
- Steven Farkas joined the rotation in mid-March, while Mitchell Kuebbing is also a potential starter. Both missed the first month of the season due to injury. Farkas made his first start with 3.0 innings on an innings limit 3/25 at Radford. Kuebbing missed 2016 due to injury and has not appeared in 2017.

STAY RIGHT WHERE YOU ARE!

- Longwood led the Big South with 21 runners picked off in 2016, helping to control the running game. Devin Gould and Michael Catlin lead the 2017 squad with two pickoffs each.

BREAKING RECORDS

- Longwood had a number of records set in 2016, winning 32 games, 14 in conference, and 21 at home, all the most since Longwood became a full-time Division I participant in 2008. Longwood's second-place finish is the best since joining the Big South in 2013.
- Alex Lewis set the record for hits in a season (86) in 2016.
- As a team Longwood set the single-season school records for hits (540) and fielding percentage (.966) in 2016.

YEAR NUMBER THREE

• Ryan Mau returns for his third season as Longwood's head baseball coach in 2017. Longwood finished 22-34 in Mau's first season, stepping up to a 32-27 mark in year two. The Lancers made it to the Big South tournament for the second consecutive year in 2016, playing their way to the championship semifinals before falling to the Coastal Carolina Chanticleers, who went on to win the College World Series.

KEEPING UP WITH LONGWOOD

• Longwood will play select home and road games on the Big South Network in 2017. Five regular season games and the entire conference tournament will be on radio on WVHL 92.9 FM Farmville, with second-year play-by-play man Darius Thigpen calling the action.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

• Former Lancer stars right-handed pitcher Aaron Myers and outfielder Kyri Washington left their marks on the Longwood baseball program with Washington leading the Big South in home runs in 2015 and Myers setting the Longwood school records in strikeouts, saves, and innings pitched. Both players have moved on to play professional baseball, where they join former Lancer arm, right-handed pitcher Mark Montgomery.

• Myers was promoted prior to the start of the season and begins 2017 with the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers, the Class A (Low-A) affiliate of the Brewers.

• Myers is in his third season in the organization after signing as a non-drafted free agent in 2015. Myers pitched with the Rookie League AZL Brewers in 2015 and posted a 1.74 ERA in seven appearances out of the bullpen and picked up three saves in three opportunities with 14 strikeouts and no walks across 10.1 innings of work. In 2016 Myers went 4-1 with a 1.44 ERA across 43.2 innings pitched with 55 strikeouts to 11 walks. The right-hander began with the AZL Brewers and was called up to the Helena Brewers of the Pioneer League, where he spent the majority of his season. With the Helena Brewers Myers went 3-1 in 11

appearances with 11.38 ERA and struck out 44 batters with seven walks in 32.2 innings pitched.

• The Newport News, Va., native finished his Longwood career with a 2.93 ERA across 338.0 career innings with 319 strikeouts to just 113 walks.

• Washington, the number 22 prospect in the Red Sox system according to MLB Pipeline, was promoted to the Class A Advanced Salem Red Sox before the start of the season and sits one level below Double-A.

• Washington only played three years at Longwood, but made a strong impact and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 23rd round of the 2015 draft. Washington began his pro career in Rookie Ball with the GCL Red Sox before making it to Short Season A-Ball with the Lowell Spinners. Between the two levels Washington hit .263 with nine doubles, one triple, 22 RBI, and his first professional home run in 2015.

• In 2016 Washington had massive success with the Greenville Drive of the South Atlantic League, where he spent the entire season. Washington was voted Greenville Drive player of the year after hitting .262 with 16 home runs, 45 extra-base hits, and 73 RBI in 103 games played. In his first full professional season Washington ended the season with a .487 slugging percentage and .810 OPS.

• The Prospect, Va., native hit .263 with 28 career home runs, 44 doubles, two triples and 123 career RBI for the Blue & White.

• Montgomery signed a minor league deal with the St. Louis Cardinals April 3 and begins the season in Triple-A with the Memphis Redbirds.

• Montgomery, a native of Williamsburg, Va., spent his first six years in the New York Yankees organization after the Yankees took him in the 11th round of the 2011 draft. Montgomery posted a 2.56 ERA in 33 appearances, all out of the bullpen, between Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Trenton in 2016 and owns a career 2.33 ERA. Montgomery struck out 63 batters with 22 walks in 45.2 innings of work in 2016 and was a part of the Triple-A Champion Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders.

WE'LL SEE YOU NEXT YEAR!

• Ryan Mau announced the signing of seven recruits to their national letters of intent during the early signing period.

• Mau's third full recruiting class features three players from the Virginia and Washington, D.C., area including the top player from the D.C. area, right-hander Maceo Campbell. Right-handed pitchers Tommy Green and Tyler Knapp round out the haul of local talent, while left-handed pitcher Daniel Brandon (West Virginia), outfielder Jack Schnell (New York), Todd Moxey (Pennsylvania), and infielder Kaleb Fold (Ohio) represent four other states to bring a larger national presence to the signing class.
