• Longwood enters the matchup prepared for its first midweek game of the year and the first of two against MEAC opponent N.C. Central.

• After a rough weekend against Auburn, Longwood put together a solid weekend against Niagara, led by a pair of one-run wins in the series.

• Nate Blakeney leads Longwood with a .409 batting average as the only Lancer starter above .300 through the first six games of the season. Blakeney hit .500 in the weekend series against Niagara.

• Tyler Morgan has been a go-to pitcher out of the bullpen, posting a team-best 2.25 ERA in a team-high three appearances and sports a 1-0 record.

- Off to a 5-2 start in the first two weeks of action, N.C. Central rides into Farmville with consecutive winning weekends against Wagner and NJIT.
- N.C. Central has five players on the MEAC Preseason All-Conference teams: sophomore second baseman Corey Joyce is on the first team while senior pitcher Devin Sweet, senior pitcher Justice Sampson, senior shortstop Dominic Cuevas, and sophomore outfielder Carter Williams are all on the second team.
- N.C. Central is led by six players hitting better than .300 with Ryan Decker (.800, 4-for-5), Joyce (.423, 11-for-26), Andrew Valichka (.346, 9-for-26), Timmy Fischvogt (.333, 5-for-15), Zach Michalski (.308, 8-for-26), and Cuevas (.300, 6-for-20).
- Joyce paces the squad with three home runs and 10 RBI with three doubles, putting up an .885 slugging percentage.
- N.C. Central has also gotten some solid pitching with six players who have tossed 3.0 innings or more with ERAs of 4.00 or lower. Austin Vernon (0.00 ERA, 3.0 IP), Nick Caregnato (2.70 ERA, 3.1 IP), Sampson (2.70 ERA, 6.2 IP), Chris Kernen (3.18 ERA, 5.2 IP), Jonathan Figueroa (3.27 ERA, 11.0 IP), and Jake McCort (3.27 ERA, 11.0 IP).
- Sweet has a 4.97 ERA and is 1-0 with 16 strikeouts in 12.2 innings across three starts.

SAMMY THE SPARK

- Senior outfielder Sammy Miller was great in the lead-off role in 2017, reaching base at a rate of .382 (26-for-68) when leading off an inning.
- Miller leads Longwood in 2018 with seven walks drawn.

ATTA BOYD

- In just his second career start junior right-hander Cody Boydston put together a gem, tossing 7.2 innings against Niagara on February 24. Boydston struck out eight batters with two earned runs allowed, setting career highs in punchouts and innings pitched.

WALK-OFF THIS WAY

- Longwood won via walk-off for the first time in 2018 when Nate Blakeney plated pinch-runner Scott Carter on the first pitch with the bases loaded in the second game of a doubleheader against Niagara on February 24.
- The Lancers had a pair of walk-off wins in 2017. Michael Osinski ripped a walk-off home run against Winthrop in the first game of a doubleheader on April 21, 2017.
- Blakeney provided his first-career walkoff in the first game of a doubleheader against Lehigh on May 6, 2018.

TAKE A CHANO FOR THREE

- Sophomore shortstop Antwaun Tucker picked up his eighth career triple against Niagara on February 24. His eight triples have him inside the top 10 for triples in a career at Longwood, tied for eighth place with three others.
- Tucker led the Big South and finished seventh in the NCAA in 2017 with seven triples.
- The seven triples were the second most in a single season in program history and the most in the Division I era.

BAPTIZED IN FIRE

- 11 Lancers made their Longwood debuts in the weekend series at Auburn, with eight freshmen and three transfers getting into the action on the road against an SEC opponent.
- Junior outfielder Jawan McAllister, a transfer from Pittsburgh, made his

Longwood debut, starting all three games and going 2-for-8 in the series.

- Eli Mercado, a transfer from Olive-Harvey College, started all three games in the weekend series and scored Longwood's lone run Saturday.
- Freshman outfielder Jack Schnell picked up his first career hit at Auburn, starting all three games of the series.
- Junior outfielder Eric Crain, a transfer from Morehead State, picked up three at-bats off the bench.
- Freshman outfielder Jake Jansen entered Saturday's game as a defensive replacement and picked up his first career at-bat against Auburn.
- Freshman right-hander Tyler Knapp made his Longwood debut out of the bullpen Saturday, tossing a scoreless inning in relief.
- Freshman righty Tommy Green was called upon Friday and struck out five batters in 2.0 innings of work.
- Freshman right-hander Maceo Campbell made his collegiate debut Saturday at Auburn, lasting 1.2 innings.
- Todd Moxey, a freshman right-hander, made his first career appearance Saturday at Auburn.
- Freshman southpaw Daniel Brandon made his Longwood debut on the road at Auburn in Saturday's game two.

CALL FROM THE HALL

- It was hardly a bold move when legendary Longwood baseball coach Charles "Buddy" Bolding was inducted into the Longwood Athletics Hall of Fame February 3, 2018, becoming the sixth representative of Longwood baseball to join the Hall of Fame.
- Coach Bolding's name is synonymous with Longwood baseball, having built the program from the ground and carrying the flag as Longwood transitioned from Division III all the way to its first season in the Big South in 2013, his final at the helm.
- Bolding amassed a 953-544-4 record during his career as head coach and took Longwood to the Division II College World Series in 1982 and again in 1992.
- Under Bolding Longwood made six NCAA Division II Regionals.

CALL FROM THE HALL (CONT)

- His 953 career wins are the most of any Longwood coach in nearly 100 years of Longwood athletics history.
- During Bolding's 35-year tenure he coached five All-Americans, nine Major League Baseball Draft Picks, and six Virginia College Players of the Year. The program also produced four Academic All-Americans during Bolding's career, which are also the most of any Longwood program.
- Bolding joins five other Longwood baseball honorees in the Longwood Athletics Hall of Fame.
- Michael Tucker, uncle of Antwaun Tucker, was inducted in 2005.
- Dennis Hale was inducted in 2007.
- The entire 1991 College World Series team was inducted in 2011.
- Kelvin Davis was inducted in 2016.
- The entire 1982 College World Series team was also inducted in 2016.
- Bolding, after whom the Longwood baseball stadium was named in 2009, is retired to Roanoke, Va., where he lives with his wife, Andrea.

#WINNING

- Sophomores Nate Blakeney, Tyler Morgan, John Gregory, and Joey Mendez all won state championships in 2016, their senior seasons in high school.
- Blakeney led Wesleyan Christian Academy (High Point, N.C.) to the NCISAA 3-A State Championship with a 2-for-3 game and grand slam in the title game. Blakeney was an all-area first team selection by the Greensboro News & Record.
- Morgan picked up the save in Hanover's (Mechanicsburg, Va.) 13-12 title game win to clinch the Virginia 4A State Championship.
- Gregory, Morgan's teammate at Hanover, went 2-for-4 with an RBI in the title game and was an all-conference first team selection.
- Mendez, an all-state preseason selection at Riverdale Baptist (Upper Marlboro, Md.), led the team to its second consecutive NACA Division I Championship.

BREAKING RECORDS

- Longwood had a number of records set in 2016, winning 32 games, 14 in conference, and 21 at home, all the most since Longwood became a full-time Division I participant in 2008. Longwood's second-place finish is the best since joining the Big South in 2013.
- Alex Lewis set the record for hits in a season (86) in 2016.
- As a team Longwood set the single-season school records for hits (540) and fielding percentage (.966) in 2016.
- In 2017 Longwood set the school record with strikeouts, punching out 511 batters for the year.

GOT HEEM

- Zach Potojecki struck out a career-best 13 batters at Savannah State on 3/3/17, one shy of the school record for a single game. Potojecki was second on the team with three 10-strikeout games.
- Cody Wager struck out 10 batters at UNC Wilmington 3/11/17 and was magical again with 10 strikeouts in 8.1 shutout innings vs. Charleston Southern 3/18/17, taking a no-hitter two outs into the eighth. Wager then struck out a career-high 13 batters in a complete game win against Presbyterian 4/13/17. Wager led the squad with four 10-strikeout games.
- Longwood led the Big South with 511 punchouts, breaking the previous school D-I record of 440 in 2015.
- Wager led the Big South with 91 strikeouts and Potojecki was third with 82. Potojecki was 16th in the nation with 11.71 strikeouts per nine innings, right behind Auburn's Casey Mize (11.73).
- Longwood was 3rd in the country with 9.9 strikeouts per nine innings as a team in 2017.

KEEPING UP WITH LONGWOOD

• Longwood will play select home and road games on the Big South Network in 2018. Four regular season games and the entire conference tournament will be on radio on WVHL 92.9 FM Farmville, with third-year play-by-play man Darius Thigpen calling the action.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

• Former Lancer stars right-handed pitcher Aaron Myers, outfielder Kyri Washington, and Michael Osinski each left their marks on the Longwood baseball program with Osinski leading the 2017 team in hitting, Washington leading the Big South in home runs in 2015, and Myers setting the Longwood school records in strikeouts, saves, and innings pitched. Each player has moved on to play professional baseball, where they join former Lancer arm, right-handed pitcher Mark Montgomery.

• Myers was promoted prior to the start of the season and begins 2017 with the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers, the Class A (Low-A) affiliate of the Brewers.

• Myers is in his third season in the organization after signing as a non-drafted free agent in 2015. Myers pitched with the Rookie League AZL Brewers in 2015 and posted a 1.74 ERA in seven appearances out of the bullpen and picked up three saves in three opportunities with 14 strikeouts and no walks across 10.1 innings of work. In 2016 Myers went 4-1 with a 1.44 ERA across 43.2 innings pitched with 55 strikeouts to 11 walks. The right-hander began with the AZL Brewers and was called up to the Helena Brewers of the Pioneer League, where he spent the majority of his season. With the Helena Brewers Myers went 3-1 in 11 appearances with a 1.38 ERA and struck out 44 batters with seven walks in 32.2 innings pitched.

• The Newport News, Va., native finished his Longwood career with a 2.93 ERA across 338.0 career innings with 319 strikeouts to just 113 walks.

• Washington, the number 22 prospect in the Red Sox system according to MLB Pipeline, was promoted to the Class A Advanced Salem Red Sox before the start of the season and sits

one level below Double-A.

• Washington only played three years at Longwood, but made a strong impact and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 23rd round of the 2015 draft. Washington began his pro career in Rookie Ball with the GCL Red Sox before making it to Short Season A-Ball with the Lowell Spinners. Between the two levels Washington hit .263 with nine doubles, one triple, 22 RBI, and his first professional home run in 2015.

• In 2016 Washington had massive success with the Greenville Drive of the South Atlantic League, where he spent the entire season. Washington was voted Greenville Drive player of the year after hitting .262 with 16 home runs, 45 extra-base hits, and 73 RBI in 103 games played. In his first full professional season Washington ended the season with a .487 slugging percentage and .810 OPS.

• The Prospect, Va., native hit .263 with 28 career home runs, 44 doubles, two triples and 123 career RBI for the Blue & White.

• Montgomery signed a minor league deal with the St. Louis Cardinals April 3 and begins the season in Triple-A with the Memphis Redbirds.

• Montgomery, a native of Williamsburg, Va., spent his first six years in the New York Yankees organization after the Yankees took him in the 11th round of the 2011 draft. Montgomery posted a 2.56 ERA in 33 appearances, all out of the bullpen, between Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Trenton in 2016 and owns a career 2.33 ERA. Montgomery struck out 63 batters with 22 walks in 45.2 innings of work in 2016 and was a part of the Triple-A Champion Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders.

• Osinski was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in 2017, Boston's 31st-round pick in the June First-Year Player Draft. After just three games in the Gulf Coast League, the rookie received his first professional advancement on July 2.

• Osinski was a consistent player at Longwood, hitting .298 in three seasons, playing 163 games with 161 starts as the everyday shortstop for the Lancers. Osinski made the 2016 Big South All-Tournament team and was

selected to Perfect Game's 2017 All-Big South Preseason Team. Osinski led Longwood with a .308 batting average, 14 doubles, and 36 RBI in his junior season.

• In his first professional season, Osinski hit .259 in 44 games with 11 extra-base hits and 14 RBI. Osinski was a .261 hitter with Lowell after becoming an everyday player in the New York-Penn League.

WELCOME TO THE WOOD!

• The Lancers added seven freshmen to the roster for 2017, highlighting one of the deepest recruiting classes under fourth-year head coach Ryan Mau.

• Mau's third full recruiting class features three players from the Virginia and Washington, D.C., area including the top player from the D.C. area, right-hander Maceo Campbell. Right-handed pitchers Tommy Green and Tyler Knapp round out the haul of local talent, while left-handed pitcher Daniel Brandon (West Virginia), outfielder Jack Schnell (New York), Todd Moxey (Pennsylvania), and infielder Kaleb Fold (Ohio) represent four other states to bring a larger national presence to the signing class.
