THE OPENING TIP

- Longwood prepares to play the Duquesne Dukes on Wednesday morning at 11 a.m. in Willett Hall as the second game in the teams two game homestand.
- The difficult non-conference schedule continues for Longwood with an Atlantic 10 match up, being the first time the two teams have met in history.
- The Dukes struggled in the 2020-21 season only going 4-7 in conference play, 5-11 overall, but prior to this past spring, the Dukes have an average of 19 wins per season over the last 12 years.
- Longwood finished a program-best third in the Big South behind 12 conference wins, also a program record since joining the league.
- Following this game, the Lancers hit the road for almost a month playing six more of its non-conference match ups.
- McMakin, Akila Smith, and Tra'Dayja Smith are all averaging double digits after the first two games of the season.

LAST TIME OUT

- Gigi Gonzalez and Anastasia Warren combined for 49 points to power Stony Brook past Longwood 82-63 on Friday afternoon in Willett Hall.
- Akila Smith, a preseason all-conference selection in the Big South, led the charge on offense with 18 points for the Lancers and was one of three players who scored double digits.
- Tra'Dayja Smith earned her second double-double as a Lancer with 10 points and 11 assists.
- Adriana Shipp came off the bench with a hot hand hitting back-to-back-to-back 3-pointers late in the second quarter. Shipp scored 12 points, going 4-6 from 3-point range.
- After halftime, the Lancers made a run to close the gap to two points. It was back-to-back threes off the hand of freshman Kennedy Calhoun that trimmed the lead to 47-45. Warren had the answer for Stony Brook, scoring nine of the team's final 11 to push the lead back to seven to end the quarter.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Longwood returns a wealth of experience, with eight players returning from last season's third-place team that put together one of the top season's in the programs Division I history.
- Of those eight players, the team sees 92 percent of its scoring and 89 percent of its minutes return, including its top five scorers and all five starters.
- That core group led the Big South in scoring in conference games, averaging 71.8 points per game in 18 conference contests..
- Akila Smith and Kyla McMakin were both selected to the All-Big South Preseason First Team, the first time Longwood has had two players selected to the conference preseason first team.
- Smith was also named to the Her Hoop Stats Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Award Preseason Watch List after a season that saw her set the program career, single season and single game block records.
- Guard Kyla McMakin, a two-time All-Big South First Team selection over her first two seasons at Longwood, became the fastest player to tally 1,000 points in program history. She surpassed the mark in the team's 83-69 win over UNC Asheville in her 54th career game for Longwood. In the process, McMakin became the 23rd player to reach the milestone.
- McMakin also became the first Lancer to lead the Big South in scoring in back-to-back seasons. She averaged 18.8 points per game as a freshman and 17.9 per game as a sophomore, both the top mark in the conference.
- Point guard Tra'Dayja Smith led the Big South in assists per game for a second straight season, posting an average of 5.4 helpers per contest while directing traffic for the top scoring unit in the Big South for a second straight season.
- In her two seasons as a Lancer, Smith has two of the top 10 single-season assist totals. Her 188 assists set the single-season record in 2019-20, and she followed it up with 135 over 25 games in 2020-21.

LONGWOOD WOMEN SELECTED 3RD

- In a poll of Big South head coaches, Longwood women's basketball was selected 3rd in the preseason poll, the highest preseason ranking for the team since joining the Big South.
- The Lancers finished a program-best third with 12 conference wins, also a program best, last season. They beat every team they played in conference action at least once, including High Point.

Notes

- Longwood and Duquesne are meeting for the first time in team history.
- The Lancers finished third in the Big South last season, while the Dukes had a conference record of 4-7, and came in ninth overall.
- The Dukes are ranked in the 9th slot in the A10 preseason poll.
- From 2009-2018 the Dukes made 10 straight postseason appearances, including one trip to the NCAA Tournament, and nine to the WNIT.

SEASON OF FIRSTS

- Longwood pulled off a number of program firsts in the 2020-21 season. The team finished third in the Big South standings, the team's highest finish since joining the league in 2012-13.
- In addition, the Lancers won 12 conference games, easily surpassing the previous best of eight done in 2012-13 and matched last season. The team's 12-6 conference record marked the first time the Lancers had ever finished above .500 in conference play.
- Five players earned All-Big South recognition, also a program best, following the end of the regular season. Akila Smith was named the Big South Defensive Player of the Year, the first time the Lancers have won the award, and she and Kyla McMakin were tabbed for the All-Big South First Team, the first time the Lancers have had two first-team members. In addition, Tra'Dayja Smith was an All-Big South Honorable Mention, and Adriana Shipp was named to the All-Freshman Team. Mallory Odell rounded out the awards with an All-Academic selection.
- The Lancers also totaled 14 wins for the first time since the 2012-13 season and posted an overall winning record for the first time since going 16-13 as an independent in the 2007-08 season. The 14-10 record gave the team their best winning percentage (.583) since going 17-9 back in 2003-04.
- At the beginning of the year, Tra'Dayja Smith was named to the Preseason Watch List for the Nancy Lieberman Award, given annually to the nation's top point guard in the spring. It was the first time a Lancer had been nominated for the watch list.
- Longwood topped High Point on the road, accomplishing a pair of firsts, one marking the first time Longwood beat High Point since joining the Big South, and it also served as Longwood's first regular-season win against a team that won the regular season championship.

SMITH LEVELS UP

- **Akila Smith** was named to the Her Hoop Stats 2022 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Preseason Watch List following a season where she erupted as one of the top defensive players in the country.
- The Big South Defensive Player of the Year, averaged a double-double with points (15.8) and rebounds (10.3) while adding in 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 3.4 blocks per game. She ranks in the top three on the team across all five categories.
- On top of setting the career blocks record earlier this season, Smith also now surpassed her own single-season blocks mark she set last year. She finished with 88, shattering her previous best of 74 in the 2019-20 season.
- Smith is nationally ranked across a wide variety of categories. She is ranked fourth in blocks (82) and third in blocks per game (3.5) while also ranking in the top 20 in the nation with 14 double-doubles. Plus, she was 11th in field goal percentage (.577). In addition, she was one of only 13 players to have notched a triple-double.
- She posted her first career triple-double (the second triple-double in Longwood history) with a 14-point, 13-rebound, 11-block virtuoso performance in the team's series opening win against Winthrop on Jan. 14. The 11 blocks were both a team and Big South record for blocks in a game.
- Smith grabbed 10 offensive rebounds three times,

including back-to-back games at UNC Asheville, as part of her assault on the glass. She had at least three offensive boards 10 times this season.

- Smith is now the career blocks leader in the Longwood record book. She tallied her 159th career block against Presbyterian on January 30 to break Heather Tobeck's record of 158.

MAKIN' IT RAIN

- Guard **Kyla McMakin** notched double digits in the scoring column 20 times in 21 games in 2021 and a whopping 49 times in 51 games to start her Lancer career. McMakin also scored double digits in the 2021-22 season against a #4 ranked team in the country (Maryland, Game 1). She led the Big South in scoring at 17.9 points per game, the second straight season atop the conference leaderboard.
- In each of her first two seasons, McMakin was named to both the Big South and VaSID First Team.
- McMakin became the fastest player in program history to score 1,000 points, doing so in 54 games by hitting a pair of free throws against UNC Asheville. She became the 23rd player in program history to surpass the 1k mark.
- At the free throw line, McMakin has been the best free-throw shooter in team history. She has knocked down free throws at a .837 clip (169-202), just barely edging out teammate Tra'Dayja Smith at .832 (134-161).

SETUP BY SMITH

- Point guard **Tra'Dayja Smith** has helmed a Longwood attack that was tops in conference-only games in scoring, posting 71 points per game in 2020-21.
- Smith has also racked up a team best, 18 assists in only two games.
- A season after breaking the single-season assists record for the Lancers, Smith tallied 135 assists, good for sixth all time in the program's single-season annals.
- In just two seasons, Smith has become one of the top passers in team history, crackign the top 10 in career assists with 323.
- In her first season running the point for the Lancers in 2019-20, she set the single-season record for assists (188) while ranking fourth in Division I in dimes per game (6.5). Smith also was at the helm of the second-highest scoring offense in the Big South (67.9 points per game) while also helping Longwood post the third best assist-to-turnover ratio in the league. As a passer, Smith accounted for 44 percent of the team's assists, and Longwood's 418 assists ranked second in the Big South.

The Joan Perry Brock Center: Longwood Basketball's New Home

Thanks to a \$15 million gift from philanthropist Joan Brock '64, Longwood announced plans to build a new university convocation center that includes the new home of Longwood men's and women's basketball. The Joan Perry Brock Center will be located along Brock Commons near Willett Hall, the current home of the Lancers, with a projected opening in the spring of 2023.

Brock's \$15 million gift is the largest in history for Longwood University and ushers both Longwood basketball programs into the next phase of their Division I growth while also spearheading the construction of a venue with immeasurable potential for the university and Farmville community. The facility will be designed in Longwood's traditional architectural style and will serve as a host for speakers, concerts and shows in addition to Longwood basketball games.

Design schemes for the Joan Perry Brock Center show a planned basketball capacity of 2,500 to 3,000 seats, increasing the Lancers' current capacity of 1,807 in Willett Hall but purposefully maintaining the intimate feel and energy of Longwood's current home.

"The Joan Perry Brock Center will be a jewel in the crown of Brock Commons, and it means the world that Longwood students will be walking to these great university events, concerts and basketball games right in the very heart of campus," said President W. Taylor Reveley IV. "This building will have real character, inside and out."

At its planned opening in 2022, the Joan Perry Brock Center will elevate Longwood into the top tier of its peer basketball venues in the Big South, joining 2019 Big South regular season Campbell and 2018 champion UNC Asheville with the newest arenas in the conference. The Brock Center will be the Big South's first newly constructed arena since UNC Asheville's Kimmel Arena opened in 2011 and High Point's Quebein Arena, which is scheduled to open in 2021.

"We could not be more excited about the Joan Perry Brock Center and the new future home of Longwood basketball," men's basketball head coach Griff Aldrich said. "The 'JPB' is certainly a game-changer for our program as it will provide Longwood with a state-of-the-art venue in which to play basketball games. This new facility significantly elevates our program as it allows us to provide our student-athletes and fans with a premier arena in which to compete. We are so grateful to Mrs. Brock for her generosity, which will impact not only our basketball program and Longwood University, but also our broader community."

"So many people are drawn to Longwood because of both the sense of community and the steadfast commitment to grow this university," women's basketball head coach Rebecca Tillett said. "Joan Brock's generous gift will impact generations of students. In addition it will elevate every aspect of our women's basketball program, including immediately aiding our efforts to attract high-quality student-athletes. It will also positively influence and empower every woman who chooses this program."

"Joan Brock once said, 'You just give back. It's the American way,'" Tillett continued. "Generously



giving to Longwood is certainly the 'Brock Way,' and our program will be forever grateful."

The news follows a breakthrough 2018-19 season for the Longwood men's program under Aldrich, during which the Lancers won the second most games of the Division I era and earned a bid to the College Basketball Invitational, the first postseason tournament in the school's D-I history. Meanwhile, the Longwood women also turned the page to a new chapter under Tillett, who this year turned junior Dayna Rouse into an All-Big South forward and has assembled a foundation-building recruiting class in her first full recruiting cycle.

"This is truly a transformative day for Longwood University, Longwood athletics and the future of our men's and women's basketball programs," said Interim Athletics Director Michelle Meadows. "The Joan Perry Brock Center takes us to a championship level in our ability to recruit and compete, while providing our students, fans and community a venue they can be proud of and a place to share and display their collective Longwood spirit for years to come. We wish to extend our deepest thanks to Mrs. Brock for her belief and investment in Longwood's future."

The Brock Center will take the mantle of Longwood's home court from Willett Hall, which has played host to nearly 1,000 Longwood basketball games since it first opened in 1980. The historic arena is in its fourth decade as Longwood's home, during which it has been the backdrop for eight NCAA Tournament teams, nearly 600 wins and the 2016 Vice Presidential Debate. Willett Hall's historic resume continued into the 2018-19 season as well when the men's team's defeated Southern Miss 90-68 in the first round of the College Basketball Invitational, securing the program's first postseason win of the Division I era in the final home game of the year.

The name of the Jerome Kersey Court, dedicated in December of 2016 in honor of the late NBA star and Longwood's most accomplished basketball alumnus, will transfer to the Brock Center.

"Willett Hall has been a fantastic home to our basketball programs for four decades now, and there is a palpable history within its walls," Meadows said. "It will continue to serve as our basketball home for the next several years while the Brock Center is constructed, and it will undoubtedly play host to many more historic moments."

"However, what has made Willett Hall such a special place over the years is the energy created by our teams and the environment sustained by our students, fans and the Longwood and Farmville communities. We have long been fortunate to have such a dedicated local fanbase, and the Joan Perry Brock Center will be just as much a boon to our fans and gameday atmosphere as it will be to our student-athletes, athletics programs and Longwood as a whole."

Along with Longwood's home court, the convocation center will also be designed as a future site to host major events in the Central Virginia region, including a possible future opportunity to host another national general election debate. Also part of the project will be the migration of the Longwood tennis courts to a new facility that will be constructed on the south end of campus.

Brock's \$15 million gift toward the convocation center is the latest act in a decades-long philanthropic relationship that dates back to before the opening of Willett Hall. She and her late husband Macon are the namesakes and benefactors of numerous hallmarks of Longwood University, including Brock Commons and The Brock Experience.

That unifying potential of the Joan Perry Brock Center, to which Longwood basketball will contribute significantly, was the impetus of Brock's gift and will be at the heart of the project as it enters the design phase.

Now within the next half decade, the Joan Brock Center will proudly overlook Brock Commons, bringing Longwood students and faculty, fans and members of the Farmville community and beyond together to share in a common bond of Longwood spirit.

In just three seasons at the helm of the Longwood program, Rebecca Nemerow Tillett has engineered one of the most drastic turnarounds in college basketball.

Since being appointed head coach in March of 2018, Tillett has guided the Lancers to numerous milestones and program firsts, from the most Big South wins and highest Big South finish in program history to the team's first-ever Division I postseason berth when Longwood received an invitation to the 2021 Women's Basketball Invitational.

The 2020-21 season is just the latest example of Tillett's vision for the program becoming a reality, as the Lancers went 12-6 in the Big South to set a program record for Big South wins and earn a third-place finish in the Big South standings, also a first for the team. That success propelled Longwood to the semifinals of the 2021 Big South Championship for only the second time and also earned multiple Lancers awards from both the Big South Conference and several regional outlets.

The Lancers reached those milestones with a roster that featured the Big South Defensive Player of the Year in Aki-la Smith and three All-Big South selections in the first-team forward Smith, first-team guard Kyla McMakin and honorable mention point guard Tra'Dayja Smith. Freshman guard Adriana Shipp was also named to the Big South All-Freshman Team, marking the second straight year that a Tillett-recruited player was named to that freshman squad following Anne-Hamilton LeRoy's appointment in 2020.

Longwood's success this past season under Tillett marked the second straight year the Lancers matched or set the program record for Big South wins. In 2019-20, her second year at the helm, the Lancers won eight Big South games and secured first-round hosting duties for the Big South Championship's first round. McMakin was named Big South Freshman of the Year, senior forward Dayna Rouse was named to the All-Big South second team and LeRoy - who was among the first Lancers to commit to Longwood after Tillett took over - was named to the Big South All-Freshman Team.

The cultural shift Tillett has brought to Longwood has produced on the recruiting trail as well, as her first full recruiting class included the Big South Freshman of the Year in McMakin and a record-breaking point guard in Smith, who smashed Longwood's single-season assists record in 2019-20.

That breakthrough in 2019-20 produced 12 wins, which was a nine-win improvement from the year prior and the second double-digit win season of the program's Big South era. Longwood's nine-win turnaround was the 13th-best in the nation and the fifth-best by a second-year head coach that season and earned Tillett Longwood University's prestigious SAAC Coach of the Year honor, which is awarded annually by Longwood's Student Athlete Advisory Committee to the coach who goes above and beyond to contribute to the growth and success of his or her student-athletes.

Leading Longwood's breakthrough on the court in 2019-20 were Big South Freshman of the Year and All-Big South first-team guard Kyla McMakin, who emerged as the jewel of Tillett's first full recruiting class at Longwood, and senior forward Dayna Rouse, who flourished in her two years un-

der Tillett's leadership. Those two spearheaded a Longwood offense that averaged 67.9 points per game - second most in the Big South - and led the league in both field goal percentage and free throw percentage. The Lancers ranked 10th in the nation with 5.8 blocks per game and saw two players - McMakin and fellow newcomer Tra'Dayja Smith - finish among the NCAA's top 10 statistical leaders in multiple categories.

And while McMakin and Rouse carried the scoring load for Longwood in Tillett's second season, they were only two of a cast of breakout stars in 2019-20. McMakin was part of a transformative signing class compiled by Tillett and her staff, joined by multiple other standouts in fellow freshman newcomer Anne-Hamilton LeRoy and Smith. LeRoy, who was the second member of that signing class to commit to Tillett and the Lancers, enjoyed a strong freshman campaign as well, finishing third on the team with 11.1 points per game while starting 29 contests. Smith, meanwhile, asserted herself as one of the most dominant defenders in the conference, leading the league and setting a school record with 74 blocks and tied for 12th in the conference with 1.5 steals per game.

Tillett also inspired the growth of many returning veterans that season, grooming Rouse into one of the top all-around forwards in the Big South and Longwood's first-ever two-time All-Big South selection, and sophomore forward Akila Smith into one of the league's most dominant defenders. Both Rouse and Smith finished atop the Big South leaderboard in blocks, with Smith amassing a school-record and league-leading 73 rejections and Rouse also breaking the previous record with 59 of her own.

The success Longwood has found under Tillett comes as no surprise for those who have followed her coaching career. She made her mark as a top-tier coach in the Virginia high school ranks, amassing a 166-72 overall record during a 15-year tenure that included stints at Osbourn Park High School in Manassas (2001-07) and Forest Park High School in Woodbridge (2007-13). Those posts saw Tillett turn around both programs, first with an Osbourn Park squad that endured nine consecutive losing seasons prior to her arrival and then with a Forest Park program that she built into a championship contender with three Northwest Region and Cardinal District titles.

From there, Tillett jumped to the collegiate ranks, first during an 18-10 stop at Division II IUP in Indiana, Pa., in 2013-14, and then at Navy beginning in 2014-15. She experienced a rapid ascent up the ranks on Navy's bench under two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year Stefanie Pemper, earning a promotion to recruiting coordinator in 2016-17 and associate head coach in 2017-18. During her four-year stint with the Mids, Navy went 81-47, including in 2017-18 when they won a program-record 25 games and reached both the Patriot

League Championship Game and the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT).

Tillett was seemingly predestined for a career in coaching after growing up in a Nemerow household full of coaches and educators. Her father, Larry, coached two sports at the high school level, and her mother, Lynn, coached and taught for more than 35 years. She is the oldest of four children, three of which went into the coaching profession themselves, and all in the commonwealth of Virginia. Larry coached basketball and soccer at Osbourn Park in Manassas. Her younger brother Daniel coaches basketball and soccer at Patriot High School in Nokesville. Nate coaches soccer at Battlefield High School in Haymarket. Her youngest brother Jonah almost escaped the family tradition until he became a Robotics coach at Piney Branch Elementary School in Bristow.

Tillett was the first of her family to transcend to the college ranks, returning to the Division I level where she was once a guard at William & Mary. After graduating from the College in 1999 with her Bachelor of Science in kinesiology, she embarked on the coaching career that took her from the high school level to the college sideline, and even on the professional circuit where she spent time as a scout in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) with the Atlanta Dream from 2010-13.

She earned multiple teaching honors along the way, including the 2006 KidBiz3000 Teacher of the Year at Sudley Elementary School and a SPARK Award Hero in Education honor in 2010 at Forest Park.

Tillett and her husband, Brett, have three children: Isabel, Jack and Maya.

DEVELOPING CITIZEN LEADERS

- Among third-year head coach Rebecca Tillett's initiatives in her second season at Longwood was the installation of the Longwood women's basketball leadership council.
- The program includes a rigorous application and interview process, at the end of which Tillett and her staff selects participants who they feel at the most prepared and will most benefit from the program.
- Year three of the program saw five Lancers chosen for the year-long curriculum: seniors **Tra'Dayja Smith** and **Malory Odell**, sophomores **Anne-Hamilton LeRoy** and **Kyla McMakin** and redshirt-freshman **Adriana Shipp**.
- Those five players were hand-picked by the coaching staff after going a job like interview process that included putting together a resume and cover letter while also going through the interview stage with Tillett and the remainder of the Longwood coaching staff.
- Tillett's idea for the program came from the book "The Team Captain's Leadership Manual" by Jeff Janson.
