Griff Aldrich took over the Longwood men's basketball program in March of 2018 and soon after began what has become the most successful run of the program's Division I era.

In four seasons at the helm, Aldrich has led the Lancers to a bevy of milestones and program firsts, including the program's first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance, a Big South Championship, and a Big South regular season title. Plus, the program has set and then broken records for Big South wins as part of one of the most drastic turnarounds in all of college basketball.

The team's rise under his direction culminated in the program's first Big South Championship crown in 2021. The Lancers set a program record with 15 Big South wins, went 15-1 while also winning the Big South regular season title, and stormed through the conference tournament to earn the team's first NCAA National Tournament bid at the Division I level.

Aldrich was named the Big South Coach of the Year while also being named a finalist for both the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award, given to the top Division I coach in the nation, and the Hugh Durham Award, given to the top mid-major coach in the country.

Aldrich's career at Longwood has garnered national attention throughout his time in Farmville. In his first season, he was a finalist for the 2019 Joe B. Hall Coach of the Year Award. He was also profiled in best-selling author John Feinstein's 2020 book "The Back Roads to March."

Leslie Nkereuwem, Griff Aldrich embrace in the Big South Championship gameThe 2021-22 season saw the team set a program record in conference wins for a fourth straight season under Aldrich while advancing to the Big South Championship for the first time. The Lancers earned a No. 14 seed in the NCAA National Tournament to face No. 3 seeded Tennessee.

The Lancers closed the season on a tear, winning 19 of their 21 games once the calendar turned to January. That stretch included an 11-game winning streak, including the team's first 10 conference games. It was the first time the team had won at least 10 straight games in its Division I history and was only the fourth time the Lancers had won at least 10 in a row in program history.

The team's 26-7 overall record and 15-1 Big South record were both high water marks in the team's Division I history, and the 26 wins were the most since the team went 28-3 in the 1979-80 season and advanced to the Division III Final Four.

The team also went 16-1 at home, a program best at the DI level, bringing Aldrich's career mark in Willett Hall to 42-17. The team also ranked as high as 13th in the College Insider Mid-Major Top 25, the first time the Lancers have appeared in the rankings.

In addition, he coached a pair of All-Big South First Team selections in Isaiah Wilkins and Justin Hill, marking the first time Longwood has had two players selected to the All-Big South First Team. DeShaun Wade was also named an All-Big South Honorable Mention, giving the program three all-conference honorees for the first time in the Big South.

Longwood's turnaround under Aldrich has been the byproduct of standout recruiting classes and a program grounded in the "Longwood Five:" Excellence, Grit, Humility, Gratitude and Service.

In the 2020-2021 season, the program won a then-record 10 Big South games while advancing to the semifinals of the Big South Championship. The performance included a run of eight wins in the final 10 regular season games and an upset of No. 5 seed UNC Asheville in the Big South Quarterfinals. Veteran guard Juan Munoz earned an All-Big South nod, and the team qualified for the College Basketball Invitational for a second time in three seasons.

The Lancers also made history in Aldrich's second year in 2019-20 by amassing what was then the most conference victories (9), best conference winning percentage (.500) and highest league finish (4th) since joining the Big South Conference in 2012-13. That performance, which the team punctuated by winning eight of their final 11 regular-season games, earned Longwood a first-round bye in the Big South Championship tournament for the

first time in program history and elevated the Lancers four spots higher than their previous best Big South finish.

In 2018-19, Aldrich's first version of the Lancers broke the school record for most three-pointers, reached the postseason for the first time in the Division I era, and put an exclamation point on that debut breakout by taking down Conference USA powerhouse Southern Miss 90-68 in the first round of the College Basketball Invitational. The Lancers also picked up an early-season signature win at Commonwealth rival Richmond, swept the Tubby Smith-led High Point Panthers, and won six Big South games.

Point guard Shabooty Phillips, whose relationship with Aldrich spans more than a decade back to Aldrich's time as an AAU coach at The Forge in Houston, Texas, was named Big South Newcomer of the Year that season, while Aldrich was named one of 10 finalists for the Joe B. Hall Coach of the Year award, which goes to the top first-year coach in all of Division I basketball.

Longwood's success under Aldrich has extended off the court as well with record-breaking performances in the classroom and graduation stage. The program set a record with a 3.29 GPA in the spring of 2021 and has routinely posted cumulative GPAs north of 3.00 in his four seasons.

Additionally, Aldrich has initiated several facility upgrades for Longwood men's basketball, including a new basketball performance center, renovated locker room and player lounge, film room, and aesthetic updates to the student entrance to Willett Hall. Those are in addition to the Joan Perry Brock Center, the new home of Longwood basketball set to open in summer of 2023 that was made possible by a \$15 million gift from Joan Perry Brock.

The new heights Longwood basketball has enjoyed under Aldrich are the latest successes in the former attorney's unique career path, which has taken him from the highest rungs of the corporate ladder to the hardwood where his passions for the game of

basketball and the mission of developing young people through sport lie.

From his days as a member of the Hampden-Sydney men's basketball program, to his first coaching job alongside Commonwealth coaching stalwart Tony Shaver, to his career as a partner in a top-tier international law firm, and finally to his role in helping UMBC pull off the greatest upset in NCAA Tournament history, Aldrich has found success at every step of his professional career.

As a collegiate player, he helped lead the Tigers to a 79-31 record during his career, which included two NCAA Tournament appearances, and was team captain his senior year. After earning his Juris Doctorate from the University of Virginia School of Law, he rejoined his former college coach Shaver on the Hampden-Sydney bench for the 1999-2000 season. That year, Aldrich helped Shaver lead the Tigers to their best season in school history with a perfect 24-0 record in the regular season, a No. 1 Division III national ranking, the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Championship and a trip to the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament.

After that championship season at Hampden-Sydney, Aldrich shifted his professional sights to the private sector where he began a successful 16-year career in law and business. He became a partner at Vinson & Elkins, a leading international law firm, working in Houston and London. Later, he established and built a private oil and gas company in Texas, and held the position of Managing Director & Chief Financial Officer in a national energy-focused private investment firm.

But even as his professional resume grew, Aldrich's heart remained in coaching, and he never stepped out of the elite coaching ranks. While at Vinson & Elkins, he served as head coach at several elite-level AAU basketball programs for high school players. He went on to found the HIS Hoops program in Houston's Third Ward, one of the most impoverished areas of the city, where his work with students focused on faith, academics and basketball. Several of his players there and at other AAU programs advanced to the college and professional ranks, including L.A. Clippers forward DeAndre Jordan, international professionals Jay Cousinard, P.J. Cousinard and Brandon Peters, and NFL linebacker Orie Lemon.

In 2016 that passion for the game of basketball finally pulled Aldrich back to the court full time. At the urging of his college teammate and then-newly hired UMBC head coach Ryan Odom, Aldrich left behind his law career to become UMBC's Director of Recruiting and Program Development and helped Odom engineer one of the great turnarounds in college basketball. In that role, he acted as chief of staff for Odom – his college teammate and son of legendary college coach Dave Odom – and was involved in all aspects of UMBC's turnaround from NCAA cellar-dweller to America East Champion and NCAA Tournament giant-killer.

At UMBC, Aldrich oversaw the recruiting and program development efforts during those two seasons, helping bring in a wealth of talent that included AEC Defensive Player of the Year K.J. Maura and AEC All-Rookie Team selections Daniel Aiken and Arkel Lamar. He was involved in all aspects of the program from recruiting and scouting, to quality control and campus and community engagement.

UMBC posted back-to-back 20-win seasons during Aldrich's tenure and had that success culminate during a postseason run that put the Retrievers on the map. After winning the America East Conference title in 2018 to earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament, UMBC shocked the college basketball world when they pulled off the biggest upset in tournament history by taking down No. 1 overall seed Virginia in the first round.

Weeks later, Longwood University President W. Taylor Reveley IV and former Longwood athletics director Troy Austin introduced Aldrich as Longwood's next head coach. Now, Longwood men's basketball has experienced a bevy of firsts, from postseason wins, to academic highs and record attendance in Willett Hall.

Aldrich and his wife, Julie, live in Farmville with their three children – Scott, Ford and Laura Lee.

With one of the most decorated resumes of any assistant coach in mid-major basketball, Marty McGillan has played a pivotal role in the resurgence of the Longwood men's basketball program.

In the latest chapter of a coaching career that spans three decades, McGillan has served as the right hand of Longwood head coach Griff Aldrich since joining the program in May of 2018. His contributions have helped the Lancers reach new heights and achieve a bevy of firsts, including the program's first Big South regular season and tournament titles, a trip to the NCAA National Tournament, a program record for wins at the Division I level and the best conference record since joining the Big South.

The Lancers claimed the Big South title on the strength of a 15-1 conference record while going 26-7 overall in 2021-22. Down the stretch, Longwood won 19 of its final 21 games, including three games in three days as the top seed in the Big South Tournament. The Lancers both advanced to the Big South championship game and won it for the first time. That set the stage for a matchup with No. 3 seed Tennessee in the opening round of the NCAA National Tournament, Longwood's first appearance in March Madness.

The team's record was the best record since the 1979-80 team went 28-3 on the way to making it to the Division III Final Four. In addition, the Lancers won 11 straight games overall, and 10 straight in Big South play, for one of the longest winning streaks in team history. It was the fourth streak of at least 10 games.

Also during his tenure in Farmville, Longwood has racked up numerous signature victories, both in and out of conference, and recorded the program's first-ever Division I postseason win. The Lancers have amassed 68 wins for the winningest four-year stretch of the Division I era, received a bid to the 2019 and 2021 College Basketball Invitational tournaments and added another milestone when they knocked off Conference USA powerhouse Southern Miss 90-68 in the first round of 2019 postseason tournament.

McGillan has a hand in every aspect of the Longwood program, from recruiting to scouting and player development. His experience spans 32 years at the Division I level, during which he has won more than 500 games as an assistant, won eight conference championships and helped six programs reach nine NCAA Tournaments.

Nearly all of that success has come at the mid-major level for McGillan, a Big South veteran who helped Winthrop win three Big South titles and reach three NCAA Tournaments in two separate stints from 2007-11 and 2012-17. As an assistant coach for those nine seasons, McGillan helped Winthrop post a 96-58 record in Big South play and reach the Big South Championship game six times, including in 2017 when the Eagles won the league and finished 26-7 with a 15-3 conference record.

A native of Silver Spring, Md., McGillan came to Longwood on the strength of back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, reaching the Big Dance with the Minnesota women's basketball team in 2018 and the Winthrop men's basketball program in 2017.

In 2017-18, McGillan helped the Minnesota women's team to a 24-9 record and a third-place finish in the Big Ten, extending a run

of three consecutive 20-wins seasons following the two he helped Winthrop put together in 2015-16 and 2016-17.

The success McGillan contributed to at Minnesota and Winthrop over the past decade is the continuation of a career's worth of winning for the 1990 UNC Wilmington graduate. Including those two programs, McGillan has helped five different teams reach the NCAA Tournament, taking Wright State in 2007, UNC Wilmington in 2006 and 2003 and East Carolina in 1993.

McGillan has been a part of ten 20-win teams, and the latter half of his career has been marked by an even greater pattern of success. In the past 20 seasons, McGillan's teams have finished above .500 13 times, won six conference titles and amassed a 382-286 (.572) record. Those accolades span four seasons at UNC Wilmington (2002-06), one at Wright State (2006-07), nine at Winthrop (2007-11, 2012-17), one at Kennesaw State (2011-12), one with the Minnesota women's team (2017-18) in addition to Longwood.

McGillan has recruited and coached more than 60 players who went on to play professionally in the NBA, NBA Development League and overseas. He has coached several of the Big South's best players of the past decade, including Big South Players of the Year Keon Johnson and Xavier Cooks, who won the conference's top individual awards in 2017 and 2018.

McGillan has twice earned formal recognition for his success as an assistant coach. He was named the Big South's top assistant in 2010 by FoxSports.com's Jeff Goldman. In 2014, NextUpRecruits.com named him a top-three assistant in the conference.

McGillan received his B.A. in Parks and Recreation Management with a concentration in therapeutic recreation from UNC Wilmington. He is married to the former Tee Nagle, and the couple has two sons, Riley and Tate.

Ronnie Thomas joined the Longwood men's basketball staff in the summer of 2020 as the Director of Recruiting & Program Development and shifted to an assistant coach role in July of 2021.

In his first season in his new role, he helped the Lancers post their best year in the team's Division I history. Longwood won the Big South Championship as well as the Big South regular season crown, and the Lancers advanced to the NCAA National Tournament. All three milestones were program firsts at the Division I level.

In addition, the team's 26-7 overall record was the best since the 1979-80 team went 28-3 and went to the NCAA Division III Final Four. The Lancers ripped off 15 conference wins, also a program high since joining the Big South, and won 10 straight conference games and 11 straight overall.

A 2014 graduate of Bridgewater College in Bridgewater, Va., Thomas came to Longwood after serving as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Guilford College in Greensboro, N.C. In his final two seasons there, he was promoted to associate head coach came in 2018 and capped a five-year tenure at Guilford in which he began as an assistant coach in 2015-16 and was promoted to assistant coach and recruiting coordinator from 2016-18.

At Guilford, Thomas helped lead the Quakers to a 94-42 record, Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) championships in 2017 and 2019, and a pair of NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. Guilford advanced in both of those NCAA postseason trips, including a trip to the Elite Eight in 2019.

Under his direction, Guilford's defense was among the top three in the nation three consecutive years, including the No. 4 ranked team in 2017, No. 19 in 2019 and No. 8 in 2020. The 2019 Quakers also led the nation in total rebounds and finished sixth in three-point field goal defense. Guilford was also among the country's top 10 in rebounding margin five consecutive years.

Prior to joining the collegiate ranks, Thomas was both a semi-professional player and coach in Ireland. He played with the Ulster Elks in the Wingfoot Premier League of Northern Ireland during the 2014-15 season while also working with the Victory Scholar "Sport Changes Life" Foundation in Belfast, United Kingdom. A part of that program, Thomas worked regularly with troubled and disadvantaged youth, aged 16-24, through community engagement programs grounded in the sport of basketball.

After concluding his playing career, he served as an assistant of the Ireland National Team's U16 girls' division in Dublin and head coach of the USAA Athlete International program in Dublin in 2019.

Thomas' professional accolades followed a standout playing career at Bridgewater from 2010-14 where he was a three-year captain. He finished as the program's all-time leader in steals and No. 6 in program history in assists. Also an Academic All-ODAC honoree, he earned a liberal studies degree with an emphasis in elementary education in 2014. He went on to earn his master's in sports management from Ulster University in Jordanstown, United Kingdom, in December of 2015.

Thomas and his wife, Brittany, married in the spring of 2019 and reside in Farmville.



QUINN MCDOWELL

Quinn McDowell comes to Longwood from following three seasons as an assistant at Lehigh University, and he brings a decade of experience as both a coach and professional player with him.

"Quinn is not only a tremendous coach but an outstanding man," Aldrich said. "His approach to coaching and reasons for doing so really stood out to me during the search process. Pursuing his profession as a calling for a greater purpose, Quinn really has emphasized pouring into his players both as athletes and young men. I know he and his wife, Lindsay, and children will be a great addition to the Longwood community."

While at Lehigh, he helped guide the Mountain Hawks finishing fourth in the Patriot League last season, and the team advanced to the Patriot League semifinals in the conference tournament.

Seven players he coached earned all-conference honors during his three seasons at Lehigh, including four this past spring. Nic Lynch and Evan Taylor were both named third team All-League, and Keith Higgins Jr. and Tyler Whitney-Sidney earned All-Rookie honors.

In his second season on staff at Lehigh, Marques Wilson earned NABC second team All-District honors as well as third team All-League honors.

Prior to Lehigh, McDowell was an assistant at Taylor University after beginning his coaching career at Virginia Wesleyan University in the Division III ranks.

As a player, McDowell was one of four players in William & Mary history to record at least 1,600 points and 500 rebounds, and he set program records for both games played and minutes played in a career. He was a three-time CAA All-Academic selection, and he was named one of 10 finalists for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award, becoming the first CAA men's basketball finalist for the award.

Following his collegiate career, McDowell played professionally across multiple basketball leagues, including the G League, the VTBL League in Russia, LEB Gold in Spain and SBL in Australia.

Former George Washington assistant coach Graham Bousley joined the Longwood men's basketball staff as a special assistant to the head coach and director of recruiting in the summer of 2022.

Bousley was named one of the Top 50 Impactful Mid Major Assistant Coaches by Silver Wave Media during his time at George Washington, and he has a decade of collegiate experience under his belt, with that experience coming under the likes of Bo Ryan, Shaka Smart, Mike Rhoades and Jamion Christian.

Most recently, Bousley spent three seasons at George Washington. He was the offensive coordinator for his first two seasons, when the team ranked second in the nation in pick and roll scoring while the Colonials were also a prolific three-point shooting team. In 2019-20, the team had two players knock down the most three's in a single season in team history.

This past season, he was the team's defensive coordinator for a team that ranked in the top 50 nationally in three-point percentage defense on the way to earning the program's best seed in the A-10 tournament since the 2016-17 season this past spring. In addition, Bousley helped recruit and develop a trio of players that ranked in the top five in scoring in the A-10 during his three seasons at George Washington in Jamison Battle, James Bishop and Joe Bamisile. This past year, Bamisile, Bishop and freshman Brayon Freeman earned all-conference honors, the first time the program had three all A-10 members since 2015-16.

His success helping Battle, Bishop and Bamisile develop is a continuation of his track record of developing players. Prior to his time at George Washington, Bousley served on Christian's staffs at both Mount St. Mary's and Siena. During his season at Siena, Bousley helped recruit and develop Jalen Pickett, the 2018-19 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Rookie of the Year and the first freshman in program history to earn National Association of Basketball Coaches District 1 First Team honors. In addition, Siena ranked eighth in the nation in fewest turnovers per game while setting the school record for made three's at 288.

At Mount St. Mary's, the team won 38 games over his two seasons on staff while going 26-10 in the Northeast Conference (NEC). During his first season on staff, the Mount swept the regular season and tournament championships and earned a trip to the NCAA National Tournament. That trip culminated with a First Four win over New Orleans.

While at the Mount, he helped Junior Robinson earn NEC Player of the Year honors in 2017-18. In his first season there, he helped Elijah Long develop into an All-NEC First Team selection after increasing his scoring average from 5.6 points per game to 15.

Bousley began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Virginia Commonwealth, serving under Shaka Smart for a pair of seasons as the Rams made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. He followed it up by going to Rice University as the Director of Basketball Operations from 2014-16.

Bousley graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 2012, and he was the head student manager of the men's basketball team as a senior under Bo Ryan. He earned a bachelor of science in biomedical engineering and history while earning his master's degree from VCU's center for sport leadership.

Tidewater native Brian Graves came back to Farmville as the director of player development in the summer of 2022 after spending three seasons away. He spent a two seasons as an assistant coach at North Carolina Central before serving as an assistant at Western Carolina in the 2021-22 season.

In his return to Longwood, Graves will oversee player development, a staple of the Longwood men's basketball program under Aldrich. In addition, Graves will work with the guards while serving as a mentor and helping build player relationships in the team.

While at North Carolina Central, he helped the Eagles go 21-18 over his two seasons. In 2019-20, NCCU went 13-3 in MEAC play prior to the conference tournament being canceled (COVID-19).

In his first season at Longwood, he helped the Lancers earn a trip to the CBI and upset Southern Miss in a stunning first round upset that also was Longwood's first D-I postseason win.

At Hampton, Graves helped lead the Pirates to back-to-back top-three conference finishes and postseason bids to the 2017 College Basketball Invitational and 2018 National Invitation Tournament. The Pirates amassed a MEAC record of 23-9 in his two seasons, winning a share of the regular season title in 2017-18 and reaching the MEAC Tournament championship game.

His impact at Hampton extended to the recruiting trail as well, a trend that has followed him throughout his coaching career. Graves brought in Jermaine Morrow, who finished in the top 30 scorers all time in NCAA history. He also brought in MEAC All-Tournament pick Malique Trent-Street, a TCU transfer who finished second on the team in scoring in 2017-18 behind Morrow.

He served as a head coach at Bryant & Stratton, leading the NJCAA Division II squad to a 19-11 record in 2015-16.

That head coaching stint at Bryant & Stratton was the second collegiate stop in Graves' career, following a three-year stretch his at alma mater, Catawba, from 2012-15. As associate head coach of the Indians, Graves recruited numerous impact newcomers, including 2015 South Atlantic Conference Freshman of the Year Jerrin Morrison, All-SAC first-teamer Kijuan Arrington and SAC All-Freshman pick Jameel Taylor.

Graves starred for the Indians as a point guard from '03-'07, captaining the team twice and earning three All-SAC selections. He is the SAC's all-time leader with 600 assists and second in league history with 203 in a single season and 15 in a single game.

Following his college career, Graves went on to the professional ranks, playing for the Grevenbroich Elephants in Germany in 2007-08 and 2009-10, the Vermont Frost Heaves in the Premier Basketball League in 2009, and the Tru Hope Trailblazers in the Atlantic Coast Professional Basketball League from 2010-11. He captained both Grevenbroich and Tru Hope while earning all-league honors.

Following his playing career, Graves entered the coaching ranks as the junior varsity head coach at Heritage High School from 2010-12, leading the team to the Peninsula District Championship in 2011.

Graves, who received his Bachelor of Science in sports management from Catawba in 2007 and his Master of Sports Administration from Hampton this past May, is married to the former Gabriel Johnson. The couple has a son, BJ.

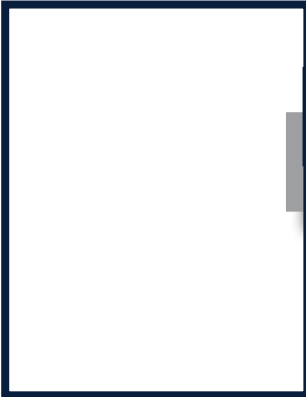

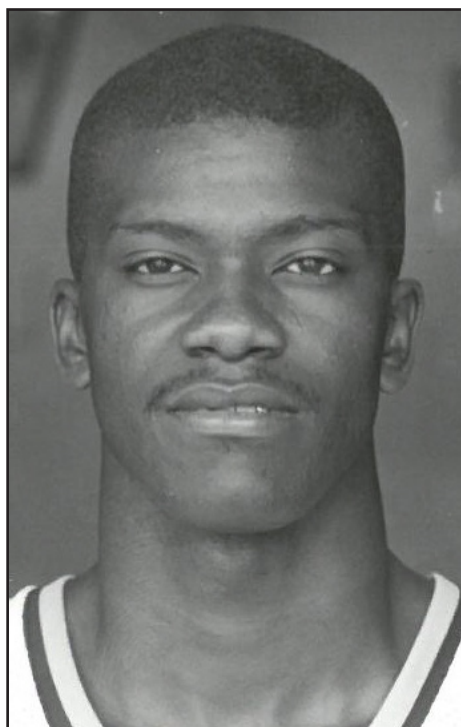

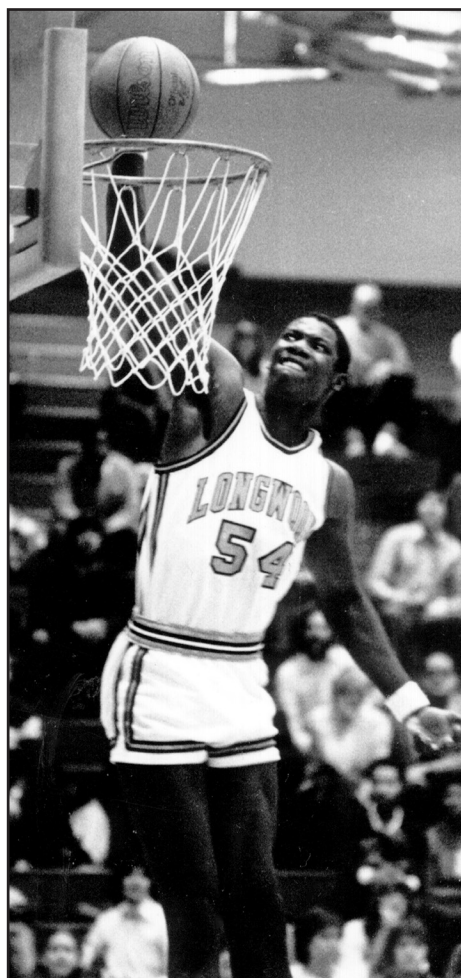
