COACH CRAIG SCHURIG (20th YEAR/123-85)

The dean of MIAA head football coaches, Schurig is 123-85 in Topeka. He led the Ichabods to the 2005 MIAA title, its first league crown in 22 years.

Schurig, a defensive back in his playing days at Colorado Mines, led WU to the playoffs in 2005 and again in 2011 and 2007. The New Jersey native has also led WU to four bowl games (2004, 2010, 2016, 2017). He began his career at Pittsburg State, serving nine years as an assistant.

LOPER-ICHABODS SERIES HISTORY (UNK LEADS 15-13)

Nothing went right for UNK in the 2019 regular season finale as Washburn roared to a 21-0 lead en route to a 57-41 win. The 657 yards featured 343 on the ground and 314 in the air with WU tallying five rushing and three passing touchdowns. Current 'Bods starting QB *Mitch Schurig* was 20 of 23 for 314 yards and three TD's. Finally, the WU defense forced three punts, picked off a pass and had a fourth down stop.

Washburn also hung 58 (2013) and 60 (2017) points on the Lopers in recent years with UNK suffering two tough losses to the 'Bods at Cope; 47-44 in three OT's (2016) and 10-7 (2014 home opener).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

Thanks to a 76-point explosion vs. Lincoln, WU has tallied at least 23 points in all four quarters, is converting 58% on third down and is 10 of 14 in the red zone (71%).

Schurig (#11) earned 2019 honorable mention All-MIAA honors after throwing for 21 TD's and 2,319 yards. He has 534 yards and five scores through two games with 2019 2nd-team All-MIAA receiver James Letcher Jr. (#13) his favorite target. He has nine grabs for 194 yards and two TD's after 824 yards and seven TD's two years ago.

Next, 5-8 senior back *Zach Willis (#34)* was a 2019 h.m. All-MIAA pick with 5-10 sophomore *Taylon Peters (#21)* currently with a team-best 138 yards and two TDs. Willis had 154 yards on just nine carries at UNK in 2019 with Peters tallying 61 on only seven attempts. Finally, the line features 6-3, 305 senior center *Colton Dunkle (#79)*.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

Three 2019 All-MIAA picks return in senior safety *K.J. Turner (#1),* senior corner *Marquise Manning (#22)* and sophomore ILB *Grant Bruner (#43),* a Gretna native.

WU has allowed 22 points and 390 yards over the first two games; they gave up 33 points and 418 yards a week in 2019. LU and Central Missouri were forced to punt a combined 17 times while going 6 of 32 on third down (19%).

Junior end Landen Urban (#51) has 3.0 sacks to date with senior ILB Jace Anderson (#23) at a team-best 10 tackles including three for lost yardage. Finally, junior corner Christian Clark (#25) has three PBU's and an INT.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Letcher Jr. was a 2019 third-team All-MIAA pick at punt/kick return; he has a 29-yard kick return so far with receiver *Devin Michael Griffin (#2)* bringing back two punts for 79 yards. Finally, senior *Lane Spiker (#46)* was a 2019 All-MIAA second-team punter with sophomore *Kameron Lake (#27)* 5 of 6 on field goals and 12 of 12 on PAT's

NEBRASKA-KEARNEY FOOTBALL '21/COACH LYNN

Josh Lynn was named the 18th head football coach in Nebraska-Kearney history on January 4, 2017.

After leading the Loper backs, cruisers (tight ends) and slot receivers, he'll directly coach the offensive line starting with the 2020-21 season.

He is a native of Eunice, N.M., and an Eastern New Mexico University graduate. Over a five-year period (2012-16), Lynn helped turn his alma mater around, leading the Greyhounds to 27 wins, two C.H.A.M.P.S. Heart of Texas Bowl appearances and a share of the 2013 Lone Star Conference (LSC) title.

In 10 years as a collegiate head coach Lynn has a **58-47 record (19-19 at UNK).** Throughout his 19-year coaching career, Lynn has coordinated both sides of the ball and coached every position except the defensive line.

The Lynn era at UNK started with a bang as the Lopers beat Missouri Western, 14-3, in the 2017 season-opener. It marked UNK's first August/September win since joining the MIAA in 2012. Kearney went on to beat Northeastern State, 42-27, and Missouri Southern, 16-6, while battling two-time defending champion and No. 1 NW Missouri before falling, 13-0.

On the year the Lopers were among the MIAA leaders in total defense, rushing defense, fourth down conversion rate and fewest sacks allowed. Seven were named All-MIAA as well.

In 2018 the Lopers improved again, going 5-6 and beginning with back-to-back wins. They capped their most successful season since 2012 with a last second road victory in the finale at Washburn. Eleven were named to the All-MIAA team as UNK was among the national leaders in rushing, going for 30 TD's and 269 yards per game. The defense was stingy once again with the Lopers playing eight games decided by 14 points or less.

Another big step took placed in 2019 as Kearney posted a 7-5 record, its first winning season in the MIAA era. The Lopers upset NW Missouri, 24-17, at home as par of a three-game winning streak and toppled Winona (Minn.) State, 50-33, in the Mineral Water Bowl. That December game marked UNK's fourthever postseason victory.

Fourteen Lopers were named All-MIAA with QB TJ Davis selected as the league's top freshmen. Senior ILB Sal Silvio (325 career tackles) was again named All-Region with senior left guard Josh Stoltenberg chosen as an honorable mention All-American. Finally, senior defensive end Hinwa Allieu signed with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons after earning first-team All-MIAA honors and was part of The Spring League in 2021.

Among the national leaders in a slew of offensive categories, set new UNK standards for rushing yards (4,115) and rushing TD's (45) in a single season. The Lopers had two 1,000-yard rushers for the first time in the program's 113-year history with the team having 44 MIAA Academic Honor Roll qualifiers.

The 2020 season was canceled by the pandemic but UNK was one of a handful of D2 schools to play in the fall. The Lopers won at Pittsburg State, 31-26, for the first time in 37 years while beating in-state rival Chadron State, 45-35, at home. It was the first meeting between UNK and CSC in a decade.

Two other games were canceled due to protocols, thus

making UNK one of 13 unbeaten teams in D2 for the 2020-21 fall/spring season. More importantly, the team posted a 3.04 cumulative GPA for the year, a rise of a half point since Lynn's arrival.

Prior to his return Portales, the 'Hounds had not had a winning season since 2004. They recorded



four straight winning campaigns and were tabbed as the top collegiate program in New Mexico (all levels) in 2015 by HERO Sports. In 2016, ENMU went 7-5 and battled Fort Hays in the Heart of Texas Bowl.

That bowl trip marked ENMU's first postseason appearance in 30 years with the LSC title the program's first crown since 1991. Subsequently, Lynn was named the LSC and Region 4 Coach of the Year and was runner up for the Liberty Mutual National Division II Coach of the Year award.

Before returning to his alma mater Lynn spent seven years (2005-11) at New Mexico Military Institute. He was head coach in 2011, leading the Broncos to a 9-3 mark, a bowl berth and a national ranking of sixth in the NJCAA. Working alongside his brother, Jeff, Lynn was defensive coordinator for four years before becoming assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2010. The Broncos took part in the 2009 Salt City Bowl, the program's first postseason appearance in 11 years.

He also worked in the defensive secondary and with the outside linebackers at Delta State in 2004. Lynn began his coaching career at his alma mater where he was a restricted earnings coach and then a graduate assistant.

In his playing days, Lynn was a two-time first-team all-conference tight end who helped ENMU win back-to-back LSC South Division titles. He also was a two-time team co-captain.

Holding a B.S. in
Physical Education and
a Master's in Sports
Administration from
ENMU, Lynn comes
from a football-coaching
family. His brother, Jeff,
is head coach at Roswell
High with his father,
David, now retired after
a nearly four-decade
career.

He is married to the former Pamela Zens, herself a volleyball standout at Division I Hofstra (N.Y.). They have three children in Bryson, Carly and Levi.

Redshirt junior QB *TJ Davis (#2/Colorado Springs)* is a 2021 All-American candidate after running for 1,034 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2019 and tallying 343 yards and seven TD's in two 2020 games.

Davis has recorded back-to-back 100-yard rushing days to start 2021, pushing his career total in that category to nine. The last opponent to hold him under wraps was Central Missouri in 2019 (23 carries, 43 yards, one TD). Pitt held him to 91 yards in 2020 but he scored four TD's.

Davis had one of his best days as a passer last Saturday, going 11 of 17 for 198 yards and having scoring tosses of 15, 30 and 44 yards. He completed passes to seven teammates to tie his career-high in TD tosses (3, vs UCM, 2019). The 11 completions are a new career-high with his yardage total ranking second best (221, vs. UCM, 2019).

LOPER TRAX

Three of UNK's lowest rushing efforts over the last three seasons have come vs. Pitt State; 136 yards (2019), 199 (2021) and 287 yards (2020). The only other sub-250 yard showings during this time frame came in 2019 vs. Northwest Missouri (228) and Central Oklahoma (233) .. redshirt junior WR *Cody Nelson (#19/Albion)* caught his first career TD catch last Saturday as his 15-yarder made it 7-0 .. five running backs have combined for 218 yards on 55 carries (3.9 avg.) and one TD.

SCHLAGER MIAA DEFENSIVE POW

Former Colorado State Ram and Nebraska Cornhusker Zach Schlager (#8/McCook) is the MIAA Defensive Player of the Week after 12 tackles and his first career collegiate interception last Saturday night at Pitt State.

The inside backer had 10 assisted tackles to push his season tackle total to 15, second most on the team. Fellow ILB *Jacey Nutter (#14/Thedford)* is first with 16 tackles.

Schlager followed his older brother, Jake, to CSU. After playing on some special teams in three games as a true freshman in 2018, he transferred to UNL in where he didn't see any game action in 2019 or 2020. Schlager came aboard this summer and joins OLB *DJ Gross (#36/U. of South Dakota)* and OG *Hunter Hays (#57/Fort Hays State)* as McCook natives who've transferred into UNK.

SECOND HALF SHUTOUT AT PITT

After shutting out Missouri Southern for an entire 60 minutes, UNK blanked Pitt State over the final 30 minutes.

Under first-year defensive coordinator *Levi Gallas*, UNK used three INT's, a fourth down stop and a third down stop to shut out the Gorillas after the break.

Pitt totaled 182 yards in the second half but had three drives end inside the Loper 43-yard line. One pick came at the UNK nine and stopped a 70-yard march.

Through two games opponent's quarterbacks are completing just 48% of their passes for 153 yards per game.

RARE THREE INT GAME

UNK, which had no interceptions during the 2020 season (79 attempts), managed three picks at Pitt.

Schlager, Nutter and reserve *CB Gabriel Amegatcher* (#15/Romeoville, III.) had the turnovers with both Schlager's and Nutter's coming off tipped balls. None of the INT's resulted in return yardage with each being the first pick of the player's collegiate career.

UNK totaled nine picks in 12 games during the 2019 season. Since joining the MIAA in 2012 UNK has averaged just under seven INT's for a season.
