

## **ANDY BRANDT** **HEAD COACH & GENERAL MANAGER**

**2ND SEASON: 33-23-4-2**

Andy Brandt enters his second season as Head Coach and General Manager of the Madison Capitols in 2024-25. During his first season behind the bench, Brandt led the Capitols to the Capitols highest win and point total in franchise history. He returned the Capitols to the Clark Cup playoffs after the team finished in last place in the league the year prior to his arrival.

In his first season with the team, Brandt led Madison to a 33-23-4-2 record, which put the team in fifth place in the Eastern Conference. This was his first full season coaching in the USHL after spending the year prior as an assistant coach at his alma mater Wisconsin.

Brandt led the Capitols to their second playoff appearance since rejoining the USHL in 2014. The team traveled to Youngstown in the first round of the playoffs. After capturing game one 7-4, the Capitols fell in the following two

games to be eliminated in the first round. The Capitols season was sparked by an excellent 15-4-0-0 stretch to end the season.

For the first time in team history, Madison had two players appear on the 2023-24 All-USHL Teams with Austin Burnevik, forward, and Carsen Musser, goaltender, being named to the third team. They became the third and fourth players to ever make an All-USHL teams from the Capitols. The first two being Luke Mittelstadt, first team in 2021-22, and Christian Stoever, third team in 2019-20.

A native of Wausau, Wisc., Brandt started his coaching career in the ECHL as an assistant coach for the Gwinnett Gladiators after captaining the team during his final season of his playing career. When the team rebranded to the Atlanta Gladiators in 2015-16, they rebranded Brandt's title to Head Coach and General Manager.

In two seasons as the head coach in Atlanta, the Gladiators went 61-68-11-4. Following the 2016-17 season, Brandt left the Gladiators organization to take the Associate Head Coach role at St. Norbert College under Tim Coghlin. Brandt would stay at St. Norbert College for five seasons helping lead the Green Knights to a 2018 NCAA Division III National Championship and three NCAA Division III Tournament Appearances.

Following the 2021-22 season, Brandt moved to Madison to become the assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of Wisconsin. In his lone season with the Badgers behind the bench, the team went 13-23-0 and fell in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament to Michigan.

58 days after the Wisconsin season came to a close, Brandt took the Head Coach and General Manager position with the Madison Capitols on May 1, 2023. In his second and third days

on the job, Brandt led the Capitols in the USHL Draft. The Capitols had eight of their ten selections in the Phase II Draft play for the team in the playoffs last season making it one of the best drafts by any team.

In his short tenure in the position, Brandt has had three players selected in the NHL Draft. He also helped advance fifteen players off of the Capitols playoff roster to division one programs.

# **TOM GILBERT**

## **ASSOC. HEAD COACH & ASST. GM**

### **2ND SEASON**

This is not the first time that Head Coach and General Manager Andy Brandt and Gilbert have worked together. They played together for at the University of Wisconsin for three seasons from 2003-2006. This includes the two of them helping the Badgers win their sixth national championship. Following his time at Wisconsin, Gilbert went onto play in the NHL for the next eleven seasons. The Minnesotan defenseman played 655 games during his NHL career recording 223 points. Gilbert had five stops throughout his NHL career with the Edmonton Oilers, Minnesota Wild, Florida Panthers, Montreal Canadiens, and Los Angeles Kings.

Gilbert is in his second season of coaching after starting the 2022-23

campaign as the Capitols' Director of Player Development. He was promoted to the head coaching position on an interim basis in March and led the Capitols to a 6-7-0-1 record. Following his first two weeks on the job, the team went onto have a record of 5-3-0-1 over the last nine games of the season. The nine-game stretch included the team's longest winning streak of the season with the team surrendering over a goal less per game on average than the team's average for the season.

# DOMINIC ZOMBO

## ASSISTANT COACH

### 2ND SEASON

Dominic Zombo is entering his second season with the Capitols after joining the team in March of 2023 as the team's Interim Assistant Coach. He was promoted to his current role in May of 2023 after helping Gilbert down the stretch of the 2022-23 season. Before joining the Capitols USHL team, Zombo was the Capitols AAA 16U and 18U head coach, roles he still occupies.

Zombo is a graduate of the University of Nebraska-Omaha hockey program where he served as team captain his senior year. Over his four seasons with the Mavericks, Zombo amassed 36 goals and 50 assists totaling 86 points in 137 career NCAA games. Upon graduation, Zombo played four years of professional hockey in the

ECHL where he scored 26 goals with 81 total points over 250 games.

After retiring, Zombo entered the coaching ranks, working with the Green Bay Gamblers AAA program for two years. Following his time with Green Bay, Zombo made his way to Madison to coach in the Madison Capitols AAA program. Zombo is still the head coach of both the U18 and U16 Capitols and will keep these roles during the 2024-25 season.

# SHANE CONNELLY

## GOALTENDING COACH

### 2ND SEASON

Originally from Philadelphia, Connelly brings a ton of experience at the collegiate and junior level of both coaching and playing. He played in the USHL with the Chicago Steel for two seasons from 2003-2005. In the USHL, Connelly recorded a record of 34-30-4, a goals against average of 2.75, and a save percentage of .914.

Following his time in the USHL, Connelly made his way to the University of Wisconsin ahead of the 2005-06 season. Picking up a national championship in his freshman season marked the beginning of a great career with the Badgers. Connelly played in four seasons with Wisconsin registering a record of 41-36-11, a goals against average of 2.39, and a save percentage

of .913.

Connelly played two seasons professionally in the AHL and ECHL before starting his coaching journey in 2011 with Bowling Green as the team's Director of Hockey Operations. Shane would serve two seasons with the Falcons before being brought on by Cedar Rapids in 2014 as an assistant coach. While in Cedar Rapids, he would help the RoughRiders capture the 2015-16 Anderson Cup. After his third season with the team, Connelly accepted a role to come back to his alma mater.

During his time with the Badgers, Connelly served as the team's Director of Hockey Operations and also helped the goaltenders as well.

**2023-24 SEASON IN REVIEW**

# 2023-24 SEASON NOTES

**2023-24 IN REVIEW:** The Madison Capitols finished with an organization best 33-23-4-2 overall record, finishing 5th out of 8 teams in the Eastern Conference and 18 points back of first place. With 72 points, Madison broke the team's point record for a single-season as well as tying the club's win record of 33 (1986-87, 1988-89). With the outstanding record, the Capitols made their way to the postseason for the second time since returning to the USHL in the fall of 2014. Madison ultimately fell in three games to Youngstown after winning game one on the road by a score of 7-4.

**A NEW BRANDT OF HOCKEY:** After spending one season under Tony Granato at the University of Wisconsin, Andy Brandt became the Head Coach and General Manager of the Capitols prior to the start of the 2023-24 season. Brandt led the team to a point percentage of .581, which was tied for the seventh best among sixteen teams in the USHL during the 2023-24 season. This percentage set the record for the highest point percentage in a single-season in Capitols' Tier 1 history and puts Brandt with the best point percentage in team Tier 1 history by .073 over Tom Upton.

**PATH TO THE SHOW:** The Capitols had two players with team connections selected in the 2023 NHL Draft with alum Luke Mittelstadt and goaltender Carsen Musser being selected in the later rounds of the draft. Of the two selected, Carsen Musser went first at pick number 166 to the Arizona Coyotes, now Utah. Later on in the draft, Luke Mittelstadt was selected by Montreal at pick number 197. Between 2014 and 2023, the Capitols had twelve players selected in the NHL Draft including six players since 2020. Miko Matikka is the highest draft Capitols player of all time being selected 67th overall.

**BURN BABY BURN:** Besides the team records that were broken during the 2023-24 season, two records were snapped by Capitols forward Austin Burnevik. Burnevik broke the team's Tier I single-season goals and points record. Burnevik broke the goals record at 26 on February 10th in the team's 38th game of the season. He added another 14 to set the new record at 40 on the season. Later on in the year, Burnevik shattered the team's Tier I single-season points record with point number 56 on March 8th, the team's 48th game of the season. The forward added another 15 points after that point to get to a total of 71 on the year. Burnevik's record breaking season helped him earn All-USHL Third Team honors.

**KUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUZ:** While Austin Burnevik was breaking single-season records, Andrew Kuzma was breaking and setting new career records for the team. With 52 points on the season, Kuzma broke Madison's career Tier-I points record for the organization and set the new total at 89 points, seven points clear of Reid Pabich's total. Kuzma played 112 games with the Capitols while the next three in that category all played in 140 or more games. The forward would also go onto break the career Tier I goals record with 47 on the year, eight clear of the former record. Austin Burnevik, now sits in second after his career year at 40.

**THE PUCK STOPS HERE:** In 2022-23, goaltending was a major issue for the Capitols, but under first-year goaltending coach, Shane Connelly, Madison found their answer in 2023-24. A dynamic duo of Patriks Berzins and Carsen Musser helped lead the Capitols to rank second in goals against for the season at 192. This margin put them behind only Fargo who set a league record for wins in a season with 50. Along with the team's success, Musser's 2.74 goals against average, fourth in the league, and .905 save percentage, second in the league, helped him earn All-USHL Third Team honors alongside Burnevik.







# *Bob Suter's* **LEGACY20 ARENA** **MIDDLETON**

Built in 1999 under the leadership of Wisconsin Badger and US Olympic Gold Medalist Bob Suter, Capitol Ice Arena was established to provide opportunities for local youth hockey players and grow the game of hockey in the greater Madison area.

Over the last 20+ years, the arena has developed thousands of young skaters and helped in their growth as athletes and individuals, from NHL All-Stars and Olympians to doctors and teachers.

The arena, named after Bob Suter in 2014, offers two NHL size ice sheets, 2,600+ capacity, 2nd level beer garden, 9 private suites, media broadcasting suite, commercial kitchen, and state-of-the-art AV and lighting systems.

Legacy20 Arena Middleton (formerly known as Capitol Ice Arena) underwent a multi-million dollar renovation in 2018, adding multiple amenities and upgrades.

In 2024, under the guidance of Ryan Suter and the Legacy20 Organization, Capitol Ice Arena was restructured to become Bob Suter's Legacy20 Arena Middleton.

Bob Suter's Legacy20 Arena Middleton is home to the USHL Madison Capitols, Madison Capitols AAA Youth, Middleton Youth Hockey, Middleton High School, and many more.

The arena has hosted events including the WIAA State Boys and Girls Hockey Tournaments, the 2022 USA Curling Mixed Doubles National Championships, IIHF Women's U18 World Championship, and the Middleton Chamber of Commerce Sip, Sample, and Socialize.

# BROADCAST INFORMATION

The Capitols Broadcast Network is back for the 2024-25 season. FloHockey is the official streaming platform of the USHL for the third straight season. All but three of Madison's games will be broadcasted on the platform. The three games not found on FloHockey will be broadcasted for free on USAHockeyTV.com.
